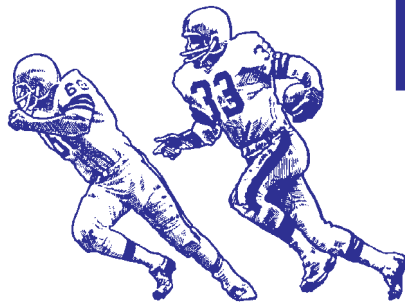

This is the FCS National Championship game which is being played in Nashville, TN for the first time. Montana St HC Brent Vigen is 11-4 SU in playoff games but has yet to win a National Title. They've been to the Championship twice under Vigen and lost both to NDSU. Illinois St HC Brock Spack is 12-6 in postseason games. He led the Redbirds to the National Title game in 2014 when they lost 29-27 vs NDSU.

ISU is the story of the FCS playoffs. They were 4-3 before a 4 game win streak but lost their reg ssn finale 37-7 vs Southern Illinois. The Redbirds were unseeded in the playoffs and have had to run a road gauntlet. They beat SELA 21-3 in the first round. ISU was +24' at NDSU and pulled the upset of the season, outgaining the Bison 422-179 and won 29-28. The Redbirds pulled their 3rd road upset by beating UC Davis 42-31. They were favored to beat Villanova and never trailed. ISU led 30-7 and Nova scored a late td. QB Tommy Rittenhouse has a 36-12 ratio. They have a 1,000 rusher and WR. Their DB's allowed a 21-13 ratio in the reg ssn but only a 5-6 ratio in the playoffs.

MSU had to rebuild much of their roster after losing LY's Nat'l title gm. They started 0-2 with losses at Oregon and SDSU but they've run the table since, winning 13 straight. They held on to beat Yale 21-13, beat SF Austin 44-28 (-13') in the quarters. The semi's was a rematch of The Brawl of the Wild. They trailed 23-20 mid 3Q, but scored 4 td's including a pick-6 for a misleading 48-23 final. MSU is #4 in our Pass D rankings (62%, 18-16). RB's Davis and Jones have both topped 1,000 yds. QB Lamson has a 24-3 ratio. MSU's D is holding foes 76 ypg below their avg (#2 in FCS).

MSU has a strong edge on D but ISU put up 29 points/422 yds on NDSU who had the FCS' #1 D coming in. MSU has allowed 23+ pts in 3 of their L/4. We call for a high scoring game, take the Over!

This game was formerly known as the Hall of Fame Bowl and the Outback Bowl. Iowa is 3-3 SU here. They won their last trip in '19 when they beat Miss ST 27-22. This is Vandy's first trip to this bowl. Kirk Ferentz is 10-11 SU/12-8-1 ATS in bowls. Clark Lea won his only prior bowl trip LY when they beat GTech 35-27 (+3).

Iowa finished 8-5 last year. They brought back 12 starters and added FCS transfer QB Mark Gronowski from SDSU. The Hawkeyes lost a close gm to Iowa St for the 2nd straight year. Iowa played Indiana tight in a 20-15 loss then won 3 straight including at Wisky 37-0 and at home vs Minn 41-3. Iowa lost close games to Oregon and USC then won their L/2 to finish 8-4. All four losses were by 5 points or less and two of those were against playoff teams. QB Gronowski only has an 8-6 ratio but also has 15 rushing td's. Their D allows just 15 ppg/271 ypg and they hold foes 102 ypg below their avg (#11 in FBS). Iowa's pass D is #6 in our PDR, allowing just 158 ypg (57%, 6-11). Iowa is #3 in our ST's rankings thanks to 1st TM AA Return Man Kaden Wetjen (4 ret td's) and K Drew Stevens has made 4 fg's of over 50+ (L/58).

Vandy was the surprise of the SEC LY when they went 7-6 including an upset over Bama. 17 starters returned including QB Pavia. The 'Dores started 5-0 against a weak sked. They lost at Bama then won 5 of their L/6 (lost at TX) to finish 10-2 but only 3 of their 10 wins were against bowl teams. QB Pavia was a Heisman finalist but he will be w/o Mackey Award winning TE Eli Stowers (769, 12.4). Their D allows 22 ppg/356 ypg and holds foes 9 ypg below their avg (#64). Vandy is #38 in our ST rankings.

Vandy is 18-6-1 ATS LY but Iowa is 9-3 ATS TY including 4-0 as an underdog and they were within a td of both Oregon and Indiana. This game is substance vs style. Our checklist has Iowa by 2 and they are +5.5. We like the Hawkeyes to be more physical and pull the upset!

Only other mtg in '14 Sun Bowl won by ASU 36-31. Sun Devils also played '17 & '19 Sun Bowl, which was their last bowl win. HC Dillingham lost only bowl LY to Texas, 39-31, as 13pt dog in CFP. Since '12, Duke 5-4 SU & 7-2 ATS in bowls. HC Diaz 0-3 SU & ATS all-time in bowls. Lost Gator Bowl to Ole Miss (-17) LY 52-20.

Reigning Big 12 champ ASU is 8-4 SU & 5-6-1 ATS. They lost in non-conf to Miss ST and went 6-3 in Big 12 play. Devils just +2 ppg & +57 ypg, going 5-1 in gms decided by 5 or less. They won 1st 2 conf gms by 3 but were routed by Utah 42-10 (QB Leavitt DNP). A wk later, ASU became only tm to beat Texas Tech. Leavitt OYF in Houston loss but tm went 3-1 with Jeff Sims at QB. Sims a downgrade as passer but dangerous runner (886, 7-5, 466 rush). Devils' top RB & WR out which should give former Army RB Kanye Udoh feature role. ASU D played well all yr, holding opp 81 ypg below their avg (#16 FBS). They give up 3.4 ypc and allowed more than 24pts in just the Utah gm. Leading tklr LB Keyshaun Elliott not playing.

Diaz's 2nd yr has been a bizarre one. Devils opened 1-2, losing by 26 to Illinois and at Tulane. They went 4-1 over next 5 and outgained 6-0 GT in only loss. Seesaw ssn cont with b2b losses to UConn & Virginia before beating UNC & WF to win complex tiebreaker and ACC CG gm. In Charlotte, Duke beat UVA in rematch for 1st outright ACC title since '62. Off has been ahead of the D all yr. Darian Mensah is a top QB who's thrown for 3646 (68%, 30-5) and top RB Nate Sheppard (962, 5.4) & WR Cooper Barkate (1069, 15.7) should play. The D really struggles vs the pass (#98, 18-13) and top CB Chandler Rivers has already opted out of gm.

While ASU has the better line play, Duke's edge at QB, the skill positions and ST's is huge. Plus, Duke's biggest weakness in pass D is less likely to be exploited by Sims and depleted ASU rec corps. Mensah & his weapons will outscore 1-dimensional ASU.

Two Blue Blood programs meet for just the 3rd time. They played each other last year and Texas won 31-12. The prior meeting was back in '01 and Texas won that 38-37 in the Rose Bowl. Biff Poggi is the Interim HC and this is his first bowl. LY Mich took out Bama in the Reliaquest Bowl. Sark is 2-3 SU/1-4 ATS in bowls and last year he took the Longhorns to the Semifinals where they lost to Ohio St.

Mich made a big upgrade at QB with true frosh Bryce Underwood. They lost at Oklahoma and USC then won 5 straight. The Wolverines were 9-2 heading into The Game vs Ohio St but lost 27-9, heading their 4 game series win streak. Mich is +9 ppg/+87 ypg. RB's Marshall and Haynes have been the strength, combining for over 1,700 yards and 20 td's as UM rushes for 213 (5.5). The D allows just 19 ppg/312 ypg but they will be w/o DE Moore (10 skt). Interim HC Poggi has done a good job keeping the roster in tact with only 3 players opting out despite the recent turmoil.

Texas was coming off a playoff season and QB Arch Manning stepping with high expectations. Manning struggled early and they lost at Ohio St and at Florida. They beat rival Oklahoma to spark a 4 game win streak as Manning found his footing with B2B 300 yd passing gms vs Miss St & Vandy. The 35-10 loss at UGA was misleading and Texas won their L/2 including over unbeaten A&M but were left out of the playoffs. Manning finished w/a 20-7 ratio. Texas' top 3 RB's have opted out but they only avg 130 (3.9). Their D allowed just 20 ppg/336 ypg but 7 of their top 12 tacklers have opted out including AA LB Anthony Hill and S Michael Taaffe.

The majority of the opt outs on this game are on the defensive side. Michigan is missing their best pass rusher. Texas is missing 7 starters on D. Manning had unfair early expectations but has looked better of late and Underwood will be unleashed. We are going to wait to pick a side but the play here looks like the Over.

Nebraska leads 4-0 but last met in '92. Huskers won Pinstripe Bowl LY in 1st bowl since '16 and 1st bowl win since '15. HC Matt Rhule 2-2 SU & ATS in bowls. This is Utah's 7th Las Vegas Bowl berth (4-2 SU & 3-3 ATS) and 1st gm as HC for Morgan Scalley.

The post-Kyle Whittingham era at Utah begins in Vegas. Scalley was a former Ute DB and has been on staff since '07 so transition should be smooth. Utah 10-2 SU & 8-4 after going 5-7 in '24. They're a dominant +22ppg and +119ypp but lost 2 biggest gms to TT and rival BYU. Offense gains 116ypp above opp avg (#8 FBS) behind #2 run gm (270, 6.1). Utes have huge edge in backfield with QB's Devon Dampier (2180, 22-5, 687 rush) & Byrd Ficklin (503, 9.0 rush) and RB Wayshawn Parker (931, 7.0). However, elite OT's Spencer Fano & Caleb Lomu opted out. Scalley's D is great against the pass (#2, 49%, 11-14) but the run D got trucked in Nov (275ypp/7.1 ypc).

Nebraska took another step forward in Rhule's 3rd yr by winning 7 reg ssn gms for 1st time in 9 yrs. But there's a long way to go. Huskers' best wins were over Cincy & NW, and they went 0-4 vs best opponents. Plus, blue-chip QB Dylan Raiola went OFY Nov. 1 and is in the portal. Frosh QB TJ Lateef has a 4-0 ratio and is a solid runner. AA RB Emmett Johnson (1451, 5.8) has opted out but bkp RB Kwintin Ives has great speed and is 215 lbs. Neb's D played well until unraveling in final 2 gm, allowing ssn high pts to Penn St (37) and Iowa (40). While the pass D gave up just 7 td's and 141 ypp all yr (both #2 FBS), run D allows 171 ypp and 4.8 ypc which is a bad matchup against the diverse Utah ground gm.

Whittingham took the Michigan job and will be at the Citrus Bowl which means one less distraction for Utah. Utes have big offensive edge but Lateef ply'd well and RB Ives is talented but unproven. Utah has blown out inferior opp all yr and will do so again in high-scoring gm with short-handed Huskers.

FORECAST: OVER 50.5 **RATING: 2★**

These two have split 4 meetings. Miami won the last meeting in '11 24-6 (-2). This is a rematch of one of the most exciting Nat'l Title games of the century when OSU upset the 'Canes in the '02 Fiesta Bowl. This is Cristobal's 2nd playoff game and he is 3-5 ATS in Bowls. Ryan Day is 4-3 SU/5-2 ATS in playoff games and won his first Nat'l Title last year. OSU is 3-1 all-time in the Cotton Bowl including LY's semifinal win over Texas.

UM was awarded the last at-large bid thanks to their head-to-head win over Notre Dame. The 'Canes two losses were to L'ville and SMU. The defense was dominant in their first round playoff game when they upset A&M 10-3. UM allows just 13 ppg/281 ypp and they hold foes 121 ypp below their avg (#3 in FBS). UM's Dline is their strength, led by DE's Bain and Mesidor. They allow just 87 (2.9) rush and they have 41 sacks including 15 in the last 3 games! RB Fletcher (725, 4.7) is a physical downhill runner. Miami has one of the top Oline's in the country, allowing just 13 sks.

For the 2nd straight ssn OSU enters the playoffs off a loss. They ran the table in the reg ssn but fell short in the B10 Title game, a 13-10 loss to Indiana. OSU's offense was held to 14 pts by Texas and 272 yds vs Illinois but they won both of those games. The Buckeyes D allows just 8 ppg and 214 ypp. They've held foes 165 ypp below their avg (#1 in FBS). LB's Styles and Reese combined for 15 tfl's this year. DE Caden Curry has 11 sacks. OSU has allowed just 9 sacks this year but they did give up 3 vs Indiana.

Despite the loss to Indiana, OSU remains the favorite to win the Nat'l Title. However, their offense has struggled against some of the better defenses they've faced and they are coming off a month long layoff while Miami just played two weeks ago. The checklist on the left calls for Miami to cover but this game features two of the best defensive units in the country so lets take the Under!

FORECAST: UNDER 41 **RATING: 3★**

Oregon has won all 3 mts, most recently '23, 38-30, in Lubbock. This is 1st Orange Bowl for both tms. Duck HC Lanning 3-1 SU & 1-3 ATS in postseason. Oregon 3-9 ATS in postseason since '14. TT HC McGuire 2-1 SU & ATS in bowls incl LY's Arkansas (+2) loss.

TT built through the portal to win right away and it worked. Red Raiders won first 6 before losing at ASU w/o QB Behren Morton. They rebounded to win final 6, twice over BYU incl in Big 12 title gm. All 12 TT wins were by 22+ pts and they are +31ppg and +220ypp! Offense gains 101ypp above opp avg (#14 FBS), led by Morton (67%, 22-4) and RB Cameron Dickey (1095, 5.5). However, run gm avg less than 4 ypc in 4 of last 6 gms. While the offense is good, the D is great. The front 7 is among the best in C

Navy 6-1 SU & 7-0 ATS last 7 bowls incl '19 Liberty Bowl win! HC Brian Newberry led Mids to 21-20 win over Oklahoma (-1) in LY's Armed Forces Bowl.

After b2b losing ssns, Satterfield's best Cincy tm will finish over .500. After opening with a 3pt loss to Nebraska, Bearcats won 7 in a row to climb to #17 in the polls. But they collapsed vs the meat of the Big 12 schedule, going 0-4 in Nov to finish 7-5 SU & 6-6 ATS. The offense gained 54 ypg above opp avg but faded late and will not have star QB Brendan Sorsby (3380 tot yds, 36 td's). The backups attempted just 8 passes this yr. Cincy does have a terrific O-line (5.9 ypc, 7 sks allow). The D is soft, allowing 41 ypg above opp avg (#11 FBS). The pass D ranks 121st (18-2 ratio) and will be missing 6 DB's, and the run D gave up 218 ypg in 2H of the yr.

Navy has won 10 gms in b2b yrs for 1st time program history. A here will tie an academy single-ssn record. Mids opened 7-0 against the softest part of the sked before losing at UNT and ND. However, they quickly rebounded with ssn-ending wins over USF, at Memphis (same stadium as this gm), and rival Army to finish 10-2 SU but just 4-8 ATS. The offense again revolves around QB Blake Horvath who rushed for tm-high 1147 (5.5, 15 td's) and threw for 1472 (10-6). Mids lead FBS in rushing (289, 5.9) and SB Eli Heidenreich is an all-around threat (437 rush, 877 rec). New Cincy QB will attack 126th ranked pass D (20-5) and won't face AA NGC Landon Robinson.

This is a brutal spot for Cincy. They'll try to slow Navy w/o DT Dontay Corleone and most of the back end. Plus, it'll be hard to keep pace without Sorsby at QB. Bearcats have the rec's to pop some big plays, but Navy will wear them down with Horvath, Heidenreich & RB Alex Tecza. Mids by more than a td for 8th straight bowl cover.

RATING: 4★

The only prior meeting was in '11's Music City Bowl won by Mississippi St 23-17 ('6). WF is bowling in their first year under Jake Dickert. The Deacons won their L/2 bowls in '21-'22 and they are 10-3 SU/10-2-1 ATS in bowls since 1992. Dickert is 0-2 in bowls going back to his time at Wash St. Miss St is in their first bowl under Jeff Lebby and their first bowl s/22. The Bulldogs are 5-7 but were chosen after a handful of teams opted out.

WF had just 11 starters back and had to replace Dave Clawson who did a phenomenal job here. Dickert put his stamp on the team with transfer QB's Ashford and Purdie. The Deacons opened 2-0 but lost their first 2 ACC gms. They won 3 straight including upsets over VTech and SMU. After getting crushed 42-7 at FSU they won 3 straight including over Virginia who finished with 11 wins. The Deacons lost their finale to Duke 49-32 to finish 8-4 and +67 ypg. RB Claiborne (907, 5.1) and WR Barnes (547, 14.0) have opened out. Ashford is a dual threat (2,169 pass, 504 rush) and RB Ty Clark saw action early on when Claiborne was inj'd. The Deacons D has been a huge surprise, holding foes to 22 ppg/322 ypg and 79 ypg under their avg. WF is #13 in our Pass D rankings.

MSU was an early snail surprise at 4-0 including an upset win over Arizona St. They dropped 7 of their 8 SEC games to finish 5-7 and were -100 ypg in SEC play but were chosen for a bowl after opt outs. QB Shapen has a 15-8 ratio but he was hurt and Kadarior Taylor started the Egg Bowl. MSU allowed just 12 pass/264 ypg in their F/4 but they gave up 38 pp/476 ypg in SEC play. RB's Bothwell and Booth combine for over 1,000 yds. MSU's run D is allowing 190 (4.9).

MSU is a 5-7 team that is favored in this bowl despite WF being 8-4. MSU has a big edge on offense while WF has a big edge on D and MSU went home before getting called back. Our checklist has WF by 2, and we prefer to take the points with the more physical team.

RATING: 2★

First mtg since '85. This is just the 2nd bowl Arizona in last 8 yrs. Wildcats won Alamo Bowl in '23. SMU has played in postseason last 3 yrs but has not won since '12 (0-5 SU & ATSI). Both coaches after 1st bowl win. SMU's Rhett Lashlee 0-3 SU & ATS while Arizona's Brent Brennan is 0-3 SU & ATS, losing all 3 as a favorite.

Brennan took a big step forward Yr 2 in Tucson, going from 4-8 to 9-3 SU & 8-4 ATS. They're +14ppg and +103ypg while riding a 5gm win streak into this gm. Cats went 6-2 over last 8 with losses to BYU & Houston by 9 combined pts. QB Noah Fifita keyed turnaround with 2963 and 26-5 ratio. His top weapons are RB Ismail Mahdi (791, 6.4) and WR Kris Hutson (740, 13.0). O-line has allowed 30 sks and will face heat from SMU D. Arizona defense was huge surprise, holding opp 80 ypg below their avg (#17 FBS). Cats are especially good against the pass, ranking #1 in FBS with a 9-19 ratio! Arizona also #3 just behind Indiana & Texas Tech with a TQ margin of +16.

SMU took a step back after making ACC CG and CFP last yr. Mustangs lost to 2 Big 12 tms, Baylor & TCU, and stumbled as a favorite to Wake Forest & Cal in ACC play. They finished 8-4 SU & 5-7 ATS after opening ssn 0-5 ATS, and are +12 ppg but just 28 ypg. The offense avg 33 ppg and gains 59 ypg above opp avg (#28 FBS). QB Kevin Jennings has thrown for 3363 with a 26-10 ratio but has run far less than last yr (50, 0.7). When SMU lost, the D was often the culprit, allowing more than 300 yds passing in 3 of 4 losses. However, they do generate a lot of chaos with 34 sacks and 27 takeaways which is just below Arizona at #5 in the FBS.

Arizona was peaking at the end of the reg ssn, which will continue in the bowl gm. In a battle between tms that create TO's, Jennings makes more mistakes than Fifita and Arizona has the better secondary. Plus, Cats have intangible of playing for a 10-win ssn. Fifita outduels Jennings to finish ssn on 6-am win streak.

4★ CHICAGO over Detroit — CHI is playing with clear incentive needing a win to lock the #2 seed, while DET enters on B2B road games after being overwhelmed 23-10 at MIN, where QB Jared Goff finished with 197 pass yds, 1 TD, 2 INT, RB Jahmyr Gibbs was limited to 41 rush yds on 17 att, and WR Amon-Ra St. Brown led with 68 rec yds as turnovers burred any rhythm. CHI pushed SF to the wire in a 42-38 loss, with QB Caleb Williams throwing for 330 pass yds and 2 TD, RB D'Andre Swift scoring 2 TD on 54 rush yds, and WR Luther Burden erupting for 138 rec yds and 1 TD, showing this O can trade blows with elite teams. The H2H leans DET historically, but this spot flips with Chicago's urgency, home field, and a Lions team that just unraveled defensively when pressured. With CHI averaging 26.6 PPG and DET allowing 24.8 PPG while coming off a turnover-heavy loss, this sets up for Chicago to control tempo and separate late.

3★ BUFFALO over NY Jets — BUF stays home on B2B games against a NYJ team clearly in full tank mode after being blasted 42-10 by NE, where QB Brady Cook finished with 152 pass yds and 1 INT, RB Brecee Hall accounted for 111 rush yds and 1 TD, and WR John Metchie managed 41 rec yds as the Jets fell behind immediately and never competed. BUF just dropped a tight 13-12 game vs PHI despite late momentum, with QB Josh Allen throwing for 262 pass yds, RB James Cook posting 74 rush yds on 20 att, and WR Brandin Cooks delivering 101 rec yds, showing the offense still moved the ball even in a low-scoring environment. Allen is expected to sit in Week 18 for rest purposes, not due to injury, with his foot healthy enough to play if plans change, leaving Mitchell Trubisky to handle QB duties. The matchup still favors BUF heavily given NYJ's 29.2 PPG allowed, league-worst defensive consistency, and zero incentive to push veterans in Week 18. The H2H remains decisive at 4-0 SU/ATS for BUF, and with the Jets mailing it in defensively while BUF closes the regular season at home, the profile points toward separation rather than survival.

FORECAST: CHICAGO by 10

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Kansas City over LAS VEGAS — KC heads into Week 18 facing a LAS VEGAS team fully committed to securing the No. 1 overall pick, with every incentive pointing toward another loss rather than resistance. LV just fell 34-10 to NYG, where QB Geno Smith posted 176 pass yds with 2 INT, RB Ashton Jeanty was held to 60 rush yds, and the offense repeatedly failed to convert short fields despite aggressive 4th-down attempts — a game that pushed the Raiders closer to locking in the top draft slot. KC is coming off a 20-13 loss to DEN in Chris Oladokun's first start, with Oladokun throwing for 66 pass yds and 1 TD, RB Kareem Hunt adding 38 rush yds, and TE Travis Kelce totaling 36 rec yds as the offense stayed conservative but functional. Oladokun starts again with Mahomes and Minshew out, while LV may be without Smith (high ankle), further thinning an offense already averaging 14.2 PPG and clearly not prioritizing wins. The H2H leans KC 3-1 SU, and while KC is only 1-3 ATS, this spot is different — LV targeting the #1 pick in the draft and KC QB Oladokun wants to show what he's made of here. KC should go off. **FORECAST: Kansas City by 14**

OTHER PLAYS

TAMPA BAY by 3 over Carolina — Saturday — Neither team has looked eager to claim the NFC South down the stretch, but it all funnels into this spot: win and you're in. The matchup hinge is TB's defense, which has been wildly split all season — allowing a staggering 236.4 pass ypg while sitting top 7 vs the run at 104.1 rush ypg. That profile matters here, as CAR ranks bottom 7 in pass PPG and just came off a game where Bryce Young managed 54 pass yds with 1 INT, Rico Dowdle posted 59 rush yds, and the offense totaled 139 yds on 1-of-11 third downs. TB didn't win last week either, but the offense functioned: Baker Mayfield threw for 346 pass yds and 2 TD/INT, and Jalen McMillan added 114 rec yds. H2H still leans TB 5-1 SU, and with CAR unlikely to exploit the one area TB struggles most, this comes down to whether the Bucs can simply play a clean game at home. If TB's run defense forces CAR into obvious passing situations, the division should stay in Tampa.

Seattle by 3 over SAN FRANCISCO — Saturday — SEA has the NFC #1 seed on the line (SEA leads SF by 1 game) and they've been a different team away from home at 7-1 SU/ATS on the road this year, backing it up LW by holding CAR to 139 total yds and 1-of-11 on 3rd down while QB Sam Darnold went 147 pass yds with 1 TD and 1 INT, RB Zach Charbonnet ripped 110 rush yds and 2 TD, and WR Jaxon Smith-Njigba added 9 rec for 72 rec yds. SF is coming off an all-gas shootout vs CHI (42-38) where QB Brock Purdy threw for 303 pass yds with 3 TD and 1 INT, RB Christian McCaffrey logged 23 att for 140 rush yds and 1 TD, and WR Ricky Pearsall chipped in 5 rec for 85 rec yds — the type of high-output game that can be a tricky follow-up spot when the stakes stay maxed. H2H history leans SF (7-1 SU, 6-2 ATS) but SEA's profile travels and the road form says they show up in these environments so we're bucking the H2H trend in favor for SEA road dominance here.

Green Bay by 3 over MINNESOTA — GB gets a key QB decision this week with Jordan Love still in concussion protocol and Malik Willis the fallback (if Love doesn't clear (or if they hold him), and Willis showed real ceiling LW despite the loss vs BAL with 288 pass yds and 1 pass TD plus 60 rush yds and 2 rush TD, while WR Christian Watson added 5 rec for 113 rec yds and 1 TD even as GB's front got gashed and couldn't get off blocks. MIN leaned on defense to beat DET 23-10 and didn't need much offense, with QB Max Brosmer at 51 pass yds, RB Jordan Addison popping a 65 rush-yd TD, and WR Justin Jefferson at 4 rec for 30 rec yds as the Vikings won the turnover battle and played from short fields most of the day. This is basically dead-even H2H (3-3 SU/ATS) with the scoring leaning Over 3-1, and MIN is on B2B HOME, but if GB gets another Willis game (or a protected Love plan) there's enough explosive play potential here to think GB wins it even with the game not mattering.

HOUSTON by 6 over Indianapolis — IND is basically at a QB crossroads with Steichen expected to make the call soon but likely leaning Riley Leonard, and with Anthony Richardson still on IR (eye) the Colts offense LW again leaned on short stuff in a 23-17 loss vs JAX: Philip Rivers 147 pass yds, 1 pass TD, 1 INT, Jonathan Taylor 70 rush yds and 1 rush TD, and TE Tyler Warren 5 rec for 43 rec yds as IND couldn't threaten vertically when it needed answers late. HOU can lock either the No. 5 seed or the No. 3 seed with a win, and they just beat LAC 20-16 with C.J. Stroud 244 pass yds, 2 pass TD, 2 INT, Jo'quavious Marks 71 rush yds, and Jayden Higgins 88 rec yds and 1 rec TD on 2 catches as Houston hit explosives early and then let the D close. The matchup history has been one-way (HOU 4-0 SU, 2-2 ATS) and it's leaned Under 3-1, which fits HOU's season-long totals profile (5-11 O/U) and this number sitting at 40.5. IND could get back DB Sauce Gardner (calf) who wants to play, but with a rookie QB or not it's hard to see them matching Houston's ability here. Although, it pegs to be a 1 score game rather than the 2 score line here so IND getting a bunch is the play.

CINCINNATI by 7 over Cleveland — CIN is keeping the pedal down with Joe Burrow in the plan to play, while Joe Flacco is returning to CLE but only as the backup. CLE might be walking into a classic letdown spot after stealing a 13-6 win vs PIT, with Shedeur Sanders at 186 pass yds, 1 pass TD, 2 INT, Dylan Sampson at 27 rush yds on 11 carries, and Jerry Jeudy 54 rec yds as the Browns basically won on stops and red-zone stands. That's a tough formula to repeat on the road, and it's now stepping into a CIN offense that just handled ARI 37-14 behind Burrow 305 pass yds and 2 pass TD, Chase Brown 101 rush yds and 2 rush TD, and Ja'Marr Chase 60 rec yds and 2 rec TD as the Bengals scored on 6 of 7 meaningful possessions. The matchup history and scoring lean match too (CIN 4-0 SU, 3-1 ATS; Under 5-1), and with CIN on B2B home plus Burrow confirmed to go, Cleveland's post-PIT edge feels like it runs into a higher ceiling offense on the other side.

JACKSONVILLE by 14 over Tennessee — JAX has everything on the line here with the AFC South clinch and a home playoff game locked in with a win, plus the seed-floor risk if they slip (and there's even a No. 1 seed path with a JAX win + DEN loss + NE loss), so the urgency edge is real. The matchup history also leans hard JAX (6-1 SU, 5-2 ATS; Under 3-0), and the profile fits a favorite that can separate with both sides of the ball (JAX 27.1 PPG / 20.6 PPG allowed vs TEN 17.3 PPG / 27.3 PPG allowed). JAX just closed out IND 23-17 despite self-inflicted mistakes, with Trevor Lawrence at 263 pass yds and 1 INT, Travis Etienne at 76 rush yds, and Parker Washington at 115 rec yds, then leaned on the D to finish the job late. TEN showed fight in a 34-26 loss vs NO with Cam Ward at 251 pass yds and 2 pass TD, Tony Pollard at 85 rush yds, and Chimere Dike at 55 rec yds, but that same defense still gave up 34 points and got flipped by one momentum-swing turnover. With JAX's playoff leverage + the way TEN's season has trended defensively; this sets up as a game where JAX can turn a competitive middle into a 2-score finish if they simply play clean.

Dallas by 14 over NY GIANTS — Both teams are basically playing for nothing here, but DAL is still the more explosive offense and the matchup reads like a points-and-pace game if the Cowboys get their early separation. DAL just showed the blueprint in a 30-23 win at WAS with Dak Prescott 307 pass yds and 2 pass TD, Malik Davis 20 att for 103 rush yds, and KaVontae Turpin 1 rec for 86 rec yds and a TD creating a quick cushion. NYG is coming off a 34-10 win at LV with Jaxon Dart 207 pass yds, Tyrone Tracy 14 att for 62 rush yds, and Wan'Dale Robinson 11 rec for 113 rec yds, but that production came in a game script where LV handed them short fields and couldn't sustain any pressure. The H2H is still a DAL stranglehold

(9-0 SU, 6-3 ATS; Over 3-1), and even with NYG at home, DAL's profile (398.6 YPG, 28.4 PPG) is built to create chunk plays and force chase mode on a NYG D allowing 26.4 PPG. If NYG can't win the turnover/field-position battle early, it's tough to see them matching DAL drive-for-drive once Prescott gets into rhythm. **ATLANTA by 7 over New Orleans** — This sets up as a classic shootout, with both teams trade scores with big plays. ATL just edged LAR 27-24 with Kirk Cousins at 126 pass yds and 1 TD, but Bijan Robinson was the entire tone-setter (22 att, 195 rush yds, 1 TD) and David Sills chipped in 3 rec for 37 rec yds to help finish drives and control tempo. NO's offense finally hit top gear again in the 34-26 win at TEN behind Tyler Shough (333 pass yds, 2 TD), Audric Estime (14 att, 94 rush yds, 1 TD), and Chris Olave (8 rec, 119 rec yds, 1 TD), which is exactly the kind of production that can keep this game in a shootout lane. Both Ds have been leaky on the scoreboard (NO 22.8 PPG allowed; ATL 24.0), and with NO on B2B AWAY and ATL on B2B HOME, this feels like one where ATL's late-game edge shows if Cousins is sharp closing drives while Bijan keeps the chains moving in the 4th.

PHILADELPHIA by 10 over Washington — PHI is playing for the #2 seed (needs a win + a CHI loss) and it keeps showing up in how they're winning: grindy, defense-led, and efficient enough on offense. The Eagles just won 13-12 at BUF with Jalen Hurts at 110 pass yds and 1 TD, Saquon Barkley at 19 att for 68 rush yds, and A.J. Brown at 5 rec for 68 rec yds, then the pass rush closed the door late to survive a quiet 2nd half. WAS is limping to the finish line after the 30-23 loss vs DAL with Josh Johnson at 198 pass yds, Jacory Crosby-Merritt at 11 att for 105 rush yds and 2 TD, and Deebo Samuel at 2 rec for 68 rec yds, and the QB situation is the headline again with Marcus Mariota doubtful and Johnson starting if Mariota sits. With WAS allowing 388.8 YPG and 27.1 PPG on D, PHI doesn't need fireworks — just enough early separation while the defense forces Washington to sustain long drives without mistakes.

NEW ENGLAND by 10 over Miami — NE can clinch the No. 2 seed with a home win and still has a live path to the No. 1 seed, so the urgency is obvious after the 42-10 rout at NYJ where Drake Maye threw for 256 pass yds and 5 TD, TreVeyon Henderson added 19 att for 82 rush yds, and Stefon Diggs finished with 6 rec for 101 rec yds and a TD. MIA is coming off the 20-17 win vs TB with Quinn Ewers at 172 pass yds and 2 TD, De'Von Achane at 18 att for 83 rush yds, and Theo Wease popping 1 rec for 63 rec yds and a TD, but the bigger lens is matchup history (MIA 9-1 ATS in the last 10 H2H) vs current profile: NE's O is 374.5 YPG and 28.2 PPG while the D is holding 302.4 YPG and 19.4 PPG. If NE plays clean early like it did last week and forces MIA to string together long drives, the Pats are positioned to control pace and keep the pressure on Miami's offense for 4 quarters.

LA RAMS by 14 over Arizona — LAR is locked into the 5 or 6 seed, but Sean McVay made it clear "they're playing," and this sets up as an indoor spot where LAR's O (396.7 YPG, 30.5 PPG) can press ARI's D (355.4 YPG, 28.2 PPG) for 4 quarters. ARI is on B2B AWAY and just got buried by efficiency swings despite Jacoby Brissett (212 pass yds, 2 TD), Michael Carter (7 att, 29 rush yds), and Michael Wilson (5 rec, 89 rec yds, 1 TD), while LAR comes off the 27-24 loss at ATL where Matthew Stafford finished with 269 pass yds, 2 TD, 3 INT, Kyren Williams ran 13 times for 92 rush yds, and Xavier Smith led the receivers at 4 rec for 67 rec yds. The H2H leans LAR (4-1 SU, 3-2 ATS) with the Over 3-1, and even with LAR's run D getting stressed last week, the bigger mismatch here is pace and scoring ceiling against an ARI team that's struggled to sustain drives all season.

DENVER by 10 over LA Chargers — DEN can clinch the AFC No. 1 seed with a home win, and the setup flips hard with Justin Herbert ruled out and Trey Lance starting for LAC, which is a major downgrade for an offense that's already living in lower-scoring ranges (22.8 PPG) with a Totals profile at 7-9. LAC just lost 20-16 vs HOU despite Herbert posting 236 pass yds, 1 pass TD, 1 INT plus 37 rush yds, while Quentin Johnston led with 5 rec for 98 rec yds; DEN comes in off the 20-13 win at KC where Bo Nix had 182 pass yds, 1 pass TD, 1 INT, RJ Harvey ran for 43 rush yds on 14 att, and Courtland Sutton finished with 4 rec for 40 rec yds. The H2H leans LAC (3-0 SU, 2-0-1 ATS) with the Over 2-1, but this matchup is being played under totally different conditions if Lance is asked to operate in Denver against a top-end DEN D (282.1 YPG, 19.2 PPG) while DEN's O stays patient and possession-based like it did at KC but they also almost let KC beat them there. The question is whether Lance can sustain drives and like he has in preseason and show the world he's got it or not. We see it tighter than the huge 2 TD line but Denver should win this one.

Baltimore vs PITTSBURGH — SNF — AFC North on the line with BAL on B2B AWAY and a real QB hinge: Lamar Jackson is questionable (back contusion) and if he can't go, Tyler Huntley would start again after a 107 pass yd, 1 TD outing while BAL leaned all the way into Derrick Henry (36 att, 216 rush yds, 4 TD) with Zay Flowers (4 rec, 30 rec yds, 1 TD). PIT just lost 13-6 at CLE in a tight game that had a questionable non-PI call to end the game. Aaron Rodgers finished with 168 pass yds, Jaylen Warren had 12 att for 64 rush yds, and Pat Freiermuth led with 3 rec for 63 rec yds as the offense felt the DK Metcalf absence (and he's OUT again, suspension). The chess match is obvious: PIT has to crowd the box and force BAL to win through the air, but that gets harder if T.J. Watt is a long shot (doubtful) and PIT can't create the same pressure/chaos to slow down the rushing game. H2H leans PIT (5-2 SU/ATS), and while the recent meetings have gone Over (2-0), the broader trend has been Under 9-1 in the last 10. Can Rodgers get the offense going or will Derrick Henry take over?
