## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ KENTUCKY over Ohio** - These 2 have not met s/04 but OU did upset them 28-16 as a 13' pt dog in '04. UK is 3-2 in the series and 12-1 SU s/06 hosting non-conf (FBS tms minus UL). OU HC Solich is just 4-7-1 ATS as a AD vs BCS conf. LW the Wildcats crushed UT-Martin 59-14 (-21) as they piled up 656 yds, the 4th most in school history. QB Towles was 20-29-377-1-0 and the D forced 5 TO's and didn't allow a score until the 4Q. Ohio, meanwhile got revenge for LY as they beat Kent St 17-14 (+1) thanks to a 44-yd FG on the final play. They did have a 437-295 yd edge. UK needs every win it can get during the season and unlike some teams, does not overlook its MAC opp's. Since '07, they have ply'd 6 MAC tms going a perfect 6-0 SU and ATS covering by an avg of 18 ppg. Two years ago they took on a solid Kent St team which finished 11-3 and beat them 47-14 (-6). While we respect the job Solich has done at OU, this does not look like one of his better tms while thanks to one of the best recruiting classes in schl history, the Wildcats program is on the rise and they will show it here. **FORECAST: KENTUCKY by 17**

**3★ ARMY over Buffalo** - Army is 1-2 SU. In the L/gm ('08) Army led 24-10 into 4Q. UB forced OT after an Army fmb1 w/4:19 left. In OT Army missed a fg while UB hit a 34 yd'r. LTH ('01) UB won (+15) 26-19 in just their 3rd ssn in the FBS. UB led 15-0 at HT but trailed 19-18 w/14:17 left. UB went 80/13pl for a GW td 5:05 later. The Bulls are 2-14 SU in road openers but they have covered 7 of their L/10. LW they found themselves down 28-24 to lowly Duquesne in the 4Q before rallying 38-28 (-26). QB Licata hit 25-36-298-3-1 while RB Anthonie Taylor had 115 (3.8) as UB had 26-18 FD and 472-373 yd edges. Keep in mind though, Duquesne is a poor FCS schl that just started offering scholarships a couple of yrs ago. Army is just 3-14 SU in home openers and they have failed to cover 8 of their L/10. However, the Black Knights have a new HC in Jeff Monken who inherits 16 st'r's (most s/04) and this is the Knights only HG of the 1st 5 wks of the ssn so look for them to give an all-out effort. None of these UB players have played against the option in their college careers and w/o LB Khalil Mack off to the NFL, look for Army and their stable of backs (6,002 career rush yds) to take advantage. **FORECAST: ARMY by 10**

**3★ NORTHWESTERN over Northern Illinois** - NU is 6-0-1 vs NIU (all gms in Evanston). In the L/gm ('05) both tms had DD leads at one point. Tied 31-31, NU went 82/6pl to go up 7 w/1:02 left. NIU responded with a 19 yd td pass w/0:06 but elected to go for 2pt (ng) and lost 38-37 (+2). NIU is 4-21 SU s/89 in road openers but have won L/2 incl LY at Big Ten foe Iowa (30-27, +3). The Huskies started off the post-Jordan Lynch era in style as they are off a 55-3 win (-39) over Presbyterian as they had 36-6 FD and 635-127 yd edges. They split the QB reps between Matt McIntosh (1H) and Drew Hare (2H) as they combined for 18-27-187-2-0 but they don't have the rushing ability that Lynch offered. NW is coming off a disappointing 31-24 loss (-10) to Cal as the Bears snapped a 16-game losing streak to FBS opp. NW actually trailed 31-7 in the 3Q before mounting a comeback that saw them with the ball at the Cal27 before a late int sealed the loss. We won't overreact to what we saw in Wk 1 and we think we will see more of the NW tm that showed up in the last 20 min of the gm LW as the Wildcats desperately need a win and have a bye and W Car on deck. **FORECAST: NORTHWESTERN by 10**

## OTHER SELECTIONS

**2★ Louisiana Tech (+) over LOUISIANA** - 86th instate meeting between these two rivals who are 180 miles apart. LT has won 6 str by 30 ppg incl a 34-3 win (-4) the LTH ('03). LT led 10-0 into the 2Q and built a 24 pt HT lead outgaining ULL 449-292 (forced 3 TO's). They are 4-2 ATS in their streak but failed to cover in the last meeting ('04) in a 24-20 win (-14). This is only the 2nd time s/90 UL-Ls opened with B2B home gms. LW they beat Southern 45-6 (-30) as they had 28-14 FD and 512-279 yd edges. On the other side, La Tech got the backdoor cover vs OU LW in a 48-16 loss (+35) as lowa trans QB Cody Sokol hit a 22-yd td pass with :37 left. Even with the loss, the Bulldogs are a much improved team TY and figure to play with a chip on their shoulder considering they find themselves nearly 2 td dog to a rival that plays in a weaker conference. **FORECAST: LOUISIANA by 6**

**2★ BOISE ST over Colorado St** - BS has won all 3 meetings SU (2-1 ATS) winning by an avg of 49-19 and have won 12 str Bronco Stadium openers (5-7 ATS). LTH BS (-28) jumped out to a 35-0 HT lead. CSU, trailing 42-0, got a td in the 3Q and another w/4:09 left for the backdoor cover, 42-14. BS had a 503-229 yd edge. LY BS (-7) was on the road and Grant Hedrick hit 19-27-305 w/5 td's. CST QB Grayson hit 36-53-397. CSU led 17-14 with 6:20 left in the half but BS got a 68 yd td pass. Then after a fmb1, BS went 67/15 for a td w/1:08 left and CSU had a 47 yd fg bounce off the crossbar on the last play as BS led 28-17. It was 35-17 after 3Q's and BS led 42-17 when CSU went 93/13, 65/9 for 4Q td's. BS is coming off a misleading 35-13 (+10) loss to Ole Miss in Atlanta despite having a 26-22 FD edge. The gm was just 7-6 after 3Q's. QB Hedrick threw 4 int's after throwing just 5 all of last season (242 att's) and they failed to take adv of some early Ole Miss miscues. CSU is off a come-from-behind 31-17 (+2) win over rival Colorado which they scored 17 4Q pts to pull away (trailed 17-7). We did easily cash a 2★ on these pages on the UNDER. Bama trans RB Hart led the way with 139 rush yds and 2 td's. The Wildcats led 38-6 with 13:57 left but SA got a 75/10pl drive for a td with 9:39 left and then got to the AZ24 to end the gm. LTH ('10 Alamo Bowl), UA lost 36-10 (+4) vs Okla St. UA is 2-10 SU/3-9 ATS in road openers but is 2-2 SU/ATS in the L4Y. The Roadrunners are 2-1 in home openers and while they covered vs Okla St LY in a 56-35 (+24) loss, they did score a couple of late gbg td's. ### Saturday, September 6th

**ALABAMA by 45 over Florida Atlantic** - The Crimson Tide won the only prior meeting in '12, 40-7 (-49). UA scored on its 1st 6 poss and led 40-0 before a garbage td w/2:49 left. The last time UA lost a Tuscaloosa opener was in '01 vs #17 UCLA 20-17 (+2) but they are just 2-6 ATS their L/8. LW was a sluggish start for the #2 Crimson Tide as they beat WV 33-23 (-25). QB Blake Sims surprisingly took all the snaps (24-33-250-0-1) but arguably even more surprising was the struggles of the Bama defense that all'd 393 yds while the ST's gave up a 100-yd KR td. The 365 pass yds allowed to WV were the 2nd most in the Saban era and WV had 17 completions of 10 yds or more. The Owls are routinely a play-on tm as a large away dog as they were 11-2 ATS prior to LW. However, TY they have a new HC in Charlie Partridge and were destroyed by Neb 55-7 (+21) as they were outFD'd 35-13 and outgained 784-200. Their QB Jacquez Johnson was inj'd in the 2H (shld'r) and is ? here. Bama has posted winning ATS records each of the L/4 yrs as 20+ fav (18-11 ATS) and after a sub-par opener LW, they will want to put the hammer down in front of the home crowd.

**Kansas St by 10 over IOWA ST** - KS is now 17-3 SU in this series (12-7-1 ATS). In the 4Y prior to LY, KSU was a perfect 5-0 SU but all 5 were close with wins by 8, 1, 7, 6 and 6 and they were just 2-2-1 ATS. LY that history of close games changed. KSU was -17 at home and almost had their first shutout of a B12 foe s/03 when they beat Iowa St 45-0. KSU led 17-0 at half and it was 41-0 when KSU fumbled at their own 10 w/3:38 left and ISU avoided the shutout with a td. The Wildcats are off a 55-16 win (-40) over SFA as they had 29-14 FD and 478-294 yd edges. They are just 5-12-1 ATS as an AF and figure to be a large one here as the Cyclones are off a 34-14 loss (-3) to FCS NDSt as they were outscored 34-0 in the final 44 min and for the gm were outgained 503-253. QB Sam Richardson was only 20-31-151-0-2. While the Cyclones are just 1-7 ATS as a DD dog, they have a history of pulling off upsets at windy Jack-Trice stadium and keep in mind Kansas St has that huge home gm vs Aub looming.

**Smu at NORTHTEXAS** - The series is the longest running in NT history. SMU leads 28-4-1, but UNT has won both games played in Denton, including a, a 24-6 win (+5) in 2006. NT lost 45-31 (+17) in the L/gm ('07) but they broke a single gm rec for tll off (613) and the game was tied 31-31 mid-4Q. This will be a 11:00 am local start time but NT fans will be able to buy beer in Apogee Stadium (12-5 SU/11-6 ATS overall here) TY for 1st time. The Mean Green are off a 38-7 loss (+26) to Texas as they struggled mightily on offense with just 8 FD's while their QB's combined for just 3-17-15-0-4. SMU is coming off their 1st losing ssn s/08 and it should be noted that HC June Jones has never had B2B losing seasons. These tms look evenly matched and considering it is unknown at presstime how SMU fared in their opener at Baylor, we'll pass until we see a line on this game later in the week. **IOWA by 14 over Ball St** - Iowa is 2-0 SU/ATS outscoring BSU 101-0 (+374 ypg). In the L/gm ('10) the Hawkeyes won 45-0 (-28) all'g just 56 pass yds and 2 comp passes. BSU didn't cross midfield till the 3Q and never ran a play in the UI redzone. BSU is 2-16 SU incl 5 str losses by 16 ppg in road openers but they are on a 6-2 ATS run. The Cardinals are off a 30-10 win (-27) over Colgate as they had 29-9 FD and 514-227 yd edges. New QB Ozzie Mann was 20-32-203-2-1 but the Cards focused on the run gm as they piled up 311 yds led by their solid 1-2 punch of Horacio Banks and Jahwan Edwards who both topped 100 yds. The Hawkeyes are off a 31-23 (-16) win over N Iowa. While they had a 26-13 FD edge, they gave up several big plays in the pass gm all'g 380 yds in just 17 comp (22.3 ypc). While on the flip side, QB Jake Rudock was 31 of 41 but for only 250 yds (8.1 ypc). Tough to lay a lot of pts here considering Ball St is 25-8 ATS s/06 as an AD and Iowa is just 12-24 ATS as a DD fav.

**PURDUE by 3 over Central Michigan** - PU is 5-0 in the series and won the L/gm 32-25 (-10) in '08. PU all'd a 53/6pl td drive (2pt) to trail 25-24 w/1:18 left. After a 39 yd KR +pen, PU got a 46 yd td run on the gm's next play and then int'd CM at the PU15 w/:28 left. This marks the 17th str ssn CM plays at least one B10 tm (3-19 SU in that span) but they have won 2 of their L/5 gms outright. The Chippewas are 3-14 s/97 in road openers but have split their L/10 ATS. They do have a couple of extra days of prep for this one as they are coming off a 20-16 win (-12) over Chattanooga. The Chips found themselves down 16-0 in the 2Q before scoring 20 unanswered pts. They did benefit from 4 Moc int's incl 2 in the 4Q. Cooper Rush was 15-26-173-2-0 and Mich trans RB Thomas Rawls had 121 (4.8). However, the win could be costly as their All-MAC WR Titus Davis who had 1,109 yds LY is doubtful here (knee sprain). After 12 str losses to FBS foes, the Boilers beat W Mich LW 43-34 (-8). While they were outFD'd 24-22 and outgained 456-407, they did lead most of the gm. QB Danny Etling was 19-38-181-2-0 but the star was RB Raheem Mostert who had 146 rush (6.6). CM is 3-11 ATS as an AD and after a 1-11 ssn, Purdue needs all the wins they can get.

**Navy by 1 over TEMPLE** - Navy has played here 12 times in 13Y. LTH vs TU came in '07 and the Midshipmen won 30-19 (-21). Navy is 7-3 SU/ATS in 'true' road openers. TU won the L/gm in '09 27-24 (+7) snapping 4 str series losses. The gm had 6 lead changes. TU down 24-20 got the GW 41 yd td run w/2:41 left and the Owls outruined Navy 274-227 despite 28 less att. TU is 3-8 SU in home openers (3 W's vs FCS) but have covered 5 of their L/6. This could be a flat spot for both tms as it was obvious Navy came out with everything they had for OSU LW (led 14-13 late 3Q). After some questionable play-calling from Urban Meyer and Co, the Bucks finally took adv of a weak Navy pass D and pulled away late cashing our Early Bird POW (given out FREE every Monday on Button #9 at 347-677-1700). Navy did impress us though with their 370 rush yds (5.9) vs one of the better DL's in the country. On the other side, Temple will be getting slaps on their backs all week after their 37-7 (+13) upset win over Vandy giving them their 1st win over an SEC opp s/1938. The gm was delayed by lightning and did not get over until 2:14 am ET time. After notching just 3 total int a yr ago, the Owls had 3 in the gm while forcing 7 total TO's (just 13 LY) and got 27 pts off those. It should be noted that the Owls did face the Army option LY and dominated 33-14 (E) as they allowed a respectable 4.4 rush ypc. Tough to go against Temple QB Walker as he is now 8-1 ATS and we'll gladly take the pts.

**Arkansas St at TENNESSEE** - Only prior meeting was in '07, a 48-27 (-19) UT win as the Vols had 30-17 FD and 523-377 yd edges. Into '14, the Volunteers have won 11 str non-conf home gms but have gone just 1-5 ATS the L/2 yrs. LY the Red Wolves played both SEC tms that played in the conf champ (Aub & Mizzou) and while they lost by 26 ppg, they outFD both, 24-23 and 25-23. Ho-hum it's just another HC (5th in 5 yrs and 7th counting interims) and yet the Red Wolves continue to not miss a beat as LW we used them as a 3★ Small College LPS and they easily beat Montana St 37-10 (-9). They had 23-10 FD and 547-228 yd edges. Because it is unknown at presstime how the youthful Volunteers fared vs Utah St, we will wait until we see a line on this game until we make a forecast. **ILLINOIS by 10 over Western Kentucky** - First meeting. WKU is 1-12 SU in road openers (not incl neutral sites vs UK, only win at MT in 20T in '11). New HC Jeff Brohm prior served as Illinois QB cch from '10-'11. He had a wonderful debut as WKU destroyed last year's MAC champ BG 59-31 (+6). QB Brandon Doughty threw for a schl-rec 569 yds and was 46-56 with 6 td's as the Hilltoppers had a schl-rec 702 total yds and a FBS schl-rec for most pts. It was not that great of a start for Illinois but new QB Wes Lunt did engineer three 4Q td's in Illinois' 28-17 (-12') win over Youngstown St. Lunt finished with 24-38-285-4-0 after the Illinois offense managed just 7 FD's in the 1H and clung to a 7-6 lead. There is always an overreaction to week 1 and while WKU looked great at home against a tm with a new HC and new systems, travelling to B10 country against a coach that needs all the wins he can get will be a different story.

**MISSISSIPPI ST by 28 over Uab** - MSU is 4-1 SU (all gms after '04) but are just 1-4 ATS in the series. In the L/meeting ('11) the Bulldogs won 21-3 (-20). UAB led 3-0 at HT but in the 2H MSU outgained the Blazers 318-159 forcing 2 TO's on the down 4 UAB poss. LTH ('10) UAB lost 29-24 (+20). The Blazers led the #24 Bulldogs 24-23 w/10:16 left. Down 2 UAB was forced to punt and down 5, UAB fmbled the KR w/1:40 (L/2 poss). UAB has lost 10 str road openers by 21 ppg and are 1-6 ATS their L/7. However, it was a great start to the Bill Clark era LW as they hammered Troy 48-10 (+1') with 25-15 FD and 490-272 yd edges that incl a dominating 338-71 rush yd edge. Speaking of domination, LW the Bulldogs romped S Miss 49-0 (-30). QB Dak Prescott threw for a career-high 284 yds and 4 td's as Miss St had 29-15 FD and 550-283 yd edges. Mullen usually puts the hammer down in these gms (13-6 ATS) and we'll call for a 4 td win.

**New Mexico St by 3 over GEORGIA ST** - First meeting for these new conf foes. LY the only common opp was Louisiana. Both tms lost by 14 pts but the Panthers were outgained by 1 yd at home while the Aggies had a 10 yd edge on the road. Both teams had extra time to prepare and are off FCS opp's after playing midweek games LW. NMSt has lost 15 in a row on the road (LY outscored 57-16 on road) and they are making a long trip to Georgia. GSt, however, had lost 13 in a row SU at home prior to LW's 38-37 win (-4) over FCS Abilene Christian. The win also snapped their 16-gm overall losing streak. Juco trans QB Nick Arbutkule hit 31-47-413-4-2 and the Panthers rallied to score 10 pts in the final 5 min incl a 26-yd FG w/0:4 left. The Aggies cashed a 3★ Small College LPS for us LW in their 28-10 win (+6') over Cal Poly as they had no business being a TD dog to a mediocre FCS tm that was just 6-6 LY. They had 21-14 FD and 355-265 yd edges as the star was RB Larry Rose III who had 149 (5.0). Both tms are in the 2nd year of the new HC's but NMSt has 13 ret st's and have been in the FBS for a long time. GSt has just 9 ret st's, the fewest in the Sun Belt and are in just their 2nd year coming from the FCS. Tough making NMSt a fav here, but we'll call for them to get the outright win on the road as GSt barely escaped a transitional FCS tm LW.

**Colorado by 17 over MASSACHUSETTS** - First meeting. This is the longest mainland road trip in Colorado history (26 miles longer than Miami, FL gms). CU did have their opener vs CST moved to Friday to give them an extra day for the travel. In that gm LW, the Buffs blew a 17-7 3Q lead and lost to their in-state rivals 31-17 (-2). QB Sefo Liufua was 24-39-241-2-0 but CU was outmatched at the LOS as they were outrushed 266-134. Speaking of getting dominated at the LOS, LW the Minutemen in new HC Mark Whipple's 2nd stint here were outgained by an incredible 302-0 in rush yds by mid-3Q. They would go on to lose 30-7 (+17) as new QB Blake Frohnappel hit just 9-22-147-1-1. Overall, BC had a 42:11-17:49 TOP edge and had 27-9 FD and 511-202 yd edges. While the rare trip to the East Coast and fact that the Buffs are in their 1st away favorite role since '10 concerns us, we think their HC MacIntyre will have them focused as they get a bounce back win.

**South Alabama by 1 over KENT ST** - LY was their first meeting and the situation greatly favored SA. KSU was a very banged up team and rested a few players for MAC Play in QB Reardon, DL Nix, P/K Melchiori and RB Durham. Surprisingly SA only had a 483-428 yd edge. Kent had just ply'd in the Godaddy Bowl at Labb Peebles stadium and was making a return trip. SA led 17-7 at the half and extended it to 38-14. SA was SOD at the KSU 15 w/1:38 left and KSU went 85/9 for a td with :04 left to only lose by 17. LTH ('11) SA (+10) trailed 25-0 at HT & 33-0 3Q but then scored 25 unanswered finishing with a 374-281 yd edge. KSU is 13-5 SU the L13Y hosting non-conf foes. LW the Golden Flashes playing with heavy hearts after seeing one of their st'g OL pass away 2 wks ago, lost 17-14 (-1') to Ohio as the Bobcats hit a 44-yd FG on the final play. QB Colin Reardon was 30-41-264-2-0 but they were outrushed 175-31 with RB Trayon Duham missing the gm with a foot inj (CS). After a 6-6 ssn, the Jags return 15 st's TY and look like a prime contender for the SBC crown. In a pick-em game, we'll go with the more exp'd road team.

**UTAH by 16 over Fresno St** - The home team has won the L/5 reg ssn gms. The L/meeting was the '99 Las Vegas Bowl. The Utes won 17-16 (-4') and they had a 548-279 yd edge as one of FSU's td's came on a blk'd fg ret (Utah GW fg w/5:03 left). FSU is 1-4 SU s/95 incl a 24-16 loss (+7') the LTH ('98). After LW's 52-13 (+20') loss to USC, FSU is now 2-9 SU in reg ssn non-conf road/neutral gms the L5Y. LW their D allowed an incredible 37 FD and 701 yds to USC's new high-tempo offense, while the Bulldogs found life with out Derek Carr difficult as Brian Burrell and Brandon Connette combined for just 18-36-160-0-4. We did cash our Top Weekly Totals LPS on the OVER despite the fact that neither team scored in the 4Q. Speaking of cashing plays, LW we cashed a Small College Top Opinion on the OVER in the Utah's 56-14 (-41') demolition of Idaho St. The Utes did benefit from a 46-yd PR td and 100-yd KR td while they also had 3 td drives lasting less than :42. Tough B2B road trip here for the Bulldogs as they now play in elevation and their poor QB play LW has us calling for their 2nd str DD loss on the Pac-12 road.

**STANFORD by 3 over USC** - SU had won 4 in a row SU in this series (3-1 ATS) but LY was -3' at USC with SU ranked #5 and USC unranked. SU was off their big win over Oregon and we used USC as a 3★ LPS at home. The gm was tied 17-17 after 3Q's but SU tossed two 4Q int's (both in USC territory) and the last set up USC's 47 yd GW fg w/19 left. LTH #2 USC (-7') led 14-7 3Q but were upset 21-14. After an unpleasant off-field week for the Trojans, the Steve Sarkisian era started off in style as the Trojans crushed Fresno St 52-13 (-20'). We easily cashed our 4★ Top Weekly Totals play on the OVER as we figured Sarkisian would run as many plays as possible. He even exceeded our expectations as they set the Pac-12 record with 105 plays while also accumulating 37 FD's and 701 total yds. Stanford, meanwhile, blanked UC Davis 45-0 (-42'). AA all-purp man Ty Montgomery had a 60-yd PR td to squash some injury concerns and the Cardinal D limited the Aggies to just 6 FD and 115 yds. Each of the L/4 meetings between these two have gone down to the wire and we look for more of the same here.

**PENN ST by 14 over Akron** - LY PSU ply'd 2 MAC teams and struggled vs each in the 1H or 3Q but then won big at the end, winning by a comb'd 79-7 (avg line -22'). PSU is 4-0 vs UA. In the L/gm ('09) the Nittany Lions won 31-7 (-29'). Penn St led 31-0 at HT outgaining the Zips 339-(-5)! Akron is 1-24 SU vs current Big Ten tms w/ the only win coming in 1894 vs Ohio St. LY they almost got their 2nd victory as they nearly upset Michigan losing 28-24 (-37') as the Wolverines got some home cooking from the referees late with the Zips incl the UM5 on the final play. Zips have dropped 20 str road openers by 28 ppg (L/win in '93 at CM 23-13) and are 1-3 ATS their L/4. PSU had a 10 gm home opener win streak snapped 2Y ago (still 20-3 SU) but are just 1-4 ATS their L/5. The Lions are off their trip to Ireland where they got a 26-24 (+2) win over a UCF thanks to 36 yd FG on the final play. PSt did have 24-11 FD and 511-246 yd edges as QB Christian Hackenberg became the

1st player in PSt history to throw for 400 yds (454). Akron is off a 41-0 (-21') win over Howard and is dangerous here as Bowden and his staff have big-time coaching exp and the Zips have some BCS trans. While Lions fans will be sky high for the Franklin home opener, the team maybe a lil jet lagged from the trip (see ND 2012) and we'll call for the Zips to make it interesting.

**FLORIDA by 42 over Eastern Michigan** - In the only prior gm ('04), the Gators beat the Eagles 49-10 (-37). From the 2:11 1Q mark till :56 left in the 3Q UF had scored 7 td's. EM was only outgained 409-296 (-3 FD) and actually led 3-0 till 2:11 1Q. The Eagles have dropped 15 str road openers by 26 ppg (5-10 ATS). UF is 12-1 SU vs the MAC w/the loss in 1973 vs Miami, Oh (Tangerine Bowl). The streak is still at 24 str ssn opening wins for the Gators after LW's gm vs Idaho was PPD due to poor weather and field conditions. They have failed to cover 4 of their L/5 openers incl each of their L/2 as we cashed our Underdog POW LY on these pages going against them in a 24-6 (-23) win over Toledo. LY was UF's worst ssn s/79 (0-10-1), however the following yr the Gators rebounded w/a 8-4 mark incl a bowl win and this year we feel they could easily do the same with 14 ret st's and a healthy QB Jeff Driskel. On the flip side, the Eagles barely broke thru in their 31-28 (-14) win over Morgan St LW in EC Creighton's debut. While, the Gators are 1-5 ATS as a 20+ pt fav under Will Muschamp EM is 9-21-1 ATS as a 20+ dog. The Gators should roll in this one.

**Mississippi by 21 over VANDERBILT** - This game was moved to LP Field (Vandy Field Turf while LP grass). This is part of Ssn ticket package for Vandy fans (7miles apart - Vandy Stadium to LP field). VU is actually 5-2 SU and 5-2 ATS in this series. LY it was the opening game of the season and then Vandy HC Franklin declared the game a blackout. Ole Miss had a 28-19 FD edge. VU led LY 28-17 late 3Q but UM was up 32-28 and VU got a td w/4:24 left. Jeff Scott got a 75 yd td run w/1:07 left to give UM the 4 pt win and they had a 489-426 yd edge. TY figures to be a different story as Franklin is now off to Penn St and LW in HC Mason's debut, the Dores lost 37-7 (-13') to Temple which had "Same Ol Vandy" becoming a popular Twitter trend as they had a uniform debacle, 7 TO's and a weather delay. Ole Miss QB Wallace was "Same Ol Inconsistent Bo" in the opener vs Boise as after throwing 3 int's in the 1H, he rebounded to throw 3 td's in the 4Q of a misleading 35-13 win (-10) as the Rebs were outFD'd 26-22. While Vandy has owned the series as of late, a new HC and an inexperienced squad could give Freeze and Co the opportunity here to put a rare beatdown on the Dores and we look for them to do so.

**NC STATE by 14 over Old Dominion** - First meeting. NCSt is 14-2 the L5Y at home vs non-conf tms and 8-7-1 ATS. After suffering thru 8 straight losses to close the 2013 season, it looked like HC Doeren's seat was going to get a bit warmer LW, as the Wolf Pack trailed Ga Southern 23-17 late 4Q before getting a 35-yd TD pass with 1:37 left for the 24-23 win (-20'). On the flip side, ODU got a 41-28 win (-23') over Hampton as it looks to be the same story for them as they have a great offense led by QB Taylor Heinicke (29-40-281-3-2) but still gave up 416 yds on defense. Look for NC State to get a more comfortable win than LW, however, ODU is perfectly capable of pulling the backdoor with their offense and it's toughing laying more than 2 td's with a tm that is on a 0-8-1 ATS run dating back to LY.

**OREGON by 13 over Michigan St** - Arguably the biggest non-conference game of the 2014 season matching 2 top 10 tms. In the L/gm ('99's opener) UO lost 27-20 (+10). The HT is a perfect 4-0 and the LTH ('98) the Ducks won 48-14 (E). Both tms are coming off dominating wins over FCS opp as while Oreg won 62-13 (-52) over S Dakota, the Spartans won 45-7 (-34') giving us a 3★ Small College LPS winner on the OVER. MSU actually allowed their 1st td at home s/Oct 12th of LY, which was almost 216 minutes of game time. Obviously the marquee match-up of this one will be Oregon's offense vs Michigan St's defense. It is notable that as good as MSU's defense was LY, they still allowed 273 rush yds (6.8) to Ohio St in NY's B10 champ gm, a similar offense to what Oreg runs. The Ducks are more exp'd as MSU lost 3 AA's to the NFL, but it does concern us that Oregon has had trouble in recent yrs vs physical tms (see Ohio St, Auburn, LSU, Stanford). However, keep in mind, this game is in Autzen where the Ducks are 34-2 SU and are covering machines even with inflated spreads. We think they take care of business here.

**ULM by 10 over Idaho** - These "new" Sun Belt foes split their 4 mtg's as previous SBC opponents ('01-'04). ULM has not opened a season with B2B home games since '96 (18Y) and just the 2nd time s/'89. LW we cashed a 3★ Key Selection on these pages as ULM beat WF 17-10 (-2). The score was still misleading as WF managed a 10-0 early lead despite having just 1 FD as they had a blocked PR td and got a TO that led to a FG. For the game ULM had 21-5 FD and 352-94 yd edges. It will be interesting to see how Idaho handles the cross-country trips TY as after flying down to Florida LW for a game that got PPD, they have to fly down again here to the heat of humidity. Still, we think there could be an overreaction to ULM and it's tough laying 2 td's with a tm off a big win and Idaho still being kind of an unknown.

**MINNESOTA by 14 over Middle Tennessee** - Solid schedule edge to Gophers playing their second straight home off a Thursday Night'r while MT makes this trip with a conf game on deck vs a WKU team which everyone saw dominate on Friday Night. Minny HC Jerry Kill went 8-3 ATS as a HF his L2Y at N III and has continued that success here going 6-1 ATS as a HF. While the record is impressive incl a cover LW, Minnesota was outgained 409-338 and outFD 27-18 insuring there is no look ahead to TCU. It'll be rough for Blue Raider soph QB Austin Grammer making his 1st road start as prepping vs Savannah St LW is basically like scrimmaging. Look for Gopher OL (avg 6-4, 310 lbs) to wear down the 3-4 D (DL avg 6-2, 285 lbs) especially that emerging rFr Berkeley Edwards (60, 15.0, 2 tds) as a breakout threat.

**Arizona St by 17 over NEW MEXICO** - If your Todd Graham you just manhandled Weber St and while your telling your team New Mexico is a formidable opponent and we must prep for the option based offense, you also know you are playing in altitude B2B weeks and your Sun Devils have lost their first BCS road game each of the L6Y. Your team knows once it beats New Mexico and Colorado they got a bye before hosting UCLA and then they have USC. New Mexico meanwhile lost as a td favorite but now they get their first BCS team visiting in HC Bob Davie's 3rd year. The Lobos can slow down the game with a rush offense that avg'd 6.1 ypc LY and rushed for 410 (7.9) LW and has a bye on deck versus a D with just 2 returning starters. New Mexico who?

**Duke by 10 over TROY** - This is another overreaction game as Duke was a 52-13 winner and Troy was a 48-10 loser. Duke HC David Cutcliffe does deserve kudos for getting a unit that was 11-62 on the road the previous 13Y to go 5-0 SU! That team had also NOT been an AF in 7Y went 1-0-1 ATS. Troy was outplayed in all 3 phases LW something HC Larry Blakeney admitted with their new QB, but the Trojans are also a team that is rarely a HD going 4-2 ATS the L8Y. Troy has had this game circled as its only their 4th BCS foe to visit since turning DI in 2002 and all they've done is beat Missouri 24-14 (+11'), beat Okl St 41-23 (+10') and cover vs Miss St 30-24 (+14').

**SOUTH CAROLINA by 16 over East Carolina** - On August 27th East Carolina was in a GREAT spot catching South Carolina between SEC homes games of A&M and Georgia. Now they face a team that seemingly lost to Cumberland St 222-0 as analyzed by the Nat'l media. The SC publicity dept was at it all year letting the country know they have the longest home win streak now its their first home L in 3Y and only 4th in 6Y. SC has rebounded from those previous 3 home losses winning and covering each by 18 ppg. EC had a walk-over as expected LW (-39', 52-7) but they are just 2-6 ATS as an AD and 1-5 ATS in their first away game.

## TOLEDO +7 over Missouri

Missouri HC Gary Pinkel returns to the place where he's a HOFr and the career wins leader ('91-'00) as 14Y ago he moved on from UT to Missouri. LY MU (-16) led 24-23 w/4:22 left 3Q and that incl a 70 yd IR td to open the 3Q. From that point MU outgained UT 168-35 (UT's L/3 drives ended in 2 punts & int) and MU would win 38-23 while taking a knee at the UT6 at the end. The Rockets did have a 387-384 yd edge. Campbell is 5-0 SU/3-2 ATS hosting non-conf gms incl a 29-23 (+6) upset over #21 Cincy in '12. LW the Rockets destroyed the FCS's #4 tm New Hampshire 54-20 (-11). Bama trans QB Phillip Ely was 24-34-337-4-0 as the Rockets piled up a 666-375 yd edge. They did trail 14-3 2Q and it was just 30-20 late 3Q before pulling away. The Tigers were rather unimpressive in their 38-18 win (-25) over S Dakota St. They only led 21-18 with 10:28 left 3Q when Marcus Murphy got a 100-yd KR td. For the game, they only had a 393-365 yd edge, which was even less impressive considering SDSt lost their all-time passing yds leader in the 1Q. The Rockets are the most talented tm in the MAC TY and have a great history of knocking off Power 5 conf tms highlighted by upsets over Penn St 24-6 (+18) in '00 and #9 Pitt 35-31 (+10) in '03. We'll call for them to do it again here. **FORECAST: TOLEDO by 3**

**AUBURN by 35 over San Jose St** - Can't get much of a better situation than beating a conference rival by 24 points while having a bye on deck. The Auburn offense picked up right where they left off putting up 595 yds and HC Gus Malzahn showed us LY he doesn't mind the back-ups scoring beating Ark St, W Carolina and Florida Atl by a combined 145-22. Malzahn has not only become an elite ATS coach he has set the bar going 19-2, 90.5%! The only way to ever consider playing against him is early in the year, but not with the Spartans who allowed 459 ypg, 5.2 ypc and 62% completions LY while having to also deal with the heat and humidity this week.

**Georgia Tech by 10 over TULANE** - For those of you tuning in, YES, that is a sellout for Tulane in their new Yulman Stadium. That type of excitement can carry a team to victory but as Houston showed opening their new stadium LW, you still have to play the game. The negatives for the Green Wave are having a circled conf road game in the opener, which they lost in 2OT, and now playing the option with a 4-2-5 base defense. LW Tech put up 508 yds and that was versus a teams that practices for the option every day in Wofford. Tech also showed an added wrinkle as QB Justin Thomas (11-15-282) connected with mini-Megatron? De Andre Smelter (5-132) which is something LY's QB Vad Lee struggled with. GT is 2-0-1 ATS the L2Y as an AF and a very tough spot for Tulane in week #2 (Ohio St prep for Navy in opener and allowed 390 yds).

**Maryland by 17 over USF** - USF true frosh Marlon Mack leads the country in rushing after one week finishing with 275 yds (11.5) but it was vs West Carolina. More concerning for the Bulls should be QB Mike White hitting only 9 of 26 (181 yds) and the defense allowing 454 yds of offense and 27 FD's to a Catamount squad which avg'd 301 ypg and 15 FD/gm on the road LW. Maryland did what was expected in a 52-7 win vs James Madison playing both QB's and spreading the ball around with 9 rec's making catches. While this is Edsall's 4th year as UM's HC, his squad was an AF for the first time LY going 2-1 ATS finishing the year by covering by 18 at NC St (-3, 41-21) and by 18' at VT (+15', 27-24). USF's "homefield edge" is becoming much like Temple's was playing in an off campus NFL Stadium. This not only gives them no home edge, but is actually a negative as the opposition is excited with the venue. USF is 2-12 ATS at home and LY in their 6 ATS losses they failed to cover by 21 ppg!!

**NOTRE DAME by 4 over Michigan** - The final scheduled game for one of the best rivalries in the gm. Each of the L3Y it has been a rare night home gm for the teams and this will mark the 4th straight. LY Brian Kelly said this was regional game and didn't have the history of ND's other rivals while Hoke didn't shy away from the importance of the rivalry. UM is now 6-2 SU/ATS in this series and after a stretch of 9 outright upsets in 12Y in this series, the favorite has won the L2. In fact, the HT is 9-3 ATS and the SU winner of the game has cashed 12 in a row. LY Hoke also said that ND was chickening out of the series and they played the Chicken Dance over the stadium speakers after the game. Just before the half UM got a 30 yd IR td drive for a 27-13 lead. On 3&12 with UM up just 34-30 late in the 4Q, the Wolves were int but a ? PI call gave them a FD. Then on 3&5 another PI FD sent up a td w/4:18 left and ND was int'd in the EZ on their next pass giving UM a 41-30 win (-4). Golson DNP LW and QB Gardner had one of his best games. LW both Golson and Gardner looked like they were in mid-season form as the Irish beat Rice 48-17 (-21) and the Wolverines beat App St 52-14 (-32). Golson had 336 total yds and 5 tds as we easily cashed a 3★ Weekly Totals play on the OVER while Gardner was an efficient 13-14-173-3-0 and RB Green ran wild with 170 yds (11.3). As usual look for this one to be tight and come right down to the wire.

**TEXAS by 9 over BYU** - Both teams met inferior foes LW with BYU QB Taysom Hill hitting 28-36-308 at U Conn while Texas QB David Ash underwhelmed hitting 19-34-190 at home vs North Texas, hence the short line. The difference this week is the Cougars are on a 2nd straight long road trip with temp's expected in the mid-90's. The Longhorns may have a new coaching staff but the 15 ret starters certainly remember getting embarrassed at Provo LY, allowing 679 yards incl 550 rushing!! Texas' D could have easily looked past their opener gearing up for revenge, but holding North Texas to 8 FD's and 94 total yards was a solid start. Also favor playing against BYU on the road as despite LW's stat padder, Vs "real BCS teams" away from home they scored just 16 at UVA, 17 at Wisc, 13 at ND and 16 vs Wash.

**NORTH CAROLINA by 17 over San Diego St** - Only prior meeting was the '98 LV Bowl, NC won 20-13 (-7). The Tar Heels are 17-1 SU L/18 gms hosting non-conference opp's with the loss LY vs East Carolina. Fedora is 5-2 ATS as non-conf HF and those 5 covers were by 22 ppg. QB Williams ended up getting the start LW in the Tar Heels 56-29 (-30) win over Liberty as after trailing 22-21 early 3Q they exploded to score 4 TD's in under 4 min of game time. SDSt is 2-19 (2-2 L4Y) in road openers and prior to the Army gm in '11 which San Diego St failed to cover as a 9 pt fav 23-20, SDSt hasn't been out to the East Coast s/'91 in FL (lost 39-12 vs UM). The Tar Heels have a bye on deck and have the opportunity to start 2-0 for the 1st time under Fedora and should do so easily.

**OHIO ST by 10 over Virginia Tech** - First meeting. The Buckeyes are 50-9 SU/33-23 ATS vs non-conf opp's the L/12 yrs. The JT Barrett era started off slowly for OSU LW vs Navy as they trailed 7-6 at HT, marking the 1st time they trailed a non-Power-Five conf foe s/'08. The Buckeyes scored 28 2H pts incl a 61 yd fumb rec for a TD early 3Q that swung the momentum into their favor. Navy actually out-FD'd OSU 22-19, while the Bucks had a slight 420-390 yd edge. A late TD did give you a winner on our Early Bird POW (given out FREE every Monday on Button #9 at 347-677-1700). However, the Bucks probably would not have needed it if not for some ? play-calling in the 1st 40 min of the gm as they refused to attack the Navy pass D despite the Middies having 8 guys in the box. **SITUATIONAL PLAY OF THE WEEK..... UTAH**

Brewer era (23-30-251-2-1) began a bit more smoothly for VT as the Hokies were able to limit FCS William & Mary to just 193 ttl yds in their 34-9 (-23) win. The Hokies are 19-2 SU/14-7 ATS in 'true' road openers (lost at #2 LSU in '07 and at Pitt in '12). A key matchup to look at will be a young OSU OL that struggled at times LW vs a very fast VT D that will stack the box darring QB Barrett to beat them over the top. However, the VT secondary (best in the country) is not likely to give up the big play like Navy LW and we'll side with the Hokies here.

**Oklahoma by 21 over TULSA** - These two are state rivals and OU makes a rare trip to Tulsa. The Sooner's last trip here was in '07 and they won 62-21 (-23). OU is a perfect 7-0 SU and 5-1-1 ATS in this series, winning by an avg of 37 ppg. In the last 3 meetings, OU has been +270 ypg. LY Blake Bell got his first start and short passes turned into big td's as OU did not punt until their 8th poss. OU had a 346-144 yd edge at the half and led 27-7. OU was -24 and TU got to 37-20 with 11:59 left but the Sooners went 75/5 for a td w/9:33 left and 84/11 getting a td to 2:35 left for the frontdoor cover 51-20. The Sooners are 13-3 SU (8-7-1 ATS) since 1998 in their first road gm. OU is coming off a 48-16 (-35) win over LaTech LW which saw them score the first 31 pts. They held LT to just 89 yds in the 1H. Not only has UT lost 7 str in the series, but they've been shutout 3X (L/series win in '96). UT did give us a 4★ Key Selection winner on these pages LW in their 38-31 2OT (-6) victory over Tulane. While many will point to the blown two TD lead and the missed FG at the end for Tulane, Tulsa also had some missed scoring opportunities incl 2 missed chipshot FG's early. Clearly the Sooners have the talent edges in this one, but don't discount Tulsa's ability to pull the backdoor as their offense (592 yds) looked much improved while OU could be taking a peek ahead to Tennessee next wk.

**UCLA by 24 over Memphis** - First meeting. Tigers have dropped 9 str road openers (2-6-1 ATS) but 4 have come by 6 pts or less incl the L2Y. UM has pl'y'd in CA just twice in their history going 2-0 (beat USC 24-10 in '91 and SJSU 28-9 in the '71 Pasadena Bowl). UM wasn't given much of a challenge LW during their 63-0 (-37) thrashing of FCS Austin Peay, who haven't won a gm since the '12 ssn. The Tigers had 27-8 FD and 545-146 yd edges. UCLA meanwhile is 14-2 SU s/'98 in home openers (12-4 ATS). The Bruins are 15-3 SU (13-5 ATS) their L/18 gms hosting non-conf foes and a perfect 12-0 SU (8-4 ATS) the last 3 ssns at home the wk following a road gm, winning by an avg score of 40-18. UCLA entered the ssn with its highest AP Pre-ssn ranking s/'98 and was nearly upset at VA LW. The Bruins needed 3 Def TD's to escape with a 28-20 (-20) win as we easily cashed our Top Weekly LPS winner on the Cavaliers with a 4★. They were out FD'd 17-16 and outgained 386-358 as the travel to the east coast appeared to take a toll. Heisman hopeful QB Hundley managed to throw for just 242 yds with 0 TD's. Huge sked edge goes to UM as they have a bye on deck while UCLA has a neutral site gm against Texas. Still, look for the Bruins to come away with a comfortable win.

**Air Force by 1 over WYOMING** - 53rd meeting in the Front Range rivalry. LTH ('12) former WY HC Christensen got upset at AF HC Calhoun calling him "Howdy Doody" at the end of the game and got a susp from the MW. This will be new HC Bohl's first time seeing the option at the FBS level. LY, WY was playing with extra motivation and actually went into AF -4' on the road and led 42-17 at the half. It was WY's highest scoring output ever vs AF and they've been playing s/'57 as they won 56-23. WY is 10-3 ATS in this series, but AF is 6-2 SU. There have been 4 outright upsets the L9Y and the visitor is 7-2 SU and 6-3 ATS. LTH AF trailed 21-7 and 27-14 w/4:58 3Q. From that point AF outgained WY 200-33 (GW td w/7:45 left) as the Cowboys L/2 drives ended in a punt and SOD at the AF44. WY is coming off a come-from-behind 17-12 (-4) win over FCS Montana LW after trailing 6-3 at HT. They did have slight 18-16 FD and 301-253 yd edges. AF cruised to a 44-16 (-22) win LW over FCS Nicholls St. The 539 rush yds were the most by the Falcons s/'11. Both these tms are similar talent wise and we look for it to go down to the wire.

**Oregon St by 10 over HAWAII** - OSU is 6-3 (3 str wins) in the series. There have been 2 recent meetings ('08, '13). OSU at home was +274 and +269 yds. LY OSU had a 202-128 yd edge at the half but it was tied at 14 and OSU did not cover winning 33-14 (-27). LTH vs Hawaii ('06) the Beavers pulled the outright upset, 35-32 (+8) in a gm they never trailed (gm tied 3X's). They did just play here in the bowl as they beat Boise St 38-23 (-3). OSU is just 4-11 SU/5-10 ATS in AG's vs non-conf foes and you would figure that after a couple of outright upset losses to FCS tms in the L/3 yrs, they would be better prepared but LW they failed to cover vs Port St in a 29-14 win (-32'). They actually trailed by 1 at HT before scoring 16 straight in the 2H. They did have 25-15 FD and 504-214 yd edges but also benefited from +4 TO's. The Rainbow Warriors are off a 1 pt loss at home to Wash (+17) in a game they were leading 10-0 1Q. They had 26-19 FD and 424-336 yd edges and had to settle for 2 short FG's. Despite the loss UH improved to 8-1 ATS vs non conf foes under HC Chow. Look for the Beavers to get the win but Hawaii is dangerous.

**Texas Tech by 17 over UTEP** - TT has won all 3 recent gms. LTH ('06) TT won 38-35 (-8). TT trailed 28-24 in the 4Q and all'd a 80/8pl td drive w/1:04 to force OT (won it on a fg). TT is 10-3 SU/8-5 ATS in road openers incl 4 str W's by 37 ppg. UTEP has dropped 5 str (L/series win in '57). L/gm ('07) UTEP led 21-7 and 28-14 but the gm was tied 31-31 into the 4Q. UTEP all'd B2B 80 yd td drives while their L/poss ended on a fmb! at the TT2 w/2:48 left as the Raiders won 45-31 (-25). TT is coming off a much closer than expected 42-35 (-29) win over FCS C Ark despite 636-406 yd and 35-28 FD advantages thanks to 2 TO's and 15 penalties for 113 yds. On the other side, UTEP is off an outright upset victory on the road against New Mexico 31-24 (+7). The Miners were slightly outgained 477-446 but were gift wrapped 3 TO's and RB Jones rushed for 237 yds and 3 td's incl a 73 yd'r. While TT has the clear talent edges, UTEP is expecting a sell-off here and gave another B12 tm #4 Oklahoma all they could handle here in 2012 losing 24-7 (+29').



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# PRO SELECTIONS

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## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ New England by 14 over MIAMI** - NE is 5-2-1 ATS vs MIA. NE had a 453-378 yd edge but drives of 16, 15 and 13 produced just 6 pts. NE is improved over that team with the return of DT's Wilfork, Kelly, stud ILB Mayo as well as TE Gronkowski and adding CB Revis. Brady also has better chemistry with his WR's since then, though MIA's DB's are better than LY's. MIA could be fielding a new OL here if Ctr Pouncey (hip) sits out and LY's #26 rush off (90 ypg 4.1) only earned 3.4 in the preseason. NE spent most of pre-2 scrimmaging PHI before holding them to 10 FD/155 yds in the 1H w/14 pts coming off a pick-six and a 31 yd drive off a blocked punt. OC Lazor was PHI's QB coach LY and while running the same system hasn't called plays at the NFL before. Have to believe the Belichick & Brady duo might remember their 24-20 loss at Miami Wk#15 costing them the homefield edge in the AFC Champ (L at DEN). The line is reasonable as NE was 0-4 as an AF but that is trumped by Belichick who has only lost 6 div games the L5Y and is now 4-0 SU/ATS revenging them COVERING BY 21 PPG!

**3★ TAMPA BAY by 6 over Carolina** - Why would a 4-12 team be favored over a 12-4 team week #1? The technicals line up on CAR with TB coming off a string of bad coaching since Gruden left and the Panthers being the surprise team of 2013. What Lovie brings is discipline and focus and that's the reason his Bears team was 11-3-1 ATS his L2Y in games with a line between the 3's. Newton (ribs) was limited in TC after missing most of the offseason and were hoping he's a 100% go because a mobile QB not at 100% healthy is a play against. He's playing behind an OL w/2 returning starters and no returning WR's from 2013 (7 FD/112 yds in 5 drives vs NE). Lovie Smith is a huge credibility boost for TB (they are well prepped incase OC Tedford misses) and they have a solid edge in the skill positions. Look for the public to take the playoff team taking a step back but we'll take the home team w/a winnable line.

## OTHER SELECTIONS

**2★ CHICAGO by 13 over Buffalo** - HC Trestman & the Bears are a bit overlooked TY after producing a #8 off without Culter for 5 games. They return all 11 offensive starters including a pair of 1,200 receivers and a 1,300 yd rusher with Forte. BUF is fielding its 3rd DC in 3Y and lost FS Byrd to NO, stud WLB Alonso (ACL) in the offseason. Yes, CHI's 1st string defense gave up 234 yds (6.7 per play) vs SEA in pre-3 but they were minus DE Allen and Trestman admitted they didn't gameplan at all. EJ Manuel is still really a rookie (4-6 SU/5-5 ATS) and the BUF starters went 18 drives without a TD vs their score vs TB's backups. BUF was held to 6 FD/82 yds in the 1H vs TB with 3 TO's. CHI's #30 def is still expected to be a bit soft vs the run and while Watkins is clearly the top WR here this is his 1st start here. We'll take the home team with the better skill players to outpace the young BUF offense.

**2★ NY JETS by 7 over Oakland** - While Schaub gets a fresh start in Oakland after his 10-14 ratio the only thing he or a rookie QB doesn't want to see in the opener is a ball hawking D that blitzes. Oh well, you can't always get what you want. OAK is 3-9 ATS in East Coast games inc a 37-27 loss to the Jets as a 3 pt AD LY. Geno Smith was decent (219 yds 64% 1-1) and now has a significantly upgraded supporting cast TY with WR Decker (87 rec 14.8) and RB Johnson (1077 yds 3.9). The Jets have a formidable front 7 (41 sks #13 3.4 ypc allowed) vs an OAK OL with 3 new starters protecting rookie Carr or Schaub. OAK will have 6 new starters on def after 8 new starters LY (#22 def 28.3 ppg #29). The Jets covered 4 out of 5 LY at home vs similarly talented NDIV teams with a lesser unit. There are legit concerns about the Jets DB's but Schaub lacks the physical capability and Carr the experience to vs Rex Ryan's schemes and we'll take the Jets here.

## OTHER GAMES

**Green Bay at SEATTLE - Thursday** - The defending SB champ is 8-2-2 ATS when opening the season at home in Wk 1. This is the 1st meeting since the controversial catch by Golden Tate on MNF Wk 3 during the referee strike to steal the win from GB as time expired. Rodgers was sacked 8 times in the 1H but rallied for the lead in the 4th Qtr. SEA's 12th man will be uncontrollable to open the season and much like the SNF game this has tons of implications for the end of the season.

**New Orleans by 4 over ATLANTA** - NO is 8-2 SU/6-2 ATS in the series. ATL is better than LY (#3 most improved) w/ renewed health at WR/DL but are fielding a rookie LT and a RT that gave up 10 of ATL's 44 sks LY (#20). They still lack a clear pass rush (#29 LY) and HC Payton tweaked his offense TY to be more unpredictable. ATL's LB issues have carried over (LB Weatherspoon IR) w/a pair of 2nd yr UFA's starting. NO's #4 def is in the 2nd year of DC Ryans system (#4 sks) and actually upgraded with FS Byrd. ATL should be a tougher out over 2013 and the line has shifted 5 pts vs the preseason opening number. NO has more continuity, added wrinkles and Brees has avg 324 ypg (67%) 11-4 in his L5 at ATL.

**ST LOUIS by 3 over Minnesota** - STL has big edges w/ one of our top 5 def's heading into the season with a highly experienced HC at home vs rookie HC Zimmerman and our #28 def. MIN released its 2013 sack leader (DE Allen 11.5), its #2 tackler (Henderson 112), its #1 DT (Kevin Williams) and have new systems on both sides of the ball. The loss of Bradford stings but STL has 2 weeks to prep with Shaun Hill (3-7 SU/6-3-1 ATS in 2010) in a system that was designed to ease Bradford back. The Rams return all 11 def starters from LY's #15 unit but STL has only been a fav of 6 or more since Dec 2006 and that was vs JAX LY (-11 34-20 cover). We'll call the home team by a FG here in a lower scoring game as we want to see how Hill fares against an aggressive DC bringing heat to keep him from getting comfortable.

**PITTSBURGH by 10 over Cleveland** - 19-2 SU/13-7 ATS vs CLE, the Steelers have covered the L3 by w/a 23.7-9.3 avg score. CLE has upgraded their run game, defense and, while not as exciting as that other guy, Hoyer (12th diff opening day starter L16Y) has the backing of the lockerroom. Hoyer's left something to be desired on the field in preseason with 192 yds (50%) 1-1 ratio with just a 5.3 ypa thru pre-3. CLE's 1st string offense went 12 drives before scoring a TD and were outgained 472-178 vs STL. Don't read too much into PIT's performance vs PHI in pre-3 as they were distracted. CLE's passing game looks anemic without Gordon and rookie HC in 1st 2 wks are 10-26-1 ATS vs Div foe. We'd have this play higher but Tomlin is 4-10 ATS as fav by 6 or more and have a Thur Night vs BAL on deck.

**PHILADELPHIA by 14 over Jacksonville** - This is a major mismatch with our #7 team entering the season vs our #31 as shown on pg 7. Yes, PHI cut WR Jackson (82 rec 16.2) and will be minus RT Johnson for the 1st 4 games (LY 1st time s' 2006 PHI had all 5 OL for 16 gms) but they have a more well rounded healthy WR Maclin and the team has a full year in Kelly's system. PHI rattled off an impressive 79 offensive plays vs PIT in pre-3 quieting fears after some lackluster play in the 1st 2 gms. While Henne has been decent in press keep in mind the vanilla schemes he's faced. Now he's working w/a new #1 RB, a #1 WR that missed most of camp (Shorts) who is really a slot WR, #2 and #3 WR's that are rookies and an OL that will have a different starter at 4 of the 5 spots. DD HF's w/a MNF game on deck are 13-5 ATS, PHI is light years ahead of JAX in terms of development and while the Jaguars defense should be stouter TY they won't get much offensive support.

**BALTIMORE by 7 over Cincinnati** - The favorite has covered 5 straight. While BAL is minus RB Rice (660 yds 3.1 LY) for 2 gms but got a boost w/ Kubiak coming over from HOU and added WR Smith (64 rec 11.6) and upgraded the OL. Dalton has only avg'd 243 ypg (54%) w/a 6-11 ratio vs BAL's def who are a full year past losing Reed/Lewis. CIN is fielding rookie Ctr Bodine (4th RD DC N Carolina) and lost both OC/DL to HC jobs in the offseason. Defensively CIN gets a boost w/ the return of All-Pro DT Atkins (ACL) but BAL will have all 3 of their top CB's here after giving up just 4 FD/40 yds in the 1H to WAS. We'll take the home team vs an adjusting Bengals team as BAL puts the offseason noise behind them.

**Washington by 3 over HOUSTON** - This matchup features a pair of true rookie HC's fielding quality defenses and questionable offenses. They are also our #1 & #2 most improved teams for 2014 and HOU is the 1st 3-13 (or worse) team to be favored in Wk 1 since the 1995 Oilers. Griffin has struggled to adjust to Gruden's offense and it showed vs BAL in pre-3 with the Redskins 1st stringers earning 1 FG in 6 drives with an int, a pair of 3 & outs with another 2 drives netting 20 yds (9 drives = 0 TD's). Fitzpatrick hasn't been much better with 3 scoring drives in 6 Qtrs of work for 232 yds (58%) 1-2 and a 5.4 ypa. HOU has rested RB Foster all preseason but the interest is how DC Crennel will use Watt/Clowney with a healthy Cushing as well. WAS will also have a healthy Orakpo/Kerrigan tandem and bolstered their def with 5 players with 8 or more starts LY. We'll call for the road team by a FG with Griffin's mobility, WAS having more depth at the skill positions, Gruden having more NFL experience though we respect the Texans defense here.

**Tennessee by 1 KANSAS CITY** - KC beat TEN 26-17 LY as 2.5 pt AF's LY converting 3 TO's into 13 pts but needed an RB Charles 1-yd TD w/ 6:23 left after blowing a 13-0 1H lead. KC feasted off TO's LY (+18 for +102 net pts) and combined with other factors they are 32nd in our improvement rankings (TEN #11). KC's OL is a mess right as 2 starters and their top backup gone, LT Fisher (2013 #1 DC) is struggling and RT Stephenson is susp 1st 4 gms. WR Bowe is also susp here so Donnie Avery (41 rec 16.5) is the #1 WR here. New TEN HC Whisenhunt knows what he's facing here helping SD beat KC twice LY (1-1 ATS) with 491 yds (41 pts) and 405 yds (27 pts). He is working with a lesser QB with Locker but TEN's offense will be much less predictable than LY. KC will look to ride RB Charles, TE Kelsce and a very formidable pass rush here but we'll go with the road team getting points vs a team that is 5-19 ATS as a HF.

**San Francisco by 3 over DALLAS** - DAL ended 2013 with the #32 def (#26 pts) and then proceeded to lose DE Ware, DT Hatcher to FA, stud ILB Sean Lee (ACL) to IR and its reasonable to expect worse for 2014 (29.7 ppg in pre). DAL has eluded any major preseason issues and has a quality OL to protect Romo (back) who has looked good in limited duty TY. SF's passing game is primed to be much better than LY's with Kaepernick (foot), WR's Crabtree, Boldin, Stevie Johnson and TE Davis all being healthy together. SF's (8-1 ATS as an AF) depth will be tested with LB's Bowman, Aldon Smith susp with DE McDonald also being a distraction now. However, DAL status as a public team plays to its advantage as the dog is 44-18-1 ATS in their games and keep in mind their offense is actually quite healthy. SF will be the team more likely to head to the postseason TY but DAL knows what they are facing and as long as Romo is healthy they'll be an interesting dog in 2014.

**Indianapolis at DENVER - SNF** - After the SEA game this may be the most anticipated game on Manning's schedule TY. Manning admitted that being honored by the Colts prior to LY's 39-33 loss (5.5 AF) distracted him & owner Irsay didn't deny their intent. Both teams are expected to cruise to capture division titles so a win here has seeding and tiebreakers even this early in the season.

**NY Giants at DETROIT - MNF #1** - DET (1-5 ATS as a HF) w/a new HC and retooled passing game take on a Giants team with a completely different offense (WC vs vertical) under Coughlin (10-6 ATS as AD). Can the Lions DL take advantage of the Giants rebuilt OL or will Manning expose DET's still sub-par secondary?

**San Diego at ARIZONA - MNF #2** - This is the 1st MNF game for ARZ since mid-2012 and they haven't covered one since 2006. SD has played Wk 1 MNF in 4 of the L5Y so they are well adjusted to the routine. This is also the 1st time since 1994 teams played pre-4 then played again to open the season. Can Palmer and a stocked WR unit challenge SD's rebuilt DB's or can Rivers and his deep RB/TE overstress ARZ's LB unit?
