### SUPER BOWL SITUATIONS

Let's take a look at some interesting situations about Super Bowl matchups. Here are the answers to recent questions about past Super Bowls. **How does a lower seed do?** The playoffs expanded in 1990 and the NFL seeded teams 1 thru 6. In 2010 it was only the second time in 16 years that a #1 seed had failed to make the Super Bowl and the only time with a matchup between the #2 and #6 seeds. A team ranked as the #4 seed or lower has reached the Super Bowl 6 times in the last 12 years, winning it 4 times. One of the most surprising stats is that the LOWER SEED is now 10-3 SU and 11-2 ATS. **What happens when an AFC/NFC Title game favorite was outgained?** Five years ago BOTH teams were outgained in the conf finals but SF was a favorite. In 2011 New England was outgained 398-330 and of course was upset. In 2010 the Pittsburgh Steelers were outgained by the NY Jets 289-287 and since 1992, only 9 teams have been outgained as favorites in the title gm and went on to play in the Super Bowl. In 2009 the New Orleans Saints were outgained 475-257 but of course went on to beat Indianapolis. The Bears were outgained in 2007 by a 364-340 edge and then lost and failed to cover vs Indy. In 2005 New England was outgained 388-322 vs PIT and won but did not cover in the SB 24-21 (-7). In 1998 Denver was outgained 370-331 and won the SB 34-19 (-7) and was outgained in '97 but won 31-24 (+11). Pittsburgh was outgained in '95 (328-285) and went on to cover the SB 27-17 (+13.5) and SF won the SB 49-26 (-18) in '94 after being outgained by 157 yds by DAL. DEN was the latest to win and cover 2Y ago in the SB (+4), 24-10 win over CAR) after being outgained by NE (336-244). LY the Patriots were outgained (374-344) by Jacksonville in their come-from-behind win and would later go on to lose outright in the Super Bowl as a favorite against the Eagles. Teams are 5-4 SU and 6-3 ATS (dog is 4-1 ATS). **How do teams perform if they've appeared in the Super Bowl in the last 3 seasons?** NE is back in the "Big Game" for the 4th time in 5 yrs with only the Bills and their run of 4 straight from '90-'93 as the only team to accomplish the feat of 3 consecutive appearances (BUF lost 52-17 to DAL). **Thinking about a record?** The most combined total points in a Super Bowl came in SB 29 as SF and SD combined for 75 pts. LY's PHI/NE matchup nearly reached the mark at 74 pts followed by 69 total pts twice as DAL defeated BUF and TB beat OAK. The fewest points scored were all prior to 1975 as PIT and MIN combined for 22 pts in SB 9 while MIA and WAS combined for 21 pts in SB 7. In the 37 years since, the 2 lowest scoring SB's have occurred in the last 11 years as the NYG beat NE 17-14 and PIT beat SEA 21-10. **Quick starts?** The final thing we'll look at is how teams have started and scored in the 1Q. It has been slow going as in the last 20 Super Bowls only THREE TIMES have the teams combined for over 10 total points in the opening period (PHI/NE 12 pts LY). Five times in the last 18 years has seen a 3-0 score after 1Q and on 4 occasions (incl '16) both teams failed to score. **GOTTA LOVE THOSE PROPS!!** Over the last 11 seasons we've had great success with our Super Bowl prop plays. In fact we are now 100-61 (62%) on those releases!

**GAME OVERVIEW** - The Patriots are back in the Super Bowl for the 3rd consecutive season and 9th time in the Tom Brady/Bill Belichick era following their OT win over the Chiefs in Arrowhead. The Rams meanwhile are back in the "Big Game" for the 1st time since 2001 after getting their own OT victory in the Superdome against the Saints. Ironically, the Rams' last Super Bowl appearance came against the Patriots with Brady beginning his legendary career with a game-winning drive with the game deadlocked at 17-17 (GW 48-yd FG as time expired!). The NFC owns a 5-4 edge over the past 9 SB's with the favorite going just 6-11 SU/4-13 ATS and the score going "Over" in 6 of the L/8.

**RECORD VS THE SPREAD** - New England finished the regular ssn with a solid 11-5 SU mark while covering 9 of their 16 ATS. They have however cashed both of their playoff contests with a 10 pt avg cover. For the ssn (incl playoffs), the Patriots have now outgained their foes by 53 ypg with a 7 pt avg MOV. The Rams finished tied atop the overall standings at 13-3 although a handful of lofty spreads saw them finish at 7-9 ATS. They do however come in on a 4-gm ATS winning streak overall with a 5 pt avg cover. The Rams outgained their foes by 69 ypg with a 9 pt avg MOV. The edge here goes to the Rams as while NE struggled on the road TY with just a 4-5 SU/ATS mark, the NFC representative went 7-2 SU (5-4 ATS) away from their home venue. **SLIGHT EDGE: RAMS**

**TURF/SITE** - Both the Patriots and Rams are playing their first contest inside of the newly built (2017) Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta. The city has hosted a pair of Super Bowls in its history however including the 1999 ssn where the Rams held off a late Titans drive to earn their one and only title! We'll go ahead and give the slight edge to the Rams here as they routinely play in Atlanta with their conference affiliation compared to the Patriots' trips to Georgia every 8 years. **SLIGHT EDGE: RAMS**

**PATRIOTS #5 OFFENSE VS RAMS #19 DEFENSE** - The Patriots come in with the #5 total offense in the NFL avg 393 ypg while also putting plenty of points on the board with the #4 mark in the league at 27.3 ppg. The Rams meanwhile have allowed opponents to move the ball at a decent rate all year as they finished #19 in total defense at 359 ypg while surrendering 24.0 ppg (#20 NFL). In their most recent contest against the Chiefs in the AFC Championship, the Patriots put up 37 points and 524 yards in rough conditions inside of Arrowhead. With a clean track at their disposal here inside Atlanta, the Patriots should be able to move the ball with no issues. **LARGE EDGE: PATRIOTS**

**RAMS #2 OFFENSE VS PATRIOTS #21 DEFENSE** - The Rams finished with the #2 total offense in the NFL for '18 with a 421 ypg avg (#2 at 32.9 ppg). While NE did finish with the #21 total defense in the NFL, the unit shored up inside the RZ by forcing FG's and keeping the ppg low at 20.3 ppg (#7 NFL). The Rams will more than likely attempt to keep the ball on the ground early to see if the combo of Gurley and Anderson can control the tempo and keep Brady off the field. **EDGE: RAMS**

**PATRIOTS #20 SPECIAL TEAMS VS RAMS #9 SPECIAL TEAMS** - The kicking game has played an important role all ssn long so it's fitting that the 2 teams that made the Super Bowl have some of the league's best in Stephen Gostkowski and Greg Zuerlein. During the regular ssn, Gostkowski and Zuerlein had identical performances by connecting on 27 of their 31 attempts (87.1%). While the return games had relatively even success, the Rams' higher special teams ranking falls with outstanding P Johnny Hecker who once again surpassed the 40.0 net avg mark for the 6th time in his 7Y career. **SLIGHT EDGE: RAMS**

**COACHING** - While Sean McVay has done an outstanding job as the HC of the Rams over his first 2 years in the NFL, Bill Belichick is heading into his 9th Super Bowl as the man in charge of the Patriots including hoisting the Lombardi Trophy on 5 separate occasions. With McVay the youngest coach in the NFL and Belichick the longest tenured, it's abundantly clear who is getting the edge in this one (Belichick was a NFL assistant for 12 yrs before McVay was born!). **LARGE EDGE: PATRIOTS**

**PAST HISTORY MATCHUP/INTANGIBLES** - The Patriots have utterly dominated the Rams dating back to their SB winning campaign of '01 with 5 consec wins overall and 4 covers within that span. In fact, NE has outscored the Rams by 16 ppg since that previously mentioned "Big Game" with a 51 ypg edge. NE won and covered 3 of their 4 matchups TY against the NFC while the Rams went a perfect 4-0 against non-conf members (2-2 ATS). **LARGE EDGE: PATRIOTS**

**CONCLUSION** - It appears that Tom Brady's illustrious career has come full circle with a rematch against a Rams squad that he won his very first Super Bowl against way back in 2001. Since that victory, Brady (only player remaining on either roster from that game) has won 5 SB titles (4 SB MVP's). Jared Goff meanwhile was just 7 years old the first time the Rams and Patriots met and enters just his 3rd year in the league and 2nd under offensive guru Sean McVay. The defenses here have some talent however as former HC and current Rams DC Wade Phillips has a handful of players that have earned All-Pro honors in the past while Brian Flores appears to be the next Bill Belichick coordinator in line to get an NFL HC gig (rumored to be joining MIA after the SB). While both teams have dynamic offenses coming in with Top 5 finishes in both ppg and ypg, we expect the ground games to play an important role here as both Belichick and McVay will do their best to keep the opposing offenses off the field. With an enlarged 58 point total on the board for this one and 6 of the past 8 Super Bowls going "Over", it appears that the oddsmakers may have overcompensated here giving us some value on the "Under" and our computer agrees!
