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NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK 3, 2010

NEWS AND NOTES: Wisconsin took their opening drive vs SJSt 80/8pl for a TD and took their 2nd drive for an apparent TD but fmb'l'd into the EZ for a TB. At the half they only led 17-0 with a 203-110 yd edge and SJSt got two 2H TD's, the latter with 5:45 left only to lose 27-14...Michigan St's secondary was a problem last year and Florida Atl, basically playing a road game at Ford Field in Detroit, had their QB Jeff Van Camp hit 23-35-215 yds despite the fact FAU has zero ret str's on the O-line...UCConn scored the 1st 5x they had the ball vs TX Southern and allowed just 1 FD in the 1H while rolling up 288 total yards offense. RB Jordan Todman rushed for 151 yds, his 7th career 100 yd game and did not play in the 2H...Northwestern scored on their first poss vs Illinois St and led 30-3 at the half. It was just 17-3 when NU took over with 4:24 left 1H on an int. They went 60/6pl for a TD and following a 2nd int with just :28 left in the half, they went 22/3pl for a TD with :10 left for that lead. NU was a 28 pt favorite and only got ahead of the spread when Illinois St fmb'l'd at their own 19 with 8:36 left and NU converted on 4th & 1 for a FD and got a TD with 4:31 left. ISU got to the NU18 but was SOD...Wake Forest had their 2nd consecutive 50 pt game for the first time in school history and won the 2nd highest scoring game in ACC history, 54-48 over Duke. In the 1H Ted Stachitas who hit 0-4 with 1 int shared time with Tanner Price. Price played the entire 2H for WF and hit 12-19-190. WF led 48-41 when they took over with 8:45 left and went 79/13pl for a TD with 2:53 left. Duke was int'd with 2:16 left then after a punt got a 51 yd TD with 1:39 left but WF rec'd the onside kick and ran out the clock...Pitt got a TD with :18 left 1H to take a 17-3 lead and only had a 167-122 yd edge. New Hampshire did drive 67/13pl for a garbage TD with 1:13 left while trailing 38-10...East Carolina only had a 425-413 yd edge vs Memphis but their 3-0 TO edge was huge as Memphis fmb'l'd at their own 12 & 24 yd lines setting up 2 TD drives consisting of 36 total yards and also gave up a 41 yard IR TD. Those 3 TD's turned out to be a big difference in the 49-27 game...Cincinnati led 12-7 at the half and after losing just 2 fumbles all of 2009, lost 2 in the 1H against lowly Indiana St which came in with a 3-55 record over the L6Y. They left the field to a smattering of boos but did score TD's on their first 4 poss of the 2H although one was on a 10 yd drive after ISU fumbled the punt snap. ISU was SOD at the UC9 and missed a 36 yd FG in the 4Q in UC's 40-7 win...W Illinois and Purdue were tied at 7 when WI went on a 72/14pl drive but missed a 37 yd FG. WI went on a 51/9pl drive but was SOD at the PU29 with 3:17 left in the half. PU went 71/4pl for a TD with just :18 left then WI fmb'l'd the KO and PU added a 36 yd FG to lead by 10 despite only having a 228-191 yd edge. Each team finished with 22 FD and WI had a 406-402 yd edge...Iowa scored TD's on their first 3 poss over rival Iowa St and then their 5th poss went 66 yds for a TD. At the half they led 28-0 with a 279-85 yd edge. While ISU was int'd at the UI3 in the 3Q, the Hawkeyes led 35-0 when ISU took over with 3:37 left and went 71/6pl for a garbage TD with 1:51 left marking the 1st time the Cyclones scored an offensive TD in the annual series since 2006...Turnovers were the key in the USF/Florida game. USF went on a 96/17pl drive for a TD in the 1Q and led 7-0 and had the ball back with 2:14 left in the half when the game started to turn on USF's first TO of the game, an int at their own 29. UF got a TD 3pl later, 7-7 at the half. USF had a FD at the UF16 threatening to retake the lead and fmb'l'd and the Gators got a 62 yd TD run 3pl later. A 30 yd PR set up UF for a 35 yd drive for a TD and they then got a 35 yd IR TD and stunningly led 28-7. USF got back under the number at 28-14 on a 69 yd drive but UF got a 22 yd FG with 12:20 left and following yet another TO (int) went 57/13pl for the clinching TD...As you would expect with both Georgia Southern and Navy running the triple option offense, the D's played well. In fact Navy had a just 9-8 FD edge and 193-109 yd edge in the game. Navy got a 55 yd KR to set up an 18 yd FG then after a fmb'l, drove 1 yd for a 42 yd FG. After a fake punt was stopped at the GS40, Navy drove 40/8pl for a TD to lead 13-0 at the half with a 113-23 yd edge. GS got a 4&8, 17 yd TD pass to open the 3Q, 13-7. GS punted with 6:08 left and Navy would convert on 3&11, 3&10 and 3&8 running out the clock at the GS9. GS QB Jaybo Shaw is a GT transfer...Oklahoma's Landry Jones completed less than 50% of his passes in the opener vs Utah St while Florida St dominated Samford. Jones hit 30-40 for 380 yds vs FSU while Heisman candidate Christian Ponder hit 11-28-113. The game was even more lopsided than the 47-17 final. FSU got 4 FD's on their first series but then just 5 over the next 2.5Q's. In fact OU led 47-10 when Florida St went 71/7pl and on 3&10 on the last play of the game got a 47 yd garbage TD pass...While Cal did indeed

dominate Colorado with their 52-7 win they did just have 18-17 FD and 356-239 yd edges. They got a 41 yd IR TD with :11 left 1H and then at the end of the game, Cal was SOD at the CU41 with :35 left. CU got 2 FD's to the Cal29 but was int'd again and this time ret'd 82 yds for a TD with :28 left in the game...Utah/UNLV was actually a lot closer than the final score would indicate. In fact, UNLV had an 18-14 FD edge and if not for spec tms, would have had a shot at the

game. Utah got a 30 yd PR setting up a 5 yd drive for a 44 yd FG. UNLV fmb'l'd a punt at their own 20 setting up a Utah TD pass on the next play with just :32 left 1H, 17-3. Utah blk'd a punt and ret'd it 19 yds for a TD then got a 77 yd PR TD by Smithson, 31-10. UNLV had a bad snap on the punt and while their P got the punt off, it went for -20 yds and that set up a 33 yd Utah TD drive and a 38-10 lead. LV had a 1st & gl at the 1 but was SOD and on their next drive had a 4th & gl at the 1 and were SOD...While Clemson only beat Presbyterian 58-21 they led 52-0 mid3Q. In fact, in the 1Q CU played 57 different players and took advantage of some short field position so the stats were not overwhelming as they only had a 414-279 yd edge...Louisville only beat E Kentucky by 10 but the game was not that close. In the 1H UL led 23-0 with a 290-93 yd edge. The Cards were at the EK27 with that lead mid3Q when they were int'd on 2nd & 4 and ret'd 80 yds for a TD. EK took over with 6:48 left and punted on 4&14 but roughing the P gave them a FD. They got a 41 yd run 2pl later then on 4th & 1 a TD with 2:28 to make it 23-13...There were a couple of key stories in the Michigan/Notre Dame game. First, UM QB Denard Robinson had another record breaking performance as his 502 yds broke the UM QB record he set the previous week vs Connecticut (383). He rushed for 258 yds, another UM QB record. The other story was that ND QB Crist played just the 1st series in the 1H and that was a ND TD drive in which he was banged up. Tommy Rees and Nate Montana combined for 8 series is his place hitting 8-19-104 yd and both threw an int. Rees' int was followed by a 30/1pl TD pass by Robinson. UM did miss 39 and 40 yd FG's in the 2H but needed a Robinson TD run with :27 left for the lead. ND got to the UM27 but Crist's final pass was incomplete...Gary Patterson has gone out of his way to not roll it up the last 2 weeks and he better get over it because it may cost TCU a shot at the National Title. Versus Oreg St he didn't want to tack on to a slim 9 pt lead at the end of the game and vs Tenn Tech, running the ball with a backup FB he apologized to TT for scoring a TD with 4:09 left. Coach Patterson - Isn't it the responsibility of the opposing team to stop you? If you are using backup players - what's the harm in scoring TD's? Especially if you are not throwing the football. Last year TCU put the hammer down on foes and nearly made it to play in the National Title game if Texas would have missed the FG in the Big 12 Title Game. Patterson better change his approach to the games for the remainder of the season or they will not get to the big show...Arkansas St QB Ryan Aplin hit a school record 438 yds passing but Louisiana led 31-7 heading into the 4Q. ASU still got the ball back at their own 31 with 2:22 left, down by 7 but Aplin was int'd on 3&10...Miami, FL's special teams kept them in the game vs Ohio St in the 1H as they had an 88 yd KR and 79 yd PR TD's and only trailed 26-17 despite being outgained 260-103. It marked the first time since OSU began keeping records in 1936 that the Bucks allowed a KR and PR TD in the same game. Two key factors were in Ohio St's favor in this one as Terrelle Pryor was the more mobile QB rushing for 113 yds while Harris had just 8 and Harris threw 4 int's to Pryor's none. Miami trailed 26-17 early 3Q when DL Heyward dropped back after faking a blitz and int'd a pass and ret'd it 80 yds to the UM15 setting up a TD. The Buckeyes had a 39 yd FG blk'd and settled for a 24 yd FG on their next 2 drives, and then on their final drive took over at their 39 with 7:31 left and converted on 3&5, 4&1, 3&7 and got a 1st & gl at the 6 and took a knee...Tennessee played a much better game than the final score would indicate. The Vols actually led 13-3 after a 1 hour long lighting delay in the 2Q with the Ducks getting a 42 yd FG with 2:56 left in the half then going 62/5pl for a 27 yd TD pass with 1:04 left, 13-13. UT had a 244-200 yd edge at the half. Two key plays happened in the next 5:00. UO got a 72 yd TD run by James to take their first lead and then with UT having a FD at the Duck24, on 3rd & 13, Simmons was not only int, but ret'd 76 yds for a TD putting UT in a 2 TD hole. UO got a TD with 11:39 left and added an 80 yd PR TD with 11:39 left and backup QB Costa led them 51/10pl for a TD with 3:54 left for the 35 pt blowout...Penn St actually played closer than the final would indicate vs Alabama. In the 1H they had a 3rd & 8 at the Tide 20 at the end of a 10pl drive but was int at the 3. They had a 2&6 at the Tide 16 after a 68 yd drive but fmb'l'd and it was ret'd 75 yds. In the 3Q PSU had a 3&8 from the Bama26 but was int at the 13 and PSU's final drive ended on an int at the Bama25. While Bama only had a 19-17 FD edge, a 4-1 TO edge was the key...Hawaii scored TD's on 3 of their first 4 poss to lead 21-0. Army trailed 21-0 at the half and UH had a 240-99 yd edge. Army took advantage of some crucial TO's in the 2H driving 24 & 11 yds for TD's after TO's. Their first TD of the 3Q came after they lined up for a 19 yd FG and UH was called for too many men on the field and they went for it on 4th & gl at the 1. With the game tied at 28, Army had a 37 yd FG blk'd with 7:02 left and then was setting up for the game winning FG when they fmb'l'd at the UH27 with :24 left. UH went 59/4pl and got a 31 yd FG with :07 left for the win...At the half Baylor had a 329-153 yd edge and Robert Griffin did not play the entire 4Q as the Bears opted to rest him leading 34-6...Tulsa had a 31-18 FD edge vs BG and in the 1H had a 360-146 yd edge. BG, after a fmb'l, went 44 yds for a TD to take an early 7-0 lead but TU led 20-7 and had the ball late 1H when they were int'd and ret'd to the 1 setting up a BG TD. TU still got a TD with :32 left in the half to lead 27-14. TU settled for 34 & 46 yd FG's in the 3Q to extend it to 33-14 and was SOD at the BG28 in the 4Q and finished the game at the BG14 taking a knee.

LSU has now won 11 of their last 12 vs Vanderbilt and held VU to 31 pts combined the past 6 games. LSU and VU was closer than the final indicates even though LSU had 21-8 FD and 392-135 yd edges. The first 5 poss of the game were 3 & outs and LSU led 10-0 at the half with a 127(-7) yd edge. VU had a 1st & gl to the LSU8 but settled for a 23 yd FG. LSU was int'd in the EZ from the VU13 and settled for a 23 yd FG and after that VU fmbld the QJ on their own 26 and 4pl later LSU added a TD. VU got to the LSU31 but punted and 4pl later Ridley broke off a 65 yd TD run to extend the margin with 4:34 left...It was a wild game between Troy and Oklahoma St. In the 1H there were 3 long drives of 11, 12 and 10 plays that all resulted in short FG's incl a 22 yd'r by OSU which put them up 6-3. The 2Q featured 41 pts and 100 yd KO return by Jernigan put Troy up 27-20 at the half. OSU drove for a TD to open the 3Q then got a 66 yd PR TD to lead. In the 4Q Troy fmbld at the OSU 2, 10 and 35. They got a TD and 2 pt conv with 4:00 left to pull within 41-38. OSU was about to take a knee on 1st & 20 from the Troy34 but QB Weeden fmbld and Troy had 1 shot left but QB Robinson was sk'd and fumbled on the next play and OSU held on for the 3 pt win...Toledo only had 13-11 FD edge and 212-183 yd edge while UT did have one solid offensive drive where they went 84/14pl for a TD, their other 2 TD's both came after int. They got a 28 yd IR to the 2 setting up a 2pl TD "drive" and a 20 yd IR to the 5 setting up a 3pl drive for another TD. UT did miss a 40 and a 41 yd FG in the 2H.

FRONTDOOR AND BACKDOOR COVERS: Nebraska took advantage of six TD's. Idaho QB Nathan Enderle, a Nebraska native had 5 int's and when the Huskers got 40 and 47 IR TD's just before the half, they took a 31-0 lead. Idaho gained 60 of their yds on 12pl drive getting a 34 yd FG on the 1H's final play. The Huskers had numerous opportunities to turn it into a blowout leading 38-10 (ahead ATS) they got an IR to the ID21. With backup QB Green in, they were SOD on 4th & 1 at the 13. ID fmbld it at their own 4 yd line but NU fmbld it back at the 2 with 6:19 left and ID gained 98 of their yds on a 10pl drive for the spread covering TD with 2:31 left. NU ended the game at the ID23.

POINTS LEFT OFF THE BOARD: UAB could have led early in the 3Q but blew 2 opportunities at the 1 yd line. Trailing 14-7 they had a 1st & gl at the 1 with :41 left 1H. On 2nd & gl at the 1 they ran the ball on no time-outs then hurried the FG unit on and the snap went through the holder's hands and they did not score. UAB opened the 3Q with a 74/5pl drive and got basically a 50 yd TD pass from Isabelle to Forrest who fmbld the ball before he crossed the goal line for a TB. UAB was int at the SMU28 with 12:52 left and then down 2 scores, opted to go for it on 4th & 4 at their own 38 and was SOD less than a yd short setting up a short SMU TD. UAB was also SOD at the 5 yd line on 4th & 2.

MORE FCS UPSETS: Opening week saw a couple of upsets by the FCS and last week saw even more as you would expect with a large amount of games vs IAA foes. Akron only led 21-17 at the half and Gardner-Webb had a 187-179 yd edge but the Zips did lead 31-17 late in the 3Q. GW tied it with 5:05 left and the kicking game cost the Zips. They missed a game winning 34 yd FG on the final play of regulation then while each team scored a TD in OT, UA missed the xp and was upset by 1. GW finished with 24-22 FD and 391-389 yd edges.

INJURIES OF NOTE: Wisconsin WR/RM David Gilreath was taken off the field on a stretcher after a suffering a concussion vs SJS and his status for next week will be questionable. Also, SJS starting C Robbie Reed hurt his right leg and was on crutches with an immobilizing knee brace in the 2H. Purdue WR Keith Smith (knee) was on crutches at the end of LW's game...Georgia was not only without star WR AJ Green (susp) but also their top RB Caleb King missed the game with an injured ankle. UGA still had a chance vs SC despite being outFD'd 23-11. In the 3Q they rec a fmbld and got a 55 yd pass and had a 2nd & gl at the 8. Only down by 8 pts, RB Ealey fmbld which SC rec'd at the 1 and ret'd it 13 yds. UGA did not threaten after that and SC got a 24 yd FG with 1:12 left which iced it. Probably the key component of the game was SC true frosh Marcus Lattimore (PS#1) who was dominant from start to finish and finished with 182 yds rushing with his 3rd and 4th TD's of the season.

4★ W MICHIGAN over Toledo - After being embarrassed by Arizona at home, UT upset reigning MAC East champ Ohio, 20-13 as a 9 AD as they were +2 TO's. WM only led Nicholls St 21-14 at the half before scoring 28 unanswered pts and has the advantage of a bye on deck. LY WM dominated Toledo LY 58-26 on the road. WM has won 4 in a row vs UT by 19.5 ppg but the visitor has covered 3 straight. While these teams are close on both off and def, WM has a big edge on ST's (#42-105). LY WM's Sr QB Tim Hiller avg 271 ypg (60.1%) with a 23-13 ratio, his replacement QB Carder is avg 259 ypg (62%) with a 7-2 ratio and is avg 3.1 ypc on the ground. LY UT's Sr QB Opeit avg 222 ypg (59%) with a 16-10 ratio, his replacement QB Austin Dantin is avg 103 ypg (68.4%) with a 1-3 ratio and is avg 1.5 ypc on the ground. By virtue of their 12 str win over OU, UT has the early MAC West lead but WM will bring UT back down to earth. We'll grab the great value with UT's misleading final.

FORECAST: W MICHIGAN 34 Toledo 20

3★ FLORIDA ST over BYU - LY's 54 pts were the most FSU scored vs a ranked foe S/'00 and the Noles were actually +8 handing BYU its 1st home loss in 18 gms. FSU is 3-0 vs BYU (every win by at least 16) and this will be the series' 4th diff venue. FSU is 11-5 ATS off a SU loss but BYU is 21-8 SU (20-9 ATS) in its 2nd consec gm away from home. The Noles are off a 47-17 loss to Okla and have their ACC opener on deck. QB Ponder's Heisman campaign took a heavy hit as he threw for 113 (39%) with an 0-2 ratio (on B2B 3Q throws) LW. He is now avg just 140 ypg (55%) with a 4-3 ratio. Ty Jones leads the rushers with 125 (9.6) and the top rec is Easterling with 7 (17.1). For the first time S/'03, BYU lost to AF LW. The Cougs built a 14-7 1Q lead, but did not score again as they were outFD'd 22-15 and outgained 477-309. The QB combo of Heaps/Nelson only comb for 88 pass yd (40%) as the "every other series" rotation stopped at halftime (Nelson 2H). RB Di Luigi did break the 100 yd mark and leads with 172 (8.6). He's also the top rec but with only 7 (15.4) on the year. BYU is 0-4 as an AD the L4Y and FSU has all the edges (off #14-66, def #47-72 and ST #3-53) and bounces back.

FORECAST: FLORIDA ST 41 BYU 24

3★ ARIZONA over Iowa - Arizona HC Stoops is an Iowa alum and began his coaching career under Hayden Fry serving on the same staff as Ferentz from '86-'89. The Wildcats have been impressive in their 1st two matchups TY not allowing a single TD (2 FG's and a safety) although it has been against Toledo and FCS member The Citadel. Iowa meanwhile is also off to a 2-0 start after their victory LW vs rival Iowa St, a gm in which RB Robinson rushed for a career high 156 (11.1). In LY's matchup low led 27-10 (all'd just 190 yds) before the Wildcats scored a garbage TD w/1:53 left (Iowa had a 338-253 yd edge). While UA is just 3-7-1 ATS in their 1st lined HG of the ssn, the Hawks haven't fared much better going 2-6 SU (1-7 ATS) vs the P10 and just 1-7 ATS in non-conf AG's and could find some resistance this week in the desert. The Wildcats are 13-2 ATS at home and are 9-0-1 ATS at home vs ranked foes S/'05. On the flip side, the Hawkeyes are 1-5 ATS in their 1st road game and we'll side with Arizona as the **Technical Play of the Week**.

FORECAST: ARIZONA 24 Iowa 20

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ ARKANSAS ST over ULM - The HT is 5-2 SU but with an avg win of only 7 ppg. ULM has now covered 5 in a row vs ASU and the dog is 9-1 ATS. LY ULM won in the rain at home 16-10 (-2'). ULM was outgained 217-58 in the 1H vs Arkansas but only trailed 7-0 and covered as a 34 pt AD despite being outgained 499-188 overall. ASU trailed Louisiana 31-7 in the 3Q before scoring 17 4Q pt to make the score close and actually matched ULL with 456 yds each but were -3 TO's. These teams are fairly evenly matched as ASU has the edge on offense (#104-113) while ULM has the D edge (#96-113). This is ULM's SBC opener and they have FCS SELA, a historical rival on deck. Arkansas St has an underappreciated pass game and ULM's cover LW has made this line reasonable.

FORECAST: ARKANSAS ST 34 ULM 17

2★ Notre Dame (+) over MICHIGAN ST - The Spartans are 11-2-1 ATS in the series (outgained ND 10 of 13Y) but the visitor is 7-1-1 ATS. There was 5 lead changes in LY's gm as MSU's final drive was int'd at the ND4 w/:57 left. ND is 2-8 ATS in their road opener. ND's Kelly followed MSU's Dantonio as HC at Cincy so he's seen plenty of film of Dantonio's schemes. MSU beat FAU 30-17 in Detroit as the Spartans outshined the Owls 225-45 including 183 (12.2) by Baker. MSU has been extremely conservative the 1st 2 gms with a 67-39 run-pass ratio (261 run ypg, 7.8) but that should change TW. Down 21-7 to Mich, the Irish rallied to take the 4Q lead on a 95 yd TD pass with 3:41 left only to see UM QB Robinson run for a TD with :27 left. QB Crist (241, 63%, 3-1 ratio) missed most of the 1H after being banged up on a TD run but ret'd to throw 2 2H TD passes although his final toss was out of the EZ. After handling PU dual-threat QB Marve (230 yd) in the opener, UM's Robinson had 502 tt yds but here the Irish face a traditional dropback passer in Cousins and the Irish continue the strong run by the visitor in this series.

FORECAST: Notre Dame (+) 27 MICHIGAN ST 23

2★ Tulsa (+) over OKLAHOMA ST - These 2 played every yr from '81-'96, but this is only 5th meeting since then and 1st S/'04. TU hasn't won in Stillwater S/'51. TU has lost to 19 straight to BCS foes by an avg score of 42-14 (5-10-1 ATS), but their last win did come over the Cowboys in '98 (35-20). The Hurricane faced Cowboys OC Holgorsen when he was at Houston the L/2Y following an avg of 58 ppg and 668 ypg. TU bounced back to beat BG LW 33-20 with 31-18 FD and 546-303 yd edges after losing the opener on a last play Hail Mary to EC last Sun. NCAA's #1 passer QB Kinnie avg 378 ypg (61%) with 7-2 ratio. TU is allowing 421 tt ypg and 35.5 ppg. OSU rallied from a 27-20 HT deficit to beat Troy 41-38 as our 4★ College Totals GOM. OSU outgained the Trojans 522-371 but Troy lost a fmb! and had a bad snap inside the Cowboys 10. QB Weeden avg 283 ypg (74%) with a 5-2 ratio. RB Hunter is #2 in the NCAA with 414 yd (8.5). OSU's young D is allowing 241 pass ypg (61%) with a 4-0 ratio. Two explosive offenses but OSU has the home and D edges (#60-100) so whoever has the ball last may win it. We favor the "little brother" in this in-state rivalry.

FORECAST: Tulsa (+) 44 OKLAHOMA ST 41

Thursday, September 16th

Cincinnati at NC STATE - 1st meeting. Cats are 5-3-1 ATS as an AD losing to Fresno (+2) in the opener. NCST is 5-17 ATS as a HF S/'03 (2-4 under O'Brien). NCST is just 1-4 hosting non-ACC BCS tms S/'04. UC is 1-7 SU and 2-5-1 ATS the last 8 gms vs non-conf BCS schools on the road (lone win LY vs Oreg St). UC is travelling on a short wk and Butch Jones' off has been slow starting as UC only led 12-7 at the half LW before pulling away for a 40-7 win over Ind St. UC has allowed 10 sks in the 1st 2 gms (8 vs Fresno). NCST escaped with a 28-21 win over UCF aided by 5 TO's incl an IR TD (NCST outgained 308-239).

Friday, September 17th

Kansas at SOUTHERN MISS - SM HC Fedora was rumored to be a candidate to replace Mangino at KU but the Jayhawks elected to hire Gill away from Buffalo instead. The Eagles will be playing with legitimate revenge here after outplaying KU LY in the 35-28 loss (+13). SM is off a solid performance (464-211 yd edge) vs IAA opponent Prairie View A&M while KU rebounded from a dismal opener to upset GT by a FG in Lawrence as our Big Dog POW. KU is 14-6 ATS in reg ssn gms vs non-BCS tms while SM is 9-4 ATS the L/2Y off a SU win making this a potential classic at the "Rock".

California at NEVADA - Cal has dominated the all-time series but the only recent meeting was in '96 as Cal won 33-15. The Wolf Pack has dropped 8 consec gms vs BCS tms (1-7 ATS) by 25 ppg and UN is 1-3 SU/ATS at home vs BCS foes S/'05. QB Kaepernick is directing Ault's pistol off for the 4th consec ssn. Cal delivered as a 4★ LPS with a 52-7 shellingack of Colorado (31-0 at HT) where the Bears took advantage of 5 CU TO's. The Bears are making just their 2nd visit to a non-BCS school in the L/5Y and are 4-0 SU but only 1-3 ATS S/'04 in AG's vs non-BCS tms.

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Saturday, September 18th - GEORGIA 27 Arkansas 24 - LY GA was coming off Okla St and SC while Ark was off Missouri St and a bye and had worked all summer on this gm. GA QB Cox tied a school record with 5 TD with 375 yd and Ark QB Mallett set 2 school records with 408 yds and 5 TD in a 52-41 GA win (+2). Richt is 5-0 SU vs Ark and the Hogs are just 2-7 in SEC openers and 4-13 ATS in their first road game. GA's secondary replaced 3 str's TY but ranks #16 in pass D after 2 gms, but now must take on the explosive pass attack of UA led by QB Mallett (701 yd, 73%, 6-2 ratio). Ark struggled in the 1H vs ULM LW (7-0 1H) before pulling away for a 31-7 win. GA's D was manhandled by SC RB Latimore LW (182 yd, 2 TD) and SC had 23-11 FD and 354-253 yd edges. GA WR Green is susp but rfr QB Murray has been productive without him (352 pass, 66%, 3-1) and faces Ark's #42 pass D. Ark is just 1-8 SU in road gms under Petrino. The Dawgs are hungry to avoid an 0-2 SEC start.

W VIRGINIA 30 Maryland 20 - This series ran uninterrupted from '80-'07 and WV has won the L/4 by an avg score 32-18 and has outgained MD in each (+83 ypg) since getting waxed in the '03 Gator Bowl. MD is 5-11 ATS off a SU win and 2-4 ATS in non-conf AG's. LW WV trailed Marshall the entire gm before driving 96/9pl and 98/15pl to force OT on a Fri night showdown. PK Bitancourt hit a 20 yd in OT while MU pushed its 39 yd at night and WV escaped, 24-21. WV did finish with 28-16 FD and 469-364 tt yd edges. QB Smith avg 266 (72%) with a 3-1 ratio. RB Devine has 223 (4.8) and Austin and Sanders have comb for 17 rec (11.2). MD rolled Morgan St, 62-3, after a short wk off Navy. The Terps held on 4 goal-line stands vs Navy stopping QB Dobbs on 48g from the 1 w/:34 left. MD was actually outFD'd 26-11 and outgained 485-272 in their 17-14 win. MD's QB's have comb to throw for 160 tt yd (45%) with a 5-2 ratio. The run gm has been productive as 3 are already over 100 yd led by Meggett with 155 (9.7). Despite being 11-16-1 ATS vs MD S/'80, WV has won 14 str non-conf HG and is 7-3 ATS when those opp are from the FBS.

† Kansas St 34 Iowa St 14 - K-St second straight year at Arrowhead with K-St being the home tm TY after ISU was the home tm in '09. LY K-St QB Gregory made his 1st career start and threw 2 TD's as the Cats blocked a game tying PAT w/:32 left as we won a 4★ LPS on the Cats. K-St beat Missouri St LW as Coffman threw for 280 yd and 3 TD after having just 66 in the opener. RB Thomas has 371 yd (7.6). K-St allowed 25 FD and 447 tt yd to MSU although they entered the 4Q with a 41-10 lead. ISU was crushed by rival Iowa 35-7 as the Hawks flew out to a 28-0 lead while the Cyclones had just 30 yd (Iowa 479-275 yd edge). QB Arnaud avg 231 ypg (59%) but with a 1-5 ratio (2nd most int in NCAA) which allows D's to focus on RB Robinson (145, 4.8). Both D's have struggled vs the run TY with K-St allowing 180 (4.5) and ISU 217 (5.0). K-St has the off, D and probably crowd edges and looks to get off to their 1st 3-0 start S/'06.

PURDUE 30 Ball St 20 - The Boilermakers lead this series 7-0 SU and 3-2 ATS outscoring the in-state Cardinals by 23 ppg (38-15, last met in '06). Including bowls PU is 3-6 ATS vs MAC teams since '05. Ball St is 2-12 in road openers (avg loss 25 ppg). Purdue did get upset by N Illinois LY but then had Notre Dame on deck but only has Toledo on deck TY and should be better prepared. PU has just 11 ret str's and ranks #109 in exp level while Ball St has 19 ret str's and is #4 in exp. PU HC Hope is 1-3 ATS as a HF while BS HC Parrish is 5-0 as an AD. Both teams are 0-2 ATS but while PU only beat FCS WIU by 10 LW, Ball St lost outright to an FCS tm (Liberty) for a 2nd str year. PU has the off (#72-99) and D (#71-89) edges. The Cardinals pulled QB Page for true frosh QB Keith Wenning who led BSU to its only lead of the game (23-20) but they could not hold it. Wenning threw for 129 (72%) with a 1-0 ratio. PU QB Marve is avg 196 ypg (71%) with a 3-1 ratio but may have lost his top target WR Keith Smith (knee) for the year.

ILLINOIS 30 N Illinois 20 - Last met in '01 and NI is 0-3 SU but 3-0 ATS in series. IL is 3-9 ATS vs non-conf (but 2-0 TY) and 1-7 ATS vs the MAC. NI upset Purdue LY with a 454-335 yd edge but has gotten off to a 1-1 SU (0-2 ATS) start TY despite 15 ret starters. NI is off a misleading 23-17 win over N Dakota in which, leading 16-0 and going for more, ND had a 63 yd IR TD. ND also had an 85 yd TD pass and a blk'd P which set up a FG but NI outgained the Fighting Sioux 510-334. IL led FCS #2 S IL 35-3 after their 1st drive of the 2H before coasting (407-230 yd edge) and has a bye on deck. QB Scheelhaase avg 155 (56%) with a 3-3 ratio and 80 rush yd. RB LeShoure has 227 yd (6.5). The Illini have allowed just 72 rush ypg (2.5) despite playing without 3 projected D starters LW.

Connecticut 25 Temple 20 - Temple used to be a member of the Big East but was booted out and UC was invited in. TU is 5-0 ATS in the series but has dropped 3 in a row SU. In 2007 they played here and TU should have won the game with a late TD but despite replays showing conclusive evidence of a TD catch, it was ruled in and the Huskies (-30) prevailed, 22-17. In '08 TU led 6-0 on a rainy day into the 4Q at home but lost 12-9 in OT. UC is 9-3 ATS as an AF over 10 yrs but Golden is 7-2-1 ATS as a HD. UC is off a blowout win over Texas St (444-169 yd edge) and pulled its starters at halftime. TU K McManus has kicked 2 gm winning FG's in each of their gms incl LW when TU got the 1st OT win in program history over CM. Golden has his former coach/boss Paterno on deck which may be a distraction this wk.

OHIO ST 41 Ohio 3 - OSU is 6-0 SU but 0-2 ATS vs the Bobcats. In their last matchup in '08 the Bucks were looking ahead to USC and trailed into the 4Q but rallied for a 26-14 win as a 33' pt HF. The Bucks are 5-9 ATS vs in-state schools. OU is 7-2-1 ATS vs ranked opps. OSU is off a big 36-24 win over the mistake prone Hurricanes who threw 4 int's and missed 2 FG's. Pryor avg 240 ypg (56%) with a 4-0 ratio and 130 rush yd leading our #2 off. OSU's D allowed its 1st TD TY on the 4Q's first play LW while the usually solid ST's have allowed an NCAA worst 3 TD's. Despite missing 2 FG's Toledo won their 12th straight over OU as they forced 4 TO's and held the Bobcats to 11 FD and 183 tt yd. OU QB Jackson was sk'd at the UT41 with 2:10 left and he is #100 NCAA in pass eff (117, 62%, 1-4 ratio). OU is allowing just 216 ypg (compared to OSU's 276) including 55 pass ypg (#2 NCAA) but have faced just option Wofford and Tol. OSU leans up its ST's and continues to roll.

PENN ST 38 Kent St 10 - Last met in '03 (PSU 31-10, -24). PSU was 9-2-1 in non-conf HG's but is 0-10 the L/2Y. They have won 20 straight vs non-conf non-BCS tms by an avg of 43-9. KSU has dropped 6 straight AG's vs BCS schools by 26 ppg. The Flashes covered (+17) despite losing 5 TO's LW 26-13 at BC as they scored on a 32 yd TD on a screen pass with 2:27 left. The Flashes were without RB/PR Jarvis (CS) and were held to 4 net rush yd and lost 3 fmb's on PR. KSU leads the NCAA in rush D allg 11 ypg (0.4) including holding BC's Harris to 80 yd (2.8). PSU lost 24-3 at #1 Bama LW in QB Bolden's 1st road start (13-29-141 with 0-2 ratio) as the Tide outgained the Lions 409-279. RB Royster has just 72 (3.6) TY and will want to get on track vs the NCAA's "top" rush D. PSU has big edges all around except for ST (#33-87) and Paterno will want to give his offense some confidence.

N CAROLINA 30 Georgia Tech 23 - NC is 6-11 SU (2-10 L/12) but 11-5 ATS (5-1 L/6) vs GT. LY though, it was not much of a game with GT winning at home 24-7 (-2') with a commanding 406-154 yd edge. It was a diff story when Davis took on Paul Johnson's option off at home in '08 as NC won 28-7 (-4) but was outgained 423-314 in that one as well. TY they will be well motivated and have the huge edge of having a bye LW to prep and GT is on a 2nd str road trip, off a humiliating loss to Kansas, 28-25 (-13'). GT did have a 407-320 yd edge but the FD's were even. QB Nesbitt is avg 62 ypg (29%) with a 1-1 ratio and after putting up 130 rush yd vs FCS SC St in the opener, he only put up 63 LW (still the #1 rusher, 5.3, 5 TD). Despite their overwhelming susp, NC hung around LSU in the opener, but their comeback bid fell short, 30-24, despite 20-11 FD and 436-313 yd edges. It is still unknown if the 13 susp players will ret TW, but 12 are practicing (CS). QB Yates threw for 412 (61%) with a 3-0 ratio and WR Boyd had 221 (36.8) vs LSU. Assuming the susp plyrs ret, NC has one of the most athletic D's in the country much like Miami and Iowa did LY when they held GT to 12 and 9 FD's.

MISSISSIPPI 27 Vanderbilt 13 - UM hasn't won its SEC opener S/'03, a 24-21 win over Vandy. The visitor is 10-4-2 ATS and Vandy is 8-2-1 ATS in the series. The L/2Y Vandy took adv of QB Sneed with 7 int (3 LY) but still lost '09, 23-7 (+10). UM has just 10 ret st's but VU has just 11 st's back with 26 left lost. UM is 7-4 as a HF under Nutt and this is their only SEC game in Sept, but VU is 8-1-1 as an AD. UM came back after their disastrous loss to Jax St with a 27-13 win over Tulane LW (only had 374-312 yd edge). Masoli got his 1st start at UM LW throwing for 281 yds, 1-1 ratio, 1 rush TD. VU was shutdown by LSU LW (outgained 392-135, outFD'd 21-8) with QB Smith sk'd 6x (310 pass, 56%, 1-1 ratio, 2 gm).

VIRGINIA TECH 41 E Carolina 24 - Hokies are 7-1 SU (4-3-1 ATS) vs the Pirates S/'93 but are off of one of the more embarrassing defeats in program history after losing to FCS foe James Madison, a game which VT played just 5 days after their heart-breaking loss to Boise. LY VT was playing with legitimate revenge after EC upset them in '08, 27-22 (+9) as a LPS Winner. The Hokies shutout EC in the 2H holding them to 4 FD's and 95 yds (3.1 ypp). EC has some nice momentum riding into this week after B2B home wins over conf opp as QB Davis continued his torrid start (314 ypg, 64%, 8-1 ratio) but he's now on the road for the 1st time TY (EC 1-7 SU and 3-5 ATS in road openers). The Pirates are 14-5 as an AD but that was mostly under Holtz and now they have a new HC and new schemes with just 8 ret st's. While VT does have their ACC opener on deck (0-3 ATS run), they do have solid edges in all 3 areas and will still remember that upset of '08 so they do not figure to take any prisoners in this matchup, especially as they are still searching for their 1st win of 2010.

MISSOURI 34 San Diego St 20 - Last met in 1980. Missouri is 3-8 ATS as a DD HF (1-4 L/2Y incl LW's FCS foe). Both are veteran units with 16 starters back. SDSt is 1-17 SU vs the BCS on the road but 10-7-1 ATS. Mizzou has won 17 str SU (11-4 ATS) vs non-conf foes, with their last loss coming vs MWC member NM in '05. QB Gabbert is avg 251 ypg pass (76%) with a 3-0 ratio. Josey, who scored on 3 of his first 4 carries LW, leads with 122 (15.2, 3 TD) and the top rec is Moe who is tied for #1 in the NCAA with 23 rec (7.8). SDSt is 2-5 ATS away from home but their 2 wins have been the last 2 contests (UNLV '09, NMSt LW). They're off to their first 2-0 start S/'94. QB Lindley is avg 311 ypg (54%) with a 3-0 ratio. True rush RB Hillman has put up 215 (5.8) with 5 TD and the outstanding combo of Sampson (11, 22.9) and Brown (138, 13.8) pace the rec game. Both teams should be focused here as Missouri is off a 50-6 blowout of McNeese State (21-18 FD, 438-245 yd edges) and only has Miami, Oh next week while SDSt is off their 41-21 win over NMSt (delivering a 3★ on these pages) and only has Utah St on deck.

Alabama 41 DUKE 20 - Bama is 2-1 SU and 0-1 ATS in this series. The last meeting was a 30-14 Tide win in '06 (Duke +28) in Tuscaloosa. Duke led 14-10 mid-3Q before UA scored 20 unanswered pts and UA had just a 354-275 yd edge. Saban is 4-1 SU but just 2-3 ATS vs Cutcliffe as HC's at LSU and Ole Miss with the HT 5-0 ATS in that span. UA hasn't ply'd in front of less than 40,000 since '07 (at Vandy). This is UA's 1st non-conf true road gm S/'03. The Tide is also in a large Penn St/Ark-Florida sandwich. UA is 13-20 ATS as a DD favorite since '05 but has covered the L/2 wks in that role including LW's domination of Penn St (409-283 yd edge). RB Ingram has missed the 1st 2 (knee inj) but Richardson (210 yd, 6.6, 3 TD) has been solid. LW Duke set a record for most pts scored in a loss (48) to WF and QB Renfree has thrown for 708 yds (71%) with a 6-3 ratio but now faces Bama's #5 pass D. UA has a massive edge on D (#4-105), but the offenses are closer than expected (#4-31) and Duke has the ST edge (#65-91).

COLORADO 34 Hawaii 24 - Hawaii won the only meeting 13-0 in Honolulu way back in 1925. The Warriors are in the midst of a 13 day road trip which has taken them to 8 different cities and 4 different time zones as UH stayed on the mainland for B2B road trips. UH is 4-1 SU/ATS in the 2nd of B2B AG's with their lone non-cover by 1 pt. UH has the edge on off (#50-83) and ST (#52-92) but CU gets the nod on def (#46-97). UH built a 21-0 lead vs Army LW only to fall behind 28-21 but kicked a 31 yd FG with :07 left to win 31-28 by driving 59/4pl in :24 to set up the score. UH QB Moniz passed for 343 yds and 3 TD LW and is avg 306 ypg (60%) with a 4-0 ratio and one of his top weapons is WR Pliars who has 11 rec (4 for TD) and is avg a whopping 25.5 ypc! UH is 2-11-1 SU and 1-3 ATS vs the B12. Since '03, the Warriors have gone 1-5 SU and 3-3 ATS away from home vs BCS tms being outscored by an avg of 42-20. The Buffalos were steamrolled LW 52-7 at Cal (31-0 at HT) where 5 CU TO's only compounded matters. CU QB Hansen is avg 179 (59%) with a 2-4 ratio and RB Stewart has 145 yds (3.2). CU stands 20-8-1 SU and 5-3 ATS vs current WAC tms and while the Buffs are 17-5 SU in home openers, they are 0-8 ATS S/'00. CU does have a bye on deck so their focus will be here.

Colorado St 20 MIAMI, OH 17 - These two have only met once before as MU upset CSU 41-21 in '03 in Fort Collins. CSU is 2-2-1 SU (0-3 ATS) all-time vs the MAC and this is their farthest trip East S/'02 (UVA). Miami does have 19 ret st's but they're 0-4 L/3Y as a HF. After being ejected early vs Fla, Merriweather ret'd to rush for 103 of the tm's 181 rush yds LW. QB Dysert is avg 178 ypg (59%) but has a horrible 1-5 ratio. This is CSU's 3rd str away from home and on an 11 gm slide SU (1-10 ATS). Colo St has yet to score a TD TY, being outscored 75-9. QB Thomas is avg 195 ypg (68%) with an 0-4 ratio. Their top rusher has just 32 tl yds and no rec has over 100 yds. While this once would've been considered a "C" game for the Rams, that's no longer the case as they know they're getting a Miami tm still riding high after outplaying Florida and off their first SU win since last Halloween. The Rams are a team desperate to right the ship and they're 22-14 ATS as a single digit dog.

Florida 30 TENNESSEE 13 - LY both tms came in with conservative game plans and UF won their 5th consec in the series 23-13 which some considered as a moral victory for Tenn (+30). UF had a 323-210 yd edge. The Vols have averaged just 60 rush ypg vs UF the last 4 years (-11, 37, 96, 117). Tennessee is 4-13 SU and 5-11-1 ATS in the series. There hasn't been an upset in the series since '03 and UF is 4-1 ATS in Knoxville. UF is 11-4-1 ATS in their 1st SEC gm of yr. UF's off regrouped from a horrific opener LW for a 38-14 win over USF with a 423-330 yd edge and their #5 D leads the NCAA with 8 int in 2 gms. UT jumped out to a surprising 13-3 lead over Oregon LW but then all'd 45 unanswered pts after a 1 hr lightning delay (outgained 447-333, outFD'd 26-14). UT is 0-3 as HD, UF 8-3 as an AF. The dynamics are different than LY when Kiffin fired up the Gator nation with his comments, but now that the Gators are back on track offensively expect UF to continue their series domination.

Usc 37 MINNESOTA 20 - The Trojans lead this series 4-1-1 SU with the last matchup in '80 (67-27-2 all-time vs B10). USC is 9-0 SU and 6-3 ATS in non conf AG's winning by 25 ppg and are in the middle of 3 RG's in the 1st 4 wks to begin the ssn. While the Trojans showed some improvement on the def side LW holding UVA to 337 yds, the offense had problems of their own scoring just 17 pts (327 yds) in their 3 pt victory. The Gophers are meanwhile just 1-6 ATS vs non-conf BCS schools and are off an embarrassing home loss to IAA foe South Dakota as they were unable to halt the Coyote pass gm (352 yds, 70%) who took advantage of 11 new starters on the Gopher defense. LY Minny hosted #8 Cal from the P10 and only lost 35-21 (+13) while the Trojans went just 1-7 ATS LY after a SU victory. The new USC coaching staff can not be happy with this season's start despite being 2-0 and they have better athletes to work to work with.

SMU 40 Wash St 17 - Legitimate revenge in this matchup as the Mustangs lost on the road LY in Pullman despite having a whopping 504-276 yd edge and leading 24-7 in the 3Q as QB Mitchell threw FOUR 2H int, including 2 for TD's and 1 on the 1st play of OT. Both teams have 15 ret st's and while the Cougars were expected to be improved, their performances in the 1st 2 wks has been a disappointment as they narrowly escaped at home vs IAA foe Mont St, a gm in which they were outFD'd 24-17 and outgained 407-316 (WSU int'd 2 late MT passes). SMU on the other hand has shown improvement taking TT down to the wire in the opener and coming out victorious in LW's meeting with UAB, a game in which they benefitted from some costly UAB RZ miscues. While the Mustangs are learning how to win as they are 1-7 ATS as a HF (0-3 as DD fav) and play for the Iron Skillet on Friday night vs TCU, WSU is just 9-17 ATS as an AD and have gotten hammered in their L/2 trips to Texas over the past 2 seasons being outscored by a 43-16 clip including 2 yrs ago when we had a strong 4★ on Baylor and they covered by 24'. The Mustangs get pay back as our **Revenge Game of the Week**.

WISCONSIN 33 Arizona St 23 - Last met in '68. The Sun Devils are 14-5 all-time vs the B10. Including bowls UW is 5-1 SU but 2-4 ATS vs the P10. UW has won 8 in a row SU in non-conf BCS games (6-2 ATS). ASU is 5-1 ATS in road openers and covered at Georgia LY. This is UW's only BCS foe in Sept so it will be their "A" game after struggling LW at home vs SJSU 27-13 as QB Tolzien threw an int and had 3 fmb'l's. RB Clay (260, 6.5) had his 8th straight 100 yd gm but the D allowed 2 passing TD's on SJSU's last 2 poss. ASU has won over 2 FCS foes (1-1 ATS) with their P10 opener on deck vs Oreg. ASU has just 9 ret st's but new QB Threet (315 ypg, 67%, 5-3 ratio) did start vs Wisky in '08 while at Mich and hit 12-31 with 2 int and had 89 yds rush in a 27-25 comeback win. ASU has the D (#23-41) and ST (#39-62) edges although their D front is outweighed on avg by 323-280.

Nebraska 27 WASHINGTON 24 - 1st meeting S/'98. NU will be breaking in a QB making his 1st career road start in Martinez who has been a terror for the Husker run gm (284 rush, 13.5 ypc, 5 TD) over the 1st 2 gms in wins vs WKU and Idaho. While the ssn started off on the wrong foot for the Huskies with a loss to BYU, they returned to their winning ways LW vs Syracuse as UW ended a 6 year (0-5 SU) home losing streak vs non-conf BCS programs w/a 3 TD victory. Sarkisian is 4-1 ATS as a HD and last year vs 3 ranked teams in that role they were 3-0 ATS upsetting #3 USC, #19 Cal (42-10) and outgaining #11 LSU 478-321 but coming up short. The Huskies have also gone 4-1-1 ATS against B12 opp's but haven't faced this fierce of a defense (#8 ranking, 289 ypg, 13.5 ppg). Neb is 7-3 ATS in non-conf AG's and escape out of the Pacific NW with a narrow victory.

OREGON ST 37 Louisville 16 - UL beat OSU 63-27 in '05 (only meeting) w/a 553-419 yd edge (UL led 56-13 after 3Q's as 158 of OSU's yds came in the 4Q) and we won with a 3★ LPS and a 2★ in Power Sweep. Long trip and road opener for UL and they are 2-6-1 ATS as an AD. UL is off new HC Strong's first win (10 pt win vs EKY with 388-230 yd edge). Home opener for OSU and they have 15 ret starters. OSU was outgained 453-255 by #6 TCU but only lost by 9 (+13) in the opener thanks to 2 TCU int. This is just the 2nd time S/'98 that OSU has hosted a non-conf BCS foe. OSU has large edges on off (#47-78), def (#36-84) and ST (#15-108). OSU is 8-1 ATS as a DD fav and this is their only HG in Sept, so force will be extra emphasis on this one especially since they are off a bye.

OKLAHOMA 48 Air Force 20 - These two have met only once with OU winning 44-3 in '01. AF is 5-2 ATS as an AD vs ranked foes and 15-4 SU/ATS in road openers. AF is in a MWC sandwich and OU is 16-6-1 ATS as a HF. Stoops admitted to holding back "a chunk" of his off in the 7 pt win over Utah St in wk 1, but let loose on his brother (FSU's DC) with an impressive 47-17 win over the Noles (10 of FSU pts in garbage time). QB Jones put up 321 1H pass yds, the 2nd most in OU hist and is avg 298 (62%) with a 6-2 ratio. RB Murray leads with 260 (5.1, 4 TD) and Broyles has more than triple the rec (21, 12.5) of the #2 rec (6). LW AF pulled off their first win over BYU S/'03, 35-14 (-2) outgaining the Cougs 477-309 with 409 of their yds on the ground. QB Jefferson has thrown for 247 yds (48%) with a 3-1 ratio while adding 97 rush (5.7, 3 TD). After 2 gms, Clark leads the rushers with 205 (6.8). OU clearly has the athletes on defense to disrupt the wishbone and the edges are too hard to ignore (off #7-62, def #1-67 and ST #7-21). With AF making its first road trip off rival BYU and in an MWC sandwich, we'll make OU our **Situational Play of the Week** as they're home for a 3rd straight game off a comfortable win.

TCU 40 Baylor 17 - TCU and Baylor are fierce old SWC rivals who played every yr from '45-'95). This is the 106th meeting but just the 3rd S/'95 as BU is 0-2 SU/ATS being outscored 44-7. HC Briles is 0-2 SU/ATS vs TCU in his career (both when he was the HC at Houston, '03 and '04). The Horned Frogs are 5-2 SU (4-2-1 ATS) vs B12 foes. TCU is off a 62-7 stomping of FCS Tenn Tech, extending their home win streak to 15. QB Dalton leads the way avg 179 ypg (67%) with a 2-2 ratio. Surprisingly no rec has over 100 yds yet, but RB Wesley is pacing the rushing unit with 219 (7.8). Baylor is off a 34-6 win over Buff where QB Griffin put up 230 pass yds in the 1H to bump his avg to 270 ypg (55%) with a 4-1 ratio. Finley leads with 127 rush yds (6.7) and the top rec's have just 8 grabs a piece. TCU is 3-0 SU/ATS at home vs BCS foes, has huge edges all around (off #9-53, def #11-59, ST #4-72) and knows this is an important game as they want to be in the title picture.

Marshall 27 BOWLING GREEN 24 - MU held BG to just 10 rush yards in LY's 17-13 win as a 3 pt HD as RB Darius Marshall ran for a then career-high 186 yds. Bowling Green is 14-5 SU and 10-5 ATS in Perry Stadium openers. MU was a member of the MAC from '97-'04 and was 4-2 SU and 2-4 ATS vs BG and this is their 2nd meeting since leaving the conf. Marshall has the much more veteran team with 14 ret st's (BG 8). The Herd blew a 21-6 4Q lead over in-state rival West Virginia last Friday, allowing a TD with :12 left to force OT. Marshall has played the much tougher schedule (#4-41) and has substantial edges on off and D. The Herd has Ohio on deck, who was their divisional rival when they were in the MAC while BG has urgency at 0-2 with a trip to Ann Arbor next week.

LOUISIANA TECH 23 Navy 20 - This is just the 2nd meeting between these two as Navy won 32-14 (-7) LY. LT jumped out to a 14-0 lead at the 9:02 mark in the 1Q but could only muster 93 yds the rest of the way as Navy scored 32 unanswered pts and had 393-167 yd and 23-10 FD edges and played "keep away" holding the ball for a huge 41-19 TOP edge. Navy just faced the option LW and now takes on a spread offense. The Midshipmen are 1-2 SU/ATS vs current WAC tms as LT is just the 2nd WAC school to face Navy (also Hawaii). The Midshipmen grounded out a 13-7 over FCS Georgia Southern LW where Navy gained just 193 yds with his triple option off gaining just 109 yds rushing, their lowest rushing total S/'02. LT DC Spangler spent 10 yrs at GA Southern so he is well-versed in the triple option and used a "Double Eagle" look on defense LY in an effort to confuse Navy QB Dobbs. LT's new spread offense is still a work in progress and HC Dykes has yet to settle on a QB to take over the keys to the off (3 diff QB's have seen action early on). LT is 9-1 SU (7-0 ATS) in Joe Aillet Stadium openers including 6 consecutive wins.

Ucf 20 BUFFALO 13 - Buffalo is 1-6 SU vs UCF but they've covered 2 of L/3. LY UB led 17-7 at HT but were shutout in the 2H w/just 106 yds on 5 poss that ended in 4 TO's and a punt. UCF is 2-11 SU but 9-4 ATS in road openers. The HT is 6-1 SU incl the last trip to Buffalo ('04, only UB win in series) when UCF had a 473-440 yd edge but 3 TO's resulted in 21 UB pts. Knights led 13-10 (2Q) before allowing 24 unanswered. UCF trailed NC State 28-7 before two 4Q TD's made it close as UCF had a 308-239 yd edge but was -5 TO's. The Bulls were outgained 493-325 by Baylor and trailed 34-6 in the 3Q. UCF has just an #85-110 offensive edge but they have a #30-68 def edge and an #11-118 ST edge.

KENTUCKY 41 Akron 10 - 1st meeting. UK (-15) destroyed MAC member Miami in LY's opener in Cincinnati at Bengals' Stadium, 42-0. Akron has dropped 16 straight "true" road openers by an avg of 28 ppg and is 7-4 ATS. UK is 3-7 ATS as a HF but covered LW in a 63-28 (-24') win over WKU. WR Cobb had a TD rec, TD pass and a 50 yd PR TD and RB Locke has had B2B 100 yd rush gms. QB Hartline has hit 72%, 430 pass, 3-0 ratio. Akron has had trouble adjusting to the pro style off and is off a 38-37 loss to FCS Gardner-Webb despite two 100 yd rushers (Allen and Burney). QB Nicely has 276 yds (46%) 1-1 ratio. UK is 5-3 ATS as a DD fav but just 2-5 as a HF. UK has dominated in non-conf play the last few yrs (22-2 SU since '06) with large edges on both sides of the ball (#40-116 off, #70-109 def) should continue that streak vs the Zips.

AUBURN 31 Clemson 21 - These schools are less than 250 miles apart. These two last met in the '07 Chick-fil-A Bowl and Aub (+2) defeated Clem in OT, 23-20. The situation does favor Clemson as they are off two weak tms with a bye on deck and this is their "A" game for Sept while Auburn is in an SEC sandwich. Aub does have 15 ret st's (#26 exp level) while Clem has just 13 (#56). Off a short week, Aub relied on a relentless effort from its D in the 17-14 Thurs night win over Miss St. Despite finishing with 21-16 FD and 348-246 yd edges, MSU made it to the AU41 before the final pass fell inc with :22 left. QB Newton has been impressive avg 161 ypg pass (61%) with a 5-1 ratio and leading Aub with 241 rush yds (7.3, 2 TD). The combo of RB's McCalebb and Dyer have comb for 287 (6.5). CU is 9-4 ATS in road openers. LW they handled Presbyterian in a 58-21 win with a 414-279 yd edge. CU QB Parker has yet to top 20 att in the gm, as they've established the run early. He is avg 142 ypg (58%) with a 4-1 ratio. RB Ellington (133, 8.9, 3 TD) and Harper (110, 9.2, 1) lead the rushers and the top rec's all have just 3 grabs. CU is on a 1-5 ATS run (only cover in bowl gm).

4★ New England (+) over NY JETS - The Jets are off what promises to be a very physical MNF game vs BAL and those results are unknown. LY the Jets shut down NE in the 1st meeting 19-9 as a 3 pt HD holding Brady to 216 yds (49%) with an int as he deftly threw the ball away instead of taking a sack. In the 2nd meeting after getting a good look at the Jets scheme and with a healthy Welker, Brady shredded the Jets for 310 yds (68%) with a TD in a 31-14 win as a 10' pt HF. Not only do the Patriots have the benefit of extra rest they just faced a defense that utilizes a lot of Ravens/Jets principles with the Bengals. Brady was very efficient with 258 yds (71%) 3-0 while their defense held Benson to 43 yds (2.9). CIN's 1H drives ended in 3 punts, 2 TO's, a FG and a 51 yd Hail Mary. Sanchez is still a young QB and will have a huge amount of pressure to cope with both by the fans and by Belichick who is his own DC now. NE knows that the Jets are a serious division rival and have been stockpiling all the clippings of Hard Knocks and other related materials. Look for them to make a statement here about who still runs the division.

FORECAST: New England 20 (+) NY JETS 14

3★ TENNESSEE over Pittsburgh - PIT fell to 1-4 ATS vs TEN as while they beat them 13-10 in OT LY they were a 6.5 pt HF in LY's season opener. PIT was outruled 86 (3.4) to 36 (1.6) and are without the 2 heroes of the game with Roethlisberger (363 yds 76% 1-2) and WR Holmes (9 rec 14.6). PIT kept the game straightforward for Dixon LW and he was efficient (236 yds 69% 0-1). PIT's defense was intense as they held ATL to 116 yds in the 1H with just 58 yds rushing (2.3) in the entire game. The win was costly as they will be without LT Starks (ankle sprain) and NT Hampton (hamstring) here. Now they have to go on the road vs a TEN team that also prides itself on physical play. TEN beat an OAK team LW that was adjusting to a new QB and OC, holding them to 38 yds passing in the 1H. While Chris Johnson had 142 yds (5.3) Young was very sharp with 184 total yards. TEN final stats were misleading as they had a 264-106 HT edge and a 24-6 lead. TEN has the advantage of being home for a 2nd straight wk again facing a run oriented team with a DL that had 4 sacks and 4 qbh LW. PIT 14 FD's LW were enough to escape at home vs ATL but without being able to establish long drives it'll be a long game vs the Titans defense. Our injury system says to play on a team the first game after a major loss but then play against them.

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ ATLANTA over Arizona - Counting the playoffs this is the 4th meeting in 5 years (ATL 2-1 ATS) with ARZ beating ATL 30-24 (Even) at home in the 2008 playoffs. The Cardinals shut down RB Turner (42 yds 2.3) while bringing relentless pressure on then rookie Ryan (199 yds 65% 2-2). ATL was in a tough situation LW vs a veteran laded PIT team rallying together in their home opener. ATL couldn't get any balance on offense (25/44 rush/pass) and RB Turner was held to just 42 yds (2.2). The situation is now in favor of ATL at home vs an ARZ team on the road for the 2nd straight week that has had a lot of changeover on both sides of the ball. ATL is one of the better home teams avg 26.1 ppg and 357 ypg (11-5 ATS) under HC Smith the L2Y as they are built for speed. ARZ runs a Steeler style 3-4 defense which will help Ryan (252 yds 61% 0-1) in his presnap reads here. ARZ only had a 53 yd edge vs the woeful Rams, fumbled the ball 7 times with 2 of the 4 losses coming inside the STL 25. We'll side with the more consistent ATL team at home as we are very aware of QB Anderson's issues. **FORECAST: ATLANTA 34 Arizona 20**

2★ Jacksonville (+) over SAN DIEGO - We don't mind making a Jaguar call without having seen SD's Monday night game. JAX took care of business covering vs DEN despite getting outgained 363-299. The Jag's did what they do best led by efficient QB David Garrard (170, 76%, 3-0) and RB Jones-Drew (98, 4.3). They played turnover-free and had only 5 penalties and that is exactly what you want when backing a road underdog. SD starts this year w/o LY's leading RB (L.T.), leading WR (Jackson) and top OL (McNeil). The Chargers are also on a short week, off a div road game, have another road game on deck and finished their L/8 games LY allowing 5.0 ypc rushing. The Chargers success has come from playing in the NFL's weakest division. This is a great spot to play to grab some value as the **Ugly Dog Play (25-16-1 61%)**.

CLEVELAND 23 Kansas City 16 - Both coaching staffs are loaded with Bill Belichick disciples and after taking a year off Romeo Crennel will get to face his former team. KC is primed for a huge letdown here as they are off their 1st MNF HG since Nov-2004 and now have to travel. CLE led from the first score through mid-4Q vs TB but allowed a 47/6pt TD drive and failed their last 3 drives. CLE beat KC 41-34 as a 2 pt AD LY as CLE rushed for 351 yds (7.2), Cribbs had KR TD's of 100 and 103 yds and KC WR's dropped 9 passes. Delhomme (227, 54%, 1-2) did a nice job spreading the ball as 10 different rec's caught passes inc 6 that had 4+ rec's. The OL also kept him clean allowing only 2 qbh and no sacks. The Browns finished LY covering 4 straight home games by 10 ppg and get another here for the hometown faithful.

GREEN BAY 31 Buffalo 10 - The Bills big concerns of poor OL play and lack of a pass rush were realized LW vs MIA which only had 5 returning defensive starters from 2009 playing. BUF only had 166 yds offense in the 1H with Edwards managing a meager 4.1 ypa in the game. The Bills struggled away LY (254 ypg and 15.1 ppg) and now face LY's #2 defense which held PHI to 49 1H yards. While BUF does have a good secondary they are adjusting to a new 3-4 system and that is a huge concern vs a GB OL that returned all 5 starters from a unit that has allowed 10 sacks over L8 regular season games. We're sure the Packers would admit to letting up as after they led 20-3 LW the offense had a total of 14 plays in four 4Q drives. GB not only went 3-0 LY as a DD fav but those games by an avg score of 36-7. While having a MNF div game on deck may seem like a distraction GB showed LY that they'll stay focused as they were -6.5 at STL with a MNF game at MIN on deck and won 36-17.

Baltimore 20 CINCINNATI 17 - CIN improved to 8-3 SU and ATS vs BAL after sweeping both games LY. While Palmer only avg'd 248 ypg (59%) with a 2-1 ratio, Benson avg'd 119 ypg (3.9) with only MIN RB Peterson having more success on the ground LY (143 yds 6.5). Overall CIN had a 386-236 yd edge while Flacco was intercepted a combined 4 times. CIN's offense got off to a slow start and on their 1st play inside NE territory (6:04 left 1H), Palmer was int'd for a 59 yd TD return. The Bengals finished with a 428-376 yd edge with Owens and Ochocinco combining for 19 rec's (11.1 ypc) while RB Benson was held to just 43 yds (2.9) though CIN did abandon the run due to falling behind. BAL is of course off the opening MNF game vs the Jets and in the last 2 seasons they've gone 1-2 SU/ATS in that role. Flacco has handled himself well away vs division opp's leading the Ravens to a 4-1-1 ATS mark. The schedule makers have done BAL no favors as they are 1 of only 4 teams to be playing B2B road games to open the season and the only to face a div foe, plus its on a short week.

Philadelphia at DETROIT - While Kevin Kolb was to make his 1st NFL road start but the plans have changed after getting KO'd LW. PHI is 7-3 ATS as non-div AF and will now be under the direction of Michael Vick. Vick (175, 67%, 1-0) led a valiant comeback effort as he had 103 yds rush (9.4) but will now be the focus

TEXAS TECH 25 Texas 24 - The favorite is just 6-11 ATS and LY Texas was playing with revenge for their only '08 loss which kept them out of the title game but "survival" is the word HC Brown used to describe the victory LY vs TT as they were outFD'd and outgained. The HT is 8-4 ATS. UT is only #108 in exp level and this is their 1st true road trip to a hostile environment and QB Gilbert's (197, 62%, 1-0) 1st B12 road start. The Horns spent the offseason working on the run gm which has avg'd 181 ypg (4.8). The Horns actually trailed Wyoming 7-6 in the 2Q before 'waking up' although the Cowboys were SOD at the UT18, 15 and 36 in the 2H. Thanks to 2 blk'd P and a 93 yd KR TT overcame a short week and plowed NM 52-17 despite having just a 462-433 yd edge. QB Potts (326, 64%, 7-0) has handled the transition to the new offense well. UT has a big D edge (#3-61) but the Horns may not survive TY in Lubbock, at night, in Tuberville's first B12 matchup.

DET finished with just 168 yds and the anemic rush game totaled 20 yds (1.0). DET is also likely to be without QB Stafford (throwing shoulder) and #2 QB Hill finished with 88 yds (47%, 0-1). Tough spot for both teams to recoup with backups and we'll pass on this one here and look at it further this week.

DALLAS 24 Chicago 17 - The Cowboys are off LY's SNF game vs WAS (9-2-1 ATS at home afterwards) and those results are unavailable. CHI was situationally in a very strong spot LW at home vs a DET defense which had given up the most yardage and points in each of the L3Y. DET had 3 new starters on the DL and in the secondary with Cutler hitting for 372 yds (66%, 2-1). The tables are turned here as they now face LY's #9 defense that pulled in 49 sacks after allowing 4 sacks and 7 QBH's vs DET. While DAL did allow 303 yds (64%) with a 2-1 ratio the last time they faced a Martz offense 105 yds and both TD's were in garbage time after DAL had a 32-9 lead. DAL will have the crowd to help throw off the OL's snap count (4 diff players in 5 OL spots LW) and DAL CB's should matchup well vs CHI's average WR's here. We'll call for DAL by 7 and wait for a line.

CAROLINA 13 Tampa Bay 10 - Fox is 11-5 SU and ATS vs TB, winning both SU and ATS LY by 7 and 10 pts. CAR's ground game was at the forefront of each game with a 212 (5.2) to 139 (5.5) edge. Freeman had double the passing yards of Moore (321-161) in the 2nd game LY with a 469-309 yd edge. However he was int'd 4 times inside the CAR 25 (5 total) which CAR converted into 9 pts. Freeman (thumb) missed most of the preseason and it showed. He only had 182 yds (61%) with a 2-1 with 1 TD set up by a 64 yd IR. CAR was able to hang with the Giants in the 1H LW holding them to just 8 yds rushing (0.6) in the 1H but were outgained 196-72 in the 2H with 4 TO's. Freeman has a play style similar to a younger Vince Young in that he doesn't put up dominating stats but makes plays to put the team in a spot to win. CAR may start QB Clausen here as Moore may be forced to sit out due to the NFL's strict concussion rules. We'll call for the home team to win by 3 for now in a lower scoring game and wait for an injury update.

MINNESOTA 33 Miami 17 - The Vikings were outcoached in LW's game vs NO being held to just two FD's and 65 yds in the 2H. Caught with only 3 healthy CB's NO went after the secondary in the 1H diffusing MIN's elite front 7 then running against it in the 2H (70 yds on 23 att's). Favre was sharp in the 1H with 127 yds (73%) with a 1-1 ratio but NO dropped 8 into coverage in the 2H. MIN now has the edge of extra rest here and practice reps to get Favre and his WR's on track. RB Peterson's 87 yds rushing (4.6) weren't as bad as it looked LW as he didn't get a lot of touches in the 2H (6 att 30 yds). After struggling to put away BUF LW MIA now finds itself in a tough spot on the road for the 2nd straight week with primetime games vs the Jets and Patriots on deck. While Henne completed 62% of his passes he only had a 5.4 ypa as the Dolphins punted on 6 of their 7 2H drives. We'll side with an angry Vikings team with a loud home crowd and a greater array of weapons on both sides of the ball here.

OAKLAND 21 St Louis 14 - OAK was in a poor situation LW as after playing 4 straight night games in preseason they had to travel out to TEN and play a 10 am Pacific time game. With a new QB and OC running a new system the Raiders were outmatched being outgained 318-139 thru the 1st 3Q before TEN lost interest. Campbell (180 yds 47% 1-1) was expected to have a learning curve but the Raiders new run defense gave up 205 yds (5.3) on the ground. They now take a step down vs the one-dimensional Rams who were held to 85 yds (3.5) rushing LW. Bradford was forced to air it out 55 times (253 yds 1-3) which will give the Raider defense plenty of film to break down. STL was only able to stay in the game due to ARZ's poor ball security (7 fumbles - 4 lost) and 10 penalties. While OAK hasn't covered as a HF since Oct 2005 (0-10 ATS) they are a team with a plan and do have more talent defensively. They now get a rookie QB making his 1st start in the Black Hole with a very young supporting cast and the home team is the play.

DENVER 30 Seattle 24 - These two former AFC West rivals have met just twice since the NFL went to its current div format in '02 with the road team going 2-0 SU and ATS. LW despite the 24-17 loss to JAX, DEN played well with 21-18 FD and 363-299 yd edges. QB Orton managed 295 yds (63.6%) with a 1-1 ratio and will face LY's #30 pass D (245 ypg). While SEA cruised to a 31-6 win at home vs SF, the game was closer than indicated as SF had 3 poss inside the SEA10 but came away with just 6 pts. SEA also had a 32 yd IR TD and were outgained 263-242. QB Hasselbeck was efficient with 170 yds (78.3%) and a 2-1 ratio. The Broncos are just 1-9-1 as a HF the L2Y but SEA was 0-6 as a AD LY. DEN has won 5 consec HG SU against NFC foes (avg 23-16) while SEA has lost its L/6 SU on the road vs the AFC. The Seahawks played with great emotion LW in HC Carroll's first game but it will be tough to take that emotion on the road.

WASHINGTON 20 Houston 17 - WAS is off LY's SNF game vs DAL and those results are unknown. HOU HC Gary Kubiak used to be Mike Shanahan's OC and Kyle Shanahan was on the Texans coaching staff as the WR then QB then OC from 2006-2009. WAS will know exactly how WR Johnson likes to run his routes as well as how Schaub goes thru his reads and checkdowns here. HOU will be getting lots of accolades from the media after only their 2nd win ever vs IND. HOU never trailed in the game and won by 10 as the Colts allowed a franchise high 257 yds (6.1) on the ground. Their defense was looked in as they forced IND to punt on their 1st 4 drives and forcing Manning to put it up 57 times. However, Schaub was inconsistent with 107 yds (53%) 1-1 and only had 5 pass att's in the 2nd half. They now have to travel with the intensity of opening week behind them with a big in-state rivalry vs DAL on deck. We've seen lots of team deflate after a big win (HOU 5-9 ATS) and the Texans haven't proven to be the most consistent team.

Indianapolis at NY GIANTS - In the 1st ever NFL game to feature 2 brothers at QB, Peyton beat his brother Eli 26-21 as a 3 pt fav in '06. Both QB's played well with both having 2 TD passes but Eli turned the ball over twice (with a missed FG) which led to 17 pts for IND. The NYG won LW but Eli did toss 3 int's and struggled with high passes. Peyton had 57 att's but the final 2 TD's came on the last 2 drives as Indy dropped their meeting at HOU. Can the NYG go to 2-0? Rice is 17-8-2 ATS as a home dog S/'00 (1-3-1 ATS with an outright upset LY). NW beat IL St 37-3 with a 434-263 yd edge as the NCAA pass eff leader Persa (279, 86%, 5-0 ratio) accounted for 3 TD. After a 16-7 1Q lead the Owls came back to beat NT 32-31 on a TD run with 6:22 left as the Mean Green punted and was SOD at the Rice47 with :46 left. NT finished with 17-13 FD and 420-351 yd edges. QB McHargue (shoulder) left the gm in the 2Q and DNR with LY's starter Fannuzzi hitting 12-23 for 189 but with a goal line int with :12 left 1H. NW's has the off and D edges but it's tough to trust the Cats laying pts on the road.

Mississippi St 20 LSU 17 - LSU held off MSU with 3 attempts inside the 1 yd line with a minute left to pull out a 30-26 win in Starkville. QB Jefferson threw for career-high 233 yds, 2 TD. MSU had 374-263 yd and 21-12 FD edges but had 4 TO's in the 1H. LSU has won 10 straight and 17 of the last 18 vs MSU outscoring them 404-131 in the last 10. LSU is 10-3 ATS in this series, but MSU has covered the last 2. MSU is 2-6 ATS in road openers and this will be MSU QB Relf (226, 54%, 1-1) or Russell's (275, 68%, 4-1) first road start in one of the loudest stadiums in the NCAA at night (28-2 SU in home night gms under Miles). MSU is off a disappointing Thurs night loss to Auburn in which they were held to 246 total yds and 14 pts. LSU is off a 27-3 win over Vandy in which their D held VU to just 135 total yds. LSU QB Jefferson (247 pass, 56%, 2-2 ratio) hasn't produced as expected and was replaced by Lee LW. MSU came close LY and while they have to face LSU without steady RB Dixon, they're a team with enough talent to pull the upset.

Utah 41 NEW MEXICO 13 - LY, UT true QB Wynn was making his 1st start and Wide set a school record with his sixth 100 yd rush gm (totaled 122 in 3Q alone). This is NM's 3rd str tough foe and they are just #115 in our exp rankings. So far this year, NM is 0-2 ATS with the avg line +30 and the avg loss 62-9. After a pitiful showing vs Oreg, NM did put up better numbers LW (only outFD'd 24-23, outgained 462-433) in their 52-17 loss to TT. QB Holbrook is avg 197 ypg (55%) but with a 1-4 ratio. The top rusher, Hernandez, has 45 yds and that came on a NM fmb! that he recovered and advanced for a TD. LW QB Cain (207, 65%, 2-0 ratio) got the start and led UT to a 38-10 win over LV (CS on Wynn). RB's Wide (123, 5.1, 2 TD) and Asiatu (105, 4.4) have split the carries 50/50 with each having 24. WR's Christopher and Brooks have almost identical stats with each having 9 rec and 164 yds. Although NM has lost 3 str to Utah by an avg 18 ppg, the last time here the Utes squeaked out a 13-10 win (TCU on deck) not covering as a 7 pt AF (visitor on 0-4 ATS run). That seems a moot point after watching NM the L2W.

Fresno St 31 UTAH ST 28 - Fresno has won 6 of the L7 in the series. The Bulldogs are 6-2-1 SU vs the Aggies S/90 but are 1-8 ATS in those gms. There have been some closely contested gms in recent yrs as LY USU led 27-24 mid-4Q but allowed a 78/3pl TD drive and couldn't stop FSU from running out the clock. Last time here ('08), FSU (-15') kicked a 58 yd FG as time expired for a 30-28 win. In fact, the L2 gms in Logan have been decided by a comb 3 pts with USU (+27) winning 13-12 in '06. The Aggies suffered major offseason losses to their skill positions losing top rusher (RB Turbin, ACL) and receiver (WR Morrison, broken foot) to inj's. Despite the setbacks, QB Borel has shouldered an increased workload and is avg 298 ypg (61%) with a 3-3 ratio and LW became the 7th USU QB to pass for 5,000 career yds. His counterpart is also off to a good start as FSU QB Colburn passed for 247 yds (75%) and matched his career high with 4 TD (4-1 ratio) in the opener vs Cincy. Fresno also has the edge on def (#45-80) and Bulldog HC Hill had to love what he saw early on from his DL as they recorded 8 sks in the opener (Harrell 4, Carter 3) after posting just 11 sks as an entire team in '09. The DL will need to be a presence here again in what is likely to be another close contest.

Boise St 34 WYOMING 17 - Boise is 4-0 SU (avg win by 14 ppg) but only 1-3 ATS vs Wyoming. The Pokes have been no pushovers for the Broncos and the last time here ('06), BSU won 17-10 (-7') but was outgained 251-246 getting an int in the EZ on 4D to stop UW. The Pokes play 3 BCS participants from LY and are the only tm to face two in B2B wks (Texas LW). UW QB Carta-Samuels is avg 240 (75%) with a 3-1 ratio. War Memorial Stadium sits 7,220 feet above sea level (highest elevated venue in FBS, Boise sits at 2,700) and the thin air can be a 12th man at times. But UW will need more than elevation to slow down the Broncos as they have large edges on off (#11-107), def (#15-83) and ST (#2-41). QB Moore passed for 215 yds (61%) with a 3-0 ratio in the opener while WR Pettis had 6 rec (12.2) incl 2 for TD (incl the GW) and also blk'd a P that set up another score. The shoe is officially now on the other foot for Boise as it goes from having to prove everyone wrong to now proving everyone right. BSU controls its BCS hopes right out of the gate instead of having to fight all season long to get into the picture. But the Broncos now have to win big and look good doing it to remain in elite company. Boise has its big home opener vs Oregon State on deck and can't overlook the pesky Pokes here.

UTEP 40 New Mexico St 23 - UTEP leads the "Battle of I-10" series 50-35-2 SU as these two rivals are just 45 miles apart. This is the Miners' longest running series in program history (88th meeting). The visitor is just 3-10 but has covered the L/5. These two have avg a comb 62 ppg in the L/10 with 3 of the L/4 decided by 6 or less. Last time here ('08), UTEP QB Vittatoe was inj'd early 1Q and the Miners couldn't overcome 3 TO's and NMST won 34-33 (+7) as the Aggies recorded their first win in the Sun Bowl S/94. While NMST lost its opener to SDSU 41-21 LW, HC Walker had to be pleased that his off was finally able to move the ball through the air (pass off was #118 in NCAA in '09 at 88 ypg) as QB Christian threw for 223 yds (50%) with a 2-0 ratio. UTEP has the edge on off (#70-115) and veteran Vittatoe is avg 285 ypg (58%) with a 3-1 ratio and his top target has been WR Adams who has 9 rec (18.0). The Miners are sorely missing RB Buckram (#4 rusher in NCAA in '09 with 1594 yds, 6.2 and 133 ypg) who has been out so far TY with a knee injury (CS) and tried to give it a go but couldn't LW vs Houston. UTEP is only 5-12 ATS as a HF and the Miners are 7-12 ATS vs the Aggies S/89, but they are 4-2 ATS under HC Price.

IDAHO 30 UNLV 27 - UNLV leads the series 3-2 SU (0-1 ATS). Four of the previous 5 gms have been played in Vegas and this will be only the second meeting in Moscow (last time was in '77). UNLV won the only lined game in the series 34-31 in '05 but failed to cover as a 12 pt fav. The Rebs finally get a more suitable opponent here after facing B2B ranked foes to open the season. Veteran QB Clayton is avg 150 ypg (45%) with a 1-0 ratio and is also leading the team in rushing with 87 yds (4.6). The Rebs will look to exploit a rebuilt UI OL (only 1 ret str) as protection has been a prob (11 sks all'd in the first 2 gms). QB Enderle had a miserable outing LW at Nebraska as he threw 5 int (2 ret'd for TD) and was also sk'd 5x's before being pulled from the game. He is avg 237 ypg (60%) with a 3-6 ratio. The Rebels are just 2-8 SU (4-6 ATS) in non-conf AG's and UNLV is 1-9 SU and 1-8-1 ATS in the 2nd of B2B AG's. The Vandals are on an 0-3 SU/ATS skid vs FBS foes in the Kibbie Dome and are 1-4 ATS as a HF under HC Akey.

Houston 34 UCLA 30 - The Cougars have gone just 3-8 ATS in road openers but have some nice momentum coming into the Rose Bowl after a 30 pt win over conf rival UTEP on Friday but the win may have proved to be somewhat costly as Heisman hopeful QB Keenum left the gm with an apparent head inj (CS). UCLA's offense continues to be in neutral after a lackluster performance vs Stan that saw them get shutout at home for the 1st time S/99 (233 til yds). While UH rates the edge on offense (#3-81), UCLA has edges on defense (#39-91) and ST's (#1-28). UCLA has been solid at home vs non-BCS teams going 23-1 SU winning by an avg of 38-13. The Cougars however will come into this matchup with confidence after facing and coming out victorious in their 2 trips to BCS schools LY including the huge upset of #5 Okla St but the outcome will all depend on their star returning.

STANFORD 40 Wake Forest 23 - Stanford is 8-3 ATS vs non-conf opp and this one is played with legitimate revenge as LY in a game that started at 9 am PDT, Stanford dominated the 1H but ended up losing 24-17 on the road due to some questionable calls during the 2H that all'd the Deacons back into the game. The Cardinal put up a dominating shutout performance LW in the Rose Bowl vs UCLA (223 yds all'd) and has now outscored their 1st 2 opp of the ssn by a 87-17 margin. The Deacons on the other hand posted a 2nd straight game of 50+ pts to begin the year as they held off Duke for the 6th pt win. WF is 4-0 SU/ATS vs the P10 but are 5-16 SU and 9-12 ATS in road openers and will be starting this game at 11:15 pm EDT giving the Cardinal the advantage this time not to mention the fact that they are on an 11-2 ATS run at home.

Indiana 42 WKU 28 - WK HC Willie Taggart's first HG will be promoted as a "red-out". In their first and only meeting in '08 home standing IU outFD'd (21-14) and outgained (450-282) WKU w/a 24-6 lead after 3Q (only won 31-13, -20). IU is 4-8-1 ATS in non-conf road gms and 3-6-1 ATS L10Y in road openers. WKU is 13-1 SU in home openers. Indy has had 16 days off after their opening Thursday night win over Towson, 51-17. All B10 WR Doss (hamstring) DNP vs the Tigers but is expected to return. WK is 0-2 SU/ATS with losses to Neb and Kentucky by a combined 112-38. The Hilltoppers got their 1st lead of ssn on a 59 yd TD run by Rainey on their 3rd play but it was all UK after as the Cats took a 42-14 HT lead. WK is #119 NCAA scoring (56 ppg) and t/d (509).

NTexas 31 ARMY 30 - Army has won all 3 gms vs NT incl LY's misleading final. The Black Knights were outgained by 160 yds (-12 FD's) but had a 5-0 TO edge and a blk'd 4Q FG propelled them to victory. NT did have the ball with 1:43 left but threw an int. In fact, all 5 of their TO's were inside Army territory. Army is 3-7 ATS as a HF the L/4Y including 0-4 ATS LY being upset twice. Army trailed 21-0 to Hawaii in the 2Q but took a 28-21 lead in the 3Q before allowing 10 unanswered pts in a 3 pt loss. NT trailed Rice 16-7 in the 1Q but led 28-23 in the 3Q before giving up a 4Q TD to lose by 1. Army is a favorite for a 3rd straight week for the first time since 1996. NT does have their SBC opener on deck but HC Dodge needs wins to keep his job so they should not be looking ahead. Army has the defensive edge (#78-94) while NT has the offensive edge (#57-103) and has played the much tougher schedule (#30-79).

TEXAS A&M 45 Florida Int'l 17 - First meeting. A&M is 18-2 vs current SBC teams but in '08 lost to Arkansas St 18-14 (outgained 415-303) in Sherman's college HC debut. FIU is 4-1 ATS in road openers but is 0-4 vs B12 opponents being outscored on avg 47-9. The Aggies have a bye on deck. They beat Louisiana Tech 48-16 as a 19 pt HF but led just 31-16 in the 3Q before finishing with a 565-269 yd edge. FIU outgained (371-172) and outFD'd (15-8) Rutgers and led 14-13 in the 4Q but could not hold on as 16 pt HD. While A&M has the offensive (#5-94) and defensive (#40-90) edges, FIU does have the ST edge (#50-75) which could help them keep it under the number.

Middle Tennessee 31 MEMPHIS 28 - These two are just 245 miles apart. After consec defeats on the road to Miss St and EC, the Tigers return home losers of 3 straight home openers (1-2 ATS) and very well could have a QB controversy on their hands as bkup QB Williams (293 yds, 72%) outplayed starting QB Smith (19 yds, 50%) for a 2nd straight wk. Memphis has dropped the L/2 in this series ('07 and '09) being outgained by no less than 210 yds in each but may get the advantage of having MT's star QB Dasher sitting out yet another one here as he's been susp all ssn thus far. After falling short in their opener vs Minny, the Raiders earned their 1st win of the ssn LW vs FCS member Austin Peay rolling up 654 yds of offense (353 rush) in the 23rd pt win. Despite the potential absence of their star, MT (9-2 ATS in road openers) figures to be pumped for their in-state rival making this a potential down to the wire finish.

UAB 30 Troy 27 - The HT has covered B2B games. Eighth in-state meeting (1st gm in '93 as IAA foes). LY Troy's Levi Brown threw for 413 yds in this gm (1st TU QB S/68 to eclipse 400+ pass in single gm, Sim Byrd) and Troy led 10-0 at HT and 24-6 after 3Q's. UAB was outgained by 266 but the last time here ('06) they held Troy to 202 yds all'g just 4 plays in the redzone (after fmb!) with 6 sks. UAB is a much more veteran team with 16 ret str's (Troy 9) and they do have the defensive edge (#86-104) but Troy still has the stronger off (#51-101) and ST's (#20-100). We won our 4★ College Totals GOM on the Over in the Troy/OKSt game as the Trojans lost the shoot out by just 3 as a 13' pt AD despite being outgained 522-371. UAB shot themselves in the foot vs SMU and after fumbling a sure TD out of the EZ for a touchback vs the Mustangs seemed to give up and were outgained 421-261. This after blowing a 28-12 lead vs FAU in the opener to lose by 1. Troy has their SBC opener on deck while UAB has a road trip to Tenn.

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PRO ANGLES

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping, or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings, is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situational handicapping (analysis of letdown, lock ahead, systems) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. For more complete analysis you should read Ten Keys To A Winning Season. Each week in Power Sweep we provide the angle section to add to your handicapping arsenal. Many times we will agree with the angle plays. Sometimes the Fundamental & Situational aspects of a game will outweigh the angles & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on. We are NOT Technical handicappers, but we do use them in our handicapping analysis. Each week in Power Sweep we provide pro angles for the current week's games. For the angle plays the number in the () indicates how many angles apply to that team. The higher the number the stronger the angle play.

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc...) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. **We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on.** If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
