The Post Draft Issue grades a team's offseason a little differently than most. The grades we put into Power Sweep predict whether a team's record will improve or decline for the upcoming season. We take EVERYTHING into account. Included in the analysis are coaching changes, the NFL Draft, Free Agent signings, Free Agent losses and even favorable or unfavorable schedules. The "A" & "D" grades have been extremely accurate over the years. We spend a great deal of time and effort making these grades and while there was no list in '11 (work stoppage), here is a recap of the past 27 years as well as the record from the last 12 years with grades ('09, '10 & '12-'21).

Overview: Last year the Bills were tripped up in the playoffs by the Chiefs for a 2nd consecutive season (playoff OT rules changed after that matchup against KC!). This year the early schedule is daunting as six of their first seven opponents posted a winning record in '21. On a positive note, the offense remains virtually intact with a handful of weapons (WR Jamison Crowder, RB James Cook) being brought in via FA and the draft. The defense meanwhile adds in future HOF and 2x SB Champ LB Von Miller after a year that they finished #1 in the NFL in both ypg and ppg allowed. The Bills are clearly the favorite to capture their 3rd straight AFC East Title while the #1 seed in the conference should also be well within reach.

Overview: The Dolphins fell just short of earning a playoff berth a year ago despite winning eight of their final nine contests (started off '21 at 1-7). This year an offense that avg just 20.1 ppg (#22) adds in some much needed help including the huge acquisition of WR Tyreek Hill. Also worth mentioning is the upgrades on the OL with Terron Armstead and Connor Williams. While the latter part of the '22 schedule features four road games against teams that finished with a winning mark a year ago, we're expecting offensive-minded rookie HC Mike McDaniel to continue last year's late surge and have the Dolphins in contention for one of the three Wildcard spots.

Overview: The Patriots finished in the Top 10 in scoring offense a year ago despite a rookie QB under center. The defense meanwhile were #2 in ppg (17.8) and #4 in ypg (311) which was key to their playoff run. This year's biggest questions comes on offense with the OL being rearranged and the departure of OC Josh McDaniels to the Raiders. The early schedule features four away contests over the first six weeks while the end of docket has the Patriots taking on teams that finished with '21 winning records in each of the final six! A questionable draft class along with not much help coming in FA has us thinking that the Patriots are in for an overall losing campaign in 2022.

While that could change as the season progresses (HOU outgained by an NFL-worst 106 ypg LY), this is clearly a rebuilding year for the franchise with more of an optimistic leap heading into 2023.

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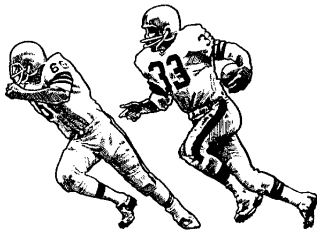
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
