They were done in by 4 TO's and lost the TOP battle 35:18-24:42. They are now 1-5 SU/ATS on the year and we think Troy could be a "Play-On" team the rest of the year as they try to send their HOF cch off in style. Also they laid more pts to a better team LW and covered by DD.

FORECAST: TROY by 14

3★ Marshall over FIU - These two had a pair of recent meetings as they actually met in a bowl gm in '11 with MU winning 20-10 (+4). LY at FIU, the Herd rolled to a 48-10 win (-32) with a 558-262 yd edge. FIU is playing an 8th str wk and MU has a lot of players on the roster from the Miami-Dade area. The Herd continue to thunder on TY as LW we had a 3★ Key Selection on these pages on them and they crushed MT 49-24 (-23). QB Cato tied the NCAA record held by Russell Wilson w/a td pass in his 38th straight gm. They are now outscoring their opp by 31 ppg and their +266 ypg is #2 in the country. While FIU is much improved TY, they benefitted greatly from TO's in their wins over UAB and FAU (+9 total in those gms). LW they had 5 TO's and were beaten by UTSA who was down to their 3rd string QB 16-13 (+9). While it used to be an automatic play to go against Marshall on the road, they have easily covered their L/2. Cato breaks the NCAA record, Marshall covers their 5th straight gm!

FORECAST: Marshall by 27

3★ OHIO ST over Rutgers - Homecoming for the Buckeyes & 1st meeting ever between these schools. After their loss vs VT, the young OSU offense has taken off avg 56 ppg their L/3 contests. RFR QB Barrett became the 1st Buckeye ever with 4 td passes in 3 str gms after the MD win. OSU is off a bye (7-0 SU/5-2 ATS run in that role in the reg ssn) winning by an avg of 18 ppg. RU is also off a bye and the biggest surprise tm of the conf so far won their 1st ever B10 gm over UM in their last gm. The Buckeyes are +210 ypg & +24 ppg vs our #23 sked while the Scarlet Knights are +28 ypg & +8 ppg vs our #92 sked. Rutgers is on an 0-5 SU/1-4 ATS run vs ranked foes in the reg ssn & the Bucks continue to roll giving Rutgers a rude welcome to life on the road in the B10 conf.

FORECAST: OHIO ST by 28

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ SMU (+) Cincinnati - LY was the first meeting for these 2 schools. SMU dominated early as a 7 pt AD. SMU missed a 48 yd fg and had a 1st & gl at the 9 and settled for a 24 yd fg and only led 10-0 despite dominating the 1Q. SMU had a FD at the 13 wiped out by a hold and missed a 34 yd FG and trailed at the half, 14-10 despite having a 269-189 yd edge. UC had a 28-10 lead after 3Q but SMU went 92/6 and then 90/15 for td's with 3:27 left to get within 28-25. UC ran the clock. While SMU has horrible stats (-314 ypg, #128, -42 ppg), they just faced the toughest schedule in the country and is off a bye and their offense impressed us vs TCU and again vs ECar. This wk they will be taking on a Cincy D that has allowed 226 YPG more than what their L/3 opp's were avg on the ssn. Cincy QB Kiel (inj ribs) hit 31-57-355-3-3 LW but Miami scored on 9 of its 1st 13 poss & had 621 yds (led 41-13). They are playing a 6th str wk incl gms vs Ohio St and Miami and are on their 2nd straight long road trip. While they have yet to be close TY, we feel SMU is getting better and better.

FORECAST: Cincinnati by 7

2★ TCU over Oklahoma St - In '12 we used OSU as our 5★ OCT GOM and they delivered a solid 36-14 (-6) win at home with a 471-344 yd edge. LY the Cowboys at home won 24-10 (-7). They had a 17-0 HT lead (3 str TCU TO's) & a 268-62 yd edge. OSU is 9-1 SU/8-2 ATS in this series while the HT is 7-1-1. LTH ('92) the Cowboys lost 13-11 & in fact the last win in Fort Worth was in 1947. We cashed a 2★ on these pages LW in TCU's 61-58 (+9) hard fought loss at Baylor. They were up 21 pts w/just over 10:00 to play but gave up the final 24 pts incl the GW fg w/ no time left. OSU survived a scare from KU LW as they won 27-20 (-20) cashing us a 3★ LPS totals LPS winner on the UNDER despite being outFD'd 18-15 & outgained 379-275 as a 99 yd KOR td w/6:43 left was the difference. Despite coming off B2B to the wire performances, we think TCU will have enough left in the tank here to dispose of a Ok St tm that we think is vastly overrated and has only beaten the B12 lightweights to date (TT, IST, KS) and were fortunate to do so.

Thursday, October 16th

Virginia Tech at PITTSBURGH - LTH VT was -10' and #13 in the country and took Pitt lightly. We won a 4★ play in our Power Plays newsletter which we gave out FREE (get a FREE 4★ every Tue on button #9 by calling 1-347-677-1700) as Pitt won outright 35-17. LY VT was playing with legit revenge and had dropped 4 in row to Pitt dating back to '01. All 4 had been outright upsets. We used a 3★ LPS on VT (-7) at home and they led 19-3 w/3:27 left before Pitt got a gbg TD. Both tms have been Jekyll and Hyde TY as VT won their 1st 2 gms, incl an upset at OST but then lost B2B gms, before winning their L/2 gms. After a 3-0 start, Pitt has lost 3 str gms. Which team is Jekyll, which team is Hyde in this Thur Night matchup?

Utah at OREGON ST - LY Utah had a 539-491 yd edge but OSU made a late comeback and won in OT 51-48 (+3). The HT is now 4-1 SU/3-2 ATS with that one loss coming in OT. LTH OSU led 14-0 then 14-7 at the half. They were -10 and got a td w/7:41 left to get ahead ATS and Utah's L2 drives were SOD at the OSU18 and int'd at the OSU35. Both tms come into this at 4-1 SU but Utah is 4-1 ATS while OSU is 1-4 ATS. However, Utah is just 3-9 SU on P12 road.

Friday, October 17th

Fresno St at BOISE ST - BSt has absolutely dominated this series going 11-1 SU from '01-'12 and since FSU's lone win in '05, BSt had won by an avg of 46-15. LY FSU was -3' at home. We had a Fri Night Marq on the Over. FSU led 34-19 late 3Q but BSt took a stunning 40-34 lead with 7:04 left. FSU went 87/13 for a td w/2:14 left and BSt was SOD at the 49 w/5:56 left. However, BSt did get their 8th straight cover in the series. LTH BSt (-7) jumped out to a 17-0 HT lead and it was 20-3 when FSU got a td w/2:15 left to only lose 20-10. The Bulldogs are playing an 8th str wk while Boise comes in off a bye. On paper and series history, you gotta like Boise here, but the line could be inflated after Fresno's upset loss to UNLV LW.

Temple at HOUSTON - LY was a frustrating game for UH. They were in the red zone an amazing 9 times and had a 1&g six times. Yet, with 1:18 left in the game, they had a total of 15 pts before getting a td w/1:06 left in their 23-13 win. We had UH (-3) as a 3★ Key Selection on these pages and the Cougars finished with 32-19 FD and 524-324 yd edges and could have easily won by 5 td's. In their only prior trip to Houston (1989), the Owls were hammered 65-7. Both tms are off key conf wins as Temple beat Tulsa 35-24 (-17) while UH upset Memphis 28-24 (+7). Who takes the next step in the AAC pecking order here?

Saturday, October 18th

Syracuse by 6 over WAKE FOREST - The home team is 3-0 SU/2-1 ATS in this series. SU is a perfect 3-0 ATS in this series and 2-1 SU. LY SU got their first shutout s/'96. There were really 2 keys to the game. First, WF lost their best off ply'r, WR/RM Michael Campanaro to an injured collar bone in the 1Q. The 2nd was that WF was off the draining effort vs Miami, FI who they should have beat the previous week and left it all on the field. Nothing was left in the tank as they went on the road here. SU had a 352-213 yd edge. TY the situation favors WF as they are fresh off a bye and SU is off 4 big gms vs Maryland, ND, L'Ville and FSU and this is their 1st true AG s/Sept 13. LW w/a bkp QB and a new OC, they had a respectable performance vs FSU losing 38-20 (+23) as they were only outgained 482-412 (FSU did lead 31-6 and 38-13). They actually had to go to the 3rd stringer AJ Long who was 16-27-167. WF has arguably the worst OL in CFB TY as they have given up 25 sks and avg just 31 rush ypg (1.0). Their D has been respectable all'g 355 ypg and 24 PPG. However, they are -142 ypg vs the #73 sked while the Cuse are +23 ypg vs the #17 sked.

NORTHERN ILLINOIS by 17 over Miami, Oh - L/gm was the '10 MAC Champ (NIU's 1st series loss s/'98). Gm had 7 combined scores and 7 lead changes. Up 21-20 NIU punted w/2:48 left but all'd a 33 yd td pass on 4&26 w/33 left. The Huskies were dominated LW by CM 34-17 (-9) ending their 28-game home win streak and also their 24 gm MAC reg ssn win streak. CM had 30-19 FD and 552-341 yd edges and controlled the LOS w/a 283-110 rush yd edge. The RedHawks lost to Akron 29-19 (+15) LW. They were facing a bkp Zips QB for all of the 2H and trailed 29-13 before getting a late 91-yd TD drive (did have a 412-318 yd edge). Huge situational edge here to NIU as they are angry off a loss, are playing their 3rd str at home, (bye 3 wks ago) while MU is playing their 8th straight gm and 5th road gm in 6 wks. Huskies rebound!

Akron by 3 over OHIO - AU was 7-2 SU/6-3 ATS in this series from '99-'07 but OU has won the last 6 in a row SU by an avg of 37-18 (4-1-1 ATS). Three of the L4Y OU has had a 200+ yd edge but the LTH was their only recent non-cover as they were -20' and led 20-0 in the 2Q and 34-14 after 3Q but all'd AU 70/11 and 43/8 4Q td drives and only won 34-28. LY AU was +3' at home but OU led 30-3 with a 183-100 yd edge. OU led 40-3 (11:18 4Q) and got a 28 yd fg w/1:47 left. The Zips have won 7 of their L/9 gms dating back to LY after their 29-19 win (-15) over Miami, Oh LW. They did lose QB Pohl late in the 1H (CS) and bkp Woodson was 7-14-64 in the 2H. Their D managed 9 sks. The BG/OU gm was one of the more interesting box scores of LW as the Bobcats had 29-19 FD and 513-355 yd edges but lost 31-13 (E). OU did settle for 2 short FG's and was SOD 3 times. Despite being an AF for just the 3rd time s/'08 (0-1-1 ATS), we'll call for the Zips to come away w/a FG win here if Pohl can play.

MINNESOTA by 10 over Purdue - The home team is on a 4-0 SU/ATS run w/an avg MOV of 18 ppg. In the L/gm ('12) UM's 44 pts were their most in a B10 gm s/'07 as they led 44-7 early 3Q before PU scored the L/21 pts. LW Minny was outFD'd 28-14 and outgained 393-272 but beat NW 24-17 (-3) thanks to a 100-yd KR td. They are 5-1 on the ssn but are being outgained by 18 ypg. On the other side, while Purdue did trail 21-3, they rallied and were down just 7 late 4Q but was int'd and ret'd 15 yds for a td w/1:22 left in their 45-31 loss (+21) to Mich St. They were outgained 532-340. They are much improved TY and are 5-2 ATS. Huge situational edge to Minny here as they are off a bye and a HG and this is homecoming while Purdue is playing their 8th straight game. However, how can you lay DD's here w/a stagnant offense avg just 24 ppg vs FBS TY? We'll Bolter LW with the underdog here.

MARYLAND by 6 over Iowa - First meeting. LW, raise your hand if you had lowa and Indy combining for 59 pts in the 1H? We didn't think so as lowa had 5 games TY vs Power 5 teams and had not scored or allowed more than 24 pts in any of them. While the Hawkeyes won 45-29 (-3), it should be noted that the Hoosiers lost starting QB Sudfeld in the 2Q. Frosh Chris Covington, a converted LB hit 3-12-31 with 2 ints in the 2H. While MD does come in off a bye, Edsall is 0-5 ATS in that role here. Also the Hawkeyes have covered 5 str B10 AG's. Despite those technical edges, the Terps should be healthier for this one and lowa's D could be a little overrated as they all'd 316 rush yds LW to Indy and also have not faced a tm with anywhere near as close to the WR's that the Terps have in their line-up.

Baylor by 10 over WEST VIRGINIA - Things sure have changed since Baylor's last trip here. In 2012, BU was +11' and lost to Geno Smith and WV 70-63. LY BU was -29' at home and rolled to a 73-42 win that wasn't that close. It was 56-14 at the half as BU had a commanding 617-147 yd edge as our Early Bird POW (given out FREE every Monday at 347-677-1700 on button #9). Incredibly, WV has all'd 1572 yds & 136 pts the L2Y (only gms). BU has not been the same team on the road (see misleading gm vs TX 2 wks ago) and this is the Bear's 3rd AG in 4 wks. The Bears are coming off a huge effort as TCU got a 49 yd IR TD to lead 58-37 w/just 11:38 left. Baylor scored the gm's final 24 pts incl a FG on the last play to escape 61-58 (-7) but we did cash a 2★ other selection on these pages on the Frogs. There were a couple of ? calls that went against TCU late. Baylor did have a 782-485 yd edge. Not to be outdone by the Bears, the Mountaineers are also off a come-from-behind win as they trailed 34-20 mid-4Q but drove 75/7pl & 78/7pl for TD's then 42/8pl for a long 55-yd FG on the final play. WV did upset Okla St LY as a large dog (+19, 30-21) and went deep into the 2H vs OU earlier TY but BU is #1 in the country at +336 ypg.

Virginia by 1 over DUKE - This was our 1st Sept 5★ given out FREE to all Power Sweep subs back in 1984 and UVA won 38-10. UVA had won 8 in a row SU in this series from '00-'07 but Duke has now taken control going 5-1 SU and 5-0-1 ATS and there have been 3 outright upsets. LY despite the fact Duke was 4-2 and UVA 2-4 and Duke having won 4 of the last 5, VA was -2' at home. For the 2nd str yr, VA appeared to have the game in control. VA led 22-7 at the half with a 287-176 yd edge but Duke converted 4th down plays in the 2H and won 35-22. LTH, VA led 17-14 at the half w/a 321-186 yd edge but Duke dominated the 2H and won 42-17. We were greatly disappointed w/the outcome of the Duke/GT game LW as the Blue Devils were outgained 483-373 but benefitted from a 3-0 TO adv, 2 missed GT FG's and a ? decision right before the half in GT HC Paul Johnson starting to chase pts in going for 2, giving Duke some momentum in their 31-25 win (+3). UVA comes in off a bye and has cashed multiple times for us TY as they are 6-0 ATS (8 str covers dating back to LY). Despite being burned by them LW, we're not afraid to go against the Dukies here again as UVA is the superior tm that is rested and can smell a bowl bid.

NORTH CAROLINA by 3 over Georgia Tech - GT has dominated this series going 14-2 SU and are on a 4-0-1 ATS run. LY GT beat NC for the 8th str time at home. The Tar Heels led 20-7 w/9:18 left 2Q but from that point were outgained 324-98 (6 poss ended on 4 punts, int & half). They played in monsoon like conditions in the 3Q after the 1H was played in a steady rain. NC got an 82 yd td pass to Switzer to make it 26-14 early 3Q but a holding call wiped it out which was the key play of the game. LTH GT won a wild one 68-50 (+8). Keep in mind, LY NC was 1-5 and finished the rest of the yr on a 6-1 SU/ATS run. This year they are 2-4 and have clearly not given up as LW they went toe-to-toe with unbeaten ND on the road in a 50-43 loss (+16) as they were only outgained 519-510. Their 43 pts came against an ND defense that had given up just 60 pts all yr. GT's unbeaten ssn came to an end LW, as despite a 483-373 yd edge, they lost to Duke 31-26 (-3) as our 5★ Oct GOM. The Jackets were -3 TO's, missed 2 FG's and we won't go into detail how awful some of HC Johnson's time and game management were in the gm. After suffering their Bubble Burst and UNC gaining some confidence, we think the Tar Heels should kick off the 2H of the ssn w/a win.

LOUISVILLE by 17 over NC State - UL is 3-1 but in the L/gm ('11 Belk Bowl) lost 31-24 (+2). UL led 10-7 w/6:07 2Q but all'd 24 str pts until 2:00 left 3Q (outgained 221-59 in that span). Down 7, UL tossed an int at the NCS16 (on 4D) w/41 left. LTH ('94) NCS1 lost 35-14 and in their only other trip lost 26-2 in 1951. The Cards come in 5-2 SU/ATS after a near upset of Clemson LW. They st'd Bonnafo (5-13-62) at QB and then Gardner came off the bench and went 10-16-150. UL was SOD at the Clem 2-yd line w/21 left but it should be noted that the Tigers played w/o QB Watson for all of the 2H. NCS1 was not in a good situation LW as their opp BC was a physical team coming off a bye while NCS1 was playing a 7th str week. BC had a 310-43 rush edge but it was 14-14 in 2Q. NCS1 had just 56 yds in the 2H and their HC Doeren is now 0-11 in ACC play. Petrino is a great home fav and NCS1 is 2-7-1 ATS as an away dog.

MASSACHUSETTS by 8 over Eastern Michigan - First meeting. Both of these tms scored on "cloud 9" after picking up conf wins LW. The Eagles went to bkp QB Bell & he had 71 & 72 yd TD runs (8-13-144). Their opp Buffalo would have 6 trips in red zone but scored just 13 pts. EM was outgained 537-484 but won 37-27 (+14"). On the other side, UMass was down 10-7 but on 4th Dn got a 17-yd TD pass & then on 4th Dn again got a 4-yd TD pass with :03 left 1H to lead 24-10. Michigan transfer RB Woodley had 160 yds in the 40-17 win (E). QB Frohnapfel has thrown for 1,264 yds (12-3 ratio) in the L/3 gms alone and will be taking on a EM D that has all'd 355 and 383 pass yds the L/2 wks. However, while UMass won easily LW, not sure they are ready to start covering DD point spreads especially considering they are playing an 8th straight week and their opp just pulled off an upset as a DD dog.

BOWLING GREEN by 7 over Western Michigan - Dino Babers was the HC at E Illinois the L2Y and in '12 lost 52-21 (+23) vs WM. BG lost the L/meeting 45-21 (-10) in 2011. The gm was tied 14-14 but from that point WM scored 31 unanswered until late 4Q. WM is 8-3 SU s/95 incl 3 str wins by 30 ppg. LTH ('10) WM beat BG 41-7 (-6) despite just a 442-396 yd edge & -1 FD's. Both tms are off conf road wins. BG beat Ohio 31-13 (E) despite getting outFD'd 29-19 and outgained 513-355 while WM rallied from a 28-7 deficit to beat Ball St 42-38 (+2). While we have been impressed w/WM so far TY (5 straight covers), it's tough to ignore the disparaging home/away dichotomies here as BG is +79 ypg at home (-213 ypg on road) while WM is +153 ypg at home and only -26 ypg away. Look for the defending MAC Champs to move to 4-0 in conf play as they can take a breather after this one (don't play again until Nov. 4th).

CENTRAL MICHIGAN by 10 over Ball St - Been a back/forth series as BS won 4 in a row from '00-'03, then CM went 5-1 SU/4-2 ATS from '04-'09 but BS has now won the last 4 SU/3-1 ATS. The visitor is 9-4 SU/10-3 ATS. LTH BS (-3) was up 41-23 and CM got a td w/1:32 left. LY BS was -21 and it was even more impressive than the final score. BS led 31-3 at the half with a 355-193 yd edge. However, CM got a 22-yd td run for the backdoor cover w/1:33 left, 44-24. The Chips come in off arguably one of the biggest MAC wins in the Enos era as they ended N Ill's 28-gm home and 24-gm reg ssn conf win streaks in their 34-17 win (+9"). It was no fluke as they had 30-19 FD, 552-341 yd and 283-110 rush yd edges as we cashed a 4★ LPS Totals Play on the UNDER. Do you think Mich would like to have back Thomas Rawls at RB, as after LW's 270 yds (6.8), he has 499 yds in the L/2 gms alone. It's been a tough yr for Ball St HC Lembo who just missed out on a BCS HC job and now after going 19-7 the L/2 yrs have seen his Cardinals limp out to a 1-5 start incl LW's blown 28-7 lead in the 42-38 loss (-2) to WM. This is the Chips 8th straight game but we feel they could be a play on tm down the stretch especially with Rawls and WR Davis (363 rec yds L/3 wks) now back healthy and in the line-up.

Georgia by 4 over ARKANSAS - First time UA is hosting UGA in LR but they are 0-4 in Fayetteville. UGA is 6-1 s/00 vs UA but did lose the L/meeting ('10). UGA never led at any point but fought back to tie the gm at 24-24 after trailing by 14 in the 4Q. UA got a 40 yd td pass w/:15 for the win. LW was a great example on why we like to play on the Injury System. The rest of the team plays harder when a star is out and UGA w/o Gurley had a 379-147 yard edge. The defense got a SEC road shutout and Mizzou avg'd just 3.4 ypg. QB Mason said we have 10 other guys on offense and have a defense and we are not just 1 player. They're going to need an all-out effort here vs a much improved Ark tm that impressed us greatly LW even in defeat vs Bama. They had a 335-227 yd edge and did fumble into the EZ for a TB while also missing an xp and FG. While UGA is on B2B road gms, they do have a bye on deck and we can't back an Ark tm in an SEC gm until they prove they can win one (lost 14 str).

San Jose St by 3 over WYOMING - These two met LY for the 1st time s/97. SJS was -8' at home but WY led almost the entire game. The Cowboys led 23-14 at the half with a 322-267 yd edge. WY got a td on the 2nd play of the 3Q to go up 30-14. SJS got a td to lead 36-30 after 3Q. The next 4 poss all went for td's with SJS getting a 1 yd td run by QB Fales w/:08 left to pull out the 51-44 win. The Spartans come in off a bye after a 33-10 win (-10) over UNLV. The Pokes meanwhile played a Hawaii team that st'd a bkp QB & RB and would lose both of those bkps late 1H. They led 21-10 in the 1H aided by a 78-yd FR td (14 pt swing) but would lose 38-28 (+6). While SJS is just 2-3 on the ssn, they are +73 ypg while WYom who is 3-3 is getting outgained by 86 ypg TY. That gives us some value here on the road dog.

AIR FORCE by 13 over New Mexico - AF is now 8-2 SU in this series and 7-3 ATS. The visitor is 6-3 ATS. LTH NM was +11 and trailed 28-17 when they got a td early 4Q to pull within 28-23. NM had a 444-366 yd edge. LY's loss snapped AF's 5 gm series win streak. AF trailed 21-7 early 2Q but led 28-27 w/6:49 3Q. Down 7 AF drove 71/14pl for a td but the XP was blk'd. NM reeled off 10 str pts before AF kicked a fg w/1:24 (onside failed). Both tms come in off conf losses. The Falcons gave up a 75-yd TD on the 1st play, fumbld in to the EZ for a TB and settled for 2 short FG's in their 34-16 loss (+7) to Utah St. NM, meanwhile was outgained 470-263 vs SDS in their 24-14 loss (+4). With a game that pits option vs option, the Falcons clearly have the adv in defending it as they are all'g just 108 rush ypg (3.4) while NM is all'g 285 rush ypg (6.4).

TULSA by 3 over South Florida - First meeting. Even though it might not show in the W/L column, USF is much improved TY. They were tied with Wisconsin 3-3 at HT. LW they led ECAR 17-7 but would lose 28-17 (+17), still cashing as our NC Sports Complimentary College POW (play that just missed out being a ★-rated LPS, and given out free on button #3 every Saturday by calling 1-347-677-1700). LW Tulsa had a 24-21 FD edge at Temple but the Owls had a Fabe FG for a TD and also a Tulsa FG went off the upright & they were SOD at the 1. This is a must win for Tulsa as a win could turn their season around as they have a bye on deck. Tulsa is -85 ypg and USF -112 vs similar skeds. Also this is the 1st trip to Oklahoma for USF.

LOUISIANA TECH by 14 over Utsa - Good spot for LT as they are fresh off a bye. LTH LT was -30' and won 51-27. LT only led 37-27 before getting the game's last 2 scores incl a td w/14 left. LY UTSA was -16 at home and rolled to a 30-10 win with a 475-193 yd edge. LW FIU led 10-0 on drives combining for 23 yds (off TO's). UTSA QB Carter was out, and bkp QB Bogenschutz got hurt in the 1Q so they had to go to the 3rd string QB. Still they got a FG w/:50 left to win it. It's been an up and down season for the Bulldogs who have 3 blowout wins, 2 blowout losses (albiet to OU and Aub) and a loss to FCS Northwestern St. While they are just 3-6 ATS as a HF, they are a perfect 5-0 ATS vs FBS tms TY. On the flip side, UTSA has failed to cover 4 str gms (high preseason expectations and a nice start inflated their lines). La Tech is a very respectable +30 ypg (+6 ppg) vs our #34 sked while UTSA is -48 ypg (-4 ppg) vs the #53 sked.

NORTH TEXAS by 10 over Southern Miss - These two met in a bowl game in '04 with SM winning 31-10 (-6). LY SM came in winless and was a 12 pt HD to NT. They could have been getting 3x that amount and it wouldn't have been enough. NT went into Hattiesburg and had 529-249 yd and 30-10 FD edges in front of a homecoming crowd. NT's 55 pts were their most in a road game s/62. NT had a 383-144 yd edge at the half. This is NT's only home game in a 6 wk span and McCarney is 9-3 ATS as a HF. They are fresh off a 56-21 loss (+6') to UAB which could be the misleading gm of the wk. UAB got a 40 yd FR TD & a 22 yd IR TD on B2B plays to lead 14-0 & had a 5-0 TO edge (later 9 yr IR TD) as NT had a 451-446 yd edge. Still we cashed our top weekly LPS Totals play on the OVER by nearly 3 td's. S Miss comes in off a bye but is just 5-11 ATS as an AD. Look for the Mean Green to get a bounce back win here.

BYU by 7 over Nevada - In '01 and '02, the HT was 2-0 SU/ATS covering by 18.5 ppg. The visitor has won the 2 recent meetings. NV won here in '10, 27-13 (-4). LY BYU was -15' at NV. At the half NV had a 190-150 yd edge and led 7-0 but BYU's offense got in gear in the 2H and would win 28-23. While the Cougars lost QB Hill for the ssn and they have lost B2B gms, we actually came away impressed w/them LW even though we cashed another Thur Night Marquee going against them in their 31-24 loss (+2) to UCF. Bkp QB Stewart was 22-37-153-3-1 and had 52 rush yds as they blew a 24-10 2H lead. On the flip side, Nev has dropped B2B conf HG's with their late rally coming up

short LW (trailed 31-3) in their 31-24 loss (+2). The WolfPack could actually be happy to be on the road here as they only lost to Arizona by 7 earlier TY and beat San Jose St by 11. BYU is 0-3 ATS as a HF TY and we can't believe they continue to lay DD's.

Army by 3 over KENT ST - Black Knights are 2-1 (all gms after '06) incl a 45-28 win (+1) the LTH ('10). Army led 28-7 at HT & KSU never got closer than 14 in the 2H despite Army being outgained 410-382. Army was +4 in TO's (14 pts). In the L/gm ('12) KSU won 31-17 (-2). The gm was scoreless into the 2Q but KSU led 14-0 at HT & 24-3 into the 4Q. The Golden Flashes were outgained 457-367, outFD'd 27-12 & Army ran 42 more plays (90-48). LW Army lost to Rice 41-21 (+1) but the yds were reasonable (only outgained 391-341, -2 TO's). On the other side, Kent led UMass 10-7 but UMass on 4th Dn got a 17 yd TD pass & on 4th Dn again got a 4 yd TD pass with :03 left in the 1H to lead 24-10 as the Flashes were rolled 40-17 (E). They are now 0-6 SU/1-5 ATS (-185 ypg) while Army is getting outgained by only 34 ypg. While we are well aware that Army is 0-11 ATS as an AF, and haven't covered in that role s/96 (lost 18 str road gms), Army has taken on 2 MAC teams TY and beat them both, Buffalo handily and Ball St by 9 and both teams are better than Kent St.

Stanford by 7 over ARIZONA ST - LY the situation favored SU as AST was off a big home win over Wisc and had USC and ND on deck and having to travel while SU was off a couple easy non-Power 5 foes and at home. The game was a misleading stat gm and misleading final. Taylor Kelly had 96 yds pass in the 1H but finished 30-55-367 doing most damage after SU led 39-7 (29-0 HT) after 3Q's. SU brought their bkps in for the 4Q to "only" win by 14. TY the situation favors AST as SU is on their 3rd road game in 4 wks with their previous 2 being vs Wash and ND and Arz St is fresh off a bye. These two also met in the P12 Title game LY and we used SU as a 3★ LPS and on the road they won here, 44-14 (+3) with 517 yds of offense. The Cardinal are off a 34-17 win (-16') over Wash St as they held the high-powered Cougar offense to 266 yds on 80 plays (3.3 ypg). They are all'g just 10 ppg and 238 ypg and will give AST by far their toughest test. In their L/gm AST got a miracle win over USC scoring 3 td's in the final min incl getting a 46-yard Hail Mary pass on the final play. Bkp Bercovici was 27-45-510-5-0 but str Kelly could be back for this one (CS). In these types of matchups (physical vs finesse), we like to take the physical tm especially considering Stanford's dominance over AST LY (never trailed in either gm).

OREGON by 21 over Washington - UO has now won 10 in a row SU in this series by an avg of 26 ppg. They have also remarkably covered 10 in a row as well. LTH Oreg was -24' and led 38-7 early 3Q benefitting from 5 UW TO's and won 52-21. LY UW was -16 playing before a loud home crowd vs the #2 Ducks. UO QB Mariota had not played into the 4Q in any game but had to vs the Huskies. UO was -13' on the road and only led 31-24 after 3Q's. The Ducks went 66/5, 75/8 and 60/11 taking a knee at the UW9 at the end winning 45-21. LW Oreg got LT Fisher back & all'd 0 sacks. Oregon got 10 & 13 yd TD drives after TO's & led 42-10 but were outgained 553-468 in their 42-30 win (-2) over UCLA. They are right back in the mix for a CFB Playoff berth and QB Mariota is back among the Heisman favorites. LW UW got a 100 yd FR TD by Shaq Thompson then recovered a fumble & got a 25 yd TD pass on the next play to lead 14-0. They would go on to win 31-7 (+3) but only had a 384-365 yd edge. Now they are on B2B road gms and the Ducks haven't dropped 2 str HG's s/02 and we look for them to continue series domination here.

Ucla by 7 over CALIFORNIA - This series has been dominated by the HT as they are 13-1 SU/11-2-1 ATS. There have been 2 outright upsets the L2Y. UCLA has lost their last 7 trips here SU incl '12 when they were pounded 43-17. Six UCLA TO's resulted in 27 pts. LY UCLA was -25' vs a banged up Cal D. Cal was working RB's at LB and WR's at DB and UCLA was playing with revenge. Cal fmb'd at the UCLA3 w/9:08 left which was huge as UCLA went 97/8 for a td and the cover w/4:41 left, 37-10 (-25'). The Bruins come in reeling here as they have dropped B2B gms and LW despite a 553-468 yd edge, they lost the all-important gm vs Oreg 42-30 (+2). They did trail 42-10 at one pt. After 3 str gms decided in the final seconds, the Bears ran out of juice a bit in their 31-7 loss (-3') to Wash LW. There were a couple of key plays early as UW got a 100 yd FR TD, then recovered a fumble & got a 25 yd TD pass on the next play to lead 14-0. Cal is just 3-13 ATS as a HD but we wonder what the Bruins frame of mind will be here.

MIDDLE TENNESSEE by 3 over Uab - These 2 have had played 2 lined games as in '00 UAB only won 14-9 (-10) at home and LY UAB was +3' at home and covered but still lost 24-21. UAB led almost the entire game but gave up a FG w/:03 left. MT got a 93 yd td pass and a 50 yd IR td to lead 21-13. UAB went 70 yds for a td and the 2pt tied it. MT from the UAB34 went deep with a 33 yd pass to the 1 and the 18 yd fg gave them the win. A UAB player had called timeout prior to the pass all'g MT to avoid a pen and :10 runoff. UAB is one of the most improved tms in the country TY and they are fresh off a 56-21 win (-6') over North Texas LW cashing as our Top Weekly Totals LPS on the OVER. After suffering a very misleading loss to FIU 3 wks ago (-6 TO's), they were +5 in TO's in this one and scored 3 defensive TD's and were outgained 451-446. MT was blasted by Marshall 49-24 (+23) and it wasn't even as close as that final as MT got a TD right before HT and then got a gbg TD late. UAB is 2-0 TY as a AD w/a outright upset as our Underdog POW on these pages but MT is 7-2 ATS after a SU loss. Two even tms looking for CUSA bowl positioning here.

ALABAMA by 21 over Texas A&M - This is Bama's only HG in a 7 wk span & after tough B2B road gms, expect a motivated performance. Meanwhile this will be A&M's 4th AG in 5 wks w/a bye on deck. LTH ('12) Bama was ranked #1 & off a big win at LSU but A&M pulled the upset. LY Bama was playing with revenge. A&M jumped out to a 14-0 lead but Bama led 49-35 & A&M went 79/10 getting a td with :15 left for the backdoor cover 49-42 (+8'). A&M did finish w/31 FD's & a 628-568 yd edge thanks to that final drive. Bama was tested LW as they escaped Ark w/a 14-13 (-9) win despite being outFD'd 18-10 & outgained 335-227. A&M was blown out for the 2nd str wk by a tm from the Magnolia State as they lost 35-20 (-2') to Ole Miss. They were down 35-7 mid 4Q before scoring 2 late td's (3rd str wk, they scored 2 td's late 4Q giving us line value here). We can't imagine Saban or DC Smart (embarrassed by last 2 years vs A&M) letting up and remember the Tide are avg 594 ypg at home (only 312 ypg on road).

USC by 21 over Colorado - Homecoming. USC is a perfect 8-0 SU in this series winning by an avg score of 35-10 with 2 shutouts. In P12 meetings the Trojans are 2-1 ATS. LY USC was in a massive flat spot off their huge win over Stanford with rival UCLA on deck. USC led 23-0 at HT (206-63 yds) but CU went on to cover 47-29 (+21). LTH ('12) CU lost 50-6 (+40') but only punctured once on 12 pass (6 TO's, 2 SOD, 2 made fg's and end of half). Big sked edge favors the Buffs as they are fresh off a bye while USC just played three bowl teams from LY incl'g knocking off the last remaining undefeated P12 tm AZ 28-26 (-2) LW which we cashed as a 3★ LPS going against them. The Trojans were fortunate to get the win as they were outFD'd 34-22 & AZ's kicker missed a 36 yd fg on the final play only after a fortunate USC TO (made the 1st one prior to the TO, also missed 2 other FG's). RB Allen rushed for 206 yds & 3 td's. The Trojans have been a Jekyll and Hyde team TY but they clearly are the better tm.

Michigan St by 10 over INDIANA - Homecoming. While the HT is 5-2 SU/6-1 ATS, MSU is 10-1 SU/9-2 ATS in this series. LTH ('12) IU (+15) led 17-0 1Q & 27-14 HT but MSU got the GW td w/6:35 left holding IU to 47 tt yds on their final 6 drives in a 31-27. LY MSU finished w/a 238-92 rush edge as they were an Inside Info Marquee Play for us. The Spartans went on to win 42-28 (-9). MSU is off a 45-31 (-22) road win but all'd PU, down 38-17 4Q to get within 38-31 before a "pick 6" w/1:22 left sealed it. IU is off a 45-29 (+7) loss at Iowa. After spotting the Hawkeyes a 21-0 lead, the Hoosiers cut it to 28-21 before all'g 2 more td's late 1H. RB Coleman had 219 rush yds (14.6!) & 3 td runs of 83, 69 & 45 yds but they did lose st'g QB Sudfeld (CS) late 1H and their pass gm completely went away w/a converted LB playing QB. Sked edge favors IU as this is MSU's 2nd str road gm w/rival UM on deck while IU has a bye on deck. Spartans get a 2nd consec non-impressive road win over a B10's bottom feeder.

Over 33 years this play has been a reader favorite hitting 216-167. The last 16 years the Underdog Play of the Week has recorded numerous **OUTRIGHT UPSET WINNERS (51!)** to the **incredible record INCLUDING 4 in '13 incl 3 straight outright winners AND ONE THIS YEAR!!!!!!** LW's **OUTRIGHT WINNER was on UAB +13', a 42-39 winner!** Here is TW's Underdog Play:

NORTHWESTERN +7' over Nebraska

Homecoming. In 4 recent meetings NU is 3-1 SU/1-3 ATS incl 0-3 ATS reg ssn. LTH Neb was playing with revenge and had a 543-301 yd edge, but only won 29-28 (-6). They trailed 28-16 before going on drives of 80/10pl & 76/6pl. The GW td came w/2:08 left (2ptng). LY NU was -4 & NW was w/o their top 3 RB's. NU had a 28-16 FD edge and 472-326 yd edge but needed a Hail Mary from Kellogg to Westerkamp which was tipped in the air and hauled in the EZ for a td on the final play to pull out a 27-24 win (no xp att). NW is playing a 5th str wk & is off a 24-17 (+4) loss at MN despite having 28-14 FD & 393-274 yd edges as they all'd a 100 yd KOR td w/7:19 left that proved to be the gm winner. Neb is fresh off a bye after nearly pulling a dramatic comeback at MSU as they were down 27-3 4Q before scoring the final 19 pts to lose 27-22 (+7). We have been impressed with NW's DL which should be able to contain Abdullah (just 47 yds vs MSU) and remember this is a NW tm that led Wisc 20-7 at home 2 wks ago and was one miracle play away LY from winning in Lincoln.

Clemson by 14 over BOSTON COLLEGE - Homecoming. BC has dropped 3 in a row SU in this series by an avg of 15 ppg (avg line +17). The HT is 4-1 SU/3-2 ATS in this series. CU is 5-1 SU/4-2 ATS and has won 2 of their L/3 trips here. LY CU had a big gm vs FSU on deck & had 23-12 FD & 496-286 yd edges but struggled. At HT they trailed 7-3 (3 blown fg's). CU got a td w/13:44 left 4Q to lead 17-14 & went onto a 24-14 win (-24). LTH ('12) CU trailed 21-17 late 1H but scored 21 str pts & went on to win 45-31 (-7). BC is off a 30-14 (+4) outright upset at NCSU. The Eagles had significant 24-13 FD & 411-217 yd edges incl 310-43 rushing. The Tigers are off a hard fought 23-17 (-10) win vs L'Ville. It was a D struggle with CU having a 12-10 FD edge but they were outgained 264-229. A goaline stand with :21 left preserved the win. Watson should be back for this and we'll back the Tigers.

OKLAHOMA by 10 over Kansas St - OU is on a 9-2 SU run in this series (63-9-1 all-time) but just 5-5-1 ATS. Surprisingly the visitor is 4-1 SU/5-0 ATS. Stoops was a KSU asst HC for 7Y. LTH ('12) both tms entered undefeated & KSU trailed 13-10 in the 4Q but went 38/7 and 77/8 for tds and won outright 24-19 (+16)! LY OU was playing with revenge. The gm was tied at 21 at HT w/ OU having a 321-271 yd edge. OU got a 74 yd IR td w/11:47 left to break open a close game and won 41-31 (-5) despite WR Lockett setting a KSU rec w/440 all-purr yds. Big sked edge for KSU who is fresh off a bye while OU returns home for the 1st time in nearly a month & had all they could handle vs UT in the RRR LW. The Sooners were outFD'd 24-11 & outgained 482-232 in the gm & had just 29 yds at HT but were fortunate with a "pick 6" & a 91 yd KOR td. HC Snyder dominates as an AD, covering 12 of the L/13 gms but we have to think OU's Stoops will point towards the LTH (only 1 of his 5 losses at home in '16Y) and get a solid win.

IDAHO by 5 over New Mexico St - Homecoming. There has been very little that stays the same in these 2 programs except that the two are almost tied at the hip. Both were in the SBC, moved to the WAC, were IND LY & now move back to the SBC. They've pl'd 16X the L17Y. The HT is 7-1 SU/5-3 ATS in that span. There have been 5 outright upsets in this series and NMSt has covered 4 str. LTH ('12) ID was -9' and led by 16 after 3Q but NMSt got a td w/1:55 left for the backdoor cover 26-18. LW NMSt was -3 & ID had the yardage edge (459-371) but NMSt won the game, 24-16. Both tms enter off blowout losses. NMSt is off a 41-24 (+7) loss at Troy where they gave up 570 yds & had 4 TO's. ID meanwhile remained winless on the ssn as they were crushed 47-24 vs GS, all'g 550 ttl yds. NMSt had lost 15 str road gms by 33 ppg before beating GST earlier TY and we'll back the home team here.

SOUTH ALABAMA by 28 over Georgia St - Homecoming. While SA is in their 6th year of FB & GSU is in their 5th this is their 4th meeting. The Jaguars have won 2 of 3 SU/1-0 ATS & the only mtg here was in 2010. In that gm (NL) SA trailed 14-6 but scored 27 str pts. LY was the 1st lined meeting. SA led 24-3 at HT & went on to the easy win 38-17 (-7) while having a 522-345 yd edge. Despite coming in winless vs FBS foes TY, GSU had covered 3 str until getting rolled LW in their HC vs ASU 52-10 (+10). It was essentially over after the 1Q as ASU had a 24-0 lead. GSU was outFD'd 32-18 & outgained 618-269 and had at least a half dozen str's sit out due to inj (most are ? here). SA is fresh off a bye & a dominant 47-21 (-3) win over App St prior. We look for the Jaguars to post a comfortable win here as they have only lost to #1 Miss St and a very impressive Ga Southern tm TY.

FAU by 3 over Wku - These CUSA rivals were SBC rivals from '07-'12. The visitor has won 3 str (2-1 ATS). In the L/gm ('12) FAU pulled off the huge outright upset win 37-28 (+16)!. LTH ('11) WKU won 20-0 (+2) which is their only series win (1-4). It was FAU's 1st on-campus FB gm. Both tms come in off a bye and both lost conf gms prior. FAU is -151 ypg TY but have played the #29 sked while WKU is +58 ypg but has played the #76 sked. We love playing on defensive home dogs and in CUSA play FAU is all'g 379 ypg while WKU is all'g 566 ypg.

COLORADO ST by 5 over Utah St - 71st overall meeting & homecoming for CSU. LTH ('12) CSU lost outright but covered 31-19 (+12). They trailed 24-6 4Q and got a td w/1:43 left after a 91 yd drive. LY was their 1st conf meeting s/61 (Mountain States Athletic). CSU was +11 and the game was basically even w/UTSt having a slim 191-185 yd edge in a game played in 25-35 mph winds. UTSt went on to win 13-0. The last time UTSt has won 3 in a row in this series was from 1973-'75! LW CSU had a 31-3 3Q lead & held on for a 31-24 (-2) win over NV. They are now 5-1 SU/ATS and are off to their best start s/the Sonny Lubick glory days. UTSt capitalized on 4 AF TO's and turned a 31-6 HT lead into a 34-16 (-7) win. The Rams are on an 8-2 run as a HF & the Aggies had been on a 14-2 run as an AD bur are just 2-4 in that role since HC Wells has taken over.

MISSISSIPPI by 14 over Tennessee - Homecoming. The HT is 3-0 SU/2-1 ATS s/'05 in this series. In the L/gm ('10) the Rebels were hammered 52-14 (+2). Ole Miss quickly trailed 21-0 and 'only' was down 31-14 at HT. In the 2H they had 4 TO's w/just 47 yds. LTH ('09) UT lost 42-17 (+6). The Vols only trailed 21-17 w/11:53 3Q but all'd the final 21pts. This series has been dominated by the Vols as they've won 13 of the L/14 meetings SU, but this yr's Ole Miss squad is clearly superior to yesteryears. After snapping their losing streak to Bama 2 wks ago, the Rebels snapped their 8 gm series losing streak vs A&M as they increased a 21-0 HT lead to 35-7 4Q before A&M scored the L/2 td's in the 35-20 (+2) win. UT is off a 45-10 win over FCS Chattanooga. Ole Miss is 7-3-1 as a HF under HC Freeze while UT HC Jones is on a personal 4-9 run as an AD. Playing similar skeds Ole Miss is +134 ypg & +24 ppg vs our #10 sked while UT is +31 ypg & +9 ppg vs our #16 sked. Ole Miss would get our vote as the #1 team in the country (not Miss St) but this is a bit of a letdown game after 2 big performances and their lines will be inflated now.

TEXAS by 18 over Iowa St - UT has dominated this series winning 9 of the L/10 SU but is 5-5 ATS. The visitor is actually on a 5-2 SU run with ISU's lone win coming here in '10. LTH ('12) UT won 33-7 (-10) jumping out to a 20-0 HT lead. LY UT escaped with a 31-30 (-7). UT also benefitted from a Hail Mary just before half to go up 17-13 and got a ? call at the end. UT pl'd inspired but fell short LW in their RRR gm vs OU falling 31-26 (+14) despite having significant 24-11 FD & 482-232

QB Richardson threw for a car high 351 yds. Despite pl'g our #3 sked, UT is +30 ypg while ISU is -109 ypg vs our #7 sked. We wrote a couple wks ago that we expect the Horns to get better as their youth especially QB Swoopes (334 pass yds LW) gains exp and we think they take another step here.

FLORIDA by 10 over Missouri - Homecoming & UF is playing with revenge. LY UF was -3 & got a 100 yd KR to open the 3Q to only trail 13-10 and was as close as 23-17 after 3Q but MO rolled to a 36-17 win and finished with a 500-151 yd edge. It would have been worse but they settled for 5 fg's. LTH ('12) MO had a 23-11 FD edge & their last 6 drives ended in UF terr but they came up short, 14-7 (+18). MO was shutout 34-0 (+3) for the 1st time s/'02 vs UGA LW as they were held to just 147 yds & QB Mauk threw 4 int's. UF blew countless opportunities in their 30-27 (-1) loss vs LSU as they had 3 TO's. The Gators are +28 ypg & +10 ppg vs our #15 sked while the Tigers are -23 ypg & +6 ppg vs our #25 sked. Missouri's offense has been completely shutdown vs SC (sans L/8 min) and UGA and we don't think they will fare too well here in the Swamp.

TEXAS TECH by 10 over Kansas - Homecoming. TT has now won 7 in a row SU/4-3 ATS in this series (+157 ypg) but the HT is just 3-6 SU/2-7 ATS. LTH ('12) TT needed 2 OT to pull out a 41-34 (-24) win. LY TT had a 290-144 yd HT edge & led 20-10 but would roll in the 2H in their 54-16 (-16) win. Both tms came to play LW but fell short. TT let a 34-20 4Q lead slip away as they all'd a GW 55 yd fg with no time left in their 37-34 (+6) loss vs WV. KU rallied to tie OSU at 20, but then all'd a 99 yd KOR td that proved to be the GW to fall short 27-20 (+20). We cashed a 3★ LPS totals winner on the UNDER. KU is on their 2nd AG in 3 wks & has lost 29 str AG's (10-19 ATS) but TT is on a 1-6 run as a HF. Kansas nearly upset a better Okla St team LW and have started to show some signs of life with their interim HC and you can't lay DD with a team off 4 straight losses.

UCF by 21 over Tulane - This will be their 1st meeting as AAC foes as they were CUSA rivals from 2005-'12. L/gm ('10) UCF won 61-14 (-18). TU is 0-2 SU/ATS in Orlando incl a 49-0 (+22) shutout the LTH ('09). TU was outgained 504-50 (28-7 FD) incl -30 rush yds (-1.2 ypc). LW we cashed a Thurs night Marquee winner on UCF in their 31-24 (-2) OT win vs BYU. After taking a 10-3 lead into HT the Knights all'd 21 str pts before scoring the final 21 pts themselves. QB Holman had a car high 326 pass yds. We cashed not only a 2★ on these pages LW but also a 3★ LPS on TU as they all'd just 217 yds & forced 3 TO's in their 12-3 (-3) win vs UConn. UCF is on a 16-9 run as a HF while TU is 0-3 as an AD TY and we think the Knights are getting overlooked in the AAC.

LSU by 10 over Kentucky - The home tm has won 3 str (2-1 ATS). In the L/meeting & also LTH ('11) LSU was -30' and suffocated UK leading 35-0 before all'g a garbage td w/4:22 left. UK had just 155 yds w/100 of those (65%) coming on its L/2 poss. UK is 1-5 SU/4-2 ATS incl 3 str losses in Baton Rouge. In fact, the last time UK won here was in '98. In those trips UK has been outscored by a combined 118-7 (-151 ypg). UK enters this gm having lost 17 str SEC AG's (5-12 ATS), but is off a 48-14 (-21) win over ULM. After spotting the Warhawks a 14-3 2Q lead, the Cats responded with 45 str pts incl 2 td's via pick 6's. LSU is off a come-from-behind 30-27 (+1) win at UF as PK Delahoussaye nailed a 50 yd'r w/0:3 left. It marked the 23rd 4Q comeback for the Tigers under HC Miles, the most in the FBS s/'05 when he was hired. While the Cats are confident and are just a play away from being undefeated (lost to UF in OT), winning in Death Valley is a little too much of a climb at this pt for this rising program.

FLORIDA ST by 10 over Notre Dame - FSU is 5-2 SU/3-4 ATS. The L/gm was the '11 Champs Sports Bowl. FSU (-3) trailed 14-0 w/11:11 left 3Q. From that pt they would score the final 18 & sealed the win w/a int in the EZ w/2:48 left. ND's only time here ('02) resulted in a 34-24 upset win (+10). ESPN College GameDay returns to the series that featured their 1st road trip ever (1993 #2 ND beat #1 FSU 31-24, +7). Both teams come in undefeated as the Noles have won a schl rec 22 gms in a row but have struggled to cover TY as they are 1-5 ATS. They had their chances LW to cover vs the Cuse in their 38-20 win (-23) as they were up 31-6 and 38-13. This will be ND's 1st true AG TY. Kelly is 5-2 ATS as a AD incl 3 outright upsets (two vs ranked foes) but FSU is 11-4 ATS as a HF. The Irish in a sandwich gm LW found themselves down 14-0 right away to NC but then had a 223-15 yd edge scoring 3 TD's. It was 28-26 at the half. ND had not allowed more than 17 pts all year but had to win a shootout 50-43 (-16) only having a 519-510 yd edge. Marquee matchup of QB's as Winston is avg 321 ypg (70%) w/a 11-5 ratio and is 20-0 as a str' while Golson is avg 281 ypg (63%) w/a 16-4 ratio and is 16-1 as a str. While ND hasn't seen this type of team speed since they were embarrassed in the Nat'l Title gm 2 yrs ago, we haven't been thrilled with what we've seen from FSU this year.

SAN DIEGO ST by 7 over Hawaii - SDSt has won both MW gms SU/ATS & is 4-2 SU/4-1-1 ATS in this series. The HT is 4-2 SU but 2-3-1 ATS. LTH SDSt was -21' and led 35-7 HT rolling to a 52-14 win. LY SDSt was -5. SDSt went 82/8 for a td w/2:34 left to tie it. In OT the Aztecs got a td and UH on 4&20 (after sk) fired incomplete. UH hasn't won here s/'88 losing 6 str but is off a come-from-behind 38-28 (-4) home win over WY. Down 21-10 at HT, UH scored 28 2H pts despite st'g QB Graham & RB Lakalaka being inj'd. UH had 25-17 FD & 513-322 yd edges. SDSt is off a 24-14 (-6) win over NM. RB Pumphrey had a car high 246 yds (12.3!) & 2 td's incl a 93 yd'r. The Aztecs had 19-15 FD & 470-263 yd edges (397-152 rush) & the final score would have been wider had it not been for 4 TO's. The Rainbow Warriors are 0-8 SU/2-6 ATS in MW AG's losing by 21 ppg (-121 ypg). However, we can't lay nearly DD with a SDSt team avg'd just 21 ppg vs FBS foes this year.

Arkansas ST at LOUISIANA - The HT had been 9-1 SU in this series but the LTH UL QB Broadway had 5 TO's and AST (+4) led 50-21 embarrassing UL on its home turf. LY UL was looking for revenge and they had 26-10 FD and 470-168 yd edges in their 23-7 (-2) win. Ark ST has a few extra days to prep following a 52-10 beat down of Ga St while UL is off a Tue Night tilt w/Texas St. Winner takes a major step to securing one of the Sun Belt's bowl bids. 4★ INDIANAPOLIS over Cincinnati - This is the 4th meeting in 5 years with the Bengals covering 3 straight including a 42-28 win as a 6.5 pt HF LY in 28 degree weather. Both QB's played well with Luck posting a 113.1 QBR and Dalton logging a 120.5 QBR but the difference was CIN controlling the ground game with a 155 (4.4) to 63 (5.3) yd edge. This time the Colts have the edge at home with extra rest and HF's off a Thursday Nite win are 14-5 ATS. IND also has the benefit of not facing AJ Green (foot) who is not expected to play here. CIN was taken a full extra 15 minutes at home by CAR and while WR Sanu (120 yds 10.9) and Bernard (137 yds 7.6) had big days CIN did give up over 400 yds to a CAR team that is still trying to find itself. IND has outgained foes by 170 ypg the L4W, have tallied a combined TOP edge of over 60 min in that span while holding 4 of 6 foes to QBR's under 85.0. The situation favors the home team with extra rest and more weapons here.

FORECAST: INDIANAPOLIS by 10

3★ Miami over CHICAGO - The Bears are just 2-6-2 ATS as a HF and are happy to be home after wrapping up 4 road games in 5 Wks while MIA is off a bye and a hard fought home loss vs GB. CHI had an easy time of it LW vs a depleted ATL team with an awful secondary pulling in a 478-287 yd edge. Minus the TB game though the Falcons have given up a 104.4 QBR TY and just 1 TD by Cutler is a bit disappointing. Yes, CHI did hold Ryan to a 73.1 QBR without their 3 starting LB's, nickel CB and lost their starting FS in the 3rd Qtr but ATLs OL is one of the worst in the NFL. MIA played GB very well for the majority of the game and their secondary is allowing a decent 88.3 QBR, are decent vs the run (110 ypg 3.8) and are much more physical than ATLs. While MIA is off a tough loss they now know they can hang with one of the best teams in the league and CHI has a road game at NE on deck. CHI is only 1-6-2 ATS hosting a NDIV foe and we'll side with the road team getting points.

FORECAST: Miami by 3

OTHER SELECTION

2★ BUFFALO over Minnesota - BUF is 14-7 ATS after losing to NE and 13-4 ATS at home off a loss. Despite their QB issues to start the season LW was the 1st time the Bills lost the TO battle TY leading to 13 NE pts to build momentum and take BUF's #21 run game out as a factor. Orton had a 94.1 QBR but was sacked 5 times, hit another 7 and BUF was fld'd 10 times. Now they get Bridgewater in his 1st career road game in a venue that is notoriously windy at this time of the year. MIN's OL has been horrible the L2W giving up 10 sks, 23 QBH's, 9 fll's which equates to a negative OL play in 30% of the snaps in that span. Bridgewater was held to a 41.3 QBR and now faces a Bills defense with 19 sacks, allowing just 67 ypg (2.8) on the ground. Minus the STL/ATL games MIN has been outgained 316-244 with a 1-9 ratio while giving up 22 sacks vs a 1-7 ratio allowed and 8 sacks. We'll side with the home team with a decent defense, more experienced QB and manageable line vs a rookie QB here.

FORECAST: BUFFALO by 10

OTHER GAMES

NY Jets at New England - Thursday Night. If you look up "brutal stretch" in the dictionary you find the Jets current schedule off a trip to GB, CHI on Mon night, DET, at SD, DEN and now they travel to NE on a short week. With that said it'll be no easy task for Brady to prep on a short week and his ankle surely bothered him last week. NE had won 6 straight vs the Jets before LY's OT loss but the visitor had also covered 4 straight prior to NY's 30-27 win (+3) at home.

WASHINGTON by 4 over Tennessee - The Redskins catch a break for the 2nd straight week facing either a sub-par Locker (75.9 QBR) or Whitehurst (93.8 QBR) after facing a less than 100% Carson Palmer. WAS is 5-2 ATS as a HF and they do get a good matchup vs the #23 rush defense off a win vs a rookie QB with 6 other rookies. The Titans invested a ton of money in their OL the L2Y and they have the #15 rush attack (116 ypg 4.7) to show for it (70 yds vs JAX) with 17 sacks allowed (28th). The problem with WAS is that Cousins has proven to be very unreliable with 4 TO's vs ARZ to give them 10 pts all in the 4th Qtr. WAS only ran the ball 17 times vs 38 pass att's and only the NYG blowout had more pass att's. The other issue is the #13 pass defense allowing a 105.1 opposing QBR (13-2 ratio 65%) and the fact WAS is 8-16 ATS as a NDIV fav has us call for them by 4 and watch the line.

Cleveland by 6 over JACKSONVILLE - JAX beat CLE 32-28 on a 20 yd TD with 40 sec left despite CLE having a 439-314 yd edge which sealed the fate of the previous coaching staff. Both own poor defensive rankings (JAX #30 CLE #29) but the Browns ability to run the ball (146 ypg 4.4 vs 69 ypg 3.5 for JAX) and the veteran play of Hoyer (4 games w/a QBR of 94.0 or better with just 1 int) gives them the edge. Minus the SD game where the Chargers had to drop the run due to RB injuries the Jaguars have given up 132 ypg (4.3) on the ground. JAX does have an edge with their #2 pass rush (19 sacks vs 20 in 2012, 31 LY) vs a CLE OL that lost All-Pro Ctr Mack (left ankle) for an extended time. 174 of JAX's 379 yds came on their final 3 drives LW as they rallied for a shot at the win only to come up short on a 55 yd blocked FG. This is a true revenge game for CLE (7-1 ATS as a AF) vs a JAX team off a heartbreaking loss and we'll side with the team having momentum here.

Seattle by 7 over ST LOUIS - SEA has been a DD fav in 4 of the L5 meetings but STL has covered 3 of the L4. The Rams are off MNF vs SF and Austin Davis has done a fairly good job of handling himself with a QBR of 99.4 in his 3 starts and the Rams have avg'd 122 ypg (4.4) in the 3 games prior to SF. However that was vs the #31, #12 and #24 pass defenses and the MNF game should be a better barometer of the STL offense. While STL #16 defense looks nice, they are 31st vs the run (153 ypg 4.9), are allowing a 98.5 defensive QBR (#25) and are dead last with just 1 sack after 4 games. After facing SF's power run game STL's defense now has to try and contain a mobile QB in Wilson who has a 107.3 QBR in his L8 road games (210 ypg 63%) 15-3. While SEA does have another long road trip on deck to CAR they are 9-3 ATS on the road and we'll call for them by a TD and see where the line.

GREEN BAY by 4 over Carolina - GB is 19-9 ATS as a HF, have tons of confidence having won and covered 3 straight and are in a good situation here. CAR is in their 3rd road game in 4 Wks after going an entire extra Qtr at CIN only to tie. The Panthers are slowly getting healthier at RB and while Newton had 107 (6.3) of LY's 147 yds on the ground that means his rib/foot issues are behind him. Newton has clearly stepped up his game and the Panthers gained confidence by taking one of the better AFC teams to the wire in a game the Bengals viewed as one to get right in. GB was pushed to the limit LW vs a MIA team with a solid secondary and the Packers were down 2 starting CB's during the game. Rodgers is clearly in rare air now (111.4 QBR 15-1 ratio) but they've had serious issues vs mobile QB's in the past as shown in their meetings vs SF recently. GB is the better team overall and while its tough to go against Rodgers the points are generous enough esp with a road game vs NO on deck to take CAR with the system above.

BALTIMORE by 9 over Atlanta - ATL is 1-10 SU/3-8 ATS on the road losing by 9 ppg. In that span Ryan has avg 278 ypg (62%) 18-20 ratio with 6.54 ypa (75.9 QBR) vs 309 ypg (72%) 20-4 with a 7.91 ypa (106.4 QBR). While teams are expected to do worse on the road ATL is giving up 60 more ypg overall with 74 ypg on the ground and a 17.3 higher defensive QBR. BAL is better than its #27 pass defense ranking as their 88.8 defensive QBR is 14th and they've only given up a 6-3 ratio. BAL's best matchup is their #7 rush defense (90 ypg 3.7) vs a bad ATL OL as while the Falcons are 20th in rushing that's because teams are emphasizing pass defense vs them. Both teams obliterated the Bucs TY with ATL embarrassing itself afterwards but the Ravens are healthier, at home for the only time in a 5 game span and 18-7 ATS as a NDIV HF.

New Orleans by 1 over DETROIT - Including playoffs the Saints are 7-0 SU/ATS off a bye with a 40-21 avg score and 451-402 yd edge. The Saints road struggles work in their favor here. With a 1-8 SU/0-9 ATS mark (losing avg score 28-19) and a "slow start" to the season by Brees (91.8 QBR vs 104.7 LY) they find themselves getting points vs a Lions team that at best will field a less than 100% Megatron here that is 1-7 ATS as a NDIV favorite. Stafford isn't playing that much better than LY in the system (88.4 QBR vs 84.2) as while his accuracy has improved (62.3% vs 58.5%) he's taken 21 sacks vs 23 all of LY. DET's DL is doing an awesome job of making up for the DB issues as they mauled MIN LW with 8 sacks and minus the Jets game they are allowing just 62 ypg (3.9) rushing. The Lions are 1-8 ATS at home vs a NDIV foe and while NO will likely get a slow start here this is a manageable line for a Saints team that's under .500 coming off the bye.

NY Giants at DALLAS - DAL has covered 4 of the L5 at home vs the Giants including a 36-31 win LY as a 3 pt HF LY on SNF. The Giants had a 147 yd edge but they were -5 TO's and while Manning puts up big passing yards at DAL he isn't very clean with 312 ypg (61%) with a 12-10 ratio his L6 there. The Giants are LW's SNF vs PHI but favorites are just 3-12-1 ATS after travelling to SEA. Romo has avg'd 311 ypg (68% with a14-8 ratio) vs the Giants in his L6 matchups and Murray has avg 101 ypg (5.6) his L3 vs them. DAL is off a statement game vs SEA where they had a 23-9 FD and 401-206 edge showing they are the real deal. The problem with DAL is that they are 3-9 ATS at home off a win, they have had a ton of fans for visiting teams and Jerry Jones is already talking about this being a special team. We'll pass on this game for now but give DAL their respect for being atop the NFC East.

SAN DIEGO by 3 over Kansas City - KC is 2-5 ATS off their bye week and 3-6 ATS as a Div dog. The bye came at a good time for the Chiefs as they were caught short vs SF without vertical WR Donnie Avery (expected to miss) and SS Eric Berry. RB Charles has started slow TY (49 ypg 4.6) due to inj's but has avg'd 106 ypg (6.7) from scrimmage vs SD and Knile Davis has proven himself capable. Minus the TEN game Smith has a 101.7 QBR, 7-1 ratio with a 66% comp rate as while the Chiefs don't air it out they put a priority on protecting the ball. SD was challenged the entire game by the Raiders who's 396 yds were the 2nd most allowed by SD this year. Rivers continues his hot streak and minus the ARZ game has a 126.8 QBR (72% 14-1 ratio). The Chargers are a good team but this is the 2nd week in a row they face a team off a bye, they have a road game at DEN on deck and we'll take the points here.

Arizona by 1 over OAKLAND - OAK is 2-9 ATS hosting a NDIV foe and gave SD their best stuff coming off the bye. Carr had a very good game with 282 yds (53%) and 4 td's with his 1 int coming on a 40 yd pass late in the 4th Qtr. OAK's 114 yds (5.7) rushing was 6 yds short of being twice as much as their rush yardage vs MIA and NE combined. As good as his game the #10 pass defense gave up their 5th straight game of over 91 opposing QBR. They now get the Cardinals who are atop the NFC West with duct tape and wire with their defensive injuries and QB issues. ARZ has been outgained in 3 of their L4 games by a 439-266 margin but they are +10 in TO's in them. A less than 100% Palmer (and LT Veldheer) gets to face the team that let him resurrect his career here as they sit atop the NFC West. The Raiders close loss LW shows that they are improving and will be even hungrier for a win while ARZ has big games vs PHI and DAL on deck and we'll take the points in a higher scoring game.

San Francisco at Denver - Sunday Night - Traveling to the altitude of DEN for a primetime game is never easy. How about doing it on the second of a back-to-back road trip on a short week off a MNF division road game? The Broncos's however faced a physical Jets team last week and have a challenge on deck as they face SD on Thursday who the actually trail in the standings.

Houston at Pittsburgh - Monday - You can say it was your 4th road game in 5 weeks but that won't cut when you just got smacked by the Browns. What was the last time PIT lost by over a TD to their turnpike rival? Well it was 2003 and Tim Couch "out duelled" Tommy Maddox and Chris Batch. While the Steelers will be fired up be careful as they are 0-4 ATS as a non-div fav of 6' or more the last 2+Y losing the last 3 outright.
