## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ NEBRASKA over Illinois** - Last met in '86. This is Illinois 1st road game and LY were outscored by an avg of 45-13. However, this is a much different Illini tm TY off to a 3-1 SU/ATS start after LW's 50-14 (-26) win over Miami, Oh where they had 36-14 FD and 601-250 yd edges. QB Scheelhaase is a completely different player as well TY now healthy and thriving in new OC Cubit's system avg 291 ypg (67%) w/a 12-3 ratio. Unless Neb makes some major changes on def during the bye, Scheelhaase could have his way vs Husker D (#76) all g 464 ypd and showed no improvement vs SDSt prior to the bye all g 465 yds. For the 1st time in 32 gms, QB Martinez DNS vs SDSt but he will be back here leading a Husker off avg 43 ppg and 496 ypg. **In 2006, we won a 5★ on Nebraska (-4) at home vs Missouri 34-20.** The Huskers off a bye and only have lowly Purdue and a bye on deck will circle the wagons and get a B10 statement win.

**FORECAST: NEBRASKA by 20 over Illinois**

**3★ TULANE over North Texas** - First meeting and first in dome for NT s/04 New Orleans Bowl. This is a much different Tulane tm compared to recent history and they further cemented that LW in their 31-14 win (+13) over ULM. RB Darkwa had his best gm s/11 w/118 yds while the D is all g 122 ppg and 121 ypg less than LY. NT comes in off a bye after their 45-21 loss (+33) to UGA. That gm was misleading as while it was tied at 21 in the 3Q, NT had a 100-yd KR td and a blk'd P td and were outgained 641-245. While the off is avg 410 ypg, the D has all'd 488 ypg. This will be only the 2nd time s/07 that the Mean Green will be an away fav. Tulane was 5-2 ATS as a home dog LY, have the def (#77-86) and ST's (#29-66) edges and are playing w/a lot of confidence.

**FORECAST: TULANE by 7 over North Texas**

**3★ VIRGINIA TECH over North Carolina** - Visitor had covered 6x prior to NC winning at home LY. We had a 2★ on these pages on NC -5' at home and Bernard rushed for a career high 262 yds and NC finished with a 533-394 yd edge. NC led 45-26 after 3Q's and won 48-34. Surprisingly VT is only 1-6 ATS as a conf HF the L2Y but NC went just 1-4 ATS on the road in Fedora's first ssn. TY's NC tm is a shell of itself as they have no run gm w/o Bernard and LW they were dominated at the LOS vs EC (227-67 rush yd deficit) in a 55-31 loss (-12). That was the same Pirate tm that VT's #3 D held to 204 total yds and 10 pts. LW VT held GT's vaunted option to a meager 129 (3.1) while QB Thomas had his best gm on the ssn going 19-25-221-1-0 in the 17-10 win (+7). You have to think DC Foster is angry after his D's performance vs Fedora's hot shot off LY and look for the Hokies to get revenge here.

## OTHER SELECTIONS

**2★ LOUISIANA over Texas St** - 1st meeting. This is UL's ONLY game in a 25 day period. UL went 3-2-1 ATS as a HF LY with one L by a hook as they were -3 TO's. This is only their 2nd HG as they crushed Nicholls St earlier TY 70-7 (-26). TSt meanwhile is off a huge emotional upset win over WY 42-21 (+12) as they held a Cowboys off that came in avg 556 ypg to just 356 yds. It was the 200th career win for TSt HC Franchione and the gm was delayed more than 3 hrs due to weather. Despite their 3-1 record they are getting outgained by 55 ypg while 2-2 UL is getting outgained by only 3 ypg despite playing Ark and Kansas St. UL has the situational and huge off edge (#53-114) and we think they get a comfortable win here.

**FORECAST: LOUISIANA by 17 over Texas St**

**2★ TENNESSEE (+) over Georgia** - While UGA has won 3 in a row SU, the HT is 5-1 SU. LY UGA had a 560-478 yd edge but UT had a 26-20 FD edge. It was the highest scoring game ever in this series. UGA led 27-10 early in the 2Q. UT used a couple of TO's late in the half to take a 30-27 lead. UT missed a 28 yd FG and trailing 51-44, was int'd at the UGA36, fmbld' at the UGA31 and had a pass tipped and int with :07 left at the UGA48. UGA's offense has been stymied in Knoxville as they have gained just 366 yds in '11 (-43 ypg avg), 241 in '09 (-121) and 234 in '07 (-142). Another disparate sked edge with Tenn off S Ala (won 31-24, -16) with a bye on deck compared to UGA being off the huge win over LSU 44-41 (-3). QB Murray has finally gotten the monkey off his back and now has B2B wins over Top 15 tms while playing well (20-34-298-4-1). UT led USA 31-7 LW (could have been 45-7) but let off the gas pedal in the win. Just 2 wks ago, UT went into The Swamp w/a frosh QB and only lost by 14 and here at home, we think they can keep it well under the DD spread.

**FORECAST: TENNESSEE (+) Georgia by 4**

## OTHER GAMES

### Thursday, October 3rd

**Texas at IOWA ST** - The visitor has had little trouble in this series going 6-1 ATS and UT has won their last 3 trips here by 32 ppg. LY we used UT as a 3★ Key Selection on these pages and Darrell Royal, the HOF cch had passed away during the week and Mack Brown honored him by running the wishbone on the first play of the game. UT dominated with 609-227 yd edge and 31-15 FD edges. Thursday Nighters usually offer the same rest but Texas is off a bye, while Iowa ST is off a Thursday night road game facing Tulsa for the 3rd time in 16 gms. UT has the clear talent edges but Jack Trice Stadium can be a tricky spot for any tm.

**Wku at ULM** - The visitor is 4-0 ATS and has pulled outright upsets the L3Y. LY for the 1st time in SBC history, the game featured a matchup between 2 teams both getting votes in the Coaches Poll. WKU (-3) at home led 28-7 in the 2Q. ULM got a 31 yd td pass on the last play of the half on a Hail Mary for momentum to get back to 28-21. It was tied at 28 when WKU got a td w/2:29 left and ULM went 90/6 for a td with :31 left to force OT and ULM won it in 2OT's. ULM has the sked edge off a HG vs Tulane while WKU had to prep for the option (Navy) and is on a short week with travel. However, ULM is 4-9-1 ATS as a HF.

**Ucla at UTAH** - The home team has won all 4 outright but Utah has covered the L/3. LY Utah got a fortunate cover (+9), only losing 21-14. In an early key play, UCLA's PR Steven Manfro tried to field a punt over his shoulder at the 2 and fmbld' giving Utah a td. UCLA was in control leading 21-7 with 6:17 left when Utah went 90/10pl and got a td with 3:16 left for the backdoor cover. Both are off a bye and both have powerful offenses as the Bruins are avg 53 ppg and 602 ypg while Utah avg 42 ppg and 505 ypg. Winner here takes an early step in the P12 South race.

### Friday, October 4th

**Byu at UTAH ST** - Agonizing series for the Aggies as they've lost 12 of 13 but have covered 5 straight with the last 3 gms being an upset and a pair of 3 pt losses. LY there were more punts than points with USt trying to sweep Utah and BYU for the first time s/94. Taysom Hill st'd for BYU and hit 24-36-235 (was also inj'd and OFY) but BYU (-6) only won 6-3 and USt missed a 38 yd tying FG with 7:47 left. BYU did miss 2 FG's and an xp and had a 380-243 yd edge. Both tms played L/Fri as BYU won 37-10 (-24) despite having 5 TO's while USt beat San Jose St 40-12 (-9). While the Aggies are on an overall 15-3 ATS run, those all came as a dog and now they are favored.

**Nevada at SAN DIEGO ST** - LY's meeting was the 5th ever and first s/04. UN trailed for only 4:17 the entire game. UN had a 325-107 yd edge mid-3Q with a 17-6 lead. However they all'd a 63/7pl drive and a FG on the last play. In OT, SDSt went for 2 and got it. Aztec starting QB Katz went down in the 1Q and Dingwell threw for 177 yds (3-0). Both tms come in off DD come-from-behind wins LW as Nev rallied from 12 pts down in the 4Q to beat AF 45-42 (-11) while SDSt rallied from a 16 pt 2Q deficit to beat NMSt 26-16 (-16) notching their first win on the ssn. This is the Aztecs 1st Friday night HG since 1998 and the winner here starts setting themselves up not only in MW play but also for a possible bowl.

### Saturday, October 5th

**NAVY by 7 over Air Force** - SEVEN upsets the L10Y with the dog 8-1-1 ATS (visitor 5-1-1 ATS). 3 of the last 4 have gone to OT. LY Navy led 10-7 at HT but was outgained 261-128 as AF missed a 27 yd FG and had 3 straight TO's (all fmb). Down 21-13, Navy went 75/6pl w/6:35 left for a td (2pt) to force

OT. Navy got a td and held AF on 4pl for the win. AF is in 3rd away in 4 weeks and off 4 straight conf games while Navy is off Delaware, a bye and WKU. LW the Mids came in 2-0 and were up 7-3 over WKU when QB Reynolds was KO'd (CS) in the 2Q. They went scoreless the rest of the way managing just 162 yds in the 19-7 loss (-3). AF, down to their 3rd string QB due to inj and susp, found themselves up 42-30 in the 4Q at Nev but all'd 15 pts in the L/6:00 in the loss. QB Roberts did manage 161 rush (7.0) and 2 td's. While Navy has the better tm, the series says go with the visitor and the dog. With Navy QB Reynolds ? as of presstime we'll pass for now and see where Vegas tells us to lean.

**IOWA by 1 over Michigan St** - Iowa is 7-4 SU and 9-2 ATS in this series with 4 outright upsets but the visitor is on a 3-1 SU/ATS run. LY Iowa trailed 13-6 in a def struggle but went on an improbable 68/9pl drive getting a 5 yd td run w/:55 left to force OT and won it there. The Hawkeyes had a bye the week prior and this year it's MSU who has the bye (2-5-1 ATS) and is traveling. The Spartans look very similar to LY's tm as the D (#4) continues to carry the off (#90) and the D has scored 4 of MSU's 7 td's vs FBS opp. In their L/g several ? Pl pen set up both of ND's td's. Dantonio will continue to go to QB Cook here who does have a 5-0 ratio in his 2 starts. Thru 5 gms, Iowa looks like they are back to playing Hawkeye FB under Ferentz as they are big, strong and physical on both sides of the LOS while QB Ruddock has been efficient w/play action. LW they punched Minny in the mouth w/a 246-30 rush yd edge in the 23-7 win (-2). This will be a throwback gm epitomizing the "3 yards and a cloud of dust" B10 mantra of the 60's and 70's. With 9 of the last 10 being decided by a td or less, we expect more of the same.

**Louisville by 31 over TEMPLE** - LY in their first meeting s/06, TU's campus was shutdown Mon and Tue due to Hurricane Sandy and the Owls were without their starting C Sean Boyle. True frosh Kyle Friend, a RG, had numerous blown snaps which cost TU. UL led 45-17 after 3Q's and Bridgewater sat the 4Q and UL had a 508-309 yd edge. UL is off a bye after their 72-0 (-42) demolition of FIU sitting at 4-0 SU/2-1-1 ATS. While Bridgewater and the offense (#18) get most of the attention, the D (#9) is allowing just 7 ppg (#1 in FBS) and their 221 ypg all'd is 161 ypg less than what their opp are avg. LW winless Temple had no business being a td plus favorite traveling across country in the unique Kibbie Dome and we made the Vandals our Underdog POW on these pages. ID gave us another outright winner as they won 26-24 dropping the Owls to 0-4 SU/1-3 ATS on the yr. While UL has a big gm vs Rutgers on Thur, they are 12-4-1 ATS on the road under Strong.

**TOLEDO by 24 over Western Mich** - Underdog has now covered SEVEN straight by an AMAZING 20 ppg with 5 outright upsets incl LY. WM gave Tyler Van Tubbergen the start as Carder was inj'd and while he hit 26-46-246 he, to no surprise, had 3 int. It was 17-0 before WM even had a FD LY in an embarrassing 37-17 home loss (-1). LTH these 2 combined to set 4 MAC records incl most yds (1439), plays (183), td's (18) and points (129). The game was tied at 14, 21, 28, 35 and 49 but Toledo then broke serve and won 66-63 (-12). WM is playing their 3rd away in 4 weeks and already took on 3 B10 teams on the road. You have to wonder if WM is now reconsidering their firing of Cubit LY as while he is thriving in his new job as OC at Illinois, WM is floundering under new HC Fleck at 0-5 after their 32-14 loss (+1) to Kent LW. QB TVT is very erratic comp just 45% of his passes w/a 3-9 ratio. UT is off a huge gm in MAC West play, a 31-24 (+1) loss to Ball St where it was tied twice in the 4Q. It was the Rockets 1st non-cover of the year. RB Fluellen did have 129 yds (4.8) and should have a field day here vs a WM D all'g 254 rush ypg (5.2). Series says go w/dog but look for UT to get their 4th str overall win in the series.

**BUFFALO by 17 over Eastern Mich** - EM is a perfect 5-0 vs UB going 4-1 ATS incl 3 straight covers. Bulls went 0-2 ATS as a MAC HF LY losing to Kent (Oliver inj'd) and beating Miami, Oh 27-24 (-3). Buffalo is at home for 3rd straight gm with a bye 2 weeks ago but are off the all-important HG vs Conn. Many of you must be calling our comp tapes every day as LW we released Buf (+2) as our NC Sports Comp Underdog POW (free on button #3 on Tue at 347-677-1700) and they were favored the next day. While the line moved back in Conn's favor by gametime, it didn't matter as the Bulls crushed the Huskies 41-12 giving them their 1st win over a BCS schl s/02. While you would think EM has the situational edge, they are 0-4 SU/ATS off a bye the L4Y. In their L/g vs Ball St, despite a 51-20 defeat, the gm was a bit misleading as EM had 416 yds but were -3 TO's. Despite HC English taking over the D TY, they are still struggling vs the run all'g 209 ypg (6.0) and that isn't good news going up against one of the MAC's best RB in Oliver who had 110 total yds LW. With lowly WM and UMass on deck, it's time for the Bulls to string together some wins.

**ALABAMA by 52 over Georgia St** - Previous Bama HC Bill Curry started the Georgia St program but retired this past season. These two met late in '10 and it was 7-7 early but Bama (-45) rolled to a 63-7 win. Saban went 8-1 ATS vs non-conf opp in '09-'10 but has gone 5-6 ATS the L3Y. Against the 5 non-AQ teams the L3Y, Bama is 1-4 ATS as the D plays lights out, but he puts away the off (Kent St 48-7 -39, N Tex 41-0 -47, WKU 35-0 -38, FAU 40-7 -49 and CST -39, 31-6). After a 1-10 ssn, the Panthers are 0-4 TY despite playing 3 FCS tms. They do have their 1st SBC game on deck and even off a bye, you have to think this is a paycheck gm. LW, we were shocked that the nat'l media and public were anti-Bama as the line plummeted throughout the week vs Ole Miss. We boldly went against that sentiment and took the Tide (-13) as a 3★ LPS and the champs rewarded us w/a dominating 25-0 win. Their D shutout and shutdown cocky Bo Wallace and the rest of the country as they certainly haven't forgotten how to play D in Tuscaloosa w/9 shutouts in the L/5 yrs (most in FBS). This line could be one of the largest TY and while Bama hasn't performed well covering huge spreads in non-conf action, we'll call for the 2nd straight shutout by this "much-maligned" defense.

**BOSTON COLLEGE by 14 over Army** - BC had won 5x but all prior to '07. LY BC was -7 on the road and Army pulled the outright upset 34-31 as a Big Dog POW (get your Big Dogs every week on your NC VIP Debit for just \$9). Army posted ssn highs (595 lt yds and 516 rush, 6.5). BC's Addazio beat Army twice at Temple incl his 42-14 in '11 and 63-32 LY (32 pt win his biggest, Temple 534 yds rush). BC was 1-7 ATS as HF but now are on a 3-1 ATS run while Army is 1-7 ATS as an AD. Both tms are off impressive performances as Army playing 3 hrs away from Ft. Hood (largest US military base) beat La Tech 35-16 (E) rolling up 414 rush yds and a 39:57-20:03 TOP edge. The gm was delayed twice for lightning. BC opened up a shocking 17-3 lead LW over FSU but a 55-yd Hail Mary td pass before the half gave FSU the lead as they went on a 35-3 run. The Eagles did manage 397 yds and QB Rettig threw 4 td passes. While both tms should be playing with confidence we like the fact that Addazio has prepped for the Knights each of the L/2 yrs w/great success.

**Central Mich by 4 over MIAMI, OH** - Only 3rd mtg s/07 with the teams splitting the previous two both at C Mich. LY it was a bowl elimination as both came in with 6 losses and while MU had a 434-386 yd edge, they had a couple of blown opportunities and lost by 14 on the road (+4). MU was int'd at the CM1 and SOD at the CM15 and int'd at the 9. CMU HC Enos finally will be going against someone he can outcoach as MU's Treadwell, while a nice guy, surely is not worthy of MU's "Cradle of Coaches" mantra as the RedHawks are now 0-4 SU/1-3 ATS after LW's 50-14 loss (+26) to Ill. While they did give up 600+ yds for the 3rd time TY, the anemic off "exploded" for 14 FD's and 250 yds. CM was equally as woeful LW as they found themselves down 38-0 after 3Q's to NC State before the off got 102 of their 259 yds and all of their pts in the 4Q. The Resistible force vs the Movable Object here but at least the Chips have shown some signs of life getting outgained by "only" 101 ypg while MU is getting outgained by 393.5!

**VIRGINIA by 7 over Ball St** - First meeting. These 2 HC's met in '08 and '09 as Lembo's Elon team lost to London's Richmond team both times incl the playoffs. Cardinals have knocked off 3 BCS tms in Lembo's 2Y (Indiana 2x and USF). UVA is off a trip to Pitt but at home are just 3-10-3 ATS the L3Y. Both tms are not in ideal situations as UVA is in an ACC sandwich while Ball St is in a Toledo/Kent sandwich and this is their 3rd road gm in 4 wks. LW the Cards picked up a huge MAC West win over UT 31-24 (-1), which should set up a huge shutdown vs NIU in Nov. After missing 2 gms, RB Edwards has scored 6 td's the L/2 wks. TD's are a rarity for the Cavs offense as excluding the gm vs a woeful VMI, they have scored just 3 in their 3 gms vs FBS tms. LW 2 crucial TO's set up short fields for Pitt as the 2 tms comb for 17 punts and 5 TO's in Pitt's 14-3 win (+5). UVA did botch a pair of 4th downs in Pitt territory in the 1H passing up chances for FG's. While Ball St's Wenning is avg 330 ypg (64%) w/a 9-3 ratio, he will be taking on our #5 pass eff D in all'g just 153 yds and 38%.

**FLORIDA ST by 20 over Maryland** - FSU has beat MD 6 in a row SU (4-2 ATS). LY FSU dominated even more than the 41-14 (-31) score indicates. They had a 226-27 yd edge in the 1H. FSU got a td with 5:27 left for the cover, 41-7, but FSU fumbled on 3rd and 3 with :37 left on MD and 2&10 got a 42 yd td pass with :25 left for the miraculous backdoor cover. The Terps are one of the MIP tms in the country TY, off to a 4-0 SU/ATS start after cashing a 4★ LPS vs WV 37-0 (-3) 2 wks ago. QB Brown is avg 262 pass ypg (66%) w/a 7-3 ratio and has 283 rush (6.3) and they are outscoring their foes by 30 ppg while outgaining them by 233 ypg. FSU was 3-0 ATS heading into LW but found themselves down 17-3 at BC before exploding for a 35-3 run in their 48-34 win (-23). The key play was a 55-yd Hail Mary td pass before HT as Winston continues to impress avg 262 ypg (74%) w/a 12-2 ratio. While Terps are certainly a "play-on" tm TY covering their gms by 17 ppg, the Noles are 6-0 ATS at home the L2Y when laying more than 14 w/an avg cover of 17 ppg.

**MIAMI, FL by 7 over Georgia Tech** - UM has won and covered 3x as a small fav and LY pulled the upset as a 13' pt dog (42-36 OT). It was a strange game. UM jumped out to a 19-0 lead after 1Q, then GT outscored UM 36-0 in the 2Q and 3Q and appeared in full control leading 36-19. UM which finished with 609-419 yd and 30-18 FD edges, went 91/7pl and got a td with :27 left to force OT. The Canes come in a 4-0 SU/3-1 ATS for the 1st time s/04 after LW's 49-21 (-16) win over USF. QB Morris, for 2nd wk in a row left w/an ankle inj (prob here) but his replacement Williams is 22-31-369-3-0 on the yr albeit vs weak competition. GT is off a Thur Night 17-10 loss (-7) to VT where their option offense was stuffed to the tune just 129 rush yds (3.1). QB Lee was a miserable 7-24-144-0-2. Ever since allg 472 rush (8.4) in a 51-24 loss to GT in '08, the Canes posted that "472" on their locker room and are 4-0 SU/ATS in the series winning by 16 ppg and we expect the Canes to make it 5 for 5.

**Clemson by 17 over SYRACUSE** - Dome might be new experience for some ACC teams but CU has played in one 3x the L2Y. Clemson is in between WF/BC, which sets up nicely, but Syracuse is off a bye and this is first ever ACC game as well as HC. Cuse started the ssn 0-2 and were struggling on week but new QB Hunt (7-0 ratio) has brought them new life in the L/2 gms albeit the one gm was vs weak FCS Wagner and the other outburst vs Tulane was aided by numerous Green Wave ST blunders. The Tigers are off a 56-7 beatdown (-28) of WF as they racked up a 573-222 yd edge. OC Morris thought QB Boyd had been playing tight recently and Boyd responded w/a 17-24-311-3-0 performance while adding 69 rush. Tms are 1-7 ATS in their first conf game when moving to a new BCS conf incl Pitt who got a rude awakening earlier TY vs one of the ACC's elite. **In 2009, we won a 5★ on Clemson in a 25-7 win (-7) over BC and in that same year we won another 5★ going against the Cuse at home, playing on a speedy tm from the south in USF (34-20, -6'). Will we go back to that winning formula here?**

**MARSHALL by 21 over Uta** - First meeting. Don't be fooled by the Herd's 2-2 record as they are avg 40 ppg and are outgaining their foes by 201 ypg. Their (#26) offense made quite an impression in their L/gm vs a Top 10 VT D managing 361 yds in terrible field conditions, which was 149 more yds than what Bama got. LW we easily cashed a 3★ Key Selection on these pages going against UTSA in their 59-28 (+2) loss to Houston and you have to wonder after that gm vs an in-state rival was tied at HT, if their balloon is burst here. LY the Herd were off a loss and a bye and they were a 4 pt dog at S Miss winning 59-24 (led 59-17, 629-329). Situation looks familiar (albeit at home) plus UTSA is on their 3rd away in 4 weeks making a unique road trip. The Herd thunder to a DD win.

**Oregon by 42 over COLORADO** - Their 2 P12 meetings have been no contest as UO is 2-0 ATS despite being a -31 pt AF and -47 at home. They have outgained the Buffs by an avg of 572-238. LY was your typical UO game as they jumped out to a 56-0 lead at half but with USC dead ahead, let up in the 2H and "only" won 70-14. In MacIntyre's L2Y at San Jose St they were a dog of 20+ 3x, losing to Stanford LY 20-17 (+24) but finishing w/a 287-280 yd edge, lost to Stan 57-3 (+29) but SU 3 td's were 13/1pl, 1/3pl and 39/1pl and lost to UCLA 27-17 (+21), although it was 17-17 mid-4Q. Oregon is a perfect 8-0 ATS as an AF covering by 9 ppg. The Ducks are off a 55-16 win (-37) over Cal. The gm was played in weather only a Duck would love as the 2 tms comb for 8 fmb (4 lost) in the 1H alone but UO did lead 41-3 as HC Helfrich sack Mariota and the str's for most of the 2H. The Ducks amazingly only had a 381-325 yd edge. Col, off a double bye due to the PPD Fresno gm lost to Oreg ST 44-17 (+11) LW getting outFD'd 29-14 and outgained 540-300. WR Richardson who came into the gm leading the country w/209 rec ypg was held to 70 (14.0). While the Ducks do have a big road trip to Wash on deck, there is only one way to go w/Ducks gms as they are on an 11-1 ATS run despite lines getting inflated each week.

**FLORIDA by 13 over Arkansas** - UF won the first 7 SEC matchups by 25 ppg. In their last meeting ('09) the Gators came in #1 but they trailed 20-13 in the 4Q. After a tying td UF went 69/14pl and got a 27 yd GW FG w/09 left. Bret Bielema welcome to the SEC as your 1st SEC road trip is to the Swamp. No welcome present from SEC with his 1st 4 vs A&M, Florida, SC and Bama. The Hogs are off a 45-33 loss (+14) to A&M as they welcomed back QB Allen (17-36-282-3-2) but couldn't keep pace w/A&M's high-flying off. RB Collins continues his run at SEC Frosh of Yr as he has 597 (6.0). He will find it tough sledding vs our #1 D as the Gators cashed as our 4.5★ LPS Totals GOM LW in a 24-7 win (-12) over KY. In his 1st career start QB Murphy comp his 1st 11 passes (1st QB to do so s/Bridgewater LY) and finished 15-18-156-1-1 while adding another td rush. Gators rode their RB Jones to 176 yds while the D held the Wildcats to just 173 yds. Both cchs will probably play it conservative here and look for another lower scoring gm w/the Gators moving to 4-1 before their big trip to LSU next wk.

**LSU by 6 over MISSISSIPPI ST** - This series has long been dominated by LSU as they are 20-1 SU (last MSU win '99) and 17-4 ATS. LY was a miracle cover for the Tigers. MSU was only outFD'd 22-21 and outgained 392-351 despite playing w/o their leading rusher Perkins. It was 30-17 and MSU drove 86/13pl. On 2nd and goal from the 9, they were not only int'd but it was ret'd 100 yds for a td with 1:13 left and LSU (-16) would cover 37-17. Great situation for Miss St. LSU is off a 44-41 loss (+3) to Georgia w/huge gm vs Florida on deck while Miss St is off Troy, a bye and with only BG on deck. While Mullen will go back to QB Russell here, you have to think Prescott will get plenty of action after impressing in his L/2 starts. LSU was on a 4-0 run as a conf AF but went 1-3 ATS LY and we have been impressed w/Miss St's D (#23), which is allg 128 ypg less than what their opp are avg TY.

**TULSA by 6 over Rice** - Rice had actually gone 5-1 SU/ATS in this series from '97-'02 but TU has dominated since going 9-1 SU but only 5-3-2 ATS. However, the ATS loss LY was explainable LY. TU was -21' at home but the big story was that QB Cody Green was a late scratch. TU was also w/o RB/KR Ter Watts with those 2 being the top 2 in tl offense coming into the game. Things looked bleak for TU trailing 28-21 when Ja'Terian Douglas took off on a 75 yd tkl breaking td run with 1:31 left to pull out the win. Tulsa is a disappointing 1-3 SU/0-4 ATS TY after LW's 38-21 loss (-2) to Iowa St. TO's and inefficiency from the QB spot continue to be the issue as Green was pulled and then reinstated. Rice also has QB issues as McHargue was only 7-25-69-0-1 and the Owls benefitted from +3 TO's in an 18-14 (-14) win over FAU. They were outgained 366-273. Blankenship lost his first 2 here as a conf HF but is 6-1 ATS since. Rice was 1-17 SU away from '09-'11 (5-13 ATS) but LY went 3-3 SU and 4-0 ATS as an AD. Winner here takes command in the CUSA West and keep in mind TU is off a bye and Thur night while Rice is off rival HOU and expended a lot of effort in LW's win.

**OKLAHOMA by 10 over Tcu** - This is only the second meeting s/'05 but alum will certainly remind Stoops that TCU upset the #7 Sooners in the ssn opener as a 25 pt dog in '05. LY OU was playing for its share of the B12 Title and was -5' on the road and did finish with a 22-11 FD edge but just 421-350 yds. OU missed a 42 yd FG with 2:40 left that kept TCU in the game. The Frogs drove down to the OU15 but on 4&13 they were SOD. They had a td called back on a hold 2pl prior. TCU is sandwiched by HG's vs SMU and Kansas while OU, is off ND and has Texas on deck! LW the Sooners jumped out to a quick 14-0 lead (thanks to 2 TO's and got revenge over ND 35-21 (-3)). QB Bell in his 1st road start was an efficient 22-30-232-2-0 and most importantly no TO's. TCU is off a very misleading gm vs SMU as they trailed 10-7 at HT. They benefitted from 5 SMU TO's and their L/2 scores were a 45-yd inside KR td and a 66-yd IR td. TCU may have caught some B12 tms off guard as they pulled upsets in 3 of 4 conf road games but no such occurrence TY as OU continues to impress.

**Cincinnati by 10 over USF** - Both teams off Miami but HUGE edge to Cincy as they are off Miami, OH and a bye while USF off ranked Miami, FL last week. UC is now 6-1 SU/ATS in this series with there being 5 outright upsets in that span and the Bearcats have gone 4-0 ATS here. LY USF was down to 3rd string Matt Floyd due to inj's and he hit 21-39-175 and it was 38' at game time with wind gusts and got colder as the night went on giving UC a large edge. New HC's but BCS Tuberville has plenty of BCS exp while this is first BCS conf game for Taggart. Bearcats are 3-1 SU/2-2 ATS outgaining their foes by 226 ypg while USF is 0-4 SU/1-3 ATS getting outgained by 93 ypg. LW's 49-21 loss (+16) to Miami was misleading as the Bulls got a 96-yd td drive in the final 3:00, while UM earlier fmb'd inside the Bulls 5 twice and missed a chip-shot FG. While the Bearcats should get the win, we fade them a bit here as they are 0-2 ATS already on the road TY.

**OKLAHOMA ST by 14 over Kansas St** - Interesting numbers in this series as the home team is 6-1 SU but only 1-3 ATS the L/4. There was also a 29.5 pt line shift as OSU was -21 in '11 and +8.5 LY. In that game OSU's only lead of the gm was 7-0. Twice the Cowboys cut the deficit to 7 but the entire 2H never got within SD. The L/3 gms in Stillwater, OSU has won by just 4, 2 and 7 pts. Gundy has brought a true home edge to Boone Pickens as OSU is 13-3-1 ATS as a conf HF. KSt is off a bye and while OSU was at WV they had a bye prior and have another after this gm. The Pokes should come in mad after getting upset LW 30-21 (-19) as they were outplayed from start to finish. Snyder is 13-4 ATS off a loss vs a conf foe as they dropped their L/gm to TX 31-21 (-6). OSU is 19-10 ATS prior to a bye but Snyder is 11-4-1 ATS in the series.

**Missouri by 7 over VANDERBILT** - LY VU travelled to MO for the first time s/'58. MO was w/o WR Green-Beckham, MLB Ebner and lost their top RB Murphy early on. The key injury was to QB Franklin. MO opened with a pair of 61/9pl drives but settled for a 31 and 28 yd FG's. VU did not have a FD yet MO only led 6-0 and lost Franklin for the game. Bkp QB Berkstresser hit just 9-30 and VU won 19-15 (+7). The Tigers are not only healthier but are also much improved from LY as they come in 4-0 after LW's 41-19 win (-21) over Ark St. After a slow start, they exploded for 21 4Q pts. Vandy is 3-2 after LW's 52-24 win (-20) over UAB. However, we feel their best gm might have actually come in the opening loss to Ole Miss as they walked thru the motions vs Austin Peay, were down 28-0 early vs SC and were up 10-7 in 2H vs feeble UMass. Both tms have played similar sked and while Mizzou is +153 ypg, Vandy is still +53 ypg and the Tigers have the talent edges (off #24-58 and def #40-52).

**MICHIGAN by 21 over Minnesota** - Mich is 21-1 SU in the series with their only loss coming at the Big House in '05. Mich has also covered the L5 in the series and has outgained Minn by 258 ypg in that stretch. LY Denard Robinson was inj and Devin Gardner got his first start and Minn dominated the 1Q getting 8 of their first 10 pass past midfield and they led 7-0 but the key play of the game was a Gardner 3&17 pass where he rolled out of the pocket and hit a 45 yd td w/7:42 left to tie it. Mich's final td came after recovering an onside kick with 5:17 left to win 35-13 (-10'). Minn QB Nelson std 3 road gms LY (Wisc, Ill and Neb) and went a comb 30-62 (48%) w/most of them drop-offs as he avg'd 95 ypg and 4.6 ypa. This is first "real" road game TY as the other was at New Mex St. LW Nelson was back in the line-up but the prev undefeated Gophers showed that they are a paper tiger as Iowa dominated them from start to finish incl a 246-30 rush yd edge. Mich is 5-3 as a B10 HF the L2Y but 4-0 ATS when fav by over 2 td's and they are fresh off a bye with the Gophers playing a 6th str week. If the Wolves can clean up the TO issues that have plagued them in their L/2 unimpressive wins vs Akron/Conn, then they should easily retain the Little Brown Jug.

**Ucf by 14 over MEMPHIS** - UCF won all 8 as CUSA members but the home team is 7-1 ATS incl 4 straight. LY UCF was -22 on the road but only won 35-17 and Memphis finished with a 361-351 yd edge. UCF went 73/13pl for a td to get ahead of the spread, 35-10 with 4:18 left but Mem went 57/12pl and scored with :39 left (backdoor). UCF just hosted South Carolina LW in what was one of the biggest HG's in schl hist. UCF jumped out to a 10-0 HT lead but SC rode their RB to 28 unanswered pts. The Knights did rally to within 3 but it was too late. UCF is 13-5 ATS off a SU loss. Mem comes in off a bye and this is Tigers first AAC game. Tigers went 4-0 ATS vs conf foes at home LY covering by 11 ppg and pulling 2 upsets. However, we feel UCF is a legit Top 25 team and remember a lesser Duke tm came in here already and beat the Tigers 28-14.

**SMU by 4 over Rutgers** - First meeting and this will be their only conf meeting as RU moves to the B10 next ssn. SMU is clearly battled tested as they've already faced 3 BCS Texas tms incl B2B away. While SMU lost all 3 of those gms, all of them were misleading finals as they are just -53 ypg but -5 TO's. LW was no exception as they led TCU 10-7 at HT but had a 2H meltdown as the Horned Frogs benefitted from 5 SMU TO's and got a 45-yd inside KR td and a 66-yd IR td. Rutgers meanwhile is off a bye (2-0 ATS rec ssn LY) and they went 3-1 ATS under Flood in conf away but this is a unique road trip for them (1344 miles) and they have the all-important gm vs LVille on Thurs. They also will be playing w/our RB James who has 573 (7.3) and 6 td's. **Back in 2009 we cashed a 5★ star on SMU as a HD vs Navy.** SMU was 6-1 ATS at home LY and are due to catch some breaks as we'll call for them to get the outright upset win.

**Fresno ST by 24 over IDAHO** - The Bulldogs won all 7 as WAC foes and the visitor has covered 5 straight. Fresno has the unusual B2B away with first at Hawaii and LY struggled on the 2nd of B2B AG but it was vs Boise. Derek Carr ply'd here in 2011 and had a 5-0 ratio as FSU won 48-24 (-3). LW the Bulldogs in a clear flat spot off the Boise win still raced out to a 42-3 lead over UH but like they did vs Cal Poly earlier TY, let their foot off the gas pedal and nearly lost outright 42-37 (-17). Carr came in w/ just 1 int all yr but threw 2. LW ID was our Underdog POW on these pages and they pulled the outright upset (+7) over Temple leading throughout. QB Chalich had by far his best outing yet going 26-43-310-1-0 while adding 106 rush (8.2). Idaho will certainly get most opponents "C" games but unfortunately Fresno has a bye on deck and LW's near collapse will have them focused.

**TROY by 9 over South Alabama** - LY it was South Alabama's first ever SBC game and this is an instate rivalry with the two 174 miles apart. The Jaguars were outgained 495-252 and outFD'd 28-13 in the 31-10 loss (+7). The teams combined for 9 TO's. Troy is only 3-11 ATS as a HF while USA covered both SBC away games when +20 or more, but went 0-2 ATS when it was under 20 LY. Both tms are off 7 pt losses to BCS tms. However, there is a big diff as USA was down 31-7 and it could have been 45-7 as the Vols were int'd twice in the RZ. Meanwhile Troy outFD'd Duke 29-21 and it was relatively close throughout. While we respect USA's L/3 gms (two outright upsets and a DD cover), we can't get over LY's domination.

**NEW MEXICO by 10 over New Mexico St** - The visitor is actually 4-1 SU and 5-0 ATS with 3 outright upsets the L4Y. LY NMST was -6' at home and NM snapped a 24 gm road losing streak with their last prev road win being vs NMST in '08. NM had a 394-334 yd edge and we gave them out as the free Big Dog POW on button #9 of the comp line. LTH when Martin was the OC, it was the ONLY time in the L5Y+ that NMST had over 500 yds on the road. LY NMST HC DeWayne Walker said, "It wasn't an all-out slaughter, just a methodical beating." Both tms come in off disappointing losses as NMST blew a 16 pt lead to SDSt while NM blew a 14 pt early lead and lost 56-42 to UNLV despite the gm being tied at 42 in the 4Q. NM is getting outgained by 94 ypg while NMST is getting outgained by 243 ypg. They have one common opp in UTEP as NM won 42-35 on the road while NMST lost 42-21 at home.

**Washington St by 3 over CALIFORNIA** - Leach was the HC at TT from '00-'09 and Dykes was his WR coach the F/5Y and co-OC for 2Y before moving to Arizona. Cal has won 8 str vs WSt with an avg score 35-14. LY Cal never trailed and in the 2H held a DD lead the entire way. Cal did cover the LTH (30-7, -9) but dropped the FIVE games prior ATS. Both these tms come in off blowout losses to the elite tms in the P12 as Wash St lost 55-17 to Stanford (+9) while Cal lost 55-16 (+37) to Oreg. Both games were played in wet conditions. The Cougars did lose their QB Halliday in the 2H of the gm (leg) and he is ? here. The home team (15-2 SU/14-3 ATS, 5 outright upsets) has won and covered 6 straight covering by 6 ppg. LY NCSU was the Coll 900 Marquee Play given out on Sat on the PPH (Saturday is the only day where you get 2 Marquees for the price of 1 on your NC VIP Debit). NCSU dominated with a 26-9 FD edge and 428-185 yd edge and clinched bowl eligibility. These tms look to be heading in opposite directions as Wake has struggled to a 2-3 start and they are now 1-4 ATS after LW's 56-7 (+28) loss to Clem. NC State, the wk prior (albeit at home) nearly pulled an outright upset over the same Tigers tm and LW pounded CM 48-14 (-23'). They are now 3-1 SU/ATS but while the off is avg 462 ypg, QB Thomas still only has a 1-5 ratio. It also must be noted that NC State is 0-12 ATS as a CAF losing outright 10 times! With that in mind, we'll side with the HD Deacons.

**STANFORD by 10 over Washington** - Stanford won and covered 4 straight prior to LY when (Thur night) SU led 13-3 late 3Q after a 40 yd IR td. SU all'd a 61 yd td run on 4th and 1 and a GW 35 yd td pass w/4:53 left (SU was int'd at W8 on final drive down 4). The Cardinal have taken revenge very seriously. When they lost as a fav or small dog of under 5 pts they are 5-0 SU/ATS the next season covering by 22 ppg! However, while Stan is 9-0 SU at home L2Y, they are only 2-6 ATS as a HF. Both tms have been very impressive to date (Stan L/2 wks) as UW is 4-0 SU/3-1 ATS and LW was an easy 4★ Key Selection winner on these pages beating AZ 31-13 (-9) as RB Sankey had a schl-rec 40 carries (4.0). They are outgaining their foes by 285 ypg. Stan is off a 55-17 (-9) beatdown of Wazzu as they racked up a ssn high 560 yds, which was 295 ypg more than what Wazzu was all'g coming in! Both tms offenses and D's rank in our Top 20 but we think the Cardinal play w/a chip on their shoulders after LY's upset loss.

**Northern Illinois by 10 over KENT ST** - NI is 7-0 SU/6-1 ATS failing only by 1/2 pt in the MAC Champ game LY. NI trailed 10-0 but into the 4Q led 27-13. Kent went 58/11pl to score w/44 left, then in the 2OT NI picked it off on 488. Kent is 7-3 ATS at home but 0-2 TY. NI is on it 3rd road game in 4 weeks while KSU is in their only home game in a 6 week stretch off LSU, Penn St and W Mich. LW the Golden Flashes officially welcomed back the return of AA Dri Archer as he accounted for 73 rush and 48 rec and naturally while the D was keying on him, that opened up lanes for Durham who had 154 yds (5.9) and 2 td in their 32-14 win (-1'). While NIU is a perfect 4-0 SU, it should be noted that they are -12 ypg! LW they crushed Purdue 55-24 (-4) becoming the 1st MAC schl ever to beat 2 B10 tms in the same ssn and their 31 pt MOV tied for the best ever for a MAC tm over a B10 tm. They did benefit from +4 TO's and were outgained 524-402. While both D's have struggled TY, NIU does have a massive off edge (#31-106) and have covered their L/5 MAC AG's by 15 ppg.

**Mississippi by 1 over AUBURN** - Ark St's '12 HC (Aub HC Malzahn) vs Ark St's '11 HC (UM HC Freeze). The HT is 4-1 SU and ATS. LY's 41-20 HC win was Freeze's 1st ever in the SEC and it snapped UM's 16 gm conf losing streak. UM finished with a 451-213 yd edge and leading 27-20 UM got a short pass to Scott who landed on an AU player, but wasn't down and he raced 56 yds for a td to make it 34-20. Tigers are 3-1 SU/2-2 ATS in Malzahn's 1st yr and in the L/gm vs LSU, a driving rain storm limited their offense in the 1H as they were held to 0 pts and 119 yds. In the 2H after the rain let up, they exploded for 21 pts and 318 yds and missed on a couple of other scoring opportunities. Ole Miss was on a 5-1 ATS run on the road but LW ran into a buzz saw in Tuscaloosa as QB Wallace and Co poked the Elephant and got stomped on as we cashed a 3★ LPS going against the Rebs in their 25-0 loss (+13') to the Tide. Wallace said he was going to score some pts, but he never clarified what team it would be for as he was responsible for a 2 pt safety. Auburn in a great situation off bye w/W Carolina on deck while Rebels are in a Bama/A&M sandwich. Freeze is 7-1 ATS off loss and it should be noted that Ole Miss is a much better tm than Miss St who outplayed Aub here 3W ago.

**SOUTH CAROLINA by 24 over Kentucky** - SC has taken charge of this series going 12-1 SU and is 8-4-1 ATS (3-1 ATS at home L/4). LY SC got a very fortunate push. UK led 17-7 at the half and had the ball at the SC10 but fmbld and by the time they rec'd at the 2 yd line with no time-outs they had run out of time. Still, a cover seemed far fetched with SC leading just 21-17 when UK was int'd with 8:47 left and the Gamecocks would take adv of several UK miscues down the stretch. SC is 6-2 ATS as an SEC HF, while UK was 2-10 ATS as an AD under Phillips. SC's only home game in a 6 week span after LW's 28-25 escape (-7) at UCF. SC found themselves down 10-0 at HT and w/QB Shaw KO'd (out for this gm as well) Spurrier went to RB Davis as the workhorse w/167 yds (6.4) and 3 td's. First "true" road gm for new HC Stoops and LW we easily cashed our 4.5★ Totals GOM on the UNDER in a 24-7 Florida win. It was the Gators 27th str win in the series as UK was outgained 402-173. SC does have a huge 3-gm SEC road trip on deck but should take care of business here.

**SOUTHERN MISS by 24 over Fiu** - First meeting. Both were bowl teams in '11 (SM 12-2, FIU 8-5) and both now have new HC's because of finishing 0-12 and 3-9 LY. While both of these tms are winless, they are major differences as FIU is 0-4 getting outscored 47-6 and outgained by 294 ypg. In their L/gm vs Louisville, the Panthers suffered their worst loss in schl hist 72-0 (+42) as they managed just 2 FD's and 30 yds. It got so bad in the 2H that a running clock was instituted, the 1st time that has happened in a FBS vs FBS gm s/03 (OU 77-0 over A&M). FIU does have an edge off a bye. LW SM travelled to the Blue Turf and was spanked 60-7 (+28). TO's continue to be the issue as they are -11 (dead last in the FBS). While SM is 0-4, they are "only" getting outgained by 91 ypg and new HC Monken needs a good win after road gms at Neb, Ark and Boise with a bye on deck.

**BOWLING GREEN by 27 over Massachusetts** - Only mtg was LY. Of UM's 15 drives, 11 of them resulted in 3kouts or TO's and were just 1-16 on 3rd down. It was BG's first shutout s/04 and first on the road s/01 in their 24-0 win (-18). Falcons are on a 9-2 ATS run as a fav after LW's 31-14 win (-15) over Akron. The gm was a bit misleading as Akron missed a 19-yd FG in the 4Q and BG marched down the field and got the frontdoor cover. The Minutemen off a bye, are 0-4 but had one of their more impressive performances since jumping up to the FBS LY in a 24-7 loss to Vanderbilt (+29'). They still, however, haven't settled their QB issues as Doyle replaced Wegzyn in the L/2 gms and while he comp 69% of his passes, they were for just 5.4 ypa. Falcons continue to "Roll Along" as the offense is fully capable of covering a larger number TY as they are avg 487 ypg under Johnson.

**UAB by 6 over Florida Atlantic** - Faced off from '08-'11 as non-conf foes with FAU winning and covering 3 of 4 incl pulling B2B upsets (+5 and +14). UAB has not been a HF often and in the L3Y they are 1-6 ATS vs FBS foes. FAU continues their amazing run as an AD as LW they covered vs Rice in an 18-14 loss (+14) moving their AD record under Pelini to 10-1 ATS. A week after QB Johnson put up 321 pass yds, Pelini shockingly went to frosh Hankerson to make his 1st career start and with FAU leading 14-12 late 4Q and driving, Hankerson was picked off and Rice capitalized w/a td 3pl later. Overall, FAU had a 366-273 yd edge but like the prev wk vs MT, TO's were the issue as they were -3. UAB comes in off a 52-24 loss (+20') to Vandy as QB's Brown and Perry comb for just 19-36. Look for UAB to buck FAU's streak.

**Texas Tech by 7 over KANSAS** - TT has won 6 in a row SU (3-1 ATS). LY KU ran for 390 yds, the most by a KU team in the B12 era and TT (-24) escaped at home in OT with a 41-34 win. KU surprised TT by running the speed option as they had only used it 5x prior in 230 plays. TT went 5-0 ATS as an AF the L2Y under Tuberville, but this is Kingsbury's first conf road game. While the Jayhawks have already topped LY's win total, there is still plenty left to be desired. QB Heaps is comp just 54% w/a 3-4 ratio while the run gm has avg just 109 ypg (3.2) vs FBS competition. TT is off to a 4-0 SU/3-1 ATS start and while the off gets

Tough to lay too many pts here as KU went 3-0 as a conf HD of a td or more covering by 6', 21' and 15 LY.

**East Carolina by 13 over MIDDLE TENNESSEE** - First meeting. EC under Holtz always made BCS Carolina gms the focus. While still important it seems McNeill knows the real goal is to win the conf. In the L6Y he's ply'd NC 4x, SC 2x and NCSU and while going 2-5 SU/3-4 ATS vs them he's gone 5-1 SU/ATS the following game covering by 11 ppg. Let's compare their 2 common opp this yr. EC dominated FAU in a 31-13 win as they pulled their str's late while MT was lucky to win 42-35 in OT (+3 TO's). They also both played NC w/EC dominating the Tar Heels LW 55-31 (+12') w/a 603-465 yd edge while earlier TY MT was trounced 40-20 getting outgained 377-243. EC in newer role of AF, is 2-1 the L2Y but MT has rolled over at home going 0-6 ATS as a HD the L4Y. EC has the talent edges (off #60-93, def #51-109 and ST's #20-76) and continue to roll here.

**Ohio by 10 over AKRON** - OU has won 5 str (1-3-1 ATS). LY Ohio was -20' at home and jumped out to a 20-0 lead in the 1Q. UA got to 20-14 but OU opened it back up to 34-14 after 3Q's. UA got a 60 yd td run with 8:48 left and then went 43/8pl for a td with 1:55 left but OU rec'd the outside kick and took a knee (34-28). Akron is 1-4 SU but is an improved tm TY. LW's 31-14 loss (+15) to BG was misleading as the Zips led 14-3 and then trailing 24-14 were lining up for a 19-yd FG and missed it while BG went down for a td and the frontdoor cover. OU is off 3 str wins and a bye with only CM on deck, so they should be focused. Bobcats' inj's LY showed ATS as they went 1-7 ATS vs MAC teams incl 0-3 ATS as an AF. However, that will not be the case TY as the Bobcats are healthy and have cashed 3 str gms. Make it 4.

**Arizona St by 4 over Notre Dame** - Arlington, TX. Last met in '99, a 48-17 (-12') ND win. These 2 HC's faced off in '11 as ND beat Pitt 15-12 (-7') and they also faced off in '10 w/Graham at Tulsa pulling the outright upset 28-27 (-8). ASU is off Wisc/Stanford and LW trailing USC 21-20 in the 3Q, they exploded for a 62-41 win (-4). The FD's were close at 25-22 but ASU benefitted from an inj to USC WR Marquee Lee and 4 Trojan TO's. ND is off 3 B10 tms and OU are the only tm in the country to be sitting at 0-5 ATS. LW 2 early TO's all'd OU to jump out to a 14-0 lead. Another key int came late in the 1H w/ND driving and OU scored right before the half to make it 21-7. QB Rees now has all 5 of his int's TY vs UM and OU and continues to play well vs mediocre tms (11-0 as str' when facing a tm that finishes w/6 or more losses) and is just 5-6 vs tms that finish w/less than 6 losses. Irish are 3-0 SU/ATS the L3Y playing at a reg ssn neutral game and 2 wks ago this line might have been ND -3.

**BAYLOR by 35 over W Virginia** - In LY's first series meeting the gm featured 133 pts, which were just 3 shy of the NCAA rec. Of the 19 scoring drives, 16 were under 3:00 and while both QB's have moved on to NFL, Bryce Petty (75%, 8-0) has filled the shoes for the Bears. The same cannot be said for the Mountaineers who have had 3 QB's start TY. However, FSU trans Clint Tridick was 24-50-309-1-2 LW in their 30-21 upset (+19) over OKSt. While it's his first road start here he did go into Clemson his Fr season and was 24-38 for 336 with a 3-1 ratio. Baylor's pass D is allowing 46% comp with a 2-5 ratio and it would be no surprise if the Bears put up a pick-6 (3 in F/3 gms). Do need to credit a W/D that allowed just 383 ypg and 19 FD/gm away from home vs OU and MD but this is against an uncharted offense. Baylor is the first team since 1930 to top 60+ in each of its first 3 games and there is no calling off the dogs under Briles as the Bears have covered 9 straight by 23 ppg and have covered their L/3 with revenge by 25 ppg.

**Louisiana Tech by 1 over UTEP** - Edge to LT HC Holtz who prepped for and beat UTEP in '11 (USF -29, 52-24) with many players back incl the Miners' leading rusher, passer and rec in that game. La Tech is playing away from home for the 3rd straight wk and vs Army in Dallas they were beat 35-16 (E) in a gm that featured 2 weather delays. The Bulldogs were forced work on their rush attack vs the option LW which benefits them here vs UTEP which has run the ball 60% of the time (178/300). UTEP is off a 59-42 loss (+13') at Cst as they fell behind 28-7 at HT before scoring 21 pts in the 1st 7:00 of the 3Q to tie. Eventually they wore down as the D is all'g 231 rush (6.1!). QB Showers did have a career-gm going 26-43-365-5-0. Both 1st-yr HC's need a win, and the tms are close talent wise. This one goes down to the wire.

**Ohio St by 10 over NORTHWESTERN** - While OSU is 28-1 vs the Wildcats (only loss in '04 in Evanston) they've covered 4 straight winning them by 43 ppg and covering them by 24 ppg. The **LTH we used Ohio St as our 2008 5★ College GOY and the Buckeyes were an 11 pt AF and won easily 45-10!** 4-0 SU/2-2 ATS NW is off a bye (HC Fitzgerald is 1-8 SU off a bye) while OSU is off their showdown vs Wisconsin but is 22-8-1 ATS on the road vs B10 and you should see plenty of Scarlet in the stands. LW we used the Bucks as our 4★ Top Weekly LPS and they won 31-24. It was 31-14 after 3Q's and QB Miller showed no rust going 17-25-198-4-0 and added 83 rush. While the situation favors NW, the Wildcats have not faced anyone near the talent level of the Bucks this year and we like the Bucks who are on a 5-1 ATS run away, to take care of business and show the Wildcats who reigns supreme in the Big 10.

**INDIANA by 3 over Penn St** - Penn St is now 16-0 all-time vs Indy but they have only covered 2 of the L/6. B10 opener for both while both teams are also off byes. Uplifting bye week for Penn St with the scholarship ban lightened. While the bye week will allow both teams to add wrinkles to their offenses, the Lions do have "true" Christian Hackenberg making his first ever B10 start and his first ever road start (fans 50/50 vs Syr in opener). The Hoosiers are moving in the right direction as under Wilson. They had 1 home win in '11 turned in 2 LY and TY the have 2 in 4 games with losses to a perennial bowl tm in Navy and a much improved Missouri squad. QB Sudfeld is avg 287 ypg (65%) w/an 11-5 ratio but was pulled for Roberson in the L/gm after tossing 3 picks. Indy has the off edge (#11-48) while Penn St has the def edge (#19-107). **LY we cashed our 5★ College GOY going against the Hoosiers as Wisc beat them 62-14 (-7). Will we flip the script and play on the much improved Indy tm this year?**

**HAWAII by 1 over San Jose St** - UH had won 9 of 10 SU but SJSU pulled the upset the L/mtg in '11, 28-27 (+6). SJSU went 6-0 ATS away LY incl 4-0 ATS as an AF but TY's tm is reeling after a 1-3 start and B2B blowout losses. LW they were their star WR Grigsby to inj 2 wks ago and LW saw their star DB Benwikere carted off the field. They still have QB Fales who is avg 299 ypg but is comp just 58% of his passes w/a 5-6 ratio after comp 72.5% LY. While the Warriors are 0-4 SU TY, they are 3-1 ATS despite playing 4 bowl tms from LY. LW they fell behind 42-3 to Fresno but scored 34 pts in 13:00 under the direction of QB Schroeder who threw for 321 yds in 1.5Q's of action. His final Hail Mary pass at the end was int. We think that rally will carry over to this week and we will call for them to pull the outright upset.

## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ New Orleans by 7 over CHICAGO** - NO is coming off their Monday Night'r and they've covered 3 straight the week after. At some point the Saints emotions will run dry in this season of redemption but it won't come this week versus an NFC div leader. All the Saints talk has centered around the reunion of Payton and Brees while new DC Rob Ryan keeps dialing up defenses which has held its first 3 opp's to 296 ypg and 16 FD/gm. Some may be impressed with the Bears offense avg 32 ppg but much of that has been on big plays incl 2 last week leading to 97 yards. Excluding the Minnesota game, Chicago has been held to 17 FD/gm meaning teams will play bend but don't break D forcing the mistake prone Cutler (25-17 ratio L2Y) to beat them. On the flip side the Bears defense is allowing 65% comp vs Dalton, Ponder, Big Ben and Stafford and now must face Drew Brees who has avg'd 351 ypg & 68% excl the rain soaked TB game. If NO's covered Monday then Payton & Brees have gone 15-1 ATS and if they are off a loss the duo has covered 6 straight.

**3★ CLEVELAND by 10 over Buffalo** - The similarities between these 2 franchises is eerily similar. In the past 5 seasons Buffalo has finished last in their div each year while Cleveland almost matched them finishing last all but once. Both also have not finished in the upper half since '07 when they finished 2nd. Now both have new HC's and are off to 2-2 starts. The Browns dropped a home game vs Buffalo LY (+3, 14-24) getting outgained 340-244. TY is however another story as Cleveland's D has shown they are a top 10 worthy holding their first 4 opponents to 292 ypg incl Cincy to 266 LW. The short winning streak coupled with their first primetime home game since upsetting the Steelers as a DD dog in 2009 will have the Stadium rocking. The Bills rookie QB Manuel makes his 2nd road start and has to prep for this defense which has totaled 14 sacks on a short week. Buffalo has a new staff but the Bills players are not accustom to winning as a road dog going 1-13 SU and 3-10-1 ATS covering only as a 9+ pt dog vs a pair of foes and one game in OT.

## OTHER SELECTION

**2★ Carolina by 7 over ARIZONA** - Prior to the bye the Panthers posted their first shutout since 2008 and it must be noted teams that earn a shutout prior to their bye are 0-7 SU/ATS losing by a 25-19 avg score being outgained by 75 ypg. The bye week however came at an opportune time for CAR as a mobile Newton will help alleviate the man-to-man coverage the Cardinals prefer while giving him time to work with new WR Ginn (6 rec, 22.2, 2 td's L2/gms). He along with Smith (14, 10.1, 1 td), LaFell (7 rec, 9.4, 2 td L2/gms) and TE Olson (16, 12.1, 1 td) give Newton options he was unaccustomed to. LW's results also give some very good value vs ARZ as while they stayed out on the East Coast all week to acclimate to the humidity they only outgained TB by 43 yds. TB's rookie QB masked the fact that ARZ lost 3 OLB's to IR LW (get stud LB Washington back from susp here) and that's a great matchup vs CAR run game vs an overrated #16 Def giving up 3rd Dn conversions at 40% TY. Add in the fact ARZ lacks a run game (79 ypg 3.6) and we'll take the road team here.

## OTHER GAMES

**Kansas City by 3 over TENNESSEE** - Dick Vermeil was the HC the last time KC started 4-0 in 2003. It wouldn't be a surprise to see KC flat to start this week after 3 straight former HC Reid rivals but the players and fans are reenergized with this start. Alex Smith finished with 2 int's but behind a D that only allowed 11 FD's they could afford to extend the playbook and throw deep. Tennessee is home for a 3rd straight with B2B wins but did lose QB Locker. When Fitzgerald took over early in the 3Q the Titans had a 24-6 lead thanks to 3 first half Jets TO's and while he completed a 77yd TD he was 2-7 for 31 yds the rest of the game. The Titans D however has been extremely aggressive with 14 sacks already this season and 11 qbh LW. One way to stop the pass rush is by running the ball and that is the reason we'll lean KC. The Chiefs have topped 100+yds rushing all 4 games (121 ypg, 4.1) allowing for a successful play action package while the D has only allowed a league leading 22% on 3D conv now facing a qb making his first start for this franchise.

**Baltimore by 6 over MIAMI** - This is an interesting spot for Miami off their 1st MNF game in almost 2 years with a bye on deck (0-3 ATS). They host LY's Super Bowl champ either being an incredible 4-0 or more likely 3-1 but they are still on top of or tied for the AFC East. The reality is however that Miami is 3-0 yet they are -12 FD/-53 ypg prior to NO. Baltimore's offensive game plan was a complete mystery LW in their loss to Buffalo rushing only 9 times all game despite leading early in the 2Q and trailing by only 6 points in the 3Q. Flacco imploded under the Bills pressure getting sacked 4 times with 12 qbh and that was with BOTH Bills CB's and a starting safety missing the game! We won't throw Flacco in the trash yet because excluding his rookie season he has NEVER tossed more than ONE int in B2B games and after throwing 2 or more in a game (only 8 times) he has thrown for 63% with a 13-1 ratio!

**ST LOUIS by 16 over Jacksonville** - The Jaguars offense totaled NINE points the first 10 Q this season and got some fans excited by putting up 17 2H pts vs Seattle in garbage time. They got Gabbert back LW and he "led" his team to 3 FD's and 69 yds at HT. The Jag's do get back #1 DC Blackmon (#1 w/64 rec LY) back from susp which will free up Shorts who has had an amazing 13 targets/gm with MJD still not 100% (35 ypg, 2.4, long of 10 yds). The schedule makers added to their misery as in their current 5 week stretch they had trips to Oak, Seattle, here at St Louis and Denver next week. St Louis has extra prep time off of a Thursday loss vs SF but the Rams have not been a DD fav since 2004 although Fisher went 3-0 ATS in that role at Tennessee. STL is also the first team to be a DD fav after losing SU as a HD since Jacksonville did so vs SF back in 2005 (failing to cover as 15.5 pt HF). Jag's HC Bradley familiar with the Rams while the Seattle DC but until they score a non-qbq td we can't back them. The question then becomes can you trust St Louis to cover a DD spread when they've won 4 games as a fav in the L6Y and only one the L3Y failing to cover their ssn opener TY? Jax is that bad.

**New England by 6 over CINCINNATI** - This is Belichick's 1st crack at Andy Dalton and this is the 1st realistic chance that TE Gronkowski makes an appearance. NE's defensive rebuild which started in 2011 is finally bearing fruit as prior to ATL they had the #9 def and while they didn't exactly play elite QB's prior to Ryan their 50.5% comp rate and 5.8 def ypa allowed are very impressive. While Cincinnati has tons of potential they are inconsistent as shown by blowing a 21-10 pt lead vs Chicago, a 14-0 lead vs GB and could muster only a pair of FG's vs Cleveland. The Bengals secondary can also be exposed as they are allowing 61% comp (incl 66% LW to Hoyer) and they've only played one QB in Brady's league (Rodgers) allowing the Packers 27 FD's. NE holds the technical edges as they're 19-6 away, 18-5-2 ATS as a dog and 6-0 ATS if on a 2nd of B2B away if off a loss.

**Seattle by 2 over INDIANAPOLIS** - IND has the situational advantage off a relaxing trip to Jacksonville while Seattle is on their second straight away off a physical battle vs HOU. The Seahawks expended a great deal of energy with a comeback win vs HOU and the D allowed 476 the most since 2010. SEA came into this season going 1-4 ATS as an AF in Carroll's first 3 years and while they are 2-0 SU/ATS TY those wins were by 5 and 3 points in OT and in fact they've not won a road game by over 6 points the last 10 games. Many will discount Luck's performance vs JAX (as well they should) but remember just 2 weeks ago he went into SF and threw for 65% with no interceptions. The Colts stepped it up last year not only going 4-0 ATS as a HD but winning all 4 outright and covering by 9 ppg. Living in the Great Northwest may get you an incredible cup of coffee but it also means that your road trips are lengthy and in the past 3Y when the Seahawks are on the second of B2B away games they've been outscored 23-16.

**GREEN BAY by 3 over Detroit** - Since 2007 Div HF's that lost prior to their bye are 5-9 SU/4-10 ATS when they return. The difference here is that you have elite veteran QB as GB has covered 7 straight after a bye. The Packers also matchup well winning 4 straight vs the Lions and the home team has covered 4 straight. In fact the Pack has now gone 10-2 ATS vs the NFC North the L2Y incl 6-0 ATS

at home. Detroit took care of business LW giving the Bears their first loss as they finally had all their playmakers back. Reggie Bush rushed for 139 (7.7) while adding 34 (8.5) rec, opening the middle for TE Pettigrew (7-54). On the defensive side of the ball Louis Delmas had 2 int's, Suh played smart (2 sks, 2 tfl, 2 qbh, 1 FF) and Fairley returned after missing a couple of games scoring a TD. We'll grab the points vs Rodgers who was sacked 8 times the last 2 games and with a D that will leave the back door open allowing 404 ypg so far this season.

**NY GIANTS by 1 over Philadelphia** - There is an immense amount of pressure for Coughlin esp with Giants fans used to the winning ways. Starting 0-4 SU/ATS is inexcusable in NY but losing to a pair of teams that totaled 9 wins LY by a combined score of 69-7 has Jim Lee Howell turning over in his grave. The dog is 4-1 ATS in the series with the only loss coming in LY's season finale where the Giants thrashed PHI 42-7 as 6' pt HF's. In Eli's L5 vs PHI he's avg'd 265 ypg (75%) w/a 16-3 ratio but back to the present the L2W he's hit 50% with a 5.6 ypa. The Giants have built their defense around size which is a poor matchup for the Eagles quick paced offense. The Eagles however are feeling the effects of their supersonic tempo as the D is allowing 28 FD's/gm (Saints historically bad D all'd 24 per/gm LY) and that will be magnified playing a second straight away with the first being in altitude. The Giants may have already played themselves out of the playoffs but the disciplinarian Coughlin will not be embarrassed at home versus a new hotshot college HC and a division foe.

**San Diego by 3 over OAKLAND** - The dog has not only covered an amazing 8 straight in this series they've pulled the upset 5 of the L6 meetings. While HC McCoy deserves a ton of credit for getting Rivers to play up to his level despite a bad OL and missing top WR Floyd for the #7 Off their #30 Def is a surprise esp since its the same DC/system as LY. SD has allowed over 70% comp in 2 games TY and their only int came all the way back in Wk 1. They have very little pass rush with just 8 sks (WAS had 7 vs OAK LW) which is good for OAK as Pryor is expected back here. There is a question if McFadden (hamstring) or all purpose FB Reece (knee) will return. OAK had a chance to keep LW's game within 1 score but Allen went for it on 4th&1 on the WAS 17 w/3:32 left instead of a sure FG costing them the game. We'll call for the dog here as SD's defense can't be trusted and the series history.

**DALLAS by 3 over Denver** - This is a good situation for DAL getting the Broncos off a MNF game followed by a track meet vs PHI. One of the quieter surprises of 2013 has been the improved play of Romo 238 ypg (72%) 8-1 who has only been sacked 9 times in 152 att's TY in a streamlined offense. Romo has been able to spread the ball with 3 rec's having 21 rec's though the status of Austin (hamstring) is unknown here. DEN's 4-0 mark has been vs BAL opening on the road in a hostile game, the injury depleted Giants, talent lacking Raiders and an Eagles def still integrating 4 new starters. While Peyton looks unstoppable remember his only road gm TY was vs the #23 D of the Giants and LY he posted a 22-3 ratio at home but only 15-8 away. The Cowboys have only been a non-div HD TWICE since the opening of Jerry World in 2009 and may have been caught looking ahead blowing a 21-10 lead LW.

**Houston at SAN FRANCISCO** - Neither team anticipated being 2-2 at this point and the loser certainly didn't expect to have a losing record after 5 games. SF has extra time off a Thursday win and is 12-4-1 ATS as a HF while Houston just outgained Seattle 476-270 which is the same team San Fran was outgained against 290-207. Sunday Night Marquee!!

**NY Jets at ATLANTA** - When is a Monday Night game not one you circle? That would be if it is played the week after hosting New England on NBC. In the last 3 seasons the Falcons have only beaten 1 of the 6 AFC teams they have hosted by over 6 points. The Jets are off a very misleading game vs Tennessee as they allowed TD drives of 18, 26 and 46 yards while also giving up a defensive TD. Will Ryan come up with a game plan to slow Ryan and company or will the Falcons cash another at home?
