4★ UTSA over Texas St - Schools separated by 57 miles. UTSA leads series 5-1 but lost last yr's meeting on the road, 49-10, when the tm was banged up. Tex St scored 35 unanswered and outgained the Roadrunners, 504-334. The Bobcats' home rout snapped a 4-gm series streak of the visitor covering. UTSA is home, with revenge on their minds for last yr's lopsided loss. They also have an experience edge (#38 vs #103). HC Jeff Traylor is 29-3 in San Antonio, with the only losses to Army (2x) and ranked Houston. Roadrunners lost LW at Texas A&M, 42-24, but only trailed by 4 in the 3Q, rushed for 203 yds vs an SEC D and covered as a 23'pt dog. Tex St opened by routing EMU, 52-27, behind 606 yds and 4 Brad Jackson TD passes but they only led that game 24-17 at half. Since 2019, UTSA 16-8 ATS after SU loss, and they have a knack for rebounding under Traylor. We expect UTSA to get payback by DD's in a high-scoring gm.

FORECAST: UTSA by 14 over Texas St

3★ VIRGINIA TECH over Vanderbilt - Major revenge spot for VT in their home opener. Last year the Hokies clearly underestimated Vandy who was coming off a 2-10 season but added QB Diego Pavia. VT fell behind 17-3 at half but rallied, took the lead then lost in OT. VT opened last week against South Carolina and lost 24-11 with the game turning on two big plays, a PR and a 64 yard td pass in late 4Q. VT actually finished with the yds and FD edge but were -2 TO's. Vandy is off an expected win over Charleston Southern. VT won't underestimate this Vandy team in the least and in fact is going to be fired up to get revenge and QB Pavia is known to put up bulletin board material they are only laying a fg??? Enter Sandman will be rockin and the Hokies will make a statement.

FORECAST: VIRGINIA TECH by 13 over Vanderbilt

3★ TOLEDO over Wku - Toledo has won 14 straight Home openers (10-4 ATS) but have lost L/3 SU & ATS vs CUSA teams. The Rockets are playing with legitimate revenge as LY Toledo (-2) led most of the game including 21-10 3Q before giving up a GW td with 5:16 left to lose 26-21. WKU has won 8 straight (5-3 ATS) vs MAC foes. Hilltoppers are playing their 3rd straight game (2-0 SU, 1-1 ATS), after only getting by Sam Houston St 41-34 as a 10 pt HF, they blew out FCS foe North Alabama 55-6 as a 29'pt HF. LW at Kentucky, Toledo (+10) only trailed 10-2 at HT (5-5 FD, outgained 103-96) but needed a backdoor cover td with 1:55 left. The Rockets finished with a 329-305 yd edge (17-17 FD) and if you take away KY 79 yd rush td, they held an SEC team to just 3.3 ypc rush. Toledo has the experience edge with 13 returning starters compared to WKU's 6. The Rockets are the better team and will not lose focus after last year's collapse.

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Kansas (+) over MISSOURI - Two former Big 12 foes meet for the first time since 2011 and renew their Border War rivalry! This is the 121st meeting. Mizzou returns 15 starters but do lose their QB, top 2 RB's and top 2 WR's. Their defense should be solid with 9 starters back. Kansas is off to a 2-0 start after wins vs Fresno St (31-7) and Wagner (46-7). QB Daniels has looked like his old self, throwing for 456 yds (80%, 7-1, 65 rush) through the first 2 gms, plus former Bama WR Emmanuel Henderson looks to be the new #1 WR. Mizzou opened with an easy 61-6 win over Central Ark with new QB Beau Pribula (Penn St transfer) hitting 23-28 for 283. He was slated to split snaps with Sam Horn who was injured on the first play and is out this wk. Kansas is confident and playing well on D (19 FD)'s all'd in 2 gms. Plus, they have the QB edge since this is Pribula's first career start. We think the Jayhawks are positioned to surprise in a low-scoring gm.
FORECAST: Kansas by 3 over MISSOURI
2★ OKLAHOMA over Michigan - Michigan HC Sherrone Moore, an '08 OU grad, brings UM to Oklahoma for the 1st time ever. It's the earliest UM road trip since '20. It's the first-ever regular season gm between these blue-bloods (Sooners won '76 Orange Bowl, 14-6). OU is 9-4 ATS under HC Venables vs non-conf opp. The Sooners are expected to have a much improved offense and LW they defeated Illinois ST, 35-3 (-40). Michigan has 7 starters back on both offense and defense and are much more experienced than last year. Moore is 1-3 SU on the road. Last week, Michigan knocked off New Mexico, 34-17 (-34), behind the debut of true frosh QB Bryce Underwood. Michigan only has WMich on deck, while Oklahoma only has Temple. Both teams have top notch defenses with Michigan #2 and Oklahoma #6, but the Sooners are at home with a veteran QB while Underwood is making his first road start. Oklahoma is 56-7 SU at home the last 10 years and 8-3 ATS as a HF the last 3 years. Early Vegas line has the Sooners -5' and we think they are one of the most improved teams in the country. Boomer Sooner!

FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 5th

James Madison vs LOUISVILLE - Louisville won the only prior meeting in '22, 34-10 (-7). JMU is looking to pull another road upset over an ACC foe after beating North Carolina 70-50 (+10). L'ville is off a 51-17 win over Eastern Kentucky. The Cardinals return 16 starters including RB Isaac Brown and added USC transfer Miller Moss. JMU beat up on a rebuilding Weber St team 45-10. The Dukes have 10 starters back including QB Alonza Barnett. UL is 20-8 as a HF including 4-1 last year. Both teams have a bye on deck so they will be giving full effort on a nationally televised Friday night game. The Cardinals are favored by just over 2 td's. Call 1-800-654-3448 and purchase the Friday Marquee for just \$15.

MARYLAND vs Northern Illinois - First mtg since '04. The Huskies are 0-2 all-time at Maryland, but covered the last meeting in '04 as 14'-point dog in the 3-pt loss. Since 2009, NIU is 6-9 SU (10-5 ATS) vs. Big Ten teams (0-4 ATS last 4 from '18-'23). NIU covered the last 2 in '03 & '04. In their last 3 games vs the MAC in '18, '21 & '22, the Terps are 3-0 SU, 2-1 ATS. Since '17, Maryland is 17-7 ATS vs non-conf opponents and they haven't lost a non-conf game SU since 2019 (16 straight wins since 20-17 loss to Temple). True Frosh QB Malik Washington had a great debut - 27-43-258-3-0, and didn't get sacked once as Maryland defeated FAU 39-7 (-14). Last week, the Huskies eked out a 19-17 victory over FCS Holy Cross, despite being a 13'-pt favorite. NIU is 17-5 as an away dog. Early Vegas odds had Maryland favored by 17' and one of these two games will be our Friday College Marquee.

SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 6TH

PENN ST by 45 over Fiu - This is the school's second meeting and first since '07's 59-0 (-37) blowout win for Penn St. Penn St. is 3-0 SU (2-1 ATS) against Sun Belt foes since 2007. Fiu is 0-7 SU (1-6 ATS) vs Big Ten teams. They lost last year to Indiana (+23'), 31-7. Since 2017, the Nittany Lions are 20-11 ATS vs non-conf. opponents & 12-5 ATS vs G5 programs. Penn St is our pick for #1 this year and have QB Drew Allar and the best set of RB's and O-Line in the country. They only have Villanova on deck. Last week, Penn St defeated Nevada, 46-11 and the only td they allowed was in the 4Q. Last week, Fiu defeated Bethune-Cookman, 42-9 (-30'). Fiu has a new HC in Willie Simmons. Franklin is now 7-2 ATS when favored by 40+ so we have a small lean on the big chalk.

TEXAS TECH by 52 over Kent St - First meeting. Golden Flashes have lost 6 straight (2-4 ATS) vs Big 12 including a 56-6 loss at UCF as a 35' pt AD in 2023. KSU's schedule is made to make money at the expense of their record as the last 2 years in non-conf road games they are 0-6 SU & ATS despite being an AD of +24 or more (three of +48 or more). This is Texas Tech's first game vs MAC team since 1948 Sun Bowl. The Red Raiders have excelled as DD favorite doing 13-5 ATS.

Last week Kent St was out gained 340-305 & out FD'd 17-15 by FCS foe Merrimack, needing a 100 yd KR td with 5:28 left for the come from behind 21-17 win failing to cover as a 5 pt HF. Last week the Red Raiders easily covered as a 53' pt HF over FCS Arkansas Pine-Bluff. Texas St scored their first 11 drives leading 47-0 at HT & 61-0 into 4Q and "holding on" for a 67-7 win (took knee on final drive). Kent St is on a 6-20-1 ATS run including 1-8-1 LY as a DD Dog. Texas Tech is 14-5 ATS as a DD Favorite. This is a mismatch and with only a non-conf game hosting Oregon St look for the Red Raiders to keep their offense running on all cylinders.

NC STATE by 6 over Virginia - NCSt has won the last 3 meetings. Last meeting was in '23 when NCSt never trailed but needed a 33 yd fg on the games final play to win 24-21 (-7'). UVA is looking to start 2-0 for the 2nd straight season. The Cavaliers 5-10 SU on the road under Elliott but did win at WF and Pitt last year and are on a 7-2 ATS run as road dogs. NCSt is off a rematch of last year's bowl loss to East Carolina. They led 24-7 start of 4Q but only won by 7. The Pack on a 4-11 ATS run as home favorites and last year they lost at home to WF, Cuse & Duke. This is Elliott's best team and the Cavs have the experience edge (#8 vs #50). UVA is 11-5 ATS vs the ACC while NCSt is just 1-9 the L2Y. The underdog is 10-3-1 ATS in the series. The angles say take the dog but NCSt is only favored by a fg and we like the Pack to start 2-0.

TEXAS by 45 over San Jose St - Only 1 prior meeting and it came back in '17 where Texas (-25') won 56-0 with a 623-171 yd edge. Both teams are off opening week losses. Texas lost 14-7 at Ohio St despite having a 336-203 yd edge, but they were just 1/5 on 4th down & committed the game's only TO. QB Manning was 17-30 for 170 with a 1-1 ratio, but will have much better success here. SJSt had the yds edge vs CMich but were -3 TO's and missed two 4Q FG's that would have put them ahead. Texas is 6-0 SU/4-2 ATS since '21 in home non-conf games when favored by 20+ pts including going 3-0 ATS LY in that role. Texas has an elite D and allowed just 203 yds last week vs one of the top offenses in CFB. Now they should feast vs SJSt which disappointed in the opener. After a tough loss last week and just UTEP on deck, we expect Texas to take some of their frustrations out on the Spartans this week and win big.

Liberty by 14 over JACKSONVILLE ST - This was been a key game in the CUSA race last year. Lib was off their shocking loss to Kennesaw. JSU led 24-21 when Lib was SOD at the JSU17 then Lib was int'd and JSU scored a 1 yd td drive (JSU won 31-21). Jax St is the least experienced team in the country under 1st year HC Charles Kelly. They only lost 17-10 (+20') last week at UCF. QB Wimsatt hit just 15 of 29 for 139 and 1 int. Lib has 15 starters back (#55 exp) and were the preseason favorites to win CUSA. Flames were only 1-4 as road chalk last year but that was a team coming off a 13-0 reg season with poor leadership. JSU has been tough at home but this looks like a rebuilding year and Liberty has a big coaching edge. We will go with the more experienced team by two td's.

PITTSBURGH by 24 over Central Michigan - First meeting. Last year Pitt covered as a 24 pt HF over MAC Foe Kent St 55-24 in the season opener but lost to MAC foe Toledo in their Bowl 48-46 in 6 OT as a 6 pt favorite. Chippewas are 0-13 SU (3-10 ATS) vs ACC foes but in their last only lost to Miami 17-12 as a 30 pt AD in '19. Pitt easily covered LW as a 39' pt HF 61-9 over FCS Duquesne but only had a 460-208 yd edge including a 60 yd td pass with 1:12 left. CMich opened the season pulling a 16-14 outright upset as a 14' pt AD at San Jose St. The Chippewas led 13-0 2Q with 3 scores of TO's but trailed 14-13 into 4Q. They had a 14 play/70 yd drive that ate up 7:16 culminating with the GW 28 yd FG with 4:13 left & survived as SJSt missed 2 late FG attempts. CMich has a trip to the Big House on deck while Pitt has the "Backyard Brawl" on deck and so might not run up the score as LW. Pitt has the talent edge and CMich is off a long road trip.

Iowa by 1 over IOWA ST - 72nd battle for the Cy-Hawk Trophy. LY ISU trailed 13-0 HT but got a long TD pass 2H and then got a 54-yd FG with :06 left to win 20-19. The home team is on an 0-4 SU/ATS run in this series and there have been 3 outright upsets the past 4 meetings. ISU already has 2 games under their belt and showed no rust off their Ireland game last week, defeating South Dakota 55-7 (+321 yd edge). Iowa ran the ball 53 times LW vs Albany (16 pass att) and ran for 310 yds (5.8), but ISU has a stout run D and an exp'd defense overall. Hawkeye QB Mark Gronowski left in 3Q after dealing with multiple leg cramps throughout the gm. The 'Under' has hit in 10 of the past 12 meetings (avg 38 ppg). ISU does have the experience edge (#28 vs #51) and are at home, but have not beaten Iowa at home since 2011 (0-6 SU/1-4-1 ATS). We expect another low-scoring, close contest.

SYRACUSE by 7 over UConn - After losing 5 straight in the series from '07-'11, Syracuse has won last 5 meetings going 4-1 ATS. Last year Syracuse as a 10' pt HF had a 538-352 but gave up the backdoor cover TD with w/1:29 to only win 31-24. LY under then-New HC Fran Brown Syracuse went 6-1 SU at home but 0-3-1 ATS as a HF. LW Syracuse lost to #24 Tennessee 45-28 failing to cover as a 13' pt dog despite have a 24-22 FD edge (outgained 493-377). They only trailed 24-14 late 2Q. They allowed a TD with 1:55 left 2Q and then threw an int on 2nd play of 3Q setting up a 17 yd Tenn TD drive. The Huskies cruised to a 59-13 win (-28) over FCS Central Conn scoring on 9 of their first 12 drives finishing with a 26-13 FD & 638-257 yd edges. UConn has a big ST edge (#36-#128) and has 11 returning starters vs Syracuse's 8 & should keep it close.

SMU by 3 over Baylor - Former Southwest Conf foes meet for the 83rd time. Dating back to 1989 Baylor has won 13 straight meetings, but they have not met since 2016. In their last meeting in Dallas, in 2015, Baylor won 56-21. Baylor is off a 38-24 loss at home vs Auburn, but despite the loss QB Sawyer Robertson played well, throwing for 419 yds and 3 td's. However, the defense couldn't stop the run, allowing 307 yds and almost 6 ypc. SMU beat East Tex A&M LW 42-13 but was only +49 yds as 2 of their scores came off pick-6's. QB Kevin Jennings threw for 260 (73%, 2-1) and should be able to do damage with his legs here as Baylor gave up 137 rush (8.6, 2 td) to Auburn QB Jackson Arnold last week. SMU is 9-4 ATS as a home favorite since 2023 and is 16-3 SU in Dallas under HC Rhett Lashlee.

Illinois by 7 over DUKE - First meeting since 1965. Illinois had been 0-5 ATS in road openers until last year when they upset Nebraska 31-24 (+7') in OT. Illinois ended last year on a 4 game winning streak and started strong this year with a 52-3 (-45') over FCS Western Illinois. Duke was among the biggest surprises in CFB last year in Manny Diaz's first year. The Blue Devils opened with a 45-17 (-36') win over Elon on Thursday but it was only 24-17 4Q. Illinois has a big experience edge (#3 vs #70) as they return QB Luke Altmyer, all five starting OL and their top five tacklers. Duke lost their QB, top rusher, top two receivers and top 3 tacklers but they did add Tulane transfer Darien Mensah who looked great in his debut (389 yds, 3 td's). Duke went 5-1 at home last year and were 2-0 ATS as a home dog but under HC Bielema, Illinois is 15-5 ATS on the road including 3-0 as an AF. The price is cheap here with #12 Illinois only laying a FG. Duke is a dangerous dog and are 16-3 SU at home L3Y and since '12 they are 12-2 as a dog of 3 or less but they didn't beat a single P4 team with a winning record last year. We like the experience edge for Illinois to be the deciding factor.

INDIANA by 45 over Kennesaw St - First meeting and first-ever game for Kennesaw St vs a Big Ten opponent. In non-conf. games, KSU is 15-18 ATS (1-3 LY, all as a dog). As a DD dog, Owls are 9-6 ATS (4-4 LY, with 3 covers in last 4 games as DD dog). In their last 10 vs CUSA, Indiana is 10-0 SU (7-3 ATS) - it beat FIU +23'. 31-7 in last year's opener. As DD favorite, the Hoosiers are 17-6 ATS since '17 (5-1 last year in HC Cignetti's debut). Indiana hit the portal hard once again and brought in Cal QB Fernando Mendoza. They could actually have more talent than last year's playoff squad. Last week, the Hoosiers defeated Old Dominion, 27-14 (-23') but did have a 30-10 FD edge and missed out on points in the Red Zone. Indiana only has FCS Indiana St on deck. Kennesaw St has a new HC, but has a lot of experience returning. Last week, Kennesaw nearly upset Wake Forest, losing 10-9 as 17' pt dogs. QB Dexter Williams (Indiana transfer) hit just 12 of 33 for 149 yds. Indiana has a large special teams edge (#15 vs #117). Cignetti wasn't happy about their red zone failures and we think they pour it on this week.

TEXAS A&M by 31 over Utah St - Only other meeting between the Aggies was in '09 when A&M won 38-30 (-19'). Texas A&M is 7-0 SU/6-1 ATS vs MWC teams. Utah St won their debut under HC Bronco Mendenhall, 28-16 (-6) over UTEP. They held the Miners to 284 yards but now face an A&M offense that put up 42 points and 401 last week vs UTSA. QB Marcel Reed threw for 289 yards and 4 td's. A&M has a loaded roster, full of experience (#6) while Utah St is full of transfers and inexperienced (#119). A&M was covering last week until UTSA scored with just .14 left. Mendenhall is 7-1 ATS in his career as a dog of 20+ points. A&M are laying over 4 td's and once again there is backdoor potential.

Ole Miss by 13 over KENTUCKY - Huge revenge for Ole Miss here. Rebels were #6 and -15 at home last year. Rebels were held to a season low 353 yards and lost 20-17. That loss ultimately kept Ole Miss out of the playoffs. HC Kiffin has 12 starters back but must replace QB Dart. Austin Simmons has the talent and got to learn for a season under Dart. KY has 13 starters back. Last week they won vs Toledo 24-16 (-10) and the Rockets had a 329-305 yd edge. 'Cats QB Zach Calzada is known for leading Texas A&M over Alabama back in 2021. He spent the last two years at FCS Incarnate Word and last week he completed just 10 of 23 for 123 and 1 int. Kiffin is 1-4 SU/0-5 ATS in SEC openers but KY has lost their last 8 home games vs P4 foes (1-7 ATS). We are calling for the Rebels to get revenge by double-digits.

NAVY by 17 over Uab - UAB has smashed Navy each of the last two years, 41-18 (-4') and 31-6 (+2') LTH. The Blazers allowed 227 and 269 rush in those games but new DC Steve Russ was DC at Air Force from '12-'17 and knows how to defend the option. That UAB defense struggled last week, giving up 514 yards but 312 was through the air. Navy handled VMI 52-7 (-41'). The Middies have a big experience edge (#16 vs #101) but they are laying over 3 td's and UAB does have a potent offense with Jalen Kitna at QB. Navy will win the game but UAB's new DC will help keep the Middies' option in check and Kitna will make enough plays to stay within 3 td's.

North Texas by 14 over WESTERN MICHIGAN - First meeting. WMich is 7-3 SU & 6-4 ATS in home openers. North Texas is 2-5 SU vs MAC but lost last mtg to Miami, Oh in '21 Frisco Bowl 27-14 as a 2' pt dog. NT is just 1-4 ATS as an AD under 3rd yr HC Eric Morris but Broncos are 0-3 ATS under 3rd yr HC Lance Taylor. LW Mean Green easily covered as a 25' pt HF over FCS Lamar leading 37-0 at HT & 51-0 into a scoreless 4Q finishing with a 26-8 FD & a 462-119 yd edge. The Broncos on the other hand allowed Mich St 3 td's on their first 4 drives to trail 21-0 being out FD 13-3 & outgained 205-89 at HT. After allowing a safety in the 3Q to trail 23-0. The Broncos got a miracle backdoor cover 32 yd IR td with 2:51 left to only lose 23-6 as a 21 pt AD. North Texas does host Washington St next week but has the experience edge with 14 returning starters compared to Western Michigan's 7 and should be able to take care of business here.

OREGON ST by 13 over Fresno St - Teams last met in 2022 with Oregon St winning 35-32 as they scored the GW td on the final play. OSU is in Year 2 under HC Trent Bray and they brought 12 starters back, plus added QB Maalik Murphy from Duke. They did drop their first game last week at home to underrated Cal 34-15 as they were only -43 yds but were -2 TO's. Fresno St is playing their 3rd game of the season. Two weeks ago at Kansas they fell 31-7 as they only put up 216 yds. Last week they trailed 14-13 HT but pitched a 2H shutout and blew out GA Southern down the stretch and won 42-14, rushing for 351 yds (7.8). Oregon St does have the big edge in experience (#30 vs #98) and are back in Corvallis off a loss and will be motivated to get their first win of the season. We think the Beavers will get back on track and that there's line value in favor of the home team.

CLEMSON by 42 over Troy - Clemson lost their season opener for the 3rd straight year last week. They won the following week by 49 & 46 the last two years. In fact Clemson was 3-0 ATS off a loss last year. This is the 3rd meeting, Clemson is 2-0 but Troy did only lose 30-24 (+35) back in '16. Tigers are just 2-9 ATS when favored by 28+ points. Troy trailed FCS Nicholls 17-10 starting 4Q but scored four 4Q td's and won 38-20 (+21). Gerard Parker is in his 2nd year as HC and has 10 returning starters while Clemson has 17 returning starters with the majority being players that Swinney recruited out of HS. Clemson has their ACC opener on deck but they take out their frustrations on Troy.

RUTGERS by 21 over Miami (OH) - First meeting. Since '04, RedHawks are 1-18 SU (9-10 ATS) vs. Big Ten opponents (beat NW in '22 as 7-pt dog). Miami (+3') lost to Northwestern 13-6 last year. As a home favorite since '14, Rutgers is 18-12 ATS (8-3 ATS as a HF vs G5). Miami is 13-20 ATS in non-conf games, but does have a bye on deck. Last week, Rutgers defeated Ohio, 34-31 (-15'). The Knights after a blocked punt for td led 31-14 late 2Q but allowed a FG w/:08 left 2Q and two 3Q td's as they were tied 31-31 into 4Q. To stop Ohio's offense Rutgers went on a 14 pl/67 yd GW FG drive that ate up 7:56. Miami lost at Wisconsin, 17-0 (+17') despite Wisconsin losing their starting QB in the 1Q. Miami was out FD 23-7 and outgained 353-117. The Redhaws are led by QB DeQuan Finn, who was the MAC OPOY in '23 with Toledo, but with no other offensive starters back, he struggled vs a tough Wisky defense, hitting just 9-18-83-0-2. Miami does return 5 starters on defense. Rutgers is much more experienced with 16 starters and with a tough schedule needs to concentrate on every game & with just Norfolk St on deck will not look past Miami.

CINCINNATI by 24 over Bowling Green - Bowling Green is 4-0 SU & 3-1 ATS vs Cincinnati. Bearcats are just 9-10 SU & 6-12-1 ATS at home including 5-10 ATS as a HF. Despite returning the opening KO for a TD, the Falcons only beat FCS Lafayette 26-7 failing to cover as a 21 pt HF. They

only finished with a 17-11 FD & 266-177 yd edge. The Bearcats opened the season losing 20-17 to Nebraska but covered as a 6' pt dog. Cincy had a 1st down at Neb33 but was int'd in the EZ with :34 left to end their upset attempt. Falcons under New HC Eddie George return just 5 starters including just 1 on defense. Bearcats are much more experienced with 15 returning starters and only have Northwestern on deck. The Falcons have a more winnable home game vs Liberty on deck and Bowling Green has struggled in road openers losing 9 straight (2-7 ATS). Look for Cincinnati to take care of business as coming off a 5-0 season will not look past anyone.

OREGON by 35 over Oklahoma St - Only prior meeting came back in the 2008 Holiday Bowl with Oregon winning 42-31. Okla St is off a 27-7 home win vs UT Martin (+26'), but they did lose QB Hauss Hejny to an injury, so Zane Flores will be the main QB. Flores completed 13-20 for 136 yds and the off managed just 359 yds. Okla St returned 10 st'r's this season but hit portal hard to add talent after they had their first losing season since '05. Oregon is off of winning the B10 title and making the CFP. The Ducks brought back 14 st'r's but do have to replace their QB, top 2 WR's, and top RB. New QB Dante Moore was 18-23 for 213 and a 3-0 ratio in LW's 59-13 win over Montana St (+29'). Oregon HC Dan Lanning is 10-5 ATS as a 20+ point favorite here. After Cowboy HC Mike Gundy publicly called out Oregon's player budget this wk. Duck HC Dan Lanning has the motivation and decided talent edge pound OSU by more than 30 pts.

COLORADO by 27 over Delaware - First meeting. This is also Delaware's first FBS vs FBS gm and their furthest trip to play an FBS opp since 2003. Blue Hens began their debut ssn in CUSA by beating Delaware St, 35-17, in steady rain. They were just +60 yds and needed a 3Q pick-6 to get some breathing room. Delaware did not cover the 30'pt spread. Colorado is coming off a disappointing home loss to Georgia Tech, 27-20, in a game that was more one-sided than the score indicated. The Buffs were -158 yds but played better in the 2H and but kept it close because of 3 costly GT TO's. The D allowed 320 yds and 3 td's on the ground, so a visit from the a smaller, less physical OL will help the D recover week. Colorado will even their record Saturday against an inferior opponent still unaccustomed to the size and physicality of FBS teams. We're expecting the Buffs to win going away, with blue-chip QB JuJu Lewis putting up pts off the bench in the 2H.

WISCONSIN by 35 over Middle Tennessee - First meeting. MTSU is 3-6 ATS over their last 9 vs P4 schools. Their lone win was a 45-31 upset over Miami, FL in '22 as 25'-pt dog. The Raiders are 0-5 ATS in their last 5 road openers. The Badgers are 5-1 SU, but 1-5 ATS, vs CUSA tms (beat WKU, 34-3, as 37-pt favorite in '18). Since '21, Wisconsin is 5-2 ATS when favored by 20+ - most recently, last year vs WMich, where a 28-14 win didn't cover the 24-pt spread. The Badgers are 0-3 ATS last year vs non-conf. teams. Wisconsin is off their first non bowl season since 1991 and facing the nation's toughest schedule. Last week, Wisconsin shut out Miami (OH), 17-0, as an 18'-pt fav, which makes them 0-1 ATS. QB Billy Edwards was injured and UW finished w/a 353-117 yd edge. MTSU is in the 2nd year of Derek Mason and he had a much more experienced team, going from #107 to #36 on the Exp Chart. MT had a dismal opener, losing to Austin Peay, who was picked 6th in the UAC preseason. MT put up just 153 yards and lost by 20 as 14' pt chalk. We expect Wisconsin to take this one by 5 TD's and we couldn't back the Blue Raiders after last week's failure.

FLORIDA by 14 over Usf - This is the fourth meeting and USF covered the last two including in '22 when they only lost 31-28 (+24). USF looked like the real deal last week when they beat Boise St 34-7 (+4). Florida was dominant against FCS Long Island 55-0 (-45). QB DJ Lagway answered questions about his health by hitting 15-18 for 120 and threw 3 td passes. Florida has huge road games against LSU and Miami on deck and keeping Lagway healthy is key. USF is clearly improved under 3rd year HC Alex Golesh. They have a 3 year starting QB in Byrum Brown and the defense was impressive with 8 starters back including their top 3 tacklers. Napier is only 4-8 ATS as a home favorite here and the situation favors the Bulls but we lost some line value after last week so we only have a small lean on the dog.

ARKANSAS by 28 over Arkansas St - First meeting of in-state foes. ASU 0-47-2 all-time vs SEC with 3 straight ATS losses. This is HC Butch Jones' first gm vs the SEC since being fired by Tennessee in 2017. He lost his only gm vs Arkansas in 2015, 24-20, as a 6pt fav. RedWolves (-13') opened with 42-24 win over SEMO. Jalen Raynor threw for 345 yds and 3 td's, and ASU was up 42-10 before SEMO scored 2 td's in final 8 mins. Arkansas rolled Alabama A&M in Wk 1, 54-7, as Taylen Green threw 6 td passes and the D allowed 235 yds. However, Hogs failed to cover 47'pt number to slip to 2-6 ATS since 2022 when laying 20+ and 6-13 ATS as a home favorite under HC Sam Pittman. ASU just 2-9 ATS L/11 when getting 20+, incl 2-5 under Jones, so something has to give in Fayetteville. We expect Green to expose an Arkansas St D that returns 0 starters. Pittman needs to make statements wherever possible so Arkansas will roll by 4 td's in a high-scoring gm.

HAWAII by 17 over Sam Houston - Back half of home & home. SH St won LY's meeting, 31-13, as 4'pt home dog. Bearkats never trailed and held Hawaii 58yds below their total off average. Sam Houston is at a significant experience disadvantage this yr (54 vs 123). Plus, they have a new HC in Phil Longo. Longo is off to an 0-2 SU & ATS start, losing at WKU, 41-24, in Week 0 and LW's home opener, 38-21, to UNLV. SHSt had just 332 yds in the loss and used 2 qb's. Hawaii has also played twice, beating Stanford at home in Wk 0 before losing at Arizona LW, 40-6, as a 15pt dog. The Warriors are a dramatically better team in Honolulu, where they're 14-6-2 ATS under HC Timmy Chang. Starting QB Micah Alejado has been playing on a bad ankle, giving way to backup Luke Weaver (8-16-66-0/2) LW. Even if Weaver gets reps Saturday, we expect Hawaii to win by more than 2 td's as their veteran D has the upper hand on SHST's offense.

MARSHALL by 7 over Missouri St - First meeting. Missouri St moved up from the FCS to FBS and joined CUSA which Marshall was a member from '05-'22. The Herd are basically a whole new team with just 4 starters back under a 1st year HC in Tony Gibson. The Herd covered last week at Georgia, only losing 45-7 (+38') but the Dawgs are notorious for not covering as large favorites. Missouri St has more experience, with 9 starters back including QB Jacob Clark and they did play in the toughest FCS conference last year. The Bears were no match for USC last week, losing 73-13, but they match up much better here. Marshall is on an 8 game home winning streak so we won't call for the upset but Missouri St keeps it within a touchdown.

OHIO by 7 over West Virginia

OHIO (+) over West Virginia - WV leads all-time series 13-4 but this is their first trip to Athens since 1949. The Mountaineers have struggled in road openers losing 6 straight (1-5 ATS). Ohio has won 3 straight home openers (2-1 ATS) and are 3-1 SU & ATS vs Big 12 teams. LW Rich Rodriguez's WV offense put up 625 yds, more than any game last year. Still they only led FCS Robert Morris 10-3 at HT with only a 9-5 FD edge. They still needed a front door cover 59 yd run td with 3:15 to win 45-3 as a 41 pt HF. LW Ohio (+15') allowed a punt block TD late 2Q to trail Rutgers 31-14 but thanks to a FG with :08 left 2Q & 2 unanswered TD tied the game at 31 into 4Q but lost 34-31. Ohio QB Parker Navarro was only slowed in 2H by an over 7 min Rutgers drive. He threw for 239 with a 3-0 ratio and was the Bobcat's top rusher with 93 yd (1 td). WV has the Backyard Brawl on deck, while Ohio has a trip to Ohio St on deck. This is a huge home game for the Bobcats, and in '23 they beat Big 12 Iowa St at home 10-7 as a 2' pt HD. Look for Navarro to have another big game and will take the points as Ohio is 5-0 as a HD the last 3 years.

North Carolina by 21 over CHARLOTTE - Last year was the first meeting between these two. QB Conner Harrell led NC to a 38-13 lead before a late CLT td gave the 49ers the cover as 22 pt dogs. Harrell has since transferred to Charlotte and started in LW's 34-11 loss to App State. The 49ers only trailed 7-3 until late 2Q but were outgained 586-218 and Harrell was 13-24-124-1-1. The Heels are on short rest after their Labor Day game vs TCU. They scored on their first possession then were plagued by mistakes and missed tackles in a 48-14 beatdown and QB Gio Lopez left with an injury. CLT is 4-13 ATS as a home dog while UNC is 1-10 as a DD favorite (0-4 LY) but those were under previous HC's. Tar Heels will still have a large portion of this crowd and we expect Belichick to address the missed tackles and win by 21.

KANSAS ST by 10 over Army - First meeting since 1987 (Army won 41-14). Knights 1-7 SU L/8 vs B12 but 6-2 ATS. Army is looking to rebound from a crushing OT loss to Tarleton St, a quality FCS program but also a 2 td dog playing at West Point. Knights were -3 TO's and blew 2 td 2H lead to lose, 30-27. Kansas St is off to a rocky start as well. Wildcats opened with a tough 24-21 loss to rival Iowa St and then almost got picked off by North Dakota LW. They needed to rally behind QB Avery Johnson to pull out a seesaw gm, scoring the GW with 42 sec left. K-State has outgained its first 2 opp but is 0-2 ATS and was dangerously close to being 0-2 SU. The Cats still have enough talent on both sides of the ball to regroup and make a run at a Big 12 title. However, Army is always a unique challenge for defenses, especially off a loss. We believe they'll take the air of the ball with shifty QB Dewayne Coleman, control the clock and remain close into the 2H.

Memphis by 14 over GEORGIA ST - This is the second meeting between the 2 schools & Memphis' first trip to Georgia St. Memphis won, 59-22, at home in the 1st meeting in '18. Tigers have won 11 straight vs Sun Belt (6-5 ATS), with the last one beating Troy, 38-17, as 19-pt fav LY. Memphis is 5-9 ATS as a road favorite for HC Silverfield. GSU has won last 2 SU & ATS vs AAC schools (ECU '20/Char '23). The Panthers are 2-8-1 ATS in home openers since joining FBS in '13. Memphis loses long time QB Seth Henigan, but brings in Nevada QB Brendon Lewis. They have the best depth on defense since Silverfield got here but do have a lot of transfers. Last week, Memphis defeated Chattanooga, 45-10 (-29). Georgia St is in Year 2 of Dell McGee and did upset bowl bound Vandy at home last year. Last week, the Panthers were dismantled by Mississippi St, 63-7 (+33'). McGee is 1-5 ATS at home but covered the only time as a HD (Vandy). Silverfield is 4-9 AST as an AF. Memphis is the early 13-pt fav by Vegas. We see Memphis going over by two scores.

Tulane by 13 over SOUTH ALABAMA - This is their 4th all-time meeting. The Green Wave have won their last two vs SA (1-1 ATS). The last time here was in '20 - Tulane (-10') trailed 24-6 3Q but scored final 21 pts in 27-24 win. Since 2016, Tulane is 6-1 SU & 4-3 ATS vs the SBC (beat Louisiana LY, 41-33). Jags have dropped last 2 (37-17 on the road in '23 as 6-pt dog & 27-24 at home in '20 as 10-pt dog). S. Alabama is 0-5 SU & 2-3 ATS vs the AAC (lost to N. Texas LY, 52-38, as 6-pt dog). Both teams lost their QB's to the transfer portal, with Tulane losing theirs pre spring and S. Ala. post spring. Tulane is 9-3-1 ATS as an AF the last 4 years. Last week, Tulane defeated Northwestern at home, 23-3 (-6'). Last week, USA defeated FCS Morgan St, 38-21, but failed to cover the 28'-pt spread. Tulane is 15-2 SU/12-4-1 ATS on the road last 3 years so they will be prepared for this one.

Houston by 17 over RICE - Crosstown rivals meet for the 47th time for the "Bayou Bucket Classic". Houston 8-1 SU & 6-3 ATS L/9 but lost LTH, 43-41, in 2023 as 8pt fav. Home tm 8-2 ATS L/10 incl Cougars' 33-7 win LY (held Rice to ssn low 159 yds /9 FD's). Houston blanked Stephen F. Austin (+23') in the opener, 27-0. The D picked up where it left off LY, allowing 144 yds and 7 FD's. This is Year 2 for HC Willie Fritz who improved his offense by adding QB Conner Weigman (Texas A&M) & RB Dean Connors (Rice's best player in '24). Owls began the Scott Abell era with a road upset of Louisiana (-10) 14-12. The offense was blanked in the 2H and had just 251 yds (45 passing), but Rice held on for the win. They won't be able to overcome a lack of balance vs Houston, which will stack the box to stop RB Quinton Jackson. Plus, the Owls could have a letdown after last wk's big upset. We have Houston swarming Rice by more than 2 td's in a low-scoring gm.

LSU by 28 over Louisiana Tech - Huge sandwich for LSU, coming off a rare season opener win where they beat Clemson in a physical 17-10 fight, and they have their SEC opener vs Florida on deck. This is the first meeting since '18, won by LSU 38-21 (-20). LT is 0-11 SU but 7-4 ATS vs the SEC including last year, when they covered at Arkansas. The Bulldogs won their opener 24-0 over SELA but only put up 262 yards and face an LSU D that held Clemson to 261. LT's D only allowed 21 ppg and 308 ypg last year and held Ark to 35 points and 454 yds. LSU will come out strong but laying 38 points is too much in this sandwich game and we think LT's D keeps it closer.

MICHIGAN ST by 13 over Boston College - BC is 5-1-1 all-time vs MSU but failed to cover LY on Red Bandana Day, winning 23-19 (-4). MSU had 368-292 ydg edge in that game. Since '07, the Eagles are 4-7 SU & 2-9 ATS vs the Big Ten. The Spartans are 5-0 ATS vs ACC schools. Since '21, MSU is 9-4 ATS vs non-conf. Jonathan Smith is in his 2nd year and is 15-7 ATS as a HF. The Spartans have QB Aiden Chiles back and an improved Joe Rossi defense. Last week Mich St led WMich 23-0 (-17) but gave up a 4Q Pick-6 to blow the cover. Boston College is also in Year 2 of Bill O'Brien and he is 7-5 ATS as an AD. Mich St is playing with revenge as they had a 368-292 yard edge last year but lost. Spartans are improved and we like them at home to win by double-digits.

AUBURN by 45 over Ball St - Auburn has won all 3 meetings by a combined 147-33 (last met '09. Ball St is 0-11 all-time vs SEC by an avg MOV 44-14 (1-3-1 ATS L/5). Cardinals are 0-6 SU (1-4-1 ATS) vs P4 teams. Tigers have won 7 straight home openers and 8 straight vs MAC (scoring 54+ pts L/3). Auburn since '14 is however just 11-19-1 as a favorite of 20+. Auburn is off a 38-24 win over Baylor as a 2 pt AF, but despite leading 17-10 were actually being outgained 240-238 at HT. Auburn stopped Baylor on downs three times including at UA 3 & 11. Ball St made Purdue look like a B10 Title contender, as Ball St (+17) trailed Purdue 21-0 being out FD's 12-6 and outgained 246-105 at HT and trailed 28-0 into 4Q in a 31-0 loss. Auburn is not only more talented but much more experienced as they return 15 starters compared to Ball St's 7. Auburn only has South Alabama on deck and so despite being off a big win, will not look pas Ball St.

NEBRASKA by 42 over Akron - Second meeting. Zips lost, 59-14, in '97 as 58 pt dog. Akron is 3-7 ATS last 10. Since '07, Nebraska 6-1 SU (upset 21-17 loss to Northern Illinois in '17) & 4-2 ATS vs MAC (covered L/3). Since '18, the Huskers are 3-5 ATS when laying 20+ pts (2-0 LY). Nebraska has QB Dylan Raiola and are #39 on the Exp chart and Akron is #114 with a lot of losses to the portal. LW Nebraska (-6') defeated Cincinnati, 20-17, at Arrowhead in KC but need an int in the EZ with :34 left to seal the win. LW Akron lost to Wyoming, 10-0, as a 4' pt dog. Nebraska only has Houston Christian on deck. LW Akron (+4') only trailed Wyoming 3-0 from the 2Q to the 4Q, covering the entire game until Wyoming while running out the clock hit a 35 yd td with 4:21 left. The Zips lost RB Sean Patrick (73 tll yd) in the 1H LW with an upper body injury (?). They have a winnable game on deck at UAB and may try to get out of this game healthy enough to better compete next week.

Arizona St by 3 over MISSISSIPPI ST - Last year when these two met ASU had a 30-3 3Q lead but MSU rallied and only lost 30-23 (+5'). Aztecs only beat Northern Arizona 38-19 with a 460-331 ydg edge though NAU's final td did come with just :20 left. MSU is off a 34-17 (-15') win at Southern Miss. Blake Shapen returned from last year's injury and threw for 270 and 1 td. The Bulldogs have 16 starters back from last year's 2-10 team but the OL and DL are vastly improved, adding size and strength. ASU has 17 starters back from last year's playoff team. QB Sam Leavitt and WR Jordyn Tyson (1100 yds LY) have ASU back in contention for a Big 12 title. The Aztecs are laying a td and they did go 2-0 as an AF in Dillingham's first year however, we think this improved version of MSU can make it competitive again and ASU is making a long trip to hear the Cowbells for the first time.

USC by 35 over Georgia Southern - First meeting. GS HC Clay Helton returns to LA, where he led USC from '15-'21. Eagles 1-3 SU & 2-2 ATS vs Big Ten (lost to Wisc, 35-14, as 20'-pt dog in '23). Since '17, GS 8-8 SU & 2-6-1 ATS vs P4 (beat Neb' '22). This is USC's 3rd all-time gm vs SBC (2-0 SU & 1-1 ATS). As a DD fav under HC Lincoln Riley, USC 9-8 ATS L/3 yrs (3-0 LY). GS gets better each yr under Helton and was 8-5 LY. They're #29 on the Exp Chart led by veteran QB JC French. LW GS lost to Fresno St., 42-14, as 1'pt dog, but led 14-10 at HT. USC #84 on the Exp Chart. LW Trojans destroyed Missouri St, 73-13 (covered -36' & scored most pts 5/1930). USC has their Big Ten opener at Purdue next. Riley 29-19 ATS as a HF and Clay Helton is 8-18 ATS as an AD. GS traveled poorly to Calif LW and now heads west for a 2nd straight wk. With 2 QB's who can move the offense (Jayden Maiva & TF Husan Longstreet), we see USC cruising by 5 td's.

ALABAMA by 49 over ULM - Alabama won last 2 meetings by a combined score of 97-7 ('15 & '22). Tide have won 11 straight vs the SBC but are just 4-7 ATS (last 3 went over the total). ULM is 0-17 vs SEC teams (6-11 ATS). Bama was one of the biggest disappointments of Week 1. Not only did they lose to Florida St as a 13'pt favorite, but they were outplayed at the line of scrimmage and outrushed 230-87. Meanwhile, ULM beat St. Francis, 29-0, arguably the worst FCS squad and a program that's moving down to D3. The Warhawks only led 10-0 at HT and 17-0 at the start of the 4Q. Under normal circumstances, Alabama can name its number against an overmatched SBC team. Following an embarrassing loss that put the coaching staff under the microscope, we believe the Tide will hammer ULM without mercy until the final whistle.

Ucla by 6 over UNLV - Third meeting. Rebels lost both games, but covered in the last loss in '16, 42-21, as 26-pt dog. In L/11 vs Big Ten, UNLV 1-10 SU, yet 10-1 ATS! In the last 10 home openers, Rebels 6-4 SU/ATS. Tms have met twice (UCLA won 37-3 at home '15). Since '13, UCLA 9-3 SU (6-6 ATS) vs MWC (0-2 ATS vs Hawaii & Fresno St LY). In road openers, Bruins 4-0 SU (3-1 ATS) over last 4 yrs. UNLV has new HC Dan Mullen and they are just #130 on the Exp Chart, but brought in a bunch of P4 transfers. UCLA in Year 2 for HC DeShaun Foster and is #115 on the Exp Chart, but brings in Tenn transfer QB Nico lamaleava. LW Bruins (+6') were trounced by Utah, 43-10, and were -272 yds. lamaleava's was disappointing (11-22-136-1-1). LW UNLV (-9') defeated SHSt, 38-21. UCLA is 6-3 ATS as an AF the last 5 yrs. UNLV is 10-16 ATS as a HD L/11 yrs. We think UCLA is better than they showed LW and will rebound with a close road win.

NEW MEXICO ST by 3 over Tulsa - Tulsa is making their first trip to Las Cruces since '00. The Hurriacne beat CUSA's LA Tech 23-20 on the road last year. Now they are a road favorite for the first time since '22. NMSt is off a 19-3 win over Bryant. The Aggies only had a 305-255 yd edge. Tulsa led Abilene Christian 10-0 at half last week before pulling away in the 2H. It was 35-0 when AC scored their only td with 6:42 left. NMSt was 3-1 as home dogs last year. Tulsa was 0-5 SU/1-4 ATS on the road last year yet they are favored here and we think NMSt pulls a small upset.

BYU by 14 over Stanford - BYU won last meeting in 2022, 35-26, as a 6'pt favorite. Since 2020, Cougars are 10-3 ATS at home vs P4 opponents. BYU began the season with a 69-0 win over Portland St (+43') who was picked to finish 10th in the Big Sky preseason poll. The Cougars rushed for 468 yds, and true frosh QB Bear Bachmeier accounted for 5 td's. Stanford is coming off an unusually early bye wk. In their lone game, the Cardinal (+2') lost at Hawaii, 23-20. The offense struggled, but the D did well to hold Hawaii to just 306 total yds and 210 through the air. The veteran Stanford defense will be a much tougher test for the unproven Bachmeier than what he faced in the opener. The Cardinal will want to slow the game down by running RB Micah Ford and limiting QB Ben Gulbranson's downfield throws. BYU will move to 2-0 but we believe the Cougars are being slightly overvalued by the 69pt rout of a bad FCS opponent.

San Diego St by 6 over WASHINGTON ST - Tms will be in the same league next yr as SD St joins Pac-12. Aztecs (+14') lost LY's meeting at home, 29-26, but were +43 yds and led by 12 in the 4Q before allowing final 15 pts to John Mateer and the Cougars. Mateer is gone and this is a very different and less experienced squad (Wazzu #125 on Exp Chart/ SD St #35). Plus, the Cougars have a new staff. They started slowly in Wk 1, escaping Idaho (+16'), 13-10. The offense had just 13 FD's while rushing for 3 yds (0.1 ypc)! The Aztecs were similarly favored, laying 19' to Stony Brook. However, they rolled 42-0, outgaining the Seawolves 453-95 in a wire-to-wire domination. This is Year 2 for HC Sean Lewis, and his Flash Fast offense will be more dangerous. His D returns 10 starters which gives the Aztecs a big edge on the rebuilt Cougar offense. These tms are going in opposite directions, and we believe SD St is the more complete squad.

DEN addition of LB Greenlaw and injury return of LB Singleton will be a big boost to a DEF on fire this preseason allowing the lowest YGP (191.3) and #7 in the league LY (317.1). TEN rookie QB Ward will have a tough time vs a DEN team that are 5-1 ATS as a -7.5+ fav. There should be some help for Ward as TEN def was #3 total def LY but losing top pass rusher EDGE Landry will sting. They move on from the 9 sack veteran a year ago to rookie Oladejo. This tied with TEN being #28 offense LY gets them put as a big dog and games where TEN is under +14 are 1-8 ATS. DEN offense will look to improve from last year with the addition of TE Engram on top of a young receiver corp. DEN 2nd yr QB Nix adds another year under Payton's offense to improve. With DEN coming in hot of preseason, at Mile High, fav by a little over a TD, all the stars align to here to take the Broncos by 2 td's.

3★ San Francisco over SEATTLE - Seahawks 12th man isn't what it used to be, they are 1-5 ATS/SU as HD LW. LY these teams split games but the last 3 H2H at Lumen Field were all 49ers who are 3-0 ATS/SU. With the line sitting around a FG we can look at the last 5 games SF was an AF of >3 and see they are 4-1 ATS/SU. SEA signs former MIN QB Darnold who threw for 4564 (66%) with a super 36-13 ratio but they also lose star WR Metcalf. SF went 6-11 LY but actually had the 4th most YPG (376.3) and with a healthy HB McCaffery we expect a much better year. SEA has lost 2 straight week 1 games while SF has won 2 straight.

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Pittsburgh over NYJETS - One team that does well wk1 and one team that doesn't is the story here. PITT is 4-1 ATS/SU while NYJ sit at 1-5 ATS/SU. PITT QB Rodgers gets revenge against NYJ def that allowed 23.8 PPG LY while PITT def allowed 20.4 PPG. These teams met in wk 7 LY where Rodgers threw for 276 yds 1TD 2INTs but now he joins the Steelers and their #6 rushing defense to stop new NYJ QB Fields from running. QB Rodgers had some good stats LY ending #8 in pass yds and #7 in TDs. PITT in the last 8 games are 5-3 ATS/SU and should improve their week 1 record here.

OTHER PLAYS

Dallas vs PHILADELPHIA- Thursday - The Eagles swept DAL last year, including a 28-23 win at home where Hurts threw for 3 TD and the defense forced 2 turnovers. The Cowboys are just 2-4 ATS in their last 6 vs PHI, despite Prescott averaging 270 ypg passing in that span. Philly's defense allowed only 17.1 PPG in 2024 (#1) and gave up just 5.1 yds/pass at home. Dallas countered with the #5 scoring defense (19.5 PPG allowed) and DAL finished the season 3-1 ATS. They now trade away EDGE Parsons and lose a huge pass rush but gain DT Clark to help the run. The Eagles are 8-1 SU (6-3 ATS) in their last 8 home openers, while DAL is 3-3 SU/ATS. Prescott has thrown at least 2 INTs in 3 of the last 5 vs PHI, he'll need to throw the ball to the right team to have a chance in this one. **We'll have one of our Marquee selections available after Noon EST on gameday.**

Kansas City vs LA Chargers (Friday - Brazil) - KC has won 6 straight SU vs LAC but is just 2-3-1 ATS in that span. Both games last year were tight: 19-17 (-4.5) and 17-10 (-7), both Chargers covers. Mahomes has averaged 287 pass yds and 11TDs/2INTs ratio in his last 5 vs LAC. The Chargers finished 2024 ranked #2 in scoring defense (17.7 ppg) and aim to give the chiefs issues on Fri. In the past 5 years LAC have won 4 out of 5 (3-1-1 ATS) wk1 games with an avg score of 23-19. KC has dominated H2H matchups winning 10-2 SU but only 5-6-1 ATS. Neutral site openers have trended Over (7 of last 10 international games). KC wk1 is 7-1 SU (6-2 ATS) while the LAC are 5-1 SU (3-1-2 ATS). **We'll have one of our Marquee selections available after Noon EST on gameday.**

Tampa bay by 3 over ATLANTA - TB and ATL open the season in what has been a lopsided series lately, with TB just 1-4 SU and 1-5 ATS vs ATL. Despite that, TB has been dominant in openers, going 3-0 SU/ATS in wk1. ATL once struggled badly in wk1, starting 0-6 ATS, but the last 3 yrs they've turned it around with a 2-1 ATS mark. The past 3 h2h matchups have averaged 59 total pts, setting the stage for another shootout. Mayfield comes in off a huge year with 41 TDs (#2) and 4,500 pass yds (#3), and he's been sharp in wk1 with TB, averaging 231 pass yds and 3 TDs with 0 INTs the last 2 yrs. On the other side, ATL QB Penix Jr. averaged 246 pass ypg in his 3 starts LY, including 2 OT losses to close the season. While trends lean slightly toward ATL, the eye test favors Mayfield in his 3rd yr with this WR corps.

Arizona by 7 over NEW ORLEANS - ARI heads to NO in a rare matchup, with these teams meeting just once in the past 6 yrs - a Thurs night win for ARI back in 2022. History in the Superdome hasn't been kind though, as ARI is 0-5 ATS in its last 5 road games vs NO. Week 1 trends tell a different story, with ARI riding a strong 5-1 ATS mark in openers (2-3-1 SU), showing they tend to start fast against the number. NO has been consistent out of the gate, winning 6 straight wk1 games, though only managing a 3-3 ATS record in that span. The Saints' ability to take care of business early is proven, but ARI's knack for covering in wk1 creates an interesting clash of trends. With the NO questions at QB and ARI QB Murray having another yr with Harrison Jr we'll take the Cardinals to handle business.

Cincinnati by 3 over CLEVELAND - CIN and CLE renew their rivalry with plenty of trends pointing both ways. CIN has covered 4 of the last 5 vs CLE and is 7-2 ATS in its last 9 road games, but they've struggled badly in Cleveland going just 1-6 SU in their last 7 trips. Week 1 hasn't been kind to CIN either, sitting 0-3 SU/ATS the last 3 yrs including a loss to CLE in 2023. CLE has fared better early, 2-2 SU and 3-1 ATS in wk1 during that stretch. CLE QB Flacco looks to recapture the late 2023 form where he averaged 323 pass ypg and 2.6 TD pg, while CIN QB Burrow comes in off an almost MVP campaign, finishing #1 in pass yds, TDs, and comp/att. These teams met twice LY (21-14, 24-6), overall CIN has won and covered 3 straight vs CLE. With CIN's wk1 slump and CLE's home edge, an upset is in play. Burrow and this Bengals offense may simply prove too much but not enough to cover.

Las Vegas by 3 over NEW ENGLAND - LV and NE square off with the Raiders holding the upper hand recently, going 2-0 SU/ATS vs NE. LV has been solid in openers overall at 4-2 SU, though they've slipped a bit going just 1-2 SU/ATS the past 3 wk1 games. NE has also been shaky to start seasons, 4-3 SU in wk1 but only 1-3 SU in their last 4. The big storyline is new LV HC Carroll taking over and reuniting with his QB Smith, who faced NE LY and put up 327 pass yds with 1 TD and 0 INT. On the other side, NE's 2nd-yr QB Maye will try to steady things on the road, where he averaged 215 pass yds with 1 TD and 1 INT. With the coaching change and Smith's familiarity, LV enters with momentum, while NE leans on a young QB still finding his footing.

WASHINGTON by 4 over NY Giants - NYG and WAS clash in a divisional battle where recent history leans toward the Commanders. NYG is 4-2 ATS in the last 6 vs WAS, but they've dropped the last 2 SU/ATS. Week 1 has been a nightmare spot for NYG, sitting at 1-7 SU/ATS in their last 8 season openers and an even worse 2-9 SU (3-8 ATS) when opening on the road. WAS has been steadier, 4-3 SU/ATS in wk1 the last 7 yrs. Last season WAS QB Daniels was efficient vs NYG, averaging 218 pass yds while leading wins of 21-18 and 27-22. Both were close, but WAS came out ahead by 3 and 5 pts, which lines up with expectations again here.

JACKSONVILLE by 6 over Carolina - CAR heads to JAX with plenty of intrigue around rookie WR/DB Hunter, the #2 ovr pick who is set to start on both sides of the ball - a true unicorn player to watch. Historically, CAR has had the edge in this matchup at 3-1 SU/ATS, but the most recent meeting in 2023

was a disaster, a 0-26 shutout loss. Week 1 has been brutal for CAR, going 0-3 SU/ATS the last 3 yrs, and in the past 2 openers they've lost by an avg of 26 pts. JAX hasn't been much better at 1-3 SU (2-2 ATS) in wk1, but this will be their first home opener since 2020, and it also marks QB Lawrence's first wk1 home start. CAR QB Young has struggled in his wk1 outings, posting just 146 pass yds with 1 TD 2 INT in one, and 161 pass yds with 0 TD 2 INT in the other. With CAR's offensive struggles and the hype around JAX's new star, this sets up as a comfortable spot for the Jaguars to take control.

Miami by 3 over INDIANAPOLIS - MIA and IND meet with trends heavily tilted toward the Dolphins. IND has held a slight edge H2H at 3-1 SU (2-2 ATS), but at home the Colts have struggled badly vs MIA, going 4-7 SU and just 2-7 ATS. Even worse, IND has been historically dreadful in openers with a 0-10-1 SU mark (1-9-1 ATS) in their last 11 wk1 games. MIA, on the other hand, has thrived in this spot, riding a 4-game wk1 win streak while going 3-1 ATS, and they're 5-1 ATS on the road in wk1 overall. QB Tagovailoa has lit it up the last two wk1 games, posting 466 yds 3 TD 1 INT in one and 338 yds 1 TD 0 INT in the other, and comes into this opener fully healthy. IND has made the move to bench QB Richardson in favor of QB Jones, hoping to provide a spark, but with these trends and Tua's wk1 track record, MIA looks primed to keep rolling.

LA RAMS by 6 over Houston - HOU travels to LAR with the odds stacked against them historically. HOU is 1-4 SU/ATS vs the Rams, though they did manage to cover in their last meeting back in 2021. Week 1 has been decent overall for HOU at 2-1-1 SU (2-2 ATS), but when opening on the road they've struggled badly at 1-4 SU/ATS. LAR has been a strong starter, going 6-2 SU/ATS in wk1 and an even better 4-1 SU/ATS at home in openers. QB Stafford enters with back injury concerns but will start, which is big given that in his last 2 wk1 games he threw for 300+ yds each time. Now with star WR Adams added to the mix, expectations are high for another big outing through the air. With LAR's proven wk1 edge and Stafford's firepower, this looks like their game to control.

GREEN BAY by 1 over Detroit - DET and GB square off in a rivalry that has tilted Detroit's way recently, with DET going 6-1 SU (5-2 ATS) H2H, though they've slipped to just 1-2 ATS in the last 3. DET has been reliable against the number in wk1, a perfect 4-0 ATS despite only a 2-2 SU record. GB had once owned openers with a 6-game wk1 win streak but have cooled off, now 1-3 SU/ATS in their last 4. The spotlight is on new GB EDGE Parsons, acquired at a heavy price of 2 first-rd picks and DT Clark. Despite injury concerns, Parsons is expected to play and could cause problems for DET QB Goff, who has been sharp vs GB with 253 pass yds, 2 TDs, and 0 INTs per game in the last 3 meetings. GB QB Love has also fared well in this matchup, averaging 249 pass yds, 1.5 TDs, and 0 INTs vs DET. With both QBs efficient and plenty of firepower, this has the makings of a shootout. Momentum leans slightly toward the Pack here.

Baltimore vs BUFFALO - SNF - BAL vs BUF is a must watch this week, wk1 matchups with two elite QBs facing off again. BUF holds the H2H edge at 3-1 SU (2-1-1 ATS), and when playing at home vs BAL they've been dominant, going 4-1 SU/ATS. Week 1 has been shaky for BUF with a 2-2 SU (1-3 ATS) record, while BAL has excelled early at 7-2 SU/ATS, though just 1-2 SU/ATS on the road in openers. The QB duel will be key, but both have been contained in these meetings: BUF QB Allen has been held under 200 pass yds in 3 of 4 games vs BAL, while BAL QB Jackson has been limited to under 160 pass yds in the last 3 matchups. With two defenses that know how to disrupt star QBs, this one could come down to who makes the bigger play late.

Minnesota vs CHICAGO - MNF - MIN heads to CHI with recent history heavily in their favor, winning 7 of the last 8 H2H (5-2-1 ATS) and a perfect 5-0 SU (4-0-1 ATS) in road games vs the Bears. However, wk1 has been a stumbling block for the Vikings, sitting 2-3 SU/ATS overall and 0-3 SU/ATS on the road. CHI has been stronger in openers, 3-2 SU/ATS with a 2-1 mark at home. CHI QB Williams played well vs MIN LY, averaging 266 pass yds with 1.5 TDs and 0 INTs, though their last meeting was a 30-12 Vikings win where a late garbage-time TD boosted those numbers. For MIN, it's a new era as they move on from Darold and hand the reins to QB McCarthy, who gets his first chance to prove himself on a big stage. With both QBs under the spotlight and early-season momentum on the line, this divisional clash has plenty of intrigue. **Remember on Monday Nights you can get a \$back+ guarantee! 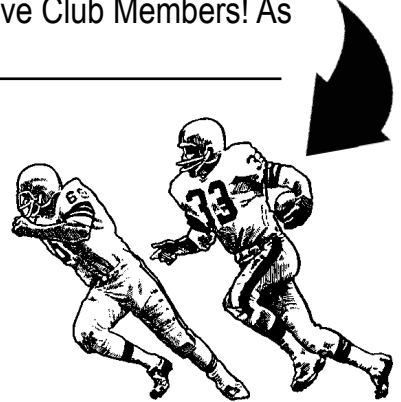
