NEWS AND NOTES

Georgia and Alabama put on together one of the best championship games of all time. The story of this game was Bama's O-line and RB's as Eddie Lacy rushed for 181 and TJ Yeldon 153. There were a couple times where it appeared UGA was on their way to the victory but ended up coming up a few seconds short. Bama fumbled on their 2nd pass at their own 40 but UGA missed a 50 yd FG. UGA went 87/13pl for a td and led 7-0. 2 punts. Bama went 77/8pl but on 3&gl from the 5 was int'd in the EZ. Bama went 70/6pl getting a td with 1:59 left in the half then after UGA got a pair of FD's to midfield, they were int'd at the 18 and ret'd 35 yds with just 1:15 left. QB Murray was laid out after the play but no penalty was called. Bama went 42/6pl but settled for a 22 yd FG and a 10-7 halftime lead. Bama did have a 246-156 HT yd edge. UGA went 75/9pl for a td then blk'd a 49 yd FG and ret'd it 55 yds for a td and it appeared UGA was on way to a National Title game with a 21-10 lead. On the next drive Bama's run game got them 47 of their 77 yds on the drive with the other 2pl being

a PF and a pass interference and Yeldon's 10 yd td run go them back to within 3. Bama kept it on the ground and went 74/7pl (all rushes) for a 25-21 lead but UGA answered with a 75/5pl drive, 28-25. 2 punts. Bama went 55/4pl and with UGA selling out to stop the run, McCarron hit a 45 yd td pass to Cooper which he caught in the EZ, 32-28. UGA punted with 2:17 left but forced a punt with 1:08 left using their final 2 time-outs. UGA got 4 FD's to the Alabama 8 with :15 left. The clock continued to run as they did not spike it and Murray was trying for a back shoulder fade in the EZ and threw the ball but it was deflected at the line and WR Conley, using his instinct, caught the ball. If he had let it drop, obviously the clock would've stopped and they would have had another opportunity. Instead the clock ran out... Kent St and Northern Illinois was interesting as if either team finished in the top 16 of the BCS, they would gain an automatic berth to a BCS bowl and Kent St was in the best shape coming in at #17. NI finished with a 524-260 yd edge but got off to a slow start as on their first 4

poss they punted 3 times and fumbled the PR on the other. Kent St got a 22 yd drive after the fumbled PR then after an 18 yd punt, drove 16/6pl for a 37 yd FG to lead 10-0. NI went 65/14pl, 59/6pl, 58/12pl for 2 td's and a FG but after a 34/5pl drive was int'd at the KSU3 with 2:13 left in the half. At the half NI had a commanding 240-55 yd edge but only led 17-10. Kent St went 46/8pl for a 24 yd FG and NI went 75/10pl for a 1 yd td run. NI went 43/9pl but settled for a 29 yd FG. Kent St went 31/9pl but opted to go for it on 4&7 from the NI11 but gained 5 yds. NI went on a 58/10pl drive to the KSU36 but opted to punt on 4&10. Kent St went 96/8pl, with a key 60 yd pass to Archer which got them down to the NI22. The td made it 27-20 and then NI fmbld on the next play and Kent St ret'd it 22 yds for a td with 4:38 left to tie it, 27-27. NI went 75/4pl for a td with 3:12 left and Kent St went 58/11pl for a 19 yd td pass with :44 left to force OT. Each team got a FG in the 1st OT and NI got a 23 yd run by Daniels then a 2 yd td run by Lynch. Kent St got 1 FD but on 4&8 was int'd in the EZ.

Lincoln Financial Field, Philadelphia PA. This is the 113th meeting in one of the greatest rivalries in CFB and it used to be very evenly split with the 2 teams almost 50-50 in wins. Navy has completely taken hold of the series and has now won an amazing 10 in a row SU (by 24 ppg) and are 7-3 ATS although Army has covered 2 of the last 3 and in fact, Army has had the yardage edge each of the last 2 years (375-309 LY). This matchup has gone UNDER 6 straight yrs and LY we had a 3★ CTOT on Under 55. It was the 1st time the gm had been decided by 8 pts or less s/00. This yr the matchup brings extra meaning as it is the first time s/96 that both tms have a shot at the CIC Trophy. It has been a disappointing ssn for 2-9 Army (3-8 ATS) as they ret'd an unusually high # of str's (15) incl a 4Y starting QB in Steelman. While their rush off leads the country avg 370 ypg (5.5) and is the highest here in 20+ yrs, their #122 D has given up 439 ypg incl 238 rush ypg (5.7). Things didn't start off well for Navy at 1-3 TY, but ironically an inj to QB Miller (TO prone) in the AF gm was the best thing to happen as frosh Reynolds has led the tm to a 6-1 finish. Reynolds gives them a legitimate pass threat w/an 8-1 ratio and also leads the tm w/9 rushing td's. Both tms are evenly matched as Army is -1 ypg vs the #101 sked while Navy is +10 ypg vs the #100 sked. The difference comes on D where Navy holds a #71-122 advantage.

Ho-hum, it will be just another playoff season for the AFC East champ Pats thanks to the NFL's best off. They have two huge gms in the next 2 wks against the NFL's best but both the Texans and 49ers travel to Gillette. A win in both would have the Patriots as the favorites to return.

The win over TB sealed the AFC West and all'd DEN to keep pace with the other div leaders. With OAK, CLE & KC still left on the schedule the Broncos have a great shot at a 1st round bye as many believe DEN may be the team to beat.

LW's loss to a PIT w/out Roethlisberger was a missed opportunity for BAL to take a 4 gm lead in the AFC North and also stay ahead of NE & DEN. They draw two of the NFL's best in DEN and NYG in the final 4 gms but both of them have to travel to M&T Bank Stadium.

Thanks to a QB Luck and a rejuvenated franchise playing with a lot of emotion, the Colts are the surprise of the NFL this year. Even with 2 gms left against the Texans, IND has TEN and KC left which should get them their 10th DD win season in the L/11 yrs.

Without their leader, the Steelers have survived thanks to LW's 23-20 win over BAL. Roethlisberger is expected back for the final 4 gms and with 3 of those gms coming against Top 10 NFL D's the Steelers will need him if they want to clinch their 7th playoff bid in the last 9 yrs.

LW's win over SD helped the Bengals keep pace w/the Steelers as they try to make their 2nd consecutive playoff appearance. That won't be easy especially w/their L/2 gms coming against their dreaded AFC North rivals where they are 0-9 against them the L/3 yrs.

Harbaugh's decision to start Kaepernick backfired last week in the loss to STL. With road trips to NE and SEA, the 49ers have their work cut out for them if they want to lock up a 1st round bye for a 2nd year in a row

Don't look now, but after a slow start, the Packers have won 6 of their L/7 gms and are getting healthier each week. The road game at CHI in 2 wks will decide the NFC North title, but even with a loss there, GB is in solid shape for at least a Wild Card.

It is not known how the Giants fared against WAS as it was a huge gm w/NFC East implications. Regardless, the G-Men have one of the toughest sked remaining of playoff contenders w/B2B road trips to ATL and BAL but they still have control of the NFC East at this time.

An OT loss at home to SEA LW was the Bears 3rd loss in the L/4 wks and now they have 3 out of 4 HG's to close out the ssn. Their only HG in the stretch is against GB where they are just 1-3 against the Packers at home incl the NFC Champ gm 2Y ago.

The Seahawks grabbed a key OT road win at CHI LW. With 3 HG's in the final 4 wks at the NFL's loudest venue in CenturyLink Field, you have to think SEA is in good shape to make their 2nd playoff appearance in 3 yrs under Carroll.

No one has done more with less than 1st-yr HC Schiano but they were exposed LW at DEN before scoring the gm's final 10 pts to make it look reasonable. They do benefit from a relatively easy road down the stretch w/3 gms against losing tms and could get an ATL tm resting st's in the finale.

LY after their bye, MIN dropped 6 of their L/7, and now TY they have dropped 4 of their L/5 and it does not get any easier w/all 4 of their remaining tms in the playoff hunt incl home gms against division rivals CHI and GB who MIN is 0-11 against the L/3+ yrs.

Thanks to an OT win LW over SF, the Rams faint playoff hopes are still alive and their remaining 4 gms all come against tms that are in the same situation. However, 3 of those come away from home incl the finale at SEA where they have lost their L/7 by an avg of 17 ppg.

Rookie sensation RGIII has the Redskins overachieving and while it is unknown how they fared on MNF vs the NYG, WAS has played their NFC East rivals tough (3-0 ATS). They welcome in an angry BAL tm coming off a loss to PIT next wk and that could decide their fate.

It is unknown how DAL fared against PHI but w/a win they set themselves up for a final 4 gm stretch coming against 4 tms all w/playoff hopes. It helps that 3 of them come at home, but then again DAL is just 4-9 at home the L/2Y.

CLE has momentum over the L4W thanks to their defense allowing just 3.5 ypc rush & 19.8 ppg. CLE knows what they are getting with so much familiarity w/ the KC coaching staff. PP has this close to the line though making it a no play but we'll take a small look at the total.

SAN DIEGO PITTSBURGH
 (SD #25 vs PIT #1, PIT #28 vs SD #20) - PIT has the #6 seed thanks to their big win LW vs BAL & they may get Roethlisberger back with 3 of 4 games at home. PP gives PIT the 2nd biggest yardage margin TW & putting Rivers behind a bad OL (63 ypg 3.3 L3W) on the road vs a focused Steeler defense is a recipe for trouble. No line due to the home teams QB situation means No Play on the side but the total is attractive either way as PIT will try to protect the passer & they have the defensive edge.

TENNESSEE INDIANAPOLIS

TEN went to a new OC LW & TEN was held to less than 40 yds on 10 of their 1st 11 drives with 1 FG & 4 TO's. IND actually has the #8 & #9 units (-2 TO's) at home TY while TEN is #27 & #19 (+2 TO's) on the road. PP gives IND an 87 yd edge but has it right at the line making it a No Play.

NY JETS JACKSONVILLE
 (NYJ #28 vs JAX #32, JAX #19 vs NYJ #7) - The Jets QB situation is in flux but whoever starts gets a team that is 6-17 ATS at home vs a NDIV foe with a QB the defense knows behind an OL that is 30th in sacks allowed & 32 in sacks by JAX may be down to their #4 RB here & their spec teams ranking shows how bad their depth is overall. PP has this right at the line though making it a No Play.

NO PLAY: JETS 22 JAGUARS 20

CHICAGO MINNESOTA
 (CHI #31 vs MIN #23, MIN #24 vs CHI #11) - The Bears have lost 3 of 4 & are behind GB on tiebreakers who they face next week. Injuries are taking a toll on both sides of the ball but they do have an edge in depth here. There is no timetable for the much needed Harvin & Ponder only had 2 completions to WR's vs GB. CHI is 7-1-1 ATS as an AF, with 6 straight covers vs MIN but their injury situation has us pass for now esp with Peterson needing just under 140 ypg the L4W to hit 2000 yds rushing.

NO PLAY: BEARS 22 VIKINGS 16

ATLANTA CAROLINA
 (ATL #7 vs CAR #19, CAR #17 vs ATL #15) - CAR faced an inspired foe LW & played a decent game in the loss. ATL clinched the NFC South LW but don't have the feel of an 11 win team due to the quality of wins. PP gives CAR the yardage edge (+114) but they are 1-7 SU/2-6 ATS vs the Falcons. We think CAR will make this a much closer game than what PP forecasts as the Falcons have a bit of letdown with the extra days after beating the Saints making it a No Play.

This sets up a good momentum building game for the Bucs who are healthier than PHI at this point.
