POST DRAFT "A" & "D" GRADES HITTING 82% OVER 3 YEARS!

The Post Draft Issue grades a team's offseason a little differently than most. The grades we put into Power Sweep predict whether a team's record will improve or decline for the upcoming season. We take EVERYTHING into account. Included in the analysis are coaching changes, the NFL Draft, Free Agent signings, Free Agent losses and even favorable or unfavorable schedules. The "A" & "D" grades have been extremely accurate over the years.

We spend a great deal of time and effort making these grades and while there was no list in '11 (work stoppage), here is a recap of the past 19 years as well as '09, '10, '12 and '13.

Last year we released a total of 8 teams which earned either an "A" or "D" grade. 7 of the 8 teams were correct including the 4 "A" teams all improving their record by an avg of 5.5 wins. This included KC (+9) and PHI (+6) who were the 2 most improved teams in the NFL LY. The 4 "D" teams went 3-0-1 incl ATL (-9) and MIN (-5.5). The only blemish in LY's article was IND whose last 3 wins came against HOU and JAX who both gave up playing at the end of yr while going for the #1 pick in the draft. They also beat a KC tm who already had a playoff berth clinched at the time of the game. Those last 3 wins allowed them to match their record from the year before.

These "A" and "D" are a huge help in determining which teams to bet on using the Vegas Over/Under season total. This year on every division page, you can see a last 3 year number for the Vegas Over/Under for each team. The Cincinnati Bengals actually lead the way as they have went "Over" their Vegas win total each of the last 3 years by a combined 8 wins.

NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS.....GRADE: C+

OFFENSE 385 ypg (#7) Patriots: +11.4 ypg (#13) DEFENSE 373 ypg (#10)
 SCORING 27.8 ppg (#2) +9 TO's +6.6 ppg (#8) SCORING 21.1 ppg (#20)

Offense: NE continues to reload with both a combination of youth and a wise selection of FA's to fill the holes. The addition of Brandon LaFell doesn't address their WR issues though. NE does lose their #2 rusher but add in a 4th rounder to go along with 2 others. Garoppolo gives the team depth options for 2015 even with Brady being an effective QB. Grade: EVEN

Defense: NE upgraded at CB by bringing in Revis at a manageable cap salary with Talib going to DEN. They added depth in FA as they added another pair of S's (18 comb sts in '13) for LY's #26 defense. 1st round pick Easley will shore up a DL that is beginning to show it's age. Grade: EVEN

Overview: It's been 9 yrs since the Patriots won a SB but the fact remains that they are still one of the elite squads in the NFL. The fact they earned 12 wins LY with a bad WR unit and their injuries on defense shows the strength of the Brady/Belichick tandem. This is a better team with the return of the players who were on the 2013 IR list as they seize the AFC East crown again.

MIAMI DOLPHINS.....GRADE: C+

OFFENSE 313 ypg (#27) Dolphins: -46.4 ypg (#28) DEFENSE 359 ypg (#8)
 SCORING 19.8 ppg (#26) -2 TO's -1.1 ppg (#18) SCORING 20.9 ppg (#8)

Offense: After the turmoil caused by the OL situation a year ago, the Dolphins addressed the issues this offsn with the signing of a solid FA LT and the drafting of 2 more OL in the 1st 3 rounds of the Draft. They also added a proven RB in FA and took one of the most sure-handed WR's in TY's Draft. MIA's offense looks promising in 2014 but they have 5 new starters likely. Grade: EVEN

Defense: Despite the loss of 3 starters from a year ago in FA, MIA appears to have canceled out those losses with some solid FA acquisitions of their own including CB Finegan. The 2014 Draft was used to add some late picks to the unit who will likely serve as special teamers during their rookie campaigns. Grade: EVEN

Overview: MIA started off with a 3-0 mark but a tougher schedule along with off-the-field issues saw them finish with just a 5-8 mark the rest of the way. The Dolphins did a good job addressing major needs while adding OL help early in the Draft. They are installing a Chip Kelly style offense TY but should come close to the .500 mark again.

NEW YORK JETS.....GRADE: B-

OFFENSE 318 ypg (#25) Jets: -16.8 ypg (#21) DEFENSE 335 ypg (#19)
 SCORING 18.1 ppg (#29) -14 TO's -6.1 ppg (#26) SCORING 24.2 ppg (#19)

Offense: The Jets made a splash in FA on the offensive side with the addition of some big names. There are some question marks as QB Vick is now a reluctant backup, RB Johnson has avg'd just 1,183 a ssn since his 2K effort in '09 and WR Decker will be the #1 receiving option for the 1st time in his career. The Jets lacked consistency on this side of the ball LY and they also added 3 WR's & a TE in the Draft to help bolster the 31st ranked pass off (183 ypg) in 2013. Grade: EVEN

Defense: Rex Ryan is a defensive guru so you know that this unit will always be a big portion to the tm's overall success. Changes in the secondary are the biggest factor for what used to be a team strength. The Jets allowed a pair of veterans to leave while spending the 1st Rnd pick on an in-the-box safety and a 3rd rounder who could be a starter on opening day at CB. Grade: EVEN

Overview: After some surprising playoff runs early in the Rex Ryan era, the team has struggled to get anything going consistently over the past 3 yrs. The Jets are looking to stabilize both sides of the ball and 2014 will come down to Geno Smith's growth in a run oriented system.

BUFFALO BILLS.....GRADE: C

OFFENSE 338 ypg (#19) Bills: +4.8 ypg (#16) DEFENSE 333 ypg (#20)
 SCORING 21.2 ppg (#22) +3 TO's -3.1 ppg (#22) SCORING 24.3 ppg (#19)

Offense: The Bills traded a 1st, 4th and 5th to CLE for the best WR in Sammy Watkins. They also used a 2nd Rnd pick to help bolster an OL that allowed 48 sks with a trio of QB's starting. The rest of the offense remains virtually the same under 2nd yr QB Manuel who must step up with the weapons that he has at his disposal (Bills 28th in passing a yr ago). Grade: EVEN

Defense: While the Bills lost a trio of starters in FA they added LB depth by signing a pair that comb for 19 sts in 2013 (also added a 3rd Rnd LB in the Draft). The secondary is the biggest question mark heading into '14 despite finishing #4 LY in pass def (204 ypg). The loss of FS Byrd and the uncertain status of DT Dareus for his off-the-field issues means that this unit may take a dip in 2014. Grade: EVEN

Overview: The Bills were extremely aggressive 2 years ago in FA and were equally aggressive in TY's Draft by trading up to #4 overall. With NE continuing to sit at the top of the hill in the AFC East and a new owner expected by mid-season, the Bills have a challenging 2014 ahead of them.
