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NEWS AND NOTES

UPSET: Toledo had a 526-446 yd edge and benefitted from a 3-1 TO edge but still lost to Ball St at home. Toledo had entered the AP Poll for the first time since 2001 and as you see many times, teams that enter the AP for the first time in a long time, usually struggle with the attention that next week. Ball St took their opening 2 drives 82/11 and 87/7pl for td's to lead 14-0 but UT battled back to 17-17 at the half and had a 350-220 yd edge at the half. BS got a 61/10pl drive for a td on its first 3Q poss then missed a 35 yd FG and UT went 75/14pl but settled for a 22 yd FG to make it 24-20. UT went 25/4pl and on 4&1 got a 16 yd td run to lead 27-24. BS tied it on a 30 yd FG with 9:41 left. UT drove 68/7pl but on 4&1 was SOD at the BS14 with 6:02 left. After the game, Campbell was questioned about that 4&1 based on them settling for 2 short FG's and the fact they had a td on the last 4&1, he probably made the right decision. BS then went 86/11pl and got a 15 yd td run with 1:43 left to take the lead 34-27. UT on 4&7 from its own 27 fired incomplete.

BIG GAMES: Normally when an opponent travels to Memorial Stadium to face Indiana, they play their "C"

game but Wisc came on guard because if IU beat them, they would have clear control of the Leaders Div and UW would be on the outside looking in. The Badgers big, physical O-line was off a bye and they tend to play very well late in the ssn off a bye and the smaller Hoosiers were simply worn down. UW piled up 564 yds rushing vs 61 for IU and attempted just 7 passes in the game giving off-injured Curt Phillips his first start. UW went 69/8, 69/8, 59/8 on their first 3 poss for td's but settled for a FG on the last and had 174 yds rushing in the 1Q. IU had just 2 FD's. It was 24-7 at half. UW led 41-7 when Indy converted on 4&9 on an 87/14pl drive to make it 41-14 but UW went 75/5pl and added 3 more td's in the dominating 62-14 route that was never really a question after the 1Q. Texas may have been playing with a little extra emotion as Darrell Royal, their HOF HC, passed away during the week and Mack Brown honored him by running the wishbone on their first play with a handoff pitch back to Ash who threw 47 yds for a FD. UT dominated with 609-277 yd and 31-15 FD edges. David Ash hit 25-31-364 and in the 1H UT had a 344-213 yd edge but had a 32 yd FG blk'd and

leading 20-0 gave up a td with :41 left in the half. UT drove 55/11 for a 37 yd FG but then was SOD at the ISU17 on their 2nd 3Q poss. They went 78/9pl for a td and a 30-7 lead with 12:32 left and settled for a 25 yd FG with 1:23 left in the dominating rout... Michael Rocco hit 29-37-300 for Virginia and piloted two late scoring drives as Virginia overcame a 10 pt deficit. Rocco had been alternating with Phillip Sims who hit 11-14-88 left until 12:02 was left in the game when the team went 3&out and Rocco led the team to a td on a 7/12pl drive with 5:33 left to pull within 38-35. Rocco was called for intentional grounding in the EZ for a safety with 4:19 left but Virginia forced a punt with 2:38 left. The Cavs went 87/16pl. On 4&7 they got a 9 yd pass and another 4&7 a questionable def holding gave them a FD at the 20. After 1 more FD, McGee caught a 10 yd td pass where he just got his foot down with :06 left. UVA had led 28-24 at the half with a 287-221 yd edge. Duke Johnson had a 95 yd KR td and rushed for 150 yards on 16 carries. Miami starters WR Scott and LB Johnson were both suspended and Perryman did not travel and UVA's slim bowl hopes stayed alive.

4★ WISCONSIN over Ohio St - LY the situation greatly favored OSU. Not only were they playing with revenge but OSU was fresh off a bye and playing a rare B10 home night gm and they caught the Badgers the week after their Hail Mary loss vs Mich St which was also on the road. We used a **4★ LPS** on rare HD Bucks (+7) and they delivered the outright upset win 33-29 in a gm they never trailed ATS. OSU is again off a bye but this is the FHG (16-4 ATS!) for UW and they had a bye 2 weeks ago. **Last week we used Wisky (-7) as our 5★ College GOY and they cashed in a big way beating Indy 62-14 and owning the LOS with a school rec'd 564-61 rush edge (most rush yd by a B10 tm s/75).** QB Phillips hit just 4-7-41-1-0 in his 1st career start but his mobility adds a different dimension to the Badgers off. The post ssn ineligible Bucks are the least respected 10-0 tm in the country with HC Meyer likely using their polling position behind two 1 loss tms as motivation. OSU used the bye to work on the pass gm which is avg just 184 ypg (53%) with a 9-5 ratio in conf play to better supplement its run gm which is avg 274 (5.6) led by Miller (1166, 6.3) and Hyde (737, 5.1). The Bucks are expected to get back the services of LB Sabino (leg) who missed the L/4 and after getting ripped apart early in the ssn the D has settled down to allow just 108 rush ypg (3.5). However, we have no problems going back to the Badgers here as UW doesn't want to back into the Leaders title and gets their revenge.

FORECAST: WISCONSIN 37 Ohio St 27

3★ Rutgers over CINCINNATI - LY UC had come in winning 5 in a row SU in this series and was 4-1 ATS but was w/o QB Collaros and Legaux got his 1st start. UC was held to a ssn low 225 yds. RU had 385 yds and a 23-11 FD edge in the 20-3 win (+2). The HT is 8-2-1 SU in the series. Both tms' BE title hopes got a boost with LW's loss by LVille. The Cats moved to 7-2 thanks to their 34-10 win at Temple (-11). UC scored on 4 of their 5 1H poss in QB Kay's 1st career start as he hit 13-21-244-2-0 and UC finished with 472-267 yd edges. The new BE leader Knights were outFD'd (22-14) and outgained 337-252 by Army but miraculously covered (-18) after returning a fmb'l 73 yd for a td with under 1:00 left, 28-7. Army also had 2 FG's blk'd and fmb'l'd at the RU9 and 14. This one should go down to the wire but RU is the fresher tm with a more stable QB spot and an underrated D (#20-43 edge).

3★ MISSOURI over Syracuse - Last met in '87. The Tigers are 7-0 SU but have dropped 5 straight home finales ATS and this is the first non-conf BCS foe to visit here s/'06. It is their only HG in Nov and they have played the tougher sked (#10-37). The Tigers were able to overcome a 28-14 2H deficit and despite being outFD'd 32-20 and outgained 585-454 were able to beat Tenn 51-48 (+3) in 4OT. The key play of the gm actually came at the end of regulation as on 4&12 Franklin hit super frosh Green-Beckham in the corner of the EZ for a 25 yd td. Syr just played its home finale which was an upset of prev unbeaten #9 LVille 45-26 but not on these pages as we called for the outright win. The Orange did have a 52-47-2 yd edge incl a 278-48 yd edge and QB Nassib passed Donovan McNabb for 2nd place in the sch'l's all-time pass mark. The Cuse are on their 4th road gm in 6 wks and have a Friday gm vs Temple on deck. Both tms can earn a bowl bid w/a win here but we love the HT Tigers who have the D (#35-63) and ST's edges (#32-92).

2★ NC State (+) over CLEMSON - LY NCSt was in a good situation as CU had just wrapped up the ACC Atl Title and rested Sammy Watkins while the Pack needed a win for a bowl. NCSt (+7) won by 24 covering by 31' pts and delivered another outright upset winner for the Big Dog POW. NCSt led 37-6 and CU got a td with 1:22 left. CU is playing with legit revenge as they had won 7 in a row SU in the series prior but the HT is 1-6 ATS. The Tigers destroyed a depleted MD squad 45-10 LW as they forced 3 1H TO's and piled up 27-10 FD and 436-180 yd edges in an easy win. QB Boyd has moved up to #2 FBS pass (294, 68%, 28-9). The Pack got their 6th win to secure a bowl by beating Wake 37-6, winning as the College 900 Marquee POD. NCSt led 17-6 at HT before returning the 2H KO 100 yd for a td and coasted with 26-9 FD and 428-185 yd edges. QB Glennon (291 ypg, 57%, 22-13) rebounded from LW's rough outing vs VA. CU has covered their L/7 while the Pack is 0-5 ATS away from home TY. However, Clemson has the huge rivalry game vs S Carolina on deck and may be peeking ahead.

LY on the road NU jumped out to a 34-0 lead extending their consec pt streak vs UM to 145-0 spanning the L/4. UM got its 1st points vs Big Red s/'84 mid-3Q. Two thirds of the TFC Stadium crowd was in Red and NU finished with 515-254 yd and 27-11 FD edges and covered 41-14 (-24). NU has won 7 str home finales SU by 19 ppg (4-2 ATS). NU (-8) rallied from its 3rd 2H DD deficit in conf play TY to beat PSU as a 4★ LPS for us with a 32-23 win. The Huskers finished with a 438-391 yd edge but settled for 2 short FG's, muffed a P which set up a 31 yd PSU td drive and fmb'l'd at the PSU1. They also caught a lucky break as PSU controversially fmb'l'd into the EZ for a TB, had a holding pen called in the EZ for a safety and NU hit a FG with :27 left to get the cover. QB Martinez (#1 B10 pass eff w/211 ypg, 63%, 19-8, 770 rush, 5.8) leads the B10's #1 off despite being last in TO's total (25). The Gophers are bowl elig for the 1st time under Kill after beating hapless IL 17-3. UM had a 231-101 rush yd edge led by Kirkwood's career high 28-152 as Fr QB Nelson threw just 15 passes (9-15-78-0-0). UM is all' 194 rush ypg (5.2) in conf play. The Huskers build momentum on their way to Indy.

TY FIU is fresh off a bye while FAU is playing its 6th str gm and on a short wk. However, the Owls are much improved under 1st yr HC Pelini and have covered 8 str gms! Will the rested Panthers make it 2 in a row or will the Owls continue their streak? **After LW's win, the Friday Night Marquees are now 19-4 (83%). After clinching their 1st bowl bid s/'94, the Devils have lost their L/2 gms vs the ACC's best in FSU/Clem by an avg of 52-14. GT has quietly won 3 of their L/4 after LW's 68-50 win at UNC (+8) and are playing for their 16th str bowl bid here. After the gm HC Johnson quipped, "Too bad we missed that 2pt conv." GT is using bkp QB Lee more and more and LW he topped 100 yds both pass/run. Cutcliffe says they have a separate playbook for GT as they have played Tech every year he's been there and face similar option attacks vs Navy and Army (twice each) in his tenure here. Duke is fresh off a late season bye which gives them extra prep time for the option but UNC had the same adv LW and that didn't work out too well for them.

ARMY 29 Temple 23 - TU has won 4 in a row SU/ATS by 19 ppg. LY Army (+13) got back inj'd QB Steelman but he lasted just 2pl and TU led 28-0 at the half with a 269-103 yd edge in a 42-14 win. LTH the Owls trailed 28-13 mid-3Q but scored 29 unanswered and covered 42-35 (-6). After starting BE play 2-0, the Owls have now lost 4 str by an avg of 40-14 getting outgained 470-273 and LW fell to Cincy 34-10 (+8). In a clear flat spot LW, Army actually played well in a 28-7 (+17) loss at Rutgers. The gm was tied at 7 at HT (7-7 also after 3Q's) as Army dominated everywhere but the scoreboard. They had 2 FG's blk'd, lost a fmb'l in the RZ and saw a WR drop a would-be td pass in the final min before HT. Army does not have another gm for 3W while TU has one on Fri and the Owls are off 6 straight BE gms (1st time matchups) and now must face the option.

BOWLING GREEN 23 Kent St 17 - LY KSU was coming off a bye and BG was playing its 9th str gm and off a big upset over Temple. KSU (+3) delivered a 27-15 home win. They posted B2B wins over BG for the 1st time s/'72-'73. The winner here will most likely end up Detroit for the MAC Champ and there may not be a matchup this weekend of two hotter tms as BG has cashed 6 str gms incl LW's Wed Night Marquee 26-14 (+1) over Ohio (RB Samuel 181 yds) and Kent has now cashed 7 of their L/8 (8 SU wins in a row) after LW's 48-32 (-6) win over Miami's RB duo of Archer/Durham comb for 323 yds! While KSU has the big off edge (#62-101), BG has the D edge (#25-78) and with the tms playing similar sked's (KSU #116-120), it should be noted that the Falcons are +89 ypg TY while the Flashes are -12 ypg. This is BG's 2nd gm in 21 days while Kent plays for a 9th str wk and must travel again. MAC East supremacy goes to the home tm here.

Virginia Tech 27 BOSTON COLLEGE 17 - LY VT (-21) was at home but BC jumped out to a 7-0 lead and led 7-6 at the half (VT 201-149 yds). At the end of the gm, VT had a FD at the 9 up 30-14 but took a knee at the 6. LTH BC (-4) got the shutout 19-0. In what looked to be a flat spot (FSU/UVA sandwich) in the pressn now becomes a must-win for VT if they want to qualify for their 20th str bowl after LW's Thurs night 28-22 (+13) loss to FSU. The Hokies were down 20-10 but rallied to take a 22-20 lead only to see FSU hit a 39 yd td pass w/4:00 left. BC played valiantly vs #4 ND LW but fell 21-6 (+20) as we easily cashed a 3★ Total on the Under. QB Rettig is avg 281 ypg (57%) with a 16-9 ratio but he is getting no help from a run gm that is avg just 73 ypg (2.7). Bud Foster's DC which has been criticized TY actually has held 5 of their opp's to either their lowest or 2nd lowest yd output on the yr. That doesn't bode well for a BC tm that can't run, off an emotional loss, and is playing for a lame-duck HC.

MISS ST 34 Arkansas 24 - Ark is 12-1 SU but just 7-6 ATS although they have covered the L/3. LTH UA (-3) won 20-20 with MSU having a 32-21 FD edge. LY we had a 3★ Key Selection and a 3★ LPS on Ark (-13) at home and they won 44-17 with 539-211 yd and 29-13 FD edges. Both tms come in off a loss as the entire Ark organization surely isn't "smiling" after LW's 38-20 loss (+14) to SC dropped the pressn Top 10 tm to 4-6 SU (1-8 ATS). The gm was a bit misleading as Ark had a 22-20 FD edge but like they've done all yr were -2 in TO's (#115 NCAA TO margin). After a 7-0 start, the Bulldogs have now lost 3 str SU/ATS and are off a misleading gm themselves. Despite getting outFD'd just 22-21 and outgained 392-351, they fell to LSU 37-17 (+14) which incl a 100 yd IR td for the Tigers w/1:00 left. They did play w/o RB Perkins (804 yds, 5.3) but he should be back here. The HT is 9-1 ATS in the series and MSU is 8-3 ATS in home finales while Mullen is 5-0 as a CHF.

MIAMI, FL 34 Usc 31 - The visitor is 3-1 SU and 4-0 ATS with 2 str outright upsets. LY at the half UM (+1) had a 205-162 yd edge but the two tms had just 6 pts on the board, a ypg of 61.6! BJ Daniels was inj'd in the 3Q and DNR. UM got a GW 36 yd FG on the final play and it was the lowest comb score for a UM gm s/'79 (6-3). That won't be the case TY especially w/Miami gms comb to avg of 60 ppg. The Canes are off a 41-40 (+1) loss at UVA, which was a missed opportunity to take control of ACC Coastal. The Bulls come in off a bye after snapping their 6 gm losing streak in their L/gm a 13-6 win over Conn. They did lose 4Y s'tg QB Daniels in the process for the yr as Matt Floyd (4-10-22-0-0 in career) is exp to start here. While it may look bleak for the Bulls, keep in mind they are 13-5 SU vs instate schools and the dog in USF gms is 17-3 ATS. If the Canes win next week vs Duke they will be playing in the ACC Title gm and may not have their full attention on USF here.

Purdue 24 ILLINOIS 17 - PU is 6-1 SU/4-3 ATS in this series. LY was a great situation for PU as they were at home and at 2-4 were in a must-win situation. IL had to take to the road in a bubble burst situation after losing their 1st gm after a 6-0 start and PU (+3) got the upset 21-14. The HT is 6-2 SU/ATS in the series. Minus OC Nord the Boilers ended their 5 gm losing streak and kept their bowl hopes alive by upsetting Iowa (+3) 27-24. PU had a 490-264 yd edge but TO's kept Iowa in the gm incl a late 3Q FR td which made it 24-21. After the Hawks tied it they were driving into a strong wind which eschewed a long FG att and were SOD on 4&3 at the PU34 with :21 left. Three plays later the Boilers nailed the 46 yd GW FG. QB Marve (25-33-266-2-0) made his 2nd str start and Bolden (14-102) ran for 100 yd for the 1st time TY. The Illini lost their 12th str B10 gm and 7th overall TY 17-3 to Minny. After driving 89 yd on their 1st pass to take a 3-0 lead IL fmb'l'd at the UM28, were SOD at the UM35 and ended the gm at the UM18 on their only other drives into Gophers terr. IL is being outscored 35.2-10.5 in B10 play scoring just 7 td's in 6 gms TY with QB Scheelhaase struggling (150 ypg, 60%, 2-4). The Boilers take another step out of the B10 basement.

Houston 42 MARSHALL 41 - LY UH (-23) led 63-21 before MU got a td with 3:35 left. MU is 13-2 SU and 9-4 ATS in home finales and UH is just 6-13 ATS as an AF. This is a bowl elimination gm with both tms coming in at 4-6 off of losses. The Herd (-3) trailed UAB 31-7 in the 3Q before rallying but it was too little, too late as the Blazers rec'd an outside K with 1:41 left. Despite a 4-1 TO edge MU was outgained 406-337 and outFD'd 25-18 as FBS's #1 passer Cato (351 ypg, 69%, 29-8) was held to his lowest tt's of the ssn with 216 yds. The Cougars (+3) were blasted 41-7 by Tulsa. After a 1Q int UH missed a 32 yd FG, they also were SOD at the TU47 and the Hurricane never looked back finishing with 505-262 yd and 29-16 FD edges. UH's only td drive was led by bkp Jones as Piland (293 ypg, 57%, 16-12) struggled hitting 15-32-148-0-2. Look for a ton of pts here in a gm that will go down to the wire.

Florida St 38 MARYLAND 0 - LY at home FSU (-18') won 41-16 (MD went 63 yds getting a gbg td with :05 left). FSU has won 5 in a row in the series by 17 ppg but are in a large VT/FL sandwich. FSU entered '12 5-2 ATS as an AF but are 0-4 in that role and the Terps are 4-9 ATS as a HD. The Noles (-13') survived the Hokies 28-22 on Thurs as QB Manuel hit a 39 yd td pass with :40 left for the win. FSU led 20-10 in the 3Q but VT finished with a 385-311 yd edge as they held the Noles to -15 rush yds sacking Manuel 5x. The decimated Terps (+31) lost their 4th straight after being gouged 45-10 by Clem as CSU finished with 436-180 yd and 27-10 FD edges. UM was playing without its top tkl'r (Hartsfield), rec (Diggs) and rusher (Brown) while QB Petty (6-12-41-1-0) was a bkp LB 3W ago and fmbld the ball away twice in the 1Q to aid CU's cause. FSU needs this to wrap up the Atlantic and can name the score here.

Buffalo 31 UMASS 17 - Mass has won 2 in a row SU in Buffalo but last met in '97. UB is 1-0-1 ATS as an AF in their history. The Bulls have won 2 str incl LW's 29-24 upset (+3) over a WM tm playing for a bowl with their vet QB Carder back. UB int'd WM in the EZ and led 17-0 before the Broncos got on track scoring td's on 3 straight late 2Q/early 3Q drives to lead 21-17. UB added 2 FG's, with the 2nd set up by a 35 yd IR to the WM25 to retake the lead 23-21. After WM kicked an early 4Q FG, the Bulls pulled ahead for good with a td. WM was int'd inside the UB35, fmbld at the UB24 and int'd at their own 40 on their final 3 poss as UB finished with 453-376 yd and 5-1 TO edges. UM became the last FBS school to get a win TY by beating Akron 22-14 thanks to 4 int which led to 19 pts as the Zips finished with a 427-327 yd edge but were -3 in TO's. QB Wegzyn hit 23-39-266-1-1 getting the upset as a 16 pt dog. The Bulls have big edges on both sides (#93-124 off and #70-100 D) and win their 3rd straight.

MICHIGAN ST 27 Northwestern 17 - The visitor is now a super 8-3 SU and 10-1 ATS in the series! NU has dropped 4 in a row SU (1-3 ATS) in this series with hard luck spread losses in each of L2Y. In '10 MSU used a fake punt to set up a td to get ahead 28-27 (-6) with just 2:00 left then after a fmbld got the frontdoor cover on a 25 yd td run with 1:07 left. LY MSU got a 3&17, 29 yd td pass to ice it with 5:17 left but only had a 380-370 yd edge and NU a 21-20 FD edge (MSU -6, 31-17). MSU is 7-14 ATS as a B10 HF (upset 2x TY) but is 16-4-1 in home finales (3-4 ATS run). The 5-5 Spartans find themselves in the Legends basement with their 4 conf losses by a comb 10 pts! In fact 7 Spartans gms TY have been decided by 4 pts (3-4 SU/2-5 ATS) as the B10's #1 D (288 ypg) have kept them in every gm despite a struggling off which is avg just 19 ppg in conf play despite the presence of conf's #1 rusher Bell (1249, 4.4). The Cats (+10) blew their 3rd DD 4Q lead of the ssn in a 38-31 OT loss at Mich. NW led 31-28 with :27 left when UM QB Gardner hit WR Roundtree with a 53 yd desperation heave to set up the 26 yd gm tying FG with :02 left. QB Colter left the gm twice due to passing issues and inj's but did return to QB the OT poss. B10's all-purp yd leader Mark (1181, 6.3) had his 4th str 100 yd gm. Good spot for the Spartans after LW's bye and needing 1 more win to ensure post season plans.

PENN ST 31 Indiana 17 - PSU has never lost to Indiana going 15-0 SU but the Hoosiers are on a 4-1 ATS run. LY IU was +14 at home but thanks to some blowing scoring opportunities by PSU only trailed 16-3. IU went to the hurry up off and converted on 4&5 and got a td with 3:51 left to pull within a score and got to the PSU40 but their Hail Mary was batted down. **LW we cashed going against both tms in a big way as we used our 5★ College GOY on Wisky (-7) and they dominated the Hoosiers 62-14 bullying them up front with a 564-61 rush yd edge.** The rush yds smashed the record by a Memorial Stadium opp by more than 100 yds! We had a 4★ LPS on Neb (-8') and they rallied from a 20-6 halftime deficit to beat PSU 32-23. The Lions led 23-20 going into the 4Q when NU drove for a td and PSU fmbld into the EZ for a TB. On their next pass a hold was called on PSU in the EZ for a safety and the Huskers added a FG with :23 left after the Lions were SOD. This is the B10's top 2 passing tms with IU avg 293 ypg (62%, 21-8) with their 2 QB system while PSU relies on Sr McGloin (268, 61%, 19-4). The diff here is D as PSU has a #23-109 edge!

Tennessee 35 VANDERBILT 34 - UT is 28-1 SU in this series. LY UT was poised to make it 21-7 on 3&gl from the 3 when they were int'd and ret'd 100 yds for a td and instead of leading 21-7 it was 14-14. After a short punt, VU drove 35 yds for a td and a 21-14 lead. UT got a 4&gl 2 yd td pass with 6:27 left and then won it in OT. A video of Dooley after the gm, showed him telling the players "the one thing Tennessee always does is kick the #*! out of Vandy" and VU's players and coach saw the video and said they'll leave that as an open wound until TY. LW was a tale of 2 tms possibly going in 2 diff directions as Tenn blew a 28-14 lead and lost in 4OT 51-48 (-3) to MO despite having 32-20 FD and 585-454 yd edges. On the other side, Vandy rallied from a 23-6 2H deficit and threw a 26 yd td pass w/:52 left to win 27-26 (+2) at Ole Miss. The Doers are now bowl elig for the 2nd str ssn for the 1st time in schl history but leading rusher Stacy was inj'd early (DNR, CS). Vandy is 1-6 SU/ATS in home finales and UT has won 14 str trips to Nashville (last loss '82) and usually their orange clad fans make up a good portion of the crowd. UT is 13-1 SU and 10-4 ATS vs Vandy and 13-5 ATS as an AF and if Dooley has any shot of keeping his job, they have to win here.

C MICHIGAN 35 Miami, Oh 33 - CM has won 3 straight trips here ('95, '99, '10). CM HC Enos served as MSU's RB ch from '07-09 under Dantonio while MU HC Treadwell was the Spartans OC from '07-10. Both tms come in at 4-6 clinging to outside shots at bowl elig. CM trailed 21-10 early 3Q before scoring 21 str pts incl a 49 yd IR td to beat EM 34-31. QB Radcliff (262, 60%, 18-7) and RB Tipton (1093, 6.1) lead the offense. The RedHawks (+6') couldn't slow down the steaming locomotive that is Kent St trailing 35-10 at the half in a 48-32 loss. QB Dysert threw for 455 yds but also was sk'd 5 times and threw 2 int as MU was bullied up front as KSU finished with a 399-26 rush yd edge. This one could go down to the wire.

UAB 34 Memphis 24 - LY then-UAB DC Tommy West returned to the Liberty Bowl where he had been fired by Memphis 2Y prior. UAB was down 35-17 after 3Q's but the Blazers outgained UM 215-33 in the 4Q (all'd 1 FD) on their way to 24 pts and got a 10 yd td run with 1:36 left for their first lead of the gm, 41-35 (-5'). UAB is now 10-2 SU and 9-2-1 ATS vs Mem. Both tms pulled upsets LW with UAB (+3) knocking off Marshall 38-31 despite a -3 TO margin. The Blazers led 31-7 in the 3Q when MU scored on their final 4 poss but UAB rec'd an outside kick with 1:41 and ran out the clock. RB Reeves (928, 5.1) set a new schl rec'd with his 13th rush td. The Blazers held the FBS's #1 passer Cato to a ssn low 216 yds. After being tied at 16 in the 3Q vs mistake prone Tulane (5 TO) the Tigers (+11) hit a 52 yd td pass, while TU was SOD on 4&gl at the 1. Mem added a td drive and IR td with 3:31 left to put it away. UAB has most of the edges and keeps the bronzed rack of ribs known as the "Battle for the Bones" trophy.

W MICHIGAN 41 E Michigan 27 - LY WM was coming off its loss to NI which derailed its MAC West Title hopes and EM wrapped up the Michigan MAC Champ 14-10 (+12) after having lost the L3Y by 21, 21 and 15 pts. Both tms are off losses as WM's bowl hopes were dashed 29-24 (-3) at Buffalo as TO machine QB Carder was back (missed prev 6 gms w/inj) to his usual self throwing 4 int's and WM blew yet another 2H lead. EM let a 14-0 early lead slip away in a 34-31 (+2) loss to CM as QB Gillett was back in the lineup (was benched) and ran for 162 yds (11.6). WM is 16-4 SU in the series and are 3-0 ATS the year after a loss (legit revenge). WM has won its L2 home finales by an avg of 53-11 and this could be the final swan song for HC Cubit as they win the Michigan MAC Champ.

Oklahoma 48 W VIRGINIA 31 - WV has won the L2 (s/'82). The last gm was the '07 Fiesta Bowl as #11 WV beat #3 OU 48-28 w/a 525-419 yd edge. OU (-21) stayed in contention for an at-large BCS bowl by outlasting Baylor 42-34. The Sooners ganged up on the pass holding the Bears to a ssn-low 172 pass yd but all'd over 200 yd rushing (252) for the 4th time TY. BU cut it to 28-26 mid-3Q but the Sooners scored td's on their next 2 drives incl QB Bell's 55 yd td scamper on 3&1. RB Williams ret'd to form (23-99-2) after being banged up. QB Jones (299 ypg, 66%, 18-7) continues to improve as the WR's mature. OU is #2 FBS pass eff D (170, 50%, 3-9) in the pass play B12. WV has been more competitive since their bye 3W ago leading TCU late and drawing within 4 of OSU in the 3Q before the bottom fell out in both thanks to their FBS worst pass D (344, 66%, 27-7). QB Smith still has impressive numbers (338, 71%, 31-3) but even he can't keep pace with a D which is allowing 51 ppg in conf play! This is OU's 1st trip to Morgantown but even though the Sooners have Bedlam on deck we're not jumping on the conf HD Mounties here (1st time in 7Y) who have found out that B12 play in Oct/Nov is much diff than the competition they faced in the BE as they have dropped 4 str gm ATS TY by 17 ppg!

UCLA 35 USC 34 - At one time this was one of the greatest rivalries in CFB but USC has made this completely one sided as they are 12-1 SU and 9-4 ATS. LY UCLA had clinched the P12 Title gm and perhaps breaking from tradition was against them as they came out in horrible white uniforms and white helmets when the 2 tms normally play in their full colors. USC hammered the Bruins mercilessly 50-0 (-16') with a 573-384 yd edge. As disappointing as this ssn has been for the pressn #1 Trojans, a win here gives them the P12 South Title w/a shot to still play in the Rose Bowl. LW after trailing 14-7 (booted by home crowd), they outscored ASU 31-3 the rest of the way. Super efficient Barkley has been careless w/the ball the L3W throwing 7 int but he still has the nation's best WR to throw to in Lee who had his 5th 150+ rec yd gm TY LW. After the nightmare gm vs Oreg, the D did allow just 15 FD and 250 yds. UCLA 1st yr HC Mora, Jr should be up for P12 COY as he has taken a group of perennial underachievers and has them at 8-2 after LW's 44-36 win (-16') at Wash St, a gm they led 44-14. rFB QB Hundley continues his sensational campaign as he is avg 274 ypg (69%) with a 24-9 ratio. The HT is 21-9 ATS in this cross town rivalry and with everything on the line, expect this one to go down to the wire.

BOISE ST 37 Colorado St 10 - LY BSU was playing its first ever MW gm and was -32 on the road but actually led 28-0 before CSU even got a FD and won going away 63-13 with a commanding 742-231 yd edge. The Broncos rebounded nicely LW from their shocking home loss to SDSSt by beating UH 49-14 (-28). The Broncos had a 411-250 yd edge and held UH to -14 yds rushing. While the off has struggled in the post-Moore era, the D has picked up the slack as they are giving up just 300 ypg (#10) and 14.4 ppg (#8). CSU is off a 33-11 win over UNLV (+1) as they rolled up a 340-219 yd edge and had a +3 TO margin while scoring 2 def td's. This is the Rams 1st trip to the Blue surface and Boise has a bye on deck. With solid edges across the board, look for Boise to grab an easy win here.

NAVY 41 Texas St 24 - First meeting. Franchione shutout Navy 24-0 in '00 in Annapolis while the HC at TCU (just 1 of 3 Navy shutouts s/'99). Navy has won 9 straight home finales by an avg of 22 ppg. A couple of interesting notes in this game is Bobcat leading rusher Curray (513, 6.1, 9 td) is a Navy transfer and these two have a common opp in SJSt as both lost by 10+ and both were outgained by 200+. After a 1-3 start Navy won 5 str gms prior to LW but fell to Troy 41-31 (-3). The key to their turnaround has been fresh QB Reynolds who is comp 60% with an 8-1 ratio and has run for 289 yds in the L2W. Texas St is 3-6 in their first ssn of FBS and LW nearly pulled off its 2nd big shocker of the yr in a 62-55 (+20) loss vs No. 19 La Tech. The gm was tied at 48 in the 4Q before the Bobcats all'd 2 td's as the tms comb for 69 FD's and 1,204 yds. Texas St is on their 3rd AG in 4W and Navy's option is at its best late in the yr. Look for the Mids to get a bounce back win here.

Kansas St 45 BAYLOR 31 - The HT has won 5 in a row SU (3-2 ATS) and the dog is 4-1 ATS. KSU is now 5-2 SU in this series. LY KSU (+3') was at home and they were the B12 POW on the Comp Line. Trailing 35-33 BU's RG3 threw his first int in 171 att's and KSU got a 31 yd FG for a 36-35 win as KSU got the outright upset. KSU is 13-2 ATS on the road but Baylor is 8-2 ATS at home. KSU beat TCU 23-10 as 7 pt AF's making the BCS Title gm a near certainty as long as they win out (thanks to Bama's loss). KSU led 23-0 mid-4Q before the Frogs scored on 2 of their L/3 poss thanks to a fmbld which set them up at the KSU39. After LW's inj scare QB Klein was held in check by the B12's #3 D (195 tt yd) throwing his 1st int since Sept 15th. KSU leads the FBS in TO margin (+20), B12 in sks and allows 251 pass ypg (62%) with a 12-14 ratio. The Bears (+21) fell 42-34 to OU and at 4-5 must knock off 2 of the conf's top 5 tms in their L/3 to make it back to a bowl. BU trailed the Sooners 28-26 in the 3Q but missed a 2 pt conv and all'd td's on their next 2 drives to put it out of reach. QB Florence (355 ypg, 62%, 25-11) remains the B12's #1 passer despite being held to a ssn low 172 yd LW. Seastrunk is finally showing his talented form accounting for 296 tt yd and 4 td in the L/2. The Cats continue take care of business setting up an intriguing Dec 1st matchup with Texas for a ticket to the big game.

Nevada 38 NEW MEXICO 28 - 2 recent meetings with NM had Nev winning a bowl gm in 2007, 23-0 with a 548-210 yd edge. LY at home NV (-29') had 34-14 FD and 598-257 yd edges and led 49-0 but NM avoided the shutout by scoring a td with 6:38 left. Nev is now off 3 str losses for the 1st time s/'09 after LW's 52-36 loss (+3) to Fresno. The gm was a bit misleading as it was tied at 21 at HT before Nev was outscored 23-0 in the 3Q thanks to 2 FR td's. The Lobos are much improved under 1s yr HC Davie but LW fell to WV 28-23 (+2) at home despite tallying 28-17 FD and 551-429 yd edges. NM is 8-3 SU in home finales and NV is 7-14 ATS as an AF. Nev does have the off edge (#27-96) and the depth-shy Lobos maybe wearing down a bit as after a promising 4-3 start they have lost 4 str gms. Make it 5.

NOTRE DAME 30 Wake Forest 6 - LY WF was charged up for a HG vs one of the storied programs and WF actually led 17-10 at the half with a 197-145 yd edge. ND went 62/6 and 65/8pl for td's and the lead. WF fmbld at the ND11 and ND escaped (24-17, -13'). 5-5 Wake is off a 37-6 loss (+9) at NCSSt where they were outFD'd 26-9 and outgained 428-185 while the Irish are off a 2-1-6 win (-20) over rival BC as we easily cashed a Totals Play on the Under. QB Golson continued his improvement as he accounted for all 3 td's. After starting out hot going 4-1 ATS, the Irish playing w/undefeated pressure are now 1-3-1 ATS in their L/5 and have won their HG's by just an avg of 5 ppg (winning their AG's by 25 ppg!). Their D has remained consistent though as they have now held 5 of their L/8 opp to ssn scoring lows. They naturally have all the talent edges across the board but Senior Day has been tricky for them all the way back to the Holtz era as they are just 6-15-1 ATS. With that being said, style pts are big for #3 ND here and don't be surprised if Kelly has a chance to score a td late, he will.

OREGON 45 Stanford 24 - Stan has lost 2 gms during the reg ssn in '10 and '11 and they were both to Oregon as the Ducks are 9-1 SU/8-2 ATS in this series. Coming into LY, UO was +180 ypg in the 9 prev meetings, but SU was only outgained 387-385. UO was actually fav'd by 3 and the grass was wet and muddy which favored the bigger Cardinal but the speedy Ducks still won 53-30. LTH Stan actually led 21-3 after 1Q and 31-24 at the half but UO would score the only pts in the 2H in the 52-31 home win (-6'). LW the Ducks withstood inj to its entire DL and brief absences by QB Mariota and Barner to win their 13 str gm overall 59-17 (-32') over Cal. Mariota threw 6 td's and UO scored the gm's final 35 pts after Cal cut it to 24-17 in the 3Q. Stan is off a 27-23 (-4') win over OSU in a topsy-turvy gm that saw Stan race out to a 14-0 lead before OSU scored 3 str pts, then the Cardinal closed it out with 2 td's. QB Hogan got his 1st start and completed 22-29-254-3-2 and they overcame a -3 TO deficit. UO is 1-4-1 ATS in Autzen finales and has the Civil War on deck but after being crowned the AP's new #1 tm with GameDay on hand, look for the Ducks to keep the foot on the gas here as this is a terrible matchup for the slower Cardinal.

OREGON ST 37 California 16 - OSU had won 4 in a row SU/ATS in this series (winning by an avg of 33-17) and has pulled 4 outright upsets in the L9Y. LY at home Cal (-9) had a 296-31 yd edge on the ground and won 23-6 getting their first win at home in the rivalry s/'97. Both tms come in off losses as OSU let a 23-14 late 3Q lead evaporate in a 27-23 (+4') loss to Stan. The Beavers had a 4-1 TO edge but could only muster 3 pts off of them while Stan scored the go-ahead td after a Vaz fmbld. Vaz did leave the gm late w/an ankle inj (CS). Cal has had their own inj concerns as LW they played w/o QB Maynard and WR Allen and lost 59-17 (+32') to Oreg. The Bears did put up a fight for the 1st 35:00 as they trailed 24-17 before all'g the gm's final 35 pts. QB Bridgford did go just 9-21-113-1-2. OSU is 14-5 ATS the gm prior to rival Oregon but Cal is playing their regular season finale and possible final gm under veteran HC Tedford. However, even if they hold nothing back, OSU has the talent edges and will get a bounce back win.

Smu 30 RICE 24 - Rice has covered 6 in a row ATS in the series and the HT is 11-4-1 ATS. LY SMU (-13) at home had a 368-250 yd edge but were -4 in TO's and only won 27-24. LW SMU destroyed hapless SM 34-6 (-14') as they racked up 20-10 FD and 435-178 yd edges. QB Gilbert continues to impress HC Jones w/his mobility and LW he didn't disappoint w/94 yds and 2 td's on the ground. However, he is comp just 54% with a 13-13 ratio which his sub-par numbers in a Jones offense. RB Line (1032, 4.8) is now 2nd on the schl's all-time leading rusher list behind Dickerson. Rice comes in off B2B wins scoring 40+ in each and has to win their final 2 gms to clinch a bowl (SMU needs 1). The Owls are led by QB McHargue who has a 9-5 ratio and has added 10 rush td's. Rice is 11-5 SU/ATS in home finales (5-1 ATS) and the Owls are 5-2 ATS off a bye. However, SMU is +74 ypg in CUSA play while Rice is -46 ypg and we like the Ponies to clinch a bowl here for the 4th str yr.

4★ NEW ENGLAND over Indianapolis - It's the first time that a team that covered as an AF is now a DD AD since the Chiefs in Wk 5 2001 (lost 20-6 +10). The Colts are on their second straight away but being off a Thursday Nighter negates the normal travel pressure. Luck has now led his team to B2B outright road wins but it was against a pair of teams that have 4 wins combined and into this week are ranked #29 & #26 on defense. Belichick came into this season with a 10-3 record vs rookie QB's holding them to 54% and an 11-21 ratio and after losing a game to Russell Wilson earlier this season his creative juices will be flowing. Brady loves marquee QB matchups and since '10 when he's facing an elite QB or high profile foe (Rivers, both Manning's, Vick & Tebow) he's had a 26-4 ratio. Luck deserves the praise he's receiving leading the Colts to a 6-3 mark but in their 2 losses to Chicago (21-41) and the NY Jets (9-35) the main difference was that they trailed at HT by 10 and 18 points meaning they were forced to throw playing from behind and they were also the 2 games they allowed over 28 points. Unfortunately for Indy NE has topped the 4 td mark 13 of their last 15 games.

FORECAST: NEW ENGLAND 36 Indianapolis 17

3★ Green Bay over DETROIT - GB is 9-2-1 ATS vs DET. The Packers #24 run game should get a boost as FB Kuhn and RB Starks are slated to return. Domes don't intimidate Rodgers as GB has avg'd 396 ypg & 31 ppg in their L/6 (4-2 ATS) as he's tallied a 19-1 ratio the L2Y. Both teams have respectable defensive rankings (GB #13 DET #10) but part of this is due to the fact that neither team has faced many elite QB's. Still DET has a given up a 14-5 ratio while GB has held foes to 13-10. GB has a huge situational edge off a late season bye (see page 8) having covered 5 straight while DET is off 4 road games in 5 weeks and are 1-6 ATS prior to Thanksgiving. The Packers lead the league in sacks and the Lions have struggled when pressured as in their 5 losses they've been sacked 13 times while only getting sacked 4 times in their 4 wins. Green Bay's only loss and non-cover here in the L6Y was in 2010 when the Lions knocked Rodgers out of the game in the 2Q which he still remembers well. GB has a QB who knows how to play and win big games and knows the importance of this one as they still trail the Bears in the standings.

OTHER SELECTION

2★ CAROLINA over Tampa Bay - Schiano got his 1st win as an NFL coach with a 16-10 win on opening day vs CAR as a 2.5 pt AD. Now the Bucs travel for the 3rd time in 4 weeks and while many early season opponents may have taken them lightly they are now traveling to face an opp looking for same season revenge (0-2 LY failed to cover by 7 ppg). The Bucs improved offense has propelled them to #14 but on the season they have faced the league's #31 schedule and despite facing the 2nd easiest slate they're getting outgained on the year. LW was another example as they were outgained 426-279 and only had 12 FD's scoring on a blocked punt and an int return. Carolina meanwhile has taken on the #1 schedule and the defense has brought its game as over the L5W they've allowed only 306 ypg which includes 3 offense ranked in the top 7! LY Newton showed marked improvement facing teams the second time around as his ratio went from 3-4 to 6-3 while being a much more productive runner going from 4.6 ypc to 7.0 ypc. Three straight wins gives Tampa extreme confidence but might they be looking ahead to hosting the Falcons next week?

OTHER GAMES

Miami at BUFFALO - Edge to Buffalo with Miami having to travel for the 3rd time in 4 games. Miami comes in with the better record but has dropped 2 straight and has gotten outgained in their L/5 by 121 ypg. The ironic thing in LW's season worst 34 pt loss was that they held TEN to 293 yards and were only outgained by 38 yds. Buffalo meanwhile had dropped 4 of 5 getting outgained in each before showing life at NE as they outgained the Patriots 481-347 but were -3 in TO's. Can the Bills improve on a 1-6 ATS div record at home under Gailey or can the Dolphins stay just 2 games behind NE for the AFC East lead. Grab this Thursday Night Marquee after Noon EST gameday for \$12 through the office, \$9 on the NC Sports Debit Card or on the Marquee 7-pack.

Philadelphia 27 WASHINGTON 20 - For the 3rd year in a row the Redskins come off the bye week (0-4 ATS) vs PHI. Shanahan himself is 3-21-1 ATS as a HF and there were hints that teams may have figured out Griffin who was held to 196 ypg vs PIT/CAR (5.2 & 5.5 ypa's) with just 61 total yards rushing. Both teams employed a power run style to wear down WAS defense as they allowed 140 (5.2) and 129 ypg (4.8) on the ground. WAS has struggled to pressure QB's (#19 w/ 14) and teams have hit them for a 20-10 ratio so far. While Reid is now clearly on the "hot seat" his best attribute has been preparing his squad to travel on the NFC East road as evidenced by his 13-4 ATS mark. The offenses are close, our ST rankings also have them close but the biggest difference is in the D. The Eagles stop unit has been bashed and went through a DC change but they are still #11 allowing 344 ypg and their last 6 opponents have offenses that ranked #11, #14, #2, #8, #5 and #6. Despite being off 5 straight losses a division win can ease the pressure for a day or two and the players may finally reach their potential playing loose. Even if Vick is unable to go a change may not be the worst thing.

ATLANTA 33 Arizona 13 - The Falcons talked the entire off season how Drew Brees continued to throw on them up by 22 to set his passing record at home on a Monday night in week #16. After losing to the Saints again and being the final team knocked from the ranks of the unbeaten they look towards Arizona to take out their frustrations. Atlanta has been awesome off a SU loss posting a 18-3 ATS mark. The Cardinals do come in off a bye but we'll call it a disadvantage for them having dropped 5 straight prior while also going 0-4-1 ATS. Skelton started the L/3 losses and his career #'s (54%, 15-21 ratio) are basically what you're getting this season (55.8%, 2-5). The dome crowd will clearly be the loudest he's played against and Atlanta's secondary is only 1 of 4 teams to post a positive defensive ratio (8-10). The Cards OL is still on a record setting pace allowing 35 sacks the last 6 games and while the Falcons don't blitz often they have still recorded 3 sacks in 6 different games. The Falcons have won 17 of their L/20 SU and when playing at home off of a SU loss they are 8-1 ATS covering by 12 ypg.

E Carolina 41 TULANE 27 - EC is 9-2 SU but 4-7 ATS vs Tulane (1st gm in '91). TU is 3-5 SU and 2-6 ATS in home finales. EC is fresh off a bye while TU plays a 9th str wk and are a depth-shy tm under 1st yr HC Johnson. The Green Wave had covered 4 str gms prior to LW w/the return of QB Griffin but he had his worst outing of the year completing 25-43-211-1-3 and the Wave lost at Memphis 37-23 (+1). EC, sitting at 6-4 and w/just Tulane and Marshall left on the sked, can position themselves for a solid bowl slot. The Pirates are led by a solid trio of QB Carden (65%, 16-7 ratio), RB Cooper (891 yds, 5.5) and WR Hardy (820 yds, 9 td). EC is +79 ypg in CUSA play TY while TU is -119 ypg and the Wave have been outgained in every gm TY. The Pirates clearly have the edges on off (#73-112) and def (#77-121) and should pick up the win here.

Ucf 31 TULSA 28 - UCF is 2-3 SU/ATS vs Tulsa having met in 2 CUSA Title gms ('05 inaugural & '07 played twice). Tulsa is 11-4 ATS in home finales. In its only trip to Tulsa ('08), UCF lost 49-19 to #22 TU. LY TU (+1) had a 28-18 FD edge for the gm and 454-381 yd edge. UCF got a 29 yd

DALLAS 24 Cleveland 17 - After 4 road games in 5 weeks the Cowboys settle in for a 3 game home stretch. Dallas however is off of the NYG, ATL and PHI while having WAS on Thanksgiving and PHI again on deck. The Cowboys and their 4-5 record have been an enigma as they have dominated on the stat sheet being the ONLY team with both units ranked in the top 6 and outgaining the NFL's #2 schedule by 54 ypg. Their 20.5 off ypg however is 3rd lowest and without redzone td's you have a team that is 3-13 ATS as a HF. Even though CLE is off a bye, they and STL are the only teams that haven't won a road game TY. The Browns have performed better on the road than at home only getting outgained by 37 ypg and are on a 5-1-1 ATS run as an AD of 6.5 or more. Tough to back the underachieving Cowboys as a fav when looking back at their last 16 games they've been outscored 379-333. We'll call it by a td.

ST LOUIS 17 NY Jets 13 - The Rams got a huge confidence boost with their "win" and solid defensive play vs the 49ers LW. After losing roughly 42 starts by defenders due to injury LY the Rams had not lost a single start prior to SF. LY they allowed 152 ypg rush (4.8) on the ground while giving up a 21-12 ratio with 34 sacks and 25.4 ppg. TY they have cut that down to 114 ypg (4.3), with 12-8 ratio (7 td's coming vs Rodgers/Brady), 26 sacks and 23.3 ppg. Sanchez was expected to struggle at CenturyLink Field like most QB's have TY but at the end of the game the Jets had 11 FD, 185 yds and the only score was off a 21 yd fumble return. Vs fellow tough defenses of PIT/SF/HOU/SEA Sanchez has only hit for 149 ypg (42%) with 2-4 ratio for a 0-4 SU/1-3 ATS mark. He's gotten no help from RB Greene who has avg'd 44 ypg (2.9) on the road. STL hasn't been a NDIV HF since Wk 15 of 2010, are lacking offensively themselves (Bradford only has a 10-7 ratio TY) and RB Jackson (56 ypg 3.7) isn't having the impact he used to. We'll call for the home team by 3 and watch the Jets psyche this week.

HOUSTON 28 Jacksonville 6 - This is a bit of a flat spot for HOU as they are off LW's SNF game vs CHI and have 3 straight road games vs DET on Thanksgiving on deck. The Texans have won & covered 4 straight with a 26-13 avg score and they have massive edges in every phase with the #10 and #2 units (+8 TO's) vs JAX's #32 and #26 units (-3 TO's) on the year. Gabbert may not play as he reinjured his non-throwing shoulder but JAX simply lacks playmakers to support him. LY's #12 rush attack is only avg 54 ypg (2.8) in the L4W, 1st RD DC Blackmon has struggled so far (26 rec 9.6) with former Div III WR Cecil Shorts leading the team in rec's (29) and yards (561). HOU has a very favorable matchup with Foster (96 ypg 4.0) vs the #29 rush defense giving up 137 ypg (4.2) and Schaub should have plenty of time vs the #32 pass rush after facing CHI's #7. We'll call for HOU to dominate from start to finish in a lower scoring game no matter if its Gabbert or Henne starting here.

KANSAS CITY 23 Cincinnati 16 - Clearly there's some familiarity between HC's as they faced off as division rivals from '05-'08 with the dog covering the last 4. Cincy had dropped 4 straight both SU & ATS before winning LW and now take to the road for the first time in 5 weeks. We should get some line value here as the Bengals scored 3 td's on drives that COMBINED for 39 yards! A quick check shows the Bengals avg 405 ypg away so you'd think they'll have no problem moving the ball on KC's #16 defense. The reality is Cincinnati has taken on defenses that into LW were ranked #26, #28, #27 & #29! The Bengals have struggled as a SD fav posting a money burning 8-20-1 ATS record. It's no secret that turnovers are the cause for the Chiefs probable 1-8 record (at PIT MN) but this week they face a visitor who is -6 in TO's in just 4 road games. KC's #17 off and #16 D gives us value vs Cincy's #20 & #19 rankings while Arrowhead is always a challenge for rookie and sophomore QB's. Chiefs can move they ball here as they've outFD all 4 foes incl Atlanta, San Diego and Baltimore.

New Orleans 38 OAKLAND 24 - The Saints have won 4 of their L5 and while the defense has allowed no less than 427 yds TY they are improving situationally. After being held to 58 ypg rushing (3.1) in 6 of their 1st 7 games, Vitt has made running the ball a priority the L2 with NO earning 140 (5.6) and 148 (5.1). This has given the Saints the balance they lacked and opened up the playbook. NO is only earning 24 ypg/1.5 ppg less on the road vs LY's unit and now take on an OAK team that tied a team record for most points allowed LY. While Palmer has been able to move the ball TY, he's been mistake prone at critical moments and the offense has been sorely lacking without its top 2 RB's being held to 22 (2.0) and 72 (3.0) yds rushing the L2W. OAK's #24 pass defense is worse than its ranking giving up a 17-6 ratio with just 11 sacks (31st). They are getting no help from their special teams with 5.5 on PR's and 23.8 on KR's. NO is 7-3-1 ATS after beating ATL, are gaining momentum and balance and we'll call for them by 14 in a higher scoring game.

DENVER 33 San Diego 23 - Two seasons ago the Chargers finished with the leagues #1 off and defense yet failed to earn a playoff berth with a 9-7 record. LY they finished #6 & #16 and were only 8-8. HC Turner somehow kept his job and after playing 9 games SD stands at 4-5 despite playing the leagues weakest schedule. The Bronco's meanwhile brought in John Fox and completely redid the offense to fit their prized free-agent leading to the #3 offense and to an improved #5 defense which has been on the field much less due to Manning. What's more impressive is that the Broncos have produced these results against the leagues #7 schedule. Peyton may have needed a few games to get settled in (1-2 start) but since that time is on a All-Pro pace completing 79% of his passes and a 16-3 ratio his last 6 games. The only loss in that stretch was on the road vs some guy named Tom Brady. The Chargers haven't been an AFC West AD of over 3.5 pts since 2004 showing more of their lack of competition than their supremacy. Manning will learn more from facing the SD defense for a second time in 5 games than visa versa and John Fox will not let any situation slip away from proving his team's dominance in this division.

Baltimore at PITTSBURGH - Sunday Night - This fierce rivalry has been made even stronger with Pittsburgh knocking Baltimore out of the playoffs twice in the L4Y. No series has been more closely contested as in their L/8 reg ssn meetings one game was decided by 4 pts with SIX decided by exactly a FG incl 3 in OT. Can the Steelers avenge getting swept LY and losing B2B at home or can the Ravens improve on their 10-2-1 ATS record vs the AFC North on the road under Harbaugh?

Chicago at SAN FRANCISCO - Monday Night - The Bears are on a second straight Primetime Marquee game but their results vs Houston were unavailable. When a pair of defenses that both rank in the top 6 matchup you expect a close game. SF has shown some chinks in their armor as the last 2 winning teams they faced at home were the NYG (-7, lost 26-3) and Seattle (-7, won 13-6) and LW's tie was like a loss. This game will clearly have NFC playoff seeding implications and remember Monday Night Magic selections are on an 11-5, 69% run while the MN Marquees are a phenomenal 19-5-1, 79% the last 2 seasons. Both are available after Noon EST on Monday!

FG to go up 17-16 but TU went 72/10pl for a td and 2 pt conv and UCF got to the 4 but was SOD with 4:54 left and TU got 2 FD's and took a knee. Both tms are off road wins as Tulsa took adv a short-handed HOU tm playing w/out 2 of its best ply'rs in Sims/Hayden and won 41-7 (-3). They did have huge 29-16 FD and 505-262 yd edges. After leading 24-10 in the 3Q UCF gave up 2 td's before RB Murray ripped off a 46-yd clincher w/5:25 left. Both these tms are eerily similar as they both are 8-2 SU with all of their losses coming at the hands of BCS foes. The off and def are close talent wise and while UCF is +73 ypg vs the #93 sked, TU is +76 ypg vs the #105 sked. The diff in a close gm could be UCF's huge ST's edge (#8-75) led by RM McDuffie who has 3 KR td's. Also UCF QB Bortles is comp 66% of his passes w/a 17-7 ratio while TU QB Green is comp just 53% with a 10-7 ratio. This is UCF's 4th road gm in 5 wks but UCF is 12-6 ATS as an AD and we like the Knights to clinch a CUSA Title home gm where they will most likely host a rematch with Tulsa.

The dog has now covered 4 str in this series. LY we had a 2★ in PS on KU +14. KU had a 178-169 yd edge at the half and settled for a FG from the 1 late 3Q and the gm was tied at 10. ISU got a 42 yd FG with 4:30 left for the lead and the 13-10 non-covering win. The HT is 8-2 SU and KU has won 4 in a row at home. We've successfully gone against the Cyclones on these pages the L/2 as ISU lost B2B gms to OU & TX by a comb 68-27. ISU was outgained 609-277 by UT although they did drive inside the Horns 40 4x in the 1H scoring just 1 td before wearing down. QB Jantz (171 ypg, 62%, 13-11) went the distance despite 2 more int which tied him for most in B12. Minus All-B12 LB Knott for L/2 ISU is allowing 601 ypg. The Hawks lost their 19th str B12 gm 41-34 in 2OT to TT. KU was outFD'd 29-19 and outgained 571-419 and never led in regulation but drove 72/3pl for a td and 75/9pl for a FG to tie it with :41 left and outrushed TT 390-63. In OT, after trading td's TT got a td pass out of the Wildcat while KU was SOD. KU is #2 B12 rushing (0.5 yd behind KSU) led by Sims (875, 4.9) who became the 1st Hawk to run for 6 straight 100 yd gms s/61. KU is 3-0 ATS at home in conf play with tough 4Q losses to OKSt & TX in their L/2 but now pull the upset.

MICHIGAN 34 Iowa 13 - This series has featured 4 outright upsets the L8Y and IA is 5-3 SU (4-3-1 ATS). LY we used the Hawks (+4) as a 3★ LPS and they led 17-6 at half and 24-9 in 4Q. UM was SOD on 4&gl at the 3 on an inc and the Hawks won 24-16. IA is 8-3-2 ATS in the series and UM is 2-5 SU and 1-6 ATS in "Big House" finales (0-3 ATS if not OSU) and of course Ohio St is next wk. We went against UM with our Underdog POW cashing on NW (+12) as the Cats covered 38-31. NW looked poised to pull the upset leading 31-28 with :55 left but all'd a 53 yd pass deflected by the DB to WR Roundtree which set up the gm tying FG. QB Gardner accounted for 4 of UM's 5 td in the GW in OT and he is avg 260 ypg (60%) with a 4-2 ratio while winning his 2 sts. Hoke maintains D-Rob will remain the QB when he is healthy enough to return but there's no denying that UM's pass gm has been more potent with Gardner. Once leading the Leaders Div, IA lost its 4th str to Purd to fall to 4-6 and now need to pull 2 str upsets of the div's co-leaders just to go to a bowl. The Hawks (-3) never led the bumbling Boilers (3 TO) and were outgained 490-264 but still had a chance to win when they were SOD on 4&3 at the PU35 with :21 left. PU got a 17 yd run and 20 yd pass to set up the GW 46 yd FG. Since RB Weisman was inj'd vs MSU Iowa has run for 78 ypg (2.5) which has increased the load on struggling QB Vandenberg (198, 57%, 5-6). The Wolves end Iowa's series streaks.

Washington 34 COLORADO 20 - UW is now 3-0 SU/ATS vs CU with upset wins in '99 and '00 and LY UW won 52-24 (-16) and had a dominating 562-269 yd edge. UW is just 6-18 ATS in conf AG's but did win in altitude LY at Utah (+10) 31-14. LW the Huskies became bowl elig w/a 34-15 win (+1) over Utah becoming the last BCS conf tm to top 21 pts vs an FBS opp. QB Price has struggled for most of the ssn, thanks in part to protection issues on the OL but had one of his better gms comp 24-33-277-2-0. Wash did have 22-9 FD and 437-188 yd edges but have been a much better tm at home (+48 ypg) than away (-148 ypg) TY. It doesn't matter where CU plays, they're easily one of the worst tms in all of CFB as they are avg just 18 ppg on off only to be outdone by a def all'g 47 ppg (last in the NCAA). LW they did manage 437 yds and 31 pts but gave up 574 and 56 losing their 6th str gm. While UW has the talent edges, we do think the number may be too high here and keep in mind at the end of LY CU pulled 2 outright upsets as a DD dog when the opposing tm took them lightly.

Byu 30 SAN JOSE ST 23 - LY at home BYU (-13) led 23-6 at the half but only won 29-16 with a 443-325 yd edge. SJSt is 14-2 SU at home vs non-conf foes and BYU is 1-5 in San Jose but the last visit was in 1968 (lost 25-21). LW BYU off the bye beat ID 52-13 (-39) as ID kicked a FG on the final play of the gm making some backers happy. Nonetheless the Cougs dominated with 29-15 FD and 537-273 yd edges. SJSt is off a dominating win of their own 47-7 (-20) over NMSt as they racked up a 504-220 yd edge. Both tms are bowl elig and while both off and ST's are close talent-wise, it is the D where the diff is as BYU is all'g just 265 ypg vs the #61 sked while SJSt's is all'g 325 ypg vs the #121 sked. One of their common opp's is Utah St and while lost 49-27 at home, BYU won 6-3 with a 380-243 yd edge. While much respect to SJSt HC MacIntyre (8-2 ATS TY), the Cougs get a tough win here.

UNLV 34 Wyoming 24 - LY WY was -10' at home and they rolled to a 41-14 win. The home tm is 5-0 SU and 4-1 ATS and WY is 6-2 SU in the series. The LTH WY was -4 and was pounded 42-16. The rule of thumb is to take the HT in UNLV gms as under Hauck the HT record now stands at 28-8-1 ATS after LW's 33-11 (-1) road loss to CSU. The Rebels were outgained 340-219 and they have now lost 21 games in a row SU away from home. QB Sherry was banged up and he is ? here. WY is just 12-40 SU on the MW road but got one of those wins LW 28-23 (-2) over NM despite being outFD'd 28-17 and outgained 551-429. QB Smith did have one of his best performances of the ssn comp 20-32-374-4-0. Despite the questions concerning QB Sherry's health, no way do we step in front of the home team streak here.

IDAHO 30 Utsa 27 - 1st meeting. Utsa and Idaho are 2 of just 4 FBS schools that play their HG's in a dome (Syr and Tulane). ID is just 3-9 SU in WAC HG's and are 1-6 SU in home finales. While Utsa is 6-4 SU, 5 of those wins have come against low level competition in the form of new FBS /FCS/Div 2 tms. LW was one of those as they beat McNeese St 31-24 despite being outgained 439-358 as they benefitted from +2 TO's. ID is off a 52-13 loss (+39) at BYU as they were expectantly mauled playing their 2nd gm w/o fired HC Akey and dismissed QB Blackman and LB Scheidt. Both tms are near the bottom of our rankings on off and def but the diff is ID has played the #66 sked while Utsa has played the #124 sked. ID has beaten NMSt in the Kibbie earlier TY and nearly beat WY. I'll call for interim HC Gesser to pick up his 1st win here.

Arizona 30 UTAH 27 - The dog is 4-1 ATS in this series w/3 outright upsets and Utah is 3-0 SU/2-1 ATS. LY UA (-3) finished with a 457-332 yd edge at home but the Utes won 34-21. Utah is 6-3 ATS in Rice-Eccles finales and has the weather and altitude edge in Nov vs the warm weather Cats. LY UA was -10' in chilly Colo and was upset 48-29. The Cats gained bowl elig with their 6th win (-31) 56-31 over Colorado. UA was without P12's #1 passer Scott but it hardly mattered as Carey smashed the P12's rush record with 25-366-5! JC transfer Denker hit 12-14-136-2-0 in his 1st start although Scott is expected to return here. The Utes backed themselves into a corner with a 34-15 loss at Wash in which they were outFD'd 22-9 and outgained 437-188 as they must win their L/2 to return to the postssn for the 10th straight yr. Trailing 14-8 early 3Q, UT was SOD on 4&1 at their own 43 which set up UW for a quick td and a commanding 21-8

lead. QB Wilson was sk'd 4 times and hit just 8-23 for 55 yds as HC Whittingham estimated they dropped 7 passes. Expect this one to go down to the wire but we like the more potent Cats here.

OKLAHOMA ST 44 Texas Tech 30 - OSU won 34-17 (+3) here in '10 and LY were -20 on the road and won 66-6. It was OSU's best D performance of the year as they outgained TT 637-270 and led 49-0 at the half. TT's only score came on a 37 yd FR td. OSU is 20-7-1 ATS as a HF incl LW's 55-34 win (-10) over WV as a 3★ LPS. Despite starting their 3rd QB of the yr, OSU never trailed scoring the gm's final 17 pts after WV cut it to 38-34 in the 3Q. Chelf hit 22-31-292-4-1 in his 1st career start with Lunt (concussion) also available if needed. Despite being last in B12 in TO margin at -8, OSU is bowl elig thanks to an improved D which is allowing 68 ypg fewer than LY. TT ended their 2 gm losing streak by beating KU 38-31 in 2OT as a 25' pt HF. In a gm played in wind gusts up to 50 mph the Raiders had 29-19 FD and 571-419 yd edges but could never put away the pesky Hawks. TT led by 10 with 10:19 left but KU drove 72/3pl for a td and 75/9pl for a FG to tie it. TT missed a 41 yd FG to win it and the tms traded TD's in the 1st OT. The Raiders got a jump pass out of the wildcat for a td in the 2OT and stopped the Hawks on their final poss for the win. KU outrushed TT 390-63. OSU maintains momentum here as we continue to ride the Cowboys at home.

UTAH ST 41 LOUISIANA TECH 38 - This pair of WAC undefeateds have each been a 20+ pt fav in their last 3 & 4 gms with an avg line of -.28. Utah St however is off a late season bye which they also had in '08 and '10 and covered both of those. LY LT went to bkp QB Cameron on the road in the 4Q and he led them to 10 4Q points and a 24-17 (+6) upset. TY both have run through their weakened conf skeds with LT's avg WAC score being 49-21 and Utah St's 45-17. The huge difference is that vs the 3 common opp the Aggies have led at HT by an avg of 30-1 while the Bulldogs have led by a margin of 25-16 and have piled it on in the 2H. Both our rankings (#37-120) and the NCAA's (#12-122) will show the game changing difference as Utah St's D ranks in the top third while Ls ranks in the bottom 2%. With the watered down conf let's look at non-conf foes as USU has TRAVELED TO Wisc, Col St and BYU and allowed only 315 ypg while LT HAS HOSTED Rice and UNLV which are 2 off we have ranked #87 & #98 and they all'd 507 ypg. Defense wins conf titles and we'll take the Aggies here.

LSU 38 Mississippi 17 - LSU is 8-2 SU in this series but only 3 of those wins were by more than 7 pts and Miss is on an 11-3 ATS run vs LSU. LTH we used Miss as the Underdog Play in PS and Ole Miss almost got the upset with LSU getting a td with :44 left to pull out a 43-36 win but UM easily covered (+15). LY it was the FHG for Houston Nutt and LSU dominated so thoroughly they took a knee 4 times with 5:00 left from the Ole Miss 21 LSU won 52-3. LSU got one of the more lucky covers LW as MSU had the ball down 13 w/1:00 left near the LSU GL but a 100-yd IR td made some Tiger backers happy as they bounced back from the loss to Bama with a 37-17 win (-14'). QB Mettenberger had his 2nd str impressive gm going 19-30-273-2-0. Ole Miss had a bowl bid in their sights but let it slip thru their fingers LW as they blew a 23-6 2H lead and all'd a 26-yd td pass w/:52 to lose 27-26 to Vandy. QB Wallace's performance TY has mirrored the team's; occasionally spectacular but equally mistake-prone as he has a league-high 10 int's. The talent edges are not as disparate as you would think (LSU #24-36 off, #5-39 def) but we wonder what frame of mind the Rebs will be in after LW's devastating loss and the Egg Bowl on deck.

Mind 27 SOUTHERN MISS 24 - Your program has had 18 straight winning seasons and has been to 10 straight bowl games and while your HC left, you are clearly a great job for any new hire. Fast forward to Nov 10th and you are heading home after a loss to SMU knowing that you have already set the schl rec'd with 10 losses and are the only FBS team without a win. The D blames an offense avg just (307 ypg) while the offense blames a D all'g (465 ypg) the L/5 gms. UTEP's situation is not much better but they did beat Tulane and outgained Houston on the road 494-339. The Miners were off a bye and made a youth movement and while Sullivan threw for 79 (45%, 0-1) in his first start it was vs UCF which ranks #30 in our pass eff D while now he faces S Miss' #108. While we won't quite go as far as calling the Golden Eagles a complete head case we won't back them with our money or yours.

ARIZ ST 41 Wash St 24 - LY ASU came in with a 7 gm win streak in this series and they had won the last 3 by a comb 101-14 outgaining WSU by 242 ypg. The gm was played at WSU (+11') in a 32' rain/snow mix and WSU even lost starting QB Lobbestael to inj with Halliday coming off the bench and hitting 27-36-494. WSU rolled up a 590-411 yd edge but did have a misleading 10 pt win after ASU led 27-23. LW the Sun Devils (-10) ran into a USC tm off B2B losses and playing w/revenge and lost 38-17 getting outgained 447-250. Amid player abuse allegations vs HC Leach by former #1 WR Wilson, WSU dropped its 7th str gm 44-36 (+16) but it was misleading as the Bruins held a 37-7 HT lead and a 44-14 lead late 3Q before Wazzu scored a couple of garbage td's. ASU is between USC and rival Ariz but is playing with legit revenge and as you would expect with vastly different climates the HT is 8-2 ATS and the Cougs are on their 3rd AG in 4W and have the Apple Cup next Friday.

TROY 41 Ark St 34 - Situational edge to ASU off a Thur night 22 pt win vs ULM with a bye 3W ago. Troy meanwhile is playing a 6th str wk and after dropping a competitive shootout at Tenn defending 47 passes they took on the polar opposite vs Navy's wishbone and won 41-31 (+3). ASU's off, led by possible SBC POY Aplin (16%, 6-3), has already beaten FIU, ULL and NT on the road by a comb 55 pts but is now playing with pressure as conf co-leaders. Troy, despite being on a 2-3 SU run is still alive for bowl elig and this is both their FHG and HC. These are the top 2 Sun Belt offenses so let's compare the D's and see which way we lean: ASU is all'g 64% comp's while Troy is all'g 56%. Look deeper into those records and you'll find the Trojans have taken on a pair of SEC teams (Miss St & Tenn) and OUTGAINED them both!

ULM 33 N Texas 24 - McCarney inherited a NT tm that went just 1-16 at home the previous 3Y and with the new stadium he went 4-2 record in '11. After a disappointing HC loss you knew they would leave it all on the table LW in their FHG and they did just that with a 24-14 (-7) win over S Alabama to finish at 3-2 at home. While still alive for bowl elig they travel without their leading rec from both LY and TY in top playmaker Chancellor (avg 121 all-purp ypg). ULM was hit even harder by the inj bug as they lost their starting QB 2W ago. Wells replaced him and while his 1st start was on a short wk and on the road vs the top SBC tm he still threw for 357 (70%, 2-1) in a 45-23 (+7) loss to Ark St. He is also a Sr who has been in the system for all 4Y and even started several gms in '09 so now prepping for this home affair will not be an issue. A win in this FHG gives ULM their FBS record 7th win and under Berry they are now 3-0 ATS off B2B conf losses covering by 12 ppg.

Middle Tenn 34 SOUTH ALABAMA 20 - 1st meeting. This is USA's home finale. After a shocking loss to McNeese in the opener the Blue Raiders have quietly won 6 of their L/8 gms while sitting atop the SBC. One of the reasons has been the play of QB Kilgore who is much improved avg 228 ypg (67%) with a 14-4 ratio (LY 59%, 18-12) but their D is giving up 441 ypg. That shouldn't be too much of a worry here vs a USA off that is avg just 342 ypg. LW after leading 14-7 USA lost 24-14 (+7) to NT to drop to 2-8 SU overall. Their QB Metheny is avg just 149 ypg (54%) with a 9-7 ratio. MT is fresh off a bye fighting for a bowl berth while USA plays for a 6th str wk and its depth shy in their 1st yr of FBS play.

LOUISIANA 31 Wku 24 - UL won the 1st 3 of this series but has been upset in each of the L/2Y. LY WKU snapped an 18 gm home losing streak winning 42-23 (+3) but UL had a 540-507 yd edge. LTH WKU led 27-7 at the half and snapped a WKU record 26 gm losing streak. After 15 str covers, the Hill-toppers have dropped 3 of their L/4 SU/ATS after LW's 37-28 loss (-16) to FAU which gave us another Big Dog outright upset winner. The Hilltoppers managed just 288 yds but RB/RM Andrews did account for 340 all-purp and is now #1 in the NCAA avg 231 ypg. LW after falling down 13-3 in the 3Q UL (+27') rallied back to lead Florida 20-13 w/2:00 left. After a UF td, the Cajuns, playing for OT, had their punt blk'd and it was ret'd 36 yds for a Gator td w/:02 left and a deflating loss. However, Hudspeth said after the gm "Anytime you see the #7 tm in the country storm the field like they won the Super Bowl to beat you, you know you're doing some good things." We think those good things continue here.

Tuesday, November 20th
Akron at TOLEDO - In the last meeting ('08) UA stopped a series high 6 game losing streak, 47-30 (-6'). The Zips have had 4 str losing trips to the Glass Bowl by an avg score 39-11. Toledo is playing just their 3rd game in 24 days while Akron is playing a 12th str week. The Rockets are off a MAC West showdown vs Ni while the Zips are looking for that elusive 2nd win (1-11 in each of prior 2 yrs). **Pick up the Tuesday Night Marquee on your Northcoast Debit Card for just \$9 after 12 noon ET on Gameday!**
