SUPER BOWL SITUATIONS

Let's take a look at some interesting situations about Super Bowl matchups. Here are the answers to recent questions about past Super Bowls. **How does a lower seed do?** The playoffs expanded in 1990 and the NFL seeded teams 1 thru 6. In 2010 it was only the second time in 16 years that a #1 seed had failed to make the Super Bowl and the only time with a matchup between the #2 and #6 seeds. With the Bucs earning the trip, the team ranked as the #4 seed or lower has reached the Super Bowl 7 times in the last 14 years, winning it 4 times. One of the most surprising stats is that the LOWER SEED is now 10-3 SU and 11-2 ATS. **What happens when an AFC/NFC Title game favorite was outgained?** Six years ago BOTH teams were outgained in the conf finals but SF was a favorite. In 2011 New England was outgained 398-330 and of course was upset. In 2010 the Pittsburgh Steelers were outgained by the NY Jets 289-287 and since 1992, only 10 teams have been outgained as favorites in the title gm and went on to play in the Super Bowl. In 2009 the New Orleans Saints were outgained 475-257 but of course went on to beat Indianapolis. The Bears were outgained in 2007 by a 364-340 edge and then lost and failed to cover vs Indy. In 2005 New England was outgained 388-322 vs PIT and won but did not cover in the SB 24-21 (-7). In 1998 Denver was outgained 370-331 and won the SB 34-19 (-7) and was outgained in '97 but won 31-24 (+11). Pittsburgh was outgained in '95 (328-285) and went on to cover the SB 27-17 (+13.5) and SF won the SB 49-26 (-18) in '94 after being outgained by 157 yds by DAL. DEN was the latest to win and cover 5Y ago in the SB (+4', 24-10 win over CAR) after being outgained by NE (336-244). In '17 the Patriots were outgained (374-344) by Jacksonville in their come-from-behind win and would later go on to lose outright in the Super Bowl as a favorite against the Eagles. LY the #1 seed 49ers were narrowly outgained (358-354) in their easy win over the Packers. Teams are 5-4 SU and 6-3 ATS (dog is 4-1 ATS). **Thinking about a record?** The most combined total points in a Super Bowl came in SB 29 as SF and SD combined for 75 pts. 2017's PHI/NE matchup nearly reached the mark at 74 pts followed by 69 total pts twice as DAL defeated BUF and TB beat OAK. TY's opening total for the Chiefs and Bucs is 57. The fewest points scored had previously been 1975 when PIT and MIN combined for 22 pts in SB 9 while MIA and WAS combined for 21 pts in SB 7. However, 2018's meeting between the Patriots and Rams set a new record at just 16 com pts. **Quick starts?** The final thing we'll look at is how teams have started and scored in the 1Q. It has been slow going as in the last 22 Super Bowls only FOUR TIMES have the teams combined for over 10 total points in the opening period (SF/KC 10 pts LY). Five times in the last 20 years has seen a 3-0 score after 1Q and on 5 occasions (incl '19) both teams failed to score. **GOTTA LOVE THOSE PROPS!!** Over the last 13 seasons we've had solid success with our Super Bowl prop plays. In fact we are now 116-77 (60%) on those releases!

GAME OVERVIEW - Following an impressive 14 pt win over the Bills where they finished with a solid 439-363 yd edge, the Chiefs are back in the Super Bowl for the 2nd straight season and 4th time overall. The Bucs meanwhile have earned a berth in the "Big Game" for the 1st time since the '02 season (48-21 blowout win over the Raiders) after picking up a 5 pt win LW in Lambeau. The past 11 SB's have seen the AFC own a 6-5 edge while the favorite has gone just 8-11 SU/6-13 ATS the past 19 years ("Over" has hit in 6 of the L/10).

RECORD VS THE SPREAD - While the Chiefs did earn the #1 seed in the AFC for 2020, their spread record has been an issue as LW's cover against the Bills was their 1st ATS victory since way back at the start of November against the Jets (0-8-1 ATS prior to BUF cover!). The Bucs meanwhile are on a 6-2 ATS run heading into this matchup including B2B outright road upsets of the Saints and Packers in the past 2 weeks. KC is now 7-0 SU (3-3-1 ATS) against foes with a winning record (+155 ypg, -1 TO) while TB has gone 3-4 SU (4-3 ATS) against winning foes (-51 ypg, -1 TO).

LARGE EDGE: BUCS

TURF/SITE - This marks the 2nd time during the 2020 season that the Chiefs have visited Raymond James Stadium (27-24 win over TB back in Wk 12) while the Bucs have become the 1st team in Super Bowl history to host the "Big Game". The homefield advantage is not as you would expect this time around however as the attendance is being held to just 22,000 (or 1/3 of capacity) due to Covid restrictions with most of the tickets going to NFL exec's and first responders across the nation.

SMALL EDGE: BUCS

CHIEFS #1 OFFENSE VS BUCS #6 DEFENSE - The Chiefs finished the 2020 campaign with the #1 total offense in the NFL (#6 scoring) behind another MVP caliber year from QB Mahomes and the WR/TE duo of Hill and Kelce. The Bucs defense has held their own throughout 2020 as well finishing #6 overall in total yards allowed and 8th in scoring. The key to their defense has been a dominant front 7 that allowed the fewest rush ypg in the NFL (81 ypg). We don't see an edge in this matchup.

EDGE: EVEN

BUCS #7 OFFENSE VS CHIEFS #16 DEFENSE - While the Bucs running game was among the league's weakest throughout the year, the arrival of veteran QB under center saw the TB passing game finish #2 in the NFL (KC #1) with Brady surpassing the 300-yard passing mark on 8 occasions. The Chiefs on the other hand had a middle of the pack defensive unit throughout at #16 in yards allowed. Their scoring defense was a little better however finishing #10 overall.

SMALL EDGE: BUCS

CHIEFS #16 SPECIAL TEAMS VS BUCS #26 SPECIAL TEAMS - The Chiefs ST unit has come through on a handful of occasions during the 2020 season with a pair of TD's in the return game along with another efficient year from K Butker (29-32 combined reg ssn & playoffs). The Bucs meanwhile finished in the bottom third of our ST rankings (mediocre return unit) despite K Succop combining to hit 36 of his 39 FG attempts.

COACHING - This marks the 2nd consecutive Super Bowl appearance for HC Andy Reid and his 3rd overall as he led the Eagles to the "Big Game" back in '04 (lost to Brady and the Patriots). Reid has now gone 17-14 in playoff matchups during his 22 years as HC. Bruce Arians meanwhile is making his HC debut in the Super Bowl although he does have some coaching experience in this game as an OC with the Steelers. Arians' all-time postseason mark is 4-2 with 3 of those victories coming TY.

LARGE EDGE: CHIEFS

PAST HISTORY MATCHUP/INTANGIBLES - The Chiefs and Bucs square off for the 7th time since 1999 with TB owning a 6-1 mark in that span. The only win for the Chiefs did come this season however as they went into Tampa and picked up a 27-24 win (-3') in a game that they actually led 17-0 after the 1Q with WR Hill pulling in 7 rec for 203 yds & 2 TD in that previously mentioned first 15 minutes (Bucs 14 unanswered pts in the 4Q to get the backdoor cover). With the matchup being played in TB's home stadium along with the series edge, the Bucs get the edge.

EDGE: BUCS

CONCLUSION - The Chiefs are in search of becoming the first team to capture B2B Lombardi Trophies since Brady and the Patriots won in both '03 & '04. Speaking of Brady, it's also worth mentioning that this will be just the 2nd time in his TEN Super Bowl appearances that he will be the dog (NE picked up the outright upset of the Rams as a 14 pt dog way back in 2001. At 43 years of age, Brady will be the oldest player to ever play in the "Big Game" and judging by the zip he had on the ball in the freezing temps of Green Bay, he looks poised to continue his career after this season. After Brady's signing was official, the Bucs opened as a 16/1 favorite to win it all while the defending champs came in at a decent 7/1. While it's hard to not roll with the Chiefs here with all of the success that they've had since Mahomes took over under center, there's something about the veteran Brady as an underdog inside of their home venue. With the forecast well in favor of the Bucs with a 7 pt projected win and a 422-384 yd edge, we have no issue backing the dog!
