4★ WISCONSIN over Northwestern - Home team is 5-0-1 ATS s/03. UW did win the L/meeting (-10) by a 70-23 margin. NU came into the gm w/o its starting QB/RB (83% of offense) and moved the ball but had 7 TO's (school rec 273 KR yds). Huge situational edge to UW who is off a bye while NW is off huge HG vs OSU. The two tms each played OSU in their L/gms and each came up short in the 4Q. LW NW played valiantly in a 40-30 loss (+6). They led 23-13 early in the 3Q but late in the gm succumbed to OSU's rush attack as they were outgained 248-94 on the ground. A FR in the EZ on the final play made many OSU backers happy incl ourselves as we had a 4★ LPS on OSU. After such a tough loss, you have to question what the Wildcats mindset will be here travelling to take on an angry Badgers tm who has 2 close losses already TY and can't afford another if they want their BCS hopes to remain alive. Their vaunted run gm with a healthy RB Gordon off a bye will wear down the Wildcats late just like what OSU did.

FORECAST: WISCONSIN by 20 over Northwestern

3★ Nebraska over PURDUE - Second all-time meeting; NU was shutout 28-0 in 1958. Nebraska is 2-5-1 ATS in B10 away gms. Purdue has had just 4 regular season byes s/03 going 3-1 SU but 1-3 ATS. The Huskers should also be well rested off FCS, bye and Ill w/a bye on deck. LW they were playing w/o QB Martinez for the 2nd str gm and it didn't matter in a dominating 39-19 (-7) win over Ill cashing another 4★ Key Selection on these pages. RB Abdullah had a career-high 225 (11.3) while QB Armstrong was an efficient 8-13-135-2-0. The much-maligned D also had its best performance on the ssn holding Ill 107 yds under their ssn avg. 1-4 PU comes in off a bye after B2B blowout losses. In their last gm vs NI, PU took the RS off highly-touted QB Etling. The 31 pt loss was misleading as they had a 524-402 yd edge but 5 TO's sealed their fate. NU QB Martinez should be back for this gm and you have to think w/this being the 1st trip here s/58, that Husker Red will be prominent in the stands.

FORECAST: Nebraska by 21 over PURDUE

3★ HOUSTON over Memphis - Houston has won 3 straight but just the 3rd meeting in 7Y. The L/2 meetings ('09 & '10, UH -23 H, -14 A) are eerily similar as the Tigers scored 14 and 17 pts while they all'd 55 and 56 pts and Houston scored td's in 8 of their F/9 drives in both games. The Cougars come into this game off a bye (crushed Rice LY in that role under Levine) while Mem is off UCF. The Tigers thought they had a big upset LW but they squandered a 17-10 lead in the final 2 min and couldn't overcome a -4 TO deficit. They did have 25-16 FD and 397-270 yd edges against a very good UCF tm. The Cougs have become a favorite of ours TY already cashing two 3★ Key Selections and LPS as they are a perfect 4-0 SU/ATS. It should be noted that this gm will be played in the Houston's Pro Soccer stadium as UH plays HG's in 3 diff venues TY. UH is 10-3 ATS as a HF while Mem is 2-23 SU on the road. We think Mem will have a hangover from LW's gm while the Cougs are fresh and ready to match LY's win total already. Make it 3 straight Key Selection winners on UH!

FORECAST: HOUSTON by 17 over Memphis

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Alabama over KENTUCKY - The Tide have won 4 straight in the series (2-2 ATS) with the last meeting in 2009. Bama is 14-7 ATS in SEC road games. In '08 & '09 Bama was ranked #2 and #3 in their games and UK lost by only 3 and 18 (1-1 ATS). UK is 1-2 SU (2-0-1 ATS) at home vs top 10 tms the L3Y beating #10 SC and losing by 3 to #8 Auburn. UK is off losses to UF and SC (rallied LW to only lose by 7) and you have to wonder how much they have left in the tank as this is the 4th top 20 tm they have faced already this yr. They have only lost to the other 3 top 20 tms by an avg of 9 ppg. However, the Crimson Tide are a different animal as in the L/3 yrs, they have been a road fav of 20+ 6x's and have covered all 6! Coming off a HG vs Georgia St (won 45-3, -55, vanilla gm plan, played bkps) and Ark on deck, Bama should have enough focus. Roll Tide.

FORECAST: Alabama by 35 over KENTUCKY

2★ ARKANSAS (+) over South Carolina - The HT is 5-1 SU/ATS in this series incl LY's home win for SC (38-20, -14). While they were outFD'd 22-20 in the game, SC forced 3 TO's incl a 69 yd IR td. 3rd game of the toughest 4 gm stretch in CFB TY as Ark is off A&M and Florida and has Bama on deck while playing for a 7th str week. They did manage 275 yds vs UF LW which was actually the most all'd by the Gators all ssn. SC is off a bye, UCF and UK, but starts a tricky 3 gm road stretch. LW we expected them to handle UK w/ease but after a leading 21-0 in the 2Q, UK actually outplayed SC for the rest of the gm. Naturally all week long, they will be dealing w/the distractions of AA DE Clowney deciding not to play LW. This is probably the most winnable of the 4 gm stretch for Ark and w/series history here, we'll favor the HT.

FORECAST: ARKANSAS by 3 over South Carolina

Thursday, October 10th

Rutgers at LOUISVILLE - UL has now won 3 in a row SU/ATS in this series. LY RU (-3) was at home in a game for the BE Title. QB Teddy Bridgewater gave a remarkable performance. He had a broken wrist, a sore ankle but he came in the gm in the 2Q with the team down 7-0 and hit 20-28-263 in the 20-17 win. UL is off a bye and a 30-7 win (-32') over lowly Temple cashing as a 3★ LPS Totals on the UNDER, which we gave out FREE on button #3 last Sat (347-677-1700). Rutgers meanwhile is off a trip to SMU where we cashed our Oct 5★ GOM against them. They are now travelling west again on a short week but Rutgers is 23-11-1 ATS as an AD.

San Diego St at AIR FORCE - LY the Aztecs (-7) were outgained 393-268 but forced 4 TO's leading to 21 pts in their 28-9 win. AF was inside the SDS29 6x incl at the 4 and 15 and came away with just 3 pts. The Aztecs are travelling off a Fri Night 51-44 OT win (-6) over Nev while AF is back home after a 28-10 (+13) loss to Navy (0-3 ATS L/3 yrs but 7-1 ATS prior to that in gm after Navy). Rocky Long knows how to defend the option and its 4-0 ATS in this series here, but they are only 3-9-1 ATS as an away fav.

Arizona at USC - USC is 8-2 SU in this series but Ariz is 7-1 ATS and there have been 3 outright upsets the L4Y incl LY. LY Marquee Lee set a P12 rec w/345 yds receiving and Matt Barkley set a schl rec with 468 yds passing vs Ariz in '11 and topped that with 493 LY. The Trojans had a 395-285 yd edge at the half and led 21-13 and opened it up to 28-13, but Ariz got a td w/10:46 left to take the lead 32-28 and held on for a 39-36 win (+6). The Trojans are 22-10 ATS off a bye (incl bowls) but do have ND on deck (9-12 ATS) while this is only Arizona's 2nd gm s/Sept 14. We did win our 1994 College GOY in this series with USC (-3) rolling to a 45-28 win. Will USC rally around interim HC Orgeron or will AZ step on the Trojans neck?

Friday, October 11th

Temple at CINCINNATI - UC is 3-0 SU but the visitor is 3-0 ATS in this series. TU's last trip here was in '03 when UC won 30-24 (-13). LY UC gave Brendon Kay his first start at QB and he hit 13-21-244. Kay directed UC on scoring drives of 74, 75, 80, 94 and 71 yds. UC led 24-3 at the half and won 34-10 (-9) with a 472-267 yd edge. Both tms come in off losses as 0-5 TU lost to UL 30-7 (+32') and UC couldn't overcome 4 TO's and a blk'd FG ret'd for a td in a 26-20 loss (-11') to USF. While UC is clearly the better tm, Temple is a dangerous dog at 9-4 ATS.

† Oklahoma by 7 over Texas - Dallas. UT is 4-9 SU and 3-8-1 ATS in the Red River Rivalry. OU won 5 in a row from '00-'04 then Texas won 4 of the next 5 SU. OU, however has retaken control of the series not only winning the last 3 but doing so by an avg of 30 ppg. LY OU had a 407-65 yd edge at the half and took its starters out midway thru the 4Q. UT generated 2 late td's incl 1 with no time left in the 63-21 final where the Sooners were only -3. The team that turns it over the fewest times is now 13-1 and the winning team in this series is now +35 in TO's. OU comes in 5-0 after LW's 20-17 (-8) win over TCU as the OU D continues to impress not all'g a FD until the 8:34 mark of the 3Q while also dominating the LOS avg 246 rush ypg (5.3) and QB Bell has yet to throw an int all yr. UT, on the other hand, has struggled to a 3-2 start but is still 2-0 in B12 play after LW's 31-30 (-7) escape at ISt where they got a 44-yd Hail Mary td pass before HT and also a 1-yd td run w/5:1 left after 2 near fmbls. QB McCoy started in place of Ash for the 2nd consec gm (head, CS). We expect the Longhorns to play their best gm of the season.

MICHIGAN ST by 14 over Indiana - Michigan St is 8-1 SU & 7-2 ATS vs the Hoosiers (no less than 30 pts in any win until LY). However, the Spartans are just 7-15 ATS as a B10 HF and are on a current 0-8 ATS run as a HF. Since Indy upset MSU here in '01, the Spartans have won their 4 series HG's by 28, 31, 28 and 52. LY MSU trailed 17-0 then 27-14 at the half and didn't get their first lead of the game until 6:35 was left and they pulled out a 31-27 win on the road (-15). Indy had a 280-166 yd edge at the half and their 27 1H pts was 7 more than any other foe had put on MSU all year in a full gm. Both tms come in off huge B10 wins as MSU beat Iowa 26-14 (+1) on the road thanks to a stifling MSU D (#4) that limited a powerful Iowa rush attack (came in avg 244 ypg) to just 23 yds (1.4). Indy got its 1st ever win over Penn St (was 0-16) in impressive fashion as they outscored the Lions 31-10 down the stretch. QB's Sudfeld/Roberson accounted for 4 td's and the Hoosiers surprisingly outgained PSt 150-70 on the ground. In matchups of great D's vs great O's, we almost always lean with the more physical tm that has the D edge and this is no diff.

VIRGINIA TECH by 17 over Pittsburgh - While this their first ACC meeting, they have a history in the BE and LY played for the first time in 10Y. The L/4 in the series have all been outright upset wins by the Panthers (Pitt 6-0 ATS run) incl LY when we used an 0-2 Pitt squad as a Big Dog POW on the PPH and gave it out as the FREE Power Plays 4★ on the NCSports Comp Line on Tues (347-677-1700). PP called for Pitt to have a ydg edge and win outright and Pitt was +10' and won 35-17 as they finished with a 27-14 FD and 537-324 yd edge. VT is playing for a 7th str wk but does have a bye on deck while Pitt should be fresh coming off a bye. The Hokies have now won 5 str gms after the opening wk loss to Bama and LW cashed a 3★ Key Selection on these pages as they beat NC 27-17 (-7). QB Thomas was 13-20-230-3-0 in the 1H as they raced out to a 21-7 lead. Pitt has won 3 str gms and has done it in 3 diff ways: a blowout over NM, a shootout over Duke and a slug fest over UVA. QB Savage was KO'd vs UVA but will play here. We feel VT is a play-on tm down the stretch and no doubt will play w/revenge on their minds similar to LW.

MASSACHUSETTS by 4 over Miami, Oh - LY was the first ever meeting and was also UMass' 1st ever MAC gm. The Minutemen had a 245-225 yd edge at the half but Miami led 14-3 at half and 27-10. UMass went 80/12pl getting a td with 3:21 left. Similar to LW's FIU/SM gm, someone's "0" has gotta go. Despite their 0-5 start, the Minutemen have covered 3 str and are "only" getting outscored by 25 ppg and outgained by 222 ypg. Miami, on the other hand, is getting outgained by 308 ypg and outscored by 27 ppg. On the bright side, the offense has put up ssn highs in each of the L/2 wks. Another Resistible Force vs Movable Object game and we'll take the home tm who has shown us more.

CLEMSON by 21 over Boston College - BC had won 3 in a row from '05-'07 SU/ATS but CU is 4-1 SU/ATS since incl '09 when we used CU (-7) as our Sept 5★ and won even easier than the 25-7 final would indicate. BC had a grand total of 4 FD's and 54 yds in that game. LY CU was w/o Sammy Watkins but Boyd hit 28-38-367. CU led 45-28 when BC got a 39 yd fg with 9:18 left and CU ended the game taking a knee on 1&g! at the 1. Both are off blowout wins as BC beat Army 48-27 (-11) thanks to RB Williams career-day w/263 rush (8.8) and 5 td's. We gave out CU (-14) as our FREE NC Sports College Comp play on Sat and they gave the Syr a rude ACC welcome as they won 49-14 (-14). QB Boyd had 455 yds and 5 td's in 3Q's of action but the D did give up an alarming 323 rush (6.7) which isn't good news going up vs RB Williams. BC is 0-7 SU/ATS on the road the L2Y but has a bye on deck while CU has the all-important gm vs FSU on deck but they are 4-1 ATS prior to FSU the L5Y.

Buffalo by 14 over WESTERN MICHIGAN - LY UB got its 1st SU win in 6 tries (4-2 ATS). UB had a 453-376 yd edge and the D had 4 int. UB settled for 3 FG's and did score last (td w/10:53) while holding WM to 3 pts in the L/27:30. These tms look to be going in opposite directions as the Bulls are riding high off 2 blowout wins and are positioning themselves for a bowl while WM is 0-6 SU (2-4 ATS) under 1st yr HC Fleck. TO's continue to be an issue for the Broncos and LW they were -4 in a 47-20 (+22) loss to UT. The run D also continues to be a sieve as they are all'g 272 ypg (5.8). They clearly will be tested by a UB ground gm that is starting to get hot w/a healthy RB Oliver who had 150 (6.0) and 2 td's in the 42-14 win over EM (-13). It was the 1st time UB has broken the 40-pt mark in B2B gms s/1981. While UB is in the unique role of being an AF (only 4th time in L/11 yrs), we're not afraid to lay the pts here vs a WM tm that has failed to cover their L/3 gms by an avg of 20 ppg.

OHIO by 24 over Central Michigan - CM had won 4 straight in this series (incl a couple of MAC Champ gms) prior to losing the last mtg ('11). In that gm Ohio (-7) led 14-0 and 29-14 into the 4Q. After 2 CM 4Q td drives, Ohio matched both on the following possession. CM is 2-4 SU/ATS playing a 7th str wk (3rd str road gm) after LW's 21-9 (-3) win over Miami. RB Lavallini ran for 151 yds (6.0) and 2 td's but QB Rush continues to struggle w/a 3-8 ratio in his 4 sts. The healthy and rested Bobcats, off a bye LW, crushed Akron 43-3 (-3) holding the Zips 198 yds below their ssn avg on offense. Since the loss to top 10 LVille in the opener, they have cashed 4 str gms by 14.5 ppg and only have lowly EM and Miami on deck. The Chips are on a 1-12 ATS run as an AD under Enos and there's no reason to believe that streak won't continue as the Bobcats make it 5 for 5.

ARMY by 10 over Eastern Michigan - These two meet for the 5th time in 6Y. Army is 3-1 SU and 2-2 ATS. There have been 2 outright upsets the L/3 gms. LY EM was in their 3rd str HG and RB Hill who had rushed for 283 yds the wk prior, rushed for 185 on 26 carries. Army QB Steelman became the first Army QB to top 200 yds rush s/86. Army got a td with 2:15 left to pull within 10 and rec'd the onside kick but was SOD and lost 48-38 (-2). LW the Eagles dropped their 4th str gm as they lost 42-14 (+13) at LV. While they were -3 in TO's, it should be noted that one of their td's was a 75-yd run w/1:29 left. Army is off a 48-27 loss (+11) to BC as they all'd BC to score the gm's final 17 pts. The Black Knights are 5-2 SU (3-3 ATS) s/05 at home after a 2+ road/neutral trip but EM who is on road B2B is surprisingly 7-2 ATS in that role. Key matchup to look at will be Army's ground attack which is avg 330 ypg (5.2) vs EM D all'g 213 ypg (5.7).

MARYLAND by 10 over Virginia - UVA is 4-2 SU/5-2 ATS in this series, the visitor is 6-1 SU/5-2 ATS and there have been 4 outright upsets the last 8 years. The Cavs are 3-0 SU/ATS in their last 3 trips here. LY UVA had 386-235 yd and 20-10 FD edges but MD spoiled their homecoming with Fr Diggs getting a 100-yd KR td to open in their 27-20 win (-2). LW the Terps were on the big stage for the 1st time s/06 in a matchup of top 25 tms and were thoroughly embarrassed by FSU as the 63 pt margin of defeat tied for the worst loss by a top 25 tm all-time. While they were already down 14-0, st'g QB Brown was KO'd (conc) in the 2Q as they managed -11 yds rushing in the 1H and were outgained 614-234 for the gm. UVA is also off a disappointing performance LW as they lost to Ball St 48-27 (-3). The gm was a bit misleading as the Cavs were -4 in TO's and also had 13 pen compared to BSt's 1. Both tms need a bounceback win and with MD QB Brown ?, look for a lower scoring gm as both D's rank in our Top 25 while both offenses fail to make our Top 50.

CONNECTICUT by 6 over Uf - As you would expect with the two teams having very diverse climates, the HT is 8-1 SU and 6-3 ATS. UC is 3-1 SU but the dog has covered 4 straight. LY USF was -7 at home trying to stop a 6-gm losing streak. USF QB BJ Daniels was injured in the 3Q. USF got a 50 yd fg with 4:26 left to lead by 7 and UC was int'd at the USF23 with :50 left. 0-4 Conn comes into this gm off a bye with not only an interim HC in TJ Weist (1st-yr OC) but also a new QB as they are taking the RS off frosh QB Tim Boyle. LW USF got a much needed 26-20 win over Cincy (+11) for embattled 1st-yr HC Taggart. However, it should be noted that they benefitted from 4 Cincy TO's, scored on a 75-yd blk'd FG ret'd for a td and also had a 10-yd FR td. They lost QB Bench and RB Shaw to leg inj in the 1H (CS) but QB Eveld came off the bench to go 10-16-122 with no TO's. Lots of uncertainty here w/UC's changes and USF's injury report so we'll call for the HT by 6 and see where Vegas tells us to lean.

DUKE by 6 over Navy - Duke has won the L/2 gms ATS ('08 & '10). In the L/gm Duke (+13) delivered another outright upset winner for the Big Dog POW as they led 24-0 at HT and 34-15 mid-4Q before Navy scored the final 16 pts. Navy is just 3-6 ATS following Air Force and LW took a big step in retaining the CIC trophy (AF/Navy winner has won it 16 str yrs) w/a 28-10 (-13) win. It wasn't easy as they were outplayed in the 1H trailing 10-7. QB Reynolds showed some rust after sitting out the 2H in LW's loss to WKU, but a 75/8pl opening 3Q drive for a td swung momentum. Duke does come in off a bye w/extra time to prep for option and they already faced GT earlier TY, although they all'd 344 rush (5.7). At 3-2 they need to care of business if they want it to make their 2nd str bowl. While Navy is 25-8 ATS as an AD, Duke is 10-3-1 ATS as a HF under Cutcliffe.

Troy by 21 over GEORGIA ST - This is the Panthers first ever Sun Belt game and first meeting between the 2. This is the 7th str gm for Troy who has a bye on deck (7-1 ATS) while GSU is off #1 Bama. LW Troy led USA by 17 in the 3Q but then saw the Jags take a shocking 33-27 lead w/only :48 left. Troy QB Robinson then calmly led them on a 66/5pl drive getting a 20-yd td pass w/:07 left for the win. The D did allow 630 yds, their 4th str gm all'g 500 or more. While it came against a tm w/a vanilla gm plan that also emptied their bench (Bama's bench better than 30-40 tms in CFB), a strong argument could be made that LW's 42-pt loss to Alabama was the Panthers' best performance of the ssn as they were "only" outgained 477-175. The fact remains though that they are still 1-15 SU their L/16 gms w/all but 3 of those losses coming against FCS tms. However they have covered 3 str gms. Troy has not been a 20 or more road fav s/'08 and we'll call them near the line here and see if there is any hangover after their L/second win LW.

MISSISSIPPI by 1 over Texas A&M - LY was their only recent meeting and it was a game Ole Miss could easily have won. The Rebels were +13' at home and a Big Dog POW. The FD's were even at 24 and A&M finished with a slim 481-464 yd edge. Ole Miss led 27-17 and Manziel appeared sk'd for a safety but he was ruled down at the 1 yd line. A&M would then go 99 yds incl a 3&19, 32 yd pass to start its comeback. UM went for it on 4&1 at their own 39 knowing a FD would likely end it but were SOD and A&M went 39/4pl for a td with 1:49 left. A&M comes in off a bye while Miss is off B2B AG losses to Bama and Aub w/an LSU HG on deck. The Aggies have rebounded from the Bama loss to win B2B gms and they are doing it w/our #4 off avg 225 ypg more than what their opp are all'g while the D remains a concern all'g 111 ypg more than what their opp avg. While they have dropped their L/2 gms, the Rebs still have top 30 units on off and def and we expect them to put forth a much better effort TW.

BALL ST by 17 over Kent St - BS had won 3 in a row by 20 ppg from '03-'08 and the HT has won 4 in a row SU (3-1 ATS). LY BS had a 557-461 yd edge. KST had one of their bigger home crowds in recent history. Kent led 42-29 when BS got a td with 6:01 left and then BS, after an int, drove 21 yds for a td with 5:31 left and the lead but KS got a 25 yd FG with :04 left after an 80/15pl drive to pull out the win. LY Wenning tossed a career high 445 yds and 5 td's and TY continues to put up monster numbers avg 333 ypg (63%) w/an 11-3 ratio. LW off a big MAC win over UT, the Cards did not show any signs of a letdown as they beat UVA 48-27 (+3). While the Cards offense put up 506 yds vs a D that was all'g just 299 ypg coming in, they did benefit from 4 UVA TO's and 13 pen. That doesn't equate to good news for a Kent St D that all'd 698 yds LW in the 38-24 (+8) loss to NI. The Flashes actually led 24-21 early 3Q before all'g the gm's final 17 pts. Off 2 big wins, you have to feel BS is due for a letdown but all they do is cover under HC Lembo going 7-1 ATS as a HF and currently are on a 19-6 overall ATS run.

MISSISSIPPI ST by 14 over Bowling Green - First meeting. BG travelled to the SEC LY and played a solid game at Florida (+29) in the opener. They actually had a 22-14 FD edge and were only outgained 365-327 in The Swamp, missing a pair of FG's and it was tied at 14 mid-3Q. The Falcons are 14-8 ATS as an AD but have lost by scores of 65-21 (+25), 55-10 (+18), 37-0 (+17) and 42-10 (+2) in the L4Y on the BCS road. Mullen was the QB cch at BG in '01 & '02. MSU is off huge misleading HG vs LSU as they allowed the gm's final 31 pts incl 28 in the 4Q to lose 59-26 (+7). QB Russell got the start but Prescott again impressed throwing for 106 and running for 103 more. BG is off 3 easy wins and does have a bye on deck but Miss ST also has a bye on deck. Mullen traditionally puts these opp away and is 12-4 ATS as a HF. Off a loss, look for them to take care of business here.

NORTHERN ILLINOIS by 21 over Akron - In Akron's MAC Champ year, they upset NI twice incl the MAC Title game. In the other 5 games of this series since '00, NI is 5-0 SU/ATS winning by 26 ppg with the avg line -12'. The last 3 they've outgained Akron by 231 ypg. Akron is playing a 7th str gm and likely 5th str gm against a tm that will be playing in a bowl. LW they started to show signs of being worn out as they were destroyed by OU 43-3 (+3). NI, meanwhile outgained Kent 698-392 in a 38-24 (-9) win as they have finally found a RB in Stingily (266 rush yds) to go along w/QB Lynch. The 398 yds all'd was actually by far their best performance of the ssn as they were all'g 501 ypg coming in. This is only NI's 2nd HG in the 1st 8 wks (other was FCS tm) and it is also HC. Look for them to easily get their NCAA-leading 23rd consec home win.

TEXASTECH by 17 over Iowa St - Coming into LY ISU had 2 100 yd rushing performances in each of the L/2 gms by 4 different players vs TT. They won 52-38 in '10 and then in '11 caught TT off their upset win of Okla and were a 14 pt road dog and destroyed them 41-7. LY TT got its revenge going on the road to ISU where they had 395-189 yd and 20-13 FD edges in the 24-13 win (-2). TT is 6-3 SU/ATS in this series outgaining ISU 7 of the 8 years by an avg of 170 ypg and the SU winner has covered ALL 9 (fav 7-2 ATS, 2 outright upsets). The Red Raiders are 18-3 SU and 16-5 ATS in HC gms but 4-8 ATS the L4Y in B12 HG's. They come in a perfect 5-0/4-1 ATS under 1st yr HC Kingsbury and LW after falling behind 10-0 early exploded for a 54-16 (-16) win over Kansas. The Raiders finished w/31-15 FD and 518-273 yd edges but did lose QB Mayfield to inj (leg) in the 3Q (CS). ISU is off a heartbreaking 31-30 (+7) loss to Texas last Thur as they all'd a Hail Mary td pass before HT and UT also benefitted from a generous call on a possible fmb'l late in the 4Q down 6. Even w/Mayfield? as of presstime, remember that Webb has gotten plenty of snaps TY and Aug st'g QB Brewer finally was activated LW.

Rice by 3 over UTSA - LY in their first meeting, over 4,000 UTSA fans showed up at Rice (182 miles away). The Owls held a special ceremony prior to the gm honoring their 100th yr of football and they also wore special 1957 throwback uniforms. "If you could pick one you would definitely want to win, it would be that one," said Rice HC Bailiff. Rice had a 483-239 yd edge and on the first drive of the 2H Bailiff told his OL they didn't want to throw a pass on it and they ran the ball 12 str times for a td in the 34-14 (-2) win. The Owls come in the favorites to win CUSA West after beating LY's CUSA Champs, Tulsa, 30-27 (+3) in OT. The Owls were actually up 24-10 at HT before getting shutout in the 2H. UTSA is probably starting to feel the effects of a brutal sked playing their 7th str gm vs FBS competition after only playing a total of 8 FBS tms their 1st 2Y of FB. LW they fell behind 24-0 early and lost 34-10 at Marsh (+14). They do have a bye on deck and despite their 2-4 record are only getting outgained by 1 ypg while 3-2 Rice is getting outgained by 14 ypg. Look for this to go down to the wire.

WYOMING by 17 over New Mexico - In LY's game big plays hurt the Lobos (+2). In the 1H they allowed an 81/1pl td pass and a 91/2pl drive with a 64 yd td pass and wound up losing 28-23 (+2).

The #1 rush tm in the NCAA is no longer located in Eugene, OR as NM piled up an amazing 541 yds (9.7) in their 66-17 demolition of rival NMST LW. They are now avg 368 yds (6.9) on the yr. You have to love the Cowboys situation here as first they already destroyed option-based AF this yr 56-23, and had a bye LW to help prepare. Christensen knows how to defend the option going a perfect 5-0 ATS vs Air Force and is 1-0 vs NM since they started it LY. The Cowboys have also had 2 wks to stew about a 42-21 upset loss to TXST. QB Smith (65%, 14-4 ratio) is fully capable of taking adv of a NM D all'g 488 ypg and we expect Christensen to make it 6 for 6 vs the option.

Stanford by 13 over UTAH - The visitor is a perfect 3-0 SU/ATS ('89, '95 & '96). Utah is 2-3 SU and 2-1 ATS overall vs Stanford. The L/gm took place in '96 and the Utes won 17-10 as a 6 pt AD. Stan is playing for 6th str week after LW's 31-28 escape (-8) over UWR. Montgomery saved the day piling up 290 all-purp yds on an evening where the Cardinal were outFD'd 30-14 and outgained 489-279 but never led by less than 3. Utah is off a bye and Thur night HG vs UCLA as they lost 34-27 (+5). It was amazing that the gm was that close considering QB Wilson threw 6 incl as they blew several scoring opportunities. Stanford is 13-2 SU and 10-5 ATS on the P12 road and is 13-3 ATS as an AF s/'10. Since joining the P12 in 2011, the Utes have yet to play P12 heavyweights Oreg/Stan and we feel they are in over their heads here.

BYU by 11 over Georgia Tech - BYU is 3-0 ATS in this series. LY there were 5,000+ BYU fans that made the trip to GT. HC Mendenhall showed he knows how to defend the option as they held GT to a season low 157 yds (117 rush) and the D did not allow a td with GT getting a 22 yd IR td and 97 yd KR td. BYU won the toss and chose to receive for the first time s/'99 and took their opening drive 55/12pl for a td. They had a 214-86 yd edge at the half and won 41-17 (+2, 411-157 yd). GT HC Johnson said, "We got whipped in all 3 phases of the game." GT is off road trip to Miami but is surprisingly on an 8-2 ATS run in B2B road gms incl 5 outright upsets. They are off B2B losses in ACC play and LW despite jumping out to a 17-7 1Q lead, managed only 6 more pts in the next 44 min before scoring a td w/:10 left in the 45-30 (+6) loss. BYU cashed as a rare 3★ Fri Night LPS as they were an underdog to Utah St for the 1st time since the Merlin Olsen days. LB Van Noy set the tone early w/a 17-yd IR td on the 1st play and they won outright 31-14 while also benefitting from an inj to USt QB Keeton. QB Hill did have his best passing gm on the ssn going 17-31-278-3-1. You have to love the Cougars situation here as GT is playing its first in altitude in an ACC sandwich and BYU is 4-6 SU at home.

GEORGIA by 10 over Missouri - UGA had only played MU once and that was the 1960 Orange Bowl (Fran Tarkenton UGA QB). In the week leading up to LY's game, MU DT Richardson said UGA's style of play was old man football. It was the most anticipated game ever for MU. The gm was much closer than the final would indicate as MU (+1) lost at home 41-20. MU led in the 3Q, 17-9 and had a 371-355 yd edge. UGA took its first lead of the game with :51 left in the 3Q, 24-20. The Bulldogs got a 51 yd FG, then MU fmb'l'd and UGA ret'd it to the 1 and got a td on the next play. MU was sk'd and fmb'l'd at its own 5 and UGA got a td 3pl later for the misleading win. UGA's Nat'l Title hopes appeared bleak LW. They were playing w/o 5 str's who either sat out or got inj'd in the gm and trailed UT 31-24 late 4Q. QB Murray, for the 2nd wk in a row, guided a late 4Q td drive capped off by a td pass w/:05 left. Georgia, then benefitted from a fmb'l in OT when the Tennessee runner lost it while crossing the GL. MU just gave a big effort on the road vs Vanderbilt and travels again. The Tigers easily cashed as a 4★ LPS as they jumped out to early 20-0 and 30-7 leads and rolled over VU 51-28 (E). QB Franklin is playing exceptionally well avg 281 pass ypg (68%) with a 13-3 ratio while also adding 278 rush (5.2). Not many could've predicted that at this point in the season the Tigers would be the only other SEC team outside of Alabama to be undefeated but here they are at 5-0 and their only non-cover is by a single point. While the situation favors Mizzou, we'll call for the Bulldogs near the line and check their injury report later in the week.

Baylor by 7 over KANSAS ST - The HT has now won 6 in a row SU (4-2 ATS). KSU is playing with LEGIT revenge as LY they travelled to face Baylor in Waco -12'. KSU came in #1 in the country (BCS), but Baylor became the first team with a losing record at the time of the game to beat an FBS #1 team. A banged-up Klein had 3 int the previous 10 gms but 3 vs BU. BU had a 580-362 yd edge. KSU pulled within 35-24 with 12:25 left but BU got an 80 yd td run by Seastrunk with :58 left for the 52-24 thrashing and fans stormed the field afterwards. Since that win the Bears have not looked back as they have won 7 str gms by an avg of 61-18 covering by 20 ppg incl LW's 73-42 thrashing of WV as our Early Bird POW (347-677-1700). You guys must be calling it every Mon as the line moved 3 pts by game-time. BU racked up a B12 rec 864 yds and are now avg a ridiculous 780 ypg outgaining their foes by 458 ypg while outscoring them by an avg of 71-16! KST led a possible upset (+13') slip through their hands LW as they led Okla St 29-23 late in the 4Q but gave up the gm's final 10 pts. QB Sams, who had attempted only 4 passes coming in, was 15-21-181-2-3 and also added 118 rush (4.4) but 2 of his int came on KST's final 2 drives. While we usually don't like stepping in front of long ATS streaks, this is BU's 1st AG TY, they are 0-3 ATS as an away fav and LTH were 3-0 ATS on the yr and even w/RGIII lost outright 36-35 (-3). We expect this one to be close throughout.

LSU by 7 over Florida - These teams are 5-5 SU the L/10 with UF 6-4 ATS. The home team is 6-2 SU but 4-4 ATS and there have been outright upsets in 2 of the last 3 years. LY UF was a HD but ran the ball 58x for 176 yds. At the half LSU had an 81-47 yd edge but in the 2H, UF had a 190-119 yd edge. Both teams have been ranked in each of the last 9 meetings with a combined 7 top 5's. LTH the Tigers took on a Gators squad minus their top 2 QB's (true frosh started, 1st ever snap). The 30 pt MOV was their largest s/'71 (48-7). The Gators come in off 3 str wins and the off has been energized by QB Murphy who was an extremely efficient 16-22-240-3-0 in his 1st home start LW in the 30-10 win (-13) over Ark. The #1 D all'd 275 yds, which was their worst performance on the ssn as they are all'g 238 ypg less than what their opp are avg on the yr. They will be tested greatly here vs an LSU off that is avg 46 ppg and 489 ypg TY and is coming off a 4Q explosion LW vs MSU tallying 28 of their 59 pts in the final stanza. Their D, uncharacteristically has been shredded for 400+ yds in each of the L/3 gms. This gm will be played in the day-time, which is always dangerous for the HT Tigers but we think this stage might be a little too bright for Murphy at this pt.

ARIZONA ST by 27 over Colorado - This one could be classified as series domination. ASU is 4-0 ATS despite being favored by an avg of 20 ppg with their avg win by a score of 38-12 (+213.5 ypg). LY CU was at home on a Thur night (+22') and appeared to be in great shape as they only trailed 20-17 at the half. However, ASU got a 100 yd KR to open the 3Q and CU was SOD on 4&1 at its own 47 with 7:16 left. ASU drove 47 yds for a td to get ahead of the spread for the first time and covered 51-17. CU is 3-11 ATS in conf road gms and after a 2-0 start, they have lost their L/2 gms by 36 ppg albeit it came against 2 good tms in Oreg/Oreg St. This is a flat spot for ASU off grueling 4 gm stretch of Wisc, Stan, USC and ND with Wash on deck while Col has a bye on deck. However, HC Graham is 7-1 ATS as a HF and 10-2 ATS overall as a fav as he routinely beats the tms he should be large margins.

Oregon by 13 over WASHINGTON - This could be the series play of the week as Oregon is an amazing 9-0 SU and 9-0 ATS vs UW winning those matchups by an avg of 43.4-17.5 (avg cover by 8 ppg, closest win 17 pts). LY Wash entered the game ranked #23, 1 wk after knocking off #8 Stanford. UO was -24' at home and led 52-14 early in the 4Q. UW went 55/9pl and got a garbage td with :32 left in the 31 pt loss. UO has won 17 str conf AG's and is on a 10-0 ATS run in CAG's! The Ducks are also a perfect 3-0 SU/ATS the L4Y in the 2nd of 2 str AG's (reg ssn). Need more amazing ATS numbers for the Ducks? How about them being on an overall 12-1 ATS run after yet another cover in LW's 57-16 win (-39) over Col. They are outgaining their foes by 299 ypg and outscoring them by 47 ypg. UW has also been very impressive TY and even in a 31-28 (-8) defeat to Stanford LW, they still outgained the Cardinal 489-279 (30-14 FD). We're not known for stepping in front of several ATS streaks but it should be noted that UW was 4-0 ATS LY as a HD (3 outright upsets). Newly renovated Husky Stadium will be rocking. Oreg gets another SU win, can they also get another cover?

LY the Green Wave got to the EC6, EC20 and EC8 but were held to FG's all 3 times in the 5 pt loss. The Pirates are playing at the Superdome for third time in 2Y (bowl LY). LW, despite 33-20 FD and 511-334 yd edges, they had to fight and claw for a 24-17 (-7) win over MT. EC is on a 3rd str AG while Tulane on a 2nd str HG w/a bye on deck. LW Tulane cashed a 3★ Key Selection on these pages in a 24-21 upset win over NT (+3) as they notched the program's 500th all-time victory. The D continues to impress as they have all'd just 30 rush ypg (1.4) in the L/2 gms. This Tulane tm has already pulled 3 outright upsets TY and we'll glad take the DD pts as we love the situation and the series history. LW we got yet another outright upset winner and you can make it 4 outright upsets for a Tulane tm closing in on its 1st bowl s/02. **FORECAST: TULANE by 1 over East Carolina**

UCLA by 21 over California - LY there were a couple of games that made you scratch your head and one of them was Cal at 2-9 in their other games, knocking off the P12 North Champ UCLA and did so in dominating fashion, 43-17 as a 2' pt HD. A possible answer to the upset is that the home team is now 12-1 SU in this series (10-3 ATS) but the Golden Bears are also 17-8-1 ATS in the series and 4-1 SU/ATS L5Y. The Bruins do have a couple extra days to prep off a Thur night win over Utah 34-27 (-5) and this is only their 5th gm of the ssn already having 2 byes. Cal is off a 44-22 (+1) loss to Wazzu as they continue to pile up yds on off (avg 516) but their D is giving up 524 ypg. UCLA does have the 2 toughest B2B road gms of any team in the country TY on deck (Stan, Oreg) but Cal has lost 9 str gms to FBS opp, the longest of any tm in a BCS conf.

COLORADO ST by 7 over San Jose St - In '11 SJSSt was a 3' pt AD but got the outright upset 38-31 getting a 38 yd td pass w/:54 left for the win (did lead 24-14 at half). LY they were favored for the first time at -11 and David Fales had 325 yds passing by the end of the 3Q and SJSSt finished with a 568-386 yd edge. SJSSt only led 27-20 but a 51 yd td pass with 7:56 left got them ahead of the spread. SJSSt is on B2B road trips off Hawaii and dealing with colder climate but is a perfect 5-0 ATS in the 2nd str AG the L/4 yrs. LW they rallied from a 14-3 deficit to score 31 str pts in a 37-27 win (-4). Fales had another uneven performance (16-35-318-3-2) and shockingly is only comp 56% w/a 9-7 ratio TY. CSt is 21-8 ATS off a bye and should be playing w/some confidence after 3 str solid performances incl 2 wins and a DD cover vs #1 Bama. The altitude should heighten their home edge and this is 3rd road gm in 4 wks for Spartans.

ARKANSAS ST by 23 over Idaho - Idaho is 4-4 SU & 3-4 ATS vs Ark St but the visitor is 2-5 ATS ('98-'04 as former SBC members). ASt new HC Bryan Harsin played QB at Boise and was 10-0 SU vs Idaho when he was a coach there. Idaho is finding Indep life tough as they come into this gm 1-5 after a 61-14 (+27) beatdown at the hands of Fresno LW. It could have been much worse as Fresno led 47-0 at HT and yanked many of the str's after 2.5-3Q's of action. The Vandals now are travelling across the country to the heat and humidity of the South playing for a 7th str week while Ark St is off a bye (4-0 ATS) and this is HC. The Red Wolves need a feel-good win after B2B blowout losses and get one here.

PENN ST by 3 over Michigan - PSU is 8-4 ATS in HC games and 41-6 SU. Penn St is 3-0 SU/ATS vs Michigan ('08-'10) w/the avg cover by 13 ppg but that did all come against Rich Rod. LW UM found a way to help QB Gardner cut down on his mistakes as he didn't throw the ball until mid-2Q and had his 1st TO free gm as a st'g QB in UM's 42-13 win (-19) over Minny. Despite their 1st series loss ever (were 16-0 prior) to Indy LW 44-24 (-3), QB Hackenberg played well in the defeat going 30-55-340-3-0 and the Lions did lead 14-13 early in the 3Q. This will be the 1st home dog role for HC O'Brien and they are expecting a sellout here (uncommon L2Y). We also like the fact that we have a better D ('19-31) and a home dog going up against a UM tm that is 7-14 SU in Big Ten AG's (avg win by 18 ppg & avg loss by 16 ppg).

NC STATE by 8 over Syracuse - The Wolfpack are a perfect 6-0 SU vs the Orange incl a 38-17 win in the L/gm ('98) as a 12' pt dog and they also won 32-31 in '97 as a 25 pt dog! NCSt is 13-6 SU in ACC HG's incl a 10-1-1 ATS run! Syr is 7-21 SU in conf AG's (2-5 ATS run) although they are entering a new conf. The ACC didn't throw out a welcome mat LW for them as we easily cashed our NC Sport College Comp POW going against them with Clem (-14) rolling 49-14. The Cuse did manage 323 rush yds but QB Hunt was only 8-24-52-0-3 and they gave up 624 yds with Clem QB Boyd and many str's only playing 3Q's. Speaking of cashing plays, LW we loved the fact NCSt was 0-12 ATS as an ACC AF incl getting upset 10x's. Make that 0-13 ATS and 11 outright upsets now as we cashed our Underdog POW on these pages as they lost to WF 28-13 (-7). Now they are back at home where they are 10-1-1 ATS in their L/12 vs ACC. TW we'll play their streak again but this time we're on the Wolfpack.

Uab by 10 over FIU - First meeting. This is HC for FIU and are off a bye and SM w/a bye on deck while UAB also has a bye on deck, but is playing 4th str gm. After being arguably the worst CFB tm in the country thru the 1st 4 wks, FIU pulled a shocker LW beating SM 24-23 (+16). The 24 pts scored were 1 more than what they had scored in the 1st 4 gms comb. QB Hillard came off the bench to hit 8-13-93-1-0 and RB Spearman had 136 (4.7) to key the win. UAB is off a 37-23 (-3) loss to FAU and were thoroughly outplayed getting outFD'd 25-16 and outgained 579-307 but the gm was tied at 23 late 3Q. In the L/3 yrs UAB is 1-3 ATS as a road fav (4-9 ATS s/'03) getting outright upset in 3 and their only cover was by a 0.5 pt. However, we think FIU will be caught celebrating LW's win a little too much and we'll take the Blazers here.

Marshall by 15 over FLORIDA ATLANTIC - First meeting. Marshall would like nothing better than to take home a CUSA trophy in this their final season. They will, however, have to take care of business on the road where they 0-4-1 ATS as an AF under Holiday. The Herd make their first trip to FAU Stadium to face an Owls squad that has covered 12 of 13 as a dog of 4 or more. Pelini in his 2nd season has transformed his squad into a respectable bunch allowing 18 FD/gm and UNDER 51% completions. The offense under the direction of QB Johnson has also ignited in each of his L/2 starts as they have topped 500 yds in each of those. LW, in the upset over UAB he was 23-36-299-2-0 and added 105 rush (5.5). The sked edge has to go to Marshall here as they are off a bye and UTSA with a bye on deck while FAU is playing just their 2nd HG and playing a 7th str week. The Herd continue to impress beating UTSA 34-10 (-14) LW as they are outgaining foes by 191 ypg. FAU did struggle mightily against the other CUSA elite tm TY (EC) and we expect the same here.

TCU by 28 over Kansas - Since 1982 the Jayhawks are 4-2-1 SU and 5-2 ATS vs the Horned Frogs. TCU HC Patterson grew up rooting for KU despite playing at KSt as a walk-on LB in '83 as his uncle was a 3 sport star there in the 50's. The HT is 2-0 ATS in this brief series and LY TCU was a 20' pt AF and KU only trailed 7-6 when TCU got a 37 yd FG w/:04 in the half. KU, down, 20-6 was SOD at the TCU36 then fmb'd into the EZ for a TB with 1:16 left. Sandwich gm for TCU off rival SMU, at OU, w/OST and Texas on deck while KU is off a 54-16 demolation at the hands of TT LW after leading 10-0. On one side you have a team that went 38-3 at home over a 7Y period and LY went 0-4 SU vs their new conference foes. On the flip side, you have a visitor that has lost 20

straight games on the road with 3 different HC's. One streak will stop and we'll side with the Horned Frogs who are already 0-2 in B12 play TY and off a 20-17 loss (+8) to Oklahoma. They are on a current 10-2 ATS run off a loss vs FBS tms.

NORTH TEXAS by 14 over Middle Tenn - The favorite has taken 5 of the last 6 as these previous SBC members square off as CUSA foes. NT had won 5 in a row in this series from '01-'05 incl 3 outright upsets then MT won 4 in a row SU and ATS from '06-'09 and did so by 26 ppg. NT won by 6 pts on the road and then by 52 at home in '11. LY MT was the only team from the state of TN with a winning record at the time and wore black helmets for the first time ever and talked about revengeing their loss. MT had a 4-0 TO advantage and a 305-97 yd edge at half with a 24-0 lead and won 38-21 (-3). MT is playing their 7 str gm while NT is playing only their 2nd str gm and are a respectable 9-4 SU/8-5 ATS at home in Apogee. NT has pushed the tempo this year avg 86 pl/gm at home and QB Derek Thompson has benefitted as he's hitting 73% with a 3-0 ratio compared to 52% with a 5-3 ratio at home LY. Can see him exploiting a Blue Raiders secondary that allowed FAU a 7Y high 31 completions that NFLer Rusty Smith couldn't accomplish.

TEXAS ST by 6 over Ulm - TXSt is 2-7 SU vs ULM with the last mtg in '00 (won 27-7). Both were FCS Southland conf members prior to '93. ULM has a couple extra days to prep off a huge SBC HG vs WKU on Thur and have a bye on deck (are playing 7th str wk). This is the Bobcats first Sun Belt home game and they are quietly building a solid homefield edge. After dropping their inaugural FBS home game, they've not only covered all 5 but they've done so by covering by 22 ppg! Prior to LW's bad situational loss to UL, the Texas St D has led the way as disruptive Col St trans Orapko (6.5 tfl, 3.5 sk, 3 FF) has pressured opposing QB's into a 4-6 ratio. Now ULM's Brayle Brown makes his first ever road start and he struggled LW. The Warhawks watered down offense was without 3 of their top 4 returning rec's (CS) LW and for the 5th str game they finished on the negative side of the TO margin (-11 the L/5 gms). Tough to lay too many pts here though as we'll check ULM's inj report.

Boise St by 4 over UTAH ST - Third diff conf they will compete together in (Big West & WAC). Boise has won 10 str (9-1 ATS) with their lone non-cover coming in the L/gm ('10) as they won 50-14 (-38' HF). The Broncos' D in that gm held the Aggies to 14 yds or less in 9 of their F/10 drives. LTH ('09) vs #6 Boise St it was tied 14 late 2Q. After that point the Aggies (+23) were held to 168 yds and outscored 38-7. The Broncos come in off a bye (6-4 ATS) while USt is playing a 7th str week and 4th str tough opp. LW we cashed a 3★ LPS on a Fri Night going against them as they were in the unique role of being a fav over Big Brother BYU. BYU LB Van Noy int'd Keeton on the 1st play of the gm and ret'd it for a td and while the Aggies lost 31-14 (-6), the bigger loss was losing QB Keeton for the rest of the yr (ACL). Prior to LW, USt probably would have been favored in this gm and we won't overreact as we are firm believers in the QB injury system.

Oregon St by 1 over WASHINGTON ST - OSU is now 7-2 SU (10-3 ATS) in the series. There have been outright upsets 2 of the L3Y and the visitor is actually 5-2 SU/6-1 ATS. LY OSU had a schlr rec 46,579 on hand and WSU QB Connor Halliday hit just 9-20-81 with 3 int (Jeff Tuel 11-17-126). OSU did have a 320-227 yd edge and 21-14 FD edge. OSU needed a td with 4:27 left for some breathing room at 19-6 and took a knee at the WSU23 at the end. OSU is 10-4 SU/ATS as a P12 AF. Wash St is 7-33 SU and 18-22 ATS hosting conf foes but this isn't your same Wazzu tm of the L/5 yrs as they are now 4-2 after LW's 44-22 win over Cal taking adv of 5 Bear TO's. Oreg St is off a bye, winners of 4 str gms thanks to QB Mannion who is 404 ypg (67%) w/a 21-2 ratio while his fav target Cooks has 807 (15.5) and 9 td's already. Wash St is playing a 7th straight week and with that in mind, we'll slightly lean w/the fresher OSU squad.

Tulsa by 6 UTEP - The disappointments continue for Tulsa off a home OT loss to Rice, a conf foe they had beaten 6 straight times. Now they take to the road having lost B2B home games for the first time s/'09. Utep dropped their 3rd straight as the their rush D was run over for 353 yds and 7.1 ypc vs LT who came into the meeting avg just 150 ypg. Still favor the progression the Miners have made behind new HC Kuglar (was NFL OL cch) and will always back a DD HD that has the ability to shorten the game with a rush attack. Granted the Hurricane have clearly played a significantly stronger sked, but with a pass offense avg 51%, a rush attack that is avg 3.7 ypc, and a team that has failed to cover this calendar year shouldn't be a DD AF.

UNLV by 6 over Hawaii - Quick name the MW team that has won & covered the most in a row? We're sure you all said UNLV who averaged 42 ppg and 24 FD's their L/3 games. Hawaii on the flip side is winless but their offense has improved in EVERY game despite playing a pair of upper tier P12 teams and 3 MW's teams that totaled 26 wins LY. The main issue with the Warriors is an OL that has allowed 23 sks but they'll be able to hold off a Rebel's DL that has totaled only 8. The unit has also struggled running the ball 73 ypg (2.3) but here again they have a favorable matchup vs a D allowing 285 ypg and 6.0 ypc. Don't mind fading a UNLV team that is a FBS DD fav for the second time in 5Y vs an improving UH squad that manhandled the Rebels LY (+3, 48-10) and was -17' their last trip here.

Tuesday, October 15th
Louisiana at WKU - WKU has been a dog the L/3 mtgs covering each and pulling the upset twice. LY UL was -4' at home and did have a 582-415 yd edge. The game was tied at 10 at the half but WKU led 27-17 with 6:00 left. UL went 72/11pl incl a 4&8 conv, got a td with 2:43 left. WKU rec'd the inside kick and punted and UL went 93/8pl and got a 14 yd td pass with :38 left. WKU got to the 35 of UL but their Hal Mary pass on the final play fell incomplete. Will UL move to 6-0 as a conf AD or will WKU win and cover their 4th straight TY?

4★ Detroit by 13 over CLEVELAND - CLE has the situational edge at home for the 2nd straight w/ extra rest while DET is in their 4th road game in 5 weeks having just faced GB (4-9-1 ATS after Packers). The Lions were outgained 449-286 vs GB but with CJ inactive they loaded the box and held Bush to only 44 (3.4) with their longest play totaling only 25 yds. The Browns have reeled off 3 straight wins but vs BUF they lost Hoyer (3-0 as starter). They return to Weeden who despite having the entire projected starting OL together vs BUF was sacked 5 times on 24 pass att's LW vs Hoyer who was sacked 6 times on ALL of his 96 pass att's. Two of the Browns wins were thanks to a fake FG vs MIN and 176 yds of PR yds with a TD by Travis Benjamin but don't see that vs the Lions #7 PRD. Can't discount job that DC Horton has done (#5) but after facing Manuel, Tuel, Dalton and Ponder they haven't faced a trio anywhere near Stafford, Johnson and Bush. Also give an edge to HC Schwartz as these teams face off annually in the preseason giving Detroit a deeper playbook.

3★ Green Bay by 9 over BALTIMORE - GB was off a loss and a bye and they did what they do best winning outright at home (23-2 run) while covering at home vs a div foe (7 straight). BAL returns from MIA where despite a 20-10 FD edge they were tested mentally with the game tied at 3, 6, 13 and 23. The Ravens have also boasted a strong home field going 26-3 SU but 2 of those 3 losses came LW while this seasons 2 wins were with a combined 9 yd edge. The difference in the Ravens TY is a rush attack that averaged has 64 ypg and 2.6 ypc before finally topping 100 yds LW vs MIA (still only 3.3). Without that threat Flacco is unable to use the play action which he has so successfully in the past which correlates to his 70.2 QBR and 5-8 ratio (87.7, 22-10 LY). The Ravens have been a HD just 4 times in the L5Y going 1-2 ATS as a 1.5 pt dog while taking 3 pts from Denver LY and losing 34-17. We'll side with the rested and reenergized Pack that has a home game vs CLE on deck vs a road weary Ravens squad that travels again next week to face their main rival, the Steelers.

OTHER SELECTION

2★ SEATTLE by 21 over Tennessee - SEA has this lone home game sandwiched between a pair of playoff teams and a pair of prime time division games incl next Thursday. The Seahawks OL will be the biggest beneficiary of playing in front of the 12th man as they were down 3 starters each of the L2W and despite 15 FD's vs HOU they got that win but LW they converted only 3 of 12 on 3rd down falling to IND. Seattle's home win streak is now 10 and they've covered all 9 when not resting starters and they are also 10-3-1 ATS off a SU loss. TEN is off 3 straight HG's and LW in Fitzpatrick's first start for the Titans he only hit 51% (5.3 ypc, 1-2) and they lost at home to KC failing to score in the 1H. Defenses have been able to bottle up Chris Johnson (who had only 17 rush yds LW (1.7) and he is only avg 3.3 ypc on the season and that could very easily drop with an OL still uncomfortable with a new QB cadence. SEA also faced Fitz LY while with BUF and held him to 55% (5.7 ypc & 1-2) with that game in Toronto. DD non-conf HF's are 13-5 ATS w/a 36-14 avg score and SEA adds another win to that record this week.

OTHER GAMES

NY Giants at Chicago - The only thing worse thing being worse than 0-5 is to also be off a div home loss to a rookie HC and away for a 3rd time in 4 games on a short week. The Bears however have a sieve like D that's allowing 66% comp and have just 6 sacks TY. After opening 3-0 despite getting outgained by 52 ypg the Bears finally faced a pair of quality QB's (Stafford & Brees) and dropped both SU/ATS. How low can the Giants fall or do they rally? **This Marquee Play is available after 12:00 noon est on Thursday!**

KANSAS CITY by 3 over Oakland - KC comes in 5-0 while OAK is 1-3 plus their late night SD game. The schedule however must be factored in as KC has played the weakest in the league. Now the Chiefs are a DD fav for the first time S/O3 TY the Chiefs covered as a favorite twice vs winless teams and LW vs a new QB while failing vs DAL. The Chiefs have a remarkable streak that over the L6Y and this being the 4th HC they are 0-9 ATS as an AFC West HF and not only have they gone 0-6 ATS hosting OAK they've BEEN UPSET ALL 6 GAMES. This is a tough spot for the Raiders with an OL that's allowed 13 sacks in their L3 (sans SD) but few people are talking about the Raiders D that has only allowed 349 ypg (287 ypg w/out gm @ DEN). Pryor hit 38-57 with a great deal of noise at IND & DEN and after 2 int's in the opener he hasn't thrown any the L2. DIV dogs of 10 or more are 6-1-1 ATS prior to bye and with 6 straight UNDER in this series we expect another here and will take the generous points.

Philadelphia by 6 over TAMPA BAY - Let's go back to Nov 18, 2012. TB just beat CAR in OT and they had won 4 straight to get to 6-5 with Freeman having a 13-1 ratio. Since then they lost 9 straight when their opp wasn't resting starters incl all 4 TY with 3 games by a total of 6 points making it even more frustrating. Now you're on a bye and you release your QB with numerous sources reporting that your HC has lost the team. Rookie Glennon (193 yds 56% 1-2) will obviously benefit with the extra work but despite playing the #32 D if they can't do better then the 16 FD's/gm their avg they'll be in trouble. The honeymoon period in PHI is already over after dropping 3 straight since their opening win and LW vs the NYG they scored 17 pts off 4 NYG TO's w/a trio coming in the 4th Qtr. The Eagles now travel for a third straight with Vick (hamstring) a big unknown and while Foles was 1-5 as a starter LY his only win was also here at TB (381, 63%, 2-0).

Carolina by 1 over MINNESOTA - The Vikings got their first win on the year in London prior to the bye albeit vs a 0-4 Steelers squad. They now return home where they were previously upset by CLE and in a favorites role which they only gone 3-8-1 ATS under Frazier. While both teams prefer to run and rank in the top 10 the rush D is another story as MIN has allowed 105 ypc (4.2) compared to Carolina's 93 ypg (3.6). The Vikings of course live and die behind AP so it's no coincidence that in their first 3 games, all losses, they avg'd 121 ypg & 4.2 ypc rushing but in the win vs PIT they had 145 yds and 5.4 ypc. The Panthers are on their second straight long road trip and while Newton looked bad LW (0-2 ratio) he hasn't had B2B games with a negative ratio (4-0 week after). The Panthers were held out of the EZ at ARZ as the WR's dropped a slew of passes that would have changed the flow of the game. CAR finished w/a 353-250 yd edge. In fact when CAR is on the road the underdog 9-1 ATS and the Panthers are also 13-7 ATS off a SU loss w/ Rivera.

HOUSTON by 17 over St Louis - The Texans are off the Super Bowl champs, and the top 2 NFC West teams incl the Super Bowl runner up. They dropped the first 2 with the SNF results not known. The Rams meanwhile got their second win of the season while also covering vs JAX BUT they were outgained 363-351 and allowed the Jags 127 yds over their season average. STL has played only one top 10 Def TY and that was at home vs SF (188 yds, 14 FD's) and now they must face another on the road (HOU #1). The Rams also played only one top 10 offense away from home (HOU #5) and in that game they allowed ATL 393 yds and 31 pts. Sam Bradford has been a serviceable QB but you can be sure on one thing and that is if he's on the road and gets pressured with 3 or more sacks he and the offense struggle. Over the L3 TY that's occurred 9 times and the Rams have avg'd a whopping 9 ppg! JJ Watts head may explode if the Texans return home off 3 straight losses.

Pittsburgh by 6 over NY JETS - The proud Steelers limp into NY as only one of 4 winless teams. While the offense struggled their first 2 games they have moved the ball their L/2 avg 447 yards but dropped both thanks to being -7 TO's! PIT is now off a needed bye giving them time to incorporate new LT Brown into the mix while the Jets are on a short week off a MNF in ATL (home teams off MNF vs a foe off a bye are 2-9 ATS). The Steeler's D also benefits from the bye as HOF DC LeBeau's game plans have led to 5 straight wins while allowing only under 11 ppg. The Jets D was ranked #2 into LW but looking at their body of work it was vs the #28 off of BUF, #29 TEN and #31 TB while the game vs NE was in horrid weather. On offense we'll still back a not 100% Roethlisberger who's not intimidated by Ryan's D (275 yds, 77%, 2-0 LY) vs Geno Smith who has yet to have a positive ratio (4-8) in a game.

Cincinnati by 9 over BUFFALO - The Bills are off a Thursday night loss to CLE where EJ Manuel was KO'd and expect him to miss a couple of weeks. They return home where they've covered all 3 games pulling a pair of upsets and they'll be led by the other rookie Tuel (80 yds 40% 0-1 LW). The Bengals will be happy to face a non-Pro Bowler as Cutler, Roethlisberger, Rodgers and Brady have 14 between them yet CIN still has only allowed a 6-4 ratio. BUF has been blitz happy this season earning 4+ sacks in 3 of their L/4 gms (15 sks) but CIN's steady OL has only allowed 11 (6.3%). It'll be tough for the Bills to establish long drives as the Bengals rush D is allowing 96 ypg (3.9) despite 182 yds (6.1) vs GB and if they shut

down Spiller the talent laden secondary (three #1's & #2) has the ability to blanket both Steve Johnson (inj'd LW should be OK) and #1 DC Woods (265, 16.6). Expect Bengals DC Zimmer to unleash one of the best DL's in the NFL on a rookie UFA behind a bad pass protecting OL (#25) in his 1st start here.

DENVER by 30 over Jacksonville - In 2008 the question w/ DET was can they win a game. With the 2013 Jaguars its why would they? DEN is an exhausted 5-0 but Manning will be upset as his streak of 227 pass att's w/o an int was broken making his 20 pass t's TY "almost meaningless". When it rains it pours for the Jaguars as while they set a season high of 363 yds/20 pts LW vs STL they are now down to their #3 and #4 OT's after trading their best offensive player in LT Monroe to BAL and 1st Rd DC Joekel broke his ankle LW. Gabbert was pulled for the 4th time in 8 gms (inc press) for injury/ineffectiveness. While Blackmon ret'd LW in a big way (5 rec 27.2 1 td), DEN expects CB Bailey to finally play TY and with JAX OL situation it's not likely they will have any time to throw. KC's QB's LY had an 8-20 ratio w/a 6.2 ypa and TY's Jags are already at 3-9 ratio w/a 6.0 ypa. When your defense has a 12-2 ratio allowed TY the only concern is if Manning who avg'd 267 ypg (65%) w/a 34-13 ratio vs JAX in his 18 games vs them wants to add covering as the largest favorite role in NFL history to his Hall of Fame resume however 20 pt fav's are 0-8 ATS w/a 24-15 avg score.

SAN FRANCISCO by 13 over Arizona - The 49ers took a 2 week hiatus embarrassingly totaling 10 points and 461 yards. They recovered vs STL and are off their SNF matchup with HOU with those results unknown. We do need to mention that this Harbaugh is 6-2-1 ATS off a SU if they fell to the Texans and at 2-3 we wouldn't want to be in the locker room afterwards. The Cardinals have been excellent at stopping the run this season (79 ypg #2) holding all 5 teams to under 105 yards rushing (3.3 ypc) and while there's a new coaching staff they held SF LY to 26 ppg and 18 FD's/gm. The concern here for the ARZ offense is a non-mobile Palmer who has had a 2-7 ratio the last 3 games and still got 2 wins but that won't occur at Candlestick. SF got a slap in the face going 0-1-1 LY vs STL and by going 1-3-1 SU their L/5 vs the NFC West you can be assured their will not letting off the gas.

New Orleans by 1 over NEW ENGLAND - Normally a non-conf home game would be a letdown spot in the midst of a 4 game road trip with a tougher than expected Div rival on deck. However Belichick and Payton are good friends and this looks to be a game for bragging rights. For the 1st time in 52 games Brady failed to have a td in a game as he was down to his 3rd string RB (Blount 51 yds 4.3 LW) and while Amendola returned (4 rec 13.8) CIN held him in check as they didn't fear the rest of the receiving unit. A huge concern is that in the 1st game w/o Wilfork (Achilles) NE gave up 162 yds (4.2) on the ground and other #1 DT Kelly (knee) is unknown. Nothing gets Brady focused like a loss as NE is 12-1 ATS as a dog off a loss with 11 outright upsets. NO has been excellent for us TY finishing B2B 4★ with Brees playing like the 2nd best QB in the league. LY at this time NO was #32 in total def giving up 283 ypg pass/9-3 ratio and 30.8 ppg. TY it's #12 with 222 ypg pass/6-7 ratio and 14.6 ppg and getting a depleted offense.

Washington at Dallas - Mike Shanahan was 9-2-1 ATS vs his main rival OAK his first 6Y at DEN and since taking over the Skins he's now covered all 6 vs DAL. Large situational edge to the Skins off a confidence building road win against his former rival while having a bye prior to this trip. You can also be sure during the bye that RGIII lobbied for more freedom on the offense (41 rush att's in F/4 LY, 13 TY). The Cowboys went 0-6 as a HF LY but are 2-0 ATS TY including another Sunday Night div game when they were outgained by 147 yds but were +5 in TO's vs the NYG.

Indianapolis at San Diego - Third long road trip in 4 weeks for Luck & Co but they've already won their first 2 road games by a combined 64-10. The Colts are off a physical game vs SEA where they rallied from an awful start w/a blocked punt to go down 12-0 for the win. The Chargers have allowed some gaudy numbers on D (432 ypg) but they've actually held two foes to season lows and are 3-0-1 ATS prior to their reschedule SNF event. How will Luck respond to his first real NFL prime time game?
