NEWS AND NOTES

LAS VEGAS BOWL Boise St (-14*) 56 Arizona St 24 - Kellen Moore finished his final game with 50 career wins in the NCAA, a record that we cannot foresee being broken. He hit 26-34-293 yds. BS did get a couple of big plays to turn this into a blowout. Many questioned the attitude of ASU coming in as they had fired their HC Erickson and anointed Todd Graham as the HC. Any notions of ASU giving a huge performance for their outgoing coach probably went away on the opening KO when BS deflated ASU with a 100 yd KR TD. The next 3 pass were punts then BSU went 54/8pl for a TD. BS was int'd at the ASU25 but on their next drive went 80/8pl and got a 2 yd TD pass with 12:03 left 2Q, 21-0. 2 punts. ASU went 66/12pl but settled for a 32 yd FG. BS went 72/12pl and converted on 4&5 for a FD to the ASU5 and brought Moore out and their bkp QB handed off to Miller who threw a 5 yd TD pass with :43 left 1H, 28-3. At half BSU had a 269-111 yd edge. ASU threatened to get into it. They got a 98 yd KR by Ross to open the 3Q for a TD, 28-10. They got an int but on 4th & 4 Erickson sent the punt team in. Osweiler waved them off and went for it but his pass fell incomplete from the BS39. BSU fmbld and ASU went 49/7pl. They had a 1st & gl at the 5. They had 2 shotgun runs from the 1 which were both stopped and then with Erickson trying to call time-out for at least :05, the refs did not call time-out and Osweiler's pass into the EZ which would have made it 28-17 was int'd and ret'd 105 yds for a TD and blew open what would have been an 11 pt game to a 35-10 lead. BSU took their next pass 80/10pl for a TD, 42-10 then got a 26 yd FR TD 2pl later, 49-10. ASU went 54/3pl for a 21 yd TD pass, 49-17 and then went 60/6pl but was SOD at the BSU26. BSU went 74/12pl for a TD with 2:24 left then ASU went 75/7pl getting a TD with :28 left on a 30 yd pass. Boise finished with a 460-384 yd edge.

Idaho Potato Bowl Ohio (+2) 24 Utah St 23 - OU got their first 10 win season since 1968 and had been winless in their 5 bowl appearances. They had to overcome a 23-10 deficit. US'ts opening drive went 73/12pl but on 4&gl from the 1 they were SOD. On 3&8 OU QB Tettleton had the ball slip out of his hands and he scooped it up in the EZ and ran out of the back of the EZ for a safety. USt went 50/9pl for a TD after the free kick, 9-0. 4 punts. OU went 56/7pl and got a 26 yd TD pass, 9-7 (4:40). US33 went 45/10pl but missed a 39 yd FG wide right with 1:42 left in the half. At half US had a 184-119 yd edge. After an OU punt to open the 3Q US on 2&1 got a 63 yd TD run by Smith, 16-7. OU25 went 60/8pl but settled for a 32 yd FG, 16-10 (9:52). USt went 83/9pl and an 11 yd TD run by Smith put them up comfortably 23-10 (5:51 3Q). OU answered going 66/5pl. Tettleton ran right on a possible option, stepped back and hit Brazill for a 44 yd TD pass, 23-17 (3:45 3Q). 4 punts. US7 took over with 4:23 left but were forced to punt 4 plays later on 4&9 and OU went 61/9pl and on 4&6 they got a 13 yd pass to Brazill that was ruled a TD at one point but spotted at the 1. Two plays later Tettleton's 1 yd TD run gave OU its first lead of the game and the win, 24-23 with just :13 left.

NEW MEXICO BOWL Temple (-7) 37 Wyoming 15 - WY had to be concerned about their weak rush D vs TU's strong rush offense but TU's def front 7 also did a fine job holding WY to 267 yds. TU's opening drive went 90/13pl taking up half the first quarter and made it 7-0. WY answered with an 11 play drive but missed a 49 yd FG and TU went 69/9pl for a 1 yd TD run, 14-0. WY was int'd from midfield and ret'd 30 yds. TU went 35/6pl for a TD, 21-0. 2 punts. WY went 62/11pl and on 4&3 got a 21 yd TD pass with :37 left and it appeared they would be taking momentum to the locker room but on the next play, TU got a 61 yd TD pass to Streeter as the DB feel down and TU had reestablished momentum and pretty much snuffed out WY's hopes, 28-7. At the half TU had a 278-160 yd edge. WY opened the 3Q with a 13pl drive but punted. TU went 60/13pl for a 34 yd FG then went 47/7pl for a 37 yd FG to lead 34-7 (12:50). WY got 1 FD and was int'd and TU would go 56/13pl getting a 34 yd FG with 3:22 left to lead 37-7. WY29 showed some heart (using all 3 time-outs on their final drive) and went 71/10pl and got a 14 yd TD pass with :03 left and their 2 pt conversion made it 37-15 putting the game Over the total.

Navy 27 Army (+7) 21 - Navy defeated Army for a 10th straight year in the only college game played that weekend (Dec 10). Navy opened with a 58/13pl drive but fmbld at the 19. Army, however, fmbld it back 3pl later so Navy went just 26/6pl for a TD, 7-0 (1:06 1Q). 2 punts. Army fmbld at the Navy45 and Navy went 55/7pl for a TD, 14-0 (7:05). Army went 67/8pl and got a 34 yd TD run by Steelman, 14-7 (3:34). Navy went 3&out punting with 2:45 left and Army went 63/7pl and got a 5 yd TD run by Brown with :49 left in the half to make it 14-14. Navy opened the 3Q with a 48 yd KR and went 48/5pl for a TD. Army went 74/6pl and got a 25 yd TD pass, 21-21. Navy got 1 FD and fmbld but on their next drive went 75/18pl incl a 4&1 conv at the Army14. They settled for a 23 yd FG on 4&gl from the 6, 24-21 (12:03). Army fmbld the ensuing KO at their own 27 and Navy added a 44

yd FG to lead 27-21 (10:26). Army still had a shot. At their 23 they went 51/12pl but on 4&7 with 4:31 left, Steelman was tk'd. Navy got 1 FD. They lined up like they were going for it on 4&1 and Army jumped offsidies. That allowed Navy to run 4 more plays and punt with only :02 left in the game and Army's last play from its own 10 gained 29 yds.

ST PETERSBURG BOWL Marshall (+4*) 20 FIU 10 - This was closer than the final as MU at the end of the game, faced a 4th & 5 at the FIU35 trying to run the clock and opted to go for it and got a 35 yd TD pass with :30 left. It was a def struggle as MU had just a 14-12 FD edge. MU took its 2nd pass 45/10pl but settled for a 37 yd FG. MU got a 39 yd PR to the FIU44 but on the first play Cato was int'd at the 19 and ret'd 34 yds. FIU went 47/8pl for a TD, 7-3 (1:31). 2 punts. MU went 22/6pl but passed incomplete on 4&4 at the FIU35 (8:59). FIU went 36/8pl and got a 46 yd FG, 10-3. 2 punts. MU went 55/6pl. On 1st & 15 they got a 31 yd TD pass with :23 left in the half to tie it at 10. At half MU, thanks to that drive, had a 166-137 yd edge. The 2H opened with 9 punts with the teams combining for 7 FD's on those drives. With 7:35 left in the half MU blk'd a punt and ret'd 8 yds to the 3 and it was orig ruled a td but MU was called for ill forward pass as the RM tried to lateral it forward and then a PF and instead of getting a td they were backed up to the 23. MU gained 1 yd and got a 39 yd FG that bounced off the upright and in, 13-10 (5:16). FIU got a FD pass to Hilton but he fmbld at the end of it at the MU40 with 4:24 left. MU got 1 FD and thought about punting it from the FIU35 with :38 left but opted to go for it. Cato avoided the sk, hit a wide open Dobson as the DB fell down and got a 35 yd td pass with :30 left. MU avoided a losing season as they came in 6-6 and it was the 4th time this year MU blk'd a punt and the 4th time they won with Coach Holiday preaching that if they block, they win 90% of their games.

POINSETTIA BOWL TCU 31 Louisiana Tech (+9*) 24 - Many wondered how TCU would fair without record setting QB Andy Dalton but Casey Pachall set single season school records with 228 completions, 2921 yds and a comp% of 66.5%. LT had come in on a 7 game win streak and had signed Coach Dykes to a contract extension through 2017. LT appeared on its way to winning the game as they were up 24-17 after 3Q's. There were 4 long drives that resulted in 6 pts which made this game's final a lot lower than it should have been. LT went on a 67/13pl drive and made a 29 yd FG but had it taken off the board for a pers foul but still settled for a 23 yd FG, 3-0 (8:30). LT went 57/9pl but fmbld at the TCU35. TCU went 57/8pl for a 25 yd FG, 3-3. LT went 59/7pl and got a 2 yd TD pass, 10-3. LT's next drive went 60/10pl but they settled for a 43 yd FG and it bounced off the upright. LT's next drive (14) went 3&out. Roughing the P gave them a FD but they were int'd with 1:21 left in the half and ret'd 24 yds to their 25. TCU went 25/4pl for a TD and despite the fact that LT had a 266-144 yd edge at the half, the score was tied at 10. TCU opened the 3Q with a 55/11pl drive for a TD. TCU fmbld a punt at its own 12 setting up an LT 12/3pl TD drive, 17-17. 2 punts. TCU26 got 1 FD and was int'd at the LT39. On 3&10 Cameron hit White with a 61 yd TD pass, 24-17 (2:10). TCU28 went 72/18pl converting on two 4&1 and got a TD with 7:49 left to tie it. LT went 3 &out punting with 6:24 left and TCU went 69/5pl with a 42 yd td pass to Dawson, 31-24. LT opted to punt on 4&7 with 3:33 left and TCU got 2 FD's running out the clock.

NEW ORLEANS BOWL Louisiana (+4) 32 San Diego St 30 - The largest crowd edge for any of the opening 6 bowls was clearly in the New Orleans Bowl. UL fans were probably about 40,000 strong (42,841 tt attendance) which is 10,000 more than what they avg at home games. Blaine Gautier broke Jake Delhomme's single season school records for yds passing (2,958) and td's (23) with those records standing since 1996. Gautier hit 24-40-470 yds shattering the New Orleans Bowl record for yards passing. UL needed a 50 yd FG as time ran out which would have been a 55 yd FG but SDS't was called for ill procedure on the 55 yd att despite being on defense. SDS't missed a 36 yd FG with 10:00 left and had a 29-25 FD edge but UL had a 236-200 yd edge. SDS't opened with a 53/11pl drive but settled for a 27 yd FG. 2 punts. UL went 80/10pl and got an 18 yd TD pass, 6-3 (xp blk'd, :25 1Q). UL got an 87 yd PR TD, 13-3 (14:00 2Q). SDS't went 71/16pl and on 4&1 they got a FD to the UL6 but the play was reviewed and spotted short. UL went 93/13pl but they on 4&gl from the 1 were int'd at the 4. At half UL had a 219-190 yd edge. UL opened the 3Q with a 73/3pl drive and got a 20 yd TD pass to Green, 19-3. SDS went 41/2pl for a TD, 19-10 which came on a 16 yd TD pass. 3 punts. SDS't was pinned at their 1 and went 99/7pl and got a 16 yd TD pass to Lockett, 19-17 (3:40). UL went 78/14pl for an 11 yd TD pass with 12:48 left, 26-17. SDS38 went 43/7pl but missed a 36 yd FG with 10:14 left. SDS't went 55/10pl for a TD with 5:40 left, 26-24. UL went 72/10pl and had a 1st & gl at the 3 but settled for a 22 yd FG, 29-24. SDS31 went 69/10pl. They converted on 4&2 at their own 44 and got a 12 yd TD pass with :35 left to apparently pull out the win. They missed the 2 pt conv and UL got 13 and 26 yd passes on 3&5 they lined up for a 55 yd FG but SDS was called for ill snap and UL got a 50 yd FG on the final play.

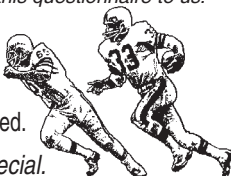

4★ CINCINNATI over Baltimore - The Ravens have 2 won straight including 31-24 earlier TY (7 pt HF) but are 0-4-1 ATS vs the Bengals. In that earlier meeting, BAL allowed a season-high 490 yds and held CIN on a 4th and goal from their 7 after blowing a 31-14 lead. LW these two had almost identical games with BAL leading CLE 17-0 at HT while CIN led ARZ 20-0. Both also allowed their opp's within a score as the Ravens were outscored 14-3 and the Bengals 16-3 in the 2H. BAL needs a win to secure a 1st RD bye while CIN needs a win to get into the postseason. BAL is only +14 ypg (-6 TO's) on the road (3-4 ATS) vs +85 ypg (+4 TO's) at home (4-3-1 ATS). Flacco has been rather avg on the road TY avg 23-27 ypg (56%) with a 9-6 ratio with 3 of those TD's being vs STL back in Wk 3. CIN's #6 rush defense is only allowing 97 ypg (3.7) and they get a break with WR Boldin (MCL sprain) sitting out as BAL's WR/TE's are avg at best (4 rec's 13.0 LW vs CLE) and not known for their speed. We'll call for CIN in an upset in a lower scoring game as BAL's inconsistency catches up to them.

3★ NY Jets over MIAMI - The favorite "improved" to 1-5 ATS with a 24-6 win by the Jets as a 7 pt fav on MNF. MIA had their chances as they forced the Jets to go 3 and out on their 1st 4 drives (14 yds total). The Dolphins were inside the Jets' 15 3 times in their 1st 5 drives but settled for 2 FG's and Revis returned an int 100 yds for a TD. The Jets had a 282-115 yd edge over their final 8 drives with 17 unanswered pts. The Jets are off a hugely embarrassing loss as Sanchez had 3 TO's (2 int, 1 fmb) though OC Schottenheimer didn't do him any favors by having him air it out a whopping 59 times. Sanchez has struggled to process his reads and the lack of a power run game (#22 3.8 ypc) has helped kill a pretty impressive effort by the #7 defense which has a 14-17 ratio TY (3 TD in 2nd NE and 2nd BUF each). Injury was added to insult for MIA as they were dismantled in the 2H LW being outFD'd 21-8 and outgained 293-126 also losing All-Pro LT Long (torn biceps) for a good chunk of the offseason. MIA is only 9-20-1 ATS at home off a loss, have dealt with poor management by the front office TY now have to deal with an angry Jets defense wondering what happened to their season.

FORECAST: NY Jets 27 MIAMI 20

OTHER SELECTION

2★ NEW ENGLAND over Buffalo - The Bills snapped a 15 game SU losing streak to NE with a 31-1 win as a 7 pt HD. BUF scored 17 pts in the 4Q with drives of 95, 71 and 70 yds as NE blew a 24-0 lead in the 2Q. Brady has avg'd 244 ypg (66%) vs BUF with a 42-14 ratio but his 4 int here gave BUF 27 pts. He's now facing the #15 pass defense that had allowed a 17-1 ratio over the 7 games before Tebow's 4 int. BUF is also in 30th sacks (24) and 9 of those sacks came vs WAS after their bye week. Injuries have compounded the fact that teams figured out the Bills intermediate passing game and since Nov, Fitzpatrick has avg'd 223 ypg (57%) with a 8-12 ratio with a 6.1 ypa. Incl playoffs, Belichick is 12-1 ATS vs a Div foe that beat him in a previous matchup with a 32-16 avg score. NE has a top 10 special teams unit (BUF bottom 10) which sets up quality field position making opposing teams go the distance (accounts #32 defense) and forcing them into mistakes (+14 TO's 3rd TY) and BUF simply doesn't have the firepower anymore to compete.

OTHER GAMES

PHILADELPHIA 31 Washington 27 - The road team is 10-2 ATS covering 5 straight. PHI won the 1st meeting 20-13 as a 3 pt AF with a 422-287 yd edge holding WAS to just 5 FD's and 75 yds in the 1H. Grossman was benched after a brutal 3Q's with 143 yds (39%) and 4 int's as the OL was in shambles. Starting with that first PHI game WAS dropped 6 straight avg just 56 ypg rushing and 13 ppg. Since then WAS has beaten SEA and the NYG on the road and while they did lose all 3 home games to the NYJ, NE and MIN they outgained and outFD'd all 3. The Eagles are trying to reach the .500 mark finishing the season with a 4th straight win and they done so in dominating fashion covering by 19 ppg while outgaining those foes by an avg of 348-202. With both teams playing their best ball down the stretch we'll take the div dog of over a TD as the line is inflated due to the Skins not winning on the scoreboard.

ATLANTA 27 Tampa Bay 17 - The Bucs are 7-2 ATS vs the Falcons incl a 16-13 win as a 2 pt HF back in Wk 3. TB wore ATL down on a hot (89°) and humid (94%) day using their run game (36 att's 3.2) to batter the Falcons defense and control the clock (+11:44). The Falcons are off the final MNF game of the year vs NO and those results are unknown. ATL is clearly the more talented team, may be playing off a loss at home wanting positive momentum into the playoffs but that is why the line is almost 2 TD's. The Bucs futility has also inflated this line as TB has dropped 9 straight (1-8 ATS). ATL will be playing next week and this is the type of game that a HC will be happy with a positive 1H and his players staying healthy. The Falcons have also only beaten 2 teams by over 14 points (IND and JAX) and TB's Freeman always has potential for the backdoor cover.

San Francisco 26 ST LOUIS 9 - The favorite is 6-2 ATS in the series. SF slammed STL 26-0 just 4 wks ago as a 13.5 pt HF. The 49ers owned a 389-157 yd edge and controlled the game with a 144-31 edge on the ground. It could have been much worse as they settled for 4 FG's on 3 drives inside the STL red zone and only 1 of STL 12 drives lasted longer than 5 plays. We usually like playing against a team with playoff need (#2 seed) as the line is inflated but don't mind backing the fiery HC Harbaugh who will not let up. SF knows that their potential SB run will have to go through Lambeau and he'll demand a positive road performance after losing to BAL and ARZ and beating SEA by only 2 pts in their L3 away from home. STL's offensive woes have gone to a new level having gotten shutout for a 2nd time in 4 games while avg only 10 ppg the L/8. SF is the NFL's #1 rush D allowing 3.4 ypc and will be hungry after allowing their first 100 yd rushing this season. By stopping Jackson and the run game Clemens will have another tough week after going 9-24-91 and throwing for 91 yds (38%) against a similar defense in PIT LW.

MINNESOTA 20 Chicago 17 - The Bears have won and covered 4 straight by a 36-17 avg score including a 39-10 win earlier TY. Both are limping to the finish with CHI having dropped 5 straight and an offense that has avg'd just 216 ypg the L/3 prior to GB. With the Hanie experiment a complete failure they turned to McCown who was teaching a few weeks ago and he was impressive vs GB's #31D making his first start since 2007 (21 pts, 19-28-24). MIN lost RB Peterson (ACL) and QB Ponder (concussion) on B2B plays LW against the Redskins but behind Webb the Vikings scored 3 straight TD drives (75/3, 73/6 and 72/6pl). With these teams playing for pride we'll back MIN with either QB as Webb made the final 2 starts LY and was an impressive 37-58 (64%) incl getting a win against a playoff bound Eagles squad. Players can surprise when there's not recent film on them but now the Vikings will be prepared for this "new" QB. In the final week of the season the HT is 20-10 ATS when they have the poorer record and both teams are under .500.

Detroit 27 GREEN BAY 21 - "There's going to come a time when we don't celebrate going to the playoffs or getting into the playoffs, but that's not going to be tonight," said DET HC Jim Schwartz. The Lions dominating performance put them in the playoffs for the first time since 1999. That may sound similar to what the 49ers (cliched playoffs 1st time S/02) said several weeks ago and then they went into Arizona losing as an AF getting outgained 325-233. GB however has the #1 seed wrapped up and the early indication is that starting skill players will rest. The difference is GB has a bye and no momentum would be gained while the Lions will want to stay in playoff mode. Check out the surprising year to date rankings as GB is #5 and #31 (off and def) while DET is #7 and #20. The Lions held GB to their 2nd lowest yd output in their earlier meeting (349 yds) so they certainly won't be intimidated by this offense especially if Flynn is under center. Teams that have 13 or more wins in the season finale usually have everything wrapped up and are 1-8 ATS as a dog since 1990 and 0-5 ATS S/05 losing by an avg score of 24-10.

NEW ORLEANS 30 Carolina 20 - The Saints have been a hospitable host dropping the L/4 ATS to the Panthers. They also failed to cover vs CAR earlier TY needing a 89/13pl drive with a 6yd TD pass with :50 left for the win. If they knocked off ATL on MNF they are still alive for a 1st round bye and can finish off a perfect 8-0 season at home. Saints HC Payton has always allowed Brees to play for records and expect him to set a new bar for QB's against the Panthers accommodating pass D allowing 63.5% completions (#30). On the flipside you have to admire the Panthers led by Newton who has gotten stronger down the stretch leading his team to 4 wins the L/5 gms throwing for 60% comp and an 8-2 ratio. CAR has the #6 and #15 units (+6 TO's) the L4W. That has been vs TB twice with a beat up Freeman with a young and worn out defense, were beaten by ATL and upset HOU without DC Phillips who just earned their 1st playoff berth in franchise history. NO has the #1 and #23 units (+2 TO's) prior to MNF outgaining their foes by 129 ypg which is tops in the NFL. NO's short week is countered by the fact they don't have to travel and CAR is off a misleading final (+4 TO's). We want to see how NO fared on MNF and their attitude towards this game so we'll call for them by 10.

HOUSTON 23 Tennessee 20 - The Texans are off a 19-16 loss to IND on Thursday and they'll certainly benefit from the extra time as Kubiak gave them 3 days off afterwards. HOU also dropped B2B games earlier TY and also faced this same Titans squad mauling them 41-7 with a 518-148 yd edge. Now HOU has to refocus with a positive performance going into their first ever playoff appearance and will have a healthier #1 rec TE Daniels (1 rec LW). The Texans may also get WR Johnson back and they are 4-1 SU/ATS when he starts with the only loss to NO which they outgained 473-454. TEN's offense "exploded" LW topping 400 yds for only the 2nd time this season as they faced a JAX secondary without 2 starters getting 207 yds (51%) on 6 passes with many broken coverages. HOU also should have DC Phillips here to give a defense that hasn't looked that good the L2W a sorely needed confidence boost. Both teams stats over the L4W cancel each other out (TEN #9 and #18 -2 TO's vs HOU #16 and #9 -4 TO's) and while the Texans are locked into the #3 seed they aren't going to want to go into the postseason with a 3 game losing streak in the mirror.

Pittsburgh 24 CLEVELAND 10 - PIT is 6-2 ATS in CLE beating them 41-9 to close out 2010 as a 5.5 pt AF. It's unknown if Roethlisberger or Ctr Pouncey who both sustained high ankle sprains in the 1st meeting TY will suit up. CLE is expected to close the season with Wallace (187 ypg 58% 2-1 L2W) here and they are expected to also feature a lot of younger players here to get film on them for the offseason. PIT dominated the 2H with a 255-104 yd edge as CLE couldn't stop a QB with 1 bad leg. PIT held a similarly talented Rams team to just 8 FD and 107 yds in the 2H as they pitched a shutout. They have a 390-247 yd edge TY vs foes with a losing record with 21-9 avg score but only a 3-4 ATS mark. The difference here is that the defense is stinging from their effort in the 1st matchup as well as the susp LB Harrison. CLE has been held to under 300 yds in 9 games TY (262 ypg) going 2-5-2 ATS in those. They also have the #28 and #23 units (+1 TO's) the L4W vs PIT's #10 and #2 units (-4 TO's). There will likely be a very strong contingent of Steelers fans here to cheer on their team and we'll call for the defense to head up a 2 TD victory here.

JACKSONVILLE 20 Indianapolis 17 - The fav has covered 3 of the L4 with the Jags winning 17-3 as a 3 pt AF in the 1st meeting TY. IND was heading into its bye while JAX was coming off theirs. Both offenses looked like they were on byes as 17 of the 24 combined drives ended with a punt, TO or were SOD. Jones-Drew had 24.6% of the total yards by both teams combined and Gabbert could only muster 118 yds passing (67%) with a 1-1 ratio. IND has won their L2 games behind Orlovsky who is 9-2 ATS as an NFL starter despite being on poor teams like the 2008 Lions and 2011 Colts. In his 4 starts the Colts have been outgained by 46 ypg (+1 TO) with a 21-20 ppg deficit. Prior to him, IND was outgained by 109 ypg (-11 TO's) while being outscored 30-14. The Jaguars have an NFL high 29 players on IR having been badly mauled in the secondary, at WR and on the DL. Since the 1st IND game the Jags have given up 233 ypg (66%) with a 9-6 ratio but 3 int came vs Freeman (bruised shoulder) who shouldn't have been playing. Gabbert has only passed for 685 more yards than what Jones-Drew has rushed for so far and his 5.4 ypa is horrid esp since Jones-Drew has a 4.5 ypa. A victory here is a big blow for the Colts future but their 2 wins have been at home and we'll call for the Jags by a FG thanks to Jones-Drew.

San Diego 27 OAKLAND 24 - The Raiders are 5-0 ATS vs SD with 3 outright upsets (29-19 avg score) physically wearing down the Chargers with a 184 (4.5) to 62 (3.9) rushing edge. Rivers has been able to move the ball vs OAK in the L3 games (328 ypg 5 TD's), but the Raiders physical style of play has given him problems as he's only hit 57% while turning the ball over 5 times himself. Despite a tough season SD once again has a 4000 yd QB, 1000 yd rusher and 1000 yd receiver on hand and are 18-3 SU/15-6 ATS in Dec under Turner. Over the L4W they have the #5 and #12 units (+3 TO's) vs the Raiders #12 and #29 units (-5 TO's). OAK hoped Palmer and McCadden would lead them into the playoffs but the 2 haven't started a game together TY. OAK beat SD, MIN and CHI with Bush (112 ypg 4.0) pounding the ball but then the WR's/CB's got beat up. While OAK is loaded with 1st RD DC's on defense they have given up 409 ypg vs foes w/a winning record with 126 ypg rush (5.1) and a 15-5 ratio from the #25 pass defense. While SD is eliminated from the playoffs the next best thing for them is to keep OAK from making it and putting forth one last effort to keep Turner in 2012.

DENVER 20 Kansas City 17 - The Chiefs get a nice edge with Orton who was with DEN for the 1st matchup TY and has intimate knowledge of the system leading the Chiefs into Mile High Stadium. The Broncos moved to 3-0 ATS vs KC with a 17-10 win as a 3 pt AD with the road team being 5-1 ATS. DEN had a 313-258 yd edge despite Tebow completing just 2 passes (69 yds) with one being a 56 yd TD pass. DEN ran the ball 55 times (4.4) which allowed them to control the clock (+7:16) and wear down the Chiefs defense. Orton has a real shot at being the #1 for KC in 2012 after avg 300 ypg (66%) with a 1-2 ratio the L2W. He has helped beat GB and lost to OAK in OT with two 49 yd FG's being blocked at the end of the halves. Orton has led 2 of KC's 3 400 yd games (IND other TY) but he now faces a defense that knows how to defend him from practice. DEN has struggled the L2W due to Tebow turning the ball over by having to throw the ball and some bad special teams play. Tebow now returns home where the Broncos have rushed for 147 ypg (5.1) and now take on the #23 rush defense allowing 126 ypg (4.1). Look for a huge crowd edge to help out the DEN defense as they push for a playoff berth.

ARIZONA 27 Seattle 24 - Carroll is 3-0 SU/ATS vs ARZ with a 24-13 avg score beating them 13-10 as a 3 pt HD back in Wk 3. ARZ had a 324-261 yd edge as SEA had 8 punts and an Int on their 12 drives. ARZ went after QB Jackson holding him to 171 yds (58%) with 4 sacks and 12 hits. Kolb didn't have much success either with 252 yds (64%) with a 1-2 ratio and 3 sacks as SEA held Fitzgerald to 64 yds (12.8). ARZ does have the health edge here as SEA is down 3 starting OL, both starting WR's and their top 2 CB's. Carroll has done a good job of coaching up its depth as rookie UFA Baldwin leads the team in rec's and yds (48 15.6). SEA's #10 defense has quietly been very solid TY as while they don't get a lot of sacks (19th) they are only allowing 3.8 rushing and have a quality 17-21 ratio (Jets 14-17 ratio). SEA has covered 4 of its L5 road games (push vs CLE) with a 23-15 avg score and no RB has been better over the past 8 games than Lynch who has rushed for 107 ypg (4.5) and 9 TD's. ARZ has a nice sked edge with this being their 4th HG in 5 Wks but have given up 134 ypg rush (4.4) in Skelton's 7 starts (4-3 ATS) TY. Both teams are fighting for an 8 win season which would be a huge confidence boost going into the offseason and we'll call for the home team by a FG here.

Dallas at NY GIANTS - SUN NIGHT The dog has not only covered 5 straight in this series they've pulled the upset 5 straight times with the Giants cashing 4 of those. The NFC East now comes down to this final game. DAL played div games in the season finale for playoff berths in '08 and '09 losing to Philly 44-6 (+1) and getting revenge the next season 24-0 (-3). LW Dallas knew in the 1Q that their game was meaningless while the Giants expended played an emotional game knocking off the Jets. The NYG were outFD'd 22-11 but used big plays against the gambling Ryan D and their TD's came on 99/3, 81/4 and 19/1pl drives. **NFL MARQUEES ARE AN AMAZING 25-9-1 74%!!!
