KEY SELECTIONS

4★ WISCONSIN over Minnesota - UW has now won Paul Bunyan's Axe 8 str times but UM has covered 2 str at UW. LY we used UW (-27) as the Early Bird POW. It wasn't easy but the Badgers covered 42-13 with commanding 461-156 yd and 29-9 FD edges. UM's 2 td's LY came on a fake FG and a 96 yd KR. There have been 11 OVERT's in the L/12 gms (avg 67 ppg). Since UW failed to cover vs UM in '10 they've been a 20+ pt B10 fav 6x's going 6-0 ATS (avg line -26.7). UW finally played up to expectations winning a 4★ Key Selection and LPS for us in their 38-14 dismantling of Purd in a heavy rain. UW (-1) trailed for less than 2:00 in the gm and finished with 30-11 FD and 645-252 yd edges. QB Stave (214 ypg, 60%, 5-3) got his 1st road win (3-1) and Ball (816, 4.7) ran for a career high 247 with 3 td. The D is all g just 117 rush ypg (3.6) and got 5 sks of Boilers QB's to run their ttl to 17 (#2 B10). UW was doomed by mistakes (-3 TO) as they lost at home in the rain to NW (+3) 21-13. UM fmbld away the opening KO which led to a Mark 26 td run, an int which led to a Mark 48 yd td run, were SOD at the NU29 and were SOD on 48ql at the NU6. QB Gray ret'd to hit 7-11-66 and rush for 86 but accounted for 2 TO's and was reinjd in the 2H (CS). HC Kill had to be hospitalized after the gm after he suffered seizures. UW's bandwagon continues to fill as we've said the L/2W that they are a play-on tm down the stretch and we'll ride them again for a 2nd consecutive 4★ Key Selection.

FORECAST: WISCONSIN 38 Minnesota 10

3★ FLORIDA over S Carolina - Naturally this is a special game to SC Coach Spurrier who won a Heisman here and cnd'd here for 12 yrs winning a Nat'l Title in '96. When Spurrier retired to SC in '05, they broke a 13 game losing streak with an upset win at home. Spurrier would drop the next 4 SU but has now won the L2Y. In '10 in The Swamp with the SEC Title on the line, SC (+6) dominated winning 36-14 with a 395-226 yd edge. LY both came in with struggling offenses and SC was -3 at home. The Gamecocks covered 17-12 with a 299-261 yd edge so Spurrier is 5-2 ATS vs UF in his 7 years. SC is off a 23-21 (+3) loss to LSU where they were fortunate to be that close getting a backdoor cover td w/1:42 left as they were dominated at the LOS (258-34 rush yd deficit). That could be a concern as UF dominated LSU at the LOS two wks ago with a 176-42 rush yd edge. LW UF cashed a 3★ Key Selection on these pgs and a 4★ LPS with their 31-17 (-9) win at Vandy. QB Driskel broke Tebow's QB rush rec'd with 177 yds (16.1) incl a 70 yd td clincher in the 4Q as UF ran for 326 yds even w/3 starting OL out due to inj. SC is playing 3 top SEC tms in 3W while Florida is off a bye. LSU at home and only at Vandy LW. UF is the better tm as evidenced by the LSU comparison, playing at home with revenge and gets the win.

FORECAST: FLORIDA 27 S Carolina 17

3★ NEVADA over San Diego St - It used to be an automatic playing on Nev as a HF as they went 19-4 ATS from '04-'09. Line adjustments led to a 5-6 ATS mark the L2Y and while they are 0-3 ATS TY they failed to cover as 29' and 19 pt favs while their only SU loss can be explained coming the wk after a DD road upset. UN QB Fajardo left mid-2Q vs WY and missed LW (bcp Combs 66%, 4-1 ratio) but should be ready to go. His counterpart Katz has underachieved away from home (55 vs 62%, 6.9 ypa vs 8.9 and a 3-4 ratio vs a 10-0) as the Aztecs have gotten outFD'd 54-30 in those 2 gms. UN's home field edge is among the nation's best and it will be magnified vs a tm traveling here for the first time in over 3Y. We'll also grab extra value as SDSt's D numbers look respectable all'g 383 ypg and 27 ppg, but they all'd 651 yds and 52 pts to the best scoring off they've faced (Fresno #34) and Nev even tops them as they are #14 in scoring off. This is also first time SDSt has face a dual-threat QB, which will cause confusion vs a front 7 that is senior-less with 4 underclassman.

FORECAST: NEVADA 45 San Diego St 27

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Nebraska over NORTHWESTERN - Neb HC Pelini is 5-2 ATS off a bye and 9-5-1 ATS off a loss. Their only recent meeting prior to LY was the '00 Alamo Bowl. LY the game was played in 35-40 mph wind gusts but surprisingly Neb QJ Martinez threw 37x's and completed a then-career best 75.6%. We used NW +17' as a Big Dog POW and they delivered the huge outright upset win. Prior to the bye Neb was crushed at OSU 63-38 as they all'd their most pts in a gm s/07, were outgained 371-223 on the ground and all'd IR and PR td's. QB Martinez is still the B10's pass eff leader (212 ypg, 66%, 12-4) despite 4 TO's vs the Bucks. RB Burkhead (392, 9.1) left early 2H (reinjd knee) vs OSU but is exp to return here. The Cats are now bowl elig at 6-1 after beating Minny 21-13 in the rain as a 3' pt AF. After UM fmbld away the opening KO NW scored on the next play and the Cats never trailed despite being outgained 327-275 thanks in part to +3 TO margin. RB Mark is #15 FBS rush (797, 6.0) and was untouched on several big runs incl 26 and 48 yd td's vs the Gophers. NW QB's are last in the B10 pass (#107 FBS) avg 180 ypg (66%) with a 4-2 ratio despite Colter's multithreat talents. Neb is off a loss, off a bye, playing with legit revenge and their fans should make up a good portion of the crowd!

FORECAST: Nebraska 37 NORTHWESTERN 23

2★ SOUTHERN MISS over Marshall - SM has been a fav in all 7 meetings (between -3 and -9) and 5 of the 7 gms have been decided by SD's. LY SM appeared in control after a 90 yd td pass, they led 17-3 at MU (-7). MU got a td with :27 left in the half. UO had to get back to 17-10 at the half. MU drove 35 yds (after fmbld) and 50/6P for td's to lead and it was a hard to explain loss for SM and they are now at home playing with legitimate revenge. MU comes in off a bye after dropping a heartbreaker to Tulsa at home prior. QB Cato is avg an NCAA-best 385 pass ypg (70%, 18-6 ratio) but the D is giving up 470 ypg. SM is off to its worst start s/76 but LW showed some signs of life in their 38-31 2 OT loss (-17) at UCF LW. QJ Alford got the start and ran for 2 td's but he did have the only 2 TO's of the gm. While SM is 0-6 SU they have played a much tougher sked (#10-82) incl some of the best tms from the BE, CUSA, B10 and MW. This will be by far the worst D (#115) they have faced to date and we will call for them to get their first win of the yr.

OTHER GAMES

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 18th

Oregon at ARIZONA ST - These two have avg 67 ppg over the L/6 meetings. UO is now 7-0 SU/5-1-1 ATS in this series. LY UO was playing without RB James and lost QB Thomas to inj early. A key play happened late in the 1H when ASU was at the O37 leading 17-14 and was int'd in the EZ and UO got a 50 yd IR. UO went 50/3pl and got a td with :27 left in the half. UO at home won 41-27 (-14). UO has won 4 str trips to Tempe but LTH was very misleading. The Ducks were outgained by 212 yds (-9 FD) and trailed 24-14 late 2Q as the Sun Devils penetrated UO terr 7x's with 0 pts and 7 TO's. ASU is 4-0-1 ATS as conf HD while Graham was 3-0 as conf HD at Tulsa/Pitt. UO is 8-3-1 ATS off a bye but ASU is 5-1 ATS TY under Graham. **Houston at SMU** - UH is 9-1 SU and 6-4 ATS vs SMU and the HT is just 4-7 ATS. LY GameDay was on hand as UH (-20) looked like they would be a BCS representative. UH had a 260-93 yd edge at the half and got a 36 yd td on a draw play with :46 left to lead 13-0. UH led 23-0 when SMU got a td with 8:33 left for the apparent backdoor cover (+20) but UH got a 16 yd td run by Keenum with 6:17 left and SMU was w/o RB Line. After an 0-3 SU/ATS start, UH has now won and covered 3 str TY while SMU is off a tough loss to Tulane (27-26, -18'). Will the Ponies get a bounce back win at home or will UH continue to roll?

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 19th

Connecticut at SYRACUSE - UC has now won 5 in a row both SU (by 19 ppg) and ATS in this series. LY the meeting took on added importance for UC as new HC Pasqualoni had been fired by Syracuse after '04. We used UC -1 at home as a Top Weekly LPS as they delivered the 28-21 win for us despite turning the ball over 5x's in the 1H. Cuse is 2-11 ATS at home vs BE but UC is 1-5 ATS on BE road under Pasqualoni. You know this game will be even more special to Pasqualoni now that he is back at the dome where he coached from 1991-'04 but Cuse is off a very misleading gm LW where they outgained unbeaten Rutgers 418-237 but lost on the road.

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SATURDAY, OCTOBER 20th - Army 37 E MICHIGAN 34 - EM has lost all 4 vs Army. In the last meeting ('10) the gm featured 5 lead changes. EM went 33/9pl (after short P) for a td to lead 27-24 w/2:59 left but Army took the next drive 72/8pl getting a GW 7 yd td run w/38. Army went 5-0 in 'true' road gms in '10 but L2Y is 0-8 (avg loss by 23.5 ppg). EM (0-6 SU/2-4 ATS) lost its first 10 HG's SU under English then rebounded to go 5-1 LY, but they've regressed to 0-3 so far TY incl LW's 52-47 (+15) loss to UT despite gaining 624 yds (gave up 655). Four yr starting QB Gillett was benched in favor of Benz who hit 18-27-301-2-1. Meanwhile Army (1-5 SU/2-3 ATS) despite having 27-12 FD and 457-367 yd edges lost 31-17 (+1) to Kent. However, EM the wk prior lost to KSU 41-14 and was outgained 467-200. It's the nation's #1 rusher in Army (385, 5.5) vs the nation's #124 rush D in EM (297, 6.2) and naturally we'll side with the Cadets.

C MICHIGAN 35 Ball St 34 - LY CM led 20-3 in the 3Q and finished with a 569-455 yd edge but lost 31-27 (+2). BSU got a 25 yd FG on the final play of the half to only trail 17-13 (CM 304-169 yds). BSU is 8-4 SU (6-3 ATS run) in trips to Mount Pleasant incl B2B wins by a td+. LTH Ball St took a 28-3 lead into the 4Q as CM gained 51% (190) of their yds (14 pts) in the final 15 min and we had ANOTHER Big Dog Play outright upset winner as Ball St (+19') won 31-17! LW we won a Fri Night Marquee on Navy (+2) as they caught CM off 3 str AG's and on a short wk prep for option as the Mids won 31-13 outgaining the Chips 372-221. CM's ATS run in all gms now stands at 2-18 L/20! BSU (-2') won a key MAC gm 30-24 in OT vs WM LW and now starts a 3 gm road trip. The Cards do have all of the talent edges but CM HC Enos needs wins to save his job and will put forth max effort here.

Bowling Green 31 UMASS 10 - 1st meeting. BG HC Clawson was the Richmond HC from '04-'07 (29-20) going 1-1 vs UM, winning 24-14 in '04 (last and only time in MA). BG looks to be heading in the right direction with 3 str wins and covers and LW overcame the Miami Whammy 37-12 (-7) as they dominated the LOS with a 251-3 rush yd edge. UMass comes in off a bye and are still searching for their 1st win under new HC Molnar (0-6 SU/2-4 ATS). After progress had been made in losses to Miami, Oh and Ohio (outgained both), they were waxed by WM 52-14 in their last outing (outgained 551-218). While BG will be in the unique role of DD road conf fav (1st s/05), the Falcons have all the talent edges. Their D (#52) has all'd just 10 ppg the L/3 gms and has lim their opp to 152 ypg less than their avg that will be the diff as they get win #4 in a row.

N Illinois 45 AKRON 31 - LTH ('10) NI won 50-14 (-13) as they had 520-257 yd and 26-11 FD edges. UA's last series win was in the '05 MAC Title gm, since then they have dropped 2 str by 17 and 36 pts. NI improved to 6-0 SU (5-1 ATS) vs the MAC East in reg ssn after LW's 45-3 (-14) win over Buff as QB Lynch ran for 129 yds (8.6) and he is the #4 rusher in the NCAA with 918 (7.1). After their opening 1 pt loss to Iowa, the Huskies have now won 6 str gms but it must be a concern that their D is all'g 400 ypg. While their record may not show it (1-6 SU), the Zips are much improved under 1Y HC Bowden and LW we cashed a 3★ Small College on them in their 34-28 loss to Ohio (+20') as it was their 3rd loss TY by a td or less. The Zips D is all'g 38 ppg (also all'd 38 LY) but the off is avg 33 ppg and 466 ypg after avg just 14 ppg and 278 ypg LY. While NI has all the edges, the Zips have backdoor potential for a 2nd str week.

Georgia 49 KENTUCKY 17 - UK is 3-1 ATS in this series but the last time here we used UGA as a rare 5★ LPS and led 28-3 late 2Q and 41-17 in the 4Q before all'g a couple of gbg scores in their 44-31 win (-4). LY UGA was -31 at home and just needed to beat UK to wrap up the SEC East Title. UGA did have a 317-165 yd edge but in the 1H settled for 5 FG's, missing one. In the 2H UGA was int'd in the EZ and fmbld at the UK40 and the crowd started getting nervous as they only led 12-10 but got a td on the 1st play of the 4Q to go up 19-10 and UK never really threatened after that. UGA is off a bye after its devastating 35-7 loss to SC but does have UF on deck. UK is now 1-5 SU (1-4-1 ATS) after LW's 49-7 loss to Ark in a gm that was called with 5:08 remaining in 3Q! Due to inj, UK is going with fresh QB Whitlow who hit just 2-10 LW and was #4 on the depth chart in press! UGA is 6-2 ATS as an AF while UK is 6-14-1 ATS hosting SEC (0-4-1 as DD SEC HD, 4 losses by an avg of 25.5 ppg). Even with a big gm on deck, expect the Bulldogs to atone for their performance against SC and continue UK HC Phillips woes.

VIRGINIA 31 Wake Forest 27 - Virginia is 20-2 SU vs WF but lost the L/meeting ('08) and has failed to cover 3 str. UVA is 0-2-1 ATS as a conf HF under London with 2 outright upsets incl LW's loss to MD. WF was 2-9 ATS as a conf AD from '07-'10 but has gone 3-2 ATS L2Y. You knew after UVA benefitted from 4 net close wins LY, that they would be in store for a down yr and that is exactly what has taken place after LW's 27-20 loss (-2) to MD dropped them to 2-5 SU and it was their 6th str ATS loss. It was also the 3rd str loss for the Cavs despite outgaining their opp as they outrushed MD 168-(-2) but gave up a 100 yd KR td and UVA is last in the country at -13 TO's. WF is off a bye where Grobe is 7-1 ATS but they are being outgained by 89 ypg while UVA is outgaining their foes by 46 ypg. While UVA is playing an 8th str gm and is just 3-12 SU in ACC HG's, they do have the off edge (#55-97) and sooner or later the ball has to bounce their way right?

N Carolina 41 DUKE 28 - NC and Duke meet in Oct for the 1st time s/38. NC has now won 8 in a row SU (3-1 ATS), but the HT has covered 3 str. LY NC was -11 at home and led just 23-21 when they went 70/5pl for a td (1:48 3Q) then 91/12pl for a 7 yd td pass with 8:24 left, 37-21. UNC improved to a perfect 5-0 SU TY when RB Bernard plays after their 18-14 (-7) win at Miami. Bernard ran for 177 yds and 2 td's but UNC did benefit from Miami starting QB Morris getting inj'd in the 4Q. LW the Blue Devils (+9) led VT 20-0 in the 1Q and they had to be thinking bowl, however 48 min and 41 unanswered pts later, HC Cutcliff after the gm sd, "I think our bubble feels burst. It hurts today. It hurts a lot." Duke was 4-13 ATS as conf HD from '05-'09 but is 6-2 ATS the L2Y. In press this looked like a trap gm for UNC in the middle of a vt/Mia/NCSt stretch, but the Blue Devils, at 5-2, will have their attention and with all of the talent edges, expect UNC to remain undefeated w/Bernard while it could be a late sn slide for the Devils who have FSU and Clem on deck.

TOLEDO 34 Cincinnati 33 - UC HC Jones spent 3Y at CM but never faced the Rockets. Bearcats have a HUGE sked edge playing just their 6th gm, coming off Miami (OH) and Fordham while UT is off 3 MAC West tms and playing its 8th str gm. However UC does have the BE showdown vs UL on deck. LW in a weird start, Fordham ran the 1st 22 off plays of the gm and still trailed 7-3 thanks to a 76 yd IR td. UC would explode for 35 2H pts in the 49-17 (-40) win. UT in possible look ahead mode beat EM 52-47 (-15) as the tms comb for 1,279 yds. Toledo was 9-3 as a HD from '02-'09 but is 0-2 the L2Y getting mauled vs Arizona (outgained 518-183) and Boise (610-349). Cincy is 3-1 as an AF under Jones and 4-0 SU/ATS vs the MAC covering by 16 ppg. UT basically beat BE member Syr on the road LY (controversial xp, lost OT) and has our #9 off which means this battle may come down to the wire.

GEORGIA TECH 37 Boston College 27 - Only 2 ACC meetings were '07 and '08 and the AD pulled the upset in both. BC is off a 51-7 loss (+28') at FSU where they were outgained 649-225. GT is just 3-6-1 ATS as a conf HF the L4Y and just 2-7-2 ATS as conf fav of 7+ the L3Y but is in a great situation as they are fresh off a bye with BC having traveled to NY, Florida and now Atlanta. GT has lost 3 str gms and after all'g an avg of 46 ppg and 573 ypg in those gms fired DC Groh in the bye wk as HC Johnson wants a simplified scheme. BC did just prep for the option a couple wks ago vs Army but was mauled to the tune of 516 rush yds (6.5) and has given up 200 or more rush yds to every FBS opp they've played TY. Sometimes it takes an option off a quarter or two to get going after a bye, but we expect GT to roll as they get a much-needed get-right win.

Rutgers 24 TEMPLE 17 - This BE series resumes after a 7 yr layoff. After getting kicked out of the BE in '04, the Owls are shockingly 2-0 in BE play TY after LW's 17-14 (-4') OT win at Conn, a gm in which the Owls trailed for more than 59 min! One key to their surprising start has been a healthy RB Harris who ran for 142 yds (4.7), which was all'd TU to avg 209 rush ypg the L/2W. The unbeaten Knights are also off a misleading gm as they were outgained 418-237 in a 23-15 win (-7) over Syr and benefitted from 4 Cuse TO's and also a 75 yd blk'd FG ret td! Temple is 10-3-1 ATS as a HD but has been outgained by 82 ypg TY and their new found run gm will find it tough sledding against the nation's #2 rush D that is all'g just 62 ypg (2.3).

AIR FORCE 34 New Mexico 24 - AF has now won and covered 7 of 8 and has won the L/5 at home vs NM going 4-1 ATS failing to cover LTH (AF -33, 48-23). LY AF was in a huge flat spot but still got the shutout win 42-0 (-30). AF led 35-0 at the half and took it easy on NM running the ball on almost every play with their 2nd or 3rd stringers in the entire 2H. NM is the 1st tm in 6Y to play on the road the wk after going to Hawaii. New HC Davie should be getting COY consideration as his Lobos are now 4-3 SU after their 35-23 (-2) win on the Islands. It was their first win outside the state of NM s/07! The Falcons are also off a win as they beat WY 28-27 (-6) but it came at a cost as the nation's #2 rusher Getz inj'd his ankle (CS). AF does have a big Friday night game at Nev on deck but unlike many of NM's opp's TY, they are familiar with the option and have recruited their players to run it for the past 4 yrs while Davie and Co haven't had that luxury yet.

San Jose St 37 UTSA 20 - 1st meeting. SJSt is 11-3 ATS as an AF s/96. SJSt is off a tough 49-27 loss to Utah St in a matchup of WAC leaders as they were dominated at the LOS getting outrushed 212-4 but shockingly still had a 38:24-21:36 TOP edge! QB Fales is #9 in the NCAA in pass eff avg 311 ypg (75%) with a 12-3 ratio. LW UTSA fell from the ranks of the unbeaten as Rice (-2) dominated them 34-14 with 27-13 FD and 483-239 yd edges. UTSA plays in the Alamodome and this is the first ever FBS team to travel here as they are in just their 2nd season and faced a DII and NAIA tm in their first two HG's TY. LY's attendance avg'd 35,521 (record for start-up program) and they are expecting their largest crowd YTD. Reality will set in however after 1Q as SJSt is 8-2 ATS on the road the L2Y and will be angry after LW's loss.

UTAH ST 44 New Mexico ST 17 - LY in their snn finale, NMSI (+15) led 21-17 and US on 4&1 got a FD at the 12 and 2pl later a td with :35 left to allow US to escape with the 24-21 win. US is now 10-4 SU and 8-6 ATS and interestingly, has a pattern of winning 2 in a row then losing SU in each of the 14 yrs and this year are due for a loss. LTH NMSI led 14-0 and 20-17 mid-4Q before all'g a 68 yd KR that set up a 12 yd GW td drive. Down 7 NMSI was SOD at the US27 w/:52 left. LW US was able to dominate the LOS outrushing SJSt 212-4 as QB Keeton had his best gm of the yr as well going 26-35-273-30 in their 49-27 win (+2). Shockingly the last time US was a 3 td fav vs a FBS schl was back in '97 (Boise St, -22, 24-20). NMSI is dangerous here coming off a bye at 1-5 SU and HC Walker is feeling the heat. They have covered 3 in a row all as DD dogs with the gms decided by 3, 5 and 3 pts and there have been 8 outright upsets in the L13Y in this series but it is tough going against a team that is 6-1 ATS TY with their only non-cover being by a 1/2 pt.

CLEMSON 44 Virginia Tech 30 - Met twice LY but previous meeting was in '07. VT is playing with some serious revenge here. LY in the reg snn they had a tremendous situational edge off of 4 easy gms while CU was off 2 big gms and on its 1st road trip. That game was played in light rain and 43' and CU got a td with 1:49 left 2Q to lead 10-3 at the half and won 23-3. In the ACC Champ game, it was 10-10 at the half but the Tigers rolled to a 38-10 win. CU has the situational edge this time off a bye and while VT had just Duke LW, this is their 8th str gm and 3rd away from home in 4W. LW VT fell behind 20-0 in the 1Q but exploded for 41 unanswered in their win over Duke as it was their best 48 min of FB TY. Clemson is 11-3 ATS as conf HF under Swinney but VT has been an ACC dog just twice s/09 and has gone 10-2 ATS as a conf dog s/01. Even with the revenge though, it worries us that Bud Foster's D couldn't stop Clem LY and TY has all'd 495 yds or more in 3 gms.

BOISE ST 41 Univ 13 - LY LV was a 42 pt HD and 12,000 Boise fans were in attendance but BSU had their big showdown vs TCU on deck and LV had a shocking 198-161 yd edge in the 1H with BSU getting a 5 yd td pass with :25 left to lead 21-14. BS went on to a 48-21 win (just 416-319 yds). Boise has no scheduling distractions TY with only WY on deck. LW the Broncos beat Fresno for the 7th str time 20-10 (-7) holding one of the nation's best scoring off to 0 pts in the 1H (4th str gm no pts all'd before HT). The Broncos are 5-1 SU thanks to a D that has forced 19 TO's (#2) while the off is avg just 369 ypg (lowest s/97!). LV is off what may be biggest home gm of snn vs instate rival Nev as conf opp's for 1st time and after leading 31-14, all'd 28 unanswered pts in the 42-37 loss (+14). While the off is much improved avg 414 ypg (274 LY), the def is still all'g 479 ypg. HC Hauck is on the hotseat and they are still only 2-16 ATS on the road their L18 gms incl just a 1/2 pt cover TY at LT. The Rebs will also be in awe of their first visit to the Blue Turf.

NOTRE DAME 23 Byu 9 - HT has won 3 str (all s/03). In the L/meeting ('05) the Irish (-18') won 49-23 w/a 511-392 yd edge. ND is off perhaps their biggest win in the Kelly era as they were able to stop Stanford on 4&g from the 1 in OT (albeit controversially) as we cashed our Top C-TOT Play on the Under. QB Golson was hit and miss as he made several spectacular throws on the run but also had 3 TO's incl a fmbt that led to a SU td. He was KO'd late 4Q (head, CS) and it was bkp Rees closing out a win for the 3rd time TY. The ND def (#4) has not all'd a td in 4 gms and is still the only D not to allow a rush td TY. BYU has a great D of their own (#11) but LW gave up 42 pts and 450 yds to Oreg St in the 2Q. It was just 28-24 late 4Q before 2 OSU td's but it was vs a QB that hadn't taken a game snap in 2Y. QB Nelson was back in the st'g lineup after missing 2 gms and was his usual inconsistent self w/3 int. While the situation favors BYU as ND is in a Miami/Stan/OU sandwich, we're not sold on BYU's off (particularly QB) generating enough pts in what should be a low scoring affair.

Alabama 34 TENNESSEE 20 - Finally this game returns to the 3rd Sat in Oct. It may surprise some to know that from '95-'06 UT was 10-2 SU in this series. Since Bama (+10') lost at UT 16-13 in '06, they are 5-0 SU/4-1 ATS and have won their last 2 trips here 29-9 (-5) in '08 (+193 yds) and 41-10 (-15) in '10 (+221 yds). LY we had a 4★ Key Selection in PS on Bama (-29') at home. Surprisingly the game was tied 6-6 at the half with Bama only having a 157-114 yd edge but Saban let them know about his unhappiness and Bama did not allow a FD in the 2H and had a 280-41 yd edge winning 37-6 (-29'). UT is 1-8 ATS as a HD while Bama 13-6 as an AF. The #1 Tide again have the nation's #1 D and LW the only td all'd came on a 98 yd KR as they rolled Mizou 42-10 (-21) racking up a 355-37 rush yd edge! Bama is on its 2nd str away which didn't occur LY but they went 0-2 ATS in that situation in '10. After LW's loss to Miss St 41-31, UT has lost 14 str vs ranked opp's with the avg loss by 19 ppg. Despite huge improvements in the run gm (avg 185 ypg), the Vols are 3-3 and Dooley is on one of the hottest seats in America. The visitor is 17-3 ATS in the series and while Bama is well rested off a bye and blowout, they do have huge gms vs Miss St and LSU on deck.

CALIFORNIA 22 Stanford 20 - The "Big Game" which used to be the final gm of the reg snn but LY it was Stan's 2nd to last gm and TY moves to Oct. LY the game was played on a rain soaked field and Luck hit 20-30-257 yds while Maynard actually outpassed him with 280. Trailing 31-21, Cal went 74/10pl for a td with :14 left but Stan rec'd the inside. Cal had a 7-1 SU run (6-2 ATS) from '02-'09 but SU has won the last 2 although Cal easily covered LY and is 8-3 ATS. Stan is on the 2nd of B2B away off a tough 20-13 (+7) OT loss at ND ('10 off at ND win lost vs Oreg next wk +6 31-52). Stan was a perfect 4-0 as P12 AF in Luck's Sr snn, covering by 8 ppg but is 0-1 in that role TY being upset by Wash on the road. Cal has been a conf HD 8x in 9Y going 2-6 ATS (1-2 L2Y incl from SF). The home team in the series is just 5-25 ATS and LTH Stan handed Cal its worst loss in this rivalry s/30. The Bears are off B2B impressive wins and playing with renewed confidence while Stan HC Shaw and ply'rs found themselves questioning the officials in LW's gm and need to regroup.

ARIZONA 34 Washington 27 - This series has delivered 6 outright upsets over the L9Y while the home team has won 4 in a row SU/ATS. LY we used UW -4 at home as a 3★ LPS and RB Polk had 5 td's and became the 1st player in UW hist to have 100 yds rush and rec in the same gm. The Cats are off a bye (9-1 ATS off bye) but may still be stinging from an OT loss to Stan, a gm in which QB Scott passed for a career-best 491 yds and 3 td's but a crucial int in OT cost them a victory. UW also blew some opportunities LW in a 10 pt loss to USC as they had a P blk'd for a td and committed some late TO's (fmbt at USC10). Keep in mind that UW has also seen their struggles playing on grass over the L12 snns going just 11-23-1 ATS incl a thumping in Baton Rouge earlier TY. With the addition of Rich Rod to the sideline, the crowd should be amped and ready for this P12 tilt.

OHIO ST 48 Purdue 20 - The home team is 6-1 SU and has covered 3 str by 19 ppg. PU upset OSU at home in '00, '04 and '09. The next year, OSU had wins of 35-9 (-6), 23-7 (-7) and 49-0 (-23') winning by 31 ppg and in '10 had a 489-118 yd edge. LY PU was +7' at home and outplayed OSU in the 1H with a 17-7 lead and a 242-97 yd edge. OSU battled back and on 4&3 got a td pass for the apparent win but PU blk'd the xp and then won it in OT 26-23. PU's last win in Columbus came in '88 and since then they have dropped 8 str by 22 ppg. PU last played a road game 6 wks ago but since their bye the Boilers are 0-2 SU/ATS getting outscored by Mich and Wisky by a comb 88-27. We won 4★ Key Selection and LPS going vs PU as Wisky (-1) dominated them in the rain 38-14 with 30-11 FD and 645-232 yd edges. UW owned the LOS (467-128 yd rush edge) and the QB trio of TerBush, Marve and Henry combined to hit 11-31-124-0-1 while being sk'd 5x. Boilers have been gashed for 199 rush ypg (B10 worst 5.0!). OSU (-17') survived Indy as the Hoosiers scored 15 pts in 0:35 in the final 2:00 before the Bucks secured a 2nd outside K play for the win. QB Miller (182 ypg, 61%, 11-4) and RB Hyde have combined for 272 rush ypg (6.6) in B10 play TY. OSU's D attrition has shown the L2W (459 ypg, 44 ppg) with the Bucks being forced to play starting FB Boren at LB due to the loss of #3 tk'r Sabino. However, this is a legit revenge gm with proven history results in those games.

MICHIGAN 24 Michigan ST 17 - Ever since the "Little Brother" comment in '07, MSU has taken hold of this rivalry going 4-0 SU/ATS winning by an avg score of 31-18 and +157 ypg. LY we used a 3★ LPS on MSU (-3) at home and the Spartans had a 313-82 rush yd edge with the tm with more rush yds going 38-4 SU. MSU has won its L2 Big House trips by 14 and 17 pts. Mich went just 16-14 SU at home from '07-'10 but Hoke reinstalled the UM pride for an undefeated record L2Y (11-0 SU/7-3 ATS). Since the bye the Wolves have outscored their foes 89-13 and outgained them 936-347 for a 2-0 SU/ATS start in B10 play. UM shutout IL LW 45-0 with 21-7 FD and 527-134 yd edges as the Illini's deepest penetration into UM terr was the 32. QB D-Rob (184 ypg, 55%, 9-8, #4 FBS 134 rush ypg, 8.0) has accounted for 627 tti yd and 5 td with 0 TO's the L2W. Improving UM D has all'd 92 rush ypg (2.8) in the L4. Disappointing MSU is off to a 1-2 B10 start after LW's 19-16 2OT home loss to Iowa. MSU was leading 13-6 late 4Q when they all'd Iowa to drive 67/9pl for the gm tying td. After both hit FG's in the 1st OT, Iowa was held to a 42 yd' in the 2nd but a deflected pass was int'd by the Hawks to end the gm. QB Maxwell (230 ypg, 54%, 6-4) has struggled with a young rec corps without #1 rec TE Sims but the deflection was his 1st int since the opener. RB Bell remains the B10's RB rush leader (916, 4.6). The Sparty D is strong on paper (#1 B10 rush, tti and scoring D) but has the league's fewest sks with 6 after leading the conf LY. With the weight of Buckeyes' streak lifted LY, this gm was circled by the Wolves in the offsn and may be Mich's most important gm YTD but LW's results inflated this line.

Indiana 31 NAVY 30 - HC but Navy has lost its L2 (EC and Duke). Last met in '86. Hoosiers DL is all'g 221 rush ypg (5.0) and now travels to deal with chop blocking for 1st time ever but IU did practice for option significantly in spg. IU's co-DC was NM's DC for 2Y so he at least prepped his tms for AF ('10 vs AF: 31 FD, 461 yds, 373, 4.7, '09 vs AF: 23 FD, 371 yds, 298, 4.1). The Hoosiers scored the most pts in their hist vs OSU (49) but it wasn't enough as IU lost its 18th str to the Bucks. IU led 14-10 in the 2Q when OSU rec'd a blk'd P for a td to take the lead for good. IU scored 15 pts in the L2:00 but OSU was able to rec an onside K and run out the clock with a 578-481 yd edge. The Hoosiers lead the B10 in passing by 61 ypg avg 313 (63%) with a 14-2 ratio with So Coffman and bigger armed true Fr Sudfield both seeing action. Navy (+2) won a Friday Night Marquee for us in their 31-13 win over CM. Frosh QB Reynolds threw 32 td passes (1st Navy QB s/97) in his 1st start for an inj'd Miller as the Mids finished with 22-12 FD and 37-221 yd edges. Navy is all'g just 189 pass ypg (66%) with an 8-4 ratio. This one could go down to the wire.

Texas Tech 31 TCU 28 - Last met in '06. TCU went 16-3 ATS as conf HF from '05-'09. The avg line the L2Y as conf HF was -32 ppg yet they still went 4-3 ATS. Not easy for TT to have Okla then both new B12 tms in B2B2B wks. The Raiders are off of their biggest home win under Tuberville and most lopsided ever vs a Top 5 team as they ambushed #5 WV 49-14. TT led 35-7 at the break and finished with a 676-408 yd edge as QB Doerge (32-42-499-6-1) easily outdueled Heisman frontrunner Geno Smith (29-55-275-1-0). Doerge is #7 FBS pass eff (315 ypg, 71%, 21-7). The D has been the difference so far TY all'g a conf best 243 ypg (#4 FBS). The Frogs (+8) took advantage of 6 Baylor TO's to upset the neighboring Bears 49-21 for yet another outright upset as one of our Big Dog POW (available on Thursdays). BU was int'd at the TCU20, fmbt'd at the TCU25 and was int'd twice in the 4Q deep BU terr which set the Frogs up for 14 and 44 yd td drives which put the gm out of reach. QB Boykin hit 22-30-261-4-0 vs Baylor with all 4 td's on 3D incl 3&19 in his 1st road start. TCU's D allows 205 pass ypg (48%) with an 8-14 ratio as they lead the FBS with 20 TO's forced. Whoever minimizes mistakes will win and we like the exp'd Doerge on the road here.

USC 48 Colorado 10 - LY these 2 met for the 1st time s/02 with USC (-20) winning 42-17 cashing a Fri Night Marquee Play on the Over. Barkley set a schl rec'd with 6 td passes. CU did have 31 and 37 yd FG's blk'd and settled for a 30 yd FG after a 1&g at the 8. USC got the frontdoor cover with a 19 yd td pass with 7:06 left. CU struggled with their 1st visits to new venues LY losing and failing to cover their 1st 4 by 13 ppg (-271 ypg!). Their only P12 rd cover was vs fellow newcomer Utah. USC is 5-3 ATS as a conf HF under Kiffin and they were 3-9 ATS as DD fav (finished LY winning 3x covering by 17 ppg, but 1-3 so far TY). USC ret's home after B2B non-covering wins over Utah (-14, 38-28) and Wash (-12, 24-14). The Trojans forced 4 TO's and sk'd UW QB Price 5x while playing it safe in the 2H with a lead as Barkley's 10 comp's were his fewest s/10. One time Heisman favorite Barkley (246 ypg, 63%, 16-6) has been quiet with RB Redd (570, 5.6) stealing the spotlight with 150+ yds in 2 of the L/3. CU trailed ASU just 20-17 at the break before being outscored 31-0 in the 2H in a 51-17 Thurs night home loss. ASU had 31-16 FD and 593-255 yd edges. CU QB Webb (190 ypg, 57%, 8-4) has been sk'd an FBS most 27x's. The Buffs are being shredded thru the air allowing 313 ypg (63%) with a 20-3 ratio (#117 FBS). If Kiffin wants to get Barkley back into the Heisman conversation this is the perfect opp to start the chatter.

Florida 34 MIAMI, FL 20 - Ten of the L11 have been decided by a td or less. Visitor had won 5x prior to LY and the traveler has still covered 6 str as Miami does not have much of a home edge. LY we used a Big Dog POW on UM and the Canes actually had a 383-249 yd and 24-13 FD edges but lost SU 23-19 yet at +10 still covered. FSU is on the road for a 3rd time in 4 wks but that is negated by a BC/Duke sandwich. LTH #23 FSU rolled to a 45-17 win as the Noles fans were in full force with the War Chant drowning out the Miami cheers. FSU was on a 5-2 ATS run as an AF but is 0-2 in that role so far TY. After the very conservative approach in the 2H of the loss at NCST, the Noles came out firing in their 51-7 win (-29) over BC which featured Manuel passing for a career-high 434 yds and the Noles topping the 600 yd mark for the 4th time TY (most s/99 Nat'l Champ tm). The Canes come in wounded literally and figuratively off B2B losses to ND and UNC as QB Morris left the UNC gm w/an inj'd ankle (CS). If he can't go it will be Mem trans Williams who was 9-13-80 LW. The Noles have all the talent edges especially on D (#2-86) and we expect the War Chant to reverberate around Sun Life Stadium.

OREGON ST 30 Utah 13 - HC. LY UU was -5 at home and White ran for a car-high 205 yds. QB Hays hit just 6-14-62 yds but UU had a 225-32 rushing edge. OSU actually had a 17-13 FD edge but the Utes won 27-8. They also met in '07 and '08 with the HT winning all 3 SU (2-1 ATS). UU is off a misleading 21-14 (+9) loss to UCLA as they got a 1 yd td pass on 4&g w/3:00 min left on a 90 yd drive led by Hays who came off the bench as Wilson got the start (23-33-220-0-1). UU's only other td came on a fmbt'd PR as the LA ply'r tried fielding it at the 3 bobbled it and then bobbled it again into the EZ. OSU is 5-0 for the 1st time s/39 after LW's 42-24 (+6) win at BYU. With s'g QB Mannion out, bkp Vaz took his first snaps in 2 yrs and made it look easy going 20-32-332-3-0 as the Beavers racked up 450 yds on one of the best D's in the country. The Utes are on 2nd of B2B away and have been outgained in each of their 6 P12 road gms dating back to LY by an avg of 116 ypg! Tough going against a Beaver tm that 4-1 ATS TY and one of the surprises in the country.

WIRGINIA 41 Kansas St 38 - Last met in '31. KSU is on the 2nd of B2B away while WV is off B2B away and has a bye on deck. When Snyder returned in '09 KSU dropped its 1st 2 as an AD but has reeled off 9 str incl an upset win over Okla (+16) in their only time in that role TY. WV is 3-0 ATS off of a SU loss under Holgerson but must prove their B12 mettle as they were crushed 49-14 at TT (+3) for their 1st loss of the snn. WV never led (trailed 35-7 at HT; 49-7 with 4:00 left) and was outgained 676-408. QB Smith is still #1 FBS pass eff (379 ypg, 75%, 25-0) but played the entire 2H without the FBS's #4 rec Bailey (766, 13.9, 14 td) due to a foot inj. The D issues that were masked by the high powered off were exposed as WV is #118 pass D (365, 67%, 17-5) with top DL Clark missing LW's gm due to inj. The Cats (-6) held off ISU as QB Klein had 12 4Q touches to grind out the win. Klein (179 ypg, 67%, 7-2, 510 rush, 10 td) may be the country's least glamorous Heisman contender but the QB's the B12's highest ranked tm. KSU is allowing 239 pass ypg (62%) with a 6-6 ratio and 14 sks. Most tms would have trouble adapting to this unusual setting at WV with their juiced up home crowd but Snyder will have the Cats prepared. LY KSU was at the OSU goal line with a chance to tie it at the end and upset Miami, Texas and TT all as dogs on the road.

TEXAS A&M 24 LSU 23 - Rematch of the '10 Cotton Bowl. We won an easy 4★ on LSU -2 in the Double Bowl Issue and a 3★ LPS and they rolled 41-24. Nice spot for A&M coming off LT and at Miss compared to LSU off SC and at Fla. In a gm that was postponed by Hurricane Issac from Aug 30, the Aggies survived a late LT rally in a 59-57 (-9) win. QB Manziel again broke the SEC rec'd for total off (576) and accounted for 6 td's. A&M did overcome 19 pen (165 yds) and was -2 in TO's. LSU also overcome several mistakes to win 23-21 (-3) over #3 SC. It was a gm LSU should have won by 3 td's as they had a 258-34 rush yd edge but settled for 3 FG's of less than 25 yds, missed a 32 yd FG, gave up a 71 yd IR that set up a SC td and gave up a 4&15 pass w/less than 2:00 min left that all'd SC to score on the next play getting the backdoor. A&M is 9-3-1 ATS vs Top 10 tms as a HD and LSU is 0-4 SU/ATS in College Station with their last meeting in '95. A&M has the better off (#4-28) while LSU has the better D (#5-28). This one will come down to the wire.

4★ HOUSTON over Baltimore - TJ Yates was at the helm for the Texans when they traveled to Baltimore in Jan losing a Conf Semi-Finals matchup 20-13. The revenge seeking Texans held Flacco and company to 11 FD's forcing them to punt 9 times. This time Houston has Schaub back (#7, 99.2 QBR) and he has led his team to a 14-3 ATS mark when starting. The Texans have done it in the trenches as their OL has allowed 1 total sack in the 4 gms prior to GB while the DL has produced at least 3 sacks per game. The Ravens much publicized fast paced offense has avg'd 385 ypg but on the road they've been pedestrian avg 312 ypg and 16 FD's/gm scoring a total on 20 pts with Flacco at 51% with a 1-2 ratio. The D has been also forced to be on the field more and in the L9Y the Ravens have finished in the top 10 every season and in the top six 8 times but TY their allowing 397 ypg (#26) incl over 480 yds to both Philly and Dallas. LW's Raven's win may be costly as 3 more defensive starters may not see action here. Houston by comparison has not allowed over 375 yds in any game and is allowing 276 ypg on the season. It all adds up to a top play.

3★ Dallas over CAROLINA - Cam Newton is undeniably in a sophomore slump avg 238 ypg passing (59%) with a 4-5 ratio but the alarming part is that after 5 games he leads the team with 209 yd rushing (5.2). Things didn't get easier for him on the bye as top-5 Ctr Kalil (foot) landed on IR and while DAL is 14th in run defense they are allowing just 3.8 ypc and have the #1 pass defense. DAL has had OL issues as they were held to under 50 yds rush in 3 of 4 games but LW after a few adjustments ran for a season high with Murray and Jones combining for 185 (5.8). The rush attack allowed Dallas to convert 30 FD's and finish with a 481-316 yd edge but a KR td proved costly in the 2 pt loss. The coaching staff was already under pressure as they lost 4 games by 4 or less LY and one in OT and now even with the Giants on deck the last place Cowboys can not let another winnable game slip away. Despite playing a second straight road game vs a team off a bye we'll back the desperate Cowboy's who have a better offense, better defense and better ST's unit.

They still have to outscore opponents to win but that's no concern vs a Bucs squad that has faced 2 other top 10 offenses that had their starting QB's allowed 539 ypg and 29 FD's/gm. We expect marked improvement from the Saints D during the bye week as the interim coaching staff will get to iron out issues. The D has totaled 3 and 5 sacks in 2 of L/3 and that is the clearest way to beat the Bucs' QB Freeman. While Josh has not been sacked more than twice so far in any game TY a look back at LY show's his lack of production when getting pressured as Tampa avg'd 11 ppg in those 5 affairs failing to cover all of them by 24 ppg. Have to know that the Saints will want to run up the score vs an inferior team that beat them 2 of the last 3 times. The page 8 system makes it stronger!

Seattle at SAN FRANCISCO - Thurs. Everyone raise their hand that projected every NFC West tm to be .500 or better after 6 weeks. Harbaugh won and covered both games vs Carroll LY logging a 349-265 yd edge in the 2nd meeting. SF held SEA to just 72 yds in the 2H but RB Lynch ended the 49ers streak of 36 straight gm of no 100 yd rushers allowed. After LW's upset by SEA and SF getting upset there's a 3-way tie at the top incl both of these teams. Will SF rebound or will the Seahawks pull their 5th upset of the season? This Thursday night Marquee will be available on the PPH after Noon gameday.

BUFFALO 28 Tennessee 24 - Both teams pulled upsets LW. The Bills do have a bye on deck but they are off B2B West Coast games getting mauled vs SF and rebounding with an OT win LW at Arizona. TEN meanwhile has extra rest and a bit of momentum after upsetting PIT last Thursday but how that carries forward is uncertain as they expect QB Locker to return. RB Johnson did break the 25 yd barrier for the 2nd time TY vs PIT (91 yds 4.8) but TEN is still on a 2-8 ATS run thanks to a defense that is allowing 136 ypg (4.4) on the ground with a 69% completion rate for a 17-5 ratio. The main difference here is the rush attack with the Bills having the edge (5.1 vs 3.7 ypc) but keep an eye on their OL which had 3 starters out or ? LW.

MINNESOTA 30 Arizona 17 - This is the 5th straight year these teams have met and the Dog had covered 3 straight until MIN hammered ARZ 34-10 to secure its 1st win LY as a 3 pt HF. MIN had a complete game as they jumped out to a 28-0 lead in the 1Q with RB Peterson tallying 122 yds (4.2) on the day. Nine of ARZ's 13 drives ended in punts/TO's with another 2 being SOD. The Vikings split their first 2 games TY but since then both lines have gelled. The OL has opened holes for 135 ypg L4 while allowing only 7 sk on the sn. The DL allowed 79 ypg and 3.2 ypg before Griffin's 138 LW but ARZ doesn't have they type of QB. While Minny's secondary is a concern vs Fitzgerald we feel they won't have enough time to allow his favorite deep routes. The Cardinals meanwhile get exposed this week. They failed to top 300 yds in any game prior to putting up 332 LW and their top 2 RB's are hurt. Add in a Cards OL that has allowed 22 sks the L/3 games and you'll have Jared Allen (26 sks L2Y) licking his chops. The 4-2 start has the Metrodome back with a sound level reminiscent of '09's playoff team making it even harder to audible and "Purple Power" is back.

INDIANAPOLIS 27 Cleveland 24 - The Browns beat the Colts 27-19 as a 2 pt AF LY but both teams are massively different vs Wk 2 of LY. CLE 5-1-1 ATS on the road while IND already has pulled home

VANDERBILT 20 Auburn 17 - The last time these 2 met Vandy was ranked and pulled the small upset in 2008 (+4, 14-13) snapping Aub's 13 gm series win streak. Since that time Aub has won a Nat'l Champ and Vandy is 5-26 SU in SEC play but now it is the Dores who will be the HF after they have gone 9-1 ATS in HG's under Franklin while Aub limps in at 1-5 SU/ATS. LW we boldly used our Top Weekly LPS against Vandy (+9) at home and they lost 31-17 to Florida giving up 326 rush yds. Shockingly, Aub HC Chizik, just two yrs removed from a Nat'l Champ, is hearing calls for his job as the Tigers are off to their worst start s/'98. LW they were an AD (+4) to a Miss tm that had lost a schl rec'd 16 str SEC gms and lost 41-20 in a gm that was much closer than the final as they trailed just 27-20 in the 4Q. The Tigers have now been outscored 62-3 in the 4Q and have lost 6 str SEC gms. Vandy is 6-1 ATS off a SU loss under Franklin, easily covered as a conf HF vs UK LY and gets yet another SEC win as the calls for Chizik's job grow louder and louder.

KENT ST 27 W Michigan 24 - LY was 1st time under Cubit that WM did not win 2+ MAC AG's. WM is 13-1 vs Kent ST but lost the LTH ('09). WM trailed just 20-14 w/8:25 left but all'd a 72/7pl drive incl a 15 yd td run and was then int'd. The HT has won 3 str by 26 ppg and in the last meeting ('10) WM won 38-3 (-3). LW the Broncos dropped a heartbreaker to Ball ST 30-24 (+2) in OT. QB Van Tubbergen got his 3rd str start but was just 16-31-202 with 2 int. Kent is off to its best start (5-1 SU/ATS) since the famous 1973 MAC Champ tm after LW's 31-17 win over Army (-2). The Flashes were outFD'd 27-12 but the nation's #1 all-purp ply'r, Archer, had yet another big day with 222 rush yds (18.5) and he even threw a 24 yd td pass! Cubit has won his L/3 trips to Ohio as an AF by an avg score of 38-6 and it should be noted that WM has alternated wins/losses SU/ATS in every gm TY and this would be the week they are due for a win. However, tough going against a Kent tm that excluding the loss to UK, has won every game by DD TY.

upsets vs MIN and GB. The Browns have some matchup edges here as while the coaching staff is on the hot seat, they are in their 18th game together while this is the 3rd for interim HC Ariens. Also RB Richardson (94 tl ypc 4.7) gets a favorable matchup vs an undersized 3-4 defense that is 29th vs the run (5.0 ypc) but he is listed as ?. However, CLE's receiving corps is gradually maturing while Luck has Wayne (36 rec 14.1) whose taking advantage of rookie Hilton stretching the field (7 rec, 21.4 L/2 at home). With the rookie QB's matching up we'll lean with the Colts at home vs the Browns on a 3rd road game in 4 weeks and playing off their first win since last November while beating a division rival will have them celebrating this week.

Green Bay 21 ST LOUIS 17 - The Rams have a sizeable situational edge at home (3-0 ATS TY) catching GB in their 3rd straight road game having faced HOU on SNF. Aside from Fisher, the big difference between this team and LY's is that the defense has been very healthy not losing any starts due to injury. LY after 5 games they were already down to their 4th and 5th CB's and their #7 pass defense ranking was misleading as they allowed a 21-12 ratio with just 12 sacks thanks to the #31 rush defense (152 ypg, 4.8). TY STL is giving up 101 ypg (4.0) on the ground with just a 4-8 ratio and with 17 sacks on the year. The Rams also are off the weeks most misleading final as despite losing to MIA 17-14 they outgained them 462-192 but settled for 5 FG's missing 3. While Rodgers is still putting up solid stats (242 ypg 69% 12-4) the Packers passing offense has looked out of sync as the OL has struggled in pass protection (SEA/IND) and its unknown how the ground game fared LW without RB Benson (foot) who gave them some much needed balance. Look for GB to come away with the win but for STL to make it tougher than expected here.

NY GIANTS 21 Washington 14 - If it's an NFC East matchup you always look at the AD as they're 23-10 ATS incl 2-0 TY. The Giants have been involved in both TY and this will be RG III's first and he can expect a special welcome from the NY fans. The Giants have played defenses that have been either elite (3 in top 8) or poor (3 in bottom 10) and against the latter group which Washington falls into (#27) NY has averaged 399 ypg and 504 ypa. Another advantage the Giants have is that they've already have faced dual threat QB's in PHI's Vick and CAR's Newton and held them to 19 and 7 pts respectively. The Skins evened their record at 3-3 knocking off MIN 38-26 but despite Griffin's numbers being better on the road vs at home he had early leads in all 3 thanks to a pair of def td's and an 88 yd rec but it was also vs NO, STL and TB. While the leadoff angle is on the dog we'll call for NY playing with double revenge (-2.5, 14-28 & -6, 10-23) to win by 7 and see how the public reacts to the win over the 49ers LW.

NEW ENGLAND 40 NY Jets 17 - NE is 5-14 ATS as a DD favorite but its tough to think that Belichick won't resist kicking an AFC East rival like Rex Ryan when he's down (ask Chan Gailey). After being stymied early on by the Jets defensive schemes, Brady has torched them the L3 meetings avg 326 ypg (70%) with a 8-1 ratio with a monster 9.7 ypa (6.8 was NFL avg TY entering LW). NE's #4 run game takes a lot of stress off the still gelling OL and they could have a field day vs the Jets #28 run defense that is allowing 151 ypg (4.7) TY. In his L5 games Sanchez has only avg'd 172 ypg (46%) with a 5-5 ratio but its not all on him as his top 3 receiving options (Holmes, Hill, Keller) have missed time with injury and RB Greene (sans LW) has been very disappointing TY. No need to overreact to NY's 35 pts LY as it came on 351 yds vs Indy. The Patriots have been a HF the L2Y after traveling to OAK and SD and they've had no issues covering both incl vs the Jets LY. Brady has to feel responsible for a poorly managed game as NE had numerous chances to open the margin but now we catch them off a SU loss which has produced a 23-7 ATS record. New England also knows that while the Jet's have been bashed they are tied atop the division as all 4 teams are 3-3. While they are also aware that if they were to slip up here they wouldn't be trailing the Jets.

OAKLAND 17 Jacksonville 10 - JAX didn't get any schedule breaks as after getting thumped by CHI at home they return from their bye week having to go cross country with another road game vs GB on deck. After a decent season opener, Gabbert has regressed avg 134 ypg (53%) with a 3-3 ratio. What's more disturbing is that he has a 5.0 ypa and keep in mind MJJ who sat out all offseason and camp has a 4.9 ypc TY. Aside from the MIN game, Gabbert has only passed for 200 yds on the road once (210 at CLE LY) and Mularkey's offense has been held to 10 or less in 3 home games. While McFadden (54 ypg 3.2) hasn't adjusted to the zone-blocking scheme, Palmer has shown signs of life (287 ypg 63%) despite a beat up receiving unit and while his 6-3 ratio isn't earth shattering it sure beats his 13-16 ratio of LY. Both the off and def were impressive vs one of the 2 remaining unbeaten as they left ATL losing on a FG with :01 left after outgaining them 474-286. Can't see the Jags improving much on their 13 pts, 15 FD's and 243 ypg especially vs an angry home team that hasn't played a home game in a month. The Black Hole will be very rowdy and has already helped the Raiders knock off Pittsburgh 34-31 and outgained SD 321-258.

Pittsburgh at CINCINNATI - Sunday Night. PIT is off a last second loss to TEN where they were nickel and dimed by injuries all game long. That puts them in a crucial game at CIN where they are 10-1 SU/ATS. CIN has a bye on deck which will allow them to go all out vs a PIT team that finds itself way behind BAL in the standings. Can the Bengals seize the day or will the Steelers bully this young division team in their own house? Call Sunday after 11:00 am ET for this Marquee Selection.

Detroit at CHICAGO - Monday. The Lions went into their bye week having dropped 4 straight and LW may have saved their season going 85/7pl scoring a td with 3:32 left and 62/12pl kicking a game tying FG with :03 left before winning in OT. The Bears meanwhile were on a bye LW with the complete opposite mind set having won 3 straight. Can Detroit continue to salvage their season or as the departed Don Meredith always sang will it be time to "turn out the lights" as a loss would put them 3 full games back. Monday Night Magic plays have won 9 of the last 12 (75%) while the MN Marquee's have gone 16-4-1 (80%). Get them both after Noon gameday. **The Monday Night Sides and Totals are 67% over the last 2 years and the Monday Night Total this year is already 4-1!!**

Ucf 41 MEMPHIS 13 - UCF is 7-0 SU (avg win 37-16!) BUT the home team is 6-1 ATS. LY UCF was angry, off an upset loss as a DD fav. Mem, meanwhile, was off an upset win as a DD dog and on the road for the 4th time in 5W. UCF dominated 41-0 and despite going to its backups in the 3Q still finished with 505-134 yd and 28-6 FD edges. This is UCF's 1st AG in 6W but they're off B2B east title gms vs EC and SM. UCF was 6-1 as an AF '09 and '10 but is 2-6 ATS away the L2Y and 1-3 ATS as an AF losing 3 SU as a 6, 16' and 7 pt fav with the only W this year. LW the Knights were able to pull out a 38-31 2OT win (-17) over SM capturing their 1st OT win in schl hist. UCF remains undefeated in CUSA play and has all but locked up a spot in CUSA champ gm if elig. UM had lost 10 str CUSA HG's SU prior to beating Rice a couple wks ago but LW lost its 7th str gm to EC in dominating fashion (41-7, +18) as they gained 133 of their 281 yds on their final 2 poss vs bkps. In a gm pitting the CUSA's best vs one of the worst, we'll side with the Knights as Mem is just 6-12 ATS as a HD.

LOUISVILLE 27 Uof 24 - The home tm was 7-0 SU/ATS but visitor has won & covered the L2. LY USF was w/o QB Daniels (inj) and was -3' at home. UL got the series' 3rd outright upset in 4Y. USF got a td with just :35 left 1H to lead 17-3 but UL got a 54 yd KR and would get a td w/:13 left in the half to pull within 17-10. USF still led 24-20 in the 4Q and UL got a td with 9:38 left and would get a fmb! for another to td with 4:12 left in the 34-24 upset. USF is fresh off a bye after 4 str losses that had the USF AD making news talking about re-evaluating the program and HC Holtz. Meanwhile UL is off to its best start s/'06 after their 45-35 (-2) win over Pitt where the Cards benefitted from a couple of bone-headed decisions by Pitt HC Chryst incl one that gave UL a FG on the last play of the 1H to cut the Pitt lead to 21-17 and gave them momentum into the lockerroom. QB Bridgewater is avg 240 ypg (72%) with a 9-3 ratio while his counterpart Daniels is avg 251 ypg (56%) with a 10-8 ratio. The tms are close talent-wise as UL has slight edges on off (#57-62) and D (#48-57) but USF has played the much tougher schd (#41-83). LTH USF (+2) won 24-21 in OT and we expect the maximum effort out of the Bulls here after a tumultuous week .

LW MD got its 4th win of the ssn (just 2 LY), 27-20 (+2) over UVA thanks to a 100 yd KR td by super frosh Diggs who is #9 in the NCAA in all-purp avg 169 ypg. The MD D (#20) is legit holding foes to 117 ypg below their avg. NCSt prior to LW's bye pulled the huge upset over #3 FSU 17-16 (+16, trailed 16-0 at HT) thanks to a key blk'd P and 3 4Dn conv on their final drive. NCSt is 0-3 SU/ATS as a conf AF in 6Y under O'Brien with all 3 gms the L2Y incl LTH. NCSt is 7-0 ATS off a bye but one of the staples in handicapping is to play on a def HD and we'll side with the Terps here who not only have the D edge (#24-43) but also have already pulled 2 outright upsets TY and covered by 15.5 pts as a dog vs WV.

LOUISIANA TECH 54 Idaho 27 - LY on HC, ID QB Reeder hit just 19-47-244. At the half ID had a 185-160 yd edge but LT had a 53 yd IR td and led 10-5. After an int LT went 53 yds for a td in the 3Q then after a 21 yd PR went 40/6pl for another td to lead 24-5 before ID tacked on an 81 yd PR td in a 24-11 (+4) loss. LT is 4-1 SU/5-0 ATS in the series outgaining the Vandals by 154 ypg with the avg score 36-22. LW LT entered the AP Poll for the 2nd time in schl hist (#23) but fell 59-57 (+9) to #22 A&M in Shreveport as their late rally fell short (trailed 39-13 in 1H) and their BCS shot is now officially done. QB Cameron continued his impressive ssn with 450 yds and a 5-0 ratio. He now is avg 318 ypg (70%) with a perfect 18-0 ratio. ID HC Akey is deservingly on the hot seat after yet another embarrassing loss LW, this time to FBS newcomer Texas St 38-7 (+2) as ID dropped to 1-6 SU on the yr. While LT could suffer from BCS Bubble Burst, they still have the WAC Champ to play for (just 1 bowl bid) and ID is playing for an 8th str week with this their FIFTH long road trip in the last 7 weeks.

OKLAHOMA ST 41 Iowa St 13 - From '00-'09 these two had met 6x's and while they split the gms 3-3, they did exactly what was expected as the fav was 6-0 SU/ATS. LY was a rare underdog cover on a Friday night as ISU's upset 20T 37-31 win kept #2 OSU from playing in the National Champ gm. ISU had 33-24 FD and 568-536 yd edges. OSU did miss a 37 yd FG with 1:17 left in regulation which would have won it. OSU has had byes in 2 of their L/3 wks and survived a 1:19 hr t-storm delay in an uninspired 20-14 win at Kansas. The Cowboys actually led 20-0 early 4Q when Hawks bkp QB Cummings drove 65/9pl and 73/3pl for td's. KU drove to the OSU41 where they were SOD and a roughing of the P en all'd OSU to run out the clock. QB Walsh (#6 FBS pass eff 210 ypg, 65%, 9-3) went the distance as Lunt (knee) may finally be ready to return for this gm. OSU's D ygd #s are actually improved from LY but the difference is TO's as after leading the nation with 44 TO's forced in '11, the Cowboys have just 4 TY (2 in L/4). ISU hung tough with undefeated KSU trailing just 24-21 in the 4Q but the Cats played keep away (40:54-19:06 TOP edge) and were able to hang onto a 27-21 win as 6 pt AF's. QB Barnett got his 2nd straight start and hit 16-36-166-2-1 but the run gm struggled with RB's combining for 14-34. ISU is 8-4 ATS as B12 AD under Rhodes incl TY's 37-23 win over TCU (+7) but unlike most of the Cyclones' opps OSU has had this gm circled.

OKLAHOMA 48 Kansas 13 - The Sooners have won 7 in a row SU by 23 ppg (+183 ypg) but are just 4-3 ATS. LY these 2 also met the wk after RRR and OU only had a 335-246 yd HT edge and led just 27-17 on the road. In the 2H OU settled for 27 and 20 yd FG's, fmbld into the EZ for a TB and was int'd at the KU28 as they won 47-17 (-35) and finished with a 610-252 yd edge. OU is in a large Texas/ND sandwich and this is the Sooners "C" game for Oct esp after LW's 2nd str whipping of the Horns, 63-21. OU led 36-2 at the half and didn't allow an off td to be scored until the 4Q when the bkps were in. The 677-289 yd margin was the most the UT program has been outgained by /50! QB Jones (271 ypg, 62%, 9-3) seems to have recovered from his slow start and has found a new rec on a weekly basis. RB Williams is #2 B12 rushing (508, 7.7) incl LW's RRR rec'd 95 yd td run. OU is 24-12-1 ATS as a HF. Despite a 1:19 hr t-storm delay KU rallied from a 20-0 4Q deficit to drive to the OSU41 where they were SOD with 2:45 left. The Hawks forced a P but saw the comeback dreams die when they roughed the P with 1:46 left. HC Weis finally benched starting QB Crist (181 ypg, 49%, 3-7) and Cummings led the 4Q comeback hitting 50-175-1-0 aided by Sims (344, 4.7). The Hawks allow 201 rush ypg (5.0) which isn't good news vs the revitalized Sooners.

TEXAS 60 Baylor 32 - UT had won 12 str in the series by 37 ppg and +256 ypg. In '10 UT had a 100 yd edge and blew a 19-10 lead and got upset 30-22 at home. LY UT was bent on revenge and was also an underdog to BU for the 1st time in 16Y. UT had a 557-511 yd edge but McCoy had 5 TO's. Those TO's led BU to an amazing 24 pt win over UT. Texas had won and covered 6x after OU but lost LY. TY the Horns stumble in after B2B losses to WV and OU and they have all'd 49 ppg and 571 ypg in B12 play. While the off was able to match scores vs OSU and WV if hit rock bottom last wk failing to score until the 4Q and being outgained by the worst margin (388 yds) s/50. QB Ash (232 ypg, 72%, 11-3) left in the 4Q (wrist, exp to miss) and McCoy finished the gm (5-8-102-2-0). BU lost its 2nd str as we got yet another outright upset winner for our Big Dog POGW on TCU (+8'). The Frogs capitalized on 6 Bears TO's thanks to 4 3rd down td passes by QB Boykin. FBS tl offense leader QB Florence (375 ypg, 64%, 18-9) threw td passes of 74 and 77 yds to FBS's #1 rec Williams (830, 22.4) but also was responsible for 4 int. After forcing TO's in 16 straight gms under DC Bennett, the Bears have been shutout in their 0-2 B12 start (allowing 59.5 ppg). Texas only has Kansas on deck and this is a legitimate DOUBLE revenge game and the Horns have NEVER lost 3 straight in the series!

Pitt 34 BUFFALO 20 - LY this was the ssn opener for Pitt and Graham rushed for 201 yds for but UB QB Anderson threw for 276 and UB actually had a 28-21 FD edge. Fourth meeting in the L5Y as Pitt has won all 3 but the visitor has now covered all 3 as LY Pitt was -30' at home and only won 35-16 and it was just 21-16 in the 4Q. The LTH in 2009, Pitt won 54-27 (-10') covering by 16' pts. UB went 0-3 as a

HD in Quinn's 1Y but was 2-1 ATS LY. Bulls are off 3x away gms incl LY's East and West Champs while Pitt is sandwiched between 2 BE HG's. LW in the earliest start time (11 am) for Pitt s/79, the Panthers fell to undefeated Lville 45-35 (+2) as HC Chryst should take the majority of the blame due to mis-managing the gm. Right before the half he elected to go for it on 4&2 at midfield up 21-14 and it failed which ultimately led to UL getting a FG and momentum. Then, down 10 late in the gm, he decided to go for it on 4&8 instead of attempting a 39 yd FG that would have cut it to one score. QB Heuser still shockingly leads the BE in pass eff (#8 NCAA) and is avg 292 ypg (70%) with a 10-2 ratio. Buff is off a 45-3 loss to NI but they did have a 26-21 FD edge. UB has completed admirably with BE Conn in each of the L/2 yrs losing by an avg of 11 ppg and we expect the same kind of gm here.

E Carolina 30 UAB 27 - The dog is 8-3 ATS in this series and the visitor is 3-8 SU (4-7 ATS). LY EC (-14') had a 545-400 yd edge but was -4 in TO's as they had a schl rec'd 7 TO's and an only won 28-23. EC fmbld into the EZ for a TB when they could have taken a 35-17 lead. EC is 5-9 ATS as an AF but has won 5 in a row SU in the series by 14 ppg. LTH EC rallied in the 2H and won 54-42 (+2). LW EC easily cruised to their 7th str win over Mem 41-7 (-17) as Mem gained 133 of their 281 yds on their final 2 drives vs EC's bkps. QB Carden tossed 5 td's and after an early ssn QB battle w/Johnson is now firmly planted as the str. UAB is now 1-5 SU after LW's 39-17 loss to UH where they were outgained 566-374. While EC has the D edge (#64-98), UAB is dangerous here as the series angles favor the Blazers and they have a ST's edge (#46-118).

IOWA 20 Penn St 14 - The LBY the tm that won has covered with 4 upsets. From '08-'10 Iowa was 3-0 SU/ATS but -22 tl yds in the 3 meetings. Iowa had been on an 8-1 SU/7-2 ATS run with PSU incl 3 str wins coming into LY but PSU (-4') won 13-3 at home with a 395-253 yd edge with their D holding Iowa to a season low in yds (129 below ssn avg). PSU has not won in Iowa City s/99 dropping 4 str trips (3 ATS Ls) by 10 ppg. The dog is 9-4 ATS with 7 outright upsets. PSU has the sked edge off of a bye and QB McGloin has greatly benefitted from O'Brien's tutelage leading the B10 in passing throwing for 250 ypg (62%) with a 12-2 ratio. Oddly both tms have had to play FB's at TB due to inj's with PSU's Zwinak running for 315 (4.8) in the L/3 while UI folk hero Weisman is the B10's #6 rusher (631, 6.3, 8 td). The Hawks trailed MSU 13-6 in the 4Q when they drove 67/9pl for a td to tie at 0:55 left. After trading FG's in the 1st OT, Iowa hit a 42 yd'r and then int'd a deflected pass for the win. QB Vandenberg shockingly has the fewest td passes of any non-option starting QB in the country (2) and is avg 189 ypg (57%) with a 2-3 ratio. Iowa extends the Lions' Iowa City blues.

TULSA 45 Rice 17 - Tulsa is 8-2 SU/ATS on HC. LY TU (-10') beat Rice 38-20 thanks to 3 TO's on the 1st 3 drives. QB McHargue had 2 int's and a fmbld and TU went 26/4pl, 34/6pl for td's and 6 yds for a 52 yd FG to lead 17-0. Rice is 1-8 SU (avg loss by 19 ppg) and 2-5-2 ATS vs Tulsa. These schools have avg'd 73 ppg the L7Y. LTH Rice led 7-0 but at HT trailed 41-7 (TU 64-27, -17)! The Owls have not stopped the Golden Hurricane the L8Y allowing 45 ppg and 501 ypg. Tulsa has had a few extra days after beating UTEP 33-11 (-17) on Thurs. The Hurricane led just 6-3 at HT but 3 3Q td's blew it open. Rice meanwhile beat prev unbeaten UTSA 34-14 (-2) as the Owls had a 483-239 yd edge. Tulsa has a bye on deck so they should give full effort while Rice is playing its 5th away from home in 7W. TU is 16-1 SU in conf gms and look for them to win their 7th str gm before their brutal Nov sked.

UTEP 31 Tulane 21 - LY UTEP went into Tulane as a 1' pt dog and came out with a 44-7 win. After the gm, which was UTEP's largest MOV on the road s/65, HC Price called it the most complete game in his tenure here. TU had covered 4 in a row in the series prior going 3-1 SU and won their last trip here as a 10 pt dog, 34-24 with a 461-286 yd edge. The HT is 4-1 SU but 1-3 ATS in the series. Last Thurs UTEP (+17) was down just 6-3 at HT vs CUSA heavyweight Tulsa but collapsed in the 3Q all'g 3 td's incl a 17 yd FR. QB Meger was 16-23-257-11 in place of the inj'd Lamaison (CS). What a difference QB Griffin makes for the Green Wave as after playing Rutgers tough in the opener (24-12, +20'), they would lose their next 4 gms by an avg of 47-8 w/o Griffin (shldr). LW he re'd to throw for 302 yds and 3 td's, the last one w/35 left to lift TU to its first win of the ssn over SMU despite being outFD'd 29-13. While both tms will be thinking "W" here, UTEP has the much better D (#76-110) and ST's (#32-82) but we're intrigued by the value of TU's Griffin.

FRESNO ST 41 Wyoming 17 - LTH was 97 and the L/gm was the '09 NM Bowl where FSU led 28-17 early 4Q but all'd a 37 yd FG to tie it w/20 left and WY pulled the upset in 2OT. WY is just 1-5 SU TY after LW's 28-27 loss (+6') to AF where they played w/ QB Smith (was #9 in nation in tl off, CS) as we cashed a 3★ C-TOT Play on the Under. Christensen's post-gm comments made headlines but what may have gone unnoticed is that the WY D has held in check the nation's #1 and 2 rushers the L2W (116 ypg below their avg's) and now faces Fresno's Rouse (NCAA #18). FSU is now 4-3 SU (6-1 ATS) after LW's 20-10 loss (+7) at Boise where they missed several scoring opportunities and had 9 pen for 85 yds. QB Carr is 3rd in the country w/19 td passes (just 4 int). The Pokes are 10-1 ATS as conf AD under Christensen led 4 upsets (+7, +3, +18.5, +16.5) and Fresno was 6-18-1 as a HF but this is a new regime and they are 3-0 TY. The home team is 6-0 SU in their matchups and we think it easily goes to 7-0.

WKU 27 ULM 24 - WKU's ATS win streak has reached 15 after knocking off Troy last Thurs. While it's rare to find a Sun Belt tm among the nation's top 50 leaders in our offensive and defensive rankings we have a pair of representatives here with ULM rated #45 on off and WKU #49 on D despite each taking on a pair of SEC tms (both went 1-1). These two SBC contenders are reflections of each other in their 3rd year with a new HC and with each having veteran starting QB's that have blossomed (WKU's Jakes 68%, 11-3 and ULM's Browning 62%, 14-3). Both D's are also similar as their stout rush D (WKU 3.5 and ULM 3.3 ypc) make you beat them through air and the pass D's have been up to the task with WKU all'g 57% (11-6 ratio) and ULM all'g 58% (11-9). We'll give the Hilltoppers the home field edge in what should be a great matchup that many won't pay attention to.

MISS ST 34 Middle Tennessee 17 - MSU is in an SEC sandwich between a huge home win vs Tenn and Bama but MT is on its 3rd AG in 4W incl an upset at GT and at 2-1 in conf play the SBC crown will be their main goal. These 2 have play'd 2 recent gms ('08 & '09) w/MSU winning both and the visitor covering both. MSU is 2-6 ATS under Mullen playing a non-conf foe after an SEC gm. While the Bulldogs did beat and cover vs an FCS foe LY with #4 Bama on deck they were also 2-3 in SEC play but TY they are ranked #15 and tied with #1 Bama for the SEC West. MSU is a different team TY as opponents need to respect the pass attack behind an extremely improved Russell who has gone from an 8-4 ratio LY to 12-1. They're also different on the defensive side of the ball as they faced 2 Sun Belt teams and were outFD'd in BOTH by a 30-17 margin vs Troy and 21-15 vs USA while totaling 1 sk. MT's strong offensive showing (434 ypg) can be attributed to an OL that has all'd 4 sks on the season incl only 1 at GT. MT has proven they can keep it close and do so again.

TROY 37 FIU 27 - These 2 tied for the SBC Crown in 2010 but FIU gave Troy its only home loss in a 3Y span the LTH (+8', 53-35) and finished on top. After both had down seasons LY each was expecting a return to the top but Troy has a pair of conf losses while FIU is 0-3. LY the Trojans were outgained 521-299 and while ST's helped them overcome the deficit they missed a 3Q xp and lost in OT. FIU QB Medlock returned after missing 2 and was in midssn form LW throwing for 380 (63%, 2-0) but their D all'd 523 yds incl 256 (54.8) rushing. Troy meanwhile now has a ? at QB as they led 17-7 vs WKU but Robinson was KO'd prior to HT in the 31-26 loss. We'll pass with the injuries but both teams are desperate as Troy was 17-3 at home from '08-'11 and is already 0-3 TY while FIU is 1-6 overall.

Fau 24 SOUTH ALABAMA 21 - Two of the 3 winless tms in SBC play and each has only a single win on the ssn coming vs an FCS foe. USA has clear edges in both off and D stats but they've played among the FBS's weakest skeds (#107) while FAU has faced the #37 sked. The Owls are showing solid progress under their new staff especially on D where they held NT to its 2nd lowest off performance and ULM to a ssn low LW (174 yds less than avg). You have to feel that the recent 4 foes may have looked past USA as their avg line was +23 but that will clearly not be the case with an FAU team visiting that is 2-15 the L2Y and has lost 12 straight conf gms.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 23rd

Arkansas St at LOUISIANA - The home team is 10-1 SU but just 5-5-1 ATS in the series. LY ASU was -11 at home and led 17-0 and held on for a 30-21 non-covering win. Both teams are capable of winning the SBC but will UL get its first loss or will ASU drop to 2-2 and basically out of the race? **Grab this Tuesday Night Marquee for only \$9 on the Northcoast Debit Card after Noon ET gameday!**
