NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK 2, 2010

NEWS AND NOTES: Kent St only led 17-10 late 2Q when they got a 3rd & 10, 49 yd TD pass with 1:13 left in the half then got a 92 yd KR TD to open the 3Q. KSU held Murray St to -65 yds rushing in their 41-10 win...SEL had a 17-15 FD edge vs Tulane and 266-252 yd edge. SEL had a 1st & gl at the 1 at the end of an 83/12pl drive early 3Q but fmbld into the EZ for a TB. Later they fmbld on their own 7 setting up a 2pl drive for a Tulane TD. They trailed 27-21 with 9:21 left and would punt on their next 2 poss and their final drive got them to the TU45 where they ran out of time...There were a couple of key plays in the Nevada/E Washington game which was fairly close with UN only having a 553-432 yd edge. Leading 21-10, UN had the ball 3rd & 3 and got a 48 yd TD pass with just :17 left in the half to lead by 18. EW pulled within 35-24 in the 4Q and had the ball at the UN33 when they fmbld. UN got a TD 3pl later to extend the lead and then after converting on 4th & 13 with a 33 yd pass, added another TD with 3:38 left in their 25 pt win...In the 1H of the UAB/FAU game, UAB had an 11-6 FD edge but only a 226-185 yd edge. The first 5 poss of the game were punts then UAB QB Isabelle got a 50 yd TD run. FAU got a 77 yd TD pass to pull within 14-12 with 3:24 left 1H but UAB drove for TD's on their next 2 poss to lead 28-12 early 3Q. UAB was seemingly in control when they were int'd and returned 38 yds for a TD. A key play happened with 4:11 left when on FAU's 56 yd punt, a holding call on UAB pinned them at the 1. UAB's punt only got out to the 38 and Morris got a TD run on the next play. UAB still had an easy shot at winning and in fact, on 3rd & gl from the 9, took a knee in the center of the field but Zahn's 28 yd chipshot FG was blk'd on the final play and FAU claimed the upset...Hawaii did have a 308-296 yd edge vs USC at the half but the Trojans led by double digits most of the game. Backup QB Mustain came in with USC up 42-23 early 4Q. UH gained 147 yds on their final 2 drives in the 49-36 loss. USC did not have contact during their practices in the month of Aug as they are low on scholarships and that may have had something to do with UH's 588-524 yd edge for the game...We've been saying all along that SC has their best team yet under Steve Spurrier and they sure looked like it in the opener vs Southern Miss. SM did have 404 yds offense but 174 of those yds came in the final 11:19 after they trailed 41-6. SC showed a balanced attack with 224 yds rushing and 225 yds passing...Pitt, with a young QB and O-line, had just 60 yds in the 2Q & 3Q and Utah had a commanding 405-266 yd edge on the day. Utah appeared to lead comfortably 24-13 but Pitt rallied back for a 24-24 tie on a FG with :00 left. Utah got an int in OT and kicked the game winning FG for the 3 pt win...Iowa QB Ricky Stanzi was injured in the 2Q but ret'd. Iowa scored TD's on their first 2 poss and blk'd a punt for a TD for a 21-0 lead but only won 37-7 and ended the game with a 10 yd run to the E Illinois 6... Robert Bolden was the first true frosh QB to start a season opener in Joe Paterno's 45 years. Youngstown St actually led 7-3 early after a 3rd & 10 short screen pass went 80 yds for a TD but PSU led 44-7 before YSU went 80/15pl for a garbage TD with :40 left...While Samford had 300 yds vs Florida St, they did get 57 of it in the last 2:23 of the 1H resulting in a 41 yd FG then took over trailing 59-6 with 6:36 left and went 79/16pl getting SOD on the 1 with :04 left...Joshua Nesbitt had a pair of TD runs for Georgia Tech and both came on 4th down. The first came on their first series when on 4th & 3 he got a 35 yd TD run, the 2nd came in the 3Q on 4th & 3 with a 14 yd TD run. GT led 34-10 when they added a 10 yd TD run with 4:50 left for the 41-10 final vs S Carolina St...Illinois had a 196-137 yd edge at the half vs Missouri and led 13-3 but would have just 85 yds and 4 FD's in the 2H. MO took the lead for good with 13:26 left. UI was SOD on 4th & 10 from their own 21 with 2:08 left and MO added a 34 yd FG with :27 left...Michigan St/W Michigan were tied 7-7 in the 2Q. There were 2 key plays, the first when WM QB Carder was calling an audible. The C snapped it off his knee, MSU rec'd at the 31 and 4pl later had a TD. MSU was then pinned back on their own 2 and got a 75 yd run by Bell which set up a TD for a 21-7 lead. In the 4Q, MSU got a 33 yd FG with 7:30 left to go up by 24. WM had a 2nd & 1 at the 7 yd line but on 4th & 1 fired incomplete with 4:10 left. On their final drive they took over with 2:37 left but brought in a backup QB and with no sense of urgency, were stopped on 4th & 9 with :20 left...Kentucky did have a 271-103 yd edge at the half and led 23-6 in the 3Q. Louisville trimmed it to 23-16 with 3:16 left but kicked off deep and UK got 3 FD's and ran out the clock and finished with 230 yds rushing and 236 passing...The pressure was on Michigan to open strong and Denard Robinson accounted for 383 yds incl a school QB rushing

record 197 yds. It was a football attendance record crowd of 113,090 in the newly expanded Michigan Stadium. UM jumped out to a 21-0 lead. Conn converted on 4th & 2 for a TD with :17 left in the half... Oregon tied an Autzen Stadium record for points with 72. They set a team record with 720 yards. UO had a commanding 35-8 FD edge. NM had just 8 FD and 107 yds. There was nothing fluky about the 72-0 shutout as the Early Bird POW... While Georgia beat

Louisiana 55-7 they did have only 377 yds offense. Their D allowed just 5 FD's...AF only led North-western St 24-21 but scored TD's on their first six 2H poss to blow it open...Alabama was without Heisman winner Mark Ingram and their top defensive player Marcell Dareus but it hardly mattered vs San Jose St. The Tide scored TD's on four of their first 5 drives, fumbling into the EZ for a TB on the other. QB McElroy came out with the score 21-3 and Trent Richardson had just 10 carries with Eddie Lacy leading the Tide in rushing with 111. AJ McCarron hit 9-14-116 in their 48-3 romp...UC Davis did sit RB Joe Trombetta who led the team in rushing and was the #2 rec LY. Cal completely dominated the game. UCD had a FD on their first play of the game and a FD on the last play but had just 2 FD's in between as Cal rolled to a 35-0 halftime lead with a 332-31 yd edge and finished with 26-4 FD and 517-81 yd edges in their 52-3 romp...W Carolina drove 87/10pl for a TD to open and forced NC State into a 3 & out but they fumbled the punt and NCSST scored on the remaining 5 poss of the 1H to lead 31-7 and did not punt again until 1:55 was left in their 48-7 win. NCSST finished with 25-9 FD and 480-189 yd edges...A look at the box score shows N Texas with a dominating win as they held the ball for 41:52 and had a 25-15 FD edge vs Clemson. Unfortunately for NT they lost by 25. CU did have a 60 yd TD run by Ellington and a 70 yd TD pass to Clear which kept the yds close in the game and provided the TD's. NT was int'd at the CU6 and int'd in the EZ for a TB and settled for a 25 yd FG. They ended the game with the ball at the CU29...The Oklahoma Sooners did not look like a national title contender in the opener. They did jump out to a 21-0 lead and it could have been 28-0 late 2Q as they had a TD pass called back for illegal formation and then had an int at the 24 on the next play. USU QB Borel's ability to convert on 3rd & long was the key and he threw for 340 yds. Utah St scored 10 pts in final 3:33 of the 1H to pull within 21-10. Their TD with 2:31 left in the 3Q put them within 1 score. OU was int'd at the US9 and ended at the US6 taking a knee... UT Martin's D played decent in the 1H vs Tenn but came up with a 23-3 FD deficit and Tenn had a 537-142 yd edge. The Vols led 13-0 after 1Q but UT actually punted on 3 straight poss before driving for a late TD in the 1H to lead 20-0 with a 225-51 yd edge. Tenn would score TD's on their first 3 poss of the 2H and added a 54 yd IR TD. They got their first shutout since 2003 and it held up when UTM missed a 43 yd FG with 9:16 left. Tenn finished the game at the UTM12...Nebraska's D was dominant in the 1H as they rolled to a 21-0 lead as WKU only crossed midfield once and that was due to an NU pen. Taylor Martinez became the first frosh QB to start an opener for NU ever and guided TD drives on his first 2 series. Cody Green guided TD drives on his first 2 series as well. NU was in control 35-3 but WKU at the end of a 46 yd run, fmbld into the EZ for a TB late 3Q. Leading 42-10 WKU only got off a 4 yd punt and NU drove 13/2pl to get ahead of the spread, 49-10 with 6:56 left. NU finished the game at the WKU9 on the final play...Memphis crossed midfield 4x in the 1H but missed 2 FG's and had a holding call wipe out a 1st & 10 at the 15. Miss St was in complete control leading 49-0 when Mem took over with 5:13 left and drove 68/8pl getting a 3rd & 8, 27 yd TD pass with 1:39 left to avoid the shutout. While Relf started and did well, backup QB Russell was the star hitting 13-16-256 yds and his 4 TD's tied a school record...An amazing stat is that ND coaches making their debut are now 26-3. ND led 2-3 and was about to make it 27-3 when they fmbld into the EZ and it was ret'd to the 6. That changed the momentum and Purdue would get 9 pts on a safety & TD to pull within 8 but the Irish got the spread covering 37 yd FG with 4:30 left and ended the game at the PU30 yd line...Virginia did lead Richmond just 14-13 and leading 21-13 Richmond was SOD on 4th & 1 at the UVA45. RU was also int at the UVA2 with 9:18 left and a 65 yd IR led to a UVA 43 yd TD drive to ice it 35-13.

GARBAGE TD'S: Boston College got the great return of LB Mark Herzlich to the lineup vs Weber St. BC's first play of the season was a false start followed by an int which set up a WSU FG. BC dominated the rest of the half leading 31-10. They led 38-13 when they were int'd in the EZ and WSU rec a fmbld with :56 left and drove 36 yds for a garbage TD with :19 left...UCF dominated S Dakota St with a 27-13 FD edge and had 231 yds rushing and 241 passing while SDS had just 220 yds incl 58 on a final garbage drive when they took over with 3:50 left. UCF punted once all game in their dominating 38-7 win.

MISLEADING SCORES, FRONTDOOR COVERS: Showing how scores can be misleading, you may have heard that John Brantley had the Florida Gators up 21-3 over Miami, Oh. In reality, UF had a grand total of 17 yards TOTAL OFFENSE with 6:33 left in the 3Q. They were outgained 102-13 at the half but were up 21-6. Their final TD came when Brantley on 4th & 21, flung a ball in the air that bounced off a UF player and Rainey grabbed it for a 25 yd TD with 1:21 left. It was the most unimpressive 34 pts scored and UF and MU each actually had just 212 yds offense despite UF's 22 pt win... UCLA was missing 3 OL for the game vs Kansas St and QB Prince missed a good portion of practice time during the week and he hit 9-26-120. UCLA got an 11 yd drive for a TD after a fmbld and led 10-7 at the half. The game was 17-16 after a UCLA 42 yd FG with 6:28 left. KSt drove 80/8pl for a TD with 2:03 left to go up 24-16. UCLA went 64/2pl for a TD but missed the 2pt conv, 24-22. The onside kick was rec by KS and then on 3rd & 1 with the game at the line (-2) Thomas not only got the FD but raced 37 yds for a TD with :58 left.

INJURIES OF NOTE: Middle Tenn was without QB Dasher (susp) while Minn's starting D lineup had 11 new starters as Theret was susp'd and the other S Royston (leg) DNP. In the 1Q they had just 33 yds but backup QB Kilgore came to life in the 2Q when MT had 174 yds offense and it was tied at 14 at half with MT having a 207-198 yd edge. Minny kept it on the ground most of the game as RB Bennett had 187 yds rushing. They did have a 12 play drive end in a punt but then pinned at their 1, went 97/13pl settling for a 19 yd FG with 14:11 left. They went 77/15pl and got a TD with 3:09 left then MT fmbld the ensuing KO and Minny ran out the clock.

HEISMAN HOPEFULS: Terrelle Pryor is one of the preseason favorites to win the Heisman and opened up in fine fashion. He hit 17-25-247. Marshall fmbld the opening KO and OSU went 22 yds for a TD and dominated much like the final of 45-7 indicates. In fact, MU's only score came on a blk'd FG which they ret'd 61 yds for a TD. OSU had a 529-199 yd edge and Pryor's last play came with 12:20 left 4Q... Arizona dominated Toledo on Friday night. They had a 518-183 yd edge and QB Nick Foles perhaps entered the Heisman race by hitting 32-37 passes for 360 yds in an impressive debut performance. Ark handled Tenn Tech and QB Ryan Mallet hit 21-24 passes for 301 yds and one of his incompletions was a potential TD pass which was dropped.

FIRST WEEK SHUTOUTS: Central Michigan beat Hampton 33-0 but their first 16 pts came on 14 yds of offense as Hampton had a snap go over the P's head for a safety then after an 83 yd return of the free

kick, got a 1 yd TD drive. Then after a fmbld KO, CM drove 12 yds for a TD to lead 16-0. HU also had a -4 yd punt which set up a 40 yd TD drive and was int'd at the CM17 in the 1H but CM did miss a pair of short FG's late and finished with a commanding 26-11 FD and 427-129 yd edges...Buffalo recorded its first shutout win since 2001 and had a 423-207 yd edge. They only led 10-0 late 2Q when they rec'd a fmbld with 3:34 left and got a 38 yd TD pass on the next play. They added a 46 yd drive for a TD with :40 left to lead 24-0 at the half. Rhode Island missed a 29 yd FG in the 3Q...Idaho got their first shutout since 1997 and QB Enderle threw for 311 yds playing just to the 3Q. UI only led 17-0 at the half and they rec'd an inside kick to open the 2H and rolled to the 45-0 win with their final TD coming with 1:26 left...It appeared Rutgers would only lead Norfolk St 3-0 at the half. A 3rd & 16, 29 yd pass to the 3 was ruled with no time left. :01 was put back on the clock and RU was able to get a 20 yd FG to lead 6-0 but still left the field to boot's. A blocked punt for a TD opened up a 21-0 lead mid-3Q and the Knights added 10 pts in the 4Q in their 31-0 shutout win...Miami, FI got their first shutout win since 2006, the year before Randy Shannon was on board. UM dominated with a 35-0 halftime lead and Jacory Harris played only the 1H. Fla A&M did have a 50 yd FG bounce off the upright on their 2nd drive which would have averted the shutout...West Virginia got their first home shutout since 1997. They had an 11-2 FD edge in the 1H but did fmbld in the EZ for a TB and only led 10-0. It was 17-0 and CC missed 47 and 42 yd FG's in the 3Q before WV went 75/9pl and 63/5pl for TD's to put it away and won 31-0.

4★ Byu over AIR FORCE - HC Mendenhall has never lost to AF as a HC while the Falcons are 2-15 SU (7-10 ATS) vs the Big 3 of the MWCC. Mendenhall's D's have always had success vs AF even when he was at NM. LW BYU held Wash scoreless in the 2H and LB Manumaleuna tipped a 4th down pass w/1:55 left to preserve a 23-17 win. The highly anticipated QB Heaps (13-23-131, 0-0 ratio) split time with USU transfer Nelson (11-17-131, 2-0) and there has been much talk of BYU using a 2 QB system TY. LW it seemed as if AF was caught looking ahead to this gm as they were only up by 3 vs with N'western St (0-11 in '09) at half. AF exploded for 44 2H pts, finishing with a 616-311 yd edge in their 65-21 win. AF has talked of passing more TY and QB Jefferson finished with 179 yds (58%) and a 2-0 ratio (59 rush, 7.4). They lost CB Rembert on the 1st series and NWSt put up 215 pass yds in the 1H. CB Wright also limped to the locker room and the CB situation will be one to watch TW as BYU QB's are capable of putting up big numbers. With BYU having covered 6 straight in the series by an avg of 12 ppg and the SU winner being 22-1 ATS the Cougars are our **Technical Play of the Week**.

FORECAST: Byu 30 AIR FORCE 23

3★ San Diego St over NEW MEXICO ST - SDSSt leads the series 7-1-1 SU (won the L/5). LY marked the first lined game in the series and the 1st meeting between these two S/75 with the Aztecs winning 34-17 (-17) in San Diego. The Aggies' offense was downright stagnant LY (#120 in FBS) so there's only one way to go and that's up. New OC Dunbar is hoping to breathe some new life into the unit and former Fresno St signee and JC transfer QB Christian has been given the keys to run the offense with hopes of adding some semblance of a passing game (#118 in FBS at 88 ypg in '09). We're well aware the Aztecs are 5-12 ATS in road openers and are 0-4 ATS as an AF over 7 yrs but have covered in 3 of their L/4 AG's (all as AD) and have the GUB advantage as NMSt didn't play LW (begins 12 consecutive weeks without a bye). SDSSt QB Lindley threw for 303 yds and 2 TD while WR Sampson had 7 rec for 179 yds (schl record for an opening gm) in a 47-0 victory over Nicholls St LW. NMSt will be an improved team TY but SDSSt has the edge on ff (#68-108) and def (#69-119). Expect sizeable improvement in Hoke's second year and you can expect sizeable improvement in this season's 2nd game for the Aztecs.

FORECAST: San Diego St 34 NEW MEXICO ST 17

3★ USC over Virginia - These two met in 2008 and we used a 3★ on these pages as well as a 4★ Top Weekly LPS on USC (-19) with them rolling to a 52-7 road victory. The Trojans have covered 5 of their L/6 home openers (46-7 avg score) and will be introducing their 1st new HC in nearly a decade as Kiffin takes over in his 1st gm at the Coliseum. While the offense appears to have the expected weapons (524 ttl yds), the defense appeared suspect as they surrendered 588 yds incl 459 though the air LW vs Hawaii. The Cavs meanwhile ended a 4 yr losing streak in ssn openers by beating a solid FCS opponent in Richmond 34-13 (488-333). USC is 8-2 ATS vs non-conf BCS schools and UVA is 1-4 ATS in road openers and has just 12 st'rs back. With both teams having new HC's the advantage goes to the team playing their only home game in Sept. While USC had to travel, they were embarrassed defensively and will right the ship against a Cavs squad making a very unusual cross-country trip. All these factors add up to our **Situational Play of the Week**.

2★ Mississippi over TULANE - Mississippi has won 9 in a row SU in this series (6-3 ATS, last met '00) but is just 4-11 ATS as an AF. UM is off a stunning loss to FCS Jacksonville St in 2OT, a gm in which they led 31-10 at the half. Tulane escaped with a 27-21 win over SEL LW but was outgained 266-252. Tulane is 3-11 ATS off a SU win and just 5-14-1 as a HD as coach Toledo says with the low energy level of the small crowds they draw, it is almost like having no edge at all. Ole Miss ranks #117 in experience level but Tulane only has 11 st'rs back also. Rare ESPN appearance for Tulane, but we expect Ole Miss to be more focused after LW's shocking upset. It will not be fun being a ball player on the Oxford campus this week and fortunately for this team, they'll take to the road and while it'll take more than one week to get the taste of the loss out of their mouth, it will start in the Super Dome.

FORECAST: Mississippi 34 TULANE 10

2★ FIU over Rutgers - LY in the 1st meeting between these 2, Rutgers led 23-0 mid-4Q before allowing 2 garbage TD's (145 of FIU's 260 yds, 56% final 2 drives) to make it misleading (last TD w/:31 left). Rutgers has a GUB edge and FIU is just 2-6 in home openers. RU is 4-16 in road openers but 3-1 the L/4Y. The Knights only had Norfolk St LW and have a bye next week and are 5-2 as an AF. FIU HC Cristobal is 6-2 as a HD. This is FIU's 3rd ever visit from a BCS opp and FIU covered the L/2 (USF '08, MD '07) only losing by 12 ppg. The Panthers have spent the summer preparing for Rutgers and being able to host a BCS team is exactly what HC Cristobal has wanted for this program. Not only will it be tough for Rutgers to be motivated facing a squad that won 3 games LY, this is the 1st time in 2 seasons they will have played a game in the southern humidity.

2★ NEBRASKA over Idaho - First meeting. UI had 547-270 yd and 26-17 FD edges in a 45-0 win over vs FCS ND in the opener. QB Enderle was an impressive 24-37 for 311 yds and a 2-1 ratio but was sacked 4 times behind a rebuilt OL (only 1 starter returning) and that unit will face a much stronger test here. NU has huge edges on ff (#22-65), def (#10-87) and ST (#8-86). QB Martinez became the only RS or true FR QB to start a season opener for the Huskers and passed for 136 yds and ran for 127 and 3 TD as he also became the first NU QB S/'03 to run for more than 100 yds in a game in the Huskers' 49-10 win over WKU LW. UI has covered in 4 of its L/6 AG's and in all 6 the Vandals were AD's, while NU is only 8-11 as a HF. However, NU HC Pellini is 6-1 ATS vs non-BCS tms with the avg win coming by 35 ppg. The Huskers have a big road trip at Washington next week but Idaho is the only foe that was in a bowl LY which Nebraska plays in Sept so they should be focused here. Nebraska cashed here LW as a 2★ and we'll go right back to them.

MSU is 0-10 SU and 1-9 ATS and Aub is 16-1 SU and 13-4 ATS in SEC openers. The favorite is 13-5 ATS in this series. Both coaches enter their 2nd year and MSU was 3-1 ATS at home and Auburn was 1-3 on the road in the SEC LY (1-8 L/9). Both tms are off impressive opening wins with new starting QB's and this will be Aub QB Newton's first road start (5 TD, 357 total off LW). MSU QB's Russell and Relf combined for 372 yds and 5 TD LW.

TY Temple is the best team in the MAC and while CM is the defending champ they are in a rebuilding year with just 12 st'rs back and having to replace their star

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QB. CM easily dispatched FCS Hampton 33-0, while Temple had to come-from-behind to beat FCS Villanova, however Hampton was just 5-6 LY, while Villanova was the FCS Champion. Temple drew its 2nd largest crowd LW since playing at Lincoln Field and should have another big crowd this week.

W Virginia at MARSHALL - WV is 9-0 (avg win by 33 ppg) in this Friends of Coal Bowl instate rivalry played for the Governor's Cup. LY WV QB Brown was injured in the 1Q and WV trailed 7-3 at halftime with 11-2 FD and 139-84 yd edges, but MU (+20) gained just 53 yds in the 2H on 29 plays and WV escaped with a 24-7 win. MU HC Holliday is a WV alum (LB from '76-'78 on coaching staff L/2Y). WV is 3-7-1 ATS (6-5 SU) in road openers. The only recent time MU has hosted this series ('07) they only trailed 27-23 but WV got a couple of late TD's and pushed (-25) 48-23. We won't discount the Doc Holliday factor or the fact that MU had a couple of extra days to prepare after their expected big loss to OSU which gave us a Thurs Night Marquee Winner.

Utep at HOUSTON - UTEP has covered 3 straight this series incl as a Big Dog Play of the Week LY as they were +14 but won outright 58-41 (31 pt cover). Despite the ATS losses, the Cougs have outgained UTEP by 162 ypg over the L/4Y. Two years ago here UTEP blew a 28-9 lead (+17) as UH got a TD with :41 left to escape 42-37. Both are off expected wins over FCS opponents making this their 1st true tests of the ssn and Houston is without RB Sims while UTEP's Buckram is ? and DNP LW. **With two games to choose from we will pick the strongest and release it as our Friday Night Marquee Play. Don't miss this Winner (see above).**

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 11th

Georgia Tech 30 KANSAS 23 - The Jackets are 6-0-1 ATS the L/5Y in non-conf AG's incl 3 outright upsets and are 9-3 SU and 8-4 ATS in road openers. Kansas is 6-2 ATS hosting non-conf teams (2-0 vs non-conf BCS). KU is 0-4 as a HD over 5 yrs. KU HC Gill's debut was spoiled by FCS ND St 6-3 as the Hawks had a 293-168 yd edge but lost crucial 3 TO's incl an int in the EZ in the 3Q and missed 2 FG's. New QB Pick struggled (13-22 for 138) and was benched for Webb (6-11 for 59) who played most of the 4Q. Gill was an option QB and assistant at Neb so he should have some ideas how to defend it. GT beat SC St 41-10 thanks to QB Nesbitt's 130 yd and 3 TD (just 1-6 pass for 8 yd) in a misleading final as the Jackets had just a 384-272 yd edge and the tms traded long drives in the 1H but the Bulldogs settled for FG's while Nesbitt scored 2 TD's on 4th down. GT allowed 4.9 ypc rush LY and even with new DC Groh's 3-4 scheme allowed SC St's Jordan 125 yd (7.4) which surprised even SC St's HC.

E CAROLINA 30 Memphis 23 - EC has won 4 straight in the series by an avg margin of 18 ppg. LY, the Pirates gained a ssn high 497 yds, incl 275 on the ground in the road win. EC of course has switched to the TT offense so it's unlikely that they'll match those rush numbers. Memphis struggled in every aspect of LW's 42 pt loss to Miss St as they managed just 237 ttl yds (all'd 569), committed 8 pen (88 yds) and conv just 2 of 15 on 3rd down. They also continue to have a QB controversy in the mix as both Smith (111 yds, 67%, 1-0) and Williams (85 yds, 59%, 0-2) saw action. Both tms are going through coaching changes and are light on exp (#93 Mem, #113 EC). Historically tms on a short wk after the opener have struggled and EC is in that situation after playing on Sunday vs Tulsa. EC does have the advantage of playing at home for a 2nd consec wk while the Tigers are forced to start their ssn with B2B road trips (1st time S/'95) giving the Pirates the edge here.

SOUTH CAROLINA 23 Georgia 21 - GA has won 7 of the last 8 meetings incl 4 straight in Columbia by an avg of 16-8. The winner has scored 20 pts or less in 7 of the last 9 yrs (but LY UGA had 41). SC had only allowed one offensive TD to GA in '07 and '08 before allowing 4 in LY's 41-37 shootout loss. SC is 5-13 vs GA since joining the SEC ('92). The home team is 2-6-1 ATS in this series and UGA is 3-6-1 ATS. Seven of the last 9 in this series have been decided by a TD or less. LY these two were at the bottom of the SEC in experience but both are at the top TY with SC having 16 st'rs back and GA having 15. GA QB Murray is making his 1st road start but Mark Richt is 33-6 SU on the road. Both are off blowout wins in their openers, but SC had extra time to prep for this. SC and GA had susps LW including GA's top WR Green (check status) and top RB Ealey (expected to play) and SC TE Saunders, CB Culliver and OT King (all ?).

WAKE FOREST 31 Duke 27 - Duke is just 2-13 SU in road openers (3-1 ATS L/4) but did beat Army LY. WF has won each gm SU in this series the L/10Y but has been outgained in 7. LY QB Skinner had a career high 372 pass yds and a WF record 5 TD passes in his final gm. Duke is 2-16 SU but 12-6 ATS in ACC AG's and WF is 10-22-1 ATS as a HF (lost LW, -45). WF is #106 in experience level TY and Duke has 15 rec st'rs. LW Duke actually fell behind Elon 3-0 but scored 21 unanswered points en route to their 41-27 win. QB Renfree threw for 350 (79%, 2-0 ratio) becoming the 4th in schl history to throw for 300+ in his debut. WR's Vernon (129, 12.9) and Varner (123, 17.6) both went over 100 yds rec and Duke finished with 542-406 yd and 32-24 FD edges. WF is off a record setting 53-13 win (schl record pts at BB&T Field) over Presbyterian (509-362 yd, 23-18 FD edges). Stanchitas led with 84 yd pass (54%) while adding 76 yds rush (7.6). Duke missed a GW 42 yd FG here in '08 and fell OT, 33-30 but did upset NCSt and Virginia on the ACC road LY.

Hawaii 34 ARMY 31 - Hawaii defeated Army 59-28 (-26) in '03 in Honolulu in their only meeting. UH outgained (588-524), outFD'd (31-25), had the TOP edge (32:07-27:53) and won the TO battle vs USC in the opener. UH QB Moniz passed for 269 yds (50%) with a 1-0 ratio before being knocked with a slight concussion (check status) and WR Pilares had 5 rec (35.2 ypc!) for a career-high 176 yds and 3 TD as 3 different WR's broke the 100 yd barrier. Army won the TO battle 3-1 and FB Hassin rushed for 68 yds and scored 3 TD (incl GW TD with :38 left) to lead Army to a 31-27 win over EM. HC Ellerson is a UH alum (3 coaching stints also) and the Warriors are making their first trip to the "Empire State" embarking on their furthest trip East in school history. UH is 3-12 SU and 6-9 ATS in road openers but the Warriors have covered in 5 of their L/7 gms overall. Army is on a current 5-12 ATS skid and is only 2-11 SU and 2-9 ATS in home openers but has gone 2-2 SU (0-3 ATS) in the L/4. This is a matchup of two completely different offenses with the Run-&Shoot of UH (incl new "pistol") and the option of Army but look for the Warriors to come away with a close win.

WISCONSIN 52 San Jose St 3 - The only previous meeting was in '07 as UW won 56-10 (16' pt AF) with 579-278 yd and 23-12 FD edges. SJSt returns 15 st'rs but with a new HC MacIntyre switching up some positions, they aren't as experienced as the numbers say. The Spartans were outgained 591-175 and outFD'd 30-7 as they managed to convert just 1 of 13 3rd downs vs Bama in a mismatch LW. UW had just 10 st'rs back LY but returns 16 TY and is a Top 10 contender. UW has huge edges on ff (#8-113), def (#28-108) and ST (#62-120) here. QB Tolzien was an efficient 15-20 (75%) for 197 yds and RB Clay rushed for 123 yds (7.2) and 2 TD in the Badgers' 41-21 win over UNLV LW. As usual, UW wants to establish the run and the Badgers will look to exploit a SJSt's DL which avg's 264 lbs and allowed 6.1 ypc (#119 NCAA) LY. The UW O-line avg's 6'5" 323 lbs and churned out 204 ypg LY (#15 in FBS). The Badgers have won 14 straight home openers SU but are just 4-10 ATS in those gms. UW has ASU on deck but SJSt has to make another lengthy trip here and may put the focus on keeping some players healthy for the winnable gms.

Lsu 30 VANDERBILT 16 - LSU had a 479-138 yd edge LY at home but only pushed 23-9 (-14). LSU has not traveled here since '05 when they won 34-6 (-15). Vandy is just 7-15 ATS as a HD as the SEC opp's fans sometimes outnumber VU's crowd. LSU is 3-6-1 ATS as an AF since '07. The Tigers have big edges in all 3 areas with our #23 off, #18 D and #16 ST vs Vandy's #90, #84 and #82 units. LSU has lost 3 straight as a true AF ATS and was outgained by 121 ypg in those. LSU (up 30-10 at half) survived a last second comeback try vs susp riddled NC LW and the Tigers were outgained 436-313 repeating '09's pattern (outgained by 300 yds LY). VU's comeback try vs NW was thwarted by a missed 2 pt with 2:25 left due to a bad snap in HC Caldwell's debut. The near blown lead vs NC should have the Tigers more focused here.

IOWA 34 Iowa St 17 - ISU is 7-5 SU and 10-2 ATS in the battle for the Cy Hawk Trophy. The dog is 7-2 ATS but the HT is 5-1 ATS. Iowa won 35-3 LY as a 6' pt AF as a 2★ on these pages. ISU had 6 TO's incl 5 int (all by starting S's Sash and Greenwood who return) and were outgained 426-303. The Hawks have now held ISU out of the EZ the L/3 gms (14Q's). ISU jumped out to a 17-0 HT lead (279-112 yd edge) over N Illinois on Thursday en route to an impressive 27-10 win. RB Robinson had 97 yd and QB Arnaud had 310 thl yd but with 2 int however and must be more careful after throwing 4 int vs the Hawks LY. Iowa jumped out to a 21-0 1Q lead over E III in a 37-7 win in which the Hawks had 24-6 FD and 435-157 yd edges as E III scored their lone TD after a 36 yd run on a fake P. Iowa also had a blk'd P TD and a safety in the win which is not surprisingly where they have big edges over the Cyclones (#11-75 D and #13-31 ST).

CALIFORNIA 34 Colorado 20 - These 2 programs last met in '82. Jeff Tedford is 6-0 SU and 5-1 ATS at home vs non-conf BCS tms (26 pt avg win) and are home for a 2nd consec week here after dismantling UC Davis as they outgained the Aggies by a 517-81 clip. Colorado is off its annual season-opening meeting vs Colo St, a game in which they scored the first 24 pts of the game en route to a 21 pt victory (307-245 yd edge). The Buffs (2nd straight wk away from home) do have 17 ret st/s and could be bowl bound TY but despite having a Friday night game with Nevada on deck, the Bears (4-0 in 1st lined game of the ssn) appear to be too strong for Colorado in this one as CU has dropped 13 of their L/18 ATS in regular ssn play vs non-conf BCS foes (lost 7 in a row SU on the road).

OKLAHOMA 38 Florida St 24 - OU is 18-7-1 ATS at home and should be well prepared for Fla St who is one of the ACC pressn favs. LY FSU was +8 at #7 BYU and not only won they rolled to a 54-28 win. They did lose to #1 Fla on the road 37-10. #1 OU beat #3 FSU in the '00 Orange Bowl, 13-2 (+10), to claim its last National Title (last meeting). OU was caught in a lookahead LW but scored its 800th program win, in ugly fashion, barely getting past Utah St. OU only outgained USU by 1 yd (422-421) with just 2 more FD's (23-21). QB Jones hit 17-36 for 217 with a 2-2 ratio but RB Murray did have a career high 218 (6.2) incl a crucial 4th down conv in the 3Q which led to his 63 yd score and an OU 28-17 lead. OU got a foot-dragging int with 4:12 left to preserve the 31-24 win. FSU got new HC Fisher his first win in a 59-6 stomping of Samford. Both QB's Ponder (12-14-167, 4-1 ratio) and Manuel (10-13-129, 0-1) saw action as FSU finished with 481-300 yd and 27-19 FD edges. The offense and ST's are close but OU has our #7 D while FSU's is #39. The Sooners have something to prove after LW's closer-than-expected final.

NOTRE DAME 30 Michigan 27 - Visitor is just 2-9 w/5 straight upsets in South Bend and 6 str upsets overall in this series. LY UM blew a DD 4Q lead but prevailed on a 5 yd TD pass w/1:11 left. UM is 2-8 SU & 1-11 ATS in road openers. The HT is 9-2 SU but the dog is 13-2 ATS. Rich Rod is just 2-7 ATS on the road at UM. The Kelly era began with a 23-12 home win over Purdue (led 20-3 into 4Q). Crist (19-26 for 205) became the first Irish QB to win his starting debut S/'02 but the Irish settled for 3 FG's and star WR Floyd fmbld on the way into the EZ. The maligned D had 4 sks and 2 int of PU QB Marve. The Wolves won a 3★ on these pages in their convincing 30-10 win over Conn. New UM QB Robinson did his best Pat White impersonation with 383 thl yd and 2 TD in his starting debut as the Wolves outran the Huskies 287-138. UM did blk a 1H FG and forced a fmbld at the Wolves 3 in the 3Q with the score 24-10.

MIAMI, OH 33 E Michigan 17 - Miami is 16-4 (9-1 w/6 str wins) vs EM. The last meeting was in '05 as MU survived after allowing a TD with :13 left but EM missed the PAT. MU has dropped 5 str home openers by 20 ppg. The Eagles have lost 11 straight road openers and are 2-18 losing by an avg of 25 ppg. EM hasn't won in Oxford S/'93 and has dropped all 6 meetings since by 12 ppg. Despite their similar MAC records Miami was +34.5 ypg and EM was -194.5 ypg LY. Miami had the same amount of yds (212) as Florida but QB Dysert's 4 int cost them incl a pick-six. RB Merriweather was ejected mid-2Q (CS) after throwing a punch. MU also settled for 4 FG's after being stopped in the RZ. EM came close to ending their 12 gm losing streak but gave up a TD to Army with :38 left. Both teams finished last in their MAC divisions LY and are much improved TY but we give Miami good sized edges on both offense and defense. With the RedHawks gaining valuable confidence vs Florida, Dysert's int are a concern.

BOSTON COLLEGE 30 Kent St 13 - LY BC lead 34-0 after 3Q's and KSU got 65 yds (36%) on its final drive in garbage time. KSU is 2-12 SU (4-10 ATS) in road openers and 6-12 ATS after a SU win the L/SY. BC is 13-0 SU and 10-2-1 ATS vs the MAC, 8-3 ATS as a HF and has a bye next week. BC is off their emotional win vs Weber St where leader Herzlich returned to action. The Eagles rolled to a 411-381 yd edge but were actually outFD'd 24-17. QB Shinsky finished with 185 pass yds (50%, 2-2 ratio) and RB Harris had 115 (6.1). It was Harris' 5th str 100 yd gm. Kent is off a 41-10 win over Murray St. The Flashes were only up 24-10 at the half when Bowman raced 92 yds for a KR TD to start the 3Q. The D also did its part with a schl record -65 yds rush all'd. QB Keith threw for 275 (69%) and RB Jarvis (out after 2 gms LY) looked to be back to form with an early TD run. BC has outscored KSU 55-7 in this short series and should win comfortably again before a week off.

OHIO ST 30 Miami (FL) 20 - Last met in the 2002 National Champ Game in which heavily fav'd UM lost 31-24 in 2OT on a controversial pass interf call. UM is 9-6 ATS as an AD. OSU is 13-5 ATS vs non-conf BCS tms during the reg ssn. With a bye on deck this game was the focus of August for Miami who got their 1st shutout S/'06 over Fla A&M, 45-0 on Thursday with 23-8 FD and 405-110 yd edges and never punting. The Canes came out in a no huddle and racked up a 35-0 HT lead with QB Harris (210 yd and 3 TD) sitting out the 2H. OSU rolled over Marshall 45-7 as our Thursday Night Marquee Play with 23-11 FD and 529-199 yd edges as MU's TD was a 61 yd blk'd FG return. MU also missed a 40 yd FG, fmbld at the OSU6 and had an int ret'd 30 yd for a TD. Both D's are in the top 10 (#2-3 OSU) but the Bucks have our #2 offense vs Miami's #32 led by Heisman candidate QB Pryor (247 yd and 3 TD LW). OSU is 0-4 ATS at home vs ranked tms.

UTAH 41 Univ 17 - Utah is 10-1 SU and 7-3-1 ATS in MWC play with their avg win over LV by 18 ppg. UT is 9-4-1 as a MWC HF. LY despite being outFD'd 23-14 UT was in control after an int led to a 8/2pt TD and on the next drive got a 64 yd IR TD. LW UT built a 24-13 lead mid-4Q before all'g Pitt to battle back and take it to OT. Pitt was int'd on the 1st pl of OT and UT nailed a 21 yd FG for the 27-24 Thurs night win. The Utes finished with 405-266 yd edges behind QB Wynnn who threw for 283 (58%, 3-1 ratio). The RB duo of Asiata/Wide took 25 of the tm's 27 rush att's (112, 4.5). LV hung around #12 Wisky LW thanks to a 19 yd IR TD and an 82 yd FR which set up a 16/1pt TD, 17-14 at half. UW blew it open in the 2H winning 41-21. To the surprise of many, new HC Hauck opted to start Clausen (4-10-23, 1-0 ratio) over 23 gm str Clayton, although he did see time (6-16-82, 1-0) and was the #1 rusher (59, 6.6). Last time here UT (-21) trailed 14-7 late 1H (outgained 205-91) but rallied for the 42-21 win and the Utes know they have a bull's-eye on their back after bolting for the P10, so they'll take no foe lightly.

Oregon 34 TENNESSEE 20 - Oregon is 27-6 ATS in road openers but this is their 1st trip to the heat and humidity of SEC country S/'03 (Miss St) not to mention the 1st RG for QB Thomas (230 yds, 55%, 2-1 ratio in 1H vs NM). UO did begin the ssn in fine form LW as they demolished NM 72-0 outgaining them by a whopping 751-119 margin as our Early Bird POW. In '06 UT was at home vs #9 Cal and destroyed the Bears 35-17 despite being an underdog. That UT team was more talented and TY they have just 9 str's back with a lot of attrition due to their 3rd HC in 3 yrs. The Vols are fresh off their dominance of UT Martin earning their 1st shutout S/'03 (537-142 edge) but are just #119 in terms of exp TY while UO, after being inexp'd LY now has 17 ret st/s with just a 1AA on deck. Despite their 10-3 record LY they were outgained away from home by an avg of 389-360 but TY being clearly more talented and with the return of RB James from susp to go with LW's star Barner (206 thl yds, 5 TD), the Ducks should be able to pull one out in Knoxville.

TULSA 41 Bowling Green 24 - TU has outscored BG 108-17 in the 2 prior meetings. In the last gm ('07 GMAC Bowl) the Hurricane outgained the Falcons by 333 yds (35-0 at HT). TU's 63-7 win was the biggest rout in NCAA bowl history. TU has won 4 str home openers. Tulsa did just play a CUSA gm on Sun and LY tms on a short week after week 1 all struggled. They have in-state rival Okla St on deck, and a win vs a BCS foe would be a program booster. BG did go into Missouri LY in wk 2 and actually led in the 4Q as a 19' pt dog. BG has a young beatable secondary and GJ Kinne should have a big day. BG lost by 3 as a 14 pt AD to Troy LW on a last second FG despite being outgained 475-339.

TEXAS 34 Wyoming 6 - UT is 3-0 SU vs WY but LY got off to a slow start trailing 10-6 late 2Q before "waking up" (UT held WY out of EZ). LW UT got off to a slow start again, only up on Rice 10-3 early 2Q. QB got a 10 yd FR TD to go up by 14 and finally found their rhythm in the 1st gm without McCoy. QB Gilbert, who threw 4 int in his last outing (Title gm), did not have a TO, throwing for 172 (61%). Longhorns are 10-0 SU in home openers with the avg MOV 42 ppg. WY HC Christensen is all-too-familiar with UT and has been outscored 211-97 the L/5 times he's faced them (OC at Mizzou '01-'08). The Pokes are 3-21 SU but 15-9 ATS S/'94 vs ranked foes and did go 5-1 as an AD LY. For the 1st time in 4 wins, WY did not need a 4Q comeback to get past S Utah LW. Instead they fought one off building a 28-10 lead before SU rallied for 10 4Q pts. WY was actually outgained 384-355 and outFD'd 24-20. QB Carta-Samuels threw for a career high 319 (81%, 3-1 ratio), the 1st 300 yd pass gm at WY S/'06. WR Bolger also had a career day with 134 rec yds (26.8) and 5 TD's. UT has large edges all around and although TT is on deck, WY has a big HG vs incoming MWC foe Boise next wk.

TEXAS A&M 41 Louisiana Tech 20 - A&M is 9-0 SU and 4-1 ATS and has covered in the L/3 meeting winning 37-17 (+14) in '99, 31-3 (+13) in '02 and 45-14 (+23) in '06. LT's new HC Dykes (TT grad, WR/co-OC '00-'06) is a spread off specialist and stated he has 8 to 12 WR's who are ready and able to contribute in his new system. While his Bulldogs defeated Grambling St 20-6 LW, LT was short 3 key WR's (susp, CS) and LT needed to rely on its D. The Aggies cruised to a comfortable 48-7 win over SFA LW as QB Johnson completed 28-40 for 322 and 2 TD as A&M finished with 539 yds of tll off. A&M is well versed in defending the TT offense (LY beat TT 52-30) and also looked good in their new 3-4 alignment LW en route to holding SFA's all-time passing leader Moses to 19-37 for 171 yds. A&M has the edges on off (#10-85) and def (#42-70) but LT does have the ST edge (#17-75). LT is 8-26 as an AD, however, the Bulldogs are on a 8-3 ATS run incl a 5-1 streak. But the Aggies were 4-1 as a HF LY covering by 23 ppg! The Bulldogs have dropped 6 str "true" road openers by 35 ppg (all vs BCS). This is A&M's only true competition in the first 4 wks so they should be up for this.

WASHINGTON 30 Syracuse 20 - The Orange are making a rare trip to the West Coast. Syracuse got off to a good start LW vs Akron winning their 1st ssn opener S/'03 (431-166 edge). Wash outgained Syr 444-207 in their season opening rout at the Carrier Dome in '07 as QB Locker went 14-19 for 142 yds in his 1st ever start. With big expectations heading into TY, UW continued its road struggles LW in Provo falling by 6 to BYU as they were unable to score in the 2H (Huskies have not won on the road S/'07). SU convincingly won a 4★ LPS for us 29-3 at Akron with 20-9 FD and 433-166 yd edges. UW has a date with Neb on deck while Syr only has a matchup with IAA Maine following. While the Orange has the defensive edge (#24-58), the Huskies are far superior on offense (#20-77) and in our experience ratings (#10-79) giving them the solid edge in this one.

OHIO 30 Toledo 20 - Toledo went 0-3 SU/ATS vs the MAC East LY (2-7 SU/ATS L/3Y). The visitor is 0-4 ATS. Ohio is 20-11 ATS at home vs the MAC and 18-8-1 ATS off of a SU win. Toledo has dropped 4 straight road openers. The last game in '07, Ohio racked up 560 yds but 7 TO's cost them the win. The Rockets are off an embarrassing 41-2 loss to Arizona at home where they were outgained 518-183 including allowing 84% comp and 413 passing yds. The Bobcats have covered 3 straight at home, including LW vs Wofford as QB Boo Jackson saw his first action (112 thl yds) since being inj'd and lost for the ssn in the 2nd gm LY.

BAYLOR 41 Buffalo 27 - Only meeting was in Buffalo in '07 and the Bears won 34-21 but had a 27-7 lead after 3Q's as the Bulls scored 14 pts, gained 187 yds (52%) and 10 FD's (56%) in the 4Q. Buffalo is 2-11 SU (5-5 ATS) in road openers but did pull the outright upset LY in El Paso, TX. The Bears are 11-2 ATS as a single digit home favorite. The Bears are 3-3 SU but just 1-3 ATS in Waco openers. Baylor has TCU on deck but knows to make a bowl they cannot afford to slip up in any expected wins. QB Griffin ret'd to action LW and threw for 242 yds (53%) with a 2-0 ratio. Buffalo has a new HC and their young QB Jerry Davis is making his first road start of the ssn after throwing for 302 (60%) with 4-1 ratio in their home opener.

ALABAMA 30 Penn St 20 - Saban is 2-3 vs Paterno with all of the meetings while Saban was HC of Mich St from '95-'99. These two last met in 1990 (PSU 9-0 road win, +2). PSU is 1-5 SU/ATS vs Top 10 tms (4 yrs) although they beat LSU in the bowl LY. The Tide has just 2 str's back on D but BCS Title Gm MVP DE Dareus may be susp'd. Heisman winner RB Ingram (knee) DNP in the 48-3 win over SJST and may not return for this but Richardson had 112 thl yd and 2 TD in 1H of work vs the overmatched Spartans. Bama had 30-7 FD and 591-175 yd edges in the game. PSU actually trailed YSU 7-6 with 2:00 left in the 1H before scoring 10 pts in 1:50 in a 44-14 win in which the Penguins hit an 80 yd 2Q TD pass and capped an 80 yd drive with a garbage time TD (:54 left). The Lions game struggled with star TB Royster having just 40 (3.6). Bolden became the 1st true freshman QB to start the opener (20-29 for 239 with 2-1 ratio) but now takes a gigantic step up on the road vs the defending champs who have our #6 D.

UCF 27 NC State 23 - NCSt is 2-5 SU/ATS in road openers. UCF is 0-9 SU and 2-7 ATS hosting current BCS schools. In the only meeting ('07) NCSt was upset in Raleigh 25-23 but did have 16-13 FD and 357-299 yd edges (-2 TO's). O'Leary is 7-1 SU vs NCSt (6-1 as GT HC). The Knights are off a 38-7 win over S Dakota outgaining them 472-220 with a 27-13 FD edge. QB Calabrese threw for 176 (80%) with a 1-0 ratio while Guyton had 127 rec yds (15.9) and Davis rushed for 107 (5.3). NCSt HC O'Brien won his 1st opener in 4 tries with a 48-7 pounding of W Carolina LW. QB Wilson, who ret'd to football just a few wks ago (baseball), threw for 306 (68%) with 4 TD's in the 1H before giving way to Glennon mid-3Q. NCSt has the off edge (#44-81) but UCF ranks higher on D (#37-68) and ST's (#11-74). NCSt has a Thurs Night gm vs Cincy on deck and UCF (4th yr at Bright House Stadium) almost upset Texas here in '07.

4★ Green Bay over PHILADELPHIA - Last year's #6 & #2 units open up on the road vs the #11 & #12 units. The Packers' #1 offense ran 14 series prior to pre-4 and they only punted 3 times with 1 being a 3 & out. GB has a massive edge at QB with Rodgers (470 yds 77% 6-0) at the helm with an improved OL & a proven RB with Grant who has B2B 1200 yd seasons. They have major issues in the secondary with CB Harris & SS Bigby being on the PUP and rookie Morgan Burnett filling in at SS. On the other hand Dom Capers deliberately ran a stripped down defense in the preseason not showing any of his blitzes. PHI is making a major transition to QB Kolb who only has 2 starts under his belt with 391 yds vs NO in garbage time & 327 yds vs LY's #30 defense. PHI's OL is a question as Ctr Jackson (ACL) isn't going to play, LG Herremans missed most of camp & LT Peters hasn't looked strong TY. The Eagles do have a very fast defense to matchup vs GB's passing game. In what looks to be a shootout, we'll side with GB who was 8-4 as a fav LY with Rodgers at the helm vs an inexperienced Kolb.

FORECAST: Green Bay 34 PHILADELPHIA 13

3★ PITTSBURGH (+) over Atlanta - The Falcons (9-2 ATS away vs AFC) look to be getting PIT at a good time as they are without their starting QB (susp), lost their best OL (LT Colon) for the year, their most dynamic playmaker on offense (WR Holmes) & will start a rookie (Pouncey) at Ctr. ATL brings back all 11 starters on offense with QB Ryan & RB Turner healthy. However PIT has all 11 defensive starters back, Hall of Fame DC LeBeau and has a massive homefield edge. Ryan admitted that he started focusing on PIT after the first preseason game due to their blitz packages. ATL did allow 107 ypg rushing (4.0) LY & RB Mendenhall & TE Miller look to be a big part of this game. PIT hasn't been a HD since they beat NE 34-20 as a 3 pt HD halfway thru 2004 and Heinz Field's poor surface should slow down ATL's speed. Look for PIT to pull an upset with Dixon at the helm.

FORECAST: PITTSBURGH 17 (+) Atlanta 13

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ NY GIANTS over Carolina - The Giants were crushed 41-9 in their final game at Giants Stadium LY as a 7.5 pt HF. CAR ran up a 247 (5.4) to 60 (3.2) yd edge on the ground vs a defense that quit on their DC. New DC Perry Fewell is an upgrade to their defense as is FS Rolle. CAR could have 5 new starters on defense, still haven't found a #2 option in the passing game for WR Smith & their special teams are not very promising. CAR's offense did not score a TD in 42 drives in the first 3 preseason games though they rested RB's Williams & Stewart. The Giants are a pass first team with the weapons to take advantage of CAR's young defense (3rd youngest team in NFL) and neutralize CAR's formidable ground game for the win.

FORECAST: NY GIANTS 34 Carolina 7

2★ Cleveland (+) over TAMPA BAY - The NFL does try to schedule similarly talented teams to start the season to give the lesser teams a chance at a good start to the year. This is CLE's first road game to open a season (1-9 SU & 2-9 ATS) since their return. CLE has done much more in FA to upgrade their roster including adding Delhomme who is 8-3 ATS vs TB. Delhomme (345 yds 79% 2-0 in preseason) provides the Browns with the most experienced & proven QB over L12Y which is a huge boost considering what the position had LY. TB is expected to start 2 rookie WR's, 2 rookie DT's & QB Freeman (thumb) only logged 8 pass att for the 1st string offense in preseason. While both teams have outstanding special teams, CLE has a big edge with their secondary vs TB's WR's, QB experience and their OL vs TB's DL. With a more polished coaching staff getting points here, we select Cleveland to be the first **Ugly Dog Play** of the season on these pages (**Ugly Dogs are 25-16 61%**).

OTHER GAMES

Minnesota at NEW ORLEANS - Thurs. The Saints beat the Vikings 31-28 as 3' pt HF's in LY's NFC Championship game by being as physical as they could with Favre. MIN had a 475-257 yd edge but also had 5 TO's. MIN has eagerly looked forward to the rematch but their issues at WR in the preseason is a concern. The defending SB winners are 10-0 SU & 7-3 ATS in Wk 1 but a loss validates concerns about the Saints celebrating for too long. **Thursday Night Magic! Miami 23 BUFFALO 17 - Chan Gailey (with 1st year OC & DC) makes his official debut with the Bills & will field QB Edwards' 3rd different offense in as many years. Edwards has looked much better with the #1's in 2010 with 5 TD drives in pre-2 & 3 vs LY when the 1st string offense had 3 pts in 15 drives. BUF is 5-1 ATS hosting MIA & expect to have its full set of RB's here. MIA is 8-3 ATS on the road & upgraded the passing game with WR Marshall. They did release 16 of LY's 44 sacks with OLB's Porter & Taylor but are faster overall on defense while BUF is starting to convert to the 3-4. MIA has a massive edge with stability, a stout OL, a more experienced coaching staff & we like the exotic blitzes that DC Mike Nolan will bring vs BUF's young OL for the win here.

CHICAGO 30 Detroit 17 - The Lions were beaten by 24 & 14 pts LY vs CHI. The Lions turned a major weakness into a strength with the retooling of a DL which allowed 127 ypg rush (4.4) (25th) & were 29th with 26 sacks. DET has had one of the worst secondaries over the L3Y allowing 252 ypg (69%) with a 92-30 ratio (1 TD allowed every 17 pass att's). They will only return 1 DB from LY's secondary & FS Delmas (groin) has been very limited. CHI's offense has struggled to adjust to Martz's complicated schemes & the OL has allowed Cutler to be sacked 10 times in 37 pass att's thru pre-3. New OL Coach Tice admitted to keeping the blocking schemes (all 37) under wraps in the preseason. DET's former HC & CHI DC Rod Marinelli has a healthy MLB Urlacher an upgrade with FS Harris not to mention the addition of Julius Peppers. Cutler was very efficient LY avg 209 ypg (63%) with a 6-0 ratio vs DET in an offense that didn't suit his talents & CHI should expose DET here.

NEW ENGLAND 35 Cincinnati 27 - In the last meeting, NE beat CIN 34-13 as a 7.5 pt AF on MNF in 2007. Too much shouldn't be read into NE's 1 pt loss to STL in pre-3 as after scrimmaging NO & ATL each for 2 days prior to the game they were worn out defensively. NE has issues as their projected starting CB tandem has 14 games between them vs a much improved CIN receiving group. LG Mankins is holding out, WR Welker isn't 100% despite his preseason showing, DE Ty Warren was lost early in the preseason & it's unknown where the pass rush is going to come from. While solid at CB with Hall & Joseph the Bengals are weak at the safety position & will rely on the front 7 who returns DE Odom (8 sacks in 6 games LY) to create a pass rush. NE has the intangible edge as Brady & Moss are in contract years, the defensive gameplan is squarely on Belichick who is his own DC in 2010, with a home crowd firmly on their side. CIN is a solid team for 2010 but Brady has been very intense in the preseason & we'll side with the home team in a higher scoring game.

JACKSONVILLE 20 Denver 7 - This is the 5th meeting over the L7Y with the dog being 4-0 SU & ATS. JAX is 0-10 ATS as a HF & 4-16 ATS vs a non-div foe the L2Y. JAX was a very young team LY & their inability to pressure the QB really hurt them as they logged 14 sacks with a 28-15 ratio. They bolstered the unit with DE Kampman & MLB Morrison and have logged 8 sacks in the first 3 preseason games. Still the Jags have a sizeable edge here as DEN will start a rookie Ctr, LG & won't have a 100% LT Clady (knee sprain). Neither RB Moreno or Buckhalter took a snap in the first 3 preseason games with a new OL blocking scheme. DEN will have 6 new starters in their defensive front 7 & are without OLB Dumervil (pectoral) who led the NFL with 17 sacks LY for new DC Don Martindale. Orton is a very underrated QB but losing 29% of LY's offensive yards with Marshall & TE Scheffler gone will be tough to overcome in the heat & humidity here.

Indianapolis 24 HOUSTON 23 - The Texans are notoriously slow to start the season (1-5 SU & ATS in Wk 1). They open the season vs a team they have only beaten once SU in 16 tries. The Texans are also without WLB Cushing (susp) & rookie RB Tate (IR ankle) with a rebuilt secondary that will start rookie 1st RD DC CB Kareem Jackson who will matchup vs a 3 WR base offense. The Colts have major issues on the OL as Ctr Saturday (knee scope) missed 3 Wks of workouts, LT Johnson's (foot) status as well as top backup OG/OT Ugoch (toe) are unknown here. Manning will also be working with a new play caller for the 1st time in his career as vaunted OL coach Mudd retired so the continuity isn't there. HOU is very aware of how close they've come vs IND losing by 4, 6, 3 & they blew a 13 pt halftime lead in the 2nd game LY. Kubiak will rely on the DL to take advantage of a jumbled IND OL to keep Manning out of rhythm while Schaub & LY's #4 offense with a healthy TE Daniels.

TENNESSEE 24 Oakland 17 - Fisher is 6-2 ATS in Wk 1 but is 1-4 ATS vs the Raiders (2-5 ATS Wk 1). Both teams look to be improved over 2009. OAK is vastly better at QB if Campbell (56% comp with 1's TY) can provide avg play but the OL is avg at best, are without their best WR in Schilens (knee) & #1 RB Bush (brkn thumb) is very questionable. OAK invested a lot of treasure in the defense to shore up the #29 rush defense (156 ypg 4.5 LY) & it will be tested by Chris Johnson here. Young has been very sharp in the preseason (71% 9.1 ypa thru pre-3) & OC Heimerdinger will take advantage of teams focusing on Johnson to spread the ball around. While OAK surprised the NFL with 6 sacks vs a bad CHI OL they only had 1 vs SF & the Titans have arguably the best OL in the NFL. OAK is improved but TEN is more physical at home and get the win.

San Francisco 17 SEATTLE 16 - The dog has won 3 of the L4. Alex Smith (162 yds 56% 2-0) led a 24-14 upset as a 9 pt dog here in the rain in a Thurs night game in 2006 so he won't be intimidated by SEA's amazingly loud crowd. For the first time in his career Smith gets to stay in the same system with the same OC. His command of the offense has improved despite RB Gore, WR Crabtree & TE Davis resting for most of the preseason. The big issue for SF is that they'll have a rookie LG (lupati), RT (Davis) & Ctr Heitmann broke his leg in the preseason which shifted backup RG Baas to Ctr. Hasselback is now the best QB in the NFC West & has a good set of WR's to work with but will still contend with a questionable OL. LT Okung (high ankle sprain) is out indef which shifted LG Wrotto to his spot with Ctr Spencer & RT Locklear having been beaten up during the preseason. SEA has taken to Carroll's offensive system & the defense will remain the same as LY as they retained DC Gus Bradley. SF is an up & coming team but since halfway thru 2003 they have been an AF just twice (1-1 ATS). SF is a known commodity but SEA isn't & we'll call for SEA to keep it closer than expected here.

Arizona 28 ST LOUIS 10 - ARZ is 9-4 ATS vs STL who are 8-16 ATS at home. ARZ was the big talent loser in the offseason losing 6 starters (3 off, 3 def) as well as their special teams ace (Sean Morey) & K Rackers. The retirement of Warner & fall from grace of Leinart has left the QB spot a mess. Combined with the injuries to Fitzgerald (knee sprain) & #3 WR Doucet (abdominal strain), ARZ will be a much more run oriented team in 2010 & their 3-4 defense should still be able to pressure the QB (43 sacks LY, 6th). STL is expected to start Bradford (1st start since 10/17/09) with the worst receiving group (top 4 projected WR & TE combined for 123 rec's 9.7 LY) in the NFL and essentially a pair of rookie OT's on the OL. STL didn't do much to improve LY's #29 defense. Keep in mind that their coaching staff is a 2nd year HC/OC/DC/STC. Even in their depleted state the Cardinals have a better roster than STL & their Steeler-style 3-4 will feature a lot of exotic blitzes vs the inexperienced Bradford.

Dallas at WASHINGTON - Sun Night - Shanahan makes his debut with the Redskins & you can expect to see McNabb under center. Jerry Jones wore out the Cowboys with their preseason travel schedule & the OL could be without LG Kosier and RT Columbo with an inexperienced LT Free. DAL has much better depth at WR and on special teams & are firmly entrenched in their systems. Call for tonight's Sunday night winner! **Get this play on the Northcoast Debit Card System for only \$9 after 11:00 am ET on Sunday. Baltimore at NY JETS - MNF - The Jets have gone all out in the PR department this offseason & it will be interesting to see how Rex Ryan schemes go vs the defense he ran in BAL from 2005-2008. BAL promises to have more balance on offense which could be a problem for the Jets without Revis. This should be a textbook example of 2 physical defenses who may wear each other out before their main division rivals next week.

San Diego at KANSAS CITY - MNF - Arrowhead Stadium wrapped up a \$375 million renovation in the offseason and this is KC's only primetime appearance in 2010. SD remains the favorite for the AFC West but they will be without LT McNeil, WR Jackson & will have a rookie feature RB here. KC is 5-16 ATS at home but SD is 1-5 ATS in their first 2 games under Norv Turner. **Don't miss out on Monday Night Magic! SMU 30 Uab 27 - The Mustangs are 3-0 SU vs the Blazers but have been outgained in 2 of the 3. UAB however is off a disappointing loss to FAU, a game in which they led 28-12 mid-3Q but had the potential GW 28 yd FG blk'd as time expired. LY we had a 4★ LPS Winner on SMU and they delivered another outright upset (+11') for the Big Dog Play of the Week. UAB was 1-5 as an AD in '09 and have a young QB making his first road start. QB Isabelle did set a UAB single game record for a QB rushing for 214 yds LW but a costly int turned the tide against them. LY teams playing on a short week off the opener all struggled and SMU just played on Sunday against TT. SMU is 0-7 ATS as a HF with 3 outright upsets in that span but they do have the home field edge in this one and should pull one out here as the Blazers are on a 1-18 run in road openers.

Texas Tech 41 NEW MEXICO 20 - The Lobos are just 5-17 vs teams from the state of Texas S/'98. LY NM was only down 14-7 at half but TT scored 28 consec pts in a 17:12 span to blow it open (48-28, -34). TT only outgained NM by 56 yds as QB Potts left before HT and Sheffield came in to throw for 238 and 3 TD's. TT took on SMU on Sunday afternoon, so the results are unknown as of presstime. TT is 11-1 vs NM S/'85 but in the last trip to Albuquerque ('04) they lost 27-24 (-3). NM was pounded by Oreg 72-0 being destroyed in every area LW. NM had 5 TO's, all'd 2 PR TD's, was outFD'd 35-8 and outgained 720-107. QB Holbrook threw for just 70 yd (46%) with an 0-2 ratio while the leading rusher was Austin with just 26 (5.2). TT has a big game vs Texas on deck and must battle attitude while NM is 6-2 ATS at home vs BCS tms in Sept. Certainly easy to side against a team that got beat as bad as NM, but it's also another reason for the Raiders squad to look past them towards the Longhorns.

UCLA 30 Stanford 27 - The home team in this series is 7-1-1 ATS while the Bruins have gone 14-2 ATS in home openers. The absence of QB Prince during most of fall camp proved to be too much for the Bruins to overcome LW vs K-St as he was constantly out of sync with his WR's throughout the game (9-26 for 120 yds). Another scary stat in their loss to the Wildcats was the 313 yds (5.8) on the ground that they all'd (143 ypg, 4.0 ypc LY). UCLA has won 6 in a row at home vs Stanford by 12 ppg but did need a TD pass w/:12 left to pull out the win in the last meeting at the Rose Bowl. Stanford will be in its 1st true matchup of 2010 after blowing by Sac St as QB Luck threw for over 300 yds in the 1H (SU has a 529-167 yd edge). Harbaugh has struggled on the road in his 3 yr tenure with the Cardinal as they are just 5-11 SU but an inconsistent UCLA team with plenty of inj's and question marks should make this another tight contest.

NEVADA 37 Colorado St 20 - UN is just 1-9 SU but is 5-4 ATS vs CSU but did win 28-10 (-3) in the Rams' last visit to Reno ('06). LY CSU used 5 UN TO's (2 int and 3 fmb'l's) to score 28 of their 35 pts and the Rams held an opp scoreless in the 1H for the 1st time S/'03. In his CSU debut, Fr QB Thomas hit 24-33 for 196 yds vs in-state rival CU but was picked off 3x's and sacked another

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3x's and the Rams' run game was bottled up generating just 49 yds on 25 carries. CSU was only outgained 307-245 but lost the TO battle 3-1. UN has the edge here on off (#15-109) and ST's (#49-97). The nation's #1 rush off LY (345 ypg) took more to the air in their opener vs E Wash Lw as 339 of UN's 553 til yds were in the pass gm with TE Green having a career night pulling in 7 rec (20.6) and 2 TD. QB Kaepernick was 26-37 for 306 and a 2-0 ratio and also rushed for 60 yds and 2 TD. The Rams are 1-6 as an AD under HC Fairchild while UN is 19-4 ATS as a HF while also covering in 7 of their L/11 gms overall. The Wolf Pack are playing with legitimate revenge here and Vegas may have overcompensated with a 21 pt opening line.

KENTUCKY 37 Wku 13 - In the only prior matchup WKU lost 41-3 in '08 being outFD'd 23-8 and outgained 398-157. WKU is 0-12 and 0-3 ATS vs the SEC with the avg loss by 34 ppg. UK is 7-0 SU and 5-2 ATS vs current SBC teams. UK is 2-7 ATS as a HF with 4 outright losses. UK has just 11 ret str's while WKU has 18 but both are going thru a coaching change. Kentucky may be in a flat spot as they are off a 23-16 win over rival Louisville with a 466-317 yd edge. WKU didn't expect to beat Nebraska but with many players from inside the state, the Kentucky game was surely circled. WKU did pick up 299 yds vs a tough Nebraska D but did allow 534 yds.

† Michigan St 41 Florida Atlantic 17 - Detroit. FAU is 1-2-1 ATS on the B10 road losing by a comb 83-10 (vs Minny in '05 and '08). These 2 pushed in E Lansing in '08 in which MSU's Ringer rushed for 282 yds in a constant rain while FAU lost a fumble inside the Spartans 5 and bobbed a snap on a FG att. This FAU "home" game is being played at Ford Field where MSU held a practice in Aug. Oddly, the Spartans (28 area players) haven't played in Detroit S/'44 while the Owls (+7) upset CM here in the '08 Motor City Bowl, 24-21. The Spartans are 1-8-1 ATS the week before ND. MSU took advantage of mistake prone WM with a short P setting up a 36 yd TD drive, recovering fmb'l's at the MSU35 and 32, getting an int at the MSU19 and SOD at the MSU7 and 33. Bell became MSU's first true frosh RB to have 100 yd in his debut (141, 14.1). FAU pulled yet another outright upset for our Big Dog POW in their Thursday 32-31 win over UAB as they blk'd a 28 yd FG on the last play. The Owls trailed 28-12 in the 3Q before a 38 yd IR TD began the comeback which was sealed with a 38 yd TD run with 2:20 left. QB Van Camp hit 14-24 for 254 with a 3-2 ratio while star RB Morris had 103 (6.4).

ARKANSAS 52 Ulm 10 - Ark (-14) escaped with a 28-27 win '08 (ULM led 24-6 mid-3Q) but won the previous 7 meetings with ULM by 29 ppg. This is technically a HG for ULM but is played in Little Rock where the Hogs always play a couple of HG's and the crowd will be mostly Ark fans. The Hogs have our #6 ranked offense led by QB Mallett and a super set of rec's and only had Tenn Tech LW but has Georgia and Bama the next 2 weeks. LY in an SEC sandwich they jumped out to a big lead vs a woeful EM team (-36) and all'd the backdoor push yielding a TD with 2:14 left (63-27). This year's Hogs team has better depth on D (#30). ULM has just 10 ret str's and is actually playing their first game of the yr under new HC Berry so Ark has a GUB edge. ULM has our #119 off, #120 def with just 41.8% of the tkls returning from '09 (7th worst FBS), so the only question is whether Ark will stay focused in the 4Q or allows the backdoor cover.

NTEXAS 33 Rice 30 - This should be a great game as both teams are much improved TY and this game could hold a key to either becoming bowl eligible. Rice is 1-1 vs NT. In the last meeting ('08) the Owls had "only" a 502-412 yd edge turning 6 TO's into 28 pts. The 77 pts scored was the most since 1916 (146-3 win vs SMU) as they won 77-20! The schools are just under 300 miles apart. Rice was outgained by Texas 369-219 but still only lost 34-17 as a 30' pt HD. NT had 462-423 yd and 25-15 FD edges over Clemson as a 24' pt AD but lost 35-10. QB Tune threw for 240 (66%) but with a 1-2 ratio. NT is just 1-10 at home the L/2Y and is 1-6 ATS as a HD in that period but Rice has dropped 6 straight on the road and have been an AF just once in the L/3Y (won 49-44 at UTEP, 3 in '08).

Arkansas St 27 LOUISIANA 23 - The home tm had won 9 str in this series until LY. UL limited ASU to 101 yds in the 1st 3Q's taking a 21-3 led into the 4Q but had to hold on for the win getting a late int. Nine of the L/11 have been decided by 6 or less (dog is 7-4-1 but fav cover 4 str) and ASU is 5-14 SU incl 7 str losses at this site. UL is the more exp'd team with 13 ret str's (incl QB) vs 11. Both teams were AD's of 28+ LW. UL was destroyed 55-7 while being outFD'd 19-5 and outgained 377-128 by UGA but while ASU was outgained 608-366 by Aub they covered as a 31' pt AD (52-26) and only trailed 35-23 in the 3Q. UL QB Chris Masson did inj his hand and missed part of the game (CS). Last season Ark St was a 13' pt fav but lost outright to Louisiana which put them into a tailspin losing their next 2 SBC games by 17 and 24 points. They will be refocused for this SBC opener and are our **Revenge Game of the Week**.

OKLAHOMA ST 41 Troy 27 - Trojans won 41-23 in '07 at home but OSU got revenge 55-24 in '08's return game. Troy is 2-9 all-time vs B12 opps. In '08 OSU led 21-0 and piled up 612 yds vs Troy but Troy was up in '07 41-10 ending with 562 yds. Both teams are young (Troy 9 ret str's, 26 left lost, OSU 8 ret str's, 24 left lost). OSU is 11-5 ATS as a HF. The debut of the Cowboys new Air Raid offense was a success in a 65-17 win over Wash St as RB Hunter ret'd to '08's AA form with 257 yd (12.2) and 4 TD. QB Weeden (22-30 for 218, 3 TD) settled into the job as OSU took a 38-10 HT lead. The young D allowed just 112 rush yd (2.7) and had 3 sks. The Trojans hit a 34 yd FG with :07 left to beat BG as Troy had 475-329 yd edge as QB Robinson had uneven debut hitting 25-37 for 252 but with 2 int. OSU has the off (#42-53), D (#52-95) and home edges.

SYSTEM SECTION

There are 3 main methods of handicapping, Fundamental, Situation & Technical. Fundamental handicapping or the analysis of personnel matchups & power ratings is our main method of handicapping. This accounts for roughly 50% of how we view a game. Situation handicapping (analysis of letdown, look ahead, systems, etc...) takes up approximately 25% of our handicapping. Technical handicapping (analysis of angles) takes up the rest. You should never base your final selection on 1 factor. To be a complete handicapper you must look at all 3 methods. Each week in Power Sweep we provide a system to add to your handicapping arsenal. This is done at the request of our subscribers who want handicapping tips & methods. Many times we will agree with the side that the system chooses. Sometimes the Fundamental & Technical aspects of a game will outweigh the system & we have the other side written up in Power Sweep. **We want to make it clear that the side we write up in Power Sweep is the side we are on.** If that is ever the case during a week, keep the system for future use, but be aware that the side we write-up in the Power Sweep Selections page is the side we are on.
