4★ KANSAS over Louisiana Tech - Last met in '08 and KU won 29-0 (last time they shutout an opp) with 23-12 FD and 538-267 yd edges forcing LT to punt on 7 of 10 drives. KU doesn't get many opportunities to be a fav and LY went 0-2 in that role losing to Rice 24-25 as an 11 pt HF and beating SDSU by only 14 (-19) with only a 432-411 yd edge. They also failed to cover TY vs FCS South Dakota in a 31-14 win (-23). However, we do think they are much improved TY in the 2nd-yr under Weis and LW they led Rice 14-13 in the 4Q but for the 2nd consec ssn vs the Owls blew a late lead in the 23-14 loss (+6). LT only has 8 ret starters and is a shell of its former self under 1st-yr HC Holtz. They clearly are a play against tm for early in the ssn off a 9-win ssn and so far are 0-3 ATS failing to cover each by DD's. LW they were a 7 pt HF but lost outright to Tulane 24-15 as a late td made the gm look more respectable. Look for KU RB's Sims (203 rush, 5.8) and Pierson (127 rec, 21.2) to take advantage of #114 LT's D (KU has #69 D) which is all'g 423 ypg as they get a feel-good win.

FORECAST: KANSAS by 20 over Louisiana Tech

3★ † Houston over Rice - 2nd straight season at Reliant. LY Houston (-7, 35-14) jumped out to a 28-0 lead and finished with a 608-343 advantage. UH has outgained Rice 11 straight seasons and has avg'd 627 ypg the L/6! Houston is off a bye after a misleading 22-13 win (-3) over Temple as the Cougars had 32-19 FD and 524-300 yd edges but were only 1 for 8 scoring a td inside the Temple RZ! They have UTSA on deck while Rice is off a home game vs Kansas. The Owls found themselves down 14-13 LW in the 4Q but bkp QB Driphus Jackson came off the bench in the 4Q to lead them to their only offensive td of the gm (other was a 52-yd IR td). Houston was our Bowl GOY winner in 1996, they cashed as a 3★ Key Selection earlier TY and have owned the series as of late w/3 blowout wins in 4 yrs. Will we go to the Cougars as TY's September 5★?

FORECAST: Houston by 10 over Rice

3★ WISCONSIN over Purdue - The Badgers have won 7 in a row both SU and ATS (cover by 15 ppg) outgaining Purdue by 221 ypg. LY on the road, UW (+1) was a 4★ Key selection on these pages. Not only did they have 30-11 FD and 645-252 yd edges, but led 38-7 when PU got an 81 yd td run to skew the stats a bit. UW even missed a 36 yd FG in the 1H, was int in the EZ in the 2H and nearly had a td at the end but ended up taking a knee deep in PU territory. Both tms come in off tough losses as PU led ND 17-10 into the 4Q before the Irish scored 3 td's in a 3:30 span in a 31-24 loss (+18). After struggling in the 1st 2 wks, QB Henry was 25-40-256-3-1 but the run gm was limited to 38 yds (1.8). The Badgers (+4) led ASU 24-19 in the 4Q but then all'd 2 td's. UW got a score w/3:53 left but the 2 pt conv failed. The Badgers got the ball back w/1:36 left and were at the ASU13 w/18 left when QB Stave, trying to set up the GW FG, awkwardly placed the ball on the ground. Officials ruled it a dead ball and with the clock still running, the Badgers weren't able to get off another snap in the 32-30 loss. One of the bright spots continues to be the play of RB Gordon who had 193 (12.9!) LW and now has 477 (12.9!) on the season. **LY we easily cashed our 5★ College GOY on UW in a 62-14 (-7) win over Indy and while they have Ohio St on deck, you have to think they will want to get LW's bad taste out of their mouths. Will we go back to the Badgers for another 5★ winner?**

2★ DUKE (+) over Pittsburgh - The Blue Devils have dropped 3 str but the L/gm was in '76 (44-31 loss). The Blue Devils are 9-3-1 ATS as a HF taking care of teams they should beat. Pitt falls into that category and this is potential battle to stay out of the cellar. The Devils are off a 38-14 loss (+8) to GT as we cashed a 3★ Weekly Totals Play on the UNDER. They were outFD'd 28-13 and outgained 469-254 as they were denied their 1st 3-0 start s/'94. QB Connette who came off the bench (due to injury to Boone who is out here) to lead the win over Mem struggled in his 1st start going 15-28-122-0-0. Pitt, off a bye, and needing a feel-good win after the FSU blowout loss, were able to beat NM 49-27 (-21) LW. The final score was a bit misleading as Pitt had 4 TO's and held NM to just 59 yds in the 1H (incl just 5 yds rushing!) and jumped out to a 42-6 early 3Q lead. QB Savage is avg an impressive 15.6 yds per comp, but like his days at Rutgers is struggling taking care of the ball w/a 3-4 ratio. In a gm that could come down to 1 poss, Duke does have the huge ST's edge (#22-85). **Duke was part of our 1st ever September 5★ in 1984 as we cashed on UVA (-3) 38-10 going against them. This time will we use the Blue Devils nearly 30 years later to cash yet another 5★ winner?**

FORECAST: DUKE by 5 over Pittsburgh

2★ USC over Utah St - LY USC started ranked #1 and Utah St was NR and they finished the season with Utah St ranked and USC NR. In Utah St's 4 BCS road trips the L4Y they've lost to Wisc by 2, #23 Auburn by 4 and #7 Okla by 7 and earlier TY lost by 4 to Utah (+2) but we did cash a 3★ Key Selection on these pages going against the Aggies in that gm. TY they are playing a road for a 3rd time in 4 weeks and have a short week with another AG vs conf rival San Jose St on Fri. QB Keeton deserves Heisman consideration as he is avg 308 ypg (78%) w/a 12-1 ratio and has added 187 rush yds (6.7). They are off B2B blowout wins but will be making a steep climb in competition here as LW the Trojans may have finally found their mojo in a 35-7 (-14) win over BC. QB Kessler got the start and was an efficient 15-17-237-2-0 while leading USC to a 521-184 yd edge. RB Madden became the first Trojan player to start the yr w/3 str 100+ rush yd gms s/Marcus Allen in 1981 and the D continues its awesome play as it is all'g just 10 ppg and 212 ypg. The Trojans do have the speed at LB to contain Keeton while the offense may have finally found its QB. **Way back in 1987 we cashed a September 5★ on USC in their 31-14 (-10) win over Cal. Will we go back to them here as they look to have some renewed confidence after LW's impressive win?**

Thursday, September 19th

Clemson at NC STATE - NCSt is 5-2 ATS but the visitor is 7-1 ATS and CU is 8-1 SU. LY CU was -16' and playing with legitimate revenge after NCSt whipped the #7 Tigers 37-13 the LTH. LY CU had a schl rec 754 yds but NCSt also produced a 400 yd passer, 100 yd rusher, 200 yd rec and got the cover only losing 62-48 with Palmer setting an ACC record with 496 all-purp yds incl 277 on KR's. The Tigers were 6-0 ATS LY away from home and while NCSt has a new HC, they were 10-3-1 ATS as a HD the L5Y including an upset of #3 Florida St LY. Both tms come in off byes and both are 2-0. CU has the talent edges on off (#16-75) and def (#45-52) but NCSt does have ST's edge (#11-89).

Friday, September 20th

Boise St at FRESNO ST - Boise has won and covered 7 straight and prior to LY the prev 4 were by 42 ppg. LY Fresno (+7) trailed 17-0 at HT which included an 86/9pl drive in which they came up empty. FSU's only td was on their final drive. Boise is 28-3 SU and 22-9 ATS on the road and has only been an AD 3x in the L5Y (2-1 ATS) but were steam-rolled by UW in that role earlier TY 38-6 (+3). The

Bulldogs went 11Y without running the table at home but did it in DeRuyter's 1st year (6-0 SU, also 6-0 ATS). They have won each of their 1st 2 HG's TY, but failed to cover as a DD fav in each. Boise has extra day off AF on Fri (but polar opposite offenses to prep for) as we cashed our Friday Night Marquee on the OVER while Fresno's gm vs Col was PPD. These two could very well see each other again in the MW Champ gm and the winner here will have the inside track to hosting that one.

Saturday, September 21st

GEORGIA by 24 North Texas - First meeting. NT has now covered 5 in a row as 23 pt or more dogs, incl losing at Clemson by 25 in '10 (+27), at Bama by 41 in '11 (+47) and LY at LSU by 27 (+44) and at Kansas St by 14 (+27). Richt was 5-1 ATS as a fav of 20+ prior to LY but went 0-4 ATS. The Bulldogs come in off a bye but have a huge game at home vs LSU on deck while NT has a bye on deck. In their L/gm UGA bounced back from the loss to Clemson in the opener and took an early lead in the SEC East race as they beat S Car 41-30 (-3). Finally, QB Murray played well in a win over a Top 15 tm as he threw for 309 yds (74%) w/a 4-0 ratio while RB Gurley already has 288 (6.9) on the yr. The inexp'd UGA D has given up 461 ypg and 34 ppg but that came against two Top 25 offenses. LW NT fell behind Ball St 27-9 in the 2Q but rallied back to win 34-27 (+3) as QB Thompson was 31-47-274-1-0 and the Mean Green did benefit from 5 BSI TO's. While clearly UGA has the talent edges (off #44-81, def #44-86, ST's #36-116), they may get caught peeking ahead to next wk while the technical edges also favor NT.

LOUISVILLE by 49 over Fiu - FIU is now 2-0 ATS vs the Cards. In '11 they went into Papa John's Stadium as a 3' pt dog and came out with a 24-17 win thanks to T.Y. Hilton as they were outFD'd 24-9. LY was a horrible yr for FIU and UL QB Bridgewater came in having an exceptional season but actually had 17 inc passes which were more than he had the first 3 games of the season combined (16). FIU was w/o RB Mallory, QB Medlock and their top RB Rhodes but had a 326-323 yd edge in the 21-12 loss (+14). UL is now 0-3 ATS in the gm following KY failing to cover by 14 ppg and is just 6-9 as a HF the L3Y. LW the Cards (-13) did cash our 3rd str 4★ Key Selection as they beat KY 27-13. Bridgewater and Co started off slow but following a fiery HT speech by HC Strong exploded for 339 2H yds and the D despite all'g 376 yds (128 on L2/D) drives did force 3 TO's and held KY to 0-13 on 3rd down. It's going to be a long ssn for FIU and their new HC Turner as after B2B blowout losses to MD and UCF, LW they embarrassingly were a 3 pt HD to FCS Bethune-Cookman. Then, in more embarrassing fashion were thoroughly dominated in a 34-13 loss all'g 311 rush yds. Naturally, the Cards have huge talent edges (off #19-123, def #17-120) and with them being upset by FIU at home in the last trip and having a bye on deck, they should be more focused than normal vs a huge underdog.

IOWA by 16 over Western Michigan - Broncos are 2-0 SU (both outright upsets) vs the Hawkeyes winning 27-20 (+14) in '00 and 28-19 (+7) in '07. Another week and another B10 road gm for the Broncos as they play their 3rd one in 4 wks. LW they were a 28' pt AD to NW and for the 2nd time TY were able to cover a large spread vs a B10 foe as they lost 38-17 giving us a 2★ Other Selection winner. WM actually led 3-0 after 1Q despite NW starting its 1st 3 drives in WM territory. Consistency at QB has been one of their major issues as Van Tubbergen is avg 176 (44%) w/a 2-5 ratio. Hawkeyes are off revenge seeking game at Iowa St where their Big 10 opener on deck at Minnesota. UI did get their revenge LW 27-21 (-1) as they jumped out to 13-0 HT and 27-7 4Q leads before surviving 2 late IST td's. We did cash our Top Weekly LPS Totals Play on the UNDER. RB Weisman had his usual workmanlike 145 yds (4.1) as the Hawks had a 218-59 rush yd edge. Iowa has struggled vs the MAC recently going 0-3 ATS and actually lost to CM at home 32-31 (-14) LY and then earlier TY fell to N Illinois 30-27 (-3) at home. They do need wins if they want to make it back to a bowl but you can't lay too many pts w/an off avg 27 ppg vs a foe that is used to hanging with the big boys.

Vanderbilt by 28 MASSACHUSETTS - LY's game was UMass' first vs an SEC opp. Despite a 42 pt loss they were only outgained 443-264 and outFD'd 22-16. They had 3 TO's and were SOD at the VU9 and VU28 in the 1H. In 11Y thru '09 Vandy was a DD fav 8 times (2-6 ATS) but since have gone 7-1 ATS but the 1 loss came earlier TY as they failed to cover as a 47' pt HF vs Austin Peay 38-3. LW they found themselves down 28-0 in the 2Q at S Car but rallied back to within 35-25 in the 4Q before QB Carta-Samuels threw an int at SC1. The Dores were outFD'd 31-14 and outgained 579-268. UMass is playing their 3rd BCS team in 4 weeks as LW they fell to Kan St 37-7 (+38'). The Minutemen actually led 7-6 after 1Q but were dominated after that as KSt had a 329-123 rush edge. UM HC Molnar had high hopes for QB Wegzyn coming into the yr but after struggling the 1st 2 wks, QB Doyle got the start LW and struggled hitting 21-31-186-0-2. Despite being a large road fav, the Dores do need wins for a bowl but this could be too high for our liking.

FLORIDA by 14 over Tennessee - UF has now won 8 in a row SU in this series, 6-2 ATS (last 6 by 19 ppg, closest win by 10 pts). LY UT had a large situational edge as they caught UF off a big road game vs A&M and travelling again while UT had just played a FCS team. UF settled for a 29 yd FG at the end of the half and trailed 14-10 and UT had a 231-156 yd edge. However, UF true to form under Muschamp made adjustments and would have a 399-109 yd edge in the 2H winning 37-20 (+3). TY the situational edge goes to UF here as they come in off a bye while Tenn is on B2B road. The Gators did lose to Miami, FI in their L/gm 21-16 (-3) despite having 22-10 FD and 413-212 yd edges. Inefficiency in the RZ was the issue as the Gators had 2 TO's and were SOD. QB Driskel threw for a career-best 291 yds but has 12 TO's in his L7 starts. Tenn comes in off their worst loss s/1910 as after leading 7-0 early it was all downhill from there in the 59-14 loss (+28) to Oreg. The opportunistic Vols D (forced 7 TO's vs WKU wk prior) was gashed for 687 yds and QB Worley is avg just 124 (61%) but does have a 5-1 rating. While Muschamp is just 1-8 ATS as a DD fav, the Gators' situational and series edges have us calling for a DD win and we'll see where Vegas tells us to lean.

Wake Forest by 4 over ARMY - These two have met 3 times ('99, '07, '12) with WF going 3-0 SU and 2-1 ATS. LY it appeared the last team with the ball would win. Army led 23-21 at the half and finished running 83 plays to WF's 62 and Grobe said it was one of the longest days he's spent coaching despite the 49-37 (-7) win. Both tms are coming off B2B losses but while Army has their heads hanging high after a 34-20 loss (+28) to #5 Stanford in which they outFD'd the Cardinal 18-17, the Deacons have disappointed at 1-2 (0-3 ATS) after being upset by ULM 21-19 (-2) as their 2 pt conv w/04 left fell inc. They were outFD'd 26-15 and outgained 424-325. Wake changed offenses LW as after failing to establish the run (avg only 86 ypg), they threw the ball 48x's while only running it 15. QB Price is avg 240 ypg (59%) w/a 4-1 ratio. Wake has only been an AF once in the L3Y (-4 at Duke, won 24-23) and has Clemson on deck. Army is 2-6 ATS as a HD. Clearly Wake needs a win here but the Knights keep it close.

Michigan by 24 over CONNECTICUT - The only prior meeting was in 2010. We used Michigan (-3) as a 3★ Key Selection on these pages and a 4.5★ selection in Power Plays and they won 30-10 in Ann Arbor. Michigan is just 5-10 SU, 3-12 ATS in 'true' road openers. Conn was 11-2 ATS at Rentschler Field the L6Y under Edsall but Pasquaioni is now 4-3 ATS (0-2 TY) after LW's 32-21 (+6) loss to Edsall's MD tm. The Huskies off a bye did put forth a better effort than their sn opening loss to FCS Towson but still were outgained 501-383 (FD's were even). UM in a clear flat spot off ND played like it LW as they narrowly escaped what would have been another shocking upset in the 28-24 (-37) win over Akron. The Zips had a chance for the win but their final pass from inside the UM5 fell inc on the final play. One wk after a dazzling performance vs ND, QB Gardner continues to have issues holding onto the ball as he had a career-high 3 int and a fmb! and now has 7 TO's in the 1st 3 gms. Despite the win, the UM players and cchs showed their extreme disappointment and embarrassment in the post-game press conferences and with a bye on deck, look for them to make a statement here before B10 play starts.

Ball St by 10 over EASTERN MICHIGAN - Ball St is 7-1 SU/5-3 ATS w/B2B covers. They've also won and covered 4 of 5 here. After the game's being decided by 2, 3 and 2 pts heading into LY, EM led 13-10 when BS got a 29 yd FG with :03 left in the half. That gave them momentum as they scored on their first 4 2H poss to lead 37-13 and at home won 37-26 (-3). BS broke a school record with 36 FD's in the gm. Eagles are only 4-12 ATS at home vs MAC under English. They are off a 28-10 (+28) loss to Rutgers where they actually had 21-12 FD and 373-274 yd edges. It was 14-10 at HT and QB Benz was 24-40-335-1-1. The Cards also come in off a loss as they blew a 27-9 2Q lead all g NT to score the gm's final 25 pts. TO's were the main culprit and the Cards had 5 of them (-4) incl QB's Wenning's 1st 2 of the ssn. One of the bright spots was RB Banks who had 141 (12.8) filling in for the inj'd Edwards (CS) for the 2nd wk in a row. The series has had 5 outright upsets the L/10Y and Ball St does have UT on deck but will want to forget about LW's finish.

PENN ST by 24 over Kent St - Last met in '10 and Penn St won 24-0 (-21). The Flashes are 0-10 SU vs Big 10 tms losing by an avg of 34 ppg incl 0-3 vs the Nittany Lions (lose by 20 ppg). PSU is 27-1 vs non-BCS tms and no doubt they remember that the one loss was LY in their ssn opener vs MAC's Ohio. LW they lost to a former non-BCS schl now in the AAC as UCF beat them 34-31 (-4). The Knights jumped out to a 28-10 lead in the 3Q before the Lions came roaring back to w/ in 3. RB Zwinak rushed for 128 (6.1) and 3 td's but also fumbled inside UCF territory w/less than 6:00 remaining. QB Hackenberg is avg 284 ypg (72%) w/a 4-3 ratio. Kent w/a new HC, and new QB Reardon (surprisingly avg 183, 66%, 4-0) is now having to play in Happy Valley after getting mauled LW in Death Valley 45-13 (+36) and has trip to W Mich on deck while Penn St has a bye on deck. RB Archer only saw limited action LW (1 rec) but should be more healthy for this one. Penn St is 10-4 ATS since their week 1 loss in '12 and is 9-1 ATS when winning the game outright covering by 14 ppg. The Lions outright loss LW gives us some value here while oddsmakers still haven't completely adjusted to a Kent St tm who is nowhere near LY's 11-win total. **We cashed a 3★ Weekly LPS 2 wks ago on Penn St vs a MAC tm, will we go back to the Lions w/our 5★?**

VIRGINIA TECH by 7 over Marshall - They've met 4 times s/'02 with Marshall dropping them all by 29 ppg. In the last mtg ('11) which was the only one at Marshall, the Herd was held to 6 net yds rushing and sacked 5 times in a 30-10 loss (+20). The Herd are off a disappointing 34-31 loss (+7) to their rival Ohio as despite 28-19 FD and 482-335 yd edges, a -4 TD deficit was too much to overcome. VT is also off a disappointing performance but they were able to get a 15-10 (-7) win over EC. While the off looked better (311 yds), the ST's miscues again continued as K Journell missed 2 FG's and an XP. What has been consistent has been the play of the VT D who had 7 SK, 11 tfl and 3 int vs the Pirates. Situational edge to Marshall as VT has a short week on deck vs the GT option with Marshall having a bye on deck. While Marshall has the off edge (#27-#78), VT has large edge on def (#3-50) and the home edge. However, it's tough to lay too many pts w/an off that is avg just 17 ppg their L/8 gms vs FBS opp.

Cincinnati by 31 over MIAMI, OH - Miami HC Treadwell served 2 diff stints as an asst at Cincy incl OC from '04-'06. LY's game was closer than the 52-14 final as UC only had a 429-379 yd edge. At half MU had a 254-163 yd edge but trailed 24-14. UC's 52 pts tied a series high and UC has now dominated this rivalry game winning 7 in a row SU (6-1 ATS) by 30 ppg! But the HT is 8-2 ATS. Miami is off a bye after a disastrous 0-2 start which saw them outscored 93-21 and outgained 1,266-361. They have an improved Illinois tm on deck and are staring at a very long ssn for HC Treadwell who has to be feeling the heat. Cincy is off a 66-9 win (-29) over NW St and has a bye on deck. The Bearcats had 28-12 FD and 669-179 yd edges and were led by QB Kay (12-14-277-4-0) who many forget was the str entering the yr before having shld'r issues in fall camp (Legaux OFY). Tuberville went 6-1-1 ATS as an AF at TT but did lose in that role here outright against IL (-10) in wk 2 giving us a Underdog POW winner on these pages. However, this is a short road trip, they have series domination and are playing a tm that has looked like one of the bottom 5-10 tms in the country thru the first few wks.

GEORGIA TECH by 7 over North Carolina - GT has now won 4 straight (3-0-1 ATS) and has won 7 straight (3-3-1 ATS) when hosting. Huge scheduling edge with NC having a bye to prep and E Car on deck while GT is off trip to Duke with VT on Thursday. GT, off a bye LW, had an impressive 38-14 (-8) win over Duke as they had 28-13 FD and 469-254 yd edges. QB Lee threw a career-high 4 td's and ran for another in DC Roof's return to Durham where he was the HC. NC is 1-1 after a 40-20 win (-17) over MT 2 wks ago. While separated by 4Y NC's embarrassment LY allowing 68 pts, 588 yds and 380 (5.7) rushing is reminiscent of Miami, FI in 2008. UM allowed 472 (8.4) vs GT and the players NEVER stopped hearing about it. The next ssn they held GT to 211 tfl yds (134, 2.8 rush). However, NC did have a bye before LY's game as well and NC is 11-21 SU on the ACC road. Look for a lot of pts but until we see NC actually stop the option, we can't call for them to break their long-series losing streak.

† Maryland by 14 over West Virginia - Ravens Stadium and while WV is off Georgia St, they have a big game vs Okla St on deck. WV has won 7 in a row SU and is 5-2 ATS but LY only had a 19-18 FD edge and only won 31-21 (-25). Counting his time at Conn, Edsall is 1-8 SU vs WV. The Terps are one of TY's most improved tms already off to a 3-0 SU/ATS start (just 6-18 SU Edsall's 1st 2Y). LW Edsall got an emotional win over his former schl 32-21 (-6) as the Terps had a 501-383 yd edge. What a diff a QB makes as Brown had 277 yds pass and 122 yds rush in the win and is now avg 363 total ypg w/a 6-1 ratio. After a couple of lackluster off performances WV HC Holgorsen surprisingly went to rFr Ford Childress (3rd string vs OU) at QB and he delivered by throwing for 359 yds (61%) w/a 3-1 ratio in the Mountaineers 41-7 win (-39) over Georgia St. It was just 17-7 mid-3Q before WV pulled away w/30-10 FD and 604-220 yd edges. The off are close but MD has the D edge (#26-55) are playing with more confidence and finally break their long series losing streak in impressive fashion.

MINNESOTA by 3 over San Jose St - Last met in '92. The Gophers come into this gm off to a 3-0 SU/2-1 ATS start after LW's 29-12 win (-24) over FCS W Ill. However, HC Kill had his 4th epileptic seizure in 3Y on the sidelines and his Gophers were trailing 12-7 late 3Q before getting their ground gm on track (213 yds). Bkp QB Mitch Leidner replaced the inj'd Nelson early (CS) and was an efficient 7-8-105-0-0 while adding 64 rush (3.8). While Minny has been impressive at the LOS TY (avg 259-121 rush yd edge), their secondary has yet to be tested and will be taking on a NFL bound Fales. SJSt comes in off a bye after a 34-13 loss (+24) at Stanford. Prior to that loss they had won 8 str gms dating back to LY. While non-BCS SJSt has all the talent edges (off #87-91, def #45-87 and ST's #44-100) over a 3-0 B10 tm, but keep in mind Minny has been a different tm at home recently going 6-3 SU dating back to LY (started selling beer at stad) after just a 13-22 mark from '07-'11.

MISS ST by 17 over Troy - Troy is a perfect 3-0 ATS in this series with an outright upset in '01 (21-9 +24), a 3 pt loss in '02 (+11) and LY Troy was hosting an SEC school for the first time ever. Troy had already pulled upsets over Okla St and #17 Missouri in HG's and Troy called it perhaps the biggest HG ever and 29,013 were on hand. Troy finished with a 572-457 yd edge but had 4 TO's in the 1H and lost 30-24 (+14). The Trojans also covered on the SEC road LY in a 55-48 (+18) shootout loss at Tenn. The Trojans are off a 41-34 (+7) loss at Ark St as the 2 tms traded scores in the 2H. QB Robinson who came into the gm w/more td passes (5) than inc (4) actually threw 3 int's but is still avg 290 ypg (76%) w/a 7-3 ratio. MSU is off to a 1-2 start after LW's 24-20 (+6) loss at Auburn. The Bulldogs found themselves down 11-0 before rallying back to a 20-14 lead. QB Prescott filled in for the inj'd Russell (CS) for the 2nd str gm and was 15-28-213-0-0 and added 133 rush yds (6.0) and 2 td's. Getting outgained LY will help keep MSU focused plus they have a bye on deck and need a win. MSU also went 5-1 LY as a HF and in the L3Y+ under Mullen they are 17-7 ATS as a fav.

BAYLOR by 28 over Ulm - LY was their only recent meeting. BU was -7' and ULM had a Malone Stadium record 31,175 show up for the Fri night game and for a good portion of the game, looked like they would win as they jumped out to a 21-7 lead in the 2Q and were up 35-34 in the 4Q. BU did

get a couple scores after TO's and took a 47-35 lead with 2:25 left but ULM went 90/12pl and got a 15 yd td pass with :06 left to lead by 5. The Bears have looked like one of the more impressive tms in the B12 so far as their off is avg 70 ppg and 737 ypg, both tops in the country. QB Petty is avg 325 ypg (80%) w/a 4-0 ratio while RB Seastrunk has 261 (9.3). ULM meanwhile is playing their 3rd BCS road game in 4 weeks and BU shouldn't look past them after they have gone 2-3 SU, 4-1 ATS vs BCS tms L2Y. One of those wins came LW as they upset WF 21-19 (+2). QB Browning was the star w/a career best 48 of 63 for 315 yds and a 3-2 ratio and the Warhawks stopped WF's 2 pt conv w/:04 left. Baylor is 8-2 ATS as a HF and have the situational edge as they play only 3 games during the first 5 weeks with each at home and this ULM gm is sandwiched by bye weeks.

Wyoming by 3 over AIR FORCE - AF is now 5-1 SU in this series but WY has covered 4 in a row as Dave Christensen usually has a good game plan vs the option holding AF to 334 ypg total offense. There have been 4 outright upsets the L8Y. LY WY QB Brett Smith, who was not even ? going into the game, found out via a Christensen tweet that true freshman Thompson would be getting his first start at QB 2 hrs before KO. Of course the game was made famous at the end with Christensen yelling at AF cch Calhoun then getting susp'd for a game. WY had a 316-164 yd edge at half and led 24-14. The 2H was played in a cold rain and AF got a td with 7:45 left to lead 28-27. WY was SOD at the AF44 with 5:35 left and AF went on an 11-pl drive running out the clock. These 2 tms look to be going in opposite directions as Cowboys are off B2B blowout wins thanks to QB Smith who is avg 314 (63%) w/a 9-3 ratio while adding 161 rush (8.1). AF meanwhile is off B2B blowout losses albeit vs two top-tier MW tms in Utah St and Boise. Awini in his 2nd start did have 107 rush yds and 2 td's in the 42-20 loss (+23) and his pass numbers would be much better if not for several dropped passes. **WY was our Sept 5★ all the way back in 1993 and were (-2) vs Utah winning 28-12.** Tough to lay too many pts here w/WY as an away favorite but we do think Christensen and Co get the win and maybe the "Howdy Doody" theme song is played in the post-game locker room.

BYU by 7 over Utah - HC Mendenhall says he does not believe in getting his team higher for one game over another and treats them all the same, but there HAS to be a little bit of that here. Utah has now beaten BYU 3 str yrs and has announced that they are ending the series, which has BYU fans fired up as the "Holy War" has been played s/1896. LY BYU had 25-14 FD and 312-245 yd edges but came up short thanks to a missed 36 yd FG at the end, 24-21 (-3). Utah HC Whittingham is a BYU grad and the dog is 16-4 ATS in the series. However, Utah is off their P12 opener a 51-48 OT loss (-3) to Oreg St (bye on deck) while a clear edge goes to BYU off a bye after a resounding 40-21 win (+7) over TX as they ran for a schl rec 550 yds and they only have Middle Tenn on deck. Mendenhall has performed as well as ANYONE with his team having extra time to prep as in the L4Y he's 12-0 SU (ssn opener, bye, bowl) and 11-1 ATS with the ATS loss as an AF at Ole Miss (-3, 14-13). The Cougs have the D edge as well (#13-56) and we like them to finally get revenge.

NEVADA by 6 over Hawaii - While the home team is 11-2 SU (9-4 ATS) the lines makers have caught up as the visitor has covered 3 of 4. Hawaii almost always at a scheduling disadvantage when visiting mainland but not so TY as it is the first time at Nevada in 6 trips that game is in warm zone prior to Oct 31st and Hawaii is off a bye. Nevada is off a hot and humid game vs a physical FSU and with Air Force's option on deck may sneak in a little practice time. The Wolf Pack after a 7-3 2Q lead were then destroyed by FSU LW 62-7 (+35') as for the 3rd str wk our Early Bird POW was an easy winner (get it every week for FREE on Mondays at 1-347-677-1700 on button #9 before the line moves!). While HC Polian wasn't in the mood for excuses after the gm but UN was down to their 3rd string QB as Fajardo DNP (CS) and bkp Combs was KO'd (CS). RFr Tyler Stewart who is 6'4" and 220 and highly recruited out of HS was 7-15-49-0-1 in the 2H. UH is 0-2 but they competed quite well vs 2 good P12 tms in USC and Oreg St. Their #58 D had all just 32 ppg vs 2 talented offenses while Nev's #119 D all'd 60 ppg vs the 2 BCS tms it has faced. With status of UN's QB's unknown as of presstime, we can't lay more than a td as we favor the "Road Warriors".

TEXAS A&M by 21 over Smu - Another CUSA tm Sumlin is familiar with as he won all 4 SU/ATS while at UH and also beat them 48-3 LY. A&M became the first team to hold a June Jones cch'd offense w/o a td. A&M started slow but scored td's on 6 straight drives in the 2nd and 3Q's. SMU's co-OC Jason Phillips was the co-OC at Houston under Sumlin. A&M is in a huge flat spot off their huge game vs Bama as they lost 49-42 (+8'). QB Manziel had 2 costly int but still played brilliantly accounting for 562 total yds and 5 td passes. The Aggies were trailing 42-21 in the 4Q but benefitted from a Bama fmb inside the A&M while A&M got a 95-yd td pass 3-pl later. Many A&M backers were also happy (we weren't one of them) when A&M got a td pass w/:15 left for the dreaded backdoor cover. SMU drew some in off a bye after a come-from-behind 31-30 win (-10') over FCS Montana St as Gilbert threw a 4-yd td pass w/:12 left. Sumlin is 3-0 off a SU loss the L2Y covering by 94.5 and 37.5 LY and by 21.5 at Houston in '11. However, we like SMU's large situational edge.

NOTRE DAME by 7 over Michigan St - From '97-'08 MSU was 9-3 SU, 9-2-1 ATS in the series. MSU is on a 1-3 SU run but the visitor is on an outstanding 10-2 ATS run. MSU outgained ND 6 str yrs but ND had a 300-237 yd edge in their 20-3 (+6) road win LY, which ended MSU's 15 gm home win streak. The 3 pts all'd on the road by the Irish were the fewest vs a Big Ten team s/'93 and they have B2B wins over MSU for the first time s/'93-'94. ND HC Kelly replaced Dantonio as the HC at Cincy and there are rumors that the 2 don't care for one another. MSU comes in 3-0 SU/1-2 ATS after a 55-17 rout of YSt. They may have finally found their QB as Cook got the start and was 15-22-202-4-0 while the Spartans racked up 30-8 FD and 547-172 yd edges. LW ND was again in a flat spot vs Purdue and found themselves down 10-0 in the 2Q and 17-10 into the 4Q before they scored 3 td's in a span of 3:30 to make it 31-17 in their 31-24 (-18) win. QB Rees has thrown for more than 300 yds in all 3 gms TY but the Irish ground gm has avg just 94 (3.3) the last 2 weeks while the defense has been exposed in all 3 games. While it will be tough for any QB making his first road start in South Bend, nine of the last 13 meetings have been decided by single digits (4 of last 8 by a FG) and we expect more of the same here.

TEXAS by 6 over Kansas St - Not one, not 2, not 3, not 4, but FIVE straight losses to Kansas St. This has to be the only series in the FBS where one team is 5-0 SU and ATS with 4 outright upsets despite being outgained 5 str yrs by an avg of 96 ypg! LY KSU was playing for its share of the B12 Title and Texas had a 234-115 yd edge at half but only led 10-7. Six of the last 8 have actually been outright upsets and the favorite is just 1-7 ATS with that cover coming LY. These tms come into this one in opposite directions as after a shocking loss to FCS NDSt in the opener, the Cats have bounced back w/B2B wins albeit over SBC/MAC tms. UT meanwhile is reeling after B2B blowout losses but LW they did lead Ole Miss 23-14 before their offense failed to do anything in the 2H in a 44-23 loss. New DC Robinson was more aggressive in the 1H but they still couldn't stop the run all'g 272 yds. Sooner or later, UT will play up to its talent level and sooner or later it will end the series losing streak. For now, we'll call the game right at the line.

Arkansas St by 10 over MEMPHIS - What a difference a year makes as it is the Sun Belt vs the AAC and LY Ark St was a 23' pt fav. ASU is actually 4-1 SU but the HT has won 4 in a row SU (2-3 ATS). We had Mem as a Big Dog POW and ASU did not get their first lead of the game until 6:31 remained so we almost got another huge outright upset winner. We did have 2 Big Dog Outright Upset Winners LW and you can pick them up every Wed for just \$9 on your NC Sports VIP Card! ASU with 2 diff HC the L2Y still went 10-2 ATS on the road and has covered 6 str as an AF. ASU is off huge SBC battle vs Troy as they traded scores in the 2H in a 41-34 (-7) win. However that gm was on a Thursday and this trip is only 70 miles. They are facing an 0-2 Memphis tm that is avg just 15 ppg and while their underrated D has kept them in both gms, they did allow 470 yds to a Duke offense that ranks 35 spots lower than this high-powered Red Wolves tm.

FLORIDA ATLANTIC (+5) over Middle Tenn

MT won and covered the L/4 as Sun Belt foes and now they are both CUSA East members. In the L/3 gms MT was on avg a 6' pt fav finishing with a 172 ypg edge and covered by 14 ppg. FAU fans will see their team for the ONLY time until Oct 12th as they're off 3 road gms (2 BCS) with 2 road gms on deck. However, they should be greeting them with a warm reception as after covering their first 2 gms as an AD, LW they finally got the outright upset beating in-state foe USF 28-10 (+12*) as we cashed a 4★ Weekly LPS and another Big Dog POW. Despite getting 2 def scores, QB Johnson did lead 2 long scoring drives of 80 and 93 yds as the Owls are now on an incredible 9-0 ATS run as an away dog and are 11-2 ATS overall as a dog under Pelini w/3 outright upsets. MT is off a 17-15 win (-9) over Memphis but has now failed to cover as a favorite in both times TY. Back in '07, we used a Sept 5★ on FAU who was a HD to Minnesota and they pulled the outright upset 42-39 (+7). Will we go back to the Owls not only for a 4th time TY as a dog but also as a 5★?

ALABAMA by 31 over Colorado St - CSU HC McElwain was the OC here from '08-'11. In the L3Y the Rams have faced 3 Top 10 tms losing by an avg score of 50-6. In the L3Y Bama has hosted 5 non-AQ teams in Sept and while the avg score was 42-3 they were only 2-3 ATS with the avg line -42. Bama is off a huge revenge game vs A&M with Ole Miss on deck. LW the Crimson Tide fell behind 14-0 at College Station before scoring 35 straight pts. They led 42-21 in the 4Q and had the ball but a fmb! inside the A&M5 and a 95-yd td 3 plays later all'd A&M to get back in the game. After a Bama td made it 49-35 w/2:28 left, A&M got the backdoor td w/1:15 left. QB McCarron did have a career-high 334 yds and a 4-0 ratio while they piled up 568 yds. However, the Bama D all'd 628 yds and the 42 pts all'd were the most ever in a Bama win. CSU had blown 24 leads in each of their 1st 2 gms but LW were able to beat FCS Cal Poly 34-17 (-7). Their ST's again stepped up LW as they blocked 2 FG's. Naturally Bama has the huge talent edges but they have struggled the L2Y the week after the huge reg ssn gm vs LSU and Saban won't feel the need to roll it up vs his old OC.

Arkansas by 4 over Rutgers - LY was the first ever meeting. Cobi Hamilton broke the SEC record with 303 rec yds but UA after a 10-0 lead lost 35-26 (-9). The Hogs are 3-0 after LW's 24-3 (-23*) win over S Miss and the players are clearly buying into Bielema's system. The off looks much like Wisc redux as RB's Williams and Collins have each topped 100 yds in the 1st 3 gms w/Collins becoming the first frosh in SEC history to top 100 yds in his 1st 3 gms. The Hogs did get a scare at QB as st'r Allen inj'd his shoulder and DNR. Bielema said after the game that he is "pretty convinced" Allen will play here. If not bkp AJ Derby was 4-6-36-0-0 in his place. Rutgers is off a pair of DD wins over Norfolk St and E Mich with a bye on deck. LW former walk-on RB James again impressed w/192 yds (9.1) and 3 td's and has now rushed for 493 (8.1) on the ssn. QB Nova was KO'd w/a concussion (CS) and Dodd replaced him only needing to throw 9 passes w/the run gm in gear. The Knights figure to have an excited home crowd for a rare SEC visitor but we like what we're seeing from Bielema's crew and will call for them to get revenge.

STANFORD by 10 over Arizona St - Last game in '10. Wide disparity in situation as Stanford was at Army LW and have Wash St in Seattle on deck. ASU had Wisconsin LW, while USC and ND are on deck. Stanford was 5-0 SU at home vs Pac-12 LY but did not have a win by more than 7, however TY they have already beaten SJSt by 21, a team they only beat by 3 at home LY as they again have exp at QB w/Hogan who has never lost a start (-7-0). The Sun Devils is off a fortunate win over Wisc as UW QB Stave botched a late attempt at lining up for a GW FG and they were unable to run another play. The Devils did have a 32-15 FD edge but their D allowed 231 rush yds and will again be taking on a powerful rush attack. The Cards 34-20 (-30) win over Army can be excused for travelling across country, playing at 9 am PST time, and of course, facing the rare option. They did allow a td pass w/:17 left that made the gm closer than it appeared. ASU LY was only held to under 100 yds rushing vs USC (250 total yds, 215 below avg and 17 pts, 21.4 below avg) and this is the best D they've seen in 2Y. Look for the Cardinal to show who still reigns supreme in the Pac-12.

Louisiana by 10 over AKRON - First meeting. UL Hudspeth was the HC at N Alabama from '02-'08 and Akron HC Bowden replaced him from '09-'11. UL traveled to face Kent St in '11 (20-12, +8) and Ohio in '10 (31-38, +14*) so this is not a unique travel spot for them. Akron went 0-5 ATS vs FBS foe at home in Bowden's first season. The Zips are off a near monumental upset of Mich as their final pass from inside the UM5 was too high in their 28-24 loss (+37*). They took adv of 4 UM TO's and actually led 24-21 late in the 4Q. QB Pohl had a gutsy performance going 25-49-311-2-2 while WR Smith made several tough catches. UL is 1-2 but both of those losses came against BCS tms. LW they celebrated their program's 500th all-time win as they set a modern-day school record for pts, an all-time school record for rushing td's (8) and tied their all-time mark for total td's (10) in a 70-7 win (-26) over Nicholls St. Have to think the focus all week for the Zips will be on their missed opportunity and we think UL uses this as a business trip.

WASHINGTON ST by 35 over Idaho - These 2 have matched up 91 times incl annually from '98-'07 as they are ST by 9 miles apart. WSU has won 7 str, all by DD's incl a 45-28 win in the L/gm ('07 but were -24*). WSU is off a 48-10 win (-21*) over S Utah as the Cougars have looked very impressive TY nearly upsetting Auburn in the opener and then pulling the shocker over USC in wk 2 as a 15' pt AD. Speaking of shockers, ID despite being a 30 pt HD to NI LW found themselves tied at 35 in the 4Q before all'g the gm's final 10 pts. After B2B blowout losses, the Vandals offense finally kicked into gear under 1st-yr HC Petrino as they had 28-24 FD and 33:47-26:13 TOP edges. While Wazzu is 9-18 ATS as a HF, these could be different times in Pullman now in the 2nd yr under Leach and we won't step in front of a tm that is 3-0 ATS TY w/an avg cover of 14 ppg.

SYRACUSE by 7 over Tulane - SU is 7-1. L/gm ('11) SU won 37-34. SU led 31-14 late 2Q but all'd the lead to be cut to 4 into the 4Q. After a 58 yd TU pass to tie w/2:53 SU went 66/12pl hitting a GW 21 yd FG as time exp'd. Syracuse off a dominating 54-0 (-29*) win Wagner (home opener) and has bye on deck. It was the 1st win of the Shafer era as st'g QB Allen was replaced by Hunt who ignited the offense going 15-18-265-3-0 as they piled up 27-5 FD and 595-87 yd edges. Tulane meanwhile, is in the middle of a 3 game road trip with both other games w/ important recruiting competition as in-state foes. However, we like what we see from the Green Wave so far TY as LW they beat LT 24-15 (+7) and QB Montana after a shaky opener is now st'g to settle in avg 281 (59%) w/a 5-2 ratio the L/2 wks. Clearly the Green Wave are used to the dome atmosphere and we will back them as an AD for the 2nd wk in a row.

Toledo by 14 over CENTRAL MICH - UT has won and covered 3 straight while the fav has won 6 straight (5-1 ATS). LY was a lucky cover. UT only led 40-35 w/1:00 left in the game and got a 28 yd FG with :54 left and then got a 31 yd IR td with :38 left for the miracle cover. CM led 21-10 in the 2Q and 21-17 at the half. Rockets have won their first MAC road game 5 straight yrs while covering them all by 19 ppg but LY failed to cover the other 3 away. The Rockets after B2B covers vs SEC opp in SU losses,

LW had another solid performance this time vs FCS #2 E Wash in a 33-21 win (-7*). UT used the run gm (325 yds) to ease the burden of frosh QB Woodside who took over when st'r Owens inj'd his knee early in the 2Q (CS). Woodside did hit 14-24-185-1-0 and the Rockets did trail 14-6 in the 1H before outscoring the Eagles 27-7 down the stretch. CM, on the other hand, blew a 21-0 1H lead and lost 31-21 (+7*) at UNLV LW. QB Rush, the 3rd diff st'g QB for the Chips TY, was 23-46-265-1-2. With UT's QB ? as of presstime we'll call for the Rockets by 2 td's and see where Vegas tells us to lean.

TEXAS TECH by 31 over Texas St - LY TST had just upset Houston and the mayor of San Marcos said he had never seen as much anticipation for a game in his city and TST was a trendy upset pick (+19 at home). We liked TT and they had a 591-271 yd edge and won 58-10. TT even finished the game at the 19 yd line of TST and never punted. These 2 also met in 2011 here with TT winning by a similar 50-10 margin but were -39 only covering by a pt. TT did rush for 246 yds (5.1) in that game. TT is off to a 3-0 SU/ATS start under 1st yr HC Kingsbury and they are now ranked #25 after upsetting TCU LW 20-10 (+3) giving us another Thurs Night College Marquee winner (8-4 67% current run). After frosh walk-on Mayfield had 2 great performances in the 1st 2 wks he was just 21-40-216-1-3 LW before getting inj'd in the 4Q. Bkp Webb was just 3-4 but for 77 yds incl the GW td pass and was awarded player of the gm. Naturally after a big win, this is a bit of a flat spot but they do have a bye on deck. TST comes in at 2-0 off a bye under Franchione. They were outgained in the opener to S Miss 400-215 but kudos to a solid run D all'g just 34 ypg (1.4). Problem is their pass D gave up 377 to SM and now will be facing a pass-happy Air Raid off. When Kingsbury was a player here the Raiders went 10-3 ATS as a HF, and they have now covered their 1st 3 gms by an avg of 12 ppg. Can't step in front of them now despite the situational edge to TST.

Oregon St by 10 over SAN DIEGO ST - Homecoming of sorts for Riley as he led the Chargers onto this field from '99-'01. OSU is on a tough B2B away stretch but despite only being 0-2 ATS as an AF the L3Y the upset win at Utah has them energized after the opening wk loss to FCS EW. It is difficult however to play on a DD AF off a road upset, in altitude and in OT that has allowed both Eastern Wash and Utah to outgain them by all'g the pair to avg 582 ypg. The Aztecs are off a bye and get an extra week to stew over an Ohio ST loss that was over at HT (trailed 35-0) the week after allowing 533 yds and losing to Eastern Ill 40-19. The offense should look much different however as Adam Muema off a 1,400 (6.1) season will finally be 100% (ankle inj) after having only 13 att TY. The bye also gave bkp QB Kaehler more practice reps as he was 22-36-216-1-1 filling in the ineffective Dingwell vs OSU. OSU RB Woods who has 300+ all-ppr yds is also doubtful for this gm.

LSU by 17 over Auburn - The home team has covered 4 straight with the LSU D holding Auburn to only 10 ppg and 216 ypg the L2Y. Last week Auburn found themselves down by 3 with 4:14 left at their own 12. We all saw Nick Marshall become a leader hitting 6-8 during an 88/11pl GW drive and a td with :10 left. At LSU, Les Miles has told us for the last decade he's found a QB and the offense will be potent, but this time the "Mad Hatter" looks to be correct thanks to new OC Cameron. Mettenberger was only 16-32 vs TCU and while he played a pair of stat padders the L2W his 66% completion rate are something not often seen here as is his 9-0 ratio. LSU now has the slight situational edge with this being their SEC opener while Auburn left it all on the table vs Miss St LW (LSU does have UGA on deck). LSU's conf HF record is well documented (7-18-1 ATS) but it must be noted that in 4 of the L5Y they've avg under 26.5 ppg vs SEC foes which will change TY.

UTEP by 1 over Utsa - First meeting and first CUSA gm for Utsa. The Miners got the inaugural win for HC Kugler and while it was by 21 points it was far from impressive. UTEP rushed for just 49 yds (2.2) in the 1H leading 21-14 but wore out a NMST team in the 2H that was off B2B very physical BCS foes. Also keep in mind that their first 2 foes have avg'd 2.1 wins/yr the L/4. Utsa is traveling for the 3rd time in 4 weeks and versus their common foe, N Mex, the Roadrunners won on the road with a 394-277 edge while the Miners lost at home getting outgained 483-399. LY Utsa's 8-4 SU and 5-1 ATS records on the road was discounted due to playing only one team with a winning record (La Tech), but that's not the case TY. HC Coker has his team believing as they just faced Okl St and Arizona and outFD'd OSU and only got outgained vs UA on the road by 43 yards although some of those were gbg yds. Tough to lay pts w/UTEP who is 0-4-1 ATS as a HF and this one goes down to the wire.

INDIANA by 1 over Missouri - Nice to see a different attitude in Bloomington recovering from an upset home loss and finishing with a new 3 game school record of 150 pts. While BG is far from an offensive power it was the first time since '08 that the Hoosiers D held their foe without an off td. Comparing opponents isn't often relative but in this case it is. Missouri was #86 in pass eff D LY and they now face a premier pass off that just dismantled a BG D that was #18 LY with all 9 def starters back incl all 4 DB's. BG HC Clawson said the WR's were uncovered and their QB was a "stud" (Sudfeld avg 306 ypg, 70% w/a 10-2 ratio) but what make this offense so potent is a new found rush attack which saw 2 players top 100 yds with dynamic soph Tevin Coleman avg 8.1 ypc with 5 td's. Tigers are off bye and a comfortable 38-23 win vs Toledo but a closer look shows they were outgained, were +2 in TO's and were only up 24-23 in the 3Q. Have to fade an AF in their 1st road game that has been a BCS AF only once in 2+ seasons and lost that outright.

UCLA by 42 over New Mexico St - 1st meeting. UCLA's 2Q deficit at Nebraska can be explained by an 8 am local start as well as the emotion of a fallen teammate. After totaling 95 yards their first 5 drives they finished with 504 yds scoring 38 unanswered. LY after again upsetting the Huskers, the Bruins hosted Houston winning 37-6 (-17). Under new HC Martin the Aggies have been far more competitive on offense avg 367 ypg incl a pair of BCS foes but on defense they still lack the strength to stop the run. NMST is allowing 331 ypg and 7.0 ypc and now must take on the #15 rush attack of UCLA with a mobile QB who has not even been forced to run much this season. Part of the reason that NMST is 5-20 as a 20+ point dog is that their efforts are put into winnable games which is what they have next week hosting San Diego St after a misleading winnable gm vs UTEP last week as they were tied at 21 before allowing the game's final 21 points.

4★ Green Bay by 11 over CINCINNATI - The Bengals had LW's MNF game circled vs the Steelers and either have beaten them at home for the first time in 4 tries or are already 0-2 this season. Cincy opened last Sunday as a 1 pt fav (5-13-1 ATS as HF) which will give the Packers some bulletin board material and if they stay one put them in a 17-8-1 ATS category. The Packers and Rodgers are already in midseason form and while they lost at SF the 28 points they put up is the most that SF has allowed in the reg ssn the last 20 games. LW after RB Lacy was nicked up James Starks stepped in rushing for 132 (6.6) opening the passing lane allowing GB to be the first ever with a duo of 125+ rushing and 450+ passing (Rodgers 480, 65%, 4-0). Better offense, better defense and better situation makes this a best bet.

3★ Atlanta by 9 over MIAMI - The Dolphins won 2 road games LY and have already matched that total. After knocking off Cleveland with high priced FA Wallace having only 1 rec he caught 9 for 115 LW. Brian Hartline was 9-114 in the opener and Charles Clay also had 5-109 LW giving Miami 3 different 100 yd rec's. The Fans did what you have to do to win on the road committing no TO's in the opener and playing penalty free LW. Atlanta's first 2 games have gone as we expected. After a loss to NO they moved to 19-4 ATS off a SU loss under HC Smith. The Falcons D went to a prevent in the 3Q leading 24-3 and w/out 3 def D starters in the 2H, allowing 3 long td drives (74/6pl, 75/8 & 80/16). Atlanta also was w/out RB Jackson who was banged up after 3 att's but Julio Jones carried them with 11 rec for 182 yds. Don't mind backing an AF that is that is 17-8 ATS away vs non-div teams with talent far superior to what Miami has faced.

OTHER SELECTION

2★ NY Giants by 7 over CAROLINA - The Panthers saw a 7-6 4Q lead fade in their opener and were 2 sec away from a win at Buffalo. The Giants join them at 0-2 thanks to an 8-2 TO deficit before B2B huge TV crowds. NY is now in their preferred role with their backs to the wall but not completely thanks to the noncompetitive balance of the division. The Giants are 8-4 ATS as an AD the last 2+ years and including LY here in a 36-7 win as the Panthers were gracious hosts finishing -5 in TO's. After B2B games with both mental and physical mistakes you can expect Coughlin to demand improvement. The reliable and veteran Manning will carry this team and lead the way vs a weak secondary.

OTHER GAMES

Kansas City at PHILADELPHIA - After running 52 plays in the 1H of their opener you might be shocked by Philly running only 59 LW but it was for an amazing 8.7 yds/play. Unfortunately for Eagle fans the same D that allowed 307 yds, 22 FD's and 20 pts in the SECOND HALF vs Washington vs SD 539 yds, 33 FD's and 33 points. Much will be made of Reid's returns to Philly after his firing but he does have the edge of knowing these players and their tendencies. KC has now matched LY's win total thanks to QB Smith (4-0 ratio) and B2B turnover free games. The Chiefs D pitched a shutout vs Jacksonville and allowed one td to Dallas (55 yd drive) but how will they handle this pace? **GRAB THIS THURSDAY NIGHT MARQUEE FOR JUST \$12 OR BUY A MARQUEE 7-PACK FOR ONLY \$29 WITH ANY LATE PHONE PACKAGE (see page 8).**

TENNESSEE by 6 over San Diego - Very good situation for TEN at home off a short road trip vs SD off a brutal MNF loss, and B2B long road trips. Philip Rivers took advantage of the Eagles missing their starting CB and shook off the media beating he took after their Monday Night opening loss throwing for 419 yds (77%, 3-0) in the upset of Philly. Eddie Royal caught 23 passes with 1 td LY and was never 100% but he is clearly the new go to guy with 3 td rec LW and 5 on the year. The Titans will surely be disappointed blowing a 24-16 lead with 2:00 to go but starting the season 1-1 after playing B2B road games vs LY's #1 and #7 D's shows their toughness. Locker did struggle LW (148 yds, 57%) but still had a 2-0 ratio and now gets some home cooking versus a D that allowed 480 ypg and 70% completions as well as a combined 5-1 ratio.

MINNESOTA by 4 over Cleveland - LY vs a Ray Horton defense RB Peterson stormed for 153 yds (6.7) yds on the ground. While CLE's offense is lacking (18 drives w/o a TD) the defense is stout holding foes to 119 total yds rush (2.0) in the 1st games. While MIN put up 30 pts LW 14 came off a 105 yd KR/61 yd fmb1 return and on 3 drives to the CHI 10 they settled for FG's as Ponder was 2-5 for 21 yds in the red zone. CLE gets WR Gordon back here and his ability as a deep threat should open up the run game for Richardson. MIN is only 3-8 ATS as a fav and we'll call for the home team by 4 as we aren't sold on Ponder vs an embarrassed visitor getting a key weapon back.

NEW ENGLAND by 10 over Tampa Bay - You won't find a more fired-up QB in the league after a 2-0 start than Tom Brady. His post game press conference was typical of a 3 td loss as he led his team to 232 yds and 9 FD's while Geno Smith led the Jets to 318 yds and 15 FD's. NE was without Amendola (out at least 4 wk) forcing Brady to almost exclusively go to his only trusted rec Edelman (13 of 16 rec). One definite edge NE does have is having played TB in the pre-season each of the L2Y and having dual practices give Belichick extra insight and prep time. Tampa Bay has had a rough start being TWO SECONDS AWAY from being 2-0 with a late loss to the Jets then losing to the Saints on the final play. Now they make a second trip to the Northeast in 3 weeks with a beleaguered QB who despite being a captain LY was not voted one TY. One edge the Buc's do have to their top off season pickup is available and if Revis Island can stop Edelman it limits NE's options.

Houston by 6 over BALTIMORE - This is the 5th meeting in 4 years with Houston dropping both their reg ssn and playoff game here in 2011. The Texans have come from behind each of the L2W but on the stat sheet they dominated with a combined 51-28 FD edge and a 901-511 yard edge. The Texans D has held Tennessee with Johnson and SD with Matthews to under 100 ypg and 3.8 ypc making it more difficult on Flacco who struggled LW after Rice (36, 2.8) was inj'd. Houston's defensive numbers were all w/out former Raven Ed Reed. The Ravens offense struggled vs Cleveland LW totaling just 296 yds and 14 points and after facing Denver week #1 will be challenged with a legitimate rush attack with the Texans now using both Tate (7-93) and Foster (19-79). Add in another offensive weapon as rookie Hopkins stepped in for an inj'd Johnson and caught a 3&10, 25 yd rec in OT as well as the game winner finishing 7-117. Houston's won 11 of 14 away game outright so no issues with this short number.

DALLAS by 6 over St Louis - The situation may lean w/DAL getting STL off a road loss vs ATL but the reality is that they are 7-21-1 ATS as a fav due to the public index. DAL fans may be upset w/ LW's loss due to a pair of fumbles that gave KC the FG for the margin but honestly their transition to a 4-3 front hasn't been that bad. Yes they've given up 42% on 3rd Dns but that's been vs an elite QB in the 1st game and an above avg QB w/an elite RB on the road. They now get an avg QB (7.0 ypa 5-2 ratio) w/a below avg skill group to work with (68 ypg rush 3.2). Yes, Bradford has yet to be sacked but that's vs ARZ w/a retooled defense and an ATL unit w/only 1 legit pass rusher (Umenyiora). DAL has Ware, an underrated LB unit and what should be a rowdy home crowd and simply a better offensive unit to back here.

New Orleans by 14 over Arizona - Situation favors NO back at home (18-6-1 ATS hosting NDIV) on turf vs an ARZ team coming cross country off a close loss to a div foe in Wk 1 followed by their 1st win for HC Ariens. This is also a bad matchup for ARZ with Brees (57-15 ratio L17 home games) vs a rebuilt ARZ secondary with a rookie nickel BD (Mathieu) and a less than impressive pass rush (1 sk in 74 pass att's). ARZ also comes in with Fitzgerald (hamstring) at less than 100% and while a bit better than LY they've only gained 3.3 and 3.5 ypc on the ground. While NO didn't get into a rhythm LW due to a weather delay of over an hour on a sloppy field we really like the matchup of a healthy TE Graham (224 yds 16.0) at home vs ARZ's slower LB's and inexperienced secondary.

Detroit by 3 over WASHINGTON - The situation favors WAS at home vs a DET team off a long trip to ARZ w/CHI and GB on deck. WAS however is a lousy 2-10 as a NDIV HF and they have been mauled in both 1H's TY getting outgained 695-230 and out/DF 38-8. The enthusiasm is fading quickly with their 0-2 start and while they're game planning to protect RGIII by not running the ball (4 att 1 yd LW) keeping him in the pocket has proved more detrimental (4 sks, 12 qbh). LW the Lions DT Fairley was a late scratch making all the difference in allowing the Cardinals 348 yards while totaling only 1 sack. The Lions are 6-3-1 as a non-div AD and excluding LY's run away season, the Lions have gone 6-1-3 when the line is between +/-3.

NY JETS by 6 over Buffalo - This pair of rookies may be the new wave of AFC East QB's and Manuel is up one win to start their NFL careers ('09 Gator Bowl 33-21). Credit this young Bills team (#30 exp) with rookie HC Marrone as after losing to NE with 5 sec on the clock they went 80/99 this time scoring with :06 left to beat the Panthers. However, now Manuel and the Bills travel for their road opener vs a Rex Ryan D that will not be shy about blitzing. NY had 3 sks vs Freeman in their opener while Buffalo allowed their QB to get sacked 6 times vs Carolina and an outrageous 9 qbh. The Jets were fortunate in week 1 thanks to a bone headed TB penalty but despite that as well as a close loss at NE it had to give them confidence. The defense is playing up to their coached preseason goals and have allowed their first 2 opponents (LY's #9 & #1 off) 241 ypg & 10.5 FD's per game.

SAN FRANCISCO by 16 over Indianapolis - The Colts were outgained by 12 ypg LY yet still managed 11 wins and a playoff berth. This year they started in the same fashion getting outgained vs Oakland (372-274) but pulling out a win but that magic stopped LW. Luck was just 8-16 for 80 yds in the 2H making very poor decisions under decent pressure. Speaking of pressure LY when the Colts took to the road and were sacked 3 or more times Luck avg'd 17 ppg and was 73-147 (49.7%). San Fran is off a massive game but they have a decent defense (#3 & #4 L2Y) which gets even nastier if off a loss. The 49ers are 5-0-1 ATS not resting starters after tasting defeat and LY allowed 221 ypg and 12.5 FD's/gm in that role. SF also prides itself protecting its home field demonstrated by their 9-1 ATS record as a non-div HF.

SEATTLE by 19 over Jacksonville - This is a massive letdown spot for SEA after facing Newton on the road in the opener, SF at home on SNF LW w/a set of 4 AG in 5 Wks starting w/HOU. JAX is on its 2nd str West Coast game but Bradley was SEA's DC for the L4Y. This could be SEA's biggest fav role s/'05 and 2 TD+ non-conf HF's are on a 6-1 ATS run (last SU loss at end of '92). The Jag's went to Henne LW and while only facing OAK the teams only td came on a 49 yd drive with under 3:00 left. We'll pass as this line should very well balloon but NFL favorites of 17+ are 6-20-1 ATS s/'92.

Chicago at PITTSBURGH - Tough to make this call with the Steelers off Sunday Night. After being embarrassed in week #1 by totalling 195 yards and 9 points they played the blitz happy Bengals without All-Pro C Pouncey (IR). Chicago is off a comeback win. Jay Cutler and his 19-14 ratio of LY was the 'perfect fit' for new HC Trestman's offense. With quick reads and getting the ball away quickly the ratio was going to improve but after 2 weeks it stands at 5-3 now taking on the Steelers D in Heinz Field. Can't fade Pittsburgh too quickly as they are 7-0 ATS as a HD since 2000!
