Montana St (13-2)

This is the FCS National Championship game which is being played in Nashville, TN for the first time. Montana St HC Brent Vigen is 11-4 SU in playoff games but has yet to win a National Title. They've been to the Championship twice under Vigen and lost both to NDSU. Illinois St HC Brock Spack is 12-6 in postseason games. He led the Redbirds to the National Title game in 2014 when they lost 29-27 vs NDSU.

ISU is the story of the FCS playoffs. They were 4-3 before a 4 game win streak but lost their reg ssn finale 37-7 vs Southern Illinois. The Redbirds were unseeded in the playoffs and have had to run a road gauntlet. They beat SELA 21-3 in the first round. ISU was +24* at NDSU and pulled the upset of the season, outgaining the Bison 422-179 and won 29-28. The Redbirds pulled their 3rd road upset by beating UC Davis 42-31. They were favored to beat Villanova and never trailed. ISU led 30-7 and Nova scored a late td. QB Tommy Rittenhouse has a 36-12 ratio. They have a 1,000 rusher and WR. Their DB's allowed a 21-13 ratio in the reg ssn but only a 5-6 ratio in the playoffs.

MSU had to rebuild much of their roster after losing LY's Nat'l title run. They started 0-2 with losses at Oregon and SDSU but they've won the table since, winning 13 straight. They held on to beat Yale 21-13, beat SF Austin 44-28 (-13') in the quarters. The semi's was a rematch of The Brawl of the Wild. They trailed 23-20 mid 3Q, but scored 4 td's including a pick-6 for a misleading 48-23 final. MSU is #4 in our Pass D rankings (62%, 18-16). RB's Davis and Jones have both topped 1,000 yds. QB Lamson has a 24-3 ratio. MSU's D is holding foes 76 yds below their avg (#2 in FCS).

MSU has a strong edge on D but ISU put up 29 points/422 yds on NDSU who had the FCS' #1 D coming in. PP forecast calls for 59 points which is a lean on the Over and we think this is high scoring.

These Power Play Forecasts are the most unique in the country because they are based on **Northcoast Sports' Private Power Ratings**. Our ratings are unlike any computer rating, as we take into account all of the following: Strength of Opponents Individual Units (Rushing Offense and Defense, Passing Offense, & Defense, Scoring Offense and Defense, Garbage Yards, Weather, Injuries, Home Field Edge, and Successful Unbalanced Attacks). Here is how each is reflected:

Strength of Opponent: Our ratings do not just take the opposing team's overall power rating into account. For example, Team A's defense vs the rush was rated at 119. They faced Team B and allowed "just" 256 yds rushing and **dropped 5 spots** in the national overall defensive ratings. However, Power Plays took into account their potent Opponents run attack and had forecasted the Team A yielding 289 yds. Due to the fact they did better than the forecast, Power Plays raised their rating to 112 even though they slipped in the national (straight yardage) rankings. Next time an announcer on TV tells you that a certain team is #3 in the country vs the run **you better check Northeast Sports' Power Ratings and see how good a rush defense they really have!** The top twenty ratings in Power Ratings for each offensive and defensive category will be listed in each week's issue of Power Plays.

Garbage yards: These are yards that a team gains or allows in the final minutes of a game when it has been decided. For example, Team A is ahead 63-0 and allows 93 yards passing for a TD vs its fourth string defense. These yards are **counted** into national ratings, **but not in Northcoast Sports' Power Ratings!**

Weather: If a game is played in miserable weather conditions and is low scoring, the straight statistics credit the defense with outstanding performances. Our Power Ratings reflect the conditions and do not give excess credit to the defenses.

Injuries: When Missouri played Vanderbilt in '13, Tigers QB James Franklin was injured early in the game. His backup, who had seen very little action (rFr), was not prepared and hit on 30%, 9-30 passes. The offensive coordinator simplified the offense. In the national statistics Vanderbilt's overall defense **MOVED UP 8 NOTCHES**. In the Power Ratings they **went from #11 dropping out of the Top 15**, as the poor performance WAS NOT reflective of an outstanding performance by the defense.

Home Field Edges: The weekly projection of yards and points is weighted with the home field factored in.

Successful Unbalanced Attacks: A few Seasons ago, Tulsa was held to 155 yards passing vs Houston. This dropped Tulsa in the national passing offense ratings & RAISED the Cougars in the pass defense ratings. In our ratings the two units **remained** rated around the same. Why? Tulsa rushed for 350 yards & DID NOT HAVE TO RELY ON THE PASS & when they did they hit 18 of 32. While Houston's pass defense looked good in the national ratings, only Northcoast Sports' Power Ratings reflected the TRUTH!

There you have it. More than just numbers, **THESE RATINGS REFLECT** the true strength of each unit and allow them to have **the most accurate forecast of yards gained and points allowed in the country! No other rating system takes into account all the previous factors.** Next time you hear that a team is rated third in the country in pass defense, just remember, yards are not everything and Northcoast Sports' Power Plays will show you how strong the team really is.

The Power Ratings listed below are not based on the Power Plays, they are based on last year's final computer power rating numbers with the pluses and minuses from the off season changes factored in. They are then adjusted during the course of the season based on the final score of the games that are played on a weekly basis. The Power Ratings listed below can be used for you as a base power ratings to forecast up coming lines and strength of opponents, etc. Once again, they are not based on Power Plays and **they differ from what we have shown in recent years**, which has been our actual computer Power Ratings. These are Northcoast Sports Plus or Minus Power Ratings.

This game was formerly known as the Hall of Fame Bowl and the Outback Bowl. Iowa is 3-3 SU here. They won their last trip in '19 when they beat Miss St 27-22. This is Vandy's first trip to this bowl. Kirk Ferentz is 10-11 SU/12-8-1 ATS in bowls. Clark Lea won his only prior bowl trip LY when they beat GTech 35-27 (+3).

Iowa finished 8-5 last year. They brought back 12 starters and added FCS transfer QB Mark Gronowski from SDSU. The Hawkeyes lost a close gm to Iowa St for the 2nd straight year. Iowa played Indiana tight in a 20-15 loss then won 3 straight including at Wisky 37-0 and at home vs Minn 41-3. Iowa lost close games to Oregon and USC then won their L/2 to finish 8-4. All four losses were by 5 points or less and two of those were against playoff teams. QB Gronowski only has an 8-6 ratio but also has 15 rushing td's. Their D allows just 15 ppg/271 ypg and they hold foes 102 ypg below their avg (#11 in FBS). Iowa's pass D is #6 in our PDR, allowing just 158 ypg (57%, 6-11). Iowa is #3 in our ST's rankings thanks to 1st TM AA Return Man Kaden Wetjen (4 ret td's) and K Drew Stevens has made 4 fg's of over 50+ (L/58).

Vandy was the surprise of the SEC LY when they went 7-6 including an upset over Bama. 17 starters returned including QB Pavia. The 'Dores started 5-0 against a weak sked. They lost at Bama then won 5 of their L/6 (lost at TX) to finish 10-2 but only 3 of their 10 wins were against bowl teams. QB Pavia was a Heisman finalist but he will be w/o Mackey Award winning TE Eli Stowers (769, 12.4). Their D allows 22 ppg/356 ypg and holds foes 9 ypg below their avg (#64). Vandy is #38 in our ST rankings.

Vandy is 18-6-1 ATS L2Y but Iowa is 9-3 ATS TY including 4-0 as an underdog and they were within a td of both Oregon and Indiana. PP has Vandy by 8 but our checklist only has Vandy by 2 and the loss of their star TE is big. Iowa's D keeps this close so no play.

Only other mtg in '14 Sun Bowl won by ASU 36-31. Sun Devils also played '17 & '19 Sun Bowl, which was their last bowl win. HC Dillingham lost only bowl LY to Texas, 39-31, as 13pt dog in CFP. Since '12, Duke 5-4 SU & 7-2 ATS in bowls. HC Diaz 0-3 SU & ATS all-time in bowls. Lost Gator Bowl to Ole Miss (-17') LY 52-20.

Reigning Big 12 champ ASU is 8-4 SU & 5-6-1 ATS. They lost in non-conf to Miss St and went 6-3 in Big 12 play. Devils just +2 ppg & +57 ypg, going 5-1 in gms decided by 5 or less. They won 1st 2 conf gms by 3 but were routed by Utah 42-10 (QB Leavitt DNP). A wk later, ASU became only tm to beat Texas Tech. Leavitt OYF in Houston loss but tm went 3-1 with Jeff Sims at QB. Sims a downgrade as passer but dangerous runner (886, 7-5, 466 rush). Devils' top RB & WR out which should give former Army RB Kanye Udoh feature role. ASU D played well all yr, holding opp 81 ypg below their avg (#16 FBS). They give up 3.4 ypc and allowed more than 24pts in just the Utah gm. Leading tklr LB Keyshaun Elliott not playing.

Diaz's 2nd yr has been a bizarre one. Devils opened 1-2, losing by 26 to Illinois and at Tulane. They went 4-1 over next 5 and outgained 6-0 GT in only loss. Seesaw ssn conf with b2b losses to UConn & Virginia before beating UNC & WF to win complex tiebreaker and ACC CG gm. In Charlotte, Duke beat UVA in rematch for 1st outright ACC title since '62. Off has been ahead of the D all yr. Darian Mensah is a top QB who's thrown for 3646 (68%, 30-5) and top RB Nate Sheppard (962, 5.4) & WR Cooper Barkate (1069, 15.7) should play. The D really struggles vs the pass (#98, 18-13) and top CB Chandler Rivers has already opted out of gm.

PP has Duke winning 29-28. We agree Blue Devils win but have it by more than the spread so this is a no play. Duke has a big edge on offense, and their struggles in pass D won't get exposed vs this opponent. Mensah outplays Sims who's w/o his top weapons.

Two Blue Blood programs meet for just the 3rd time. They played each other last year and Texas won 31-12. The prior meeting was back in '01 and Texas won that 38-37 in the Rose Bowl. Biff Poggi is the Interim HC and this is his first bowl. LY Mich took out Bama in the Reliaquest Bowl. Sark is 2-3 SU/1-4 ATS in bowls and last year he took the Longhorns to the Semifinals where they lost to Ohio St.

Mich made a big upgrade at QB with true frosh Bryce Underwood. They lost at Oklahoma and USC then won 5 straight. The Wolverines were 9-2 heading into The Game vs Ohio St but lost 27-9, heading their 4 game series win streak. Mich is +9 ppg/+87 ypg. RB's Marshall and Haynes have been the strength, combining for over 1,700 yards and 20 td's as UM rushes for 213 (5.5). The D allows just 19 ppg/312 ypg but they will be w/o DE Moore (10 sk). Interim HC Poggi has done a good job keeping the roster in tact with only 3 players opting out despite the recent turmoil.

Texas was coming off a playoff season and QB Arch Manning stepping with high expectations. Manning struggled early and they lost at Ohio St and at Florida. They beat rival Oklahoma to spark a 4 game win streak as Manning found his footing with B2B 300 yd passing gms vs Miss St & Vandy. The 35-10 loss at UGA was misleading and Texas won their L/2 including over unbeaten A&M but were left out of the playoffs. Manning finished w/a 20-7 ratio. Texas' top 3 RB's have opted out but they only avg 130 (3.9). Their D allowed just 20 ppg/336 ypg but 7 of their top 12 tacklers have opted out including AA LB Anthony Hill and S Michael Taaffe.

The majority of the opt outs on this game are on the defensive side. Michigan is missing their best pass rusher. Texas is missing 7 starters on D. Manning had unfair early expectations but has looked better of late and Underwood is improving. PP has it going over without factoring all the opt outs and we agree.

Nebraska leads 4-0 but last met in '92. Huskers won Pinstripe Bowl LY in 1st bowl since '16 and 1st bowl win since '15. HC Matt Rhule 2-2 SU & ATS in bowls. This is Utah's 7th Las Vegas Bowl berth (4-2 SU & 3-3 ATS) and 1st gm as HC for Morgan Scalley.

The post-Kyle Whittingham era at Utah begins in Vegas. Scalley was a former Ute DB and has been on staff since '07 so transition should be smooth. Utah 10-2 SU & 8-4 after going 5-7 in '24. They're a dominant +22ppg and +119ypp but lost 2 biggest gms to TT and rival BYU. Offense gains 116ypp above opp avg (#8 FBS) behind #2 run gm (270, 6.1). Utes have huge edge in backfield with QB's Devon Dampier (2180, 22-5, 687 rush) & Byrd Ficklin (503, 9.0 rush) and RB Wayshawn Parker (931, 7.0). However, elite OT's Spencer Fano & Caleb Lomu opted out. Scalley's D is great against the pass (#2, 49%, 11-14) but the run D got trucked in Nov (275ypp/7.1 ypc).

Nebraska took another step forward in Rhule's 3rd yr by winning 7 reg ssn gms for 1st time in 9 yrs. But there's a long way to go. Huskers' best wins were over Cincy & NW, and they went 0-4 vs best opponents. Plus, blue-chip QB Dylan Raiola went OFY Nov. 1 and is in the portal. Frosh TJ Lateef showed promise but may not be 100% and AA RB Emmett Johnson (1451, 5.8) has opted out. Bkp RB Kwintin Ives has good speed and size at 215 lbs. D played well until unraveling in final 2 gm, allowing ssn high pts to Penn St (37) and Iowa (40). While the pass D gave up just 7 td's and 141 ypp all yr (both #2 FBS), run D allows 171 ypp and 4.8 ypc which is a bad matchup against the diverse Utah ground gm.

Forecast has Utah rolling by 21 while outgaining Huskers 456-376. We have the gm closer so no play on a tm. But we agree with PP that there'll be lots of scoring. Utes have a track record for piling up points as a favorite and will showcase both Dampier & Ficklin. Lateef has been cleared and is ready to show he's next up in Lincoln.

FORECAST: OVER 50.5 **RATING: 3★**

These two have split 4 meetings. Miami won the last meeting in '11 24-6 (-2). This is a rematch of one of the most exciting Nat'l Title games of the century when OSU upset the 'Canes in the '02 Fiesta Bowl. This is Cristobal's 2nd playoff game and he is 3-5 ATS in Bowls. Ryan Day is 4-3 SU/5-2 ATS in playoff games and won his first Nat'l Title last year. OSU is 3-1 all-time in the Cotton Bowl including LY's semifinal win over Texas.

UM was awarded the last at-large bid thanks to their head-to-head win over Notre Dame. The 'Canes two losses were to L'ville and SMU. The defense was dominant in their first round playoff game when they upset A&M 10-3. UM allows just 13 ppg/281 ypp and they hold foes 121 ypp below their avg (#3 in FBS). UM's Dline is their strength, led by DE's Bain and Mesidor. They allow just 87 (2.9) rush and they have 41 sacks including 15 in the last 3 games! RB Fletcher (725, 4.7) is a physical downhill runner. Miami has one of the top Oline's in the country, allowing just 13 sks.

For the 2nd straight ssn OSU enters the playoffs off a loss. They ran the table in the reg ssn but fell short in the B10 Title game, a 13-10 loss to Indiana. OSU's offense was held to 14 pts by Texas and 272 yds vs Illinois but they won both of those games. The Buckeyes D allows just 8 ppg and 214 ypp. They've held foes 165 ypp below their avg (#1 in FBS). LB's Styles and Reese combined for 15 tfl's this year. DE Caden Curry has 11 sacks. OSU has allowed just 9 sacks this year but they did give up 3 vs Indiana.

Both offenses have struggled when they played top notch defenses. Ohio St is coming off a month long layoff while Miami just played two weeks ago and only scored 10 pts. PP calls for just 26 points which puts the game a full 2 td's under the Vegas total. We think the 'Canes D keeps it close and we agree with the low scoring forecast.

FORECAST: UNDER 41 **RATING: 4★**

Oregon has won all 3 mths, most recently '23, 38-30, in Lubbock. This is 1st Orange Bowl for both tms. Duck HC Lanning 3-1 SU & 1-3 ATS in postseason. Oregon 3-9 ATS in postseason since '14. TT HC McGuire 2-1 SU & ATS in bowls incl LY's Arkansas (+2) loss.

TT built through the portal to win right away and it worked. Red Raiders won first 6 before losing at ASU w/o QB Behren Morton. They rebounded to win final 6, twice over BYU incl in Big 12 title gm. All 12 TT wins were by 22+ pts and they are +31ppg and +220ypp! Offense gains 101ypp above opp avg (#14 FBS), led by Morton (67%, 22-4) and RB Cameron Dickey (1095, 5.5). However, run gm avg less than 4 ypc in 4 of last 6 gms. While the offense is good, the D is great. The front 7 is among the best in CFB. TT leads FBS in run D, allowing 68ypp (lowest in CFB since '21) and 2.3 ypc. They're tied for 6th in sacks, with pressure coming from DE David Bailey (13.5 sks), ED Romello Height (9 sks) & Jacob Rodriguez (11 tfl).

Oregon is back in the CFP for a 2nd straight yr. Ducks lost 1st playoff gm last ssn to Ohio St but beat JMU this yr 51-34 (led 34-6 at half). Their only loss is to unbeaten Indiana, 30-20, at home. Oregon +23ppg and +198ypp, with best wins at Penn St, at Iowa, vs USC and at Washington. QB Dante Moore has met expectations throwing for 3046 with 28-8 ratio. The backs are deep & electric and the rec corps is getting healthy, fueling an attack that gains 142ypp above opp avg (#1 FBS!). The defense is very good (16ppg and #4 against the pass) but not quite at TT's level. Plus, the Red Raiders have the better ST's, ranking #2 in the FBS vs #25 for the Ducks.

Computer has TT moving to the semis with 31-24 win and 382-367 edge in yds. We have Oregon in a close, lower scoring gm making this a no play. In an even matchup, Ducks have more experienced coach and more talented QB which will be the difference. They've also faced much tougher slate and will benefit from JMU tuneup.

First mtg. Indiana is the #1 playoff seed but Alabama has the playoff experience edge. This is Kalen DeBoer's first trip to the playoffs with Bama but he did lead Washington to the Nat'l Title game in '23. Indiana's first playoff trip was last year when they lost in the first round vs Notre Dame. DeBoer is 3-2 SU in postseason games. Curt Cignetti might not much FBS playoff experience but he took Elon and James Madison to 5 combined playoff experiences. At JMU he led the Dukes to 3 semifinal appearances and a runner-up finish in '19.

Bama lost their opener to Florida St then won 8 straight including at Georgia. They had a 406-212 yd edge vs OK but lost 23-21. The Tide finished the reg ssn 10-2 then lost the SEC Title gm in a rematch vs Georgia 28-7. They were out for revenge vs OK in the first round. Bama trailed 17-0 2Q. They went 7/5/9 to then OK dropped a punt snap and Bama kicked a fg. OK was driving late 1H when Bama got a 50 yd Pick-6 to tie the gm and they won 34-24. The Tide avg 31 ppg/380 ypg but they've been held under 300 yards in 3 straight. QB Simpson has a 28-5 ratio but only hit 58% in their L/6 vs FBS foes.

Indiana was the surprise of the FBS last year when Cignetti took the Hoosiers to their first playoff trip. Cignetti brought in Cal transfer Fernando Mendoza. They went 12-0 SU/7-5 ATS in the reg ssn including wins over Illinois, Iowa and Oregon in 3 straight. Their closest win was against Penn St until they beat Ohio St in the Big 10 Title game. Mendoza hit 73% w/a 38-7 ratio and won the Heisman trophy. Indiana's D allows just 11 ppg/257 ypg and they hold foes 105 ypg below their avg. The offense puts up 42 ppg/257 ypg and 127 ypg more than their foes allow on avg. Indiana also has the ST's edge (#19 vs #74).

PP calls for Indiana to win by 17 but Bama has ply'd a much tougher sked (#4 vs #52) and Indiana has had 3 wins by 5 points or less so we prefer the dog here and disagree with the forecast.

FORECAST: NO PLAY **RATING: NO PLAY**

This is the only rematch of the 2nd round. UGA owns the series lead 34-15-1. They are 9-5 ATS vs Ole Miss since '97. Ole Miss upset UGA 28-10 last year. UGA got revenge earlier this year when they won 43-35 (-7). UGA didn't punt once in that game. They trailed 35-26 and outscored Ole Miss 17-0 in the 4Q. UGA's 510 yards were the 2nd most Ole Miss all'd all year and they held Ole Miss to a ssn low 351 yds. Kirby Smart is 9-3 SU in the postseason while Pete Golding's only HC win was in the first round over Tulane.

QB Austin Simmons started the first 2 games before they switched to D2 transfer Trinidad Chambliss. Ole Miss started 5-0 this year including wins over Arkansas, Tulane and LSU. They lost to Georgia then rebounded with a 34-26 win at Oklahoma. Ole Miss finished the reg ssn 11-1 then crushed Tulane 41-10 (-17) in the first round. QB Chambliss has thrown for 3,298 (67%, 19-3) and rushed for 506 (4.3). The Rebels D is allowing 19 ppg/340 ypg. They allowed over 500 yards twice. Ole Miss allows 148 rush ypg (4.3) but they are #25 in our pass D efficiency (56%, 13-7). The Rebels are #32 in our ST rankings.

Gunner Stockton got valuable playoff experience LY when Carson Beck was hurt. Stockton led Georgia to a comeback win over Tennessee and nearly did it again vs Bama in their only loss. Georgia has won their last 9 games including the SEC Title game rematch vs Bama 28-7. Stockton has a 24-7 ratio. The Dawgs strength is their front 7. UGA allows just 79 rush ypg and in their L/4 they've allowed 32 rush ypg (1.6) including -3 rush vs Bama and 23 (1.4) vs Texas. UGA's D allows 285 ypg and holds foes 114 ypg below their avg (#7 in FBS). They also have our #5 ST's unit.

PP calls for Ole Miss to stay within the number in a much lower scoring game than the first meeting. Georgia held Ole Miss to a ssn low yards in that game. Both tms know what to expect and the forecast calls for a much lower scoring game than the Vegas Total!

FORECAST: UNDER 56 **RATING: 4★**

Tms met in '23 bowl won by Texas St, 45-23. Bobcats scored final 24pts and were +6 TO's. Texas St 2-0 SU & 1-1 ATS in bowls, both under HC GJ Kinne. Rice has lost b2b bowls with last win in '14 Hawaii Bowl. Owls won '12 Armed Forces Bowl vs AF. This is HC Scott Abell's 1st bowl & 1st postseason gm since '22 FCS playoffs.

Texas St was a preseason SBC West favorite despite returning just 5 starters. Bobcats opened 3-1 incl impressive win at UTSA. However, they dropped the next 5 even though they were at least +92 yds in 4 one-score losses. They regrouped, reduced TO's, and won final 3 to go 6-6 SU & 4-8 ATS. The offense is potent, fueling 36 ppg and +77 ypg. QB Brad Jackson is a rising dual-threat star who threw for 3050 (71%, 18-7) and ran for 692 and 16 td's. RB Lincoln Pare has 1022 (5.1, 2) and 2 WR's have 900+ yds. The off gains 112ypp above opp avg (#10 FBS) and only JMU & ASU held them under 30 pts. The D allows 31 ppg but is weakest against the pass, which Rice does poorly, and held final 4 opp below 400 yds.

Abell took over a tm with 7 returning starters and overhauled the offense with the option. Still, Owls upset Louisiana in the opener and started 3-1. They lost the next 3 as American play got tougher but rebounded with a thrilling 2 OT win over UConn to get to 4-4. They won just 1 Nov gm against a brutal sked but landed this berth at 5-7 SU & ATS. Rice is #14 in FBS rushing (213, 4.3) but gain 115 ypg below opp avg (#134 FBS) and starting QB Chase Jenkins and his backup are in the portal. Top RB Quinton Jackson (811, 4.9) could be joined in the backfield by a 1st tm starter. UTSA, Memphis, UNT & USF avg 52 pts vs Rice which ranks 116th in pass D (22-3 ratio).

PP calling for 38-20 Texas St win and tms to be even in rushing. We have it much tighter so it's a no play. Bobcats 5-10 ATS as DD fav and play to level of opp. Frosh QB Patrick Crayton has had a month to prep for 1st start and was recruited to run Abell's offense.
