The Post Draft Issue grades a team's offseason a little differently than most. The grades we put into Power Sweep predict whether a team's record will improve or decline for the upcoming season. We take EVERYTHING into account. Included in the analysis are coaching changes, the NFL Draft, Free Agent signings, Free Agent losses and even favorable or unfavorable schedules. The "A" & "D" grades have been extremely accurate over the years. We spend a great deal of time and effort making these grades and while there was no list in '11 (work stoppage), here is a recap of the past 25 years as well as the record from the last 10 years with grades ('09, '10 & '12-'19).

**Overview:** While the Patriots have been a mainstay atop their DIV for a decade, the roster will look quite different heading into 2020. The biggest departure in all of the NFL comes at QB as Tom Brady opted to leave for a chance to play in the warm climate of Tampa. Brady will be joined by future HOF TE Rob Gronkowski who returns to football falling a year away from the game. The replacement at QB is former NFL MVP Cam Newton who was deemed expendable in CAR following a handful of injuries over the past few years. Also added to the offense are WR Marqise Lee and a pair of #3 DC TE's in Devin Asiasi and Dalton Keene. The defense sees plenty of departures in DT Danny Shelton, LB Jamie Collins and S Duron Harmon who all move to DET to play under former NE DC Matt Patricia. The Patriots add a pair of high DC's on defense in S Kyle Dugger and LB Josh Uche. While less talented overall heading into the year, the Patriots are still expected to be the top team in the AFC East.

**Overview:** While the Jets had a handful of hiccups on the offensive side of the ball throughout last season despite the addition of FA RB Le'Veon Bell, the 2020 version will see plenty of changes. The moves primarily come on the OL with 4 FA additions and a 1st Rnd DC in Mekhi Becton. WR Breshad Perriman comes over in FA for the departed Robby Anderson. The defense was a Top 10 unit last year and has limited additions. The early part of the 2020 schedule appears to be difficult as they open at BUF followed by a home matchup vs SF, a road trip to IND and home on Thur night vs DEN. The final 4 weeks of the season see 3 road trips and a home matchup vs CLE. After jumping up all the way to 7-9 a season ago, the Jets could slip back some this year despite an expected improvement from their OL.

**Overview:** Behind an outstanding stop unit that finished #2 in the NFL in scoring (16.2 ppg) and #3 in total defense (298 ypg), the Bills earned a postseason berth for the 2nd time in 3 seasons. Their #24 ranked offense gets some much needed talent following the addition of WR Stefon Diggs who they coughed up a 1st Rnd DC for. The defense meanwhile continues to add talent with FA DL's Vernon Butler, Mario Addison and Quinton Jefferson joining 2nd Rnd DC AJ Epenesa. The Bills have the best chance to unseat the Patriots among the teams in the AFC East and the schedule does nothing but help their case as they begin the season with 4 non-playoff teams from a year ago and close with just 1 playoff squad over the final 4. The Bills will contend for yet another playoff berth.

**Overview:** While the Dolphins appeared to be well on their way to an 0-16 tanking '19 season after an 0-7 start and being outscored by 23 ppg, the team was much more competitive the rest of the way winning 5 of their final 9 including a 3 pt victory over the Patriots in the season finale. This year MIA gets a handful of added contributors via FA in RB's Matt Briena and Jordan Howard along with DE's Shaq Lawson, Emmanuel Ogbah and LB Kyle Van Noy. Free agency wasn't the only area of help as the Dolphins used their three 1st Rnd picks to upgrade at QB (Tua Tagovailoa), OT (Austin Jackson) and CB (Noah Igbinioghene). While they do play inside of a DIV that saw a pair of teams earn postseason berths a year ago, the Dolphins roster is much more talented in 2020 and should improve upon LY's 5-11 record.

**Overview:** The Ravens were without question the most dominating regular season team a season ago as they led the NFL in ypg (+107) and ppg (+15.6) behind the outstanding play of MVP QB Lamar Jackson. This year the offense stays virtually intact with OG Marshal Yanda (RET) being replaced by DJ Fluker. The Chiefs are one of the frontrunners to repeat as Super Bowl champs and deservedly so with the amount of talent remaining led by MVP candidate Mahomes.
