NEWS AND NOTES - WEEK NINE 2011

NEWS AND NOTES - Team have success in their first game with an interim HC which was the case on Thurs night. Arizona scored 6 TD's on six 1H poss and had a 416-177 yd edge. New HC Kish installed the old Arizona (Double Eagle) Flex D as they led 42-7 at the half and increased it to 48-7 in the 4Q before UCLA scored the game's final 5 pts. UA finished with a 32-15 FD edge. Four UA and 6 UCLA players' were susp by the P12 for all or part of the next weeks games after a fight before half...Purdue was in control almost the entire game vs Illinois. They went 91/13pl for a TD with 3:25 left in the 1Q then went 88/9pl for another TD and after rec'ing a fmb'l went 14/4pl for a TD and led 21-0 at the half with a 229-129 yd edge. The 3Q opened with 8 punts before IL got a TD with 8:12 left and added another TD on a 12pl drive with just :54 left but PU rec'd the onside kick...Oklahoma St only had a 27-26 FD edge but in the 2H MO had 2 int's and lost a fumble at the OSU4 when threatening to make a game of it. Missouri was also SOD at their own 46 in the 2H. Trailing 38-24 MO got to the OSU35 but was tipped and int'd and their next drive they were int'd again and were ret'd to the MO43 with 3:38 left and OSU tacked on a 12 yd TD run 7 plays later for the 21 pt final margin...USF blew some opportunities vs Cincinnati. At the end of the half, they had a 1&gl at the 2 and were stuffed for no gain with :20 left but they let the clock run down to :02 and took a 20 yd FG. USF still stormed to a 27-17 lead after 3Q's but UC battled back to lead 30-27. USF got a TD with 1:27 left for a 34-30 lead but UC, led by Zach Collaros, would go 70/7pl and got a 2 yd TD run by Collaros on FD with :12 left. USF got a 20 yd run by Daniels but then when surrounded he did the lateral play and UC recovered...Tajh Boyd tied a school record with 5 TD passes and Kourtnei Brown had an IR and FR TD's on the D, the first DL to score a pair of TD's in a game in 57 years. UNC had a 6-1 TO deficit. The game was tied at 10 when Clemson drove for a TD then 2 poss later Brown got his IR TD to make it 24-10. CU would expand it to 59-24 but UNC got the game's final 2 TD's with 7:38 and 2:19 left in the game...TCU had a 515-85 yd edge but New Mexico actually fumbled on their first 2 poss setting up the Frogs for 22 and 24 yd TD drives, staking them to a 14-0 lead, not like the Frogs needed any help. It was 41-0 at the half and 55-0 after TCU blk'd a punt for a TD and the Frogs, after a 24 yd punt with 2:55 left, even added a 33/6pl drive for a TD for the 69-0 win...NC State DB David Amerson got his school record tying 8th int and is #1 in the NCAA in that category. All the talk for NCSt is about the departed Russell Wilson but Mike Glennon hit 20-36-231 yds and on the season is completing 144-229 for 1717 yds with a 19-6 ratio. NCSt had a 345-249 yd edge in a game that was dominated by punts (comb for 17). At 14-7 NCSt got a 79 yd TD pass but on the next pay UVA got a 60 yd TD pass to pull within 21-14 but the game was decided when Amerson got a 12 yd IR TD with 6:08 left for the 28-14 upset...Virg Tech had a 482-272 yd edge vs Boston College. UT settled for a couple of FG's in the 1H and actually trailed 7-6 but opened the 2H with 60, 89 and 56 yd TD drives to lead 27-7. BC got a 4&6, 7 yd TD pass with 9:08 left and VT went 74/11pl but settled for a 24 yd FG with 3:43 left on 4&2 when a TD would have put them over the spread. BC fumbled on the next play and VT got a FD at the 9 and ran 1 more play before taking a knee...Oregon was without QB Thomas and RB LaMichael James but still rolled to a 29-0 lead after 1Q and dominated with a 527-231 yd edge with CU's only score coming when UO's PR went backwards and was tackled for a safety. Not getting as much publicity but equally important was that CU was missing a dozen starters including RB Stewart and WR Richardson who accounted for 60% of their yards from scrimmage on the season. They then lost SS Perkins and KR Godson to inj's in the 1Q...LSU was without star CB Mathieu and top rusher Ware but still dominated Auburn. They did only lead 7-3 when AU punted with 6:57 left in the half and LSU would get 42 and 46 yd TD passes, the first by Jefferson and the 2nd by Lee both to Rueben Randall for TD's to pull away 21-3. LSU extended it 45-3 with AU going on an 86/10pl drive for a garbage TD with 2:22 left...Miami has now beaten Georgia Tech 3 straight times by a combined score of 92-34. GT came in avg 517 yards offense but was held to 211 although their D held UM to just 262 total yards. With the score 7-0, GT fumbled a punt into the EZ and UM fell on it for a TD. GT went on a 92/20pl drive and got a TD with 1:02 left in the half when UM got an important drive. Knowing GT was going to get the ball out to start the 3Q, UM ret'd the KO to the 46 and would go 46/3pl getting a TD with :25 left in the half to go up 21-7 and retake the momentum...In the 1H Nevada went on a 78/11pl drive but settled for a 22 yd FG and then went on a 73/9pl drive also settling for a 22 yd FG. With 6:47 left in the game, NV got a TD to go up 37-24 and got ahead of the spread. FSU went 59/3pl to get a TD with 6:00 left for the apparent backdoor cover but NV went 80/7pl and got a TD with 2:12 left, once again to get ahead of the spread, this time 45-31 with a 2 pt conv. FSU had a 3rd & 10 and fired incomplete into the EZ but pass interference gave them a FD at the 2 and they got at the TD 2pl later. NV rec'd the onside kick and FSU used both their final time-outs RB Ball took a 3&1 run, broke a tkl, broke a couple of tackles for its 15 yd run down field but was brought down at the 18 and they took a knee. Cody Fajardo threw for 313 yds for the Wolf Pack as NV piled up 581 yds and 29 FD's...Boise St's Chris Petersen took the opposite approach of TCU's Gary Patterson by not prepping for Air Force's option during the offseason. BSU only had a 423-408 yd edge and only led by 1 score with 1:00 to play. They were taking on AF's banged up D and in the 1H did fumble at the AF10 yd line, up 7-0. A key play happened with AF trailing 13-7 when they faked a punt from their own 31 and fmb'l'd and BSU scooped it up and ret'd it for a TD for some margin and it was 20-10 at the half. It was 27-20 with 9:47 left when BSU went 69/10pl for a TD with 5:07 left. AF got a TD with 3:31 left to get back within 1 score but BSU rec'd he onside kick and got a 25 yd FG with :42 left to clinch it. Kellen Moore tied Colt McCoy for most career victories by a starting QB (45)...Case Keenum became the FBS's career leader in total offense but Houston's win over Marshall was not as easy as the final score. MU had 2 long TD drives and the game was tied at 14 before UH scored on 3 straight drives for TD's to go up 35-14. MU went 77/14pl but on 4&gl at the 1, lost 2 yds on the final play of the half. MU opened the 3Q with a 79 yd drive for a TD to trail 35-21. UH, leading 42-21, got a 20 yd IR TD and then MU went 67/12pl but was int'd again and ret'd 69 yds. UH went 20/4pl for a TD to close it 56-21 and each team brought in backup QB's after that...Tulane fired Coach Bob Toledo and Memphis pulled the upset. UM did have a 200-178 yd edge at the half and led 14-10. TU drove for a TD to open the 3Q, 17-14 and was driving again to go up 2 scores when they were int'd and ret'd 79 yds for a TD and UM led 20-17. UM blk'd a punt setting up a TD to go up 26-17 but missed a 46 yd FG and fmb'l'd at the UM24 and despite a 459-289 yd TU edge, UM won 33-17...For the 2nd straight week it was the tale of two halves for Alabama. At half, thanks to a 52 yd FG that just snuck over the crossbar and inside the upright, UT tied it at 6 and Bama only had a 157-114 yd edge. Bama had a 282-41 yd edge in the 2H with UT getting zero FD's in the 2H. Bama's first 10 plays of the 3Q either went for a FD or a TD. They not only got ahead of the spread, 37-6 but their 2nd last poss was SOD on 4&gl at the 1 when they could have gone up by 38 and UT was SOD at its own 8 with Alabama taking a knee at the end...Joe Paterno tied Eddie Robinson's record with his 408th career win on Saturday night. Silas Redd rushed for 164 yards and when Paterno tied Bear Bryant with 323 wins, he also did so vs Northwestern. The QB controversy is over at PSU as Matt McGloin started and played the entire game hitting 17-26-192 and PSU put up 34 pts. Dan Persa hobbled off the field in the 4Q after injuring his ankle. It was a wild 1H with PSU having a 293-281 yd edge. NU got a 25 yd FG to lead 24-20 with :47 left in the half when PSU on 3&1 got a 42 yd run by Redd to the 12 setting up a TD with :07 left in the half and PSU took the lead, 27-24. PSU got a 63 yd IR to the NU19 early 3Q and Redd's 19 yd TD run on the next pay gave them a 10 pt lead, 34-24. After the wild offense in the 1H, they next 8 poss were all punts with NU being SOD at their own 12 with 1:54 left on 4&16 and PSU taking a knee. Florida St won their 2nd consecutive game by the identical 41-16 margin. It took a couple of late scores in the final minute to get here. FSU generally controlled the 1H leading 17-0 missing a 33 yd FG and settling for a short FG when Maryland in the final 2:35 went 75/14pl for a 23 yd FG to pull within 17-3 and close the yardage gap to 256-146. FSU only led 24-10 after 3Q's but got a 24 yd FG with 10:16 left then a 41 yd TD run by Freeman with 5:57 left to go up 34-10. After a MD punt, FSU went 51/9pl getting a TD with :47 left, 41-10. MD then went 63/3pl getting a TD with :05 left. MD QB Brown rushed for 0 yds on 10 carries after having 286 yds in the previous 2 games and now bkp QB O'Brien led the team to a TD on an 80/6pl drive late 3Q...Probably one key for Washington vs Stanford's offense was keeping pace but they blew some opportunities, got behind and then suffered a costly TO before the half which blew the game open. Polk had 46 and 61 yd TD runs and they trailed just 17-14 but UW had a FD at the 10 called back on a hold, settled for a 46 yd FG and it bounced off the upright. Trailing 31-14, they were int'd and ret'd 61 yds for a TD with :56 left in the half to blow it open, 38-14. At the half SU only had a 356-321 yd edge. In the 4Q UW fmb'l'd the KO setting up a SU FG and was int'd and SU got a TD with 1:25 left to close it, 65-21. SU had a dominating 446 yds rushing and 615 tkl yds offense to UW's 430...Notre Dame punted on their first 4 drives vs USC while USC got 2 TD's, a FG and were SOD at the ND36 but the Irish still managed to pull back within 17-10 when they had a 3rd & gl at the 2 yd line about to tie it. Shades of USF occurred when bkp QB Crist (st' vs USF) fmb'l'd the snap and USC ret'd it 80 yds for a TD and USC was up 24-10. Down 24-17, ND threw a backward pass and it bounced off the RB's hands and USC rec'd at the 18 and on 3&6 got a 14 yd TD pass, 31-17. USC did finish the game at the ND2 and had a 443-267 yd edge.



cont. from Front Page ... **SITUATIONAL GAMES** - California had the situational edge over Utah at home, off a Thurs night loss while the Utes had just travelled to the East Coast and were now on the West Coast. At the half Cal had a commanding 20-0 lead and 223-27 yd edge and it was 34-0 in the 4Q. Utah got a FG and then took over with 3:46 left and got a 64/6pl drive for a garbage TD with 1:06 left which made the stats respectable as Cal had a 389-114 yd edge prior to that drive...Southern Miss had the situational edge vs SMU as they were off of a bye, at home, in front of a sellout vs an SMU team off a big game with another big game on deck. In the 1H SM only had a 210-174 yd edge but did have a 15-7 FD edge. They scored a TD and a FG in their first 2 poss to lead 10-0 and they were int'd at the SMU15 and fmb'd at the SMU18 on 2 other drives. It was just 13-3 and SMU had a 3&gl at the 5 when they were int'd in the EZ. Six plays later SM got a 55 yd TD run with 7:30 left and then 2pl later a 41 yd IR TD with 6:54 left to blow it open, 27-3. SM finished with a 28-14 FD edge...

LAST SECOND MISSES - Navy QB Proctor was inj'd early but Miller hit 5-12-126 yds and rushed for 36 on 13 carries. EC's Dominique Davis broke the single game record with 26 straight compl (23, set in 1998 by Tee Martin of Tenn vs S Carolina and later tied by Aaron Rodgers of Cal vs USC). The first 3 drives of the game were 10, 9 and 15 plays but resulted in 2 missed FG's and SOD and it was a scoreless 1Q. EC finished with a 32-23 FD edge and EC led 17-7 at the half and 31-21 in the 4Q but Navy got a TD on a 37 yd pass from Miller with 7:51 left to actually lead, 35-31. EC got a 77/15pl drive for a TD with 2:14 left. Navy lined up for the game tying 42 yd FG but instead of OT the FG hit the upright... Mississippi set a school record with 10 straight SEC losses and they've actually been in the SEC since 1933. Houston Nutt nearly pulled off another one of his famous upsets as Ole Miss jumped out to 17-0 lead and they led 17-7 at the half with a 250-128 yd edge. Leading 24-17 Ark fumbled into the EZ at the 1 and after a 54/9pl drive settled for a 23 yd FG. UM got a TD with 1:23 left and rec'd the onside kick at the 43 but their pass was int'd at the 40 and almost ret'd for a TD which would have put the game Over but Ark was knocked OOB at the 14.

GARBAGE TD'S - Nebraska was back in Minneapolis for the first time since 1989 and more than 2/3 of the stadium was filled with red-clad NU fans. The game was even a bigger blowout than the final score as at the half NU led 34-0 with a 330-88 yd edge and it was 41-7 when UM took over at their 11 with 9:40 left and went on an 89/16pl drive for a garbage TD with 1:41 left... Kansas St is off to their best start since 1999 when they won their first 9 games. KSU jumped out to a 21-0 lead but it was trimmed to 31-14 at the half. KSU ret'd the opening 3Q KO 97 yds for a TD then rec'd a pair of fumbles and went 8 and 48 yds for TD's to blow it open 52-14. They led 59-14 when KU went on a 72/13pl drive in the final 3:10 getting a garbage 2 yd TD pass on 4&gl with :01 left.

FRONTDOOR/BACKDOOR COVERS - Indiana/Iowa was tied at 14 after each team scored a TD on their first 2 drives. Iowa scored TD's on all 3 of their 2Q drives to lead 35-14 at the half. Trailing 38-17, Indy was SOD on 4&gl at the 5 and Iowa got a TD with 3:10 left to lead 45-17 with 3:10 left to get ahead of the spread. Indy went 78/9pl and got a 1 yd TD run with :50 left for the backdoor cover. Marvin McNutt became Iowa's career leader in TD rec's with his 3 in the game putting him at 24 in his career as he'd been tied with Tim Dwight and Danan Hughes.

THE MOST UNIQUE POWER RATINGS IN THE COUNTRY

These Power Play Forecasts are the most unique in the country because they are based on **Northcoast Sports' Private Power Ratings**. Our ratings are unlike any computer rating, as we take into account all of the following: Strength of Opponents Individual Units (Rushing Offense and Defense, Passing Offense, & Defense, Scoring Offense and Defense, Garbage Yards, Weather, Injuries, Home Field Edge, and Successful Unbalanced Attacks). Here is how each is reflected:

Strength of Opponent: Our ratings do not just take the opposing team's overall power rating into account. For example, in 1992, Washington's defense vs the rush was rated at a "110" (From 1-100). They faced Colorado and allowed 183 yds rushing and **dropped 12 spots** in the national rushing defense ratings. However, Power Plays took into account the potent Buffalo run attack and had forecasted the Huskies yielding 225 yds. Due to the fact they did better than the forecast, Power Plays raised their rating to 112 even though they slipped in the national (straight yardage) rankings. Another example was Michigan vs Purdue in 1989. Michigan held Purdue to just 45 yards rushing and improved their ratings in rushing defense in the national statistics. However, our ratings had them rated at a 102 and moved them down to 99, as they should have yielded just 32 yards to an impotent Purdue rush attack. Next time an announcer on TV tells you that a certain team is #3 in the country vs the run **you better check Northcoast Sports' Power Ratings and see how good a rush defense they really have!** The top twenty ratings in **Power Ratings** for each offensive and defensive category will be listed in each week's issue of Power Plays.

Garbage yds: These are yds that a tm gains or all's in the final minutes of a game when it has been decided. For example, Team A is ahead 63-0 and allows 93 yards passing for a TD vs its 4th string D. These yards are **counted** into nat'l ratings, **but not in Our Sports' Power Ratings!**

Weather: If a game is played in miserable weather conditions and is low scoring, the straight statistics credit the defense with outstanding performances. Our Power Ratings reflect the conditions and do not give excess credit to the defenses.

Injuries: When South Carolina played NC State in 1989, South Carolina QB Todd Ellis was injured on the third play of the game. His backup, who had seen very little action all yr, was not prepared and hit on just 4 of 13 passes for 65 yds. The offensive coordinator did not risk any passes. In the national statistics NC State's pass D **MOVED UP 14 NOTCHES**. In Phil's Power Ratings they **stayed the same**, as the low yardage WAS NOT reflective of an outstanding performance by the D.

Home Field Edges: The weekly projection of yards and points is weighted with the home field factored in.

Successful Unbalanced Attacks: In 1989, Ohio St was held to 127 yards passing vs Northwestern. This dropped OSU in the national passing offense ratings & RAISED the Wildcats in the pass defense ratings. In our ratings the two units **remained** rated the same. Why? OSU rushed for 456 yards & DID NOT HAVE TO PASS & when they did they hit 9 of 11 passes, which is VERY effective. While Northwestern's pass defense looked good in the national ratings, only Northcoast Sports' Power Ratings reflected the TRUTH!

There you have it. More than just numbers, THESE RATINGS REFLECT the true strength of each unit and allow them to have the **most accurate forecast of yards gained and points allowed in the country!** No other rating system takes into account all the previous factors. Next time you hear that a team is rated third in the country in pass defense, just remember, yards are not everything and Northcoast Sports' Power Plays will show you how strong the team really is.

NORTHCOAST SPORTS PLUS OR MINUS POWER RATINGS

The Power Ratings listed below are not based on the Power Plays, they are based on last year's final computer power rating numbers with the pluses and minuses from the off season changes factored in. They are then adjusted during the course of the season based on the final score of the games that are played on a weekly basis. The Power Ratings listed below can be used for you as a base power ratings to forecast up coming lines and strength of opponents, etc. Once again, they are not based on Power Plays and **they differ from what we have shown in recent years**, which has been our actual computer Power Ratings. These are Northcoast Sports Plus or Minus Power Ratings.
