## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ Utep (+) over RICE - Friday.** An easy play in this series had been Rice as they are 10-1 ATS the L11Y. UTEP has been favored in this series 8 of the last 11, but Rice is 7-1 SU with 4 outright upsets the L8Y. Despite Utep being one of the most improved tms in the country TY, they are a DD dog in this one. LW we used UTEP as a 4★ on these pages and we never backed down from it. We made it our 5★ College GOY and after jumping out to a 28-0 HT lead, they cruised 35-17 (-6) over NT as they had a dominating 438-201 yd edge (College GOY's now 26-7, 79% w/an avg cover of 15.2 ppg!). Rice was dominated (like most tms) at Marshall LW in a 41-14 loss (+21\*). The Owls had won and covered 6 str gms prior but they have lost their best D ply'r in DT Covington for the yr and were gashed LW. Now they face a powerful UTEP rush offense that had 351 (7.6) LW and the UTEP rush D is all'g just 74 rush ypg (2.8) L/4 wks. UTEP is now bowl elig, has covered 5 str and is looking for more. We're not afraid to ride them yet again as one of our top plays as NT's L/2 scores in LW's 4Q gave us some more value (were leading NT 35-3).

**3★ Louisville over NOTRE DAME - First meeting.** The Irish are off painful B2B losses as they have 9 TO's in the L/2 gms and an amazing 23 TO's on the ssn (Golson 19 TO's in L/7 gms!). LW they led NW 40-29 and HC Kelly went for a ridiculous 2 pt conv after a td (failed). ND could have taken a knee w/90 seconds left but fmb'd inside the NW 30 and the Wildcats got a 45-yd FG w/:15 left to force OT in their 43-40 win (+17\*). ND's D is now at historically bad levels as they have all'd 42 ppg in their L/5 gms. The bigger loss was on the inj front as ND lost DL Day (best DL) and QB Golson has a sprained shldr' (CS). On the other side, prior to their bye, we cashed a 4★ Key Selection on these pages on the Cards (-3) in their 38-19 win over BC. Their offense has been completely diff w/Parker healthy but they did lose QB Gardner for the yr (ACL). Bonnafon will be making the start here but he already got some exp earlier TY. With the severity of Golson's injury not yet known, we'll back the rested tm w/the better D that has a ball-hawking secondary (S Holliman 1 shy of NCAA int record) and can force TO's. Also add in the fact UL is on a 8-0 ATS run as an AD while ND is a horrible HF at 11-21-1 ATS.

**3★ VIRGINIA over Miami, FI - UVA** is now 3-1 SU and 3-0-1 ATS in this series but the visitor is 6-3-1 ATS and there have been 6 outright upsets the L10Y. LY was a strange game as UM was -20\* at home and won 45-20 but UVA finished with 28-11 FD and 483-304 yd edges. The key play saw UVA trailing 14-13 at the UM16. They were int'd and ret'd 81 yds to the 3 and UM got a td in the final seconds of the half for a 14 pt swing and led 21-13 despite UVA having a 235-112 yd edge. LTH UM led 38-28 in the 4Q but UVA got a 10 yd td pass with :06 left to pull out a 41-40 win (-1). This could be one of our favorite situational plays of the wk as UVA comes in off a bye in must win mode for a bowl (and for HC London's job security). On the other side, we used FSU as a 3★ on these pages against Miami and after the Canes led 23-7 at one pt, they fell 30-26 (+2\*) cashing yet another LPS winner as it was your typical 2014 FSU gm. Now after UM gave it their all in front of a rare sold-out home crowd, they travel to take on an underrated UVA tm that has our #17 D. Upset!

## OTHER SELECTIONS

**2★ WASHINGTON over Oregon St** - This marks the 99th all-time meeting. OSU was 7-1 SU/8-0 ATS from '03-'11 in this series but UW has won the L2 SU/ATS. There have been 6 outright upsets in the L13Y incl 2 of the L/3. LY was embarrassing for OSU. It was their FHG & they were taking on a bkp QB & they were outg'd 692-414 & lost 69-27 (+1\*), putting up 27 bbg pts in the 4Q. The 69 pts all'd were the most scored by either tm in the series. The Huskies are off a crushing 27-26 (+9) loss at Ariz. They had a 347-193 HT yd edge but trailed 21-17. Up 26-24 with the ball, UW fumbled w/:1.23 left & AZ kicked the GW 47 yd fg w/no time remaining. The Huskies had 504-375 yd & 36:05-23:55 TOP edges. OSU meanwhile knocked ASU from playoff contention with a stunning 35-27 (+9) win as they came back from a 24-14 HT deficit & up 1, ret'd an int 35 yds for a td w/:1:38 left. It was yet another outright upset winner for our Big Dogs (did you get your Big Dogs this wk?). LW they went 7-0 w/3 outright upsets and you can get them all for just \$9! The Beavers did have a 498-367 yd edge. This is the FHG for UW with the Apple Cup on deck & they are on a 3-1 SU/ATS run when not facing WSU in that role and are on a 10-6 run as a HF. We think they bounce back here this wk and will play against the Beavs off the big upset.

**2★ Louisiana Tech over OLD DOMINION** - First meeting. This is the home finale for ODU & they've won 5 str in that role but this is the 1st time there has been a line. Both schools enter fresh off a bye. LT has won 5 str & in their L/gm they never trailed, going on the road to defeat UAB 40-24 (-4). The Monarchs snapped a 5 gm losing streak in their L/gm, a 38-35 (-5) win vs FIU. Down 7, OD scored twice w/under 2 min left. Against 2 common foes the Bulldogs are 2-0 SU/ATS, +50 ppg & +214 ypg while OD is 0-2 SU/ATS, -11 ppg & -44 ypg. The Monarchs are all'g 290 (5.6) rush ypg in CUSA play & LT has rushed for 220+ in 3 gms TY incl their L/gm. LT is 4-0 as an AF under Holtz & ODU is 0-1 as a HD & have lost 6 str ATS. Bulldogs remain perfect in conf play as they look forward to their revenge gm with Rice on deck.

## OTHER GAMES

### Wednesday, November 19th

**Kent St at BUFFALO** - In their 1st 6 meetings since UB joined the MAC, KS was 5-1 SU/3-3 ATS. UB has taken control going 5-2 SU/4-2-1 ATS the L7. Even more dominant has been the visitor as they are 7-1 SU/6-1-1 ATS w/3 outright upsets. LTH KSU was +3\* but had a 404-265 yd edge and won 23-7. LY UB was -1 at KS and BU had a 491-363 yd edge. We had a 3★ LPS on UB and they cruised 41-21 (-1). UB comes in off their most impressive gm of the ssn a 55-24 (+3) trouncing of Akron as they had a 536-229 yd edge. The Golden Flashes are still winless in conf play but they have covered B2B gms vs the MAC's elite (UT/BG).

**Bowling Green at TOLEDO** - It's been a back and forth series for the Battle of I-75. UT won 3 in a row from '04-'06 then BG won 3 in a row from '07-'09. UT has now won the last 4 in a row. The home team is 12-4 SU and is on a 11-3-1 ATS run. LTH UT jumped out to a 24-3 lead in the 3Q and won 27-15 (-3\*). LY UT was +4 on the road and once again got off to a good start. UT led 21-0 but BG battled back and actually took the lead 25-21 (5:54) but UT went 70/10 and on 4&9 got an 11 yd TD pass w/:22 left for the win. The script was flipped on the Rockets LW as after going 5-0 SU/0-5 ATS in MAC play TY, they lost outright to NIU but did cover in the 27-24 loss (+4\*). They might be down to a converted WR at QB here (top 3 QB's hurt). BG, on the other side, beat Kent St 30-20 (-13) which was the same exact score UT won over KSt a wk prior. UT needs to win out to share the div crown while BG has already clinched the div.

### Thursday, November 20th

**Kansas St at WEST VIRGINIA** - In their 2 meetings, Bill Snyder has dominated Dan Holgorsen winning by an avg of 45-13. LTH KSU was +2\* on the road, but won 55-14. LY KSU was -12\* at home but it was closer than the final. WV led 9-7 at half with a 221-142 yd edge. KSU took the lead with a td w/:2:10 left in the 3Q, then went 78/7 for a td, 54/5 for a td and 64/8 for another td w/:15 left in the gm for the 35-12 win. Both tms come in off a bye and off a loss (in WV's case B2B losses). Snyder is 9-0 ATS off a SU loss and the Wildcats need to win out to share the B12 crown but WV has fared well vs a very tough slate TY (+117 ypg vs #6 sked).

**North Carolina at DUKE** - In-state rivalry for the Victory Bell. The L/time Duke has held this trophy for 3 str yrs was 1987-89. NC was 20-1 in this series but has lost B2B gms. This is a short wk for both tms and Duke is at home for a 2nd str wk while NC has NCST on deck. The Tar Heels picked up a key win for their bowl hopes LW in their 40-35 win (-2\*) over Pitt. They have now covered 4 of 5 gms and like LY are playing much better in the 2H of the ssn (however, they have been outgained by every FBS foe TY). Duke had been the most underwhelming 8-1 tm in the country and LW it caught up with them in a 17-16 loss (-4\*) to VT. They need to win their final 2 gms (own tie-breaker over GT) to claim the Coastal for the 2nd str yr.

**Arkansas St at TEXAS ST** - LY was their first meeting and Ast was -7 at home. TSt had leads of 7-0, 14-7 and 21-14. The game was tied at 21 at the half but Ast would control the 2H and would go on to win 38-21. They did pile up 328 rush yds. Both tms come in off conf losses and need a win for SBC bowl positioning. TXSt for the 2nd str wk outgained their opp but lost while Ast off 2 str misleading gms (ID +7 TO's, S Bama beat-up) fell to App St 37-32 as they were outgained 549-314 (did lead 20-6 at one pt). However, Ast is 11-2 ATS on the SBC road.

### Friday, November 21st

**Air Force at SAN DIEGO ST** - Rocky Long knows how to defend the option and did a great job each of his yrs with NMEX. It is not a coincidence that when Long arrived here as the DC in '09 and then took over as the HC Sdst is a perfect 5-0 ATS vs AF winning each of the L/4 SU. The Aztecs come in off a tough 38-29 (+13\*) loss to Boise St as they blew an early 20-0 lead. On the other side, after a 2-10 ssn LY, the Falcons are now 8-2 after a 45-38 OT win (-2\*) over New LW. They have covered 3 str gms but now travel on a short week. Sdst needs a win to get to bowl elig, but AF still has hopes of a div title.

**San Jose St at UTAH ST** - SJSU won 3 in a row SU in this series from '06-'08 but UST has taken over and gone 5-0 SU winning the last 2 by an avg of 45-20 despite being +3 and -9\* in both on the road. The visitor has covered 4 in a row ATS. The Aggies haven't missed a beat despite laying claim to arguably the most beat up team in the country TY. They are 8-3 and LW we cashed a 4★ College Totals LPS on the UNDER in their 28-21 win (-19\*) over NM. SJSU was officially eliminated from bowl contention in their 13-0 loss (-9\*) to Hawaii. The gm was extremely misleading as they had 24-11 FD and 462-240 yd edges. SJSU is 0-4 ATS as an AD but UST is just 1-4 ATS as a HF TY.

### Saturday, November 22nd

**Virginia Tech by 13 over WAKE FOREST** - WF has lost 5 str in the series by 16 ppg (0-4) incl the L/gm in '11 (38-17, +6). VT's last losing trip here was in 1970. We're not afraid to tell you winners and losers here at NCSports (it's one of many reasons we've been in business 33 yrs), and LW's 4★ College LPS on Wake (+17) was our "only" loser on a GOY weekend as they fell to NCST 42-13 (College LPS went 6-1 LW and are 15-2 88% in Nov TY!!!). They are now 2-8 on the ssn and are -252 ypg in ACC play. After 3 str losses, the Hokies pulled the upset LW over Duke 17-16 (+4\*) and a win here could make them bowl elig (were outgained 326-293). They are just 1-6 ATS as an AF but that one win was earlier TY at NC. While Wake is 5-2-1 ATS as a HD, they are 0-5 SU/0-4-1 ATS in their home finale. Their offense is avg just 166 ypg in conf play and we can't see them faring too well here vs a VT D all'g 106 ypg less than what their opp are avg TY.

**TENNESSEE by 3 over Missouri** - This is UT's home finale while MO is on their 2nd straight AG and UT is at home a 3rd str wk. Two yrs ago here, UT led 21-7 at the half and it could have been worse as they had a 383-63 yd edge! MO's only score was an 87-yd KR td. UT let the Tigers back in the game and would end up losing in 4OT's. LY there was no such drama. MO was off a bubble bursting loss to SCar and was -11 at home. MO won 33-3 with a 502-334 yd edge. Both tms are off big wins and need this gm for diff purposes. The Vols can clinch bowl elig for the 1st time s/'10 after they dismantled UK LW 50-16 (-10). On the other side, the Tigers caught A&M off their huge upset win over Auburn (MO off a bye) and won 34-27 (+3\*) as their offense exploded for 587 yds (avg'd just 250 ypg in SEC play prior). They have now won 4 str and can clinch a 2nd str SEC East Title w/wins in their final 2 gms. The Vols are 7-1 SU (3-1 ATS) in home finales and have avg'd 48 ppg in QB Dobbs 2 starts.

**S CAROLINA by 20 over S Alabama** - First mtg but 3rd SEC foe for S Bama as they lost to Tenn only 31-24 (+16\*) LY and to #23 Miss St in '12 (30-10, +34). The Gamecocks are 0-5 ATS TY as a HF, incl being outright upset 3x's but they could have new life now after a 23-20 OT win (+7) over UF LW. It was another outright upset winner for our Big Dogs (perfect 7-0 LW incl 3 outright upsets, just \$9 on your VIP Debit Card on Thursdays!) and we liked it so much we upgraded it to a 3★ LPS on Saturday. However, we're not afraid to admit we were fortunate in the gm as the Gamecocks blocked 2 kicks in the final 3 min (1 FG, 1 punt). However, considering they lost 3 gms TY while leading by 14 pts late in the 4Q, the football Gods finally shined upon Spurrier and Co. On the other side, S Bama picked up a huge win as they are bowl elig for the 2nd str ssn. While the tech edges are against SC here, they do need a win to secure bowl elig themselves and we look for them to do it comfortable fashion here.

**BALL ST by 20 over Eastern Michigan** - As you would expect, BS has dominated this series going 8-1 SU and 6-3 ATS, but the visitor is 7-3 ATS and there have been 4 outright upsets the L10Y. LTH BS was only -3 and it was tied at 13 at the half. BS exploded to lead 37-13 and finished with a 596-366 yd edge with EM getting 75/8 and 87/6 yd td drives to only lose 37-26. LY BS was -10 and won 51-20 in a misleading gm as BSt only had a 258-218 yd edge at HT. EM is off an embarrassing 51-7 loss (+27) to rival WM as they trailed 48-0 at HT. On the other side, there will be no bowl TY for the Cardinals as they fell to 3-7 after a 24-10 (+3) loss to UMass LW. They do have extra time to prep as that fell on a Wed. EM is just 4-14-1 ATS as an AD incl 0-6-1 ATS on MAC road and we'll back the home team here.

**MICHIGAN ST by 27 over Rutgers** - MSU is 13-5 SU in home finales but just 5-4 L/9 yrs and have failed to cover 4 of their L/5. MSU is 2-3 SU vs RU w/the L/gm in '04, MSU lost 19-14. Technical edges favor the Scarlet Knights here as they are 8-3 ATS as an AD while MSU is 6-13 ATS as a HF. However, it is not the best situation for them travelling after clinching bowl elig LW in their 45-23 win (-8) over Indiana as we cashed a 3★ LPS on them. MSU rebounded off the loss to OSU w/a dominating 37-15 (-11) win over MD. They had a 143-11 yd edge in the 1Q. The Spartans should be able to take adv of a small speedy RU DL w/their big OL and RB as LW the Knights all'd 307 rush yds to Indy's Tevin Coleman. The Knights lost to Wisky 37-0 and Ohio St 56-17 and we look for them to get steamrolled yet again vs the Big Ten's elite.

**NEBRASKA By 7 over Minnesota** - This is a legitimate revenge game as LY NU was -10 on the road, jumped to a 7-0 lead but lost outright 34-23 getting out rushed 271-189. It was the Gophers first win in the series s/'60. UM just had their FHG vs Ohio St and now travel although NU is off a physical Wisc gm. LW the Gophers found themselves down 14-0 but, 2 OSU TO's gave them 2 td's and then late in the game down 31-14, OSU fumb'd at their own 14 giving the Gophers a backdoor cover in their 31-24 loss (+13). There was no backdoor in the Neb/Wisc gm LW as after leading 17-3 the Huskers were embarrassed 59-24 (+6\*) as they all'd Wisky RB Gordon to run for an FBS-record 408 yds in just 3Q's! (were outgained 627-180). Now you have to question their mindset as their Big Ten champ and major bowl aspirations took a major hit and now they get a physical Minny tm that is capable of playing toe-to-toe with them.

**MISSISSIPPI ST by 28 over Vanderbilt** - Bulldogs have won B2B w/o topping 17 pts. L/gm ('09) MSU held VU to 10 FD & 157 yds. VU has not won in Starkville s/71. LW the Bulldogs trailed 19-0 and trailed by DD's most of the gm but much to the dismay of Crimson Tide backers went 72/13 and got a 4-yd TD pass on 4&G1 w/15 left to lose 25-20 (+9'). While Vandy has been by far the worst tm in the SEC TY, they do come in off a bye and catch the Bulldogs in a huge Bama/Ole Miss sandwich. In their L/gm they were run over by UF in a 34-10 loss (+13') and are -181 ypg in SEC play TY. Look for Miss St to easily win here despite their undefeated sn coming to an end LW. They still have a great shot at the playoffs by winning out.

**OHIO ST by 38 over Indiana** - OSU has now won 19 in a row SU in this series but Indy has actually covered the L3. Even though OSU was playing with pressure to roll up the score LY, they led 42-0 but gave up 2 late td's (5:59, 2:03 lateral giving backdoor cover) and only finished with a 471-442 yd edge winning just 42-14 (-34). The Bucks have won 8 str s/their loss to VT but LW got backdoored thanks to a fumb'l'd PR up 31-14 late 4Q in their 31-24 win (-13) over Minny. They also led 14-0 early before 2 TO's gave Minny 14 pts. QB Barrett continues to shine as he ran for an OSU-rec 189 yds. On the other side, despite a gigantic effort from RB Tevin Coleman (307 rush yds), the Hoosiers were destroyed 45-23 (+8). They did lead 16-10 in the 3Q but collapsed afterwards (incl a ridiculous fake punt at own 9). Despite that ugly loss to VT earlier, the Bucks still have their sights set on a possible playoff berth and look for them to cruise here especially after not finishing LW.

**MICHIGAN by 3 over Maryland** - UM is 3-0 vs Maryland (all gms in Ann Arbor) but they last played in '90 (won 45-17). UM is just 2-4 SU the gm prior to rival OSU but has covered each of the L/3. They come in off a bye after notching their 1st B2B win of the ssn as they are sitting at 5-5 and are clearly in MUST win mode to get a bowl invite (still won't save Hoke's job). The Terps are already bowl elig at 6-4 but were embarrassed LW at home, off a bye to MSU in a 37-15 loss (+11). They were outgained 143-11 in the 1Q. On the bright side, they are 8-4 ATS as an AD and have already pulled 3 upsets TY in that role. While UM is -59 ypg in B10 play TY (MD is -16), their D is all g' 113 ypg (#8) less than what their opp are avg TY and we look for a tight low scoring affair here.

**OKLAHOMA by 24 over Kansas** - OU is 9-0 SU and 6-3 ATS in this series. LY KU was +22 at home and jumped out to a 13-0 lead. OU, however led 18-13 at half with a slim 204-173 yd edge and would win 34-19. LW Cody Thomas got his 1st start at QB and after a dismal 1H (only 68 yds), the Sooners exploded for 449 yds in the 2H in their 42-30 win (-13). Much to the dismay of us and other OU backers, TT got a 39-yd TD pass on the last play of the game for the backdoor. On the other side, KU led heavily favored TCU 27-17 but would eventually fall 34-30 (+28) as we cashed a 3★ College Totals LPS on the OVER. After putting forth such a great effort LW, you have to wonder how much they have in them here while OU has a bye on deck. Also notable is the fact KU has lost 31 str away from Lawrence (10-20-1 ATS) and we look for the Sooners to hold nothing back here (plus QB Knight could be back).

**PITTSBURGH by 6 over Syracuse** - These two tms both came over from the Big East together so they have played non-stop conf gms vs each other since the start of the BE. Pitt has dominated w/a 10-2 SU/9-3 ATS mark. However, the L2G have each been decided by 1 pt with Syr winning 14-13 (-1') at home in '12 and SU was again at home LY and Pitt won 17-16 (E). Pitt is off big gm vs NCar but this is their FHG and Syr is fresh off a bye. The Panthers have to win their final 2 gms to get to bowl elig after LW's 40-35 loss (+2') to NC. They have now failed to cover 7 of their L/8 gms and have lost 6 of 7 outright. The Orange have lost 7 of 8 and will be sitting at home TY. They are actually +14 ypg on the ssn vs our #51 sked (-28 ypg in ACC play) while Pitt is +90 ypg vs our #75 sked (+39 ypg in conf play). Their D has all'd 3 str gms of 40 or more pts but should get well here vs a Cuse offense avg just 15 ppg and 296 ypg in ACC play.

**PURDUE by 1 over Northwestern** - PU won 20-17 in the L/gm ('10). LTH ('09) NU won 27-21. The Boilers come in off a bye after 4 str losses to the upper echelon tms in the Big Ten. While they are 3-7 SU (just 1 win LY), they have been respectable and are 7-3 ATS. On the other side, NW HC Pat Fitzgerald won at ND as a star LB in 1995, then as a HC LW pulled off another huge upset in their 43-40 OT win (+17') as we cashed yet another outright upset winner for our Big Dogs. NW actually trailed 40-29 in the 4Q when ND HC Brian Kelly inexcusably went for 2 after a TD and missed. NW got a TD, 2 pt conv and a FG w/19 left to force OT. It was their 3rd big upset of the ssn but now they are in a less favorable role as they are 5-9-1 ATS as an AF (1st time TY). While the Wildcats need to win out to get to a bowl, we love Purdue's situation here coming off a bye catching them off a huge upset win over ND and we give the Boilers a solid shot at the outright upset.

**CENTRAL MICHIGAN by 1 over Western Michigan** - For a long time, the HT had controlled this series going 15-5 SU/12-8 ATS. However, the L2Y the visitor has actually been favored and won both. CM had won 5 in a row in this series from '06-'10. WM ended that streak in '11 winning 44-14 at home -7. In '12 WM was -1 on the road and trailed 23-14 but won 42-31. LY CM was -2 on the road and got a 34 yd IR td to lead 27-16. WM got a td w/11:09 left, 27-22. WM missed a 32 yd fg w/8:41 left and was SOD at the CM26. This gm will decide the Michigan MAC Trophy and the loser here will most likely be eliminated from the MAC West Title contention. CM is off a 34-27 win (-18) over Miami, Oh (another Big Dog cover). Their RB Rawls had just 3 carries and should be healthier here. PJ Fleck should be your MAC Coach of the yr as after a dismal 1-11 1st ssn, the Broncos are 7-3 SU and have now covered 9 str gms after demolishing EMU LW 51-7 (-27). It could have been even worse as they led 48-0 at HT! In conf play, they are outscoring their opp by 19 ppg (+111 ypg) while CMU is +9 ppg and +129 ypg. Look for this one to go down to the wire but CMU players and cchs are used to playing in big gms while this is new territory for WMU.

**E CAROLINA by 20 over Tulane** - EC is playing with legit revenge here. LY EC was on their 3rd str road game. EC had been 9-1 SU in this series from '99-'12 (6-4 ATS). TU was +10' at home and led the majority of the game incl 19-9 in the 4Q when EC tied it w/1:48 left and then EC missed a GW FG from 42 yds out. TU won in 3OT, 36-33. Surprisingly, despite EC's dominance, the HT is 9-3 SU/8-4 ATS. In the L3Y EC has outgained Tulane by 171 ypg. After having major bowl aspirations after their 6-1 start w/2 wins over ACC tms, the Pirates have now lost B2B gms and have failed to cover 5 str after LW's 54-46 loss (-2') to Cincy. The final score was a bit misleading as Cincy hit a long FG w/15 left to lead and then got a FR td after an unsuccessful lateral at by EC on the final play. Tulane is also off a misleading 38-7 loss to Memphis as they had 21-13 FD and 351-334 yd edges. However, they were -3 in TO's as Mem got 2 IR td's. After B2B losses, EC needs a feel good win and while Tulane is 5-2 ATS as a conf AD w/2 upsets, we look for ECU to win comfortably here.

**FLORIDA ST by 16 over Boston College** - Great situation for the Eagles here as BC comes in fresh off a bye while FSU is in a massive Miami, Fl/Fla sandwich. FSU should come prepared as their closest reg ssn gm LY came vs BC, a gm they led just 24-17 at the half thanks to a Hail Mary td pass on the final play and only won 48-34 with BC rushing for 200 yds and gaining 397, the 2nd most yds vs FSU's D all year. FSU has won 4 in a row SU in this series (by 24 ppg) but the visitor is 6-3 SU/ATS and BC is 4-2 ATS. LW was your typical 2014 FSU gm as they trailed 23-7 late 1H but would outscore the Canes 23-3 after that as we cashed a 3★ on these pages on the Noles who were only laying 2.5. BC is 2-0 ATS TY as an AD pulling 2 outright upsets (1-7 L/2 yrs prior) and should be relaxed as they have already clinched bowl elig in what was considered to be a rebuilding yr coming in. On the other hand, while they continue to win (now 26 str), pressure continues to mount on the Noles as they are the only remaining Power 5 unbeaten tm while taking everyone's best shot.

**Penn St by 6 over ILLINOIS** - PSt is 16-4 SU vs the Illini but 6-4 SU/4-6 ATS the L10. Visitor has now covered 5 in a row and is 12-3 ATS. There have been 4 outright upsets the L6Y in this series and

the underdog is 7-1 ATS. LTH PS was -1' and rolled to a 35-7 win but only had a 384-366 yd edge. LY the 2 comb'd for 52 FD's but somehow each only tld 17 pts in regulation. PS -11' survived a 24-17 OT win. LW the Nittany Lions got to bowl elig for the 1st time 3 yrs (probation) as they beat Temple 30-13 (-12). On the other side, coming off a bye and seeing the return of QB Lunt (out prev 4 gms), the Illini were dominated by Iowa 30-14 (+3') getting outgained 587-235. Lunt was only 14-25-102-1-0. Illinoi's bowl hopes are on life support now but they do support a 8-4 ATS record as a HD, have covered 3 str home finales and Penn St is 1-5 ATS in conf play TY. All of PSt's AG's TY have been decided by 6 or less and we look for more of the same here.

**Wisconsin by 10 over IOWA** - IU is on a 6-4 SU/7-3 ATS run in this series but the HT is on a 0-3 SU/ATS run & due to the constant shuffling of div's & adding tms to the conf, this is the Hawkeyes 3rd str HG in the series. LY UW (-9) was fresh off a bye & IU ply'd a good game, leading 7-6 at HT. Down 14-9 after 3Q's, a pass bounced off an OL's helmet & a Badger int led to a 25 yd td drive. The 28-9 final score was misleading. UW now controls its own destiny in the B10 West Div after their 59-24 (-6') home win over NU. RB Gordon broke Ladanian Tomlinson's FBS rushing rec of 406 yds with 408 yds & could have run for 500 but he didn't even play the entire 4Q! Gordon had 6 rushes of 35+ yds, 3 more than NU had all'd all ssn. The Hawkeyes are off a 30-14 (-3') win at Illinois as they rushed for a ssn high 304 yds & had 26-12 FD & 587-235 tld yd edges. IU finds itself as an HD for the 1st time TY (5-2-1 run) while UW is on the road for the 3rd time in 4 wks & but is on a 5-2 run as an AF Tough going against the Badgers here as they have covered 4 str gms and have their sights set on a div title.

**Marshall by 20 over UAB** - MU is on a 7-2 SU/6-3 ATS run in the series while the HT is on a 7-2 SU/6-3 ATS run and there have been 5 outright upsets the L9Y. LY the Thundering Herd were p'g w/legit revenge after they felt UAB had out-physiced them the previous year. MU rolled up 657 yds but all'd 464 (100 on their final 2 drives trailing 56-14) in their 56-14 (-24) trouncing. The Herd exacted revenge on Rice LW in their 41-14 (-21') win. QB Cato broke Chad Pennington's sch'l rec for car td passes (117) while also extending his FBS rec of 42 str gms throwing a td pass. MU is 1 of just 2 FBS tms to remain undefeated as they improved to 10-0 for the 1st time s/99 & are still the only FBS tm to score 35+ pts in every gm this ssn. UAB enters fresh off a bye & a 40-24 (+4) home loss to LT the week prior. This is the Blazers FHG (0-2 SU/1-4 ATS run) but they are on an 8-4 run as a HD (0-1 TY). The Herd were 1-8-1 as an AF but are 4-1 TY and they continue to make statements week after week as the playoff committee has not yet given them any love.

**COLORADO ST by 17 over New Mexico** - CSU is on a 5-1 SU/4-2 ATS run in this series incl winning 4 in a row SU while the HT is on a 5-1 ATS run. The Rams 66-42 (-6') win at NM LY was their 2nd most pts in a conf gm (76 vs UTEP in '73) while the 649 yds were the 3rd most in school history. CSU enters fresh off a bye & a 49-22 (-20) home win over Hawaii the week prior & have a trip to AF on deck. NM is off a respectable 28-21 (+18) road loss to UTSt as they were only outFD'd by 1 & out'd by 22 yds as we cashed a College Totals LPS on the UNDER. This is the FHG for the Rams, who've won 2 str & covered 3 str in that role while also being on a 9-4 run as a HF. This will be the 2nd str MW AG & 3rd in 4 wks for the Lobo's, who are 4-0 ATS as an AD TY. Tough to lay too many here vs a feisty Lobos squad.

**WKU by 7 over Utsa** - First meeting. UTSA has had 2 extra days to prep as they're coming off a 12-10 (-9) home win over SM last Thurs. WKU enters just 1 win away from being bowl eligible for a 4th str ssn as they enter off a 52-24 (-10) home win over Army. Hilltopper RB Allen set a CUSA rec by rushing for 345 yds as WKU won B2B gms for the 1st time TY & they've scored 416 tld pts which is their most since moving up to the FBS in 2007. The Roadrunners are on a 1-7 ATS run, but are on a 7-5 run as an AD. This is the 3rd str & FHG for the Hilltoppers (3-0 SU run in home finales) but they are just 6-13 all-time as a HF. While WKU is just 3-10 ATS in conf play the L2Y, they must win this gm to have any chance at making a bowl as they will be a heavy underdog next week at Marshall.

**Boise St by 14 over WYOMING** - BS has dominated this series winning 8 str (4-4 ATS but have covered 3 of L/4), while the HT is on a 4-4 SU/2-6 ATS run. LY after a BS fumble, WY went 46/6 for a td and a 7-0 lead, which would be their lone highlight of the gm. BS led 28-7 at HT & won 48-7 (-24) w/a 524-265 yd edge. The Cowboys are fresh off a bye & a 20-3 (+7) home loss to UTSt the week prior. The Broncos were down 20-0 late 2Q, but kept their Mountain Div hopes alive with a come from behind 38-29 (-14) home win over SDSSt. This is the FHG for WY and they are on a 4-10 SU (3-1 run)/1-8 ATS run in that role & are just 2-5 as a HD the L3Y with a loss eliminating them from bowl eligibility. BS is on a 24-11 run as an AF but are just 2-2 TY. Tough laying too many pts here w/a Boise St D all g 30 ppg and in their L/3 road trips all'd 49 to NM, 46 to Nev and lost outright to AF.

**Iowa ST by 1 over Texas Tech** - TT is on a 7-3 SU/6-4 ATS run in this series, but ISU has covered 3 of the L/4 meetings. LY TT had a 666-311 yd edge, but gave up a late td and only won 42-35 (-14). The Red Raiders are off a 42-30 (+13) home loss to OU as they couldn't hang onto 14-7 HT & 21-7 3Q leads. They did get a backdoor 39-yd Hail Mary TD pass on the final play much to the dismay of OU backers. The Cyclones are fresh off a bye & a 34-14 (-3) loss at KU the week prior as we cashed a 4★ LPS going against them. Both teams have been eliminated from post ssn play and will call for this to go down to the wire.

**Ole Miss by 3 over Arkansas** - Arkansas is on an 8-5 SU/9-4 ATS run in this series, but has lost B2B gms SU. They haven't lost 3 str s/1991-'93. LY UA trailed by 3 early 3Q but all'd B2B 75 & 52 yd td passes (3:06 span) in their 34-24 (+17) loss. UM is essentially off B2B byes after not p'g LW & beating an FCS tm 48-0 (-50') the week prior. The Hogs snapped a 17 gm SEC losing streak while getting their 1st SEC shutout s/2002 after their 17-0 (-2') win over LSU. Ark limited LSU to just 12 FD's & 123 tld yds. We easily cashed our 3★ LPS on the UNDER. This is the FHG for the Hogs (6-1 ATS run, B2B SU losses) & they are just 2-4 as a HD under HC Bielema. The Rebels have their all important Egg Bowl gm on deck & are just on a 3-8 ATS run as an AF. Against their 4 common SEC foes, Ole Miss is 2-2 SU/ATS, +3 ppg & -73 ypg while UA is 1-3 SU/3-1 ATS, -4 ppg & -14 ypg. We wonder if Ark will be too busy celebrating that rare win (tore down goal posts) while Ole Miss is fully rested.

**BAYLOR by 31 over Oklahoma St** - OSU is on a 6-2 SU/13-3-2 ATS series run, but Baylor is p'g with legit revenge. LY the Bears came in undefeated at #3 and were an 8' pt road fav. BU was playing with BCS pressure and worried about Ohio St, Fla St and Bama. Perhaps the key play of the game happened in the 1Q, BU had 1&g1 at the 1 after a 28 yd run but QB Petty tripped and fmb'l'd and OSU went 99/7 for a td to lead 7-0. OSU went on to win in a route 49-17, costing the Bears a Nat'l title gm appearance. We easily cashed a 3★ LPS going against the Pokes in their 28-7 (+2') home loss to UT as they're offense continues to struggle, being held to a ssn low 192 tld yds. BU enters fresh off a bye & a dominating 48-14 (+5') win at OU the wk prior. The Bears are on a 16-3 ATS run as a HF (3-1 TY) & will be looking to impress the Playoff Committee after a lackluster outing by TCU LW appears to have opened the door. OSU is 0-2 as an AD. The Pokes are -207 ypg vs our #3 sked the L4 wks while BU is +187 ypg vs our #12 sked during that same span. Bears roll!

**HOUSTON by 20 over Tulsa** - Houston is on a 4-1 ATS streak in this series but the visitor is on a 3-0 SU/ATS run. The last time these schools faced were as CUSA rivals with Tulsa winning on the road 41-7 (-3'). The Golden Hurricane haven't won B2B in this series s/92-'93. The Cougars enter fresh off a bye after arguably the AAC upset of the yr in their 31-24 (-17') home loss to Tulane. UT is off a 31-7 (+20) loss at UCF on Friday night as they were held to just 11 FD & 201 tld yds. This is the FHG for UH (2-0 SU/ATS) & they are on a 5-1 ATS run after a reg ssn bye, but just 3-6 as a HF. This is UT's 2nd str AG & 3rd in 4 wks & they're on a 2-5 run as an AD. The Cougars are 1 win away from becoming bowl eligible for the 3rd str yr & are +56 ypg vs our #80 sked while the Golden Hurricane are -52 ypg vs our #89 sked the L/4 wks.

107th all-time meeting in this rivalry which is known as "The Big Game." Cal had dominated going 7-1 SU from '02-'09 and had a 7-2 ATS run but SU has taken control going 4-0 SU/3-1 ATS since. The visitor is on a 4-1 ATS run. LY prior to the game UO lost earlier in the day, SU just needed a win to get to the P12 Title game and came out charged up. Ty Montgomery scored the first 4 times he touched the ball and Kevin Hogan hit 17-26-329 after throwing for 318 yds the previous 3 gms comb'd. Cal QB Goff separated his shoulder in the 2Q. The Cardinal won 63-13 (-31') breaking the rec for most pts scored by 1 tm & the largest MOV in the Big Game. Cal is off a 38-30 (+15) loss at USC on Thurs night & was down 31-2 late 2Q before they decided to make a gm of it. SU is off a 20-17 (-7) 2OT home loss vs UT despite holding the Utes to just 247 yds as again their offense failed them. It marked the 1st time the Cardinal have dropped B2B gms s/'09 & it was their 6th str loss to an AP ranked foe (5 TY) after having won 10 str over ranked opposition before that. Stanford is 0-3 ATS as an AF TY and it's tough laying nearly a TD w/a tm that has trouble scoring (avg 15 ppg away from home) Cal can become bowl elig w/a win and they are 6-1 ATS as a dog TY w/their only non-cover by a 1/2 pt.

**OREGON by 28 over Colorado** - While UO has the Civil War on deck, they are off a bye and this is their FHG. The Ducks are on a 1-6-1 ATS run in that role not incl gms vs OSU. CU is also off a bye and has their FHG on deck. The Ducks are 3-0 SU/ATS in this series in P12 play, winning by an avg score of 57-11 w/an avg line of -39. LY UO (-39) trailed 10-8 but scored the next 21 pts in their 41 pt win. The Ducks won their L/gm at Utah 51-27 (-8) as they benefitted from a UT player dropping the ball at the 1 yd line as he was going to put the Utes up 14-0, but instead UO ret'd the fumble 99 yds for a td. The Buffs lost 38-20 (+17) at Ariz in their L/gm as they're still searching for their 1st P12 win on the ssn. CU got within 24-20 4Q, but all'd 2 Ariz td's with under 10 min to play. These tms have 4 common foes & the Ducks are 3-1 SU/ATS, +12 ppg & +34 ypg while the Buffs are 0-4 SU/2-2 ATS, -10 ppg & -13 ypg. CU has lost 18 str vs ranked foes (5-13 ATS) & are on a 6-18 run as an AD while UO has covered 5 str gms overall. Ducks continue to roll.

**NORTH TEXAS by 3 over Fiu** - These CUSA schools were SBC rivals from 2005-'12, but haven't met s/'11. FIU lost the 1st 2 gms in this series but is on a 5-0 SU/ATS run winning by an avg of 21 ppg. The last meeting was HC McCarney's NT debut. The Mean Green trailed 28-0 into the 2Q & never got any closer than 21 pts in their 41-16 (+14) loss. We upgraded our 4★ on these pages & easily cashed our 5★ GOY (Now 26-7, 79%) going against NT in their 35-17 (+6) loss at UTEP. The Mean Green were down 28-0 at HT & were held to just 13 FD's & 207 ttl yds in the gm. FIU is off a 38-28 (+5) outright upset win over MT as they forced 5 TO's (a recurring theme in 3 of their wins TY, outgained in all). This is the Golden Panthers final gm of the ssn & while they are just 5-4 as an AD under HC Turner, they're 3-0 TY incl an outright upset over UAB. NT hasn't left the state of Texas s/ Oct 11th & this is their FHG. They're on a 2-4 SU/4-2 ATS run in that role & they're on a 9-4 run as a HF. We're not a fan of either of these tms as of late and we'll just take the HT by a FG.

**LOUISIANA by 16 over Appalachian St** - First meeting. After starting the ssn 1-3, UL has now won 6 str. The Ragin Cajuns are off a 34-27 (-7) win over in-state rival ULM in a gm they never trailed, but we did cash our Underdog POW on these pages by a 1/2 pt. UL finished with a slight 456-444 yd edge but had a 282-(-39) rush yd advantage & forced 3 TO's. After st'g the ssn just 1-5, App St has now won 4 str (3-1 ATS) after arguably pulling off the SBC upset of the yr in their 37-32 (+14) win at ASU. Down 13-0 & 20-6 in the 2Q, the Mountaineers led 37-20 late 4Q before all'g 2 td's with under 3 min to play. They finished with 29-14 FD, 549-314 yd & 41:46-18:14 TOP edges. This is the FHG for UL & they're 3-5 SU/ATS in that role incl being upset as a DD HF LY, but they're on a 4-0 ATS run the gm following a ULM win. This is the 2nd str AG for App St & they are 4-6-1 as an AD and it will be interesting to see if they can handle going on the road B2B vs the SBC's elite.

**UTAH by 3 over Arizona** - There have been 4 outright upsets in their 7 recent meetings s/'00. Surprisingly with the climate differences, the HT is on a 2-3 SU/1-4 ATS run. UT had won 3 str, but AZ has won the L/2. LY AZ finished with a 469-329 yd edge and the situation favored them as they were off a loss to USC on nat'l tv, while Utah was off their upset win over Stanford, the 1st time they'd ever knocked off a top 5 foe in the reg season. We had a 4★ LPS on AZ -3 (won 35-24). UT is off a 20-17 (+7) 2OT win over Stanford, which was their 3rd OT gm of the yr, their most ever. AZ is off a come from behind 27-26 (-9) win over UW as they rec'd a fumble w/1:23 left & nailed a GW 47 yd fg as time expired. They were out'd 504-375 & all'd UW to have a 36:05-23:55 TOP edge. This is the FHG for UT, who is on a 5-2 SU/0-4 ATS run in that role and AZ has rival ASU on deck. Two improved tms in Pac-12 play TY fighting for bowl positioning and we'll take the HT by a FG.

**CLEMSON by 42 over Georgia St** - First meeting. This will be the 2nd str ssn CU plays a non-conf gm the wk prior to SC. The previous time before LY was '79 (ND). The Tigers have now failed to cover 5 str gms & are coming off a 28-6 (-3) loss at GT as they were held to just 190 ttl yds & had 2 int's ret'd for td's. After getting st'g QB Watson back from a hand inj, he left w/a knee inj in the 1Q & Stout went just 3-11-19-0-3. GS enters fresh off a bye but this is their 3rd AG in 4 wks. They've lost 9 str gms SU, have never beaten an FBS foe and are on a 2-31 SU run overall (8-5 run as an AD however). CU is on a 6-4 run as a HF but the Panthers are 4-0 as a 30+ pt dud covering getting 34', 39', 54' & 48' pts. We were going to back the Tigers here, but will tame it w/Watson not expected to play.

**ARIZONA ST by 17 over Washington St** - While ASU has won 9 of 10 SU, they are just 5-4 ATS, but the HT is on a 9-3 ATS run in this series. WSU has lost 5 str trips to Tempe, losing by an avg of 32 ppg incl being shutout twice (L/win was '01). This is the Sun Devils FHG but they do have rival Arizona on a short week on Friday. They are on a 3-1 SU/ATS run in that role when the gm doesn't involve Ariz. ASU saw their playoff bubble burst LW as they lost at OSU 35-27 (-7) cashing another Big Dog play for us. ASU had a 24-14 HT lead but was out'd 498-367 on the day & down 1 had an int ret'd 35 yds for a TD w/1:38 left & was SOD w/1:10 left. WSU is fresh off a bye. LY ASU put up 55 pts, their most in P12 play s/'96. The Sun Devils are on a 10-6 run as a HF while the Cougars are on a 9-4 run as an AD. We'll call this one near the line for now and analyze throughout the week how the Devils are taking LW's loss.

**MEMPHIS by 21 over Usf** - These schools have met just twice s/'04 & UM is 2-0 SU/ATS, but LY was the 10th head to head meeting between the two coaches dating back to '98 as they were both starting QB's and ass'ts. LY UM only led 6-3 after 3Q but used three 4Q int's to help build a 23-3 lead (forced 5 TO's overall) & won 23-10 (-1'). The Tigers are off a 38-7 (-10') win at Tulane as they forced 5 TO's & had 2 int returns for td's as they remained in contention for an AAC Title. We easily cashed a 4★ LPS and a 2★ on these pages going against USF in their 14-13 (-10) win at SMU. They were fortunate to get the win as they were down 13-0 mid 4Q & scored the GW td w/0:44 left. Against 4 common foes the Tigers are 3-1 SU/2-2 ATS, +20 ppg & +155 ypg while the Bulls are 2-2 SU/1-3 ATS, -8 ppg & -87 ypg.

**MIDDLE TENNESSEE by 9 over Florida Atlantic** - MT has dominated this series as these schools were SBC rivals from 2005-'12. The Blue Raiders are on a 6-0 SU/5-0 ATS run in this & the HT is on a 5-3 SU/2-4 ATS run. In '12 MT ran for 302 yds and LY FAU cch's and players said they felt embarrassed over it. FAU had a 503-446 yd edge but suffered a tough defeat. Tied at 28, FAU was int'd at the MT36 and on the next play, MT got a 64 yd td run to lead 35-28. FAU got a td w/0:44 left force OT, but lost 42-35 (+3'). FAU enters fresh off a bye but MT had a bye 2 wks ago and this is their FHG. The

## TECHNICAL PLAY OF THE WEEK.....LOUISIANA TECH REVENGE PLAY OF THE WEEK.....BAYLOR SITUATIONAL PLAY OF THE WEEK.....PURDUE

Blue Raiders were stunned 38-28 (-5) at FIU. UP 21-3 late 2Q, MT was outscored 35-7 the rest of the way as they had 5 TO's. The Owls are on a 1-3-3 run as an AD (non incl Bama gm) while the Raiders are on a 6-4-1 run as a HF. MT is a win away from becoming bowl eligible for a 3rd str yr and we look for them to take care of business here.

**Cincinnati by 10 over CONNECTICUT** - UC is 8-2 SU/5-5 ATS in this series and have covered 3 str. The home team is 8-2 SU/7-3 ATS. Conn HC Diaco was the UC DC in '09. LY TJ Weist was the interim HC for CT and had been a WR Cch at UC the prev 3Y so he knew the personnel well. It didn't matter as the Bearcats won 41-16 (-14'). Conn is off a bye & a 35-21 (-4) loss to Army at Yankee Stadium. Down 7 & driving w/under a min left, the Huskies were int'd at the Army 1 & it was ret'd 99 yds for a td. UC is off a 54-46 (+1) win on Thurs night over EC that kept them tied for 1st in the AAC. After all'd the go-ahead td with 1:02 left, the Bearcats got the GW 47 yd fg w/15 left & then added a 20 yd fumb rec td for the misleading final. UC is 2-0 as an AF TY (avg cover by 22 ppg) & are on a 4-0 ATS run while Conn is 1-3 as a HD TY & have covered just 2 gms overall. Against 3 common foes Conn is 0-3 SU/1-2 ATS, -7 ppg & -131 ypg while UC is 3-0 SU/ATS, +16 ppg & +141 ypg. We'll take the Bearcats by DD's but do note the Huskies situational edge.

**Ulm by 9 over NEW MEXICO ST** - The last meeting between these schools was in '03 when NMST won 21-14 (-4) which was also a SBC gm. This is the FHG for the Aggies & they are on a 1-6 SU/5-3 ATS run in that role. ULM is off a 34-27 (+6) home loss to in-state rival UL as they were held to -39 rush yds, but QB Thomas threw for a car high 472 yds! This will mark the 5th str week that NMST is at home incl their 3rd str HG (2 byes). The Aggies are on just on a 5-8-1 run as a HD & a 1-6-1 ATS run overall, while the Warhawks are in their 3rd AG in 4 wks & they are on a 9-2 run as an AF, but this is the 1st time in that role TY (3-0 L3Y). NMST is -49 ypg vs our #127 sked while ULM is -20 ypg vs our #83 sked. Warhawks finally break their losing skid.

**UCF by 24 over Smu** - These two former CUSA teams both moved to the AAC at the same time so they have met 6 of the last 7 years. UCF is on a 5-1 SU/3-2-1 ATS run & the HT is on a 4-1 SU run & has covered 4 in a row. LY UCF had already wrapped up the AAC Title and a BCS bowl berth and SMU was hit with a rare blizzard with their coldest HG in history. Only a few hundred fans were in the seats as they offered free admission with the ice storm shutting down the Dallas area. UCF took their 1st lead w/14 left 3Q & won 17-13 (-14). The Black Knights are off a 31-7 (-20') Friday night win over Tulsa as they had 26-11 FD, 506-201 yd & 37:02-22:58 TOP edges. We easily cashed a 4★ LPS on SMU in their 14-13 (+10) loss to USF. The Ponies were up 13-0 but all'd two 4Q td's incl the GW w/0:44 left. This is UCF's FHG & they are on a 6-1 SU/5-2 ATS run in that role & are on a 19-10 run as a HF. The Ponies are on a 7-13 run as an AD and we'll call for UCF to cruise easily here.

**UCLA by 3 over USC** - Surprisingly, these two don't meet in their final reg ssn game as each has a game on deck. LA is fresh off a bye but USC had a bye & Cal the L2W. USC had dominated this series going 12-1 SU (9-4 ATS) but the Bruins have pulled upsets each of the last 2 years. UCLA last won 3 str from 1996-'98. The HT is on an 8-3 ATS run. Both were ranked LY (#22, #23). LA had 3 frosh OL but SC lost 2 starting OL to inj in the 1H and all'd 6 sks. The Bruins won 35-14 (+3'). The Trojans are off a 38-30 (-14) win over Cal last Thurs as they led 31-2 at one pt but all'd Cal to get the backyard. UCLA, on the other hand, is playing great ball winning 4 str and have covered B2B gms. Against 5 common P12 foes the Bruins are 4-1 SU/2-3 ATS, +10 ppg & +106 ypg while USC is 3-2 SU/1-4 ATS, +6 ppg & +27 ypg. Bruins make it 3 str in one of the top gms of the weekend.

**NEVADA by 10 over Fresno St** - FSU has won B2B gms & is on a 3-1 ATS run while the visitor is on a 3-0 ATS run. NV won 4 in a row SU in this series from '08-'11 but FSU ended that streak LTH ('12) winning 52-36 (-3). Bill Polian was not happy with the way the game ended LY. FSU had 1&GL from the 3 and could have let the clock run out but ran the ball for a td w/1:29 left to go up 41-23 (-20'). Polian said "I'm only going to say that if I were in that position, I would not have done that". The Bulldogs enter fresh off a bye with their FHG vs Haw on deck. The Wolf Pack had their 3 gm winning streak snapped LW in their 38-45 (+2) OT loss at AF. While Fresno needs to win out to get to a bowl, we look for Nev to get a bounce back win here as Polian will remind his players of LY's finish.

**HAWAII by 6 over Unlv** - UH is on a 4-3 SU/6-1 ATS run in this series & the HT has won 5 str SU. LTH was the season finale and UH led 41-0 in the 4Q and were only -3. UH usually has a good following at LV due to a large number of transplants. LY UH was down 36-17 4Q, but took a 37-36 lead w/1:44 left. LV then kicked a GW 44 yd fg to win 39-37 (-8). UNLV's L/3 trips to the islands have not been kind as they have lost by an avg 50-15 (-253 ypg) & have been shutout at HT in 2 of 3. The Rainbow Warriors snapped a 17 gm road losing streak & earned their 1st shutout s/'05 by beating SJSU 13-0 (+10) despite being outFD'd 24-11 & out'd 462-240 as the Spartans missed 3 fg's, dropping a td pass in the EZ & threw an int in the EZ while also fumbling twice. The Rebels are off a 42-23 (+23) loss at BYU. This is the 2nd of B2B road gms for LV & while HC Hauck is 10-16 as an AD, he is on a 9-5 run in that role. Also very tough DD's w/a UM tm off arguably LW's biggest misleading gm and have an offense that avg's just 19 ppg.

### Tuesday, November 25th

**Ohio at MIAMI, OH** - LTH OU came in #23 and was -7. MU jumped out to a 20-7 lead. OU tied it with a 38 yd fg with 4:41 left but MU got a 31 yd fg w/1:24 left and the 91st matchup of the Battle of the Bricks went to the RedHawks. LY OU was -26 at home and won 41-16 as MU was SOD at the OU 20 w/11 left. UM had won 6 in a row SU from '00-'05 but OU is now 7-1 SU/5-3 ATS, however UM has covered the L3 in a row. The Bobcats are off a tough gm vs NIU (this Tue) and travelling while MU has extra time to prep off a loss to CMU (L/Sat). OU could be playing for bowl elig while MU (much improved TY) will be playing for pride.

**Akron at KENT ST** - These two play for the Wagon Wheel Trophy and are just 12 miles apart. UA was actually 8-5 ATS from '97-'09. Kent won 3 in a row SU the next 3 yrs but UA reclaimed the Trophy LY. UA led 13-7 and KSt was int'd at the UA4. U Awent 60/12 for a 29 yd fg w/4:25 left, 16-7 (-1) HF) and that was the final. Both tms have had disappointing yrs as Kent (depending on UB gm) comes in winless in MAC play and Akron after a 4-2 start has dropped 4 str and have failed to cover their L/5. Depending on their UMass outcome, they could be going for bowl elig here.

## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ NEW ENGLAND by 13 over Detroit** - NE has huge situational edges here. They are 8-0 SU/6-2 ATS at home after a SNF game, 14-0 SU/10-4 ATS at home and are getting a DET team that just went across country. DET has just faced the #2 and #13 defenses and now is on grass (0-4 ATS) vs an elite QB in potentially bad weather after losing to a career backup. DET got Rodgers, Brees, Ryan, Tannehill all in domes (4-0 SU/1-2-1 ATS) giving up a 91.3 opposing QBR (16th). Since the KC loss Brady has avg'd 320 ypg (68%) with a 18-1 ratio (120.5 QBR) with Gronkowski avg 103 ypg (14.3) GB rec prior to IND. NE is 14-1 SU/11-4 ATS vs a foe with a winning record of 70% or more and with GB on deck and the tiebreaker over DEN they can't afford a home loss and show DET who's in charge here.

**3★ Kansas City by 17 over OAKLAND - Thursday**. On paper KC looks like an automatic fade off hosting the Super Bowl Winner, traveling on a short week and the Super Bowl runner up on deck who also happens to be the team above you in the standings. Now the reasons to back the Chiefs: #1 - Oakland is last in the NFL at home getting outgained by 100 ypg, #2 - KC is one of only a handful of teams which has both outgained and outscored their foes on the road. #3 - The Chiefs want to run the ball (#5 in NFL) while the Raiders defense struggles to stop the run (#27). #4 - When KC can run, QB Smith is a pinpoint passer comp 66% while Oakland is at the bottom on D allowing 67%. #5 - Look back at #2 and add the thought that their road slate being at DEN, MIA, SF, SD and BUF going 4-1 ATS (loss .5 pt to SF) #6 - Let's not be too harsh, as OAK does something well like lose games at home (1-17, L/18) and fail to cover at home (1-7 ATS, L/8).

## OTHER SELECTION

**2★ Green Bay by 14 over MINNESOTA** - MIN was pounded 42-10 as a 9.5 pt HD in the 1st meeting as they were forced to start Ponder due to injury. In his L7 games vs MIN Rodgers has avg'd 283 ypg (75%) with a 21-1 ratio comp 70% of his passes in each game with GB avg 35 ppg. This is the Packers only road game in a 5 Wk span where they are giving up 104 more total yds, with a much higher defensive QBR (62.0 vs 93.7) with 22.2 ppg vs 41.5 at home. MIN's defense is much improved under Zimmer (#31 to #12) but they went 1-3 SU/ATS vs Brady, Brees, Ryan and Stafford allowing a 97.7 QBR (7-2 ratio) with the lone victory being over ATL who doesn't travel well and simply had the wrong gameplan vs Bridgewater. Vs DET, BUF, WAS (Def's ranked 10th or better) Bridgewater has avg'd 171 ypg (61%) with a 2-5 ratio (51.9 QBR) being sacked 15 times. Yes GB is 24th but they give up a lot of garbage yards thanks to Rodgers' excellence. GB can't afford to let up with NE on deck and they are tied with DET for the div lead and we'll take the road team that's 16-6 ATS as a single digit fav.

## OTHER GAMES

**ATLANTA by 1 over Cleveland** - CLE came back to earth LW and it looked bad losing to a QB in his 1st career start on the road throwing his 1st TD pass to a DE. CLE was gashed for 213 yds (3.9) on the ground but after holding CIN to 86 yds (3.9) the week prior they lost NT Taylor before the game and LB's Dansby/Sheard during the game. Getting held to 58 yds rushing (2.4) at home ruined Hoyer's ability off play action and played into HOU's strengths. They will finally have Josh Gordon (87 rec 18.9) back and he's been able to workout (but not practice) all year long with the strong chance TE Cameron finally returns after missing 3 games. ATL sits atop the NFC South but all 4 wins have been vs Div foes. ATL is 5-11 ATS vs NDIV foes and have been outgained 430-325 TY vs them and outscored 29-17. Ryan has just an 81.1 QBR vs NDIV foes TY with ATL being outrushed 138 (3.9) to 83 (4.3). CLE is 3-0 SU/ATS off a SU loss under Pettine and we'll take the points here.

**PHILADELPHIA by 23 over Tennessee** - With a rookie QB at the helm the #31 offense off its marquee primetime game gets to travel to a hostile environment. Waiting for them is the #5 offense that is 5-1 ATS off a loss scoring 31 or more in each cover who has won its 2 games as a favorite of 7 or more by 17 and 24 pts. TEN hasn't scored 31 pts in a game TY with 5 of their 7 losses by 14 or more. In the Titans 7 losses they've given up 385 ypg (-7 TO's), 154 ypg rushing (4.3) which would be 32nd on the year, have allowed a 97.5 defensive QBR (12-4 ratio) with an avg loss of 28-15. PHI is 5-1 ATS vs foes with a losing record TY with a 408-359 yd edge (-1 TO's) with a 35-20 avg score. Kelly had a reputation for not letting up at Oregon and he gleefully showed that side in their shutout of the Giants earlier TY. DD non-conf HF's are 22-11 ATS and look for an embarrassed Kelly to not stop until the final gun fires here.

**INDIANAPOLIS by 17 over Jacksonville** - The Jaguars have covered 4 straight off a bye but have dropped 4 straight (by a 35-10 avg score) vs the Colts who are 10-0 SU/ATS in Div play. Bortles has put up fair stats in his 3 road starts (1-1-1 ATS) but SD was off a long road trip to BUF, TEN off the surprise loss to CLE and CIN had CLE on a short week on deck after beating BAL. The Jaguars are 0-5 SU/ATS vs foes that were ranked in the top 10 offensively prior to LW's games giving up 434 ypg, a 122.5 opposing QBR, -5 TO's and losing by a 33-14 avg score. Luck is avg 290 ypg (65%) with a 9-3 ratio vs the Jags and if the Colts lost to NE they are 12-1 ATS off a loss with him at QB. The talent difference is simply too large to ignore and the Colts are the play.

**Cincinnati by 1 over HOUSTON** - Ten days after getting embarrassed by CLE, CIN rolled the Saints as they exploited a defense they understood having faced Rob Ryan system when he was with CLE. While Dalton had nice stats (143.9 QBR 3-0 ratio) he had his lowest pass att's of the year (22) as the Bengals had a 186 (5.2) to 75 (2.6) yd edge and have rushed for 142 ypg (4.1) in their wins. Road teams that won SU as a dog while holding foes to 10 or less are 29-17-3 ATS. HOU without Foster, slammed CLE with a 213 (3.9) to 58 (2.4) edge on the ground so Mallett wasn't exactly put in bad situations often but he did showcase his arm. CIN is 15-7 ATS after winning SU as a dog and HOU does give up passing yards by the bunches (#31 pass def). Both teams are off big wins but the Bengals have the edge with a more experienced QB and are slowly starting to get healthy with a manageable line.

**BUFFALO by 7 over NY Jets** - The Jets are 1-4 ATS after a bye and 0-7 SU/1-6 ATS after winning SU as a dog. Teams that won as a dog prior to their bye are on a 2-10 ATS run and the Jets rest edge is negated by the Bills being off Thursday Nite. BUF will be in a foul mood as their playoff chances are very dim (5 losses to AFC foes) and have gone 21 offensive drives without a TD. So why side with the Bills? BUF didn't have RB Jackson and Watkins was struggling with his own injury they played MIA tough until a missed 47 yd FG gave the Dolphins the momentum. The Jets strength is their #4 run game but the Bills own the #10 rush defense and are 1st in the NFL with 38 sks. Vick has 102 pass att's but has been sacked on 14 of them (1 every 7.3 atts!), only has a 5.2 ypa (Jets have a 4.7 ypc) and is completing 56% of his att's. Yes, he wasn't taking starter snaps most of the year but the new CBA doesn't let teams practice during byes. The Bills have won and covered 3 of the L4 vs the Jets and we'll call for them by a TD at home here.

**CHICAGO by 3 over Tampa Bay** - The Bears decidedly have the situational edge at home for the 2nd straight in cold weather vs a warm weather team on the road for the 3rd time in 4 Wks. However, this is the return of Lovie Smith who was fired after a 10 win season in 2012 and Josh McCown who went 3-2 with the Bears LY. CHI is 3-12-2 ATS at home and Cutler deserves his share of the blame (10 Ints, 5 fbs) but this defense is a shell of what Smith used to run here. Minus the GB game, the Bears defense is giving up 346 total ypg with a 107.4 defensive QBR with just 13 sks since Oct. The Bears haven't had a chance to go to Forte (79 yds rushing 4.4 in that span) as Treisman has had to dump the run game. CHI clearly has the talent (not execution) to be a top 10 offense but TB's #27 defense is allowing 407 ypg and 30 ppg vs top 10 offenses. Both teams are off sorely needed wins and expect a spirited effort by the Bucs for Smith with the Bears coming away with a win by a FG.

**SEATTLE by 3 over Arizona** - SEA is 8-2 ATS at home off a loss but face a Div foe that beat them 17-10 at home LY as a 7 pt AD. The Cardinals had a 307-192 yd edge holding SEA to 2 of 13 on 3rd Dns as the Seahawks had 103 yds rushing vs 102 penalty yds. SEA also has huge issue here as Ctr Under (high ankle) is not expected to play for a team that is on a 1-5 ATS run. Wilson's mobility is an excellent asset but he's only avg 182 ypg (58%) with a 3-3 ratio the L4W (74.2 QBR). He has just 1 game w/a comp % over 54% vs ARZ while Lynch has just a single 100 yd effort w/ SEA vs the Cardinals avg 82 ypg (4.5). ARZ hasn't allowed a 100 yd rusher in 20 games, hasn't given up an opposing QBR over 78.1 in 7 games (6-10 ratio) and has covered 6 straight games and now getting points are the play.

**SAN DIEGO by 4 over St Louis** - In the past month STL has beaten SEA and SF, went toe-to-toe with ARZ (until Palmer was inj'd) and beat DEN. They've been outgained 339-243 in that span but have held foes to just 70 ypg (3.2) rushing with a 3-3 ratio and 15 sacks. STL went back to Hill who was solid with 220 yds (69%) 1-0 but the big surprise was 131 yds rushing (4.0) vs the #1 rush defense. SD dominated OAK statistically to 4 FD and 99 yds with 90 sec left in the 3rd Qtr but teams off a win vs OAK are just 4-10 SU/ATS afterwards. SD is thin at CB with 1st RD DC Verrett (torn labrum) on IR, are down to their 3rd string NT and Ctr Ohrnberger and LT Fluker were dinged up LW. SD has the edges at the skill positions but the Rams are not easily intimidated and with non-conference teams that won SU as a non-conference dog being 17-8-2 ATS we'll take the Dog here.

**DENVER by 13 over Miami** - The Broncos are 7-0 SU/ATS after a SU loss winning by a 39-18 avg score. Aside from the SB loss LW was the 1st time the Broncos were held to under 17 pts with Manning at the helm. We now have a cold weather team at home off an embarrassing loss vs a warm weather, sea level team. DEN did take some losses with their #1 TE, #3 WR and #2 RB all being KO'd of the game. Manning was held to a season low 75.3 QBR but this loss was on the defense as they gave up 131 yds rushing (4.0) to the #21 rush off coming in and a 102.7 QBR which was the Rams 2nd best QBR of the year. MIA beat a depleted BUF team (no real RB's, Watkins hurt, lost #2 CB) at home on a short week. DEN dropped 41 pts on OAK after Manning was upset over the loss to NE and now Fox is upset off the loss to STL with the defense struggling and the Broncos are the call but not in a shootout.

**SAN FRANCISCO by 17 over Washington** - SF is on a 5-2 ATS run largely due to a defense allowing 87 ypg rushing (3.8) with just 229 ypg passing (56%) 11-13 ratio (4 TD vs Manning) with a very manageable 6.2 ypa. The losses of LB's Willis and Bowman is offset by the return of Aldon Smith (3rd Dn pass rusher now) and the fantastic play of ILB Borland. Yes, SF has struggled trying to put Kaepernick in a primarily pass mode but he owns a 91.2 QBR in his L7 games (11-2 ratio) and the run game earned 144 and 148 yds the L2W on the road. SF gets a prime matchup here as WAS is giving up a 104.3 QBR so far TY (20-3 ratio) with their lone Int since the bye week coming vs TEN. WAS may be without their #1 LT and LG after giving up 6 sacks and 3 TO's to TB. What's more concerning for WAS fans is that they lost to the #29 offense coming in (#27 scoring) after a their bye week. Now they have to travel cross country with a road trip to IND on deck. With 4 of SF's remaining 5 games vs NFC West foes they can't afford a loss to an NFC team.

**Dallas at NY Giants** - The Giants are off their 3rd bad loss in a row since coming back from their bye and this is likely their last primetime game of the year. They get DAL off a bye who have their Thanksgiving showcase game on deck vs PHI. The Cowboys have covered 3 straight vs the Giants but the Giants have a well earned reputation for being a spoiler when their backs are against the wall. **Baltimore at New Orleans Monday**. This is easy as it's a first place team vs a 4th place team. Oh yeah, the team in 1st is 4-6 and the team in 4th is 6-4. After the Saints lost LW to Cincinnati the AFC North is now 8-1-1 SU vs the NFC South. Bourbon Street is in an uproar as the Brees lead Saints haven't dropped B2B at home since resting players after a 13-0 start in 2009. The Ravens are 10-2 ATS off a bye but I assure you the Saints prefer to get back on the field to attempt to clean their pallet.
