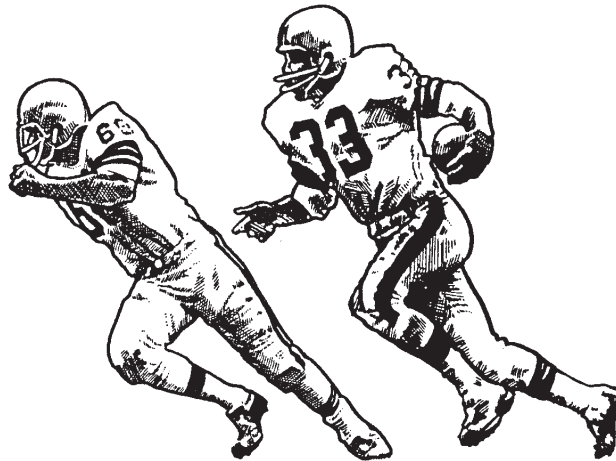


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UNDERDOG PLAY OF THE WEEK

Over 33 years this play has been a reader favorite. The last 16 years the Underdog Play of the Week has recorded numerous **OUTRIGHT UPSET WINNERS (521) to the incredible record INCLUDING 4 in '13 incl 3 straight outright winners AND TWO THIS YEAR!!!!** Here is TW's Underdog Play:

UTAH +9' over Oregon

Oregon's only trip to Utah was '03 which they lost 17-13 (-3). LY Mariota was less than 100% and Utah st'd their bkp. UO led 17-7 (190-137 yd edge) at HT. Down 44-14 Utah went 64/8 for a td w/6:01 left for the backdoor cover (+28). UO is off their huge revenge game vs Stanford and is now travelling to play in the altitude and their 2nd road gm in 3 wks. They were able to end their 2 gm losing streak to the Cardinal in impressive fashion as they won going away 45-16 (-8) as we easily cashed our 3★ LPS. After Stanford got to within 8 in the 3Q, the Ducks scored 21 unanswered & have now won 31 str gms when scoring 30+ pts. Utah saw their playoff chances eliminated LW, falling to ASU 19-16 (+4) in OT. Usually reliable PK Phillips missed two 35 yd fg's (TO called just before 1st miss) in OT. The HT is 5-0 SU in this series w/the Ducks hosting 4 times. Utah is 3-1 ATS. Utah is a HD for the 1st time TY, but HC Whittingham is 7-3 in that role here and has pulled off some major upsets incl against a Top 5 Stanford tm LY. We wouldn't be shocked to see them do it again here.

Air Force by 6 over UNLV - AF is 9-3 SU in this series, but UNLV is 5-3 ATS while the HT is 8-1 ATS. There have been outright upsets each of the L2Y with LV winning the LTH ('12) 38-35 (+10) and LY in a game that was played in single digit temps and a wind chill below zero. LV still had a 471-298 yd edge and 30-17 FD edge winning 41-21 (+1). AF has never lost 3 str in this series. UNLV was down 17-0 vs NM LW, but scored a td w/11 left 1H to sieze momentum. After taking a 28-24 lead mid 4Q, the Rebels all'd a 3 yd td w/1:22 left. They had a chance to win but their 55 yd fg at the end fell just short. AF is off a 23-6 (-3) win at rival Army which awarded them the CIC Trophy for the 1st time s/'11 (19th overall) & made them bowl elig after missing the post-ssn LY for the 1st time s/'06. AF is the much better tm but the Falcons are 0-3 SU/0-4 ATS in the gm following Army, while UNLV under Hauck is 13-6-1 as a HD incl an outright upset over FSU TY & is on a 14-7 ATS run in MW action.

SAN DIEGO ST by 17 over Idaho - Just the 4th all-time meeting between these schools & the HT is 4-0 SU/ATS with the avg win by 18 ppg. LTH ('08) SDSSt won in a route 45-17 (-11'). The Aztecs are off a 30-14 (+4) loss at Nevada. Up 14-10 at HT, SDSSt all'd all 20 2H pts. ID is off a 44-28 (+17) home loss to Ark St. The Vandals had 8 TO's (4 int's, 4 fumb's) but led 28-24 late 3Q before all'g the final 20 pts. ID is -40 ypg & -11 ppg vs our #118 sked while SDSSt is +50 ypg & +2 ppg vs our #95 sked. As an AD prior to this yr, ID was on a 3-11 ATS run, but they're 4-0 in that role TY and we'll call for them to make it 5-0 ATS especially coming off a misleading gm LW.

Marshall by 24 over SOUTHERN MISS - These schools 1st met in 2005 & have pl'd every yr since. SM had been 5-1 SU/4-2 ATS in this series but MU has now won 3 in a row SU/ATS pulling outright upsets in '11 (+7) 26-20 and '12 (+4) 59-24. LY MU scored td's on all 4 1Q drives & led 28-0. They finished w/636 yds & won 61-13 (-31'), which tied the most pts all'd in SM history ('87 vs FSU). Marshall is fresh off a bye following a 35-16 (-28) win over FAU (1st non ATS win s/opener) while SM is off a 35-14 (+5) loss at UTEP despite a 402-234 yd edge. The Golden Eagles committed 5 TO's & all'd a 98 yd KOR td & two 4Q def td's. Marshall is 1 of just 3 remaining undefeated FBS tms, but unfortunately have no shot at making the College Football Playoff (they do have a shot at making a major bowl gm and were aided by ECar's loss LW). The Thundering Herd will have to continue taking their frustrations out on overmatched CUSA opposition with SM being the latest.

Fau by 3 over NORTHTEXAS - Homecoming & the loser of this gm will be eliminated from bowl contention. Both were bowl elig LY, but only NT was invited. These schools know each other well. From 2004-'12 they were SBC rivals & now they're both in CUSA. NT was 0-6 SU in the series but has now won 3 str (3-6 all-time ATS). FAU is 4-1 SU/ATS all-time in Denton, but all their wins came at Fouts Field. LTH ('11) NT was -4 & led 7-0 at HT & 31-0 after 85 & 15 yd IR td's mid-3Q before all'g FAU to score the L/17 pts. NT enters fresh off a bye after a 41-21 (+14) loss at Rice while FAU enters off an emotional 31-28 (-3) loss vs UAB. Down 28-7 4Q, the Owls rallied to tie the gm at 28 before all'g a 24 yd fg w/0:2 left. FAU is on a 3-1 ATS run the week before their bye. We'll take the road tm here by a FG but they are a conf AF for just the 3rd time s/'10 (0-1 TY).

Georgia Southern by 9 over TEXAS ST - Only previous mtg was in the first round of the IAA playoffs in '05. TXSt hosted and won 50-35. GS is the surprise tm of the SBC as they remained undefeated in conf play after routing Troy 42-10 (-24) last Thursday, holding the Trojans to ssn lows of 9 FD & 154 yds. TXSt is off a 37-29 (-8) win over NMSSt despite being outFD'd 32-21 & outg'd 639-430 as they ret'd a blk'd punt 10 yds for a td. Against 2 common foes in NMSSt & ID, GS is 2-0 SU/0-2 ATS, +16 ppg & +46 ypg while TXSt is 2-0 SU/0-2 ATS, +6 ppg & -133 ypg. GS is +140 ypg & +24 ppg vs our #126 sked & TXSt is -16 ypg & +5 ppg vs our #123 sked. The Golden Eagles get the win, but their lines have started to get inflated and it's tough laying DD's on a long road trip (see their gm vs NMSSt earlier TY).

ARIZONA by 21 over Colorado - Homecoming. LTH ('12) CU led 10-7 in the 2Q, all'd 42 of the next 49 pts and still covered losing 56-39 (+29). LY AZ had a 670-349 yd edge. Trailing 34-20 CU faked a punt at their own 18 and AZ turned it into a td and won 44-20 (-12'). AZ was essentially eliminated from the playoffs LW after falling short at UCLA 17-7 (+6). The Wildcats couldn't hang onto a 7-3 HT lead as they were held to a ssn low 255 yds, close to 300 yds under their ssn avg. CU is off a 38-23 (+5) loss to UW as they couldn't hang onto a 23-17 3Q lead. The Buff's were done in by 4 TO's, 1 ret'd for a td & also all'd an 87 yd PR td. We easily cashed a 3★ LPS selection on the OVER. Colorado is just 6-17 ATS as an AD and we still think Ariz is a legit tm, that will want to get LW's bad taste out of their mouths.

Boise St by 14 over NEW MEXICO - BSU is a perfect 5-0 SU in this series (2-3 ATS), while the home tm is 3-2 SU/2-3 ATS. LTH ('12) the Broncos (-25) only won by 3. BSU led 25-0 at HT, but NM cut the lead to 3 w/3:24 left but was stopped on 4&4 from their 33 (BSU ran out L/2:05). LY NM came in all'g 66 & 69 pts the 2W prior. Gm was 7-7 mid-1Q but BSU would score 2 td's before HT incl a 99 yd drive and went on to win 45-17 (-37). BSU enters fresh off a bye & a 55-30 (-6) win over BYU the week prior. NM comes in off a 31-28 (+1) win at UNLV, despite only 5 pass yds (fewest by a winning FBS tm s/'12, AF 0 vs Haw). Up 17-0, the Lobo's all'd a td w/1:11 left 2Q. Trailing 28-24, RB Gipson scored the GW td on a 3 yd run w/1:22 left & UNLV missed a 55 yd fg at the end. The Broncos are on a 28-12 run as an AF, but did lose outright to option based Air Force all'g 287 (4.8) rush yds earlier TY. Even though they've had extra time to prep and have seen option earlier TY, the Broncos have struggled with it and we'll give a slight lean to the HT.

COLORADO ST by 17 over Hawaii - CSU has won 5 in a row SU (by 24 ppg incl 2 shutouts) & is on a 3-0 ATS run in this series. LTH ('12) CSU was -6. Up 28-27 into 4Q, CSU got a 76 yd IR td w/14:36 left and then a 60 yd IR td w/1:17 left for the 42-27 win. UH had a 393-291 yd edge. LY CSU was -1' and was up 35-17 at HT, but was held to 95 yds in 2H. Down 35-28 w/1:25 left, Hawaii was SOD at the CSU45. The Rams are off a 38-31 (-7) win at SJSt as they all'd the Spartans to recover an onside kick with 2:19 left but the D held at the SJSt 41. The Rainbow Warriors are off a 35-14 (+2) loss vs UTSt. Hawaii all'd a true frosh making his 1st start to complete 14 of 15 passes incl his 1st 12, while turning the ball over 3X themselves. Under HC McElwain CSU is on an 8-4 run as a HF, but are 0-2 this yr as a MW HF. UH has lost 16 str road gms (7-9 ATS) and are 6-9 as an AD under Chow. We'll call for Col St to continue the Warriors woes here.

MICHIGAN ST by 3 over Ohio St - B10 GOY as the winner will be the fav to win the B10 Champ gm & in the running for a playoff appearance. OSU has won the L/4 meetings SU here (last loss in '99). This however, will be the 1st Nov. night gm in Spartan Stadium history. MSU is 10-5 SU all-time in night HG's (7-2 SU under Dantonio). Revenge will be on the minds of the Buckeyes as LY in the B10 Championship, they were a win away from a Nat'l Title appearance. MSU (+5) jumped out to a 17-0 lead but trailed 24-17 w/5:36 3Q. From that point MSU outgained OSU 227-46 (just 2 OSU FD's) scoring the final 17 pts. LTH ('12) OSU won 17-16 (+2). MSU is fresh off a bye while OSU is off a 55-14 (-28) route over Illinois. The Buckeyes led 31-0 at HT & tied their B10 reg ssn win streak with 20 str wins. MSU is 4-8 as a B10 HF, while Meyer is 2-0 as an AD at OSU incl winning here in '12. Despite those technical edges for the Bucks here, we'll call for this gm to go down to the wire with the home tm coming out w/a 3 pt win.

Louisiana by 16 over New Mexico St - Homecoming. When these two were in the SBC together from '01-'04, NMSSt actually won 3 of the L/4 but UL was 3-1 ATS. LY they met for the first time s/'04. UL was -31' at home but NMSSt led 28-14 at HT w/a 317-174 yd edge. UL got a td and 2 pt conv to take a 35-28 lead w/10:49 left & went on to win 49-35. UL is off a 19-9 (-7) win over USA, cashing a 3★ LPS winner for us. Down 9-6 at HT, the Ragin' Cajuns scored all 13 2H pts to remain in control in the SBC standings. 2nd of B2B home gms for NMSSt as they are off a 37-29 (+8) loss to TXSt despite 32-21 FD & 639-430 yd edges. QB Rogers had 2 costly int's & TXSt ret'd a blk'd punt 10 yds for a td. The Ragin' Cajuns have covered their L/3 SBC gms but this could be a bit of a flat spot here.

ARIZONA ST by 1 over Notre Dame - LY they met for the first time since 1999. ND was off their loss to Okla and AST was off a big win over USC. ND prob would have been favored the week prior but was +6'. ND led 24-13 but tied 27-27 ND got a fg w/3:03 left then a 14 yd IR td w/1:08 left. AST went 75/7 getting a 16 yd td w/1:11 left which gave them the ydg edge for the game. ND is 3-0 SU/ATS. A playoff elimination gm for both tms here as ND comes in 7-1 after their 49-39 win (-14) over Navy LW as we easily cashed a 3.5★ LPS College Totals play on the OVER. They scored on their 1st 4 poss and led 28-7 but allowed Navy to get back in the gm. The bigger loss for them was losing their leading tackler, emotional leader and the player who called all the D plays in LB Schmidt for the yr. Ariz St is fortunate to be where they are as they got a Hail Mary td pass to beat USC, faced Wash w/o QB and top 2 RB and won a nail biter and LW faced Utah w/o #1 WR and the Utes AA K did miss a 35-yd FG in OT. AST did have a 444-241 yd edge in their 19-16 win (-6'). We would have backed the Irish here but the injury to Schmidt means they could have as many as 4 true frosh st'g and we'll call for this to go down to the wire.
